**GW GOES TO TEMPLE, McKEOWN RETURNS TO HOMETOWN**

No. 13/13 George Washington visits Temple Saturday in search of its 10th consecutive victory overall, 19th straight A-10 regular season win and 12th straight league road win. GW's nine-game winning streak is tied for the fifth longest in the nation.

GW head coach Joe McKeown is 46-15 all-time in his hometown of Philadelphia in 18-plus seasons at GW, including a 9-3 mark against the Owls and 13-7 record in A-10 Championship play at various venues throughout the city.

The Colonials held off the Owls, 56-53, in both teams' A-10 regular season finale last February to capture their sixth consecutive league title with a perfect 14-0 record. GW became the fifth team in league history to post an undefeated conference mark and is the only program to accomplish the feat twice.

**BECK BRINGS GW BACK AT RHODE ISLAND**

Senior All-America candidate **Kimberly Beck** scored a career-high 25 points, including 23 in the second half, to help GW overcome its worst first half of the season and a late deficit to defeat Rhode Island, 48-45, in its first A-10 road game of the season on Jan. 16. Beck hit GW's first seven field goals of the second half, scored 19 of GW's first 20 points in the period and connected on the go-ahead floater with 1:24 to play as the Colonials won their 13th straight over the Rams.

**HIGH-RANKING COLONIAL**

GW improved four spots to No. 13 in both the Associated Press Top 25 and ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 25. The No. 13 AP ranking is GW's highest of the season. GW began the year at No. 13 in the preseason coaches' poll - the highest preseason coaches' ranking in program history, while the No. 14 preseason AP ranking was the third highest. GW finished 2006-07 at No. 14 in the AP Top 25 and No. 11 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 25. (Full Top 25 rankings on Pg. 3)

**HEATING UP**

During its nine-game winning streak, GW is shooting 45.7 percent from the field (242-of-529) and better than 42 percent from three-point range (49-of-116). During the first eight games of the season, the Colonials shot just 39.9 percent from the floor and 28.1 percent from deep.

### COLONIALS STIFLE MUSKETEERS IN A-10 OPENER

GW won its 10th consecutive A-10 Conference opener with a 56-46 victory over Xavier at Smith Center on Jan. 13. The fourth largest women's basketball crowd in GW history (3,689) saw the Colonials put together a 10-0 run midway through the second half to open a 54-35 lead with six minutes left. GW held Xavier to its second lowest point total of the season to capture the program's 600th all-time win since its inception in 1975.

### BROWN DOES LITTLE AGAINST RED-HOT GW

GW wrapped its non-conference schedule with a 98-22 dismantling of Brown on Jan. 6. Five players reached double-figures for the third time this season and second time in the last three games, led by senior Whitney Allen's career-high-tying 16 points. A number of single-game records fell in the lopsided victory:

- A-10** ▶ Largest margin of victory - 76 points (Prev.: 75, Rutgers - W, 108-33 vs. Duquesne, Jan. 9, 1988)
- GW** ▶ Largest margin of victory - 76 points (Prev.: 65 - W, 107-42 vs. Coppin State, Nov. 27, 1993)
- ▶ Highest single-game shooting percentage - 66.7% (Prev.: 64.2% vs. William & Mary, Dec. 20, 1985)
- ▶ Tied for most three-pointers made in single game - 13 (Prev.: 13, three times)
- ▶ ALSO - 22 points allowed were fewest by GW since a 66-19 win over Gallaudet, Feb. 3, 1978.
- Brown** ▶ Largest margin of defeat - 76 points (Prev.: 62 - L, 111-49 vs. Virginia, Dec. 28, 1998)
- ▶ Fewest points scored - 22 points (Prev.: 23 - L vs. Connecticut, Dec. 13, 1978)

### GW "STEELES" VICTORY FROM NO. 18 AUBURN

Redshirt junior **Lisa Steele** connected on a three-pointer with 1.1 seconds left to lift No. 20/19 GW to a 68-66 upset of 18th-ranked Auburn in Auburn, AL, on Jan. 3. Steele, who played just five minutes, missed a short jumper that would have given GW a one-point lead with 1:08 remaining, but countered with the game-winning triple over the outstretched arms of AU's DeWanna Bonner. Senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** led all players with 18 points, followed by senior **Kimberly Beck's** 16-point, 7-assist effort. GW has now won four straight games against SEC opponents, moving to 10-16 overall against current members of the power conference. The Colonials knocked off Auburn and No. 11/10 Georgia last year and dispatched Kentucky and the nationally ranked Tigers this season.

### TIDBITS VERSUS RANKED FOES

The GW women's basketball team faced a ranked opponent for the 25th consecutive year this season after contests against #6/7 Rutgers, #10/10 Texas A&M and #18/18 Auburn. With wins over No. 10 Texas A&M and No. 18 Auburn, the Colonials have beaten at least one ranked opponent in each of the last six seasons, in nine of the last 10 years, and 10 of the last 12. The Colonials are 23-82 all-time against ranked opponents over 33 seasons, with all 23 victories coming during **Joe McKeown's** tenure. GW's "best" regular-season victory to date? A 63-58 home win versus #7/7 Rutgers on Dec. 4, 1999. The Colonials also shocked #4 North Carolina, 55-46, in the Sweet 16 of the 1997 NCAA Tournament. GW's road victory at No. 18 Auburn on Jan. 3, was its second road win over a ranked opponent in program history. It's first came at Atlantic 10 foe and 17th-ranked Temple, 55-50, in overtime in Feb. 2006.

### EARLY CHRISTMAS FOR LAWRENCE, COLONIALS

GW celebrated the holiday season five-days early in the form of a 66-65 overtime upset of then-10th ranked Texas A&M at Smith Center on Dec. 20. Senior guard **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** torched the Aggies for a career-high 29 points, high-

### A CLOSER LOOK AT...TEMPLE

Temple evened its Atlantic 10 record at 1-1 with a 73-62 victory against St. Bonaventure at the Liacouras Center on Tuesday. **LaKeisha Eaddy** and **Lindsay Kimmel** each scored 13 points to lead the Owls, followed by 12 points from **Shenita Landry**. The Owls opened league play on the road, falling to red-hot Dayton 62-50 last Saturday. Temple posted a 7-9 out-of-conference record, but played a Top 20 strength of schedule according to collegempi.com. The Owls faced six Top 25 squads in their non-conference slate, including a 26-point loss at Rutgers on Dec. 30. Ashley Morris is the lone Temple player to average double figures with 14.1 points per game. She is followed by senior Lady Comfort, who averages 8.5 points and a team-high 8.1 boards per game. GW has won 26 of the last 30 meetings in the all-time series, but the teams have split the last six contests.

### ALL-TIME COACHING WINS ACTIVE

GW head coach Joe McKeown, now in his 22nd year overall, is among the nation's winningest active coaches. As of Jan. 17, McKeown is 22nd on the NCAA's active Division I wins list. McKeown is the shortest tenured coach to appear in the Top 25 of the active coaching wins list.

lighted by a game-tying three-pointer with 4.3 seconds left in regulation. Lawrence went on to earn A-10 Co-Player of the Week honors on Dec. 24, her second career weekly league award. All five starters played at least 40 minutes for GW, which posted its biggest upset in terms of AP ranking since defeating No. 7 Rutgers, 63-58, in Dec. 1999. The victory moved GW to 15-12 against ranked opponents at home under **Joe McKeown**, including a 12-6 mark since 1997. The win also improved McKeown to 4-1 all-time against his long-time coaching friend Gary Blair.

### BECK BREAKS GW ASSISTS MARK

Senior point guard **Kimberly Beck** became GW's career assists leader with six assists versus No. 10/10 Texas A&M on Dec. 20, breaking Kathy Marshall's 22-year-old mark of 580. Beck now has 614 career assists, good for 10th all-time in Atlantic 10 Conference history and on pace for seventh all-time in league annals. Beck has led the conference in assists in three straight seasons - only former Penn State point guard and current Duquesne coach Suzie McConnell (Serio) paced the A-10 in assists all four seasons (1985-88), finishing her career with an NCAA record 1,307.

### BECK ON PLAYER OF THE YEAR LISTS

Senior point guard **Kimberly Beck** was named one of 50 preseason candidates for the Naismith Trophy, which honors the nation's best player, on Dec. 18. Beck also was named to the Wooden Award preseason watch list on Oct. 31 and for the second straight year is listed among the 'Buzz Players' for the Nancy Lieberman Award for the nation's Top PG.

### HEALTHY HOLIDAYS

GW had **Whitney Allen** and **Antelia Parrish** both back in the starting lineup against Loyola Marymount on Dec. 18 for the first time since the Rutgers game on Nov. 18. Allen started for the second straight game after missing five games from Nov. 23 to Dec. 1 due to a broken left ring finger. Parrish returned after missing five games (Nov. 24-Dec. 8) with a sprained left ankle.

### HAPPY THANKSGIVING

The Colonials celebrated the holiday in the District by hosting the GW Thanksgiving Classic, a reincarnation of the former GW Invitational hosted from 1981-86 and 1993-95. Led by tournament MVP **Kimberly Beck**, All-Tourney selection **Jessica Adair** and senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence**, GW was the only team to win both its games, defeating South Dakota State (65-60) and Western Kentucky (80-63). Beck earned A-10 Player of the Week honors in averaging 17 points, 11 assists and five steals at the event, followed by Adair's 20.5 points and 9.5 boards. Lawrence went over 1,000 career points in scoring 16 against the Lady Toppers on Nov. 24.

### NOT SO BIG EASY

Playing without starters **Whitney Allen** and **Antelia Parrish**, then No. 16/14 GW was upset by UNLV, 62-61, in the first game of the Four Points by Sheraton Lady Privateer Invitational in New Orleans last Friday. The Colonials squandered a 24-point halftime lead to the hot-shooting Lady Rebels, who were led by tourney MVP Sequoia Holmes' 22 second-half points. GW bounced back the next day against Samford thanks to All-Tourney team selections **Jessica Adair** (19p/8r) and **Kimberly Beck** (21p/6r/4a). Senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** averaged a team-best 16.0 points and 6.0 assists in the two games.

### A LOOK BACK AT 2006-07

The George Washington women's basketball team enjoyed one of the best years in program history in 2006-07:

► The Colonials made their third appearance in the Sweet 16, first since 1997, and racked up a school-record-tying 28 victories.

► GW rolled to a 25-2 regular-season mark with its only losses coming at then top-ranked Maryland and eventual national champion Tennessee.

► GW was ranked in both national polls for a school-record-tying 18 weeks and ranked in Top 10 for the entire month of February. Peaked at No. 8 in AP poll, highest since 1992, and No. 9 in coaches' poll, highest since 1991-92.

► GW became the fifth team in league history to go undefeated (14-0) in A-10 play and is now the only program to do it twice (1997).

### PLAYING FAVORITES, AGAIN

For the third time in the past four years, GW has been tabbed the preseason Atlantic 10 team-to-beat according to the league's coaches and select media members and announced on Media Day, Oct. 25. The Colonials were the unanimous selection, receiving all 17 first-place votes, finishing ahead of Xavier and Charlotte, which tied for second.

### PLAYING IN A 'BLIZZARD'

Head coach **Joe McKeown's** vaunted 'Blizzard' defense continues to stifle opponents after better than two decades in use. GW ranked 17th in the country in scoring defense last season after surrendering only 55.6 points per game. The Colonials also ranked ninth in the nation in field-goal percentage defense (35.1%). In 2005-06, those rankings were 11th nationally in both scoring defense (55.2 ppg) and field-goal percentage defense (35.5%). The 'Blizzard' allegedly got its name during McKeown's coaching stint at New Mexico State when he said he'd take his team to Dairy Queen if it played good defense. That 1987-88 team finished 26-3 and took McKeown to his second NCAA Tournament.

### NATIONAL/INTERNATIONAL SUMMER

Returning starters **Jessica Adair** and **Sarah-Jo Lawrence** got to test their games against some of the nation's and world's best this past summer. Adair was a finalist for the U.S. Pan-American Games Team, reaching pre-tournament training in DC after a successful stint at the National Team Trials in Colorado. Lawrence was a member of the bronze-medal winning U.S. Team at the William Jones Cup, an annual international event in Taiwan. Lawrence averaged 7.2 points and 5.3 boards in 25 minutes per game as the U.S. went 4-2.

### "JESS & JAZ" - DC'S SISTER ACT

GW's formidable frontcourt boasts six players at least six feet or taller, highlighted by one of the tallest sister tandems in Division I women's basketball in **Jazmine and Jessica Adair**. The Adair's are tied with Oklahoma's Paris twins as the second tallest sister duo in the nation, trailing only the Bofia's of Arizona:

### GW PROGRAM INKS SIX FOR 2008-09

The George Washington women's basketball program has signed six players to National Letters of Intent (NLI) during the early signing period, head coach Joe McKeown has announced.

Tiana Myers (Ft. Washington, MD/Bishop McNamara), Kayla Miller (Wilmington, DE/Ursuline Academy), Tara Booker (Galloway, NJ/Absegami), Brooke Wilson (Greenbelt, MD/Eleanor Roosevelt), Sara Mostafa (Galloway, NJ/Absegami) and Kiara Allums (Hugo, MN/Centennial) have all signed with the Colonials for the 2008-09 season.

Myers, a 5-9 guard, was an honorable mention All-Met selection by the *Washington Post* as a junior at Bishop McNamara High. Myers averaged 16.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 steals per game to earn second team All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference and second team all-county honors for the 25-10 Mustangs in 2007.

5-8 point guard Kayla Miller was a third team All-Delaware and first team All-Catholic Conference pick at Ursuline Academy last winter. Miller was a member of the Raiders' state championship teams in 2004 and 2006 and earned honorable mention all-state honors in 2005 and 2006. Ursuline remained No. 8 in this week's *USA Today* Super 25 national rankings.

Booker, a 6-1 guard/forward, and Mostafa, a 6-5 forward, have teamed to guide Absegami High to back-to-back New Jersey Group IV State Championships in 2005 and 2006 and three consecutive South Jersey Group IV titles.

Booker, a two-time *Press of Atlantic City* Player of the Year, averaged 17.4 points and 10.4 rebounds as a junior in 2007. Mostafa, a 2007 first team *Press of Atlantic City* All Star, added 16.6 points, 12.0 boards and Cape-Atlantic League leading 2.2 blocks for a Braves team that finished 24-5 last winter.

Wilson, a 6-2 forward, posted 12.9 points, 12.0 rebounds and 6.6 steals per game to earn All-Met honors from the *Washington Post* and first team *All-Gazette* as a junior at Eleanor Roosevelt High. A versatile, all-around prospect, Wilson helped Roosevelt to its third straight Maryland 4A State Championship in 2007, averaging 12.0 points and 12.0 boards in the state final four.

Allums, a 5-10 guard, is a two-time honorable mention all-state performer from Centennial High, currently the top ranked team in Minnesota and 13th in *USA Today's* latest Super 25 national rankings. Allums is averaging 15.6 points for the Cougars this year, after posting 14.6 points and 6.7 rebounds per game despite missing the first 13 games of last season after transferring from Highland Park High.

**No. 14/13 George Washington Downs UMBC, 79-59**

**Kimberly Beck Becomes 23rd player in GW History to Reach 1,000 Points**

**BALTIMORE, MD (AP) (Nov. 9, 2007)** – Senior **Kimberly Beck (Fairburn, GA/Woodward Academy)** scored 20 points to surpass 1,000 for her career, junior **Antelia Parrish (Washington, DC/Bishop McNamara)** added 17 points and eight rebounds, and No. 14/13 George Washington opened its season with a 79-59 victory over Maryland-Baltimore County on Friday night.

Senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence (Rhoadesville, VA/Orange County)** scored 18 points and senior **Whitney Allen (Woodbridge, VA/Woodbridge)** had 11 points and 10 rebounds for the Colonials, who improved to 7-0 against UMBC.

Six of the Colonials nine 3-pointers came from Beck, who became the 23rd player in George Washington history to reach 1,000 points on a left-side 3-pointer with 3:37 remaining in the game.

Beck's rainbow, right-side 3-pointer with 14:20 left in the first half ignited a 13-2 run for a 16-11 Colonials lead.

**Parrish's Third 3-pointer Gave Colonials Lead for Good With 5:30 Left**

**CHARLOTTESVILLE, VA (AP) (Nov. 12, 2007)** – Junior **Antelia Parrish (Washington, DC/Bishop McNamara)** had 18 points and 10 rebounds to help No. 14/13 George Washington beat Virginia 70-68 on Monday night.

Beck and senior **Sarah-Jo Lawrence (Rhoadesville, VA/Orange County)** each added 14 points for George Washington.

**Adair, Parrish Pace No. 14/12 GW Against Kentucky, 75-65**

**Junior Duo Combines for 53 Points, 25 Rebounds**

**WASHINGTON, DC (AP) (Nov. 14, 2007)** – Junior **Jessica Adair (Washington, DC/Anacostia)** scored a career-high 29 points to lead No. 14/12 George Washington to a 75-65 win against Kentucky on Wednesday night.

Junior **Antelia Parrish (Washington, DC/Bishop McNamara)** added 24 points and 16 rebounds for the Colonials (3-0), who extended their home winning streak to 15 games.

Adair had 17 of her points in the second half. The game was close until just after halftime, with George Washington holding a 36-35 lead with 19:27 left. The Colonials then went on a 7-0 run and took control of the game, as Adair and Parrish combined for 22 of the team's first 26 points after the half. George Washington built the lead to 15 points with 3:27 left.

It was the second-straight double-double for Parrish. The junior college transfer is averaging 19.7 points and 11.3 rebounds after her first three Division I games.

Adair's previous career high was 23 points, set against Tennessee on Dec. 7, 2006.

No. 6/7 Scarlet Knights Down No. 14/12 Colonials, 67-42  
*Colonials Held to 22 Percent Shooting, Lowest Home Point Total Since 1983*

WASHINGTON, DC (AP) (Nov. 18, 2007) - Rutgers broke out of its early season mini-doldrums in a big way, handing George Washington a rare home defeat that left coach Joe McKeown embarrassed.

The Scarlet Knights (2-1) lost their opener to Stanford, but they blew out George Washington (3-1) in the first half and ended the Colonials' 15-game home winning streak.

The loss was George Washington's worst at home since an 88-57 defeat to Tennessee in November 2001. It was also the fewest points scored by the Colonials at the Smith Center since a 50-40 loss to West Virginia in 1983.

Rutgers contested nearly every shot in the first half, forcing the Colonials to miss 16 of their first 20 field goals. Vaughn helped limit Jessica Adair, a 6-foot-4 center who rarely leaves the paint, to 2-for-16 shooting. The Colonials shot 22 percent for the game.

Rutgers led 36-19 at halftime, and Carson made three 3-pointers in a 20-0 run early in the second half to put the lead into the 30s. Adair, Beck and Sarah-Jo Lawrence scored nine points apiece to lead the Colonials.

"Tonight was a kick in the stomach," McKeown said. "We've got to bounce back."

### GAME 7 - JAMES MADISON

No. 16/14 GW Routed at James Madison, 80-55  
**Minus Two Starters, Colonial Falls to Hot-Shooting Dukes**

HARRISONBURG, VA (Nov. 27, 2007) – Junior center Jessica Adair (Washington, DC/Anacostia) scored a game-high 21 points, but the No. 16/14 George Washington women's basketball team couldn't overcome playing without two starters and James Madison's four double-digit scorers in an 80-55 loss to the Dukes at the JMU Convocation Center Tuesday night.

GW (5-2) starting forwards Whitney Allen (Woodbridge, VA/Woodbridge) and Antelia Parrish (Washington, DC/Bishop McNamara) both missed the game due to injuries, while Jessica and Jazmine Adair (Washington, DC/Anacostia) were both limited with foul trouble.

Adair's jumper with 6:41 left in the first half tied the game at 21-21, but her and twin sister, Jazmine, both picked up their third fouls within the next two minutes, forcing the Colonials to dig deep into their already depleted bench.

James Madison (5-0) took advantage, closing the half on a 16-5 run to lead 37-26 at halftime.

GW attempted to rally to start the second half, slicing the deficit to seven, 43-36, on sophomore Stefani Munro's (Mount Clemens, MI/Mount Clemens) steal and finish with 15:29 remaining. The Colonials would not get any closer as the Dukes knocked down five second-half three-pointers to win their 29th straight at home and score their first win over a Top 25 team since 1991.

Tamera Young (20 points, 14 rebounds) and Jennifer Brown (16 points, 11 boards) both posted double-doubles to lead the Dukes. Dawn Evans hit four three-pointers and finished with 19 points, while Courtney Hamner came off the bench to add 12.

Senior Sarah-Jo Lawrence (Rhoadesville, VA/Orange County) chipped in 13 points for the Colonials, who shot 31.1 percent overall and made just one of 15 three-point attempts. JMU capitalized on GW's small lineup, outrebounding the Colonials, 53-26.

### GAME 8 - UNLV

No. 16/14 George Washington Stunned by UNLV, 62-61  
**Colonials Lose 24-Point Halftime Lead**

NEW ORLEANS, LA (Nov. 30, 2007) – The No. 16/14 George Washington women's basketball team led by 24 points at halftime, but UNLV rallied behind Shequola Holmes' 22 second-half points to knock-off the Colonials, 62-61, in the opening game of the Four Points by Sheraton Lady Privateer Invitational hosted by the University of New Orleans Friday.

Senior Sarah-Jo Lawrence scored 22 points and junior Jazmine Adair added a career-high 17 for the Colonials, who led 40-16 at halftime.

GW (5-3) had its halftime lead steadily whittled away by UNLV throughout the second half, and with 4:02 remaining found itself trailing for the first time at 59-58. Lawrence tied it with a free throw, but Holmes answered with a charity shot to put UNLV back on top, 60-59, with 2:07 left.

Lawrence's baseline 15-footer put GW ahead again, but Holmes responded with a foul-line jumper to go to 62-61 with 51 seconds to play. The Colonials called timeout on their next possession, then threw the ball away on the ensuing inbound play. GW got the ball back on a UNLV turnover and had three chances for the go-ahead score in the final nine seconds, but a trio of jump-shots didn't fall.

The back-to-back losses are GW's first since falling versus Oregon and at BYU on Dec. 4 and 6, 2004.

GW rolled off a 27-6 run over the final 12:33 of the first half to take a commanding 40-16 lead at the break, limiting the Lady Rebels to one field goal during that span. Juniors Jessica and Jazmine Adair combined for GW's first 17 points, with Jazmine matching her career-high 14 by the 6:02 mark of the first half.

No. 16/14 GW Holds Off Samford to Snap Skid, 64-57  
**Beck, Jessica Adair Combine for 40 Points**

NEW ORLEANS, LA (Dec. 1, 2007) – Senior Kimberly Beck led all scorers with 21 points and junior Jessica Adair added 19 to lead the No. 16/14 George Washington women's basketball team to a 64-57 victory at the Four Points by Sheraton Lady Privateer Invitational hosted by the University of New Orleans Saturday.

Beck hit all five of GW's three-pointers to lead four double-digit scorers for the Colonials. Junior Jazmine Adair reached double-figures for the second straight game with 12, and senior Sarah-Jo Lawrence chipped in 10 and seven assists.

GW jumped out to an 11-2 lead just over four minutes in and held an eight-point edge, 23-15, with 7:04 left in the first half. Samford put together a 12-0 run, fueled by five straight points from Alex Munday, to take its first lead of the game and led 27-23 with 3:22 to play in the period. Beck evened the score at 29-29 with a three-pointer at the halftime buzzer.

### GAME 10 - VILLANOVA

**No. 21 GW Overpowers Villanova, 67-52  
Colonials Post Top Defensive Effort of Season**

PHILADELPHIA, PA (Dec. 8, 2007) – The No. 21 George Washington women's basketball team played its best defensive game of the season, holding host Villanova to just 28.0 percent shooting in a 67-52 victory at the Pavilion on Saturday afternoon.

Junior center Jessica Adair led all players with 19 points, followed by senior Sarah-Jo Lawrence's 13. Junior Jazmine Adair reached double figures for the third straight game with 10 points.

Senior Kimberly Beck handed out a game-high nine assists, moving her to within six of Kathy Marshall's career program record of 580.

GW (7-3) played with starter Whitney Allen for the first time in five games. Allen had appeared in 100 consecutive games before being sidelined with a broken finger, which she injured before the season, on Nov. 23. She finished with five points, three steals and team-high nine rebounds. Junior starter Antelia Parrish missed her fifth straight game with a sprained ankle.

Offensively, Jessica Adair and Lawrence paved the way in the first half, scoring 19 of the Colonials' 34 points in the first 20 minutes. However, the tone was set on the defensive end, where the Colonials used heavy man-to-man pressure to limit the Wildcats to just four field goals in the opening period.

Villanova (7-2) unloaded a barrage of three-pointers to start the second half to close within three, 36-33, but GW settled back into its man-to-man defense and quickly boosted its lead back to double-digits. Jazmine Adair's lay-up ended VU's 14-2 run and jumpstarted 16 straight points for the Colonials to blow the game open.

Villanova finished just 14-of-50 from the floor (28.0 percent), marking the first time GW has held an opponent under 30.0 percent shooting since Feb. 11, 2007. The Wildcats' 52 points are the fewest allowed by the Colonials this season. Maria Getty led VU with 15 points.

### GAME 11 - LOYOLA MARYMOUNT

**Adair Scores 23 as No. 22 GW Tames Lions, 85-46  
Beck Closes to Within One Assist of Career Record**

WASHINGTON, DC (Dec. 18, 2007) – The No. 22 George Washington women's basketball team had its best offensive outing of the season and posted its largest margin of victory in nearly two years in an 85-46 victory over Loyola Marymount at Charles E. Smith Athletic Center on Tuesday afternoon.

Junior Jessica Adair (Washington, DC/Anacostia) led all scorers with 23 points to help the Colonials to the 39-point margin of victory, their best since an 88-37 drubbing of Yale on Dec. 20, 2005 – a span of 66 games. **No. 22 GW Wins Thriller Against No. 10 Texas A&M, 66-65, in OT  
Sarah-Jo Lawrence Rips Aggies for Career-High 29 Points**

WASHINGTON, DC (AP) (Dec. 20, 2007) - Sarah-Jo Lawrence scored a career-high 29 points, but she wasn't sure at first if her biggest shot of the night was enough to keep George Washington alive against No. 10 Texas A&M.

Lawrence hit a 3-pointer from the left corner to tie the game at 60 with 4.3 seconds left, but as time ran out the scoreboard had only credited the Colonials with two of the points. After a brief confusion, the final point was added. The game went to overtime, and George Washington came out with a 66-65 win.

In overtime, neither team seized control. Both shot 1-for-6 from the floor in the extra period, but George Washington held a 66-62 lead -- built mostly on free throws -- in the final seconds.

Until Lawrence's shot to end regulation, Texas A&M had seemed to take control of the game with a 12-3 run. George Washington went more than three minutes without a score before the game-tying 3.

It was the second-straight win for George Washington against the Aggies. The Colonials beat Texas A&M 59-47 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament this March, keeping the Aggies from a Sweet Sixteen berth.

Blair and McKeown are friends off the court, but Blair said the Colonials' return trip to College Station will be the end of the on-court meetings. "One more game at our place next year, and this is the last time we will face each other unless it's in the NCAA's or on the golf course," Blair said. "It's too hard."

**No. 20/19 George Washington Rout Brown, 98-22**

**Whitney Allen Ties Career-High as GW Wins By Largest Margin in School History**

WASHINGTON, DC (AP) (Jan. 6, 2008) - Whitney Allen tied a career high with 16 points and Antelia Parrish added 15 to help No. 20/19 George Washington rout Brown 98-22 on Sunday.

It was the largest margin of victory in school history for GW, and Brown set school marks for worst loss and fewest points in a game.

Jessica Adair and reserve Jazmine Adair had 13 points apiece and Sarah-Jo Lawrence scored 11 for George Washington (12-3), which tied a school record with 13 3-pointers in its seven straight win.

Parrish went 5-for-5 from 3-point range in the first half and George Washington led 51-11 at halftime.

The Colonials led 23-0 midway through the first half as Brown missed its first 10 shots from the field and had four turnovers. Ashley Alexander, in her first career start, scored Brown's first basket to make it 23-2 with 12:00 left in the first half.

Kimberly Beck's 3-pointer gave the hosts a 70-17 lead midway through the second half and Colonials coach Joe McKeown cleared the bench seconds later.

GW has won 10 straight games against Ivy League teams dating to 1980.

Brown had 30 turnovers and went 1-for-16 from 3-point range.

*Kimberly Beck Leads Colonials With Career-High 25 Points*

KINGSTON, RI (AP) (Jan. 16, 2008) -- Kimberly Beck scored 23 of her career-high 25 points in the second half to help No. 13 George Washington rally for a 48-45 victory over Rhode Island on Wednesday night.

Beck scored on a one-handed floater to give George Washington (14-3, 2-0 Atlantic-10) a 44-43 lead with 1:24 left.

After a turnover by Rhode Island (7-10, 0-2), Sarah-Jo Lawrence hit a jump shot but the Rams countered with a driving layup by Crystal Bellinger that pulled her team within 46-45 with 21.2 seconds left.

Beck clinched the victory hitting two free throws with 10.9 seconds left.

George Washington has won nine games in a row and 18 consecutive regular-season conference games dating back to the 2005-06 season.

Safi Mojidi scored 16 points to lead the Rams, who have lost four straight.

The Colonials bolted to an early 9-2 lead, forcing 10 turnovers and holding the Rams to only one basket in the first 10 1/2 minutes.

George Washington appeared to be on the verge of breaking the game open when Jazmine Adair scored on a fast-break layup for a 16-6 lead with 5:43 left in the half. But Rhode Island then went on a 16-0 run paced by Mojidi and Lindsay Harris.

Mojidi scored eight of Rhode Island's points, while Harris connected on a pair of baseline jumpers.

The Colonials pulled within 22-18 at intermission when Lawrence sank two free throws with just under a second left in the half.
