### JACKETS, HOKIES MEET IN COASTAL DIVISION SHOWDOWN THURSDAY NIGHT

Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech, which have combined for all six ACC Coastal Division titles, meet Thursday night on national television in a game that could go a long way toward determining the 2011 division champion (8:06 p.m./ESPN).

Both teams had an open date last week. Thursday's game will feature Georgia Tech's prolific offense against Virginia Tech's high-ranking defense.

The Yellow Jackets, 7-2 overall and 4-2 in the ACC, are coming off a 31-17 Homecoming victory over then-sixth-ranked Clemson Oct. 29. Junior quarterback Tevin Washington rushed for 176 yards -- the most ever by a Tech QB -- and sophomore Jemea Thomas had two interceptions and a forced fumble to lead the Jackets.

Georgia Tech, ranked 20th in the AP Poll and 19th in the Coaches Poll, ranks in the top 10 nationally in five different categories including first in third-down conversion percentage (57.6) and second in rushing offense (328.0).

Virginia Tech, 8-1 and 4-1, remained atop the Coastal Division and extended its remarkable road-game winning streak to 11 games with a 14-10 win at Duke Oct. 29. The Hokies, ranked 10th and 9th, got a critical fourth-

down tackle from cornerback Kyle Fuller and a game-sealing interception from linebacker Barquell Rivers.

Virginia Tech leads the ACC in scoring defense, pass defense efficiency, third-down defense, red-zone defense and time of possession.

Virginia Tech leads the all-time series, 5-3, including a 28-21 win last season in Blacksburg.

### NOTING THE YELLOW JACKETS

■ Georgia Tech will be playing in an ESPN Thursday night game for the 19th consecutive season.

■ The Yellow Jackets, 5-0 at home, are attempting to stay unbeaten in Bobby Dodd Stadium for the first time since 1999.

■ Georgia Tech leads the nation in third-down percentage (.576), ranks second nationally in rushing (328.0), and ranks in the top 10 in pass efficiency, fewest sacks allowed, fewest penalty yards and fewest penalties.

■ The Yellow Jackets inched up in the national polls this week (20th AP, 19th Coaches).

■ Georgia Tech's three remaining regular season games include home games against 10th-ranked Virginia Tech and 14th-ranked Georgia, and a road game at Duke.

■ Tech is 2-0 vs. nationally-ranked teams this season.

He recorded the first two interceptions of his career, forced a fumble, broke up two passes, had five tackles and even had his first career punt return (7 yards). Thomas can -- and often does -- play every position in the Yellow Jacket secondary.

■ ESPN's Thursday night games this season have been lopsided affairs so far. Only the Virginia-Miami game was decided by one score, five games decided by 27-plus points.

■ The Yellow Jackets have produced eight one-play touchdown drives. Last season Tech had zero.

■ Tech is 3-0 in night games this season, including a 2-0 record at home.

■ Junior quarterback Tevin Washington, who broke a Tech QB record with 176 yards rushing against Clemson, has rushed for more than 100 yards in three of the last four games.

■ Washington, senior Roddy Jones and junior Orwin Smith give Tech three current career 1,000-yard rushers.

■ Smith averages 11.3 yards per carry and has rushed for a touchdown once every 4.9 carries (10 TDs, 49 attempts).

■ Seven of junior Stephen Hill's 20 receptions have been of 40 yards or longer, including three 70 yards or longer.

■ Junior linebacker Julian Burnett is fifth in the ACC in tackles (81). He has 33 more tackles than any other Tech player.

■ Coach Paul Johnson is 12-3 at Tech in games decided by five points or less.

■ Georgia Tech is 11-3 at home against Coastal Division opponents since divisional play began in 2005.

■ Tech has thrown at least two touchdown passes in a game four times this season (but no TD passes since Oct. 1). Last season it had one game with two TD passes (at Wake Forest).

■ Tech has had a 100-yard receiver four times and a 100-yard rusher five times this season.

■ Tech is the only school in the nation to produce a 1,300-yard rusher in each of the previous five seasons, although that streak will likely end this season.

■ The Yellow Jackets have played 10 true freshmen – DB/PR Zach Laskey, LB Kyle Travis, LB Tremayne McNair, LB Nick Menocal, CB Jamal Golden, OL Shaq Mason, WR Jeff Greene, WR Darren Waller, DB Corey Dennis and LS Sean Tobin.

■ Tech has used two players to kickoff (Justin Moore, David Scully), two placekickers (Moore and Scully), two punters (Sean Poole, Chandler Anderson), three kick returners (Orwin Smith, Tony Zenon, Roddy Jones) and two punt returners (Zach Laskey and Jemea Thomas).

■ The Jackets are out-scoring opponents 94-41 in the first quarter and 88-21 in the third quarter, but are being out-scored 79-59 in the fourth quarter.

■ Tech has had 109 offensive possessions this season and has scored 46 touchdowns.

■ Georgia Tech is bowl-eligible for the 15th consecutive year -- tied for the fourth-longest current streak nationally.

■ Tech began the season 6-0 for the first time since 1966 and 3-0 in the ACC for the first time since 2006.

## PAUL JOHNSON: IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS

■ Paul Johnson, 33-16 at Georgia Tech, will coach his 50th game with the Yellow Jackets.

■ Between 1967 and Johnson's arrival in 2008, Tech went 2-29-1 at home against teams ranked in the top 10. Johnson is 2-0 at home against top-10 teams -- a win over No. 4 Virginia Tech in 2009 and a victory against No. 6 Clemson Oct. 29.

■ Johnson is 6-0 at home against teams ranked in the top 25.

■ Since Bobby Dodd retired after the 1966 season, only one Georgia Tech coach -- George O'Leary (.612) -- won 60 percent of his games. Johnson's win percentage is .673.

■ With one more win, Johnson would become the first coach in Georgia Tech history to win eight or more games in three of his first four seasons.

■ With the Oct. 8 win over Maryland, Johnson became just the fourth ACC coach to defeat all 11 conference opponents. Johnson joins Bobby Bowden, Frank Beamer and Tom O'Brien.

■ Johnson is 12-3 at Tech in games decided by five points or less.

■ Johnson's Tech teams are 21-1 when scoring more than 30 points.

■ Johnson is the first coach in conference history to be named ACC Coach of the Year in each of his first two seasons.

## BACK-TO-BACK TOP-10 OPPONENTS

■ Georgia Tech will play its third nationally-ranked opponent of the season. The Yellow Jackets defeated North Carolina, then-ranked 25th in the Coaches Poll (unranked in the AP poll), 35-28, on Sept. 24, and beat No. 6 Clemson, 31-17, on Oct. 29.

■ The Yellow Jackets will attempt to win back-to-back games against nationally-ranked opponents for the first time since Nov. 20-29, 2008, when Tech beat No. 23 Miami and No. 13 Georgia.

■ Tech will be playing back-to-back games against teams ranked in the top 10 for the first time since Oct. 17-24, 1998, when the Jackets beat No. 7 Virginia and lost to No. 6 Florida State (both at home). Tech has not won back-to-back games against top-10 teams since Oct. 3-10, 1959, when it knocked off No. 6 Clemson and No. 8 Tennessee.

■ Tech is 87-154-6 all-time against teams ranked in the AP top 25, including a 26-37 mark against ranked ACC opponents, and a 47-70-4 record in Bobby Dodd Stadium.

■ Paul Johnson is 7-4 against AP-ranked teams in his four seasons with the Yellow Jackets.

## COASTAL DIVISION UP FOR GRABS

Since ACC divisional play began in 2005, only Virginia Tech and Georgia Tech have represented the Coastal Division in the ACC championship game. This season, the Yellow Jackets and Hokies join Virginia as the only divisional teams with less than three losses.

One path Georgia Tech could take to the division title -- as difficult as it may be -- is to win its two remaining conference games, coupled with another loss for Virginia.

**JACKET-HOKIE STATISTICAL COMPARISON**

- Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC and 17th nationally in scoring offense (37.6). Virginia Tech leads the ACC and ranks sixth nationally in scoring defense (15.4).
- The Yellow Jackets lead the ACC and rank second nationally in rushing (328.0), while the Hokies rank fifth nationally in rushing defense (86.3).
- Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech (200.2) rank one-two, respectively, in the ACC in rushing.
- The Jackets rank 14th nationally in total offense (474.6). The Hokies rank 12th in total defense (298.3).
- Georgia Tech leads the ACC and ranks sixth nationally in pass efficiency (167.3). Virginia Tech leads the ACC and ranks eighth nationally in pass efficiency defense (105.2).
- The Yellow Jackets lead the nation in third-down conversion percentage (57.6). Virginia Tech leads the ACC in third-down defense (30.8).
- Virginia Tech leads the ACC (34:20) and ranks fourth nationally in time of possession, while Georgia Tech ranks third in the ACC and 14th nationally (32:29).
- Georgia Tech will face the ACC's leading rusher (and the nation's third-leading rusher) in Hokie junior David Wilson (131.8 ypg). The Jackets have seen four different ACC rushers gain more than 100 yards against them.
- The Yellow Jackets, who rank 11th nationally in punt return yardage defense (3.88), will face the ACC's leading punt returner in Virginia Tech's Jayron Hosley (11.1).
- The Jacket-Hokie match-up will feature three of the top five ACC leaders in sacks -- Virginia Tech's J.R. Collins (6.0) and Bruce Taylor (5.0), and Georgia Tech's Jeremiah Attaochu (4.0 in seven games).

- Virginia Tech leads the all-time series, 5-3.
- The two teams will meet for the ninth time, the fourth time on a Thursday night.
- Virginia Tech rallied to win last year's meeting, 28-21, in Blacksburg. Yellow Jacket quarterback Joshua Nesbitt broke his arm late in the first half, and the Hokies' David Wilson returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown with 2:23 remaining.
- The Hokies have won three of the last four meetings.
- The two teams split the previous four meetings in Atlanta. The last meeting in Atlanta, in 2009, saw Georgia Tech beat fourth-ranked Virginia Tech, 28-23.
- At least one of the two teams has been nationally-ranked in seven of the eight previous meetings. This will be just the second time both teams are ranked.
- The two teams were scheduled to open the 2000 season in Blacksburg, but that game was canceled because of poor weather.
- The Yellow Jackets and Hokies first met on the gridiron in 1990. The two Coastal Division rivals have met every season since 2004.
- Each of the last three meetings have been decided by seven points or less.
- Since ACC divisional play began in 2005, Tech is 21-12 vs. Coastal Division opponents, 11-3 at home.
- Tech is 34-23-1 all-time against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia, including a loss earlier this year to the Virginia Cavaliers.
- Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson is 1-2 all-time vs. Virginia Tech.
- Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer is 5-3 all-time against Georgia Tech. He has coached in all eight meetings between the two teams.

## MORE FROM THE 31-17 WIN AGAINST CLEMSON

■ Georgia Tech had season-highs for rushing attempts (67) and time of possession (39:00).

■ The Yellow Jacket defense held an opponent to less than 100 yards rushing (95 by Clemson) for the first time this season. Tech forced a season-high four turnovers.

■ Tevin Washington's 176 yards rushing were the most by a Yellow Jacket this season.

■ Georgia Tech's 31 points were its most against a team ranked in the AP top 10 since scoring 31 against fifth-ranked Clemson on Oct. 28, 2000.

■ Clemson's 17 points were the fewest by a nationally-ranked Tech opponent since No. 22 North Carolina scored seven points on Sept. 26, 2009.

■ Tech's time of possession (39:00) was its highest since Oct. 31, 2009 at Vanderbilt (39:45).

■ Clemson's Sammy Watkins had 10 receptions for 159 yards -- the most receptions and yards by a Tech opponent since Nov. 29, 2008 when Mohamed Massaquoi had 10 catches for 180 yards.

## 1,000-YARD RUSHER x 3

There are three career 1,000-yard rushers on the Yellow Jacket roster -- senior Roddy Jones (1,658), junior quarterback Tevin Washington (1,190) and junior Orwin Smith (1,095).

## ON THIS DATE IN TECH HISTORY

Georgia Tech is 10-6-1 all-time when playing on November 10th... the last time the Yellow Jackets played on this date was a 41-24 win at Duke in 2007... Tashard Choice rushed for 170 yards and two touchdowns, and Correy Earls had five receptions for 86 yards in that win over the Blue Devils... Tech has played Virginia Tech on this date once previously -- a 6-3 win over the visiting Hokies in 1990... no touchdowns were scored in that game with Scott Sisson's two field goals being the difference... that win made the eventual co-national champions 8-0-1 on the year... in 1918, Tech beat NC State 128-0 on Nov. 10.

## DEFENSE DESERVES SOME LOVE...

■ Georgia Tech ranks 15th nationally in pass defense and 17th nationally in pass efficiency defense.

■ Georgia Tech has more interceptions this season (11) than it had all of last season (8).

■ The Jackets have forced six interceptions over the last four games combined.

■ Oct. 29 against sixth-ranked Clemson, Tech held the Tigers to 95 yards rushing, three first-half points and forced four turnovers.

■ At Miami (Oct. 22), Tech held the Hurricanes to just three second-half points. Miami scored 24 points in the game, but seven of those came on a fumble recovery in the end zone.

■ At Virginia, Tech held its opponent scoreless in the second half for the second time this season (also vs. Western Carolina). Last season the Jackets did not hold any opponent scoreless in any half.

■ Maryland entered the fourth quarter with just three points against Tech.

■ Tech has allowed just 21 third-quarter points.

■ Statistically, the Yellow Jackets are improved over last year's squad in rushing defense, pass defense and scoring defense.

But, special teams have had their positive moments as well:

■ The Yellow Jackets rank 11th nationally in punt return defense (3.88 ypa).

■ Tech has blocked or deflected four punts or field goal attempts.

■ Sophomore Justin Moore has converted all 44 PATs.

■ Freshman Tony Zenon's 79-yard kick return against Maryland set up a key Yellow Jacket touchdown.

■ True freshman Zach Laskey ranks fourth in the ACC and 30th nationally in punt return average.

**JACKETS ONE OF NATION'S YOUNGEST TEAMS**

■ Georgia Tech has just 10 scholarship seniors on the roster.

■ Just two seniors -- A-back Roddy Jones and wide receiver Tyler Melton -- start on offense.

■ There are no senior offensive linemen on the roster.

■ Four seniors -- tackle Logan Walls, end Jason Peters, linebacker Steven Sylvester and safety Rashaad Reid -- start on defense.

■ Out of Tech's 46 touchdowns, 40 have been scored by non-seniors.

**THREE YARDS AND A CLOUD OF DUST?**

■ Georgia Tech has four pass plays of 70-plus yards this season. Last year Tech had just one pass play of at least 70 yards.

■ The Yellow Jackets also have two rushing plays of 70-plus yards, for a total of six scrimmage plays that have gone that distance. Last season Tech had just three plays of 70 yards or longer.

■ Tech has produced 17 offensive plays of 40 yards or more.

■ The Yellow Jackets have produced 52 plays of at least 20 yards this season and have allowed opponents just 26 plays of 20-plus yards.

■ Twelve different players have produced a play of 20 yards or more.

■ Tech had 13 plays of at least 20 yards vs. Kansas.

■ Orwin Smith's 95-yard touchdown run on Tech's first offensive play from scrimmage against Kansas was the longest rushing attempt in Tech history.

■ The Jackets have scored 14 touchdowns on plays of 20 yards or longer and they have scored 10 touchdowns on plays of 50 yards or longer.

**JACKETS CAN SCORE QUICKLY...**

■ Tech has eight one-play touchdown drives. The Yellow Jackets had zero one-play drives last season.

■ Twenty-three of the Yellow Jackets' touchdowns have been on drives of less than three minutes. Ten TD drives have been less than one minute.

**... AND METHODICALLY**

■ Tech has produced six touchdown drives lasting longer than seven minutes and four TD drives of at least nine minutes.

■ Twelve Yellow Jacket touchdown drives have been of at least 80 yards and five have been 90 yards or longer.

■ Oct. 22 at Miami, Tech had a 20-play, 92-yard touchdown drive that lasted 9:15.

■ At Middle Tennessee State, Tech had TD drives of 17 plays, 98 yards, 9 minutes, 25 seconds, and 16 plays, 73 yards, 9 minutes and 41 seconds.

**BALANCED ATTACK**

Unlike previous seasons when the Georgia Tech offense leaned on Calvin Johnson (2006), Tashard Choice (2007), Jonathan Dwyer (2008, 2009) and Anthony Allen (2010), this year's offense is more balanced:

■ Three players -- Tevin Washington (70.7), David Sims (62.7) and Orwin Smith (61.4) -- average better than 60 yards rushing per game.

■ Eleven different offensive players have scored at least one offensive touchdown and six different players have at least three TDs.

■ Twelve different players have had at least one 20-yard offensive play (rushing or receiving).

**LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD**

■ Georgia Tech ranks second in the ACC and 17th nationally in scoring (37.6 points per game).

■ The Yellow Jackets' scoring average is their highest since 1999.

■ Georgia Tech has scored in 28 of 36 quarters.

■ Eleven different players have scored at least one touchdown -- five A-backs, three B-backs, two quarterbacks and one wide receiver.

■ Tech is 35-of-41 (85%) scoring inside the red zone.

■ Tech was just the second team in ACC history to score more than 200 points through its first four games.

■ The Jackets are outscoring opponents 94-41 in the first quarter and 88-21 in the third quarter. Tech has scored in the second quarter in every game this season.

■ Against two ranked opponents this season -- #25 North Carolina and #6 Clemson -- the Yellow Jackets scored a combined 66 points.

■ Georgia Tech scored on its first possession in each of the first six games of the season (5 touchdowns, 1 field goal). The Yellow Jackets, in fact, scored on their first offensive play in each of the first three games.

Sophomore defensive back Jemea Thomas enjoyed a career game against Clemson, earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors:

■ Thomas made his first career start when the Yellow Jackets began the game in the nickel.

■ He recorded the first two interceptions of his career -- both coming in the fourth quarter. His first INT came in the end zone with Clemson threatening to pull within a touchdown.

■ Thomas was the first Yellow Jacket with two interceptions in a game since Jerrard Tarrant had two picks against Middle Tennessee State on Oct. 16, 2010.

■ He also had five tackles, a tackle for loss, a forced fumble and two pass break-ups.

■ Thomas also lined up as a punt returner for the first time in his career. He had one return for seven yards.

## WASHINGTON SETS TECH QB RUSHING RECORD

Junior quarterback Tevin Washington's 176 rushing yards against Clemson were the most ever in a game by a Yellow Jacket QB. Washington broke the record of 151 yards by Joshua Nesbitt against Virginia Tech in 2008.

## STEPHEN HILL GIVES TECH BIG-PLAY THREAT

When junior WR Stephen Hill's number has been called this season, he has usually responded with a big play:

■ Hill has seven receptions of 40 yards or longer and three catches of 70 yards or longer.

■ Four of his 18 receptions this season have been for touchdowns.

■ Has three 100-yard receiving games this season and two games with 150 yards.

■ Against Clemson, Hill went over the 1,000-yard career receiving mark.

■ Hill's 181 receiving yards vs. Western Carolina were the 15th-most single-game yards in Tech history.

■ Hill averages 30.4 yards per reception, which ranks first nationally. The NCAA single-season record is 31.9 yards per catch by Tulsa's Brennan Marion in 2007.

■ Hill's career average for yards per catch is 25.3. The NCAA record is 24.4 by Fresno State's Henry Ellard in 1982.

## WASHINGTON-TO-HILL: A CAPITAL DUO

On a team known for its rushing attack, juniors Tevin Washington and Stephen Hill have quietly developed into one of the top home run passing combinations in Georgia Tech history. Three of the 24 longest pass plays in Yellow Jacket history have been Washington to Hill, and two of those long plays (82 and 77 yards) came in the season opener against Western Carolina.

To put Tech's longest pass plays into perspective, consider that Tech's greatest receiver, Calvin Johnson, is not on the list of the 24 longest pass plays. Also, Washington-to-Hill is the only quarterback-receiver combination that is on the list three times. In fact, Joe Hamilton-to-Dez White (two times) is the only other combination listed more than once.

## ORWIN SMITH: MR. VERSATILITY

Junior A-back Orwin Smith has been highly productive this fall as a runner, receiver and kick returner:

■ Smith averages 11.3 yards per rushing attempt.

■ He has scored a touchdown every 4.9 carries -- 10 touchdowns, 49 carries.

■ Smith averages 23.8 yards per reception.

■ His 11 touchdowns (10 rushing, 1 receiving) tie for second in the ACC.

■ Smith rushed for three touchdowns at NC State.

■ Smith has more than 1,000 career rushing yards, 1,200 kickoff return yards and more than 2,800 career all-purpose yards.

■ He has more than 1,100 all-purpose yards this season alone.

■ Smith's 95-yard run on Tech's first play of the game against Kansas was the longest run from scrimmage in Georgia Tech history.

■ Against Kansas, Smith rushed for 157 yards and a touchdown, and had 108 yards receiving and a TD. He became the first player in Tech history to have more than 100 rushing and receiving yards in the same game.

■ He was the first ACC player to have 100 or more yards in rushing and receiving in the same game since Mikell Simpson of Virginia vs. Maryland on Oct. 20, 2007.

■ He was the first ACC player with 100-plus yards and a touchdown in both receiving and rushing in the same game since Thomas Jones of Virginia vs. Buffalo on Nov. 13, 1999.

■ Smith owns three of the 19 longest rushing attempts in Tech history.

## SEVEN DAYS / MORE THAN SEVEN DAYS

■ Since Paul Johnson's arrival at Georgia Tech in 2008, opponents who beat Georgia Tech and play seven days later are 2-7 the week after beating the Yellow Jackets.

■ Georgia Tech's game at Middle Tennessee State was its first road game against a team from a non-BCS automatic qualifying conference since playing at BYU on Aug. 28, 2003. The Yellow Jackets were scheduled to play at Army in 2008, but the Black Knights opted out of the contract.

■ Georgia Tech has placed at least two players on the All-ACC first team in each of the last five seasons.

■ Since 1982, the Yellow Jackets have had 78 first team All-ACC selections.

■ Eight Jacket offensive linemen have earned first or second team All-ACC honors over the last four years.

■ The entire Tech coaching staff is back from a year ago. Charles Kelly, the secondary coach who is in his sixth season, has been at Tech the longest. Tech is one of 14 FBS teams that retained their entire coaching staff from 2010.

■ Georgia Tech is in its 119th season of football.

■ Georgia Tech's average of 323.3 yards rushing per game in 2010 not only led the nation, it broke an ACC single-season record.

**SANFORD WILL BE ACC LEGEND**

Lucius Sanford, a defensive leader under head coach Pepper Rodgers in the mid-1970s, will be recognized as Georgia Tech's "Legend" during the 2011 ACC Football Championship Game weekend. ## PAUL JOHNSON'S OFFENSE FOR DUMMIES

- Georgia Tech's offense is called the **spread option**. It is not the "triple option". The triple option is just one play, or a series of plays, within the offense. Tech runs the triple option roughly 20 percent of the time.
- There are two A-Backs, or slot-backs, that line up outside and behind the tackles (there is no tight end). The A-Back is a hybrid position, part runner and part receiver.
- The B-Back many people call the fullback because he lines up directly behind the quarterback.
- There are two wide receivers, who usually receive single coverage.
- The quarterback is very rarely in the shotgun, but otherwise there are more similarities with the popular spread offenses than most people think.

## TOTALLY OFFENSIVE AGAINST THE JAYHAWKS

Georgia Tech's offense ran – and sometimes passed – wild in the Sept. 17 win over Kansas, breaking school, ACC and NCAA records:

- Georgia Tech's 768 yards of total offense not only smashed a school record that stood since 1948, it ranked fifth in ACC history.

- The Jackets' 431 yards of total offense in the second half broke a school record for total offense in a half.

- Tech averaged 13.1 yards per play, breaking a school record.

- The Jackets' 604 yards rushing broke a school and ACC record. It was the most rushing yards by an FBS team since Nov. 29, 2003, when Rice racked up 672 on the ground at Louisiana Tech.

- Tech's average of 12.1 yards per rushing attempt (604 yards on 50 attempts) broke an NCAA record.

- The Jackets averaged 23.4 yards per pass attempt, which was their highest average in at least 30 years.

- The Jackets averaged 41.0 yards per pass completion (164 yards, 4-of-7 passing) – the fifth time under Paul Johnson Tech has averaged at least 40 yards per pass completion in a game.

# HEAD COACH PAUL JOHNSON

Western Carolina (1979) / 33-16 in 4th Season at Georgia Tech / 140-55 in 15th Season Overall

Paul Johnson, a two-time Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year and the mastermind behind Georgia Tech's high-production offense, is in his fourth season as head coach of the Yellow Jackets.

Under Johnson, Georgia Tech was one of college football's biggest surprise stories in 2008 and won the ACC championship in 2009. The ACC Coach of the Year in 2008 and 2009, Johnson's teams have appeared in a bowl game each of the last three seasons.

In four seasons on the Flats, Johnson has compiled a record of 33-16, including a 20-10 mark in ACC play. No coach in Tech history won more games than Johnson in their first three seasons. Over the last four seasons combined, only Virginia Tech has won more ACC games than Johnson's Jackets.

In 15 seasons overall as a head coach, Johnson owns a career record of 140-55. His career winning percentage (.718) ranks in the top 10 among active BCS head coaches.

Johnson enjoyed success as the head coach at Georgia Southern (1997-2001) and Navy (2002-2007) before being named Georgia Tech's 12th head coach on Dec. 12, 2007.

What Johnson has accomplished at Georgia Tech has been remarkable:

- In his first two seasons at Tech, Johnson was named the ACC Coach of the Year. He is the first coach to win the award in his first two years in the league.
- In 2008, he was named National Coach of the Year by CBS Sports.
- In 2009, the Yellow Jackets won the ACC title outright for the first time since 1990, defeating Clemson in the ACC Championship Game.
- Tech played in a BCS bowl game for the first time in 2009.
- Under Johnson, Tech has averaged nearly nine wins per season.
- In each of his three previous seasons, Tech has ranked in the top five nationally in rushing offense. Last season, the Yellow Jackets led the nation in rushing



(323.3 ypg).

- In 21 of Johnson's 40 games at Georgia Tech (entering 2011), the Yellow Jackets produced more than 400 yards of total offense. Tech scored at least one rushing touchdown in 35 of 40 games under Johnson through 2010.

- Over the previous three seasons, Tech has produced four 1,000-yard rushers -- Jonathan Dwyer in 2008, Dwyer and Joshua Nesbitt in 2009, and Anthony Allen in 2010.

- Over the previous three years combined, the Yellow Jackets have produced 12 first team All-ACC selections.

- Tech has produced two first team All-Americans under Johnson --

Michael Johnson in 2008 and Derrick Morgan in 2009.

- Since Johnson's arrival, a Tech player has been named ACC Offensive Player of the Year (Dwyer in 2008) and ACC Defensive Player of the Year (Morgan in 2009).

- Entering 2011, Johnson was 11-2 at Tech in games decided by five points or less, 6-4 at Tech against nationally-ranked opponents, 10-7 in road games, 23-5 when scoring at least 20 points, 16-1 when scoring more than 30 points.

- In 2009, Tech won in Tallahassee (Fla.) for the first time in school history, beat a top-five ranked team at home (Virginia Tech) for the first time since 1962 and won on the road in Charlottesville (Va.) for the first time since 1990.

- Also in 2009, Tech earned its highest national ranking (7th) since 1999.

- In 2008, the Jackets broke a seven-year losing skid to rival Georgia, beating the 13th-ranked Bulldogs, 45-42, in Athens (Ga.).

- Under Johnson, Georgia Tech's Academic Progress Report (APR) scores have risen each of the last three years.

In 2010, Georgia Tech earned a bowl bid for the 14th consecutive season, tying for the fourth-longest current streak in college football. The Yellow Jackets, who lost four juniors to the 2010 NFL Draft and played the final four games without injured quarterback Joshua Nesbitt, finished 4-4 in the ACC and led the nation in rushing offense for the first time in school history.

Orwin Smith scored two of Georgia Tech's four first-quarter touchdowns, Stephen Hill caught two touchdown passes from Tevin Washington and Georgia Tech beat Western Carolina 63-21 in the opener for both teams.

The Yellow Jackets piled up 662 yards of total offense -- their most productive game since 2000 -- but they struggled throughout the night to hold on to the football, losing two of six fumbles and allowing a second-quarter punt to get blocked and recovered for a touchdown.

Brandon Pechloff, who was sacked three times, had 180 yards passing for Western Carolina.

Georgia Tech, facing an FCS opponent that dropped to 10-46 since the start of 2006, showed flashes of a formidable passing game after ranking 119th in the nation last year.

Washington completed eight of 13 passes for 271 yards and three TDs. No. 2 quarterback Synjyn Days was 3 of 3 passing for 94 yards. Hill caught four passes for 181 yards. The yardage totals were career highs for all three players.

Georgia Tech had more yards passing in the first quarter (148) than it had in any game last season (130 in an Oct. 2 win over Wake Forest).

The Yellow Jackets, who led the nation in rushing last year, racked up 260 yards on the ground. Smith finished with 84 yards, which included a 77-yard score, on just four carries.

Western Carolina scored three touchdowns in the second quarter but still trailed by 21 points at halftime.

Georgia Tech coach Paul Johnson was surely irritated by his team's propensity to fumble.

Leading 28-0 near the end of the first quarter, Jackets B-back Charles Perkins lost a fumble that Western Carolina's Rainey Ala recovered at the Georgia Tech 31. The Catamounts went three-and-out, but Georgia Tech's Euclid Cummings fumbled away the ensuing punt return that Courtland Carson recovered at the Georgia Tech 4.

Pechloff's 2-yard run on the next play made it 28-7. After the Catamounts had a 13-play, 64-yard drive that ended with Michael Vaughn's 4-yard run and cut the lead to 35-14 late in the second, Georgia Tech answered with Washington's 26-yard TD pass to Roddy Jones.

But following another three-and-out by Western Carolina, the Jackets allowed Ala to block a 45-yard field goal attempt that was recovered by Isaiah Moore and returned for a 69-yard score to make it 42-21 at halftime.

One week after rolling up over 600 yards and 60 points, Georgia Tech proved it could score quickly through the air or grind it out on the ground with its triple-option attack.

Tevin Washington threw for two long touchdowns and ran for two scores, and Georgia Tech (2-0) pounded Middle Tennessee State (0-2) 49-21 before MTSU's record crowd of 30,501.

The Yellow Jackets, who took a 28-0 second-quarter lead, scored on their first play from scrimmage. Washington hit Tony Zenon down the left sideline for a 73-yard touchdown only 14 seconds into the game.

Georgia Tech then went to the ground for all 17 plays on its next possession to score on a 98-yard drive after MTSU had downed its first punt at the 2. Tech took 9:25 off the clock, had five different ball carriers and made six first downs before Washington scored on a 2-yard keeper for a 14-0 lead.

The Yellow Jackets finished with 596 total yards, 382 on the ground. Washington left in the third quarter after completing 5 of 8 passes for 202 yards, while David Sims and backup quarterback Synjyn Days led Tech's rushers with 91 yards each.

MTSU started its second possession at its 40 after Tech's kick-off went out of bounds, and Logan Kilgore hit Anthony Amos for a 20-yard pass on first down. But the drive stalled at the Tech 29 and Alan Gendreau missed on a 46-yard field goal attempt.

The Yellow Jackets went back to the air and scored on the next play, a 71-yard pass from Washington to Stephen Hill. Hill was hit by defenders around the 32, but broke loose for a 21-0 lead with 2:12 left in the first quarter.

An interception by Tech's Isaiah Johnson stopped MTSU at the Tech 10, and this time the Yellow Jackets mixed up the pass and the run to build a 28-0 lead with 10:45 to go in the second quarter. Washington connected with Hill for 43 yards and Roddy Jones and Sims had 14-yard carries on the seven-play drive before Washington kept on the option for a 7-yard touchdown.

Johnson also came up with a fumble recovery on the Blue Raiders' next drive, but Tech had to punt for the first time 7 minutes before halftime.

MTSU finally got on the scoreboard 3:12 before halftime after an 11-play. D.D. Kyle dragged defenders into the end zone on a 15-yard touchdown run.

Georgia Tech was the third Atlantic Coast Conference visitor to MTSU's Johnny (Red) Floyd Stadium since the Raiders moved up to the Football Bowl Subdivision in 1999. But the Yellow Jackets were the first to blow out MTSU; Virginia won by only two points in 2007 and Maryland lost in 2008.

The Yellow Jackets tacked on another touchdown midway through the third quarter when Orwin Smith's 2-yard TD run capped an 11-play, 6-minute drive that covered 85 yards.

Georgia Tech put in Days on the next series, and he directed two touchdown drives. The redshirt freshman ran keepers for 10 and 28 yards before scoring on a 5-yard run with 1:27 left in the third.

Middle Tennessee was celebrating its centennial with a birthday cake unveiled at halftime of the home opener.

Led by Orwin Smith, who had more than 100 yards rushing and receiving, Georgia Tech piled up a school-record 768 yards in a 66-24 rout of the Jayhawks.

Georgia Tech (3-0) also set a school mark with 604 yards rushing and played with a passion and focus that was missing a year ago in an mistake-plagued loss to Kansas.

The Yellow Jackets ran at will and mixed in three long passes against Kansas (2-1).

Georgia Tech averaged a 28-25 upset by the Jayhawks last season, a bitter defeat that sent the Yellow Jackets spiraling to a losing season.

Georgia Tech also set a school record with 604 yards on the ground in its highest-scoring game since a 69-14 win over Samford in 2007.

Losing its 10th straight road game, Kansas gave up three one-play scoring drives to the Yellow Jackets, including their first offensive snap of each half.

Georgia Tech averaged 12.1 yards each time they ran the ball. That broke the NCAA record, an 11.9-yard performance in 1973 by Bear Bryant's Alabama team against Virginia Tech.

Smith needed only five carries to put up 157 yards. Peoples added 110 yards on five carries.

Smith set the tone on Georgia Tech's first offensive play, breaking off a 95-yard touchdown for yet another record-longest run in school history.

Tevin Washington had another efficient day at quarterback, completing 4 of 7 for 164 yards. He connected with Smith on a 67-yard touchdown and hooked up with Jones on a 52-yarder. Washington also completed a 41-yard pass to Smith that came up short of the end zone, giving the junior A-back 108 yards on his two receptions.

Georgia Tech had gone seven years since its last player, Calvin Johnson, had rushing and receiving touchdowns in the same game. Both Smith and Jones did it against the Jayhawks.

Smith also was the first Yellow Jackets player since at least 1978 to account for more than 100 yards on the ground and through the air.

Kansas kicked a field goal on the last play of the first half and actually went to the locker room only down 24-17. It was all Georgia Tech after that.

Peoples took off from the 37 on the opening play of the third quarter and the rout was on.

The Yellow Jackets finished with their highest-scoring second half since putting up 96 over the final two periods of their famous 222-0 victory over Cumberland in 1916.

Georgia Tech broke the school record of 558 yards rushing against VMI in 1975, and the 706-yard mark for total yards set in 1948 against Citadel.

Tevin Washington threw a long touchdown pass and ran for two scores, including a 5-yarder with about 5 1/2 minutes remaining that gave No. 25 Georgia Tech a 35-28 victory over North Carolina. The Yellow Jackets improved to 4-0 for the first time since 1990, the season they shared the national title with Colorado.

The Tar Heels (3-1, 1-1 ACC) were actually the ones who fought back from a 28-14 deficit going to the final period, tying the game on Giovanni Bernard's 55-yard run with 7:22 left.

Georgia Tech needed only four plays to respond in its conference opener.

Running back Roddy Jones reached out to take a pitch from Washington that looked too far in front of him, going 48 yards down the sideline to the North Carolina 9. Two snaps later, with Finch and others clearing the way, Washington carried it in himself for the winning score with 5:20 left.

Stephen Hill had a huge game for Georgia Tech with six receptions for 151 yards, including a 59-yard touchdown. Bernard rushed for 155 yards and two TDs.

The Yellow Jackets came in with the nation's highest-scoring offense (59.3 points a game) and leading in several other offensive categories. While not nearly as dominating as they were in the first three games, they still had another big day offensively, piling up 312 yards on the ground and 496 yards in all.

Washington had a fumble and an interception, but he mostly ran the offense just as it's drawn up. He completed 10 of 14 passes for 184 yards, hooking up with Hill on Georgia Tech's seventh one-play scoring drive of the season midway through the second period.

Hill should've had another score, dropping a sure TD pass late in the game after he again broke free behind the secondary. He pulled up with some sort of cramp or hamstring problem just as the ball arrived, then hobbled to the sideline.

It was hard to get too mad at the 6-foot-5 receiver, especially with the leaping, one-handed grab he made on a pass in the

first half, somehow getting his fingers on the ball and pulling it down as he fell hard to the ground.

Washington also ran 25 times for 74 yards, taking quite a pounding from the Tar Heels.

North Carolina's Bryn Renner completed 17 of 25 for 204 yards, but a couple of interceptions plagued the sophomore in his first start outside of Chapel Hill.

The Tar Heels trailed 17-7 at halftime, and Tech drove for a field goal on the opening possession to extend its lead.

Renner and Bernard led North Carolina back. Renner completed five straight passes on a right-down-the-field, 74-yard drive the first time he got the ball, three of the completions going to Dwight Jones before Nelson Hurst hauled in a 6-yard scoring pass.

Washington guided Georgia Tech on a 13-play, 81-yard drive and scored on a 1-yard dive. The Yellow Jackets also made the 2-point conversion for their biggest lead.

Georgia Tech's offense kept on scoring - and the defense put up an important touchdown, too. It all added up to the Yellow Jackets' best start since they were national champions.

Orwin Smith rushed for three touchdowns and No. 21 Georgia Tech used a fourth-quarter flurry of points to beat North Carolina State 45-35 to extend its best start in more than 20 years.

Smith finished with 74 yards and scored on runs of 13, 9 and 3 yards. The Yellow Jackets (5-0, 2-0 ACC) were held to a season-low 413 total yards -- they entered averaging 630.5 yards per game -- but opened with five wins for the first time since their national championship season in 1990.

Georgia Tech led 21-0, briefly allowed N.C. State to make a game of it in the third quarter and pulled away with three touchdowns in a 2-minute, 22-second span of the fourth.

Mike Glennon was 20 of 29 for 163 yards with touchdown passes covering 9 yards to Jay Smith and 1 yard to Tyler Purvis for the Wolfpack (2-3, 0-2).

Tevin Washington completed just four passes for Georgia Tech -- but two were touchdowns, covering 9 yards to David Sims and 38 yards to Roddy Jones. He rushed for 43 yards but finished 4 of 12 for 117 yards through the air.

James Washington rushed for a career-high 131 yards for the Wolfpack. His 46-yard touchdown run got N.C. State within a score, down 21-14.

That's when Georgia Tech used a scoring flurry befitting the nation's most productive offense to take a huge lead.

Smith closed a 13-play drive that demoralized N.C. State by taking a pitch from Tevin Washington around right end and diving across the goal line with 12:29 left.

On State's next offensive play, Isaiah Johnson picked off Glennon's pass and returned it for a score, and Tevin Washington hit Jones deep for a TD that made it 42-14 with 10:07 left.

N.C. State made things interesting with two touchdowns in the final 34 seconds, including Brandon Bishop's 33-yard return of Synjyn Days' fumble with 20 seconds left to finish the scoring.

Glennon made it 21-7 with 1:15 left in the half on his scoring pass to Smith, and N.C. State got within a score on Washington's long touchdown run on its first play of the second half.

That came after it looked as though the Yellow Jackets would have their way against an N.C. State team that entered with one of the worst -- and most injury-riddled -- defenses in the ACC.

Smith capped each of Georgia Tech's first two drives with touchdown runs. Four plays after Jamea Thomas took a snap on a fake punt and rumbled 27 yards for a first down, Smith took a pitch through the right side and ran 13 yards for a score.

Then, he made it 14-0 with 3:34 left in the first quarter when he took a handoff 9 yards for his second touchdown.

Washington then made it 21-0 with his short flip to Sims on the first play of the second quarter, giving Georgia Tech a 173-30 advantage in total yards.

Tevin Washington ran for 120 yards and two touchdowns and No. 13 Georgia Tech's least impressive offensive showing of the season was enough to beat Maryland 21-16.

Georgia Tech led 21-3 before holding off the Terrapins' fourth-quarter comeback.

Georgia Tech (6-0 overall, 3-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) matched its wins total from 2010, when it finished 6-7. The Yellow Jackets averaged almost 52 points in their first five wins and began the day ranked first in the nation in rushing and second in scoring.

Quarterback C.J. Brown, who replaced starter Danny O'Brien, had a 77-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter for Maryland (2-3, 1-1). Davin Meggett, who had 86 yards rushing, scored from the 1 with 7:33 remaining to cut the lead to 21-16.

But Maryland was stopped on a fourth-and-8 play from its 46 on Brown's incomplete pass with 2:31 remaining, ending its comeback bid.

Brown was 4-of-17 passing for 36 yards and an interception. He had nine carries for 124 yards.

O'Brien was replaced after completing only 1 of 6 passes for 17 yards and an interception.

Washington had scoring runs of 7 yards in the first quarter and 3 yards in the third. Orwin Smith had a 10-yard scoring run in the second quarter.

Maryland's only points in the first three quarters were Nick Ferrara's 30-yard field goal at the end of a 14-play drive on the Terrapins' first possession.

Washington was Georgia Tech's leading rusher, but he struggled as a passer as he completed only 6 of 19 passes for 114 yards and an interception.

Maryland is left with a possible quarterback controversy. Coach Randy Edsall pulled O'Brien after the sophomore's second-quarter interception, his sixth of the year.

Brown took over and remained in the game after he was picked off by Rod Sweeting in the end zone in the third quarter.

Georgia Tech led 14-3 at halftime but wasted two second-quarter chances to stretch the lead.

Linebacker Quayshawn Nealy, making only his second career start, intercepted a pass from O'Brien to give the Yellow Jackets the ball at Maryland's 28. A false-start penalty helped stall the drive after one first down, and Justin Moore was wide left on a 34-yard field goal attempt.

Maryland turned to Brown on its next possession.

Maryland left guard Andrew Gonnella was taken off the field in an ambulance after suffering an apparent left leg injury in the fourth quarter.

With most Maryland players standing or kneeling on the field, the game was delayed for about 15 minutes as medical personnel from each team worked in a circle around Gonnella. A cart was first driven on the field but then left as the ambulance followed.

The Virginia Cavaliers beat No. 12 Georgia Tech at its own game, 24-21.

Georgia Tech (6-1, 3-1), off to its best start since 1966, came in with one of the nation's top offenses, but it was held to just two pass completions and a season-low 296 yards by a Virginia defense that made the most of an extra week to prepare.

The Cavaliers (4-2, 1-1 ACC) sealed the victory by holding onto the ball for the final 6 minutes, making five first downs to get inside the Yellow Jackets' 5.

But they didn't need to score, and when quarterback Michael Rocco took a knee for a 3-yard loss on the game's final play, thousand of fans surged onto the field at Scott Stadium.

Kevin Parks ran for one touchdown for Virginia, Rocco hit Tim Smith for a 37-yarder and Clifton Richardson had a 22-yard run, all in the first half, as Virginia built a 24-14 lead.

Georgia Tech almost struck very quickly to start the second half, with Tevin Washington running 85 yards on the first play from scrimmage, but the play was called back by a penalty.

The Yellow Jackets then did it the hard way, using 19 plays and converting two fourth-and-1 plays and a fourth-and-5 before Washington scored on a 1-yard run. The fourth-and-5 was initially a fourth-and-10, but defensive tackle Nick Jenkins was called for being offside, and Washington ran for 23 yards on the next play to the Cavaliers' 5 and scored two plays later.

The teams traded punts the rest of the way until Virginia took over at its 23 with just under 6 minutes left. Jones started with runs of 11 and eight yards, caught an 18-yard pass from Rocco to convert a third-and-6 from the Virginia 49 and the Cavaliers never gave it up.

Virginia gained 407 yards against former coach Al Groh's 3-4 defense.

The Yellow Jackets erased a 14-0 deficit with two touchdowns in 98 seconds in the second quarter. Washington capped an 80-yard drive with a 7-yard touchdown run, and Rod Sweeting intercepted a Rocco pass three plays later and returned in 32 yards for the tying touchdown.

Freshman David Watford came on at quarterback for one series for Virginia, and led a 72-yard scoring drive. He bulled his way for a first down on third-and-1, and also carried it the last 22 yards for the go-ahead touchdown.

When Chase Minnifield intercepted a deep pass by Washington on the ensuing series, Rocco came back and led them 41 yards in eight plays to Robert Randolph's 36-yard field goal.

Virginia struck quickly at the start with two touchdowns in the first 8:20.

The Cavaliers drove 73 yards after the opening kickoff, a drive kept alive by Rocco's 8-yard pass to Tim Smith on third-and-3 from the 23. Two plays later, Parks took it in from the 6.

The Yellow Jackets were penalized twice on their opening series, riling up the small crowd at Scott Stadium, and when Rocco hit Smith for 37 yards and a 14-0 lead, it got really loud.

JoJo Nicholas recovered a fumbled punt for a touchdown plus added an interception, Lamar Miller ran for 93 yards and a score and Miami's banged-up defense was dominant as the Hurricanes topped No. 20 Georgia Tech 24-7 -- holding the high-octane Yellow Jackets more than 300 yards and nearly 36 points below their season averages entering the game.

Mike James also had a touchdown run for Miami (4-3, 2-2 Atlantic Coast Conference), which won consecutive games for the first time this season and has now beaten Georgia Tech three straight times.

Georgia Tech (6-2, 3-2) came into Saturday averaging 517 yards of offense. The Yellow Jackets got only 211 on Saturday, their lowest total since a loss to Iowa in the Orange Bowl after the 2009 season. In its last 35 games, Georgia Tech has rushed for less than 200 yards only three times, all at Sun Life Stadium--95 at Miami in 2009, 143 in the Orange Bowl and 134 in this one.

Washington threw right to Nicholas on the Yellow Jackets' first offensive snap of the game, a mistake that set Miami up at the Georgia Tech 46. It was doubly costly for the Yellow Jackets, with center Jay Finch going down with what appeared to be a knee injury and eventually getting carted off the sideline for evaluation.

The Hurricanes needed 12 plays to score from there, Harris extending the drive with a 13-yard pass to Phillip Dorsett on fourth-and-3 from the 39, and James later capping it with a 2-yard run for a 7-0 Miami lead.

With 10:17 left in the half, Nicholas found himself again in the right place at the right time for Miami.

Zach Laskey dropped back to receive a punt for Georgia Tech, the bouncing ball coming straight at him as he stood at the 9-yard line. He tried to grab it as a horde of Hurricanes sprinted toward him, misplayed it and could only watch as the football kept going into the end zone. Nicholas dove on it just past the goal line for a touchdown that put Miami up 14-0.

In the first half alone, Georgia Tech failed on a fake-punt attempt, had the interception to help create one Miami touchdown and then the blown punt return to give the Hurricanes seven more points. Nonetheless, with 1:02 left in the half, the Yellow Jackets were within 14-7.

A 20-play, 92-yard drive for Georgia Tech on the scoreboard. Washington completed all three of his attempted passes during the marathon possession, plus rushed the ball nine times for 22 yards--including a 1-yard touchdown plunge.

Travis Benjamin ran the ensuing kickoff back 48 yards, and Harris hit Tommy Streeter with a 32-yard gain on first down to get Miami to the Georgia Tech 14. Two plays later, Miller ran up the middle for a touchdown from there with 25 seconds left in the half, restoring the 14-point cushion and getting help from a sealing block by guard Jon Feliciano.

It was a costly celebration. Feliciano got hurt jumping around after the score, leaving the game with a leg injury. He rejoined his teammates on the sideline late in the third quarter, on crutches and wearing a walking boot on his left ankle. An X-ray was negative, but Golden is not sure of Feliciano's status.

Tevin Washington rushed for 176 yards and broke the two longest runs of his career, leading Georgia Tech to a 31-17 upset of No. 6 Clemson and likely snuffing out the Tigers' national title hopes.

The Yellow Jackets (7-2, 4-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) raced to a 24-3 halftime lead and held off Clemson (8-1, 5-1) which was off to its best start since 2000. The Tigers were climbed to fifth in the BCS standings.

The Yellow Jackets snapped a two-game losing streak behind their junior quarterback, who had runs of 46 and 56 yards and touchdown among his 27 carries.

Clemson, which had scored 115 points in its two previous games, turned it over four times. Tajh Boyd threw for 295 yards, and freshman Sammy Watkins had 10 catches for 159 yards and a touchdown.

Clemson drove right down the field on its first possession before Georgia Tech stiffened at its own 16. Chandler Catanzaro came on to knock through a 34-yard field goal.

But the tide swung toward the Yellow Jackets when D.J. Howard caught a pass out of the backfield, but lost the ball just before he hit the ground. The officials initially ruled him down, but changed the call after a video review. Rod Sweeting was credited with a recovery at the Clemson 19, and the Georgia Tech offense took it the rest of the way, Orwin Smith going in from the 1 on fourth down.

After forcing a Clemson punt, Washington broke off the 46-yard run -- the longest of his career, though that mark wouldn't last long -- and Georgia Tech stretched its lead to 10-3 on Justin Moore's 23-yard field goal.

The Yellow Jackets went 80 yards in 10 plays to make it 17-3 on Smith's 3-yard TD run.

Stephen Hill stretched out with both arms to make a diving catch, pulling the ball into his body with the left hand before slamming into the turf. He rolled over and did a little dance with his arms, celebrating the 44-yard completion.

Two plays later, Washington ran it in from the 3 to push the lead to 24-3 with just 37 seconds left in the half.

Coming out of halftime, the Tigers took the kickoff and needed only four plays to reach the end zone for the first time. Boyd hooked up with Watkins on a 48-yard touchdown pass to make it 24-10.

But Georgia Tech quickly answered. With Georgia Tech facing third-and-6 and the Clemson defense waving their arms to rev up a sizable contingent of orange-clad fans, Washington spotted a hole up the middle and took off for the 56-yard gain.

David Sims finished the drive with an 11-yard touchdown run, restoring Georgia Tech's 21-point lead.
