No. 12 Tech Hosts Lipscomb for Weekend Series to Open 2009 Campaign

The Georgia Tech baseball team, ranked as high as No. 12 in the preseason polls after ending the 2008 season with a 41-21 record, hosts Lipscomb (33-30), a team the Yellow Jackets defeated in the 2008 NCAA Tournament, on Opening Day Friday, Feb. 20. First pitch for the season opener is 4 p.m., and the Yellow Jackets and Bisons will continue the series Saturday and Sunday, with 2 p.m. start times both days.

Georgia Tech is a consensus preseason top-25 team, appearing among the top-15 in the Collegiate Baseball (12), USA Today (12), NCBWA (13) and Rivals.com (13) polls. The Yellow Jackets have earned preseason top-25 rankings in each of head coach Danny Hall's 16 years on the Flats.

Georgia Tech returns 21 letterwinners from its 2008 squad, including seven starters in the field - CF **Jeff Rowland** (.335-4-26-22), SS **Derek Dietrich** (.332-14-66-3), OF/DH **Luke Murton** (.332-12-51-3), C **Jason Haniger** (.329-10-34-4), 1B **Tony Plagman** (.306-16-45-3), 2B **Thomas Nichols** (.283-7-36-0) and LF **Chris House** (.245-1-10-5). Third baseman **Patrick Long** also returns for his junior season after batting .276 a season ago.

Team Updates

Georgia Tech - The Yellow Jackets return a veteran group in the field, with the question marks coming on the mound, at least to begin the 2009 campaign. Even with the experience returning, a couple of freshmen are expected to have immediate impacts in the lineup, including third baseman **Matt Skole** and designated hitter/right-handed pitcher **Jake Davies**. Both could challenge for starting roles early in the season. On the mound, the Jackets return two of their four starters from a year ago, including sophomore ace **Deck McGuire**, who ended his freshman campaign with a team-best eight wins and just one loss. **Zach Von Tersch** is back for his second year in the starting rotation, and **Brandon Cumpton** will anchor as Tech's Sunday starter to begin the year. Cumpton started five games in his 2008 freshman campaign, but he's expected to be challenged by a couple of other underclassmen in sophomore **Kevin Jacob** (0-0, 4.50 ERA in 2008) and freshmen **Jacob Esch** and **Jed Bradley**. Davies could also see time in a starting role off the mound in 2009, but will likely begin the season in the bullpen.

Lipscomb - The Bisons enter the season with a talented 1-2 punch on the mound, as junior left-hander Rex Brothers and senior righty Brandon McClurg take the mound Friday and Saturday, respectively. Brothers was impressive in his last start, picking up a win against Georgia in the opening game of the 2008 NCAA Athens Regional. McClurg took the mound against the Yellow Jackets, tossing an impressive 7.2 innings while striking out six. The Bisons return 18 letterwinners from their 2008 squad that finished 33-30 and have five starters returning in 2009.

Tech vs. Lipscomb (Tech leads, 2-0)

Georgia Tech and Lipscomb have met just twice in history - and only once in the last 40 years. The Yellow Jackets have won both meetings, defeating the Bisons, 9-2, on April 29, 1967, and 6-3, in the 2008 NCAA Athens Regional.

The win over the Bisons didn't come easily for the Jackets last season. With the score tied at 3-3 in the top of the eighth inning, Brad Feltes sent a two-run double into the right-centerfield gap to put the Jackets up by two, and Tech added an insurance run on an RBI single by Charlie Blackmon in the top of the ninth for the final margin.

Tech has never faced Lipscomb outside of the state of Georgia. The first game of the series occurred on the Jackets' home field.

Jackets in Season and Home Openers

Georgia Tech is 59-47-3 in season openers and 40-21-2 when the season opener occurs at home. The Yellow Jackets have fared well in season openers under head coach Danny Hall, posting an 11-4 record in such games since his arrival prior to the 1994 season. Tech has opened the season at home on just five occasions under Hall, going 4-1 in those contests.

The Yellow Jackets' home field has been good to them in home openers, as Georgia Tech has a sterling 75-29-3 record in its first game at home each season, and the Yellow Jackets have lost just one home opener (14-1) under Hall. That loss occurred in 2005 to crosstown rival Georgia State.

The Hall Era at Georgia Tech

Georgia Tech is 652-294 in 15 seasons under head coach Danny Hall, a winning percentage of .689 and an average of 43.7 wins per season. Over the last seven seasons, Hall has led Tech to the College World Series (2002 and 2006), ACC tournament championship (2003 and 2005) and ACC regular season championship (2004 and 2005). Hall, the 2005 ACC Coach of the Year, became Georgia Tech's all-time winningest coach in an 11-10 win at Miami on March 27, 2005.

The Yellow Jackets have made 13 NCAA appearances in 15 years under Hall. Tech has won six NCAA regionals and finished second in three others, and advanced to the championship game of the College World Series in his first season in 1994. The Yellow Jackets have made CWS trips under Hall in 1994, 2002 and 2006.

Hall was named the ACC Coach of the Year and National Coach of the Year (by The Sporting News) in 1997 after leading the Jackets to an ACC regular season title, and was again tabbed the ACC's Coach of the year in 2000 after leading Tech to the ACC regular season and tournament championships. He earned his third ACC Coach of the Year award in 2005.

Tech is 242-137 vs. the ACC under Hall, finishing third or better in nine of his 15 years.

Along the way, 84 of his players at Tech have gone on to play professional baseball, 27 have earned All-America honors and 71 have made the All-ACC team; 124 have made the ACC Academic Honor Roll and 16 have been named either Academic All-America or All-District honorees.

Georgia Tech Cracks Preseason Top 25 for 16th Time Under Hall

Georgia Tech has been ranked in the preseason Top 25 by at least one of the major polls (*Baseball America*, *Collegiate Baseball*, *USA Today/Baseball Weekly*) in each of Danny Hall's 16 seasons as the Yellow Jackets' skipper. Tech has been a preseason Top 10 pick in six of the last 11 years and a top five selection in four of the last nine seasons.

Tech Picked to Finish Second in Coastal Division

Georgia Tech was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division race according to the 2009 ACC Preseason Coaches Poll, voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Coastal Division leader North Carolina, who has earned a trip to Omaha each of the last three seasons, was the overall favorite, finishing with 72 votes, five ahead of Florida State, who led all Atlantic Division teams with 67 votes.

The Yellow Jackets (56 votes) and 2008 ACC Champion Miami (49 votes) followed North Carolina in the Coastal Division standings, with Virginia (34), Duke (24) and Virginia Tech (17) rounding out the list. Behind the Seminoles in the Atlantic Division race were Clemson (61), NC State (50), Wake Forest (33), Boston College (25) and Maryland (16).

Draft Dodgers

Six current Georgia Tech players have previously been drafted seven times by Major League teams. The highest concentration of drafted players ever on one Yellow Jacket team occurred in 2000 and 2003. Those teams featured 11 players previously drafted.

The 2009 list includes **Derek Dietrich** (3rd, Astros, 2007), **Jason Haniger** (19th, Pirates, 2008), **Brandon Miller** (33rd, Red Sox, 2008), **Luke Murton** (40th, Yankees, 2007; 33rd, Diamondbacks, 2008), **Mark Pope** (17th, Braves, 2008) and **Zach Von Tersch** (38th, Nationals, 2006).

In the Bigs

In 2008, Georgia Tech set an all-time high when 12 of its alumni baseball players appeared on major league rosters, breaking the previous season-high of 11, set in 2003.

Former All-America third baseman Mark Teixeira began the season in Atlanta as a member of the Braves before being traded to the Los Angeles Angels prior to the trade deadline. He signed an eight-year, \$180 million contract with the New York Yankees during the offseason.

Jason Varitek, one of three first-team All-Americans on Tech's 1994 team and the captain of the Red Sox, played his 11th full season in Boston, leading his team to the American League Championship Series. Nomar Garciaparra, another member of Tech's 1994 College World Series runner-up team, spent his third season in Los Angeles, helping the Dodgers to the National League Championship Series, while Jay Payton, his former Yellow Jacket teammate, played for the Baltimore Orioles for the second-straight season.

Matt Murton and Eric Patterson, teammates from 2001-02 at Georgia Tech, began their second year as Chicago Cubs teammates before being traded to the Oakland Athletics in a package deal.

Speaking of teammates, Marlon Byrd, in his second year with the Texas Rangers in 2008, welcomed a Major League newcomer to Arlington when former Yellow Jacket Brandon Boggs was called up in late April. Boggs proceeded to play in over 100 games for the Rangers, recording over 25 extra-base hits in his rookie campaign. Byrd wasn't too shabby himself for Texas, belting 10 home runs in addition to 28 doubles during the season.

He may not have been stationed in Arlington, but David Newhan made his state of Texas debut by playing over 60 games for the Houston Astros, while Kevin Cameron spent his second season with the San Diego Padres.

Micah Owings, the hard-hitting pitcher from Gainesville, Ga., began the season with the Arizona Diamondbacks, but finished the year as a member of the Cincinnati Reds.

And the final member of Tech's alumni class in the Majors in 2008? That would be none other than Jason Perry - who was released by Detroit during spring training, but picked up by the Braves organization. He spent the majority of the season between Mississippi and Richmond before making his major league debut July 4th. He became the first player in Atlanta history to record a triple in his first career at bat.

The "Rusty C"

Affectionately known as the "Rusty C," a new era in Russ Chandler Stadium began in 2002 with a \$9.7 million reconstruction of the facility. The current facility seats 4,157 with room for future expansion down the left field line.

The stadium was originally built in 1985, in time for Tech to host the ACC Tournament. It has been the site of eight NCAA Regional tournaments (1987, 1993, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006) and an exhibition game between the Yellow Jackets and the first team from the Soviet Union to tour the United States (1989).

In the summer of 1996, Russ Chandler Stadium served as an official training site for the Centennial Olympic Games.

Rose Bowl Field, the tract of land on which the stadium sits, which includes the adjacent football practice fields, has been the site of Tech baseball since 1930, when the field was built with funds from Tech's 1929 Rose Bowl appearance.

Tech was 486-125 in the old Russ Chandler Stadium, a winning percentage of .798.

Streking in the ACC

Georgia Tech has enjoyed unprecedented success within the Atlantic Coast Conference since 2004, winning the ACC regular season title in 2004 with an 18-5 league record and again in 2005 with a 22-8 mark. Tech had a conference-record 25-game ACC win streak in 2004-05.

The Yellow Jackets are 88-52 (.629) in their last 140 ACC regular season games.

The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 13 straight ACC series wins in 2004-05, and Tech has won 31 of its last 47 weekend series, including five this season. Tech has won 51 of its last 72 ACC home games and 37 of its last 67 ACC road games.

27-Straight

With a win in the series opener at Boston College, Georgia Tech eclipsed the 20-win mark for the 27th-consecutive season. With a win in the series opener against Wake Forest, the Yellow Jackets eclipsed the 30-win mark for the 26th-straight year.

Georgia Tech has won 20+ games 34 times in history and reached 30 wins on 28 occasions. The Jackets are four wins shy of reaching the 40-win plateau for the 20th time in history.

Yellow Jackets in the RPI

Georgia Tech enters the weekend ranked No. 7 in the nation in the most updated RPI (source: *BoydWorld.com*). (The NCAA releases its RPI just once a week - Tech's latest ranking in that poll was No. 8 when it was released Sunday, May 11).

The Atlantic Coast Conference is well represented in the most updated RPI, with five teams ranked among the top 25 in the nation. North Carolina leads all conference teams, standing at No. 1 in the RPI, while Miami (2), Florida State (3), Georgia Tech and NC State (12) join the Tar Heels in the top-25.

Two of the Yellow Jackets' 2008 non-conference opponents also appear in the top-25 of the RPI - Coastal Carolina (9) and Georgia (10).

Georgia Tech is scheduled to play no fewer than 15 games against teams that currently appear in the top-25 in the RPI this season, with eight of those contests coming on the road.

Virginia currently stands just outside the top-25 at No. 26 in the RPI.

In terms of schedule strength, Georgia Tech is ranked No. 28 while Virginia's schedule stands at No. 62 in the latest rankings.

22-3 Out of Conference

While the Jackets have gone 14-13 through the first 27 conference games of the season, they have been impressive against out-of-conference foes, posting a sterling 22-3 non-conference record in 2008.

The Yellow Jackets are batting .322 against non-conference opponents, led by the hot-hitting Charlie Blackmon, who has blistered non-conference foes for a .392 average and 16 extra-base hits in 25 games. Four other Yellow Jackets are also batting above .350 against non-ACC teams.

Tech's pitching staff has also performed well out-of-conference, posting a 3.49 ERA while opponents are hitting just .247 against them. Deck McGuire has been the primary reason for Tech's non-conference success, as the rookie has gone 8-1 with 58 K and a 3.62 ERA in 64.2 non-conference innings pitched. Those opponents are hitting just .242 against him.

Georgia Tech vs. In-State Opponents

Georgia Tech went 5-6 against teams from the state of Georgia in 2007 but won 11 games against Georgia Southern, Kennesaw State, Georgia State, Mercer and Georgia to go 11-1 against state of Georgia opponents this season. Tech's lone loss came this week when the Jackets fell to No. 7 Georgia, 3-2, at Turner Field.

Since 1999, the Yellow Jackets own an 88-27 (.765) record against its in-state foes. In 15 years under head coach Danny Hall, Tech is 131-44 (.749) against teams from Georgia.

In 2008, Tech is hitting .335 with 56 extra base hits (28 of which are home runs) against teams from the state of Georgia, led by Luke Murton (.475, 7 HR, 18 RBI, 1 SB) and Charlie Blackmon (.449-3-9-6) while Derek Dietrich and Tony Plagman are batting .373 and .372, respectively. The Jackets' pitching staff has posted a 3.50 ERA against instate foes, while opponents are managing just a .260 batting average against them.

Power Surge

The Yellow Jacket offense has already hit 85 home runs in 2008, which is 35 more than Georgia Tech hit in all of 2007. Tech's 85 home runs leads all conference teams, and ranks seventh in the nation.

The Jackets have also been blessed with a balance of power in 2008, as four different players have hit 10 home runs already this season while two others have eight in 2008. Tony Plagman is tied for second in the league with 15 home runs and Derek Dietrich and Brad Feltes stand one behind Plagman with 14 home runs apiece. Luke Murton has added 10 home runs in 2008.

Tech has belted 40 home runs in its last 16 games, including three at Georgia last week, 10 in the three-game series against Coastal Carolina, eight in the weekend series against Wake Forest and eight in a single game at Mercer. The Yellow Jackets have homered in 17 of their last 20 games and have 22 multi-home run games in 2008.

Ain't That Grand?

Speaking of power numbers, the Yellow Jackets have made the best of their home runs in 2008, smacking seven grand

Brad Feltes leads all players in grand slams, as four of the senior third baseman's 14 home runs have come with the bases loaded. Derek Dietrich, Luke Murton and Thomas Nichols have provided the other three for the Yellow Jackets this season.

Tech has hit two grand slams in the same game just once, and that occurred when Feltes and Murton both had grand slams against Georgia Southern (4/16) ... The Jackets have hit grand slams in four ACC games this season.

Sneaky Thieves

In addition to the Jackets' production numbers rising from a year ago, so have their stolen base totals, as Tech runners have swiped 74 bases through 52 games. The Jackets had 65 stolen bases in all of 2007 and only 51 in 2006. Leading the charge are freshman centerfielder Jeff Rowland and redshirt junior Charlie Blackmon, who have 21 and 20 stolen bases, respectively.

Not So For the Opponents...

While the Jackets have managed 74 stolen bases on 95 attempts in 2008, Tech opponents haven't fared as well, swiping just 46 bases on 68 attempts (only a .676 success rate) off the Yellow Jacket pitchers and catchers. That success rate is partially due to the stellar arm of starting catcher Jason Haniger, who has gunned down 15 of 42 runners (36 percent) trying to steal on him.

Guess the Lineup

Georgia Tech head coach Danny Hall is known for mixing up his lineup, and 2008 has been no different. The Jackets had the same batting order in each of the first two games, but the Yellow Jacket skipper mixed it up for the series finale against Youngstown State and in all but nine games since. He has used 42 different lineup cards through 52 games this season. (*Lineups listed on page 12 of notes*)

Holding Opponents to 6 or Less

Georgia Tech is 34-1 on the season when holding opponents to six or fewer runs, but when Yellow Jacket pitchers have allowed seven or more runs, Tech is 2-15. Those two victories came in the last month - a 14-8 win at Georgia Southern and a 16-9 victory at Mercer - while the lone loss when an opponent scored less than six came against Georgia this week.

The Yellow Jackets have scored over six runs just 24 times this season, and are averaging 7.4 runs per game in 2008.

Hot Streaks of Late...

Charlie Blackmon is batting .465 with four home runs and five doubles in his last 16 games; he has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 contests and in 24 of the last 26 games ... Derek Dietrich has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games ... David Duncan has held opponents to just one run in two of his last three outings ... Jason Haniger is batting .429 over his last nine games, with eight of his 12 hits going for extra bases (four home runs, four doubles) ... Kevin Jacob has made four-straight scoreless appearances ... Despite a slow start to the season, Patrick Long has started to find his hitting, as he's batting .462 in his last 15 games ... Thomas Nichols has hit safely in 11 of the last 13 games ... Tony Plagman is batting .382 in his current eight-game hitting streak and .396 with six home runs and four doubles in his last 13 games; he has hit safely in 12 of the Jackets' last 13 games ... Andrew Robinson has made four-straight scoreless appearances ... Brad Rulon has made four-straight scoreless appearances.

2008 Accolades

Thursday, May 8 (Blackmon, Feltes, Haniger & Von Tersch Named to CoSIDA Academic All-District Teams) - Charlie Blackmon was named to the 2008 CoSIDA Academic All-District III First Team, making him eligible for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, while Brad Feltes, Jason Haniger and Zach Von Tersch were all tabbed to the CoSIDA Academic All-District III Third Team. In addition, Georgia Tech had a total of 21 players named to the Dean's List in Spring, 2008, while leading the Atlantic Coast Conference in CoSIDA Academic All-District honorees.

Monday, May 5 (Dietrich Named ACC Player of the Week) - Derek Dietrich earned his first league recognition after guiding Tech a 2-1 series win over No. 15 Coastal Carolina in a three-game weekend series. The freshman hit .500 with six RBI against the Chanticleers, five of which came in Tech's 11-4 victory to clinch the series on the final day. A shortstop from Parma, Ohio, Dietrich moved into a tie for second in the ACC's home runs race by belting his 14th of the season Sunday afternoon.

Monday, Apr. 22 (Murton Tabbed to College Baseball Foundation's National All-Star Lineup) - Luke Murton was tabbed to the National All-Star Lineup for the week of April 14-20 after hitting .588 with four home runs in four games against Georgia Southern and Maryland. He hit home runs in three of Tech's four games, including two at Georgia Southern. For the week, he had 10 hits, eight of which went for extra bases.

Monday, Mar. 3 (Von Tersch Named ACC Pitcher of the Week) - Zach Von Tersch earned his first league recognition after guiding Tech to a shutout victory against Rutgers in the series finale Sunday, March 2. In the process, Von Tersch picked up his first career victory while helping Tech to a 2-1 series win against the Scarlet Knights. Von Tersch tossed 7.0 innings, holding Rutgers hitters to three hits while striking out seven and walking two. He faced 24 batters and allowed just two runners past first base in the victory.

Freshmen Power Tech

Tech's freshman class has made a big impact on the offensive success of the Yellow Jackets in 2008, as they are tops among the four classes in RBI (124) in 2008. Jeff Rowland, Derek Dietrich, Thomas Nichols, Chase Burnette, and Cole Leonida have also combined to hit .305 with 27 home runs on the season, both of which are second among the classes on this year's team.

Steady Junior Class

While the 2008 Georgia Tech freshmen lead the team in RBI, the junior quartet of Luke Murton, Charlie Blackmon, Chris House and Jason Haniger have been the backbone of the team, batting a consistent .332 while hitting 27 home runs on the season. They are just behind the freshmen in RBI (112) while they lead the team with 32 stolen bases on the year. All four juniors have at least 100 at bats on the season and they have combined to make 164 starts in 2008.

Dietrich Meeting Expectations

When Derek Dietrich, a third-round draft pick and top overall selection by the Houston Astros in the 2007 MLB Draft, elected to attend school, many wondered if he would live up to the hype surrounding his arrival. The Parma, Ohio native missed the fall campaign before finally getting a shot on the field this spring, and he has not disappointed.

Dietrich leads the team and is ranked in the top five in the ACC in RBI (59), stands second on the team and two shy of the league lead with 14 home runs and is second on the team with a .621 slugging percentage. He is tops among league freshmen in HR, RBI, total bases and SLG%.

Record Setting Offense

Georgia Tech has been known as one of the top offensive teams in the nation over the last decade, and in 2001, the Yellow Jackets established a new Atlantic Coast Conference and school record with a .347 team batting average.

Tech has averaged better than seven runs per game in 25 of the last 26 seasons. In the Danny Hall era (1994-present), the Yellow Jackets have averaged 8.6 runs per game.

Tech has consistently ranked among the ACC's offensive leaders, leading the conference in scoring 12 times in the last 23 years while boasting the best team batting average in the league in seven of the last 16 years.

The Jackets currently lead the league in home runs and stand in the top three in slugging percentage and stolen bases.

From the Mound to the Batter's Box

Following a frustrating season in which he made just one appearance on the mound in his first year on the Flats, twice-drafted pitcher Charlie Blackmon decided to make a change during summer ball and picked up the bat. A successful performance at the plate prompted head coach Danny Hall to allow the left-hander to take some hacks during the fall and the rest, they say, is history.

Blackmon leads the team with a .383 average, 79 hits and 58 runs scored and stands second on the team with 20 stolen bases on the season. The redshirt junior has been on a tear of late, batting .465 in his last 16 games with nine extra-base hits and seven stolen bases. He has hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games and is batting .444 with seven doubles and six home runs in his last 25 games. Blackmon is one of just two players on the team to have started every game in 2008.

Forgetting Last Season

The Yellow Jackets missed the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in the last 23 years in 2007, but for 2008 junior Luke Murton, it may have been a blessing in disguise. The McDonough, Ga. native had gone 1-for-16 in his last four games to end the season with a disappointing .239 average after batting .339 in his first season on the Flats. Murton's junior season didn't start off much better, as he was hitting .227 through his first 15 games in 2008, but the third-year player has turned it around since then.

Over his last 30 games, Murton is batting .380 with 19 doubles, 10 home runs and 35 RBI. Seventeen of his last 23 hits have been for extra bases.

Feltes Caps Career with Big Finish

Entering the 2008 season, senior third baseman Brad Feltes had a career average of .213 and hit just two doubles, one triple and seven home runs while posting 29 RBI in his three years on the Flats. The Alpharetta, Ga. native's offense has come alive, however, in his final year on the Flats, as he has already more than doubled his career home run and RBI marks with 14 home runs and 54 RBI in 2008, and there are still at least two weeks remaining in the season. Of his 14 home runs in 2008, four have been grand slams. While the single-player record for Georgia Tech is unknown, the NCAA record for grand slams in a season by one player is six, set in 1984 by Alabama's Kyle Bryan. The last time a Tech player had four grand slams in a season prior to this was Tyler Green, who belted four in 2005. Feltes is also batting .288 and has two stolen bases on the season - the first two of his collegiate career.

Weekend Rotation Sets the Tone

The Yellow Jackets' talented weekend rotation of 2005 and 2007 MLB Draft pick David Duncan, 2007 MLB Draft pick Eddie Burns and 2006 MLB Draft pick Zach Von Tersch have been outstanding this season, combining for a 19-10 record with a 4.30 ERA and 156 strikeouts. Collectively, the trio is holding opponents to a .272 average while each has been a part of a shutout in 2008.

Winning Combo

Yellow Jacket relief pitchers Brad Rulon and Andrew Robinson headline an excellent Georgia Tech bullpen in 2008 by combining for 38 scoreless appearances this season. The duo has shared duties as Tech's seventh, eighth, and even ninth-inning pitchers, as Rulon has recorded four saves this year and Robinson has added another.

Throughout the season, the tandem has pitched in the same game on 18 occasions, with Georgia Tech holding a 14-4 record in those contests. Rulon has made 13 scoreless appearances in his last 16 outings while Robinson has 12 in his last 17 appearances.

For the season, Rulon and Robinson are a combined 5-2 with 3.57 ERA and 73 strikeouts in 63 innings of work. They are holding opponents to a .257 batting average.

Rulon Passes Century Mark

Yellow Jacket senior right-hander Brad Rulon continues his climb up several Georgia Tech career records this season. He currently stands 13th in the record books with a .786 winning percentage, seventh with 10.08 strikeouts per 9 IP and tied for 11th with eight career saves.

The Columbus, Ga. native is also one of just six players in Georgia Tech history to appear in 100 games in a career on the Flats, as he passed the century mark in the Jackets' 9-4 win over Georgia in early April. With 109 appearances in his four years on the Flats, Rulon is currently ranked fifth in school history for most appearances. He needs just two more appearances to move into a tie for fourth place in the record books.

Speaking of Saves...

Chris Hicks, who was named Tech's closer prior to the start of the 2008 season, also has eight saves on the season, which places him tied for 11th in school history for most saves in a career on the Flats and the most in a single season since Brian Burks had eight in 2003. His eight saves this season also stands 11th in Tech career history.

Duncan Continues Stellar Career

David Duncan, like senior Brad Rulon, has had a stellar career on the Flats, having been Tech's top pitcher in each of the last two seasons following a very successful freshman season in 2006. The junior stands 23rd in school history with a .724 winning percentage and tied for ninth in the Yellow Jacket career annals with just 2.75 walks allowed per nine innings. The junior is one win, nine innings pitched, and 35 strikeouts away from cracking the top-20 in the respective Tech career categories.

Speaking of Those Free Passes...

Speaking of walks, the Yellow Jackets currently have one of the top pitchers of all time in the category for walks allowed per nine innings in redshirt junior Eddie Burns. The Hiram, Ga. native has walked only 16 batters in 2008, and has issued just 36 walks total in his career for an average of 2.39 walks per nine innings pitched, which stands fourth in Tech's career record books.

That's not to say that Burns hasn't issued other free passes, however. Burns has hit a school-record 19 batters through his first 64 innings this season and 34 total in his career. Chuck Crowder's 35 hit batsmen from 1996-99 is the most in a career by a Tech pitcher.

Freshmen Tested From the Start

Georgia Tech's opening day starting lineup included two players that graduated from high school less than a year ago - CF Jeff Rowland and SS Derek Dietrich. Another freshman, 2B Thomas Nichols, also played on opening day. He drove in two runs with a pinch-hit triple in his first collegiate at-bat.

Two days later, in the series finale against the Penguins, the Yellow Jackets had four freshmen in the starting lineup in Rowland, Dietrich, Nichols and catcher Cole Leonida.

Could It Be a First? ... Six Freshmen in Starting Lineup?

After starting four freshmen in the series finale against Youngstown State, Yellow Jacket skipper Danny Hall pushed that number to five just two games later. While it may not be that uncommon for five freshmen to appear in a starting lineup every so often the question is ... How many times has that occurred when the entire middle of the field is covered by freshmen?

In the series finale against Georgia Southern (2/27), in Tech's first game of the season vs. Kennesaw State (3/5), in Tech's home contest against Mercer (3/19) and vs. Alabama State (3/26), Georgia Tech had freshmen in center field, at shortstop, at second base, behind the plate AND on the mound. Tech only had upperclassmen on the corners - in the outfield and infield.

In Georgia Tech's game against Mercer on Tuesday, April 22, and again vs. Georgia on May 7, Hall added yet another freshman to the starting lineup, as the Yellow Jackets had freshmen on the mound, behind the plate, up the middle of the infield, and in left- and center field. A total of SIX freshmen started those two contests.

Starting Five Among Best in History

Since the 2002 season, Georgia Tech has no fewer than 14 starting pitchers that have

been selected in the MLB Draft. The starting rotations - encompassing both weekend and midweek - from each of the six previous seasons (2002-07) have been some of the best in history, but perhaps none are better than the Yellow Jacket starting rotation of 2008, which has combined for a 4.03 ERA while holding opponents to a .259 average through 51 games of the season. They have also been a part of five shutouts this season, the most since Tech had six in all of 2002.

Georgia Tech is 26-8 within the friendly confines of Russ Chandler Stadium in 2008, and 10-7 in games away from home. Prior to Miami's sweep of the Jackets April 12-13, Georgia Tech had won 15 of its previous 16 home games, including a win over Georgia before a record-breaking crowd the previous Wednesday.

Tech's pitchers much prefer to play at home than on the road, as they have a 3.99 ERA and opponents are hitting just .261 at Russ Chandler Stadium, but the pitching staff is giving up 6.6 runs a game while opponents are hitting .291 against them on the road.

Georgia Tech's hitters have shown that they don't mind going on the road, as the Yellow Jackets hit .369 with 20 home runs in their last six road games to raise their average to .304 on the season in games played away from RCS. One player in particular that enjoys
