Quoting Head Coach Trey Jones

“At the beginning of the season, we said we wanted to be playing on the on that final day. This is the start of what we think is something special in our program.

“Each team is special and this one did exactly what any coach would hope for at the beginning of each season. First and foremost we improved as the season progresses and played our best golf in the last month. Second, the five guys who finished the season in the line up prepared and competed to the best of their ability each time out.

“We have talented young players in the next two recruiting classes preparing to make an impact on our futures golf teams. The negative side of that equation is we are losing a great teammate and leader to graduation in Torstein Nevestad.”

SEMINOLE MEN'S GOLF TEAMS RETURNS TO NATIONAL ELITE

The Florida State men's golf team finished the 2006-07 season ranked 15th in the final national rankings by GolfStat, in a tie for 13th place in the NCAA Championship finals, in fifth at the NCAA East Regional Championship and in a tie for fourth at the ACC Championship as it enjoyed their most successful season in more than a decade. The Seminoles had two players earn All-America, All-Southeast Regional and All-ACC honors as the team earned seven top-five team finishes and returned to the national elite under fourth-year Head Coach Trey Jones. Florida State completed its best season under Jones by playing in back-to-back NCAA Regional Championships for the first time since the 1995 and 1996 seasons and advancing to the NCAA Championship finals for the first time since 1996. The Seminoles' tied for fourth place team finish at the ACC Championship marked the highest finish in the event for Florida State since finishing in fourth place in 1996.

SEMINOLE MEN'S GOLF TEAM EARNS TOP 15 FINAL NATIONAL RANKING

Florida State finished the 2006-07 season ranked 15th in the final head-to-head standings of the season by GolfStat marking the best final national ranking for the Seminole men's golf team since 1995 when they finished seventh in the nation. Playing a schedule that was ranked in the top 20 in the nation, Florida State earned seven top-five team finishes and averaged 73.22 strokes as a team during the fall 2006 and spring 2007 seasons. Each member of the Seminoles' starting line-up in the 2007 postseason finished with stroke averages better than 75.00 strokes per round for the first time under Jones' coaching direction.

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES TIED FOR 13TH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in a tie for 13th place in the final team standings at the 2007 NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championship which was played on the Gold Course at the Golden Horseshoe Golf Club. The finish marked the highest for the Seminoles since finishing in seventh in 1995 and marked the 11th time in school history they have finished in the top 15 of the team standings in the NCAA Championship tournament. The Seminoles survived a three-team playoff in order to advance to the final day of the 72-hole event and finished tied with Duke and just behind Georgia Tech in the race among ACC teams who played in the championship. North Carolina and Wake Forest were also in the event but did not make the cut from 30 teams to 15 in order to play in the final round.

FLORIDA STATE FINISHES FIFTH AT NCAA EAST REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Florida State finished in fifth place in the team standings at the NCAA East Regional Championship on the Lakeside Course at the Golf Club of Georgia to earn a spot in the NCAA Championship finals for the first time since 1996. The Seminoles played their best round and counted four under par individual scores to finish with a seven-under par 281 team score in the third and final round. The Seminoles' 281 team score was built with three individual scores of 70 by junior Jonas Blixt, sophomore Matt Savage and freshman Seath Lauer. The Seminoles also counted a 71 by senior Torstein Nevestad toward the team score. Florida State's 281 team score in the third round was tied for the top team score of the event along with the 281 total by Georgia in the third round.

BLIXT AND SAVAGE RANK AMONG TOP-40 GOLFERS

Junior All-American **Jonas Blixt** (Hammaro, Sweden) finished his third collegiate season ranked 20th while sophomore All-American **Matt Savage** (Louisville, Ky.) ranked 36th in the final individual national rankings by GolfStat. The Seminoles were one of only six teams nationally (Arizona State, Florida State, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Stanford and UCLA) to have multiple golfers finish the 2006-07 season ranked in the nation's top-40 in the head-to-head standings by GolfStat.

BLIXT WINS INDIVIDUAL ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

Junior **Jonas Blixt** shot a career-best seven-under par 65 in the third round and became the first Seminole to win the 2007 individual Atlantic Coast Conference men's golf championship at the Old North State Club. Blixt finished with a career-best eight-under par tournament score of 208 to defeat Georgia Tech's Cameron Tringale by one stroke to claim the individual championship. His outstanding performance led the Seminoles to a tie for fourth place finish in the team standings – the best for Florida State since finishing in fourth in the 1996 conference championship. Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech finished tied for the team championship. Florida State played its' second best round of the year as they turned in a 279 team score while not counting a single score above a 72. The Seminoles' team round was tied for the best of the tournament – tied with Virginia Tech – with both teams shooting 279 on the final day. It marks only the third time since joining the ACC for the 1992 season that Florida State has finished fourth or higher in the ACC men's golf championship. The Seminoles finished third in 1994 and fourth in 1996.

BLIXT AND SAVAGE EARN ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Seminole golfers **Jonas Blixt** and **Matt Savage**, who helped lead the Seminoles to a tie for 13th place finish in the NCAA Championship finals, were named to the Ping Division I All-America teams. Blixt earned All-America Second-Team honors and Savage earned All-America Honorable Mention accolades. It marked the first time since 1995 that two Florida State golfers have earned All-America honors in the same season and the first time since 1998 that at least one Seminole has been named to one of the All-America teams. Blixt was named as a member of the 10-member second team while Savage was one of 29 golfers to earn honorable mention honors.

BLIXT AND SAVAGE EARN ALL-REGION HONORS

Florida State's **Jonas Blixt** and **Matt Savage** were both named as Regional All-Americans in 2007 as announced by the Golf Coaches' Association of America.

BLIXT AND SAVAGE EARN ALL-ACC HONORS

Florida State's **Jonas Blixt** and **Matt Savage** were named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference men's golf team as selected by a vote of the league's 11 head coaches. It marked the first time since the 1994 season that two Seminole men's golfers earned All-ACC honors in the same season and the first time since 1998 that a Seminole has earned All-ACC honors. The Seminoles were one of only four ACC teams to earn multiple selections with the Seminoles, Clemson, Georgia Tech and Wake Forest all placing two players on the all-conference team. Since joining the ACC and competing in golf since 1992, a total of five Seminoles had earned All-ACC honors. Christian Raynor, who earned All-ACC honors in 1994 and 1995 is the only two-time honoree in school history. George McNeill, who is currently playing on the PGA Tour, was the last Seminole to earn All-ACC honors in 1998. Blixt was an automatic member of the All-ACC team as the individual medalist at the ACC Championship in April.

BLIXT PLAYS MOST ROUNDS AT PAR OR BETTER

Junior All-American **Jonas Blixt** has played 102 career rounds during his first three seasons at Florida State. He has played 42 of his 102 career rounds (.418 percent) at par or better. He has a career scoring average of 73.09 strokes in 34 career events and has won three individual championships.

SEMINOLES DISPLAY MARKED IMPROVEMENT

Florida State finished the 2006-07 season with a 73.22 stroke average. The Seminoles have taken nearly one full stroke off their overall team scoring average in Jones's first four years at Florida State. In addition to lowering their overall stroke average, the Seminoles earned a pair of Jones-era best ten top 10 finishes and 27 top-25 individual finishes during the fall 2006 and spring 2007 seasons.

SEMINOLES' IMPROVED RANKINGS UNDER JONES

Florida State finished the season ranked 15th nationally in the final GolfStat head-to-head rankings of the 2006-07 season. It marked the highest final national ranking under fourth-year Head Coach Trey Jones and an improvement of 56 national places after finishing 71st during his first and second years at Florida State.

FLORIDA STATE'S SPRING TEAM FINISHES

Highlighted by its second place finish at the spring 2007 Gator Invitational, Florida State earned seven top-five team finishes in 2006-07. The Seminoles finished in the top-five in two events during the fall to give the team seven top-five team finishes in 12 events this year. The Seminoles earned four top-five team finishes in 12 events during the 2005-06 fall and spring seasons combined.

BLIXT AND SAVAGE RANK AMONG TOP SEMINOLES

Junior **Jonas Blixt** finished the 2006-07 season with a career-low 72.24 stroke average while sophomore **Matt Savage** finished with a career-low 72.92 strokes average. The pair of Seminole All-Americans finished a total of 25 strokes apart as they carded the fifth (Blixt) and seventh (Savage) lowest stroke averages by a Seminole player since Christian Raynor earned All-America honors with a 71.61 stroke average during the 1994-95 season.

BLIXT CONTINUES TO CUT STROKE AVERAGE

Junior All-American **Jonas Blixt** finished the 2006-07 season with a career-low 72.24 stroke average. He has cut nearly two strokes from his stroke average following his freshman season through his junior season and has dropped nearly one stroke per season. Blixt averages 72.10 strokes in 102 rounds during the first three years of his career.

BLIXT AVERAGES CAREER-BEST IN SPRING 2007

Junior All-American **Jonas Blixt** finished the spring 2007 season with a career-low 71.80 stroke average. He carded four of the Seminoles' top 10 individual rounds including a career-low 65 in the third round of the ACC Championship. Blixt finished the spring 2007 season with four top 10 individual finishes and was EVEN par for the entire season. Blixt was a combined 13-under par in consecutive outings at the ACC Championship, the Linger Longer Invitational and the NCAA East Regional Championship.

SAVAGE IS A TOP-25 FIXTURE

Sophomore **Matt Savage** has played in 23 events and finished in the top-25 of the individual standings an incredible 15 times during his career. He finished in the top-25 in four of 11 events as a freshman and in 11 of 12 events as a sophomore. Savage has finished in the top-25 in 13 of his last 15 events including a tie for ninth place finish in the 2007 NCAA Championship finals. Savage finished in a career-best third place at the fall 2006 Shoal Creek Intercollegiate.

SAVAGE MAKES BEING UNDER A HABIT

Sophomore All-American **Matt Savage** finished in a tie for ninth at the 2007 NCAA Championship finals. His finish marked the highest individual finish for a Seminole since Andy Purnell finished sixth at the NCAA's in 1990. Another of the Seminoles' all-time great golfer -- Nolan Henke -- finished in second place in the individual standings at the 1987 NCAA Championship finals. Savage carded a two-over par 72 in the fourth and final round and finished with a two-under par total of 278 and was at or below par in three of the four rounds during the championship. He was one of only 19 players in the entire event that finished under par for the tournament. It marked the fourth time during the 2006-07 season, and first-time in a four-round event, that he had finished under par for an entire tournament.

SAVAGE IS MANY THINGS AND CONSISTENT

Sophomore All-American **Matt Savage** averaged a career-low 72.92 strokes in 37 rounds during the fall 2006 and spring 2007 seasons. He shaved nearly one stroke from his freshman season average and now averages 72.378 strokes per round for his entire career. Savage has finished at the top of the Seminoles' leader board in five of the Seminoles' eight events during the spring of 2007 and once during the fall of 2006. In addition, he has finished with scores at 75 or better in 29 of the Seminoles' 37 rounds this year (fall and spring seasons).

NEVESTAD CLOSSES OUT HIS CAREER IN LINE-UP

Senior **Torstein Nevestad** (Oslo, Norway) finished his collegiate career exactly where he wanted to be -- in the Seminoles' starting lineup for their postseason run to a top-15 national finish. After playing in only one event during the fall 2006 season (Shoal Creek Intercollegiate) and in one event during the spring 2007 as an individual (Seminole Intercollegiate) he played in the final four events of the season and helped the team achieve many of its goals for the season. Nevestad averaged 73.31 stroke per round in the final four events of the season after averaging 76.83 strokes in his first six rounds of the year. He improved his scoring average by 3.52 strokes per round in the Seminoles' postseason run.

NEVESTAD EARNS HIS DEGREE

Senior **Torstein Nevestad** earned his bachelor's degree in social science during the summer of 2007. He is the only graduating senior member of the Seminole men's golf team.

LAUER CEMENTS HIMSELF IN SEMINOLES' LINE-UP

Freshman **Seath Lauer** (Huntington, Ind.) finished fourth on the team with a 74.45 stroke average as he played in 10 tournaments during his freshman season. He played the best golf of his collegiate career as he finished with a six-under par score of 210 and averaged 70.00 strokes in three rounds during the Linger Longer Invitational and finished in a tie for 32nd place at the 2007 NCAA East Regional Championship. For his score at the Linger Longer he earned a tie for fourth place finish -- the best of his career -- and earned three top-20 finishes in the first 10 events of his career. His 222 tournament score at the NCAA East Regional Championship was buoyed by a 70 in the final round which allowed him to average 74.00 strokes during the event.

LAUER AT THE LINGER LONGER INVITATIONAL

Freshman **Seath Lauer** was the Seminoles' standout at the Linger Longer Invitational as he set a near personal-best mark for single-round score (68 in the second round) and career-best records for 36-hole score (138), gross tournament score (21), tournament score vs. par (minus 6) and best finish (tied for fourth) in leading the Seminoles to their fourth top three team finish of the year. Lauer carded an even par 70 and only a bogie on his final hole of the tournament kept him from firing three-sub par rounds in the same tournament for the first time in his career. He had three birdies and was one-under par over the front nine and had one bogie and was one-over par on the back nine to finish with an even-par score of 72. Lauer played so well over the course of the 54-hole tournament that he was never over par at any point during the event.

LAUER IN THE SEMINOLES' TOP-10

Freshman Seath Lauer carded two of Florida State's top-10 scores during the spring of 2007. He carded a career-low 67 in the Hootie at Bulls Bay Invitational and a 68 in the Linger Longer Invitational.

KNIGHT IN THE NCAA'S IN FRESHMAN SEASON

Freshman **Cameron Knight** (Dade City, Fla.) enjoyed a very consistent freshman season and finished his inaugural collegiate season with a 74.65 stroke average. He averaged 72.00 strokes during the 2007 NCAA Championship finals to finish as the Seminoles' third leading golfer in the event. He averaged 74.65 strokes in his first season and had the fifth lowest stroke average among the eight Seminoles who earned playing time during the fall and spring seasons. Knight averaged more than three strokes less during eight events this spring as compared to nine rounds in three events during the fall season.

KNIGHT PLAYS WELL IN NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Freshman **Cameron Knight** played well and finished his play in the NCAA Championship finished in a tie for 49th place after firing a four-over par 74 in the final round. He finished with a 288 total to rank as the Seminoles' third leading golfer in the championship. Knight led the Seminoles in the third round with a career-low 67 to help the team make the top 15 and allow them to play on the final day of the event. He was also very consistent over each day of the NCAA East Regional Championship as he averaged 74.00 strokes per round and did not finish with a score above 75.

JONES KNOWS NCAA SUCCESS

Trey Jones, now in his fourth season as Florida State's head coach, has guided the Seminoles to the NCAA Regional championships in each of the last two years and to a tied for 13th place finish in the 2007 NCAA Championship finals. It marked the sixth time in the 12 seasons as a Division I head coach and the sixth time in the last nine seasons overall that he has guided one of his teams to an NCAA Regional appearance and marked the fourth time during his career that he had guided one of his teams to a top-25 national ranking.

...Led by six scores under 70 by junior **Jonas Blixt** during the spring of 2007, the Seminoles had a total of 15 scores under 70 as a team during the spring of 2007;

...Florida State finished in second place at the prestigious Gator Invitational this spring to mark the second consecutive season the Seminoles have finished in the top three in the team standings at the event in Gainesville, Fla.. The Seminoles finished in third place in the event in 2006;

...Florida State finished the season ranked 15th in the GolfStat Head-to-Head standings. The Seminoles were the third highest ranked ACC team in the final rankings behind only Georgia Tech (ninth) and Clemson (12th);

...Florida State's earned 13 top-10 individual finishes in 12 events during the fall 2006 and spring 2007 seasons;

...Junior All-American **Jonas Blixt** finished the 2006-07 season ranked 19th in the individual national GolfWeek/Sagarin rankings. He was the fourth highest ranking golfer from the ACC;
