No. 19 Jackets and No. 17 Tigers Square Off in Clemson

No. 19 Georgia Tech (26-15, 13-7 ACC) will head to Clemson for a Atlantic Coast Conference series against the 17th-ranked Tigers (27-14, 11-7 ACC) to open a 10-game road swing this weekend. Friday's first pitch is at 7:15 p.m. at Doug Kingsmore Stadium, while the Jackets and Tigers meet at 7 p.m. Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday.

The Jackets are looking to rebound from a 10-7 loss to Georgia on Tuesday evening, which snapped a four-game winning streak that included a series sweep of No. 20 NC State last weekend. Clemson is coming off a 14-5 victory over No. 5 South Carolina Wednesday and has won two of its last three games.

Georgia Tech has won 13 of its last 17 games, and 17 of its last 23 after beginning the season 9-9. Over the last 23 games, Georgia Tech has posted a 17-6 record as the pitching staff has held opponents to just 3.6 runs per game and a .249 batting average.

The Hall Era at Georgia Tech

Georgia Tech is 605-263 in 14 seasons under head coach Danny Hall, a winning percentage of .697 and an average of 43 wins per season. Over the last five seasons, Hall has led Tech to the College World Series (2002 and 2006), ACC tournament championship (2003 and 2005) and ACC regular season championship (2004 and 2005). Hall, the 2005 ACC Coach of the Year, became Tech's all-time winningest coach in an 11-10 win at Miami on Mar. 27, 2005.

The Yellow Jackets have made 12 NCAA appearances in 13 years under Hall. Tech has won six NCAA regionals and finished second in two others, and advanced to the championship game of the College World Series in his first season in 1994. The Yellow Jackets have made CWS trips under Hall in 1994, 2002 and 2006.

Hall was named ACC Coach of the Year and also earned National Coach of the Year honors by The Sporting News in 1997 after leading the Jackets to an ACC regular-season title, and was again named the ACC's Coach of the Year in 2000 after leading Tech to the ACC's regular season and tournament championships. He earned his third ACC Coach of the Year award in 2005.

Tech is 224-116 vs. the ACC under Hall, finishing third or better in nine of his 13 years.

Along the way, 67 of his players at Tech have gone on to play professional baseball, 22 have earned all-America honors and 72 have made the all-ACC team; 92 have made the ACC Academic Honor Roll and 11 have made the GTE or Verizon Academic all-America team.

Georgia Tech vs. Clemson

Clemson leads, 94-93-3

Clemson leads Georgia Tech, 94-93-3, in a series that dates to 1902. The Yellow Jackets and Tigers have played at least three games every year since 1985, including seven times in 2006, with Clemson winning four of the seven contests.

The rivalry between the Jackets and Clemson is one of the best in the ACC, as the two teams have met in the postseason nine times since 2000 and 12 times since Danny Hall became the Yellow Jackets' head coach in 1994.

The Yellow Jackets won the series, 2-1, over the Tigers last season in Atlanta before the two teams met three times in the ACC Tournament and once in the College World Series.

Both teams have been more successful in their home stadiums, while Clemson holds the edge over the Jackets in neutral territory. The Tigers are 39-18-1 against the Jackets in Clemson, and 13-4 against Tech at Doug Kingsmore Stadium since 1994.

The Jackets are 23-28 against the Tigers under head coach Danny Hall.

Middle of the Lineup Strong Against Clemson: The middle of Georgia Tech's lineup (**Matt Wieters, Wally Crancer, Luke Murton**) has combined to hit .397 (27-for-68) with seven home runs and 25 RBI against the Tigers pitching, led by Luke Murton, who hit .458 against Clemson in 2006. Murton, a freshman last season, hit three home runs in Tech's final game against the Tigers in the ACC Tournament, including a solo home run in the seventh, a two-run bomb in the eighth, and a grand slam in the ninth inning.

Tech Tidbits on Veteran Players

No Payne, No Gain: When Danny Payne's sophomore season came to an abrupt end due to injury, he was leading the team in six offensive categories, and many questioned whether he would return to that same form in 2007. The junior center fielder has quieted those critics, as he leads the team in eight offensive categories in 2007, including hitting a team-best .391 on the year. Most impressive perhaps is Payne's improved eye at the plate, as the junior has collected an ACC-best 46 walks (and stands SECOND in the NATION with 1.12 walks per game) with 2 HBP's and has tallied 61 hits. Payne is pacing Tech in average, on base percentage (.529), runs (49), hits, doubles (16), triples (3), walks and stolen bases (15).

Wieters' Jackets' Steady Leader: Junior catcher Matt Wieters continues to be the Jackets' steady leader on and off the field, appearing in the top three in 11 offensive categories in 2007, including leading the team with 39 RBI, 94 total bases and a .603 slugging percentage. Wieters is hitting .359 on the season and has missed just four games in his career on the Flats, with all four coming in his rookie season. He also appears in the top three in on base percentage (.485), hits (56), runs (34), doubles (13), triples (2), home runs (7) and walks (37). A midseason candidate for the Johnny Bench Award, which recognizes the top collegiate catcher in the nation, he already ranks in the top-20 in three career categories at Georgia Tech.

Fisher's Stock on the Rise: Playing on the same team as preseason All-Americans Matt Wieters and Danny Payne can sometimes overshadow the work that junior shortstop Michael Fisher has done on the field, but don't tell him that: He began the 2007 season with a bang and hasn't let up, hitting over 90 points higher than his career average and already breaking his previous season high in home runs (set his freshman year). The Nashville native ranks in the top three on the team in average (.347), slugging percentage (.485), hits (58), RBI (32), doubles (12), total bases (81), walks (20) and stolen bases (7). At times more impressive than his offensive numbers has been his defensive play, as he has made the majority of the routine plays with ease as well as several eye-opening ones that have proven he's on the rise.

Duncan Filling Big Shoes With Ease in 2007: Draft-eligible sophomore David Duncan entered the 2007 season with big shoes to fill--not only becoming a regular in the weekend rotation, but also filling the role of two-time 10-game winner and third-round draft pick, the 2006 Friday starter, Blake Wood. Despite a tough first weekend, the New Richmond, Ohio native hasn't let the squad down, going 5-2 with a 3.03 ERA and 67 K's in 74.1 innings of work in 2007. His best outing came when he tossed the first complete game shutout in over three years for the Yellow Jackets, giving up just four hits while striking out 10 against Boston College. In his last six outings, Duncan is 2-0 with a 1.79 ERA and 44 strikeouts in 45.2 innings of work.

"Turn"ing the Corner in '07: Over the last three years, senior lefty Ryan Turner has begun the season as a starter, been moved to the bullpen, and then rotated back to starting roles. This year, the Dahlonega, Ga. native intends to remain in the weekend starting rotation the entire season, and has made a case for such in his nine appearances of the season. The senior has been a tough-luck loser despite some quality starts, going 3-3 on the season with a 3.99 ERA and 34 K's in 56.0 innings this year.

Goody, He's Back!: Redshirt junior John Goodman, the younger brother of former Tech standout Chris Goodman, made his much-anticipated return to the mound in an exhibition game against the Atlanta Braves in Orlando after spending much of the last two years recovering from surgeries. Against the Braves, he walked Kelly Johnson, struck out Edgar Renteria, got Chipper Jones to groundout and forced an infield popup by Andrew Jones. He was the Yellow Jackets' Saturday starter in four ACC series earlier this season.

Burning Them Down: Yellow Jacket redshirt sophomore Eddie Burns entered the season with just two prior appearances totaling 1.1 innings after battling injury the last two years, but the Hiram, Ga. native hasn't let his past slow him down this season: Burns is 3-1 with a team-best 2.98 ERA in 13 games in 2007. In his six starts, Burns is 3-1 with a 2.92 ERA in 40.0 innings.

The "Rusty C"

Affectionately known as the "Rusty C," a new era in Russ Chandler Stadium began in 2002 with a \$9.7 million reconstruction of the facility. The new facility seats 4,157, with room for future expansion.

The stadium was originally built in 1985, in time for Tech to host the ACC Tournament. It has been the site of eight NCAA Regional tournaments (1987, 1993, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006), and an exhibition game between the Yellow Jackets and the first team from the Soviet Union to tour the United States (1989).

In the summer of 1996, Russ Chandler Stadium served as an official training site for the Centennial Olympic Games.

Rose Bowl Field, the tract of land on which the stadium sits, which includes the adjacent football practice field, has been the site of Tech baseball since 1930, when the field was built with funds from Tech's 1929 Rose Bowl appearance.

Tech was 486-125 in the old Russ Chandler Stadium, a winning percentage of .798.

Yellow Jacket Short Hops

Jackets Ranked NATIONALLY: Georgia Tech center fielder Danny Payne is currently ranked second in the nation in walks per game (1.12), while catcher Matt Wieters' 0.92 walks per game ranks stands at No. 13 in the rankings ... Wieters' 0.93 runs per game is also good for 37th in the nation.

Streiking of Late: LHP *David Duncan* is 2-0 with a 1.79 ERA and 44 K's in his last six games (45.1 IP) ... SS *Michael Fisher* is hitting .400 with four doubles, a triple, home run, 14 RBI, 10 walks and three stolen bases in his last 19 games ... RHP *Chris Hicks* has a 1.29 ERA over his last four outings (7.0 IP), including holding opponents scoreless in his last three appearances ... RHP *Jared Hyatt* is 3-0 with a 0.63 ERA and 13 K's in his last eight appearances (14.1 IP) ... OF *Danny Payne* has an eight-game hitting streak in which he's hitting .424 with three doubles and 10 RBI and has hit safely in 14 of the last 16 games while reaching base safely in EVERY game this season ... 1B/DH *Tony Plagman* has hit safely in 12 of the last 14 games (.348 BA, 6 2B, 1 HR, 9 RBI) ... RHP *Brad Rulon* has a 1.54 ERA in his last 11 appearances ... C *Matt Wieters* is hitting .562 with tow doubles, a triple and two RBI in his current five-game hitting streak ... He has also hit safely in 12 of the last 13 games.

Bats Warm With the Weather: After hitting just .281 through the first 25 games of the season (through March 25), the Yellow Jacket offense has hit .306 through the last 16 games, including a .330 mark against NC State this last weekend.

Fish 'n the Kids: Despite the fact that junior shortstop *Michael Fisher* has over 100-consecutive starts on the infield, the same can't be same for the other infielders ... all three are in their rookie season on the Flats and have showed steady improvement as the season's passed. 1B *Tony Plagman*, 2B *Jeff Ussery* and 3B *Patrick Long* combined to hit .251 (46-for-183) with nine extra-base hits over the first 25 games of the year, but are hitting .303 (47-for-155) with 17 extra-base hits in the 15 games since.

Jackets Earn Midseason/Preseason National Honors: Junior catcher *Matt Wieters* has been named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List (recognizing the top collegiate catcher) and the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List (recognizing the top collegiate player) ... Junior centerfielder *Danny Payne* was also tabbed to the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List ... Senior starting pitcher *Ryan Turner* is one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award (recognizing the top senior in college baseball).

Pitching Shines Over Last 23 Games

Despite a rough start to the season, the Yellow Jacket pitching staff has been the key component in the Yellow Jackets' success of late, posting a 3.28 ERA while holding opponents to a .249 average through the last 23 games.

During the span, Tech is 12-0 when Yellow Jacket pitchers have held its opponent to less than three runs, but 5-6 in the 11 games when they've scored three or more.

Starting Pitching Bounces Back from Tough Start

With opponents hitting a solid .328 against Georgia Tech's starting pitching in the month of February, Georgia Tech went 6-5 while the Yellow Jacket starters averaged a 6.08 ERA. To say there was an improvement in March would be an understatement, as the starting pitchers posted a 3.48 ERA while holding opponents to a .283 average. Tech's pitching in April against tougher teams has been just as impressive:

Starting Lineup is Anyone's Guess

Through 41 games this season, Georgia Tech head coach Danny Hall has used 35 different lineup cards, with the only repeats coming against Rutgers in early March, vs. Kennesaw State in the middle of March, once against both Maryland and Miami and last weekend against NC State.

The only constant in every lineup has been that of preseason All-American Danny Payne, who has been Tech's leadoff hitter and starting center fielder in every contest.

Tech Versus the State of Georgia

Georgia Tech went 9-3 against teams from the state of Georgia in 2006, but this season the Jackets have struggled against in-state foes, going 5-5 vs. the state with their wins coming against Kennesaw State in the first home game of 2007, vs. Georgia State, in a sweep against Georgia Southern in late March, and against Georgia earlier this week. The Jackets still have one game against Georgia remaining on the schedule for 2007.

Since 1999, the Yellow Jackets own a 76-25 (.752) mark against in-state foes. In 13 years under head coach Danny Hall, Tech is 119-42 (.739) against teams from Georgia.

Avoiding the Big Inning

Three of Georgia Tech's 14 losses have one common theme, a big inning early for the opponents which forced the Yellow Jackets to play catch-up the entire game.

**Tech led the entire game against Illinois-Chicago, but the Flames scored nine unearned runs, all with two outs in the ninth inning, to defeat Georgia Tech, 11-4, in the second game of a three-game series in February.

Jackets' Offense Key to Early Successes

Despite losing players that made up over 50 percent of Tech's hits, runs, home runs and RBI's from a year ago, Tech was forced to rely on the strength of their offense early in 2007 as the Yellow Jacket pitchers struggled in the first month of the season.

Tech received clutch hitting at key moments in 2007, but when the Jackets aren't hitting the team tends to struggle. If the Jackets hit .300 or above in a game, they are 13-2 on the season, but when hitting below .300, Tech is 9-12.

The Yellow Jackets led the ACC with a .319 batting average during the 2004 season and a .333 team average in 2005. In 2006, Georgia Tech finished fourth in the league, hitting .318.

Overall, Tech has hit over .300 as a team in 22 of the last 24 years, and has averaged at least seven runs per game every year since 1981. Tech has led the ACC in batting in six years (1994, 1995, 2000, 2001, 2004, 2005) under Danny Hall.

Since the arrival of pitching coach **Bobby Moranda** prior to the 2002 season, the Yellow Jackets are 190-22 (.896) when allowing five runs or less. The Yellow Jackets were 36-5 when allowing five runs or less in 2006, and are 19-4 in those games in 2007.

Tech went 38-2 in 2002, 34-2 in 2003, 33-3 in 2004 and 31-7 in 2005 when allowing five runs or less. When allowing six or more runs, the Yellow Jackets are 67-81 since 2002.

Yellow Jacket senior starting pitcher **Ryan Turner** has been named one of 30 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, which honors a senior baseball player that excels both on and off the field and has chosen to remain in school to pursue the multiple rewards that a senior season can bring.

Candidates were selected based on personal qualities that define a complete student-athlete, including on-the-field performance, leadership qualities, working towards their degree, and the impact that they have made in their local communities.

The award, which stands for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, will be presented during the 2007 College World Series in Omaha following fan balloting coupled with votes from coaches, media and sponsors from around the nation.

Head Coach Danny Hall Earns Milestone Victories

Georgia Tech head coach Danny Hall became the fifth active Atlantic Coast Conference head coach to reach 800 career victories when he did so in the opening game of the three-game series at Duke. Two weeks later, he earned his 600th win in a Georgia Tech uniform in the first game of a three-game series at Miami.

Hall became the winningest head coach in Tech history in the series finale at Miami two years ago, with the victory ironically coming against the coach he passed for the record, Hurricane head coach Jim Morris, who finished with 504 victories at Georgia Tech.

Tech Picked Fourth in ACC Coastal Division

Despite boasting two of the best players in the country and one of the top bullpens in the league as well as a top-10 preseason national ranking, the Atlantic Coast Conference's 12 head coaches selected Georgia Tech to finish fourth in the Coastal Division in the league's annual preseason poll.

The Yellow Jackets were picked to finish behind 2006 College World Series runner-up North Carolina, who earned four first place votes and a total of 60 points. Miami, with two first-place votes and a total of 58 points and Virginia, with four first-place votes and a total of 54 points.

Clemson, who claimed the 2006 ACC Championship, was tabbed the preseason favorite, accumulating 11 first-place votes and a total of 71 points while Florida State was selected second in the Atlantic Division with one first-place vote and 55 total points.

Georgia Tech received two first place votes and a total of 44 points.

Payne & Wieters Named to Preseason All-America Teams, Brooks Wallace Watch List

Junior catcher/pitcher **Matt Wieters** and junior center fielder/pitcher **Danny Payne** earned multiple preseason honors in 2007, including being named to the Brooks Wallace Watch List, which honors the College Baseball Player of the Year by the College Baseball Foundation. The Yellow Jacket duo joined 10 other Atlantic Coast Conference players to earn the preseason honor.

Wieters was also named a first-team preseason All-America selection by *Rivals.com*, *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball* and was tabbed a second-team preseason All-America by the NCBWA. According to John Manuel in the *Baseball America* College Preview, Wieters will be the 2007 National Player of the Year.

Payne earned second-team preseason All-America honors from the NCBWA, *Rivals.com* and *Collegiate Baseball* and was named a third-team preseason All-America by *Baseball America*.

Dupart Ranks Among Top 50 Incoming Freshmen

Baseball America ranked the top 50 freshmen for the 2007 season, and Georgia Tech outfielder **Curtis Dupart** cracked the list at No. 16. The rookie from Woodinville, Wash., is vying for the starting role in left field, which was vacated by Steven Blackwood, an Academic All-American and all-conference honoree who will graduate this semester.

All in the Family

Two players, junior **John Goodman** and sophomore **Luke Murton**, both of whom were on the 2006 College World Series team, have brothers that starred on the Yellow Jackets' 2002 College World Series team.

Goodman is the brother of pitcher Chris Goodman (2002-03), who went 17-5 in two years on the Tech staff and holds the school record for fewest walks per nine innings.

Murton is the brother of outfielder Matt Murton (2001-03), a two-time all-ACC performer who now plays for the Chicago Cubs.

Jackets Raise over \$8,500 for Charity

The 2007 Georgia Tech baseball team joined forces with the St. Baldrick's Foundation to raise money to fund cancer research for kids earlier this season, setting the goal of raising at least \$5,000 by St. Patrick's Day, or St. Baldrick's Day, as coined by the organization. For every \$250 donated, the squad agreed that one team member would shave his head. After bypassing the original goal in early March, the Jackets challenged their fans to make the whole team bald -- and the fans again answered the challenge.

On March 17, following the Jackets' 5-2 win over Boston College, all 32 team members, plus two managers, as well as head coach Danny Hall and assistant coach Josh Holliday, had their heads shaved after a late flurry of activity netted over \$8,500 in donations.

Georgia Tech Since 2000

Georgia Tech has enjoyed great success since 2000, winning three ACC tournament championships and three ACC regular season championships. The Yellow Jackets have advanced to two College World Series (2002 and 2006), earned seven NCAA regional berths, four NCAA super regional appearances, and hosted six NCAA regionals.

Draft Dodgers

Five Georgia Tech players have previously been drafted by major league teams prior to the 2007 season. The highest concentration of drafted players ever on one Yellow Jacket team occurred in 2000 and 2003. Those teams featured 11 players previously drafted.

Alumni Star in the Big Leagues

First baseman Mark Teixeira of the Texas Rangers earned the Gold Glove Award for Major League Baseball for the second consecutive season, recognizing him as the top defensive player at his position in the American League in both 2005 and 2006.

First baseman Nomar Garciaparra of the Los Angeles Dodgers was named the Comeback Player of the Year by the Major League Baseball Writers and tabbed to his sixth MLB All-Star game in 2006.

Tech Makes 21st NCAA Appearance in Last 22 Years

Georgia Tech made its 21st NCAA Regional appearance in the last 22 years in 2006. The Yellow Jackets have played in the NCAA tournament every year since 1985 with the exception of 1999, and Tech is making its 22nd overall NCAA appearance. *Georgia Tech is the only school in the nation to earn a National Top 8 seed in each of the last four years (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006).*

Prior to the current streak, Tech had participated in the NCAA playoffs twice, in 1959 and 1971, with an additional play-in tournament appearance in 1948. Georgia Tech made its first trip to the College World Series in 1994, advancing to the championship game before losing to Oklahoma, 13-5. Tech returned to the College World Series in 2002 and 2006.

2007 Georgia Tech Baseball

Tech Hosts NCAA Regional for Sixth Time in Seven Years

Georgia Tech was a host site in the NCAA Championship for the fifth straight year and the sixth time in the last seven years in 2006. Prior to this most recent streak, the Yellow Jackets hosted a regional just twice in its first 16 NCAA Regional appearances.

The Yellow Jackets have hosted an NCAA Regional on eight occasions - 1987, 1993, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006.

Streaking in the ACC

Georgia Tech has enjoyed unprecedented success within the Atlantic Coast Conference since 2004, winning the ACC regular season title in 2004 with an 18-5 league record, and again in 2005 with a 22-8 mark. Tech had a conference-record 25-game ACC win streak in 2004-05.

The Yellow Jackets are 70-26 (.729) in their last 96 ACC regular season games.

The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 13 straight ACC series wins in 2004-05, and Tech has won 26 of its last 34 ACC weekend series. Tech has won 42 of its last 50 ACC home games and 33 of its last 52 ACC road games.

Yellow Jackets in the Bigs

Georgia Tech set an all-time high in 2003 when eleven of its alumni baseball players were on major league rosters during the season. Seven former Yellow Jackets are on Major League opening day rosters in 2007.

All-America shortstop **Nomar Garciaparra** won two American League batting titles with the Boston Red Sox and was the National League's Comeback Player of the Year in 2006 as an MLB All-Star with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Former all-America catcher **Jason Varitek** is the captain of the Boston Red Sox, and the catcher won the Silver Slugger and Gold Glove awards in 2005.

Outfielder **Jay Payton** is active with the Baltimore Orioles. **Mark Teixeira** (Texas Rangers) won the Silver Slugger award as the top offensive first baseman in the American League in 2004 and 2005 and was the AL Gold Glove winner in 2005 and 2006. Outfielder **Marlon Byrd** is also active with the Texas Rangers, while **David Newhan** is with the New York Mets. Outfielder **Matt Murton** made his big league debut with the Cubs in 2005 and was a regular in the 2006 starting lineup in left field, while pitcher **Kevin Cameron** is on the 40-man roster with the San Diego Padres.
