### BOZEMAN ERA BEGINS AT GW

Saturday's season opener marks a new era in George Washington women's basketball as for the first time in nearly two decades a new head coach will appear on the Colonials' bench. First-year head coach **Mike Bozeman** takes over the reins of the program after three seasons as an assistant under **Joe McKeown**, who assumed head coaching duties at Northwestern this offseason after 19 years in Foggy Bottom.

Bozeman, who is the eighth head coach in the 34-year history of the GW program, helped GW to a 78-20 overall record, three NCAA Tournament appearances and a pair of trips to the Sweet 16 in 2007 and 2008 during his three seasons as assistant coach.

Saturday marks Bozeman's first official game as head coach of the Colonials, but he is no stranger to handling the main duties for GW. Bozeman served as interim head coach three times during the 2006-07 season, including a 72-58 season-opening victory over UMBC at Smith Center on Nov. 10, 2006. He also led GW to an upset of #11/10 Georgia and a win over host San Diego State to claim the Surf 'N Slam Classic in Dec. 2006.

### OPENING TIP

George Washington tips off its 34th season of women's basketball Saturday against Maryland-Baltimore County (UMBC) at Charles E. Smith Center. It marks the third consecutive season the Colonials and Retrievers have opened their seasons against each other, with GW winning both previous games to improve to 7-0 all-time against UMBC.

GW is 18-15 all-time in season openers, including an 11-2 mark in openers at Smith Center. The Colonials last lost a season opener prior to the 2005-06 season in a 65-52 loss to Virginia at Smith Center. GW is 17-1 all-time against America East schools, with its lone loss coming to Boston University in Dec. 1982.

In last year's season tip-off at RAC Arena in Baltimore, UMBC jumped out to a quick 9-3 lead, but GW closed the half on a 31-16 run to lead by nine at the break and never allowed the Retrievers closer than seven in the second half in a 79-59 victory. **Antelia Parrish** had 17 points and eight boards in her D-I debut and GW scored 32 points off 24 UMBC turnovers to offset Carlee Cassidy's game-high 24 points.

## 2008-09 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

### A CLOSER LOOK AT...UMBC

UMBC finished 9-21 overall and sixth in the America East Conference in 2007-08, a year after capturing its first league tournament title and first NCAA Tournament appearance. The Retrievers, who were picked to finish a program-best fifth in the AEC this year, return seven players from last season's team, highlighted by preseason All-Conference selection **Carlee Cassidy**. Cassidy led UMBC and the league in scoring in 2007-08 at 17.0 ppg to become the first Retriever to earn first team All-Conference recognition. Lone senior **Chantay Frazier** and 2008 America East All-Rookie selection **Meghan Colabella** also return to the lineup. Head coach **Phil Stern** welcomes his largest incoming class with eight players - seven freshmen and JUCO transfer **Tonishea Mack** - to a roster with just three players of junior standing or better.

### NEW LOOK, SAME GW

GW lost three starters from last season - Kimberly Beck, Sarah-Jo Lawrence and Whitney Allen - to graduation, but return senior starters **Jessica Adair** and **Antelia Parrish** as well as six other letterwinners for the 2008-09 campaign. The Colonials also welcome seven newcomers - six freshmen and Wake Forest transfer **Yolanda Lavender** - to their lineup. Despite the roster and coaching staff makeovers, GW was still picked to finish second in the Atlantic 10 this season, behind two-time defending conference tournament champion Xavier. The Colonials also are receiving votes in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 25 polls.

### JESSICA ADAIR ON WOODEN WATCH

Senior center **Jessica Adair** was named one of 30 preseason candidates for the 2008-09 Women's Wooden Award All-American Team on Nov. 5. The two-time All-Conference First Team selection led GW in scoring (15.2 ppg), field-goal percentage (.520) and blocks (1.2 bpg) and was second on the team in rebounding (6.1 rpg). She enters the 2008-09 season with 1,049 career points -- 21st all-time at GW -- and is on pace to enter the program's career Top 10 in both scoring and rebounding.

### SMITH CENTER DOMINANCE

GW owns the nation's 13th longest home court winning streak with 13 consecutive victories on the Smith Center hardwood entering Saturday's season opener. The Colonials, who had a 15-game home streak snapped by nationally ranked Rutgers last season, have won 28 of their last 29 games in Foggy Bottom, nearly 90 percent (128-of-143) of their home games over the past decade and 77.5 percent (337-98) in the facility's 33 seasons. The University is currently in the process of a \$15 million fundraising initiative to add to the Smith and Kogod families' generous \$10 million gift for renovations to the Charles E. Smith Center. Part I of a three-step renovation plan is slated to begin at the completion of the 2008-09 basketball seasons.

### INSIDE SCOUT

With the hiring of a new head coach comes a new coaching staff, on which Bozeman has added former UMBC assistant **Katie Rokus**. Rokus, who serves as GW's recruiting coordinator, spent five seasons as an assistant under Phil Stern at UMBC, including the final three years as the Retrievers' top assistant and recruiting director. UMBC reached new heights on and off the court during Rokus' tenure, highlighted by the program's first America East tournament title and NCAA Tournament appearance in 2007. Rokus also helped the Retrievers claim the highest team grade-point average in the AE in 2006. Rokus teamed with head coach Stern as a player at USC Aiken from 1999-2002.

### EXHIBITING SOME YOUTH

GW fell to DT3 All-Stars, 71-66, in its lone exhibition tune-up on Nov. 5. The Colonials, who were led by **Jessica Adair's** 15 points and nine rebounds, led 61-58 with 2:39 left to play, but Jasmine Byrd hit consecutive three-pointers to put DT3 ahead for good. GW grabbed a whopping 47 rebounds and shot 46.9 percent, including 15-of-28 in the second half, but turned the ball over 28 times and sent DT3 to the foul line 26 times (compared to six for GW).

The Colonials last lost an exhibition prior to the 2002-03 season, 69-67 to Hungarian professional club ZTE-Zala Volan. That team went on to a 25-7 overall record, 15-1 A-10 mark, an Atlantic 10 Tournament championship and the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

### DC'S TEAM

Eight of 20 members of GW's coaching staff and roster have strong ties to the DC Metro area. Head coach **Mike Bozeman** played and coached at Bishop McNamara High School, the alma mater of GW senior **Antelia Parrish** and freshman **Tiana Myers**, prior to becoming an assistant coach for the Colonials in 2005. Seniors **Jessica and Jazmine Adair** (Anacostia) and **Yolanda Lavender** (Archbishop Carroll) each attended high school in their hometown of Washington, DC. Two-time *Washington Post* All-Met selection **Brooke Wilson** shined at Eleanor Roosevelt, just over Northeast DC's border. Assistant coach **Katie Rokus** was a two-sport star at Northwest's St. John's College High.

### A LOOK BACK AT 2007-08

The George Washington women's basketball team celebrated another highly successful season in 2007-08:

▶ The Colonials (27-7 overall) advanced to their second consecutive and fourth overall Sweet 16 appearance courtesy of Sarah-Jo Lawrence's game-winning, buzzer-beating putback in a 55-53 second-round victory over California.

▶ GW ranked No. 14 in final *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 poll and No. 20 in final AP Top 25 poll. The No. 14 final ranking is the third highest in program history.

▶ Ranked in *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 for all 21 weeks and in AP Top 25 for 17 weeks. GW ranked in *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 for school-record 40 consecutive weeks.

▶ Set Smith Center single-season program records for total attendance (27,723) and average attendance (1,848).

### 2008-09 SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

▶ GW is scheduled to appear on television three times during the regular season, highlighted by *CBS College Sports* broadcasts from Smith Center Jan. 21 against Villanova (NCAA Pack the House) and March 1 against Temple (Senior Day). The Colonials' Nov. 21 game at Western Kentucky will air on *Fox College Sports Atlantic*.

▶ GW will face 13 teams that qualified for either the 2008 NCAA Tournament or 2008 Postseason WNIT.

▶ GW hosts 17 home games -- the most for the program in 12 years -- including the second annual GW Thanksgiving Classic (w/ South Alabama, Hartford and Liberty) and two-time defending national champion Tennessee Dec. 2.

▶ The Colonials also will face a trio of non-conference powers its has seen multiple times in the past two seasons. GW battles Auburn for the fourth time in 24 months, Rutgers for the third time in 13 months and Texas A&M for the third time in 22 months.

### ABIONA RETURNS

Ivy Abiona returns to the Colonials' active lineup after redshirting in 2007-08 to rehab a knee injury. The red-shirt sophomore started and played 16 minutes in GW's exhibition loss to DT3, scoring five points (2-3 FGs), grabbing a team-high tying nine boards and adding a block and steal in her first game action in 20 months.

### CATCHING UP TO COACH

After connecting on 47 three-pointers in her debut season in 2007-08, senior sharp-shooter **Antelia Parrish** is already 15th on GW's career three-point field goals made list. Parrish enters Saturday's season opener just two triples shy of tying first-year assistant coach **Kristeena Alexander** for 14th on the list with 49 career three-pointers. Alexander, a point guard, starred for the Colonials from 1998-01, earning A-10 Sixth Player of the Year and All-Conference Third Team honors as a junior and All-Conference Second Team accolades as a senior in 2001.

### WAITING GAME

GW will benefit greatly from the addition of senior Wake Forest transfer **Yolanda Lavender**, but head coach **Mike Bozeman** and the rest of the Colonials will have to wait for her to make her impact on the court. The 2007 All-ACC honorable mention selection will sit out the fall semester due to NCAA transfer rules until she becomes eligible 10 games into the season for the Dec. 21 matchup against Princeton.
