GW OPENS TIGER-FILLED WEEKEND WITH #10/10 AUBURN

George Washington hosts 10th-ranked Auburn, a team it has become very familiar with the past three seasons, Friday night at Smith Center. The Colonials and Tigers meet for the fourth time in just over two calendar years and for the third time in 2008. Friday's game is the fifth of seven straight home games for GW, the longest homestand in program history. Senior **Antelia Parrish** is expected to return following a one-game suspension for violating a team rule, while R-senior **Lisa Steele** remains questionable with an ankle injury.

GW welcomes more Tigers to Smith Center Sunday afternoon when it hosts Princeton at 2:00 pm. Sunday's game will likely be the much-anticipated debut of **Yolanda Laverder**, a 2007 honorable mention All-ACC transfer from Wake Forest.

THE GW/AUBURN SERIES

GW has won each of the three previous meetings with Auburn, one victory apiece at home, on the road and at a neutral site, with each occurring within the past 24 months: **DEC. 16, 2006, WASHINGTON, DC** - No. 20 GW led by double-digits much of the first half, but Auburn closed within 50-49 with less than six minutes left. The Colonials closed with a 12-2 run to win 62-51. **JAN. 3, 2008, AUBURN, AL** - R-Junior **Lisa Steele's** three-pointer with 1.1 seconds left lifted No. 20/19 GW to a 68-66 upset at No. 18/18 Auburn. The Colonials led the opening 33 minutes before Auburn thrice took the lead the final seven minutes until Steele's heroics. **MARCH 22, 2008, STANFORD, CA** - In an NCAA Tournament first round game, 11-seed Auburn led 44-38 with 12:44 left, but 6-seed No. 20/16 GW closed on a 28-12 run to advance to the second round en route to the Sweet 16. Auburn leading scorer DeWanna Bonner was held scoreless the final 13 minutes.

TIDBITS VERSUS TOP 25, TOP 10

The Colonials are 24-84 all-time against ranked opponents over 33 seasons, including a 15-26 mark against ranked foes at Smith Center. However, since its Elite 8 season in 1996-97, GW is 12-8 against Top 25 teams at home. The Colonials are 7-42 all-time against Top 10 teams, with two of those victories coming last season - last-second thrillers versus No. 10/10 Texas A&M at Smith Center and No. 10/8 Cal in Stanford, CA. GW has beaten at least one ranked opponent in each of the past six seasons, in nine of the last 10 years, and 10 of the last 12.

2008-09 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

A CLOSER LOOK AT...#10/10 AUBURN

At 10-0, Auburn is off to its best start in six seasons and is at its highest ranking since reaching No. 9 in Dec. 2000. The Tigers have won their 10 games by an average of 24.2 points, including five 90-plus point performances, and boasts the nation's fourth-best offense (84.2 ppg) and second-best three-point shooting (45.1 percent). **DeWanna Bonner**, an honorable mention All-American last season, leads the team and SEC in scoring at 19.5 points per game. AU has been idle for 12 days since a 64-53 come-from-behind victory at Liberty Dec. 7. The following day, senior point guard **Whitney Boddie** was named SEC Player of the Week after averaging 10.7 points, 10.3 assists and 7.0 rebounds in a 3-0 week. Boddie posted the second triple-double in school history with 12 points, 13 assists and 10 boards in a 119-54 victory over Sam Houston State Dec. 5.

TOUGH ROAD AHEAD

GW will likely face a nationally ranked opponent, including a pair of Top 10 teams, in three of its next five games. After hosting No. 10/10 Auburn at Smith Center Friday, the Colonials wrap their seven-game homestand with Princeton and Loyola (MD). GW then starts a three-game road swing Dec. 29 at #14/13 Rutgers, followed by a trip to College Station, TX, to face #4/3 Texas A&M Jan. 3. Combined with its Dec. 29 meeting against #7/9 Tennessee, GW could potentially face three Top 10 teams during the regular season for the fourth time in program history (2006-07, 1994-95, 1990-91).

SEC-CESS

GW had won its previous five games against Southeastern Conference opponents entering this season, but has since dropped both its meetings this year (at Kentucky, #7/9 Tennessee) to fall to 11-18 all-time against the powerhouse conference. The Colonials bested No. 11/10 Georgia and Auburn during the 2006-07 campaign, then topped Auburn twice and Kentucky in 2007-08 for the five-game winning streak.

OFFENSE VS. DEFENSE

Tonight's prime match-up will pit Auburn's high-powered offense against GW's physical defense. The Tigers enter with the nation's fourth-best offense at 84.2 ppg, while the Colonials boast the nation's eighth-best defense in terms of opponents' field-goal percentage at 33.0 percent. AU also is ranked in the top 6 in the NCAA in field-goal percentage (47.5%) and three-point shooting (45.1%), while GW is 16th in the nation with 5.9 blocked shots per game.

THE FRESHMAN

Freshman **Tara Booker** has paced GW with 16.0 points and four 3-pointers per game in the team's last two outings, a 71-59 loss to No. 7/9 Tennessee Dec. 2 and 63-61 win over Troy Dec. 16. Booker entered the week the nation's leading three-point shooter at 61.5 percent (16-of-26) from three-point range through seven games. Booker went 4-for-10 from deep against the Trojans Tuesday and is now shooting 55.6 percent (20-for-36) from beyond the arc.

THE OTHER SISTER

While **Jessica Adair** ranks second on the team in scoring at 12.3 points per game, twin sister **Jazmine Adair** has stepped up her contributions on the offensive end so far this season. After struggling with a 1-for-8 shooting effort and three points in a season-opening victory over UMBC, Jazmine has averaged 9.6 points and 50.9 percent (29-of-57) shooting in just under 20 mpg over the last seven games.

LADY VOLS ESCAPE UPSET-MINDED COLONIALS, SNAP SMITH CENTER STREAK

The sixth largest women's basketball crowd (3,459) in Charles E. Smith Center history saw George Washington come within a possession of taking the lead with less than five minutes to play, but #7/9 Tennessee used a 15-5 game-ending run to escape with a 71-59 victory Dec. 2. The loss snapped GW's 17-game home court winning streak, which ranked ninth-best in the nation at the time and is the fourth-longest in school history.

GW HOSTS ANOTHER THANKSGIVING FEAST

Behind Tournament MVP **Jessica Adair's** 17.0 ppg and 15-of-20 shooting, GW captured the title of its own Thanksgiving Classic with victories over South Alabama (64-59) and Hartford (67-65) Nov. 28 & 29. The Colonials again won both games at their second annual Classic with seniors **Jessica Adair** and **Antelia Parrish** leading the way. All-Tourney selection Parrish averaged 13.0 points and 7.0 rebounds in the two games, while Jazmine Adair hit a pair of clutch free throws with six seconds left to cap GW's game-ending 7-0 run in its title-game comeback victory over Hartford.

HOME SWEET HOME

Despite having its 17-game homecourt streak snapped by #7/9 Tennessee on Dec. 2, GW still boasts tremendous success on the Charles E. Smith Center hardwood. The Colonials, who had a 15-game home streak snapped by nationally ranked Rutgers last season, have won 33 of their last 35 games in Foggy Bottom, nearly 90 percent (133-of-149) of their home games over the past decade and 77.6 percent (342-99) in the facility's 33 seasons. The University is currently in the process of a \$15 million fundraising initiative to add to the Smith and Kogod families' generous \$10 million gift for renovations to the Charles E. Smith Center. Part I of a three-step renovation plan is slated to begin at the completion of the 2008-09 basketball seasons.

BLUEGRASS BLUES

GW dropped back-to-back games for just the third time in four calendar years in road losses at Western Kentucky (72-64) Nov. 21 and Kentucky (67-48) Nov. 23. It marked the first time since Dec. 2002 that the Colonials lost consecutive games against true road opponents. GW combined to shoot just 34.9 percent (38-for-109) during the two-game road swing, including 28.6 percent in Sunday's loss at Kentucky - the team's worst shooting performance since a 13-for-59 effort (22.0 percent) in last year's 67-42 home loss to #6/7 Rutgers.

BENCH BEATS COPPIN

First-year head coach **Mike Bozeman** planned on "shortening the rotation" in GW's Nov. 17 outing against Coppin State Nov. 17. That plan didn't last long as the Colonials jumped out to a 20-point lead just over 11 minutes into the game and cruised to a 77-36 victory in which their bench outscored both the Eagles (45-36) and own starting five (45-32). Freshman **Kay-Kay Allums** led with 12 points in 24 minutes off the bench, while senior **Jasmine Adair** hit her first five shots for 10 points, all in the first half.

GRAND OPENING

GW improved to 19-15 all-time in season openers - 12-2 in openers at Smith Center - with a 75-56 victory over UMBC in first-year head coach **Mike Bozeman's** debut Nov. 15. The Colonials fell behind by 15 points just over eight minutes into the game, but closed the first half on a 27-9 run and trailed only briefly in the second half to post their third straight season-opening victory over the Retrievers. Senior **Antelia Parrish** narrowly missed just the third triple-double in school history with 19 points, 10 rebounds and six assists. Rookie **Tara Booker** added 13 points, the most for a true GW freshman since Yugo Oha scored 14 in her debut in Nov. 2000.

BOZEMAN ERA BEGINS AT GW

The 2008-09 season marks a new era in George Washington women's basketball as for the first time in nearly two decades a new head coach will appear on the Colonials' bench. First-year head coach **Mike Bozeman** takes over the reins of the program after three seasons as an assistant under Joe McKeown, who assumed head coaching duties at Northwestern this offseason after 19 years in Foggy Bottom. The eighth head coach in the 34-year history of the GW program, Bozeman helped GW to a 78-20 overall record, three NCAA Tournament appearances and a pair of trips to the Sweet 16 in 2007 and 2008 during his three seasons as assistant coach. Bozeman is no stranger to handling the main duties for GW. He served as interim head coach three times during the 2006-07 season, including an upset of #11/10 Georgia and a win over host San Diego State to claim the Surf 'N Slam Classic in Dec. 2006.

NEW LOOK, SAME GW

GW lost three starters from last season - Kimberly Beck, Sarah-Jo Lawrence and Whitney Allen - to graduation, but return senior starters **Jessica Adair** and **Antelia Parrish** as well as six other letterwinners for the 2008-09 campaign. The Colonials also welcome seven newcomers - six freshmen and Wake Forest transfer **Yolanda Lavender** - to their lineup. Despite the roster and coaching staff makeovers, GW was still picked to finish second in the Atlantic 10 this season, behind two-time defending conference tournament champion Xavier.

JESSICA ADAIR ON WOODEN WATCH

Senior center **Jessica Adair** was named one of 30 pre-season candidates for the 2008-09 Women's Wooden Award All-American Team on Nov. 5. The two-time All-Conference First Team selection led GW in scoring (15.2 ppg), field-goal percentage (.520) and blocks (1.2 bpg) and was second on the team in rebounding (6.1 rpg). She entered the 2008-09 season with 1,049 career points -- 21st all-time at GW -- and is on pace to enter the program's career Top 10 in both scoring and rebounding.

▶ The Colonials (27-7 overall) advanced to their second consecutive and fourth overall Sweet 16 courtesy of Sarah-Jo Lawrence's game-winning, buzzer-beating put-back in a 55-53 second-round victory over California.

▶ GW ranked No. 14 in final *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 poll and No. 20 in final AP Top 25 poll. The No. 14 final ranking is the third highest in program history.

▶ Ranked in *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 for all 21 weeks and in AP Top 25 for 17 weeks. GW ranked in *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 for school-record 40 consecutive weeks.

2008-09 SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

▶ GW is scheduled to appear on television three times during the regular season, highlighted by *CBS College Sports* broadcasts from Smith Center Jan. 21 against Villanova (NCAA Pack the House) and March 1 against Temple (Senior Day). The Colonials' Nov. 21 game at Western Kentucky will air on *Fox College Sports Atlantic*.

▶ GW will face 13 teams that qualified for either the 2008 NCAA Tournament or 2008 Postseason WNIT.

▶ GW hosts 17 home games -- the most for the program in 12 years.

▶ The Colonials also will face a trio of non-conference powers its has seen multiple times in the past two seasons. GW battles Auburn for the fourth time in 24 months, Rutgers for the third time in 13 months and Texas A&M for the third time in 22 months.

GAME 1 - GW 75, UMBC 56

WASHINGTON, DC (Nov. 15, 2008) - Despite a rough start, first-year George Washington women's basketball head coach **Mike Bozeman's** debut was a resounding success as the Colonials overcame a 15-point first-half deficit to defeat the UMBC Retrievers, 75-56, in a fast-paced season opener at Charles E. Smith Center Saturday afternoon.

After falling behind by 15 early in the first half, GW (1-0) clamped down on UMBC's Carlee Cassidy, who finished with a career-high 31 points, and turned to returning leading scorers **Antelia Parrish** and **Jessica Adair** to give Bozeman his first collegiate coaching victory.

Parrish led GW with a 19-point, 10-rebound double-double and added a team-high six assists to finish just shy of a triple-double. Jessica Adair followed with 15 points and nine boards, and contributions from freshmen **Tara Booker**, who finished with 13 points and seven rebounds, and **Tiana Myers**, who added 11 points, helped the Colonials fend off the upset-minded Retrievers.

UMBC (0-1) rode the hot start of sharp-shooting guard Cassidy to put GW in a 15-point hole early in the first half. Cassidy scored 16 of her team's first 18 points to help the Retrievers to a 24-9 lead just over eight minutes into the game.

Parrish, Adair and Booker jumpstarted the Colonials' momentum-turning rally, combining for 18 points in a 27-9 spurt that put the hosts ahead, 36-33, at halftime.

The much-larger Colonials grabbed 63 rebounds, six shy of matching the school record, and outscored the Retrievers 40-16 in the paint. The two teams' combined for 143 shots and 108 rebounds.

GAME 2 - GW 77, COPPIN ST. 36

WASHINGTON, DC (Nov. 17, 2008) - The George Washington women's basketball team spread its scoring among 11 different players and limited Coppin State to just 21 percent shooting in a 77-36 victory Monday night at Charles E. Smith Center.

GW's (2-0) bench scored 45 points, led by freshman **Kay-Kay Allums'** game-high 12 and senior **Jazmine Adair's** 10, and Coppin State (0-1) suffered through a 13-minute field-goal drought in the first half in the one-sided contest.

Senior **Antelia Parrish** hit the second of her three 3-pointers on the night to give GW a 15-6 lead 4:02 into the game. Shante Cummings answered with a jumper 16 seconds later, but Coppin State wouldn't hit another shot from the floor for nearly 13 minutes and GW went on a 20-6 run during the span and eventually led 42-21 at the break.

GW's lead never dipped below 20 points in the second half, reached 32 on **Lisa Steele's** three-pointer with 11:44 remaining and ballooned to 40 on sophomore **Ivy Abiona's** cutting lay-in set up by freshman **Sara Mostafa** with 2:58 left.

Parrish and freshman **Kayla Miller** chipped in nine points, while Abiona and rookie **Tara Booker** added eight apiece. 11 different players grabbed rebounds, paced by seven from Abiona and Jazmine Adair, and 12 players handed out assists, led by four from Parrish.

The Colonials assisted 22-of-29 baskets and shot 50.9 percent from the field, including 8-of-14 from beyond the three-point arc.

GAME 3 - WKU 72, GW 64

BOWLING GREEN, KY (Nov. 21, 2008) - Senior **Antelia Parrish's** three-pointer with 2:37 remaining moved the George Washington women's basketball team to within 64-60, but Western Kentucky answered with six straight points and went on to defeat the Colonials, 72-64, at E.A. Diddle Arena Friday night.

Playing its first road game of the season, GW (2-1) couldn't find answer for WKU's Kenzie Rich, who finished with a game-high 22 points on 9-of-18 shooting.

Parrish and senior **Jessica Adair** led GW's four double-digit scorers with 13 points apiece, followed by 12 from twin **Jazmine Adair** and 11 from freshman **Tara Booker**. Booker led a Colonials' bench that scored 29 points, but the Lady Toppers countered with 22 points off 17 turnovers.

After being tied at 32-32 at the half, GW took a brief two-point lead just over two minutes into the second half. WKU (2-1) forced the game's seventh tie 11 seconds later, regained the lead for good with 16:30 remaining and withstood several comeback attempts by the Colonials.

GAME 4 - KENTUCKY 67, GW 48

LEXINGTON, KY (Nov. 23, 2008) – The George Washington women's basketball team grabbed a 28-27 lead with 17:59 left to play, but Kentucky went on a 25-7 run over the next 11 minutes to send the Colonials to their second consecutive road loss, 67-48 at UK's Memorial Coliseum Sunday afternoon.

GW (2-2) suffered through its worst shooting performance in more than a year, connecting on only 14-of-49 field goal attempts (28.6 percent), while Kentucky (2-1) scored 25 points from the foul line to counter a 33.9 percent rate (19-of-56) from the floor.

The Wildcats controlled the frontcourt with 24 points in the paint and scored 16 second-chance points while out-rebounding the Colonials 50-30.

Senior **Antelia Parrish**, who led GW with 13 points, hit a pair of three-pointers to open the second half and turn a one-point halftime deficit into a 28-27 advantage for GW three minutes into the period.

However, the Colonials managed only two field goals during the next 12 minutes as the Wildcats put together their 18-point swing despite being held without a field goal for nearly five minutes. UK converted 21-of-24 free throws in the second half, including a streak of 11 to stem the tide during its five-minute field-goal drought.

Parrish's third 3-pointer cut the deficit to 11 with 4:49 to play, but Victoria Dunlap, who posted a 13-point, 14-rebound double-double, made the next three baskets as UK closed the game on a 13-5 run to cap its first victory over GW in three meetings.

Senior **Jessica Adair** was held to just one field goal - a three-point play that ended GW's near five-minute span without a basket with 5:47 left - and finished with nine points. Only Parrish (4-13) and **Jazmine Adair** (3-5) finished with more than one field goal, as GW's other 10 players combined to shoot 7-for-31.

The loss snaps GW's five-game winning streak against Southeastern Conference opponents.

GAME 5 - GW 64, S. ALABAMA 59

WASHINGTON, DC (Nov. 28, 2008) – Seniors **Jessica Adair** and **Antelia Parrish** combined for 33 points and 56 percent shooting to lead the George Washington women's basketball team past South Alabama, 64-59, and into Saturday's championship game of its Thanksgiving Classic at Charles E. Smith Center Friday evening.

Jessica Adair led all scorers with 18 points on 9-of-14 shooting, while Parrish connected on a career-high tying five 3-pointers to finish with 15 points to prevent GW from losing three straight games for the first time since 2002.

Adair, along with freshman **Tara Booker**, also added a game-high three blocks and Parrish grabbed a game-best seven boards as the Colonials extended their Smith Center winning streak to 16 games. Booker and redshirt sophomore **Ivy Abiona** chipped in eight points apiece.

GW appeared to take control of a tight game when it grabbed a nine-point cushion at 40-31 on Parrish's fourth 3-pointer with 16:04 remaining. However, USA scored seven straight points to close the margin to two, 40-38, with 14:27 left and stayed within two possessions of GW for the next nine minutes.

Jessica and twin sister **Jazmine Adair** converted inside the paint on three successive offensive trips to give the Colonials their largest lead at 59-49 with 4:41 to play.

The Lady Jaguars quickly sliced their deficit to four on a trio of Shakira Nettles' free throws and a Jessica Starling triple, but Parrish responded with her fifth 3-pointer to make it 62-55 at the 1:03 mark and seal the victory.

Nettles and Starling led USA with 16 and 15 points, respectively. Karina Sproal also reached double figures with 10. The Lady Jags hit nine 3-pointers, but went just 9-of-35 (25.7 percent) inside the arc.

GW equaled a season-high with eight 3-pointers and shot 49.0 percent (25-of-51) from the field. The Colonials also had a season-high 10 blocked shots and 28 turnovers.

GM. 7 - #7/9 TENNESSEE 71, GW 59

WASHINGTON, DC (Dec. 2, 2008) – The sixth largest women's basketball crowd (3,459) in Charles E. Smith Center history saw George Washington come within a possession of taking the lead with less than five minutes to play, but No. 7/9 Tennessee used a 15-5 game-ending run to escape with a 71-59 victory Tuesday evening.

In the closest of nine all-time meetings between the programs, GW (4-3) twice pulled within two points late in the second half, the latter on senior **Jazmine Adair's** lay-up to make it 56-54 at the 5:00 mark. The Colonials had a chance to tie or take the lead after a Tennessee (6-1) missed three, but Jazmine Adair missed a potential game-tying lay-up and the Lady Vols made 6-of-8 free throws and banked in a jumper from the foul line to move ahead 64-56 with 2:10 to play.

Freshman **Tara Booker** hit her career-best fourth 3-pointer of the game with 1:44 left, but Angie Bjorklund and Alex Fuller answered with triples in the final 72 seconds to lift the Lad Vols to victory.

Booker led GW with a career-high 14 points on 4-of-9 shooting from beyond the arc. Jazmine Adair finished with 12 and freshman **Tiana Myers** added 10. Senior **Antelia Parrish** grabbed a team-high eight rebounds, but struggled with a 2-of-14 shooting performance and finished with seven points.

GW held Tennessee to its second-worst shooting effort of the season at 35.3 percent, but the Lady Vols compensated with 24 second-chance points on 25 offensive rebounds and an 18-of-25 performance at the line. Glory Johnson shot just 3-of-15 from the floor, but made 10-of-12 free throws and led UT with a 16-point, 10-rebound double-double. Alex Fuller had 13, Strickland chipped in 12 and Vicki Baugh had 10 boards and eight points.

The Colonials answered the call on each of the Lady Vols' spurts despite off nights from Parrish and senior **Jessica Adair**, who had just six points in 15 minutes due to foul trouble.

GAME 8 - GW 63, TROY 61

WASHINGTON, DC (Dec. 16, 2008) – Sophomore **Erica Rivera** and senior **Jazmine Adair** hit four straight free throws in the final minute to help George Washington post a 63-61 come-from-behind victory over Troy at Charles E. Smith Center Tuesday night.

GW (5-3) avoided the upset by scoring six points in the final 55 seconds after letting a lead it held since the 18:26 mark of the first half slip away with 2:12 left.

Troy (3-5) used a 9-2 run, capped by Sarah McAppion's short-corner jumper, to grab a 59-57 advantage with 2:12 remaining. The teams' traded missed three-pointers, but senior **Jessica Adair** scored on a put-back with 55 seconds left to tie the game at 59-59.
