



PERSONNEL

- ◊ Scored nine of her 11 points in the final 7:17 at Georgia Tech, including 4-of-4 FTs in the final 32 seconds to help ice the victory.
- ◊ Averaged 13.8 ppg during the first four games following the holiday break (Dec. 28-Jan. 10)...and upped her season average to 10.0 ppg in the process.
- ◊ Tabbed as SEC Player of the Week on Feb. 4, following a career-high 25-point outburst in a 75-71 upset of No. 8 Kentucky.
- ◊ For the week, averaged 18.0 points in victories over Alabama and Kentucky by connecting on 52.6 percent of her FGs, 42.9 percent of her 3-point FGs and 90.0 percent of her FTs.
- ◊ Her 25 points and five 3-pointers made at Kentucky represented the most in a game for the Lady Bulldogs during 2012-13.

2011-12 Season

- ◊ Named honorable mention All-SEC by the AP.
- ◊ Among SEC leaders, ranked No. 12 in scoring, No. 2 in 3-pointers per game, No. 3 in minutes played, No. 6 in 3-point FG pct. and No. 8 in steals.

- ◊ Equaled Jasmine Hassell for team-high honors with 23 double-digit scoring performances.
- ◊ Led UGA offensively in seven games – Georgetown, Montanta State, Appalachian State, Florida (at home), Mississippi State (at home), LSU and Marist.
- ◊ Connected on 72 3-pointers, the sixth-best single-season effort in Lady Bulldog annals.
- ◊ Attempted 203 shots from behind the 3-point arc, the fourth-most in a season in program history.
- ◊ Accounted for 49.0 percent of Georgia's 3-pointers overall (72-of-147) as well as 49.2 percent in SEC play (34-of-69).
- ◊ All told, 51.4 percent of her field goals made – 72-of-140 – were from behind the 3-point arc.
- ◊ Extremely hot early against TCU, scoring 14 first-half points and connecting on 4-of-7 3-point FGs.
- ◊ The only Lady Bulldog to reach double figures in the scoring column in each of UGA's first four games...a streak that eventually extended to seven outings.
- ◊ Exploded for a season-high 23 points against Appalachian State, including 17 in the second half.
- ◊ Played the final 3:13 of the first half and the entire second stanza at point guard against Appalachian State as Jasmine James missed the contest with a sprained knee and Meredith Mitchell (who started at point) took an inadvertent elbow to her right eye.

- ◊ Scored a game-high 21 points against Marist in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

2010-11 Season

- ◊ Named to the coaches' All-SEC Freshman team.
- ◊ Three-time SEC Freshman of the Week honoree – Jan. 3, Jan. 20 and Feb. 7.
- ◊ In stat leaders for SEC games only, ranked No. 24 in scoring (10.7 ppg), No. 2 in 3-point FG pct. (.379) and No. 5 in 3-pointers per game (2.1).
- ◊ Georgia's leading scorer in seven games – Loyola Marymount, Mercer, South Carolina (in Athens), at Kentucky, Alabama (twice) and Auburn.
- ◊ Became the 67th – of now 73 – freshman to start for Andy Landers at Georgia against TCU.
- ◊ Provided significantly increased contributions following Christmas...after posting two double-digit scoring outputs in the first 11 games before the holidays, had 12 such outings in the 23 games thereafter.
- ◊ At Florida International, was 4-of-4 from the line in the final 43 seconds after the Panthers pulled within three with five seconds remaining.
- ◊ Scored 12 first-half points in the SEC opener against South Carolina by hitting all four 3s she attempted, including a 24-footer with three seconds left in the period.

- ◇ The Wildcats tied the game four times in the second half. On three of those occasions, Miller answered with a bucket to give the lead back to Georgia.
- ◇ Knocked down the game-winning three with 13.8 seconds left at No. 20 Arkansas.
- ◇ Tabbed SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 6 after averaging 15.5 points by shooting 61.1 from the field, 54.5 from 3-point range and 75.0 from the free throw line in victories over Arkansas and Alabama.
- ◇ Knocked down six threes against Auburn, the most by any Georgia player during 2010-11 and tying the No. 5 mark in Lady Bulldog history.

High School

- ◇ Coached by Vernise Harris-Hill at Douglass High.
- ◇ Named 2010 Miss Georgia Basketball as the all-classification player of the year by the Georgia Sports Writers Association (GSWA).

- ◇ Named SEC Freshman of the Week on Jan. 3 after averaging 13.0 points while connecting on 44.8 percent of her field goals, 50.0 percent of her 3-pointers and 71.4 percent of her free throws in games versus Louisiana Tech, Florida International and South Carolina.
- ◇ Tabbed SEC Freshman of the Week for the second straight time on Jan. 10 after exploding for 24 points at No. 10 Kentucky. Her scoring and field goals made (10) at Kentucky were season-high tallies for the team.

- ◇ Rated as the nation's No. 33 overall prospect by the All-Star Girls' Report, as well as No. 36 by Hoopgurlz, No. 40 by Blue Star, No. 42 by Peach State Hoops and No. 57 by the Collegiate Girls Basketball Report.
- ◇ Named honorable mention All-America by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.
- ◇ Tabbed AAAAAA Player of the Year by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution as a senior.
- ◇ A three-time, first-team GSWA all-state pick in Class AAAAA, earning such status as a sophomore, junior and senior.
- ◇ A four-year starter who helped Douglass to a combined 80-33 record over that span including trips to the semifinals and quarterfinals of the 5A state tourney in 2007 and 2008, respectively.
