KEY NOTES:

* Florida State is playing in the ACC Championship game for the fifth time in school history and for the third time in the last four years. The Seminoles are 0-4-0 all-time in the league title game having faced the Tar Heels in each of their four previous appearances.

* Three of the four title games played between these two schools have been decided by one goal including the last three (2003, 06, 07). Sunday's match-up marks the third time FSU and UNC will play for the ACC Championship in Cary, N.C. (2003, 06, 09).

* This marks the 11th consecutive meeting these two teams has faced each other while ranked in the top 10. Nine of the last 11 games including seven straight have been decided by one goal or less, while five of the last seven contests have been decided in extra periods.

* The Seminoles snapped the Tar Heels 14-game unbeaten streak in the series back on October 22 in Tallahassee as FSU defeated UNC 3-2 in double OT. Sophomore Ella Stephan recorded the game-winner on a header off a corner kick with just 12 seconds remaining in the game.

* The only other victory for FSU in the series came in Tallahassee back in 2000 when the Seminoles posted a 3-2 win in OT. Kristin Boyce scored the golden goal in the 114th minute.

* FSU erased a two-goal deficit to register a hard fought 2-2 tie against UNC in Chapel Hill a season ago. Sanna Talonen tallied both goals as it marked just the second time in UNC school history that the Tar Heels did not win a game after leading at home by two goals.

* Since joining the ACC in 1995, FSU went 0-6-1 in its first six ACC Tournament appearances. The Seminoles have posted a record of 9-6-4 after registering their first win in 2001.

* Florida State is 7-7-5 in ACC Tournament games played in the state of North Carolina. The field at Cary has been a kind one to the Seminoles during the league tournament as FSU is 6-3-3 in six total trips. The Garnet and Gold improved to 9-12-5 all-time in the ACC Tournament following Friday's semifinal victory over Virginia Tech.

FSU IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

Florida State enters the 2009 ACC Tournament in Cary, N.C. as the No. 1 seed for the first time in school history. The Seminoles become just the second school outside the state of North Carolina to claim the top seed in the conference tournament. FSU joins Clemson, who finished first in the league standings with a 5-1-1 record in 2000.

Playing in the ACC finals has been a good omen for FSU in terms of the school's run in the NCAA Tournament. In three of the four years FSU has played for the conference championship, the Seminoles have also advanced to the College Cup - 2003, 2006 and 2007.

With a win over #14 Virginia Tech in the semifinals, FSU improved to 8-1-0 against ranked opponents in 2009 including a mark of 5-1-0 against teams ranked in the top 10.

With 12 goals and 10 assists on the year, Jessica Price became just the second Seminole in school history to record double-digit goals and assists in a single-season. She joins MAC Hermann Trophy Winner Mami Yamaguchi, who finished the 2007 campaign with 24 goals and 18 assists.

Following her three point performance with a goal and as assist against Virginia Tech in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament, Price became just the sixth player in school history, and third in the last three years (Yamaguchi and Katrin Schmidt in 2007) to reach double-digit assists in a single-season.

Redshirt junior Kimmy Diaz recorded her first career victory following FSU's 2-0 win over Virginia Tech in the ACC semifinals. Diaz replaced McNulty at the start of the second half of a scoreless game and played all 45 minutes recording a pair of saves.

FSU is 7-7-5 in 10 all-time appearances when the state of North Carolina serves as host to the ACC Tournament. Sunday's appearance in the championship final marks the fourth time the Seminoles will play for the conference championship in North Carolina including three times at WakeMed Park in Cary (2003, 2006 and 2009).

Since the 2000 ACC Tournament, only North Carolina has advanced to the semifinals more times than FSU. The Seminoles are second behind UNC for the most appearances in the semifinals with seven. Duke and Virginia are tied for third with five.

Other than North Carolina, who has played for the league title every year since the tournament's inception in 1988, Florida State is second all-time in ACC title game appearances with five.

With a top three finish once again in 2009, FSU and UNC are the only teams with seven consecutive top three finishes in the league. The Seminoles have the third-longest streak of being .500 or above in conference play trailing only North Carolina and Virginia. With seven wins in 2009, FSU moved past Virginia into second place for ACC wins since 2000 with 52. The Seminoles are second behind UNC for the fewest losses and for winning percentage in ACC play since 2000.

Leading the way with the most minutes played in the ACC Tournament is senior defender/midfielder **Becky Edwards (710)**. Senior **Lauren Switzer** and junior **Amanda DaCosta** lead all players with two goals each, while sophomores **Tiffany McCarty** and **Jessica Price** are the only other current Seminoles to register a goal. DaCosta leads all current players with six career points on two goals and two assists. Edwards, Price, **Marissa Kazbour** and **Casey Short** all have one assist to their credit. Dating back to 2007, **Erin McNulty** has five career starts in the ACC Tournament. The redshirt sophomore has 16 career saves and has allowed just one goal in over 385 minutes of action. McNulty became the school's all-time career leader in wins in the ACC Tournament as she picked up victory No. 3 in FSU's 2-0 decision over Duke in the first round.

In one-goal games in the ACC Tournament, the Seminoles are 3-3 posting victories over Wake Forest, Maryland and Boston College. The three losses have all come at the hands of North Carolina, with all three defeats coming in the tournament finals including a 1-0 set back in 2007 down in Orlando, Fla. The Seminoles have played to five ties in the tournament and have advanced three of those times via penalty kicks. Florida State is 3-3 in two-goal games and 3-6 in games decided by three or more goals.

For the fifth consecutive year and for the sixth time in the last seven seasons, FSU lost no more than two regular season conference games. From 1995 to 2000, the Seminoles registered just five league wins in 42 games. Since 2001, FSU has posted a record of 50-20-10 in league play averaging more than five wins a season.

Florida State established tournament high following Wednesday's opening round victory over Duke. The Seminoles set team records for most shots in a game with 22 (previous was 16 vs. Maryland, 2003) and most corner kicks with 11 (9 vs. Clemson, 2004). FSU also tied the school record for the most shots taken in the first and second halves with 10 and 12, respectively.

For just the second time in 15 all-time tournament appearances, the Seminoles posted a pair of shutouts following the first two rounds of play. In 2006, FSU went 1-0-1 en route to a berth in the ACC finals. This year marks the first time FSU has posted a pair of shutouts and won both contests. In the process, the Noles extended their school record for the longest consecutive minutes streak without allowing a goal in the ACC Tournament at 354:16, a record that began in the championship game against North Carolina back in 2007.
