The Seminoles are coming off a season in which they won their 11th ACC title and reached an NCAA Regional for the 12th straight year. FSU is one of just 12 NCAA Division I schools to reach the NCAA Softball Championship every year since the new millennium began in 2000.

Going for Lucky 13

The 2012 Florida State Softball team is gunning for its 13th consecutive trip to the NCAA Championship, a streak that is unrivaled in program history.

Last season, the Seminoles earned their 12th straight trip to the postseason following a 4-1 victory over North Carolina in the ACC Championship Game. The streak broke the previous school record of consecutive NCAA trips, which was 11 from 1986-1996.

Since the 1986 season, FSU has failed to make the NCAA postseason just twice - in 1997 and 1999.

The Offensive Replacements

In the 2012 season, Florida State will be without four key offensive players in graduates Jen Lapicki (C), Robin Ahrberg (C/DP), Kristie McConn (2B) and Ashley Stager (SS). The foursome accounted for 60 percent of the team's home run production as well as nearly 45 percent of FSU's RBI total in 2011.

While their talents will be sorely missed, the Seminoles have some exceptional student-athletes who are ready to take their spots. At catcher, sophomore Celeste Gomez will battle heralded freshman Erika Leonard for the starting position.

At second base, fifth-year senior Mallory Borden returns following a season-ending injury early last season. Stager's departure leaves a gap at shortstop, but redshirt freshman Mad-die O'Brien is one to keep an eye on at the position.

Alameda Searching for 300

Fourth-year FSU softball head coach Lonni Alameda is searching for another milestone victory in her career as she looks to amass 300 wins.

Alameda, who played both softball and volleyball at Oklahoma, holds a career record of 277-220-1 in stints that include five years at UNLV. In all three seasons of coaching at FSU, she has led the Seminoles to an appearance in the ACC Championship Game, including a conference title in 2011.

Heading to Hawaii

In a season-long schedule that features several entertaining tournaments and matchups, one of the most exciting trips occurs March 2-6 when FSU heads to the Hawaii Classic in Honolulu.

In the Aloha State, the Seminoles face three opponents in UC Santa Barbara, Hawaii twice and Radford for a total of five games. The trip to Honolulu also offers a homecoming for sophomore centerfielder Courtney Senas, who hails from Wahiawa which is located on the island of Oahu.

FSU Exposure

As part of the ACC's enhanced Olympic sports package with ESPN, FSU softball will be hosting a pair of Monday night games that will air on ESPNU at JoAnne Graf Field.

The first broadcast features the Seminoles and conference rival North Carolina on April 2 at 7 p.m. Although UNC swept FSU in Chapel Hill last season, the Seminoles responded by earning a 4-1 victory in the conference championship game over the Tar Heels in Atlanta for the school's 11th ACC title.

Another ACC foe in Georgia Tech comes to Tallahassee and will battle the Seminoles on April 16 in front of an ESPNU audience. Last season, the Seminoles took one of three versus the nationally-ranked Yellow Jackets on the road. In 2009 and 2010, Georgia Tech defeated FSU in consecutive ACC Championship Games.

In addition, the Sunday double-headers for the North Carolina and Georgia Tech series will be streamed on ESPN3.com, giving FSU softball at least six games this season affiliated with ESPN.

ESPNU reaches nearly 73 million households worldwide. ESPN3.com is a streaming service that offers games worldwide and is compatible with many cable providers.

Tournament Tested

On this year's schedule for FSU, there are six opponents who qualified for last season's NCAA Championship.

Included in that bunch is Women's College World Series participant Florida, which comes to Tallahassee on April 4 for a 6 p.m. tilt.

FSU's five other reigning NCAA postseason opponents did not get past the opening regional round. Southeastern Conference opponent LSU will host FSU early in the year on Feb. 15 at 7 p.m. ET. The other road opponent includes Maryland (May 5-6), while FSU hosts North Dakota State (Feb. 18), Tennessee-Chattanooga (March 13) and Georgia Tech (April 15-16).

Pitching Prowess

It is fully expected that the Seminoles will regain their swagger in the circle in 2012 thanks to some talented arms that provide the group with great depth.

Set to make her Seminole debut is redshirt junior Monica Perry (Whitesburg, Ga.), a quality transfer from the University of Illinois. In two years for the Illini, Perry went 49-22 with a 3.25 ERA and 394 strikeouts as the team's ace. She was forced to sit out last season at FSU due to late transfer rules.

Redshirt sophomore Jessica Nori (Weston, Fla.) gained tremendous experience last season by finishing 8-5 with a 2.84 ERA. She should form a quality tandem with Perry to help carry the Seminoles.

Playing an enormous role in 2012 will be freshman pitcher Lacey Waldrop (Colonial Heights, Va.), one of the nation's best pitchers in the 2011 recruiting class who has pitched extremely well in the offseason. Aside from earning time in key weekend series, Waldrop could develop into a strong starter for mid-week games.

Fellow freshman Bailey Schinella (Valrico, Fla.) will also look for time in the circle as she continues to develop. Junior Morgan Bullock (Dacula, Ga.) is also an option for FSU as she finished 5-4 last year in 19 appearances.



Nori's Glory

Redshirt sophomore pitcher Jessica Nori expects to bolster this year's pitching staff again in what will be her second year of actual playing experience. However, her path to the circle is very unique.

As a true freshman walk-on in 2010, Nori did not make the roster due to the team's surplus of pitchers. However, head coach Lonni Alameda decided to keep her on as a team manager to keep her within the program and allow her to develop her game.

In 2011, Nori officially made the team and even earned a spot in the rotation. She made the most of her opportunity, showing off her blazing speed after working arduously to prove she belonged on the squad. The crowning moment came when she delivered both of FSU's victories in last year's NCAA Tournament, allowing just one run in 9.1 innings pitched versus Georgia State and UAB.

Shayla's Senior Year

Consistency is the proper term to highlight senior outfielder Shayla Jackson's first three years at FSU.

The Pembroke Pines, Fla., native has been consistently good as a member of the Garnet and Gold. As a left-handed slap hitter, she shows a .332 career batting average and has struck out just 37 times in 589 plate appearances, an average of once every 16 times she steps to the dish.

Jackson joins teammates Mallory Borden and Tiffani Brown as the team's three captains this year. She is coming off a season in which she was named to the All-ACC Team and was the 18th hardest player to strike out in the nation. Entering her senior year, the criminology major is within reasonable striking distance of placing in the Top 10 in career base hits, doubles and triples at FSU.

Modish Maddie

Redshirt freshman shortstop Maddie O'Brien is a very interesting figure. She came to FSU as a heralded recruit in the 2010 recruiting class, being named an ESPN Rise First Team All-American and a MaxPreps/Gatorade First Team All-American.

While she came in as a possible contributor right away, her first season was taken away after suffering a nagging ankle injury in the fall 2010 that wouldn't go away. This season, O'Brien looks to fulfill her hype as she enjoyed a productive offseason at shortstop and maintained her smooth hitting stroke at the plate.

In addition to what could be her breakthrough season, O'Brien has an incredible fashion sense that makes

her a very interesting player. She is a major in retail merchandising at FSU and hopes to design her own clothing line someday. While her commitment level is incredibly high to the game she is so talented at, you can always find her keeping up on everything involving the wide world of glitz and glamour.

Tireless Tiffani Brown

One of the ACC's most exciting student-athletes to watch is junior infielder Tiffani Brown. The Tallahassee resident possesses an incredibly vibrant personality and is one of the team's most energetic players with a constant motor.

Brown, who was a cheerleader-turned-softball player at Godby High School, is a skilled base stealer and extremely fast down the baselines. As a sophomore, she led FSU in five categories in what was another strong season for the criminology major and computer science minor.

Meet The Assistant Coaches

During the offseason, the FSU softball program took in two new assistant coaches who will be making their debuts this season in Craig Snider and Travis Wilson.

Both coaches have a tremendous background, and have already helped several student-athletes improve their individual game exponentially.

Snider is an offensive guru from Franklin, Ky., who has worked for Lindsey Wilson College, Centenary, Oklahoma and most recently Stephen F. Austin. In four seasons, he helped increase the Ladyjacks' team batting average from .229 in 2007 to .274 in 2008, .275 in 2009 and .278 in 2010.

Wilson also has an interesting background, serving as a baseball, softball and cricket veteran. The New Zealand native will help benefit FSU at the plate and in the field through his teachings learned in seven seasons with the Atlanta Braves and Cincinnati Reds organizations. He also was a former standout in New Zealand for the Black Sox.

The Future is Bright

It has always been said that recruiting is the lifeblood for your program. With such being the case, the Seminole Softball program appears to be in great hands for years to come.

FSU's 2012 recruiting class that officially signed last fall is ready to make an impact in the 2013 season, and points to the positive direction that the program has maintained for years.

Included in the stellar class is nationally-acclaimed pitcher Jessica Burroughs, a Houston County, Ga., native

who could be touted as one of the top freshman pitchers in the country next year. High School All-American outfielder Stephanie Hartness (Niceville, Fla.) is also a heralded signee who will undoubtedly benefit the program.

Another in-state talent in utility player Alex Powers (Melbourne, Fla.) will bring big-time numbers to the college game after leading Eau Gallie High School to a Florida 5A state championship.

Outfielder Alex Kossoff (Redondo Beach, Calif.) will add another speed threat to the Seminoles as well as an outfield presence. Lastly, infielder Kaitlin Allen (Tulsa, Okla.) will provide quality depth after batting .396 in her final season at Jenks High School.
