OPENING TIP TIDBITS

► GW improved to 13-2 in NCAA Tournament first round games with a 66-56 victory against Auburn on Saturday. GW advanced to the second round for the fourth consecutive season.

► Junior **Jessica Adair** registered her third double-double in six career NCAA Tournament games with 17 points and 13 rebounds against Auburn. Adair had 11 points and 10 rebounds in the second half alone.

► GW makes its 15th overall and sixth straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, all under head coach **Joe McKeown**.
► GW is 17-14 in 15 all-time NCAA Tournament appearances, including a 3-9 mark in 12 second-round games.

► GW is a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament for the second time, the last coming in 1996 when GW defeated #11 Maine in the first round, but fell at #3 Virginia in the second round.

► Head coach **Joe McKeown** is making his 17th appearance in the NCAA Tournament. He led New Mexico State to the 'Big Dance' in 1987 and 1988 and is 17-16 in his 17 appearances.

► GW reached the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 for the third time in program history last March, defeating Boise State and Texas A&M in Los Angeles, before bowing out to No. 1 seed North Carolina in the Dallas Regional semifinal.

FAMILIAR FOES - COACHES' EDITION

Even though GW has never faced Cal, the teams' head coaches are no stranger to each other on the sidelines. GW head coach **Joe McKeown** faced Cal's **Joanne Boyle** seven times when Boyle was head coach at Richmond, the Colonials' nearby Atlantic 10 rival, from 2002-05. Despite enjoying unprecedented success with the Spiders (three postseason appearances), Boyle was unable to defeat McKeown and the Colonials in seven tries. After a close six-point battle at Richmond in the coaches' first meeting in Jan. 2003, GW beat Boyle and UR by double-figures in six straight games, including a 63-44 victory in a 2005 A-10 Championship semifinal matchup which preceded Boyle's hiring at Cal. In total, GW and McKeown won all seven meetings against UR and Boyle by an average of 16 points.

SEASON RECAP, BRIEFLY

- ▶ GW opened the season with three wins, including an impressive come-from-behind 70-68 victory at Virginia, the program's first over the Cavaliers in 11 meetings.
- ▶ The No. 14/12 Colonials had a 15-game home winning streak snapped by No. 6/7 Rutgers, 67-42, on Nov. 18, in a game pitting the two highest ranked teams to ever play at 33-year-old Charles E. Smith Athletic Center.
- ▶ GW won its own Thanksgiving Classic with wins over South Dakota State and Western Kentucky despite playing without senior **Whitney Allen** and losing starter **Antelia Parrish** against the Jackrabbits. Each missed five games.
- ▶ Minus Allen and Parrish, the Colonials dropped back-to-back games for the first time since Dec. 2004, with losses at James Madison and against UNLV in New Orleans.
- ▶ GW then reeled off nine consecutive wins, highlighted by non-conference triumphs over then No. 10 Texas A&M in overtime and then No. 18 Auburn.
- ▶ After starting A-10 play 2-0, the Colonials stumbled at Temple 68-66 for their first regular-season league loss in 19 games.
- ▶ GW closed the regular season with 10 wins in its final 11 games, the only hiccup coming at St. Bonaventure on Feb. 16. The Colonials closed 24-5 overall and 12-2 in conference play, the 18th straight season of 10-or-more A-10 wins.
- ▶ Following a convincing 70-43 quarterfinal round victory over Rhode Island, No. 2-seed GW was bounced from the A-10 Championship semifinals for the second straight year with a 63-59 to No. 3-seed Xavier. GW led 36-28 with less than 16 minutes to play, but frontcourt mates **Jessica** and **Jazmine Adair** picked up their fourth fouls and the Musketeers promptly went on an 18-4 run.

BECK MATCHES MCCONNELL-SERIO FOR RARE A-10 RECORD

Senior point guard **Kimberly Beck** became GW's career assists leader with six assists versus No. 10/10 Texas A&M on Dec. 20, breaking Kathy Marshall's 22-year-old mark of 580. Beck now has 709 career assists, seventh all-time in Atlantic 10 Conference history and nine shy of fifth place. Beck, who led the A-10 with 6.3 assists per game this season, has paced the conference in assists in four straight seasons - joining former Penn State point guard and first-year Duquesne coach **Suzie McConnell (Serio)** as the only A-10 players to lead in assists all four seasons (1985-88). Beck is also just the 11th player in Division I history to accomplish the feat.

SENIOR'S LAST STAND

GW's senior quartet of **Whitney Allen, Kimberly Beck, Sarah-Jo Lawrence** and **Lora Mitchell** closed their Smith Center careers in style with a 66-27 win over Fordham on March 1. The group has guided the Colonials to a 100-28 overall record, including 54-10 the last two seasons (tied for most in program history), four regular-season A-10 titles and trips to four NCAA Tournaments the past four seasons and has combined for more than 3,400 points, 1,400 rebounds, 1,100 assists and 600 steals during their careers.

BECK AMONG LIEBERMAN AWARD FINAL NOMINEES

Senior **Kimberly Beck** was named one of nine final nominees for the Nancy Lieberman Award, which honors Division I's top point guard, on Feb. 14. It marks the second straight year Beck has been among the award's final nominees after she was named one of the three finalists to winner Lindsey Harding of Duke in 2007.

LAWRENCE AMONG NATION'S TOP STUDENT-ATHLETES

Senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** was named to *ESPN The Magazine's* Academic All-America Third Team on Feb. 26, to become the third GW women's basketball player to earn national academic honors (Kenan Cole - 2007 1st Team, Jennifer Shasky - 1993 2nd Team). Lawrence also is one of 10 finalists for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, which recognizes the nation's most well-rounded student-athlete, and was named the Atlantic 10's Student-Athlete of the Year and to the league's All-Academic Team.

#20/16 GW STORYLINES

- ▶ GW advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the fourth straight season with a 66-56 win over Auburn Saturday. Four players reached double-figures as the Colonials overcame a seven-point second half deficit and just one field goal from All-America candidate **Kimberly Beck**. **Whitney Allen, Jessica Adair** and **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** scored 20 of GW's last 22 points, while Allen held AU's leading scorer DeWanna Bonner scoreless the final 13 minutes.
- ▶ GW has never played California. However, the Colonials have been outstanding in the *state* of California as of late, winning each of their last five games in the Golden State. Before Saturday's win over Auburn, GW won the Surf 'n Slam Classic last season with wins over host San Diego State and No. 11/10 Georgia, then advanced to the program's third-ever NCAA Sweet 16 with victories over Boise State and Texas A&M in Los Angeles.
- ▶ Although it's never played Cal, GW is 7-3 all-time against current Pac-10 programs, most recently a 69-65 victory over Arizona in the BTI Classic in Collegen Park, MD, in Nov. 2006. (Arizona - 1-0; Arizona State - 1-0; Oregon - 1-1; Stanford - 0-2; UCLA - 3-0; Washington State - 1-0)
- ▶ With Saturday's victory over Auburn, GW has won its last five contests against the mighty Southeastern Conference to improve to 11-16 all-time against the power league. In 2006-07, GW beat Auburn and upset No. 11/10 Georgia. This season, GW handled Kentucky and won twice against Auburn.
- ▶ GW posted a 5-3 record this season against teams in the 2008 NCAA Tournament. GW has wins over Virginia, Texas A&M, Auburn, Western Kentucky and Xavier, and losses to Xavier, Temple and Rutgers, a potential Elite 8 opponent.
- ▶ With it's first-round NCAA victory, GW matched the program record for wins in back-to-back seasons with 54. The Colonials are 54-10 the last two seasons and went 54-13 from 1995-97.

500 Wins, He's Awesome Baby...

At least that's how ESPN basketball analyst Dick Vitale described **Joe McKeown** in a congratulatory video shown during the GW coach's 500th career victory celebration against Richmond on Feb. 10. Vitale was joined on the six-minute montage by Georgia's Andy Landers, North Carolina's Sylvia Hatchell, Ohio State's Jim Foster, Montana's Robin Selvig, Texas A&M's Gary Blair and Colonials' men's coach Karl Hobbs. McKeown picked up his 500th career victory at Duquesne on Feb. 2.

HIGH-RANKING COLONIALS

GW enters the NCAA Tournament ranked No. 16 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll and No. 20 in the Associated Press Top 25. GW began the year at No. 13 in the preseason coaches' poll - the highest preseason coaches' ranking in program history, while the No. 14 preseason AP ranking was the third highest. GW finished 2006-07 at No. 14 in the AP Top 25 and No. 11 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 25. (*Full Top 25 rankings on Pg. 3*)

TOP SCORING TANDEM

GW's star backcourt duo of **Kimberly Beck** and **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** have combined for 2,736 points in their careers - the third most of any classmates in Colonials' history. Darlene Saar and Debbie Hemery (1995) set the mark with 3,558 combined points, followed by Tajama Abraham and Lisa Cernignano (1997 - 3,412 pts.) and Cathy Joens and Ugo Oha (2003 - 3,280 pts.)

COLONIALS TURN UP THE 'D' IN A-10

After allowing 60.0 points per game in non-conference play, GW clamped down defensively against A-10 foes. The Colonials allowed a league-low 52.8 ppg against league foes this season, highlighted by a 50-32 victory against La Salle on Jan. 23 and 66-27 win over Fordham on March 1. The 27 points tied the fewest surrendered in A-10 history and is the least allowed by the Colonials in a league game.

BECK BRINGS GW BACK AT RHODE ISLAND

Senior All-America candidate **Kimberly Beck** scored a career-high 25 points, including 23 in the second half, to help GW overcome a tough first half and a late deficit to defeat Rhode Island, 48-45, in its first A-10 road game of the season on Jan. 16. Beck hit GW's first seven field goals of the second half, scored 19 of GW's first 20 points in the period and connected on the go-ahead floater with 1:24 to play as the Colonials won their 13th straight over the Rams.

BROWN DOES LITTLE AGAINST RED-HOT GW

GW wrapped its non-conference schedule with a 98-22 dismantling of Brown on Jan. 6. A number of single-game records fell in the lopsided victory:

TIDBITS VERSUS RANKED FOES

The GW women's basketball team faced a ranked opponent for the 25th consecutive year this season after contests against #6/7 Rutgers, #10/10 Texas A&M and #18/18 Auburn. With wins over No. 10 Texas A&M and No. 18 Auburn, the Colonials have beaten at least one ranked opponent in each of the last six seasons, in nine of the last 10 years, and 10 of the last 12. The Colonials are 23-82 all-time against ranked opponents over 33 seasons, with all 23 victories coming during **Joe McKeown's** tenure. GW's "best" regular-season victory to date? A 63-58 home win versus #7/7 Rutgers on Dec. 4, 1999. The Colonials also shocked #4 North Carolina, 55-46, in the Sweet 16 of the 1997 NCAA Tournament.

GW "STEELES" VICTORY FROM AUBURN

Redshirt junior **Lisa Steele** connected on a three-pointer with 1.1 seconds left to lift No. 20/19 GW to a 68-66 upset of 18th-ranked Auburn in Auburn, AL, on Jan. 3. Steele, who played just five minutes, missed a short jumper that would have given GW a one-point lead with 1:08 remaining, but countered with the game-winning triple over the outstretched arms of AU's DeWanna Bonner. Senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** led all players with 18 points, followed by senior **Kimberly Beck's** 16-point, 7-assist effort. GW has now won four straight games against SEC opponents, moving to 10-16 overall against current members of the power conference. The Colonials knocked off Auburn and No. 11/10 Georgia last year and dispatched Kentucky and the nationally ranked Tigers this season.

EARLY CHRISTMAS FOR LAWRENCE, GW

GW celebrated the holiday season five-days early in the form of a 66-65 overtime upset of then-10th ranked Texas A&M at Smith Center on Dec. 20. Senior guard **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** torched the Aggies for a career-high 29 points, highlighted by a game-tying three-pointer with 4.3 seconds left in regulation. Lawrence went on to earn A-10 Co-Player of the Week honors on Dec. 24, her second career weekly league award. All five starters played at least 40 minutes for GW, which posted its biggest upset in terms of AP ranking since defeating No. 7 Rutgers, 63-58, in Dec. 1999. The victory moved GW to 15-12 against ranked opponents at home under **Joe McKeown**, including a 12-6 mark since 1997. The win also improved McKeown to 4-1 all-time against his long-time coaching friend Gary Blair.

HEALTHY HOLIDAYS

GW had **Whitney Allen** and **Antelia Parrish** both back in the starting lineup against Loyola Marymount on Dec. 18 for the first time since the Rutgers game on Nov. 18. Allen started for the second straight game after missing five games from Nov. 23 to Dec. 1 due to a broken left ring finger. Parrish returned after missing five games (Nov. 24-Dec. 8) with a sprained left ankle.

HAPPY THANKSGIVING

The Colonials celebrated the holiday in the District by hosting the GW Thanksgiving Classic, a reincarnation of the former GW Invitational hosted from 1981-86 and 1993-95. Led by tournament MVP **Kimberly Beck**, All-Tourney selection **Jessica Adair** and senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence**, GW was the only team to win both its games, defeating South Dakota State (65-60) and Western Kentucky (80-63). Beck earned A-10 Player of the Week honors in averaging 17 points, 11 assists and five steals at the event, followed by Adair's 20.5 points and 9.5 boards. Lawrence went over 1,000 career points in scoring 16 against the Lady Toppers on Nov. 24.

NOT SO BIG EASY

Playing without starters **Whitney Allen** and **Antelia Parrish**, then No. 16/14 GW was upset by UNLV, 62-61, in the first game of the Four Points by Sheraton Lady Privateer Invitational in New Orleans last Friday. The Colonials squandered a 24-point halftime lead to the hot-shooting Lady Rebels, who were led by tourney MVP Sequoia Holmes' 22 second-half points. GW bounced back the next day against Samford thanks to All-Tournament team selections **Jessica Adair** (19p/8r) and **Kimberly Beck** (21p/6r/4a). Senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** averaged a team-best 16.0 points and 6.0 assists in the two games.

continues to stifle opponents after better than two decades in use. GW ranked 17th in the country in scoring defense last season after surrendering only 55.6 points per game. The Colonials also ranked ninth in the nation in field-goal percentage defense (35.1%). In 2005-06, those rankings were 11th nationally in both scoring defense (55.2 ppg) and field-goal percentage defense (35.5%). The 'Blizzard' allegedly got its name during McKeown's coaching stint at New Mexico State when he said he'd take his team to Dairy Queen if it played good defense. That 1987-88 team finished 26-3 and took McKeown to his second NCAA Tournament.

NATIONAL/INTERNATIONAL SUMMER

Returning starters **Jessica Adair** and **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** got to test their games against some of the nation's and world's best this past summer. Adair was a finalist for the U.S. Pan-American Games Team, reaching pre-tournament training in DC after a successful stint at the National Team Trials in Colorado. Lawrence was a member of the bronze-medal winning U.S. Team at the William Jones Cup, an annual international event in Taiwan. Lawrence averaged 7.2 points and 5.3 boards in 25 minutes per game as the U.S. went 4-2.

ALUMS JOIN GW HALL OF FAME

A pair of former GW women's basketball stars and teammates joined seven other inductees and 122 current members of the Athletics Hall of Fame on Feb. 9. **Lisa Cermignano ('97)** and **Colleen McCrea (Maguire) ('97)** composed GW's starting backcourt during the program's most successful four-year stretch from 1993 to 1997.

The duo helped the Colonials to a 103-27 composite record and four straight NCAA Tournament appearances during their four-year careers. As seniors in 1997, Cermignano and McCrea teamed with All-American and GW Athletics Hall of Famer **Tajama Abraham** to help the program to its only Elite Eight appearance.

Cermignano, who finished her career with 1,278 points and 270 three-pointers, is now an assistant coach at Vanderbilt after serving as an assistant at GW for four years (2001-05) as well as at Monmouth and Maryland.

Maguire dealt 573 assists in her career, third all-time at GW. She graduated first (summa cum laude) in her class at the University's School of Business and was a two-time member of the A-10 Academic All-Conference team ('96 and '97) as well as CoSIDA Academic All-America District II in '97. She is now Vice President at Commerce Bank in Cherry Hill, N.J.

FOR A GOOD CAUSE

The GW women's basketball program participated in the WALK NOW charity walk for autism for the second year-in-a-row on Saturday, October 20, helping to raise more than \$5,000 for the Cure Autism Now Foundation the past two years. The WALK NOW event is a 5 kilometer family walk and autism community research fair aimed at heightening public awareness and raising money to fund autism research. The Washington, DC, event is one of 63 which will take place nationwide in 2007. The 2005 events raised nearly \$5 million to benefit the CANF and its research.

Washington, MD/Bishop McNamara), Kayla Miller (Wilmington, DE/Ursuline Academy), Tara Booker (Galloway, NJ/Absegami), Brooke Wilson (Greenbelt, MD/Eleanor Roosevelt), Sara Mostafa (Galloway, NJ/Absegami) and Kiara Allums (Hugo, MN/Centennial) have all signed with the Colonials for the 2008-09 season.

Myers, a 5-9 guard, was an honorable mention All-Met selection by the *Washington Post* as a junior at Bishop McNamara High. Myers averaged 16.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 steals per game to earn second team All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference and second team all-county honors for the 25-10 Mustangs in 2007.

5-8 point guard Kayla Miller was a third team All-Delaware and first team All-Catholic Conference pick at Ursuline Academy last winter. Miller was a member of the Raiders' state championship teams in 2004 and 2006 and earned honorable mention all-state honors in 2005 and 2006. Ursuline remained No. 8 in this week's *USA Today* Super 25 national rankings.

Booker, a 6-1 guard/forward, and Mostafa, a 6-5 forward, have teamed to guide Absegami High to back-to-back New Jersey Group IV State Championships in 2005 and 2006 and three consecutive South Jersey Group IV titles.

Booker, a two-time *Press of Atlantic City* Player of the Year, averaged 17.4 points and 10.4 rebounds as a junior in 2007. Mostafa, a 2007 first team *Press of Atlantic City* All Star, added 16.6 points, 12.0 boards and Cape-Atlantic League leading 2.2 blocks for a Braves team that finished 24-5 last winter.

Wilson, a 6-2 forward, posted 12.9 points, 12.0 rebounds and 6.6 steals per game to earn All-Met honors from the *Washington Post* and first team *All-Gazette* as a junior at Eleanor Roosevelt High. A versatile, all-around prospect, Wilson helped Roosevelt to its third straight Maryland 4A State Championship in 2007, averaging 12.0 points and 12.0 boards in the state final four.

Allums, a 5-10 guard, is a two-time honorable mention all-state performer from Centennial High, currently the top ranked team in Minnesota and 13th in *USA Today's* latest Super 25 national rankings. Allums is averaging 15.6 points for the Cougars this year, after posting 14.6 points and 6.7 rebounds per game despite missing the first 13 games of last season after transferring from Highland Park High.
