



# 2006-07 GRAND VALLEY STATE LAKER BASKETBALL

**#6 Grand Valley State (25-3) vs Northern Michigan (18-10) • March 2, 8 pm • Croy Gymnasium (Findlay, Ohio)**

• **Tonight's Contest:** #6 Grand Valley State will look to sweep the season series with Northern Michigan for the second consecutive season. The Lakers have a chance to win three games against the Wildcats for the first time since 2000-01. NMU has won three straight games and have won 10 of their last 11 games since dropping a 63-52 decision to Grand Valley. The Lakers won the first contest by a season-high 38 points at home (87-49). GVSU enters riding a five game winning streak and have won 19 of its last 20 games. GVSU is 10-4 all-time in the GLIAC Tournament. Callistus Eziukwu needs just 12 points to become the 29th player in school history to score 1,000 points. Eziukwu also needs two blocks to pass Ben Wallace for 21st on the NCAA Division II all-time blocked shots list.

• **The Series:** GVSU is 33-27 all-time against Northern Michigan having won the last four meetings. The Lakers are 1-1 against the Wildcats in the GLIAC Tournament claiming a 91-70 win in 2000-01 and dropping a 69-56 decision in 2002-03.

• **Last Time On The Floor:** Senior Mike Hall recorded his second 20 point game against Ferris State in as many games as he led the Lakers past the Bulldogs Tuesday night in the opening round of the GLIAC Tournament in the GVSU Fieldhouse Arena. Hall's 20 points led all scorers as GVSU improved to 25-3 on the year and FSU fell to 10-18. GVSU started the game with an 8-2 run that saw Hall and sophomore Pete Trammell each knock down a three as the Lakers came out firing. Ferris State would score the next six points to tie the contest at eight with 15:23 to play in the half. The Lakers would answer with a run of their own, this time of the 10-0 variety, to claim an 18-8 lead with 11:51 to go that was capped off by a three-pointer from reserve guard Brian Arnold. Grand Valley would stretch its lead to as many as 14 in the opening half before Ferris State's Michael Daniels hit a jumper with six seconds remaining in the half to cut the halftime deficit to 12 (35-23).

The bench fueled the Lakers in the first half as they tallied 18 points with Arnold pouring in eight and senior Dan Redder adding seven points of his own. The Bulldogs shot 23.7 percent in the opening half, missing 31 of their 39 shots. The Lakers upped their lead to a game-high 20 less than four minutes into the second session as Hall knocked down his career-high third and fourth three-pointers of the night. Grand Valley outscored the Bulldogs 11-3 in the opening minutes of the half to take the 46-26 lead. Ferris attempted to battle back later in the half but were unable to get the margin within single digits cutting the lead to 10 at the 12:56 mark. The Laker lead remained in the 12-15 range for the majority of the half, before extending the lead back to 20 with 2:27 to play. Ferris State would cut the final margin to 13 (72-59) over the final minutes.

Hall led all scorers with 20 points after dropping a career-high 26 on the Bulldogs in their last meeting this past Saturday (Feb. 24). Redder ended the night with 11 points off the bench, seven rebounds, and a team-high two blocked shots. Junior Jason

• **Head Coach Ric Wesley:** Ric Wesley (Central Michigan, 1980) is 70-17 in his third year at the helm of the Laker basketball program. Wesley led GVSU to a 27-4 mark a year ago. GVSU claimed the GLIAC regular season and tournament titles en route to making its first NCAA tournament appearance since 2001. In addition, GVSU has held 66-of-87 opponents under 67 points during the Ric Wesley era.



• Grand Valley State entered the season ranked fifth in the Street & Smith College Basketball Yearbook. Callistus Eziukwu was named a preseason All-American.

• **In the Rankings:** Grand Valley State is ranked sixth in the latest NABC/DII Coaches poll...The Lakers were ranked number four earlier in the year...The number four national ranking was the highest-ever ranking for the Lakers...GVSU finished fourth in the final poll in 2005-06.

• GVSU has been in the NABC Division II Poll 37 times in the school's history, including the last 23 consecutive polls...The Lakers have been ranked in the top 10 for the past nine weeks (10, 9, 8, 8, 7, 7, 10, 10, 6).

• **Defensive Prowess**

GVSU has held 22-of-28 opponents under 65 points and 17-of-28 under 55 points this season. The Lakers have yielded just 54.1 points overall on the year and rank first in Division II in points allowed per game.

• **Streaking**

GVSU had won 14 straight games overall and nine straight GLIAC contests before dropping a 76-62 decision to #3 Findlay. Grand Valley has won four straight games since its loss to Findlay. The Lakers have won 12 consecutive games on their home floor in the GVSU Fieldhouse Arena. The Laker defense had held 12 consecutive opponents under 60 points before Findlay put 72 points on the board. Grand Valley completed the first undefeated month of January since the 1976-77 squad went 9-0 in the opening month of the new year. GVSU was a perfect 8-0 in the first month of 2007.

• **Non-Conference Perfection**

The Lakers have closed their non-conference schedule with a perfect 9-0 record, including wins against at the time #10 Montevallo (12/29) and former top 15 member Christian Brothers (11/24).

**2006-07 Information**

• A balanced attack has fueled the Lakers to a 25-3 record...The 20-win season is the second in as many years for Ric Wesley...The back-to-back 20-win seasons is the first time a Laker squad has pulled off the feat since the 1990-91 and 1991-92 squads posted 26 and 20 wins respectively...Six different players have led GVSU in scoring this season led by leading scorer Jason Jamerson's (Muncie, Ind./Burris) 13.9 ppg...Jamerson opened up the season with back-to-back double-digit scoring games against Davenport (20) and Upper Iowa (16)...Jamerson also led the Lakers in scoring against Northwood (23), Mercyhurst (20), Rochester (23), #10 Montevallo (15), Michigan Tech (14), Lake Superior State (11), 25 against Northern Michigan, on the road against Gannon (12), at home Jamerson tallied 14 against Wayne State, set a new career-high with 28 points against Ashland, and had his seventh game with at least 20 points when they took on Hillsdale (2/17).

• Fellow starter Mike Hall is averaging 11.0 ppg and recorded a career-high 26 points against Ferris State (2/24)...Posted back-to-back 20 point games against the Bulldogs with a game-high 20 in the GLIAC Quarterfinals...Set a previous career-high against Lake Superior State (2/1) with 25 points against the Lakers...Tallied 18 points in GVSU's 72-71 buzzerbeating loss to Saginaw Valley (11/30) and 18 more in its 63-52 come from behind win over Northern Michigan (1/13). Scored a team-high 14 points against Wayne State (1/25).

• Senior Dan Redder (Zeeland, Mich.) ranks fourth on the squad with 9.8 ppg...Redder led GVSU with 22 points against Ferris State (12/7), tallied 16 points against Christian Brothers (11/24), 13 against Northwood (2/7) and a game-high 21 against Findlay (2/10).

• Junior shooting guard Joel Whymer poured in 17 points on five three-pointers against Missouri-St. Louis (11/25).

• Senior Kyle Carhart led the Lakers with 14 points against Lewis (12/16) and poured in a career-high 23 points on 7-of-9 shooting against Saginaw Valley (2/21).

• Callistus Eziukwu's second game back from injury was the junior's first as the Lakers leading scorer with 14 points and 10 rebounds against Florida Southern (12/30)...Eziukwu poured in 11 to lead the Lakers against Lake Superior State (1/11). Eziukwu tallied 15 points in the Lakers' non-conference win over Marygrove College. The junior center fueled the Lakers to a 69-64 overtime win over Michigan Tech with a season-high 25 points.

• Nine different players are averaging at least 10 minutes per game for the Lakers this season, with six Lakers seeing 20 or more minutes per game....Jamerson is averaging a team-high 30.2 minutes.

• Senior forward **Mike Hall** is averaging 11.0 points and 5.3 rebounds per game this season...Tallied his 51st game in double figures as he posted his second consecutive 20 point game against Ferris State as he posted a game-high 20...He fell just one rebound shy of a double-double for the second consecutive game against Ferris State (2/24) as he poured in a career-high 26 points...Passed the 1,000 point mark in his career at home against Hillsdale (2/17)...Set a previous career-high against Lake Superior State (2/1) as he recorded 25 points...Tallied 17 points against Mercyhurst (12/9), all in the second half...Scored in double figures 13 times this season, including eight straight...Came into the 2006-07 season averaging 9.0 points and 4.2 rebounds during his career...Missed the opening game of the season with a hand injury...Sunk a free throw with 0.7 seconds left to give GVSU a 59-58 win over #10 Montevallo (12/29)...The very next night poured in 13 points and pulled down five rebounds against Florida Southern (12/30)...Scored 18 points in GVSU's come from behind win over Northern Michigan (1/13)...Poured in a team-high 14 points and pulled down nine rebounds against Wayne State (1/25).

• Senior center **Dan Redder** is averaging 9.8 points and 3.9 rebounds per game...51 of Redder's 110 rebounds have come on the offensive end...Redder has scored in double-figures 26 times in two seasons as a Laker...Shooting 59.2 percent from the floor which ranks second on the squad...Connecting on 76.3 percent of his shots from the charity stripe...Scored a career-high 22 points against Ferris State (12/7)...Led all scorers with 21 points against #3 Findlay (2/10) and followed that performance with 18 points on the road against Michigan Tech (2/14)...Scored in double-digits in four of the last six games.

• Junior center **Callistus Eziukwu** (E-zoo-koo) was the 2006 GLIAC Tournament Most Outstanding Player, a First-Team All-GLIAC North Division and a North Division All-Defensive Team honoree...Eziukwu set the all-time blocked shots record against Lake Superior State and now has 224...Eziukwu moved past Ron Polus (197; 1981-85) on the list...Eziukwu saw his first action of the 2006-07 regular season in the Florida Southern Holiday Classic (12/29-30) after missing the first 10 games of the regular season...Eziukwu is averaging 11.1 points, 7.1 rebounds and 2.0 blocks in 23.8 minutes of action in his 18 games back...Eziukwu is shooting 59.9 percent from the field on the year...Needs just 12 points to become the 29th member of the 1,000-point club at Grand Valley...With two more blocked shots Eziukwu will move past Ben Wallace (Virginia Union, 1995-96) on the all-time blocked shots list with 226.

- Senior guard/forward **Kyle Carhart** is averaging 7.5 points and is first on the squad with 83 assists (3.0 per game)...Ranks second on the squad with 46 steals on the year...Sixth on the team with 22.8 minutes per game yet has started just one game, playing primarily as the sixth man for the Lakers...Tallied 15 points against SVSU (11/30) and then dropped a career-best 23 against the Cardinals on Feb. 21.

- Sophomore forward **Pete Trammell** has started 55 of 56 career games played...Averaging 5.9 points and 3.3 rebounds per game this season...Scored in double digits 15 times...
