## GEORGIA BEGINS POSTSEASON PLAY AT SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Georgia women's golf team hopes to continue to build upon the obvious momentum from its last two regular-season events when the Bulldogs open postseason play at the SEC Championships this weekend.

Georgia finished as runner-up at the Bryan National Collegiate three weeks ago. Nine of the Bulldogs' counting rounds that weekend were par-or-better tallies, a mark that is even more impressive considering sophomore Rinko Mitsunaga was not on the lineup for the first time in her career due to a slight back injury.

The following weekend, Georgia supplied the individual medalist and finished first in both the stroke and match play portions of the 45th annual Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic. Jillian Hollis notched the individual win with a 5-under 67 that was three shots better than the field. The Bulldogs earned a six-shot win in stroke play qualifying and then marched through the match play bracket as well. Harang Lee and Bailey Tardy both were 3-0 in match play for Georgia.

"We're playing our best golf of the spring and continue to work hard," head coach Josh Brewer said. "Hopefully, the momentum from the Liz Murphey carries over to this weekend."

The SECs will be contested at Greystone Golf and Country Club in Birmingham for the fifth straight year, the third time on the club's Legacy Course. One switch from previous years is pairings in twosomes. Georgia is the tourney's No. 2 seed and will play Friday's opening round with top-seeded and No. 1-ranked Alabama, teeing off beginning at 10:28 ET.

The field for the SECs is, as usual, stacked with many of the nation's top teams. Six of the league's 14 schools are currently ranked in the top-25 by both Golfstat and Golfweek.

The Golfstat ledger features No. 1 Alabama, No. 6 Georgia, No. 8 Florida, No. 11 South Carolina, No. 13 Arkansas and No. 20 Texas A&M.

In the Golfweek poll, Alabama is No. 1, Florida is No. 6, Georgia is No. 7, South Carolina is No. 11, Arkansas is No. 12 and Texas A&M is No. 21.

Georgia's lineup for the SECs will consist of the same quintet of Bulldogs for five of six spring events - Hollis, Lee, Mitsunaga, Mary Ellen Shuman and Tardy.

"They know what this means, the opportunity to play for an SEC Championship and after that a national championship," Brewer said. "They're as motivated as any group I've had in my five seasons at Georgia, and they just want a chance come Sunday to win. If they play well, we'll definitely have that chance. They're ready. I've seen them all week."

Those golfers have combined to post 38 of Georgia's 39 par-or-better individual rounds this season, as well as 13 of 14 top-10 and 23 of 26 top-20 individual finishes during 2016-17.

## UGA'S SEC TOURNEY HISTORY

Georgia has captured a league-leading 19 SEC Women's Golf Championships all-time. Georgia has won 11 team and eight individual titles (years listed at the bottom of this page).

Florida ranks second with 17 conference championships, eight team and nine individual titles, while Auburn ranks third with 15 crowns, nine team and six individual.

UGA, UF and AU own 51 of the combined 72 SEC titles all-time in women's golf, while the other 11 league schools have captured the other 21 (eight team and 13 individual).

## GEORGIA EARNS TROPHIES

Georgia has earned five titles to date during the 2016-17 season, three team crowns and two individual honors.

The Bulldogs swept the season-opening Cardinal Kickoff in September. Harang Lee shot 3-under 141 to share medalist honors with Auburn's Elena Hualde and lead Georgia to a six-shot win in the team competition.

Georgia also won the Windy City Collegiate in October for a second straight year. Bailey Tardy, Jillian Hollis and Lee all finished among the top-10 individuals en route to leading the Bulldogs to a four-shot win over Stanford.

Georgia returned to the winner's circle at the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic, where the Bulldogs officially earned three trophies. Hollis was medalist and UGA captured the team titles in both stroke and match play.

## UGA ALSO WELL REPRESENTED IN INDIVIDUAL RANKINGS

Four Georgia golfers are currently in the top 50 in rankings of both Golfstat and Golfweek.

According to Golfstat, Bailey Tardy is No. 15, Harang Lee is No. 25, Jillian Hollis is No. 26 and Rinko Mitsunaga is No. 43.

**A VERY SUCCESSFUL SUMMER**

Georgia golfers compiled a long list of impressive results during the summer of 2016. Most notably, Rinko Mitsunaga and Bailey Tardy earned spots in the field for the U.S. Women's Open. Mitsunaga did so by winning a qualifier at Sugar Mill Country Club in New Smyrna Beach, Fla., while Tardy won a qualifier at Butler (Pa.) Country Club outside Pittsburgh.

Tardy was a member of the U.S. team for the Curtis Cup at Dun Laoghaire Golf Club in Enniskerry, Ireland.

Mitsunaga, Isabella Skinner and Bailey Tardy qualified for the U.S. Women's Amateur. All three Bulldogs advanced to the match play bracket before bowing out of the field.

Jillian Hollis won the Women's Western Amateur. Each of her six matches went the distance, or more, and all told, Hollis played 164 holes of golf over six days at the Western.

Hollis also received an exemption into the LPGA's Marathon Classic presented by Owens Corning and O-I in Sylvania, Ohio.

Harang Lee finished as runner-up in the Spanish Amateur, her fifth top-10 and seventh top-20 performance in the last seven editions of the event. Lee also helped Spain to a runner-up finish at the European Ladies' Team Championships and tied for 30th at the European Ladies' Amateur.

**BULLDOGS SHATTER SCHOOL TOURNEY SCORE RECORD**

The 2016-17 Bulldogs broke the school record for 54-hole tournament score during the fall campaign. Georgia shot 19-under at the Annika Intercollegiate Presented by 3M to better the existing mark by five strokes.

The previous record was 14-under at the 2009 Cougar Classic.

Over the past two seasons, the Bulldogs have now posted five of the top-six scores in school history. In addition to the school-

record performance, Georgia also shot 12-under at the 2015 Windy City Collegiate, 10-under at both the 2015 Mason Rudolph and the 2016 Windy City Collegiate and 6-under at the 2016 NCAA Bryan Regional.

**WELCOME TO THE TEAM**

Georgia's roster grew by two members since the start of the season. In October, Emilie Meason, a four-time All-American for Georgia from 2010-13 as the former Emilie Burger, was named as volunteer coach. In February, assistant coach Whitney Wade and her husband Chase welcomed their first son, Jackson.

# JOSH BREWER

**Head Coach** ♦ **Fifth Season at Georgia** ♦ **Indiana '98**

- ♦ Named UGA's fifth women's golf coach on June 12, 2012.
- ♦ During his tenure, the Bulldogs have garnered 20 titles (10 individual and 10 team), including sweeping the 2016 NCAA Bryan Regional.
- ♦ Led Georgia to a runner-up finish at the 2013 SEC Championships during his first season.

## COACHING CAREER

- ♦ Joined the staff for the men's team at Indiana as an assistant coach in 2002 and served in that role for six seasons with the Hoosiers.
- ♦ During that time, Indiana was represented in NCAA Championships each year. After competing in Regionals in 2004, 2005 and 2006, the Hoosiers returned to the NCAA Championships as a team in 2008, their first appearance since Brewer's sophomore year in 1996.
- ♦ All told, helped coach two All-Americans, three Big Ten Players of the Year, two Palmer Cup members, one Walker Cup member and four scholastic All-Americans while at IU.
- ♦ In 2008, became assistant coach for both the men's and women's golf teams at Southern Cal.

- ♦ Helped USC produce two PAC-10 Championship teams and golfers who won National Player of the Year, National Freshman of the Year, 12 All-America certificates, three PAC-10 Player of the Year awards and two PAC-10 Freshman of the Year accolades. In addition, USC had two Curtis Cup and two Palmer Cup golfers.
- ♦ Finalist for the 2010 Jan Strickland Award for the top men's golf assistant coach in the nation.

## PLAYING CAREER

- ♦ Was a four-year letterwinner at Indiana from 1994-98.
- ♦ Helped lead IU to the 1996 NCAA Championships, a 1997 NCAA Regional bid and the 1998 Big Ten title.
- ♦ Finished second individually at the 1998 Big Tens as a senior, birdied the final two holes to secure a one-stroke win for the Hoosiers.
- ♦ Named All-Big Ten in 1998, an All-American Scholar in 1997 and 1998 and Academic All-Big Ten in 1996, 1997 and 1998.
- ♦ After winning the 1998 Indiana State Amateur crown, began a career in private industry as a financial advisor with Linsco/Private Ledger in Indianapolis.
- ♦ Three falls later, returned to the IU campus to share his experiences in golf and school and the transition to professional life with the current team. Enjoyed the interaction so well that he decided to return to golf in the coaching ranks.

- ♦ Skyrocketed from No. 89 to No. 9 in the AJGA/Polo rankings from 2013 to 2014, largely due to five top-5 finishes in nine AJGA national events during that span.
- ♦ Top 2015 results include a win at the Golfweek Junior Tour at Windmill Lakes and fifth-place showings at the AJGA Rolex Girls Junior and the Scott Robertson Memorial.
- ♦ In 2014, won the AJGA Junior at Sugar Valley, tied for third at The Ping Invitational, finished fifth at the AJGA Girls Championship and the Scott Robertson Memorial and placed 10th at the AJGA Rolex Tournament of Champions and the Rolex Girls Junior Championship.

## 2016-17 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ Has participated in six tournaments, playing an abbreviated fall schedule because she also took part in LPGA Q-School and the World Team Amateur.
- ◆ Posted counting rounds in all 13 team loops this season.
- ◆ Captured her first collegiate victory at the Cardinal Kickoff, where she shot 3-under 141 in the one-day, 36-hole event to tie fellow Spaniard Elena Hualde.
- ◆ Tied for 20th at the first stage of LPGA Q-School by shooting 1-under 215 in Rancho Mirage, Calif., but failed to advance to the final stage.
