NOTING THE SEMINOLES

Florida State claimed its first ACC Atlantic Division title in 2007 en route to earning the No. 1 overall seed in the ACC Tournament. It marked the seventh time in conference history that the Seminoles earned the top seed in the tournament.

With a mark of 24-6, the Seminoles set the school record for the most conference wins in a season surpassing the previous record of 22 set in 1999. The 24 victories also tied for the most wins recorded in ACC history as the Clemson Tigers posted the same record a season ago.

The 2007 Seminoles set the single-season record for team batting average (.350) and team fielding percentage (.975). The team batting average was also a new ACC single-season team record surpassing the record of .347 set back in 2001 by Georgia Tech. FSU also drew a home record crowd of 183,534 in 41 games at Mike Martin Field.

FSU made its 30th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance and 45th overall in 2007. The Seminoles own an all-time record of 149-100 in the NCAA Tournament including a mark of 124-64 in NCAA Regional play.

Florida State captured three of the four individual accolades presented by the league office in 2007. Tony Thomas, Jr. was named Player of the Year, while Bryan Henry earned Pitcher of the Year honors. Mike Martin was selected as the Coach of the Year. Seven Seminoles earned All-ACC recognition including a school-record six named to the first-team.

Tony Thomas, Jr. was named National Player of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and Rivals.com in 2007. The junior second baseman was also a finalist for the Golden Spikes Award, Dick Howser Trophy and Brooks Wallace Award - all given to the nation's top collegiate baseball player.

BEST START IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Florida State's 23-0 start was by far the best start in school history, surpassing the team's previous best start by eight games. The Seminoles started a season with at least a 10-0 record seven times in the program's 60-year history. In the second game against Siena, the Seminoles moved to 16-0 with an 8-3 victory over the Saints, breaking the school record for the best start ever. In 1975, under then head coach Woody Woodward, Florida State began the year 15-0. They finished the '75 season with a mark of 49-10 advancing to the College World Series and finishing the season with a ranking as high as No. 7 by Collegiate Baseball. 1975 also marked the first year as an assistant coach for current head coach Mike Martin. This is the best start in 28 seasons under the legendary ball coach.

LIMITING THE ERRORS

At one stretch during the season, Florida State went six games without committing an error, a span covering 63.2 consecutive innings. It is the longest errorless streak since 1993 when FSU went five straight games without posting an error. FSU also started the season with a streak of 36 consecutive innings without committing an error.

At year's end, FSU finished with the best fielding percentage in school history at .975. The Seminoles committed 60 errors in 2,360 total chances. For the third straight year, Florida State's team defense ranked among the best in school history. Here is a look at the top five fielding teams in school history dating back to 1973:

FIELDING THE INFIELD

Florida State's starting infield of Buster Posey at catcher, Brandon Reichert at first, Tony Thomas at second, Mark Hallberg at shortstop and Jason Stidham at third, combined to post a fielding percentage of .978. Four of those five Semi-

noles started all 62 games at the listed position, while Stidham started 61 games at third. Posey committed the fewest errors (3) while Stidham registered the most errors with 14.

TOP HITTING TEAM

Not only did the 2007 Florida State baseball team finish the season as the best defensive team in school history but they also ranked at the top offensively. The Seminoles wrapped up the 62 game schedule in 2007 with a .350 batting average shattering the school record of .337 set back in 1980 as well as the ACC record of .347 set by the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets in 2001. A total of nine Seminoles hit above .300 including six who started in at least 61 games. Tony Thomas, Jr. led all hitters with a .430 average, the third best single-season batting average in school history.

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY

Florida State ended the season sweeping its final two road series (at Maryland and at Georgia Tech) en route to claiming its first Atlantic Division title and the top seed in the ACC Tournament. The Seminoles set a school record for the most road wins in a single season in ACC play with 12 thanks to their three-game sweep over Georgia Tech to end the regular season. FSU posted identical home and away records of 12-3 in 2007. The Seminoles won all five road series this season, while winning nine of 10 ACC series overall. FSU's only series loss came at the hands of Clemson. The Garnet and Gold registered five series sweeps in league play taking all three games from Wake Forest, Boston College, Virginia Tech, Maryland and Georgia Tech. FSU reached the 20-win plateau in game two against Maryland marking the third time in school history that Florida State won 20 or more ACC games in a season. FSU's 24 wins in 2007 not only set the school record for the most league victories, but it tied the conference record set last season by Clemson. With two victories over Miami in Coral Gables, Florida State surpassed last year's ACC win total of 16. Since joining the league in 1992, FSU is the only team in the ACC to post 14 or more league wins in each of the last 16 seasons. This year Florida State won its first seven conference games before falling at Duke in game two of the series. It was the Seminoles' best start in ACC play since 1999 when the Garnet and Gold started 13-0. Since joining the ACC in 1992, FSU started league play winning its first six games three times.

registered his 30th stolen base of the season in game three of the ACC Tournament against Clemson in Jacksonville. Thomas finished the 2007 campaign with 33 doubles, 111 hits and 31 stolen bases.

14 WINS FOR HENRY

Bryan Henry made Florida State history in 2007 becoming just the third pitcher to reach the 14-win plateau in a single season since FSU joined the ACC back in 1992. The senior right hander finished the season with a 14-2 mark and an ERA of 2.60. He also became the eighth pitcher all-time with 14 or more wins in school history tying Richie Lewis who reached 14 wins in 1986. Henry's three-year Florida State career comes to a close with an overall record of 32-9 and a career ERA of 2.60. The right hander tallied 273 strikeouts and just 75 walks in 322.1 innings of work good for a 3.64 career strikeout to walk ratio. He leaves Florida State ranked eighth all-time in career starts (47) and wins (32) and 10th in innings pitched and ERA.

ACC ACCOLADES

Tony Thomas, Jr. became the fourth Seminole student-athlete to garner ACC Player of the Year honors and the first since 2001. Thomas finished the season as league leader in seven statistical categories and is ranked in the top 10 in four others. The Valrico, Fla., product finished first in the ACC in batting average (.430), hits per game (1.79), runs scored per game (1.47), doubles per game (0.53), total bases (3.05), on base percentage (.522) and slugging percentage (.733). In addition, Thomas finished second in stolen bases per game (0.50), third in triples per game (.10), eighth in home runs per game (0.18) and eighth in walks per game (0.69). Thomas joins J.D. Drew (1997), Marshall McDougall (1999) and John-Ford Griffin (2001) as past Seminoles to be recognized as ACC Players of the Year.

Bryan Henry was named ACC Pitcher of the Year after finishing the season with a perfect 14-2 record and a 2.60 earned run average. The Tallahassee, Fla., senior ran out to a 14-0 record in his first 16 starts, while he went a perfect 9-0 in 10 ACC starts. In addition to tying for the NCAA-lead in wins, Henry led the ACC in strikeouts (117), innings pitched (117.2) and finished fifth in opponents' batting average (.238).

Mike Martin was voted by his peers as ACC Coach of the Year for the fifth time in his career after leading the Seminoles to the Atlantic Division title and the No. 1 seed in the ACC Baseball Tournament. Florida State finished the year with a 49-13 overall record. FSU's 24-6 record in league play, tied the ACC single-season confer-

ence game win mark of 24 set by Clemson a year ago. Martin was previously honored as the top coach in the league in 1996, 1998, 1999 and 2001.

With six first-team selections, Florida State joined the 1977 Clemson Tigers as the only other school in conference history to place six student-athletes on the first team. It also marks the most first-team selections in school history surpassing the previous record of four set three times in 1996, 1999 and 2000. Joining Thomas (2B) and Henry (SP) on this year's first-team are sophomore catcher Buster Posey, freshman third baseman Jason Stidham, junior shortstop Mark Hallberg and junior outfielder Jack Rye. Sophomore outfielder Mark Gildea earned a spot on the second team.

RUNSA-PLENTY

The Seminoles scored 562 runs in 62 games in 2007, an average of 9.1 runs per game. That run production in 62 games is the seventh highest total to start a season in the 60 years of Seminole baseball. The school record for the most runs scored in a season is 752 set in 1982. That year the Seminoles advanced to the NCAA Regionals playing 74 games averaging 10.2 runs per game. Below is a listing of the top five seasons through 62 games in Seminole baseball history:

TWO OUT RUNS

Florida State did pretty well went it came to two out run production in 2007. In 62 games, the Seminoles scored 219 runs with two outs. That's 39.0% of their run production in 2007 coming with two outs. FSU scored a season-high 11 runs with two outs twice. First coming in the series finale against UNC Asheville, a game the Seminoles won 15-1. The Garnet and Gold then scored 11 runs on two outs in a 15-3 victory over Duke in game one of the series in Durham. Against the Gators, FSU scored nine runs on two outs including four in the first two innings. The Seminoles scored another nine runs on two outs in a 10-2 win over Appalachian State in game two of that series. In the Seminoles first ACC series in 2007, Florida State outscored Wake Forest 22-10 as 12 of the 22 runs recorded came on two outs. The Seminoles finished out the regular season scoring 16 of the 44 runs posted against Georgia Tech on two outs including nine, two-out runs

The Seminoles posted multiple runs in 132 innings in 2007 and scored at least one run in 225 of the 500 innings they played.

EARLY NOLE GETS THE 'W'

Florida State managed to put runs on the scoreboard in the early going of the 2007 season outscoring the opposition 214-97 in the first three innings. The Seminoles scored 70 or more runs in four innings this season, including the first (73), third (87), sixth (78) and seventh (89) innings. Florida State scored in every inning that they saw an at-bat this season including a run in extra innings.

DOUBLE-DIGIT RUNS & HITS

The Seminoles got off to a hot start in 2007 scoring double-digit runs in 13 of their first 17 games. FSU had a string of eight straight double-digit run games earlier this year. In the 60-year history of Seminole baseball, Florida State registered double-digit runs in eight consecutive games just twice, the last time coming in 2003 when the Seminoles strung together nine straight games of 10+ runs. FSU posted 26 double-digit run games this year.

FSU also posted double-digit hits in 47 of its 62 games played in 2007. Since 1996, the Seminoles had a streak of eight or more double-digit

hit games 10 times, including a more recent streak of 11 games in a row which came to an end in game two vs. UNC (4/21). This year's 16 straight double-digit hit games are the longest of record dating back to 1996. The previous best was 10 straight posted back in 2003.

SEEING DOUBLE

FSU hit 172 doubles in 62 games in 2007, that's an average of 2.8 doubles per game. It was the fifth most doubles hit in a single season. The 2007 Seminoles fell just short of the school record of 182 doubles hit in 72 games back in 1990, an average of 2.5 doubles per game that year.

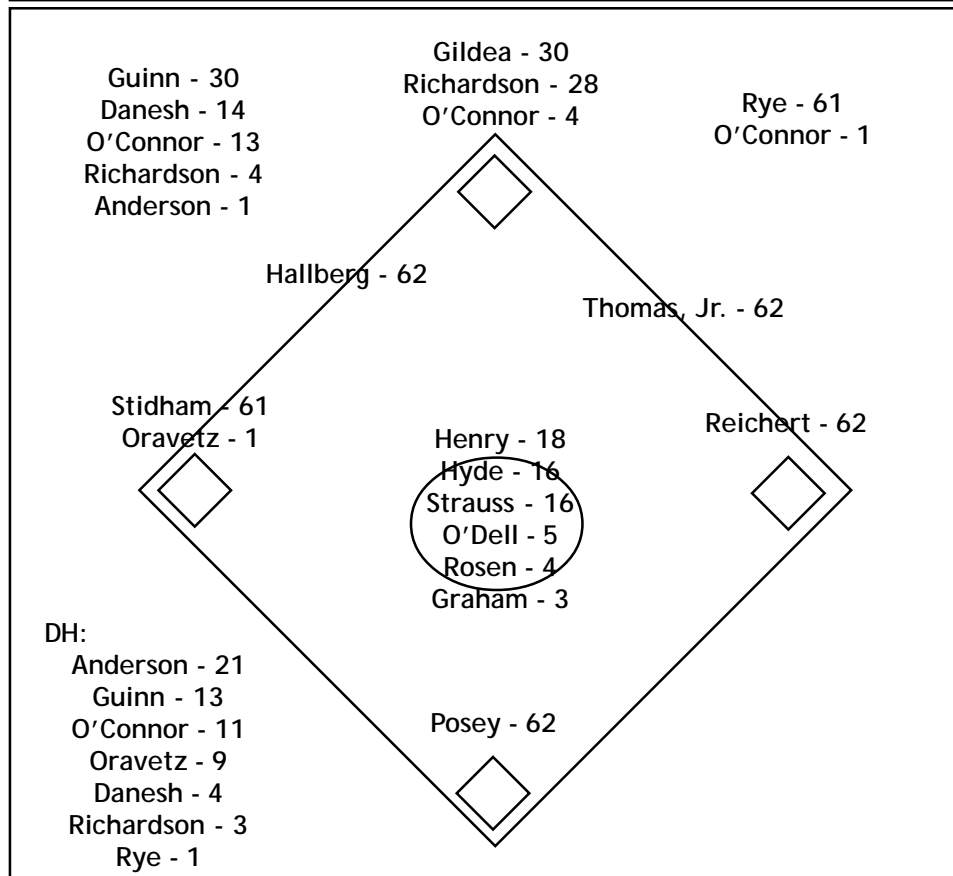
NO. 1 IN THE NATION

Florida State held the top spot in *Collegiate Baseball's* top 25 poll for six straight weeks before handing over the reigns to Vanderbilt. The Seminoles earned their first No. 1 ranking of the season as released by *Collegiate Baseball* on Monday, March 19. FSU posted a record of 16-7 while being ranked No. 1 in the nation.

9 TIMES IN 2007

Florida State was recognized as either the ACC Player or Pitcher of the Week nine times in 2007 the most of any other school in the league. The mark also ties the school record matched three times before in 1997, 1998 and 1999.

HENRY JOINS ELITE COMPANY

Bryan Henry collected his fourth career honor as ACC Pitcher of the Week on May 14. He became just the second pitcher in FSU history to win ACC Pitcher of the Week honors at least four times. Paul Wilson is the only other pitcher with four or more weekly conference accolades as he won the award a school record six times.

3-PEAT FOR THOMAS

Tony Thomas, Jr. was recognized by the league office as the ACC Player of the Week three times in 2007. It is the ninth time FSU has had an athlete win the weekly honor three times in a season. He joins a list of five other Seminole greats to be recognized by the league office three times in the same year (Paul Wilson and J.D. Drew each won the award three times in a season twice). The last Florida State player to perform such a feat was Mike Ziegler in 2000.

FOURTH PLACE ALL-TIME FOR #11

Two milestones were set by head coach Mike Martin in 2007. The first was established with the Seminoles 14-6 win over Florida in Gainesville on February 20, as Martin moved into sole possession of fifth place on the NCAA all-time wins list with 1,445 victories. Martin passed former High Point and Virginia Tech head coach Chuck Hartman on the list, who retired after 46 years as a collegiate head coach. Martin then moved into sole possession of fourth place with FSU's 17-1 victory over Stetson in the NCAA Tallahassee Regional. The win moved Martin ahead of current Texas Tech head coach Larry Hays. Martin currently sits with 1,484 career victories.

HE GOT IT

Mike Martin crossed another milestone off his to do list with his team's sweep of Minnesota last season. With the 12-4 win in the second game of the series, Martin became only the eighth coach in NCAA history to reach the 1,400 win-plateau and only the sixth active coach to do so. Of the eight coaches with 1,400 wins Martin has the fourth-best winning percentage and the second-highest winning percentage among active Division I coaches. Of the top 10 coaches across all divisions for wins, only four coaches have a winning percentage above .700 and Mike Martin is among that group. Martin passed another legend with FSU's 14-6 win over Florida in Gainesville as he moved into fifth place all-time passing former High Point and Virginia Tech head skipper Chuck Hartman. In the third game of the NCAA Regional, Martin moved passed Larry Hays of Texas Tech for fourth place all-time with 1,484 career victories. Overall, Martin ranks third in the DI 1,400-win club behind Stephenson

and former Texas coaching legend Cliff Gustafson for winning percentage.

HOLD IT RIGHT THERE

Florida State finished the season as the leader in the ACC in limiting the opposition to the fewest number of stolen bases attempted in 2007. Opponents attempted a league low 48 stolen bases against the Seminoles and catcher Buster Posey, a finalist for the 2007 Johnny Bench Award, was a big reason for that. In 62 games, Posey threw out 40.9% of attempted base stealers. He had only 44 stolen base attempted against him all season. Posey also finished as the team leader in pickoffs as he recorded six in 2007. To put all the numbers in perspective, North Carolina finished second in the ACC as opponents attempted 59 stolen bases against the Tar Heels.

FROM CATCHER TO PITCHER

Sophomore Buster Posey made his much anticipated pitching debut at Florida State in the third game of the series against UNC Asheville. Posey went from behind the plate to the mound in the top of the fifth and pitched a scoreless inning. The Leesburg, Ga., native induced a pair of groundball outs including an inning ending 6-4-3 double play.

GRAND NIGHT FOR POSEY

Buster Posey broke up a one-run Seminole lead in the sixth inning of game two against Miami with his first career grand slam. The sophomore catcher took a 1-2 offering from Hurricane pitcher Alex Koronis and hit it over the wall in right center for his second home run of the season. The round tripper proved to be the eventual game-winner for the Seminoles.

MULTI-RBI GAMES

Four Seminoles posted five or more RBI's in a game this season including Brandon Reichert, Mark Hallberg, Jack Rye and Buster Posey. Rye was the first to eclipse the mark in 2007 driving in six runs in FSU's 16-3 victory over North Florida. Hallberg then drove in a career-high five RBI's in the series finale against Siena. Against Miami, Posey set the season-high for RBI's in a single-game with seven against the Hurricanes. Four of the seven came on Posey's first career grand slam. Reichert drove in a career-high five runs on a single, fielder's choice and three-run home run in FSU's 20-5 win over Maryland in game-two.

SWEEPS ON THE ROAD

Florida State closed out the 2007 schedule posting back-to-back road sweeps as they defeated Maryland and Georgia Tech.

The Seminoles used a combination of hitting and pitching to garner its first road sweep of the season at Maryland. The Seminoles outscored the Terps 32-10 in the three-game series at Shipley Field, while posting a fielding percentage of .991. The pitching staff did its job as the starters registered an ERA of 2.67. All five relief pitchers who appeared in the series combined to shutout the Terps over a combined eight innings of work. Against Georgia Tech, the Seminoles outscored the Jackets 44-15 as the Garnet and Gold hit .350 for the series with 11 doubles while drawing 30 free passes.

HOME RUNS ON THE ROAD

Twenty-nine of the 53 home runs hit by Florida State this season have come on the road including nine hit against Duke. Before Florida State's weekend series against the Blue Devils beginning on March 30, the Seminoles had 12 home runs through the first 28 games. FSU left Durham with 21 round trippers in 2007. Seminole batters hit nine home runs vs. Duke, three in each series, including five by second baseman Tony Thomas, Jr. Thomas hit back-to-back homers in his first two at-bats in game one including the team's first lead off home run of the season. Tommy Oravetz hit his first collegiate homer, while Mark Hallberg hit his first round tripper as a Seminole. Florida State hit seven against Maryland including six in the first game. FSU registered five home runs against Miami while hitting three in game one. The Seminoles hit three or more home runs in a single-game five times in 2007. Three others have come on the road vs. the Gators including two in Gainesville and one in Jacksonville. FSU also hit two against NC State and two in Atlanta against Georgia Tech. Thomas hit the lone Seminole home run in Jacksonville at the 2007 ACC Tournament.

TOTAL SACRIFICES

Mark Hallberg was a welcome addition to the Florida State roster transferring from Illinois-Chicago in the fall of 2006. The junior from Barron, Wisc., started all 62 games at shortstop where he posted a fielding percentage of .975 (7 errors in 276 chances). Hallberg finished sixth on the team in hitting (.360) and third in RBI's (56). But the one stat that shouldn't be overlooked was his team leading 17 total sacrifices including 14 sacrifice bunts. His sacrifice total tied for the third most in a single season at Florida State with Jose Zabala (1998).

NATIONAL HONORS

Senior Bryan Henry and junior Tony Thomas, Jr. were both nominated for numerous Player of the Year accolades in 2007. Thomas was named a finalist for the Dick Howser Trophy, the

Golden Spikes Award as well as the Brooks Wallace Award. Henry was named a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy, the Golden Spikes Award and the Roger Clemens Award. Henry was recognized as a quarterfinalist for the Brooks Wallace Award.

For the Golden Spikes Award - in total, 40 college and universities were represented on the 2007 semifinalists list. Among the conferences, the ACC landed 10 players on the list to lead the nation. FSU was one of nine schools with multiple players selected to the semifinalists list including three other schools from the ACC in North Carolina, Virginia and Georgia Tech. Past Florida State winners of the Golden Spikes Award include J.D. Drew (1997), Mike Loynd (1986) and Mike Fuentes (1984).

The Seminoles were one of three schools to have two semifinalists in the running for the Howser Trophy as announced by the NCBWA and the St. Petersburg Area Chamber of Commerce. Criteria for consideration for the trophy include performance on the field, leadership, moral character and courage, qualities that were exemplified by Dick Howser's life. J.D. Drew is the lone FSU recipient of the Dick Howser Trophy winning the award in 1997.

MARSHALL OUT OF THE PEN

Jimmy Marshall was solid out of the bullpen in 2007. The sophomore right hander made 23 relief appearances working 32.1 innings. Marshall wrapped up the season with a 2-0 mark and a team best 1.39 ERA. He allowed a run to score in just four of his 23 appearances. He closed out the season with a 13.1 scoreless innings streak, a span covering 10 relief appearances.

5-HIT BRIGADE

Shortstop Mark Hallberg recorded five hits in Florida State's 20-5 victory over Maryland in College Park. The junior transfer from Illinois-Chicago went 5-for-7 in the game with two doubles, four runs scored and two RBI's. Hallberg's five-hit performance was the first since Tony McQuade went 5-for-5 against the Miami Hurricanes on April 20, 2003.

DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS

In his second start for the Garnet and Gold, Danny Rosen set the season-high for strikeouts in a ball game with 12 against Maryland. Bryan Henry held the previous season-high set back on opening day as he fanned 11 batters in FSU's 9-2 win over Tennessee. Seminole pitchers have registered double-digit strikeouts four times this season. Along with Henry's 11 strikeout performance against Tennessee, the senior right

hander also struck out 10 against Boston College. Michael Hyde registered a career-high 10 strikeouts on Feb. 3 against Tennessee.

INHERITING RUNNERS

Junior transfer Danny Rosen provided the Seminole bullpen with a huge lift after arriving on campus as a walk-on from Miami-Dade Community College in 2007. Rosen finished the season leading the team with eight saves in nine opportunities, but more importantly he pitched well in tight situations. In six of his 22 relief appearances, Rosen inherited 13 runners allowing only two to score. Those two runs that scored came in his first appearance as a Seminole and in the second game of the season against Tennessee. Senior Brian Chambers was just as effective in the same situation as he inherited 23 runners on 13 separate occasions allowing six to score. Freshman Matt Fairel also performed well allowing just one of 15 inherited runners to score and that one run scored back on Feb. 25.

SAVE AND START IN THE SAME WEEK

After earning his eighth save in nine chances in 2007 in the first game against Miami, junior Danny Rosen took to the mound for the second time in three games against the Hurricanes. But this time as the Sunday starter. Rosen made his first collegiate start as a Seminole throwing a career-high four plus innings in FSU's 7-1 loss. The Miami, Fla., native struck out three and walked four in suffering his first loss of the season.

PERFECT FEBRUARY

Florida State posted a perfect 14-0 record in the month of February for just the fifth time in the 60-year history of Seminole baseball. It was the first time the Seminoles went undefeated in the first month of the season since 1979 when the Garnet and Gold went 2-0. The previous record for the best undefeated mark in the month of February was 5-0 registered back in 1976.

WALK-OFF JACK

FSU played its first and only extra inning game of the season on March 16 against Wake Forest and came through with a victory defeating the Deacs 7-6 in 11 innings. Junior Jack Rye, who came through in clutch situations for the Seminoles this season, provided FSU with its first walk-off hit of the season singling home the winning run with two outs in the bottom of the 11th. Rye registered his third RBI of the game as his single glanced off the glove of the leaping second baseman. The ball trickled away just enough to allow Rye to reach first and pinch runner Ryan Strauss to score from third for the game-winner.

ONE IS A LONELY NUMBER

Florida State was the last remaining unbeaten team in Division I baseball until a March 21 tilt against Jacksonville. JU handed the Seminoles their first loss of the season, snapping FSU's 23-game winning streak.

FIRST COLLEGIATE HOME RUNS

D'Vontrey Richardson and Jason Stidham each hit their first collegiate home run against the Florida Gators in the Seminoles 14-6 victory in Gainesville. Stidham connected on a solo shot in the top of the fifth off reliever Josh Edmondson. The freshman third baseman sent a 1-2 offering over the wall in right for his first digger of the season. Richardson hit a three-run shot in the top of the eighth to put a stamp on the Seminole victory. The freshman center fielder sent a rocket shot that cleared the bleacher seats in left for his first career round tripper.

Stephen Cardullo got in on the action as he hit his first collegiate home run against North Florida. The freshman from Coral Springs, Fla., took the first offering he saw from Osprey reliever Paul Morales and sent the ball over the wall in left center for a three-run shot.

Ohmed Danesh registered his first collegiate home run in game two against North Carolina. Danesh blasted a solo shot over the right field to lead off the Seminole fourth.

ATTENDANCE RECORD

Florida State set the single-season home attendance record in 2007 drawing a school record 183,354 fans to Mike Martin Field inside Dick Howser Stadium. The home average attendance was 4,472 just under the school record of 4,516 which was set in 2005. This year's home attendance eclipses the record of 171,643 also set in 2005. The Seminoles played 41 home contests in 2007 posting a 35-6 record. Florida State was also the host of the NCAA Tallahassee Regional.
