Grand Valley State • Chuck Martin (Millikin, 1990) • 70-6 (6th year) • Martin has guided Grand Valley State to two NCAA D-II titles and four GLIAC crowns in five years. His .921 winning percentage is tops among active coaches in all of college football, regardless of division.

Wayne State • Paul Winters (Akron, 1980) • 27-36 (6th year)

The Series

Grand Valley State leads the all-time series by a 27-5 margin, including 22 straight wins. The Lakers 14-2 at Lubbers Stadium and 13-3 at Wayne State. The average margin of victory in the 22-game Laker winning streak is 36.0-12.3. GVSU has scored 40 or more points eight times and held WSU to 10 points or less 10 times in the last 22 games. GVSU claimed a 24-10 win last season in Detroit,

- GVSU is 93-7 in its last 100 games with four National Championships (2002, 2003, 2005, 2006). The Lakers are 117-8 in their last 125 games and 93-4 in its last 97 regular season games...Including the last six games of the 2000 season, the Lakers are 62-3 at home, 49-4 in their last 53 road games and 51-5 in all games away from Lubbers Stadium in their last 56.

- The 2009 GVSU senior class is 47-3 with one National Championship and three GLIAC titles. In addition, the 2009 senior class is 40-1 in regular season games.

- The American Football Coaches Association has released 118 polls since the 2001 season and GVSU has been ranked No. 1 79 times, including an AFCA record 36 straight weeks at No. 1. The AFCA started its coaches' poll in 2000 and the Lakers have opened the season as the No. 1 ranked team six times.

LAKER FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

- Grand Valley State has been ranked number one in the country in 79 of the last 106 polls since the opening game of the 2002 season. GVSU has finished the year ranked in the top 10 (2001-2, 2002-1, 2003-1, 2004-9, 2005 -1, 2006-1, 2007-4, 2008-4) in eight straight postseason polls. GVSU has been in the top five 102 times and top 10 108 times.

- Grand Valley State has the second longest streak for consecutive games without being shutout at 212 games. The Lakers were last shutout by Ferris State (23-0) in 1992. Valdosta State's 223 games without being shutout is the longest streak.

- Grand Valley State is 81-4 in its last 84 GLIAC games.

- Senior QB Brad Iciekhas completed 145-of-228 passes for 2,088 yards and 24 TDs...Ranks second in the nation in pass efficiency rating (173.5)...Iciek moved into fifth in all-time passing yards (7,365) yards and total offense (7,538)...Brad is third in all-time passing TDs with 87...Iciek has thrown at least one TD pass in 35 straight games and has 15 games with three TD passes or more...Iciek is 32-3 as a starting QB.

- Junior RB James Berezik leads GVSU in rushing yards with 1,036 yards on 170 carries and is third in all-purpose yards (1,236)...Ranks second on the team in receptions with 20 for 188 yards...Berezik is third in all-time rushing yards at GVSU with 3,450 yards on 476 carries (7.2 ypc)...Berezik is also fifth in all-time all-purpose yards with 4,578...Fourth player in Laker annals to surpass 3,000 rushing yards and sixth player to go over 4,000 all-purpose yards...Became GVSU's all-time leader in career 100-yard rushing games with 16.

- Rushed for 95 yards on 19 carries and caught one pass for nine yards at WTAMU.
 - Rushed for 101 yards on 20 carries and caught one pass for 14 yards at Indy.
 - Rushed for 74 yards on 12 carries and caught two passes for 19 yards vs. SVSU.
 - Rushed for 178 yards on 29 carries and caught four passes for 22 yards at FSU.
 - Rushed for 80 yards and one TD on 11 carries in just over a quarter at MTU.
 - Rushed for 31 yards on five carries in one quarter of action vs. Tiffin.

- Senior WR Blake Smolen leads the squad in receptions (38), receiving yards (673), TDs catches (8) and is third in all-purpose yards (1,196)...GVSU's all-time leader in all-purpose yards with 5,133...Smolen became the first player in GVSU history and the fourth in DII history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark in rushing (1,964), receiving (1,976) and kickoff return yards (1,193)...Needs 36 rushing yards and 24 yards receiving to become the first DII player to reach the 2,000 yard mark for both rushing and receiving in a career. Only four other players have done it in the history of college football:

Darrin Nelson (DI) - Stanford (4,033 rushing/2,368 receiving)

Mewelde Moore (DI) - Tulane (4364 rushing/2059 receiving)

Brian Westbrook (1AA) - Villanova (4,298 rushing/2,582 receiving)

Lindy Crea (DIII) - Hartwick (3,409 rushing/2,214 receiving)

Blake Smolen (DII) - Grand Valley State (1,964 rushing/1,976 receiving)

- Caught two passes for 64 yards, including a 46-yard TD reception at WTAMU.
- Caught five passes for 53 yards at Indianapolis
- Caught six passes for 112 yards and two TDs vs. SVSU.
- Returned two kickoffs 97 yards at MTU.
- Rushed six times for 67 yards and three TDs, caught two passes for 90 yards and one TD, all in first quarter...Set a GVSU first quarter record with four TDs vs. Tiffin...182 all-purpose yards.
- Notched a career-high 264 all-purpose yards (125 rec./76 KO/63 rush) and one TD at Hillsdale.
- Tallied 155 all-purpose yards vs. Findlay...Caught a career-high eight passes for 98 yards and a TD....Rushed for 33 yards and a TD.
- Caught two passes for 62 yards and a TD, while rushing four times for 24 yards at Ashland.
- Caught three passes for 53 yards and rushed twice for 18 yards in less than one Qrt. vs. NMU.

Totals -- 38 receptions for 673 yards and eight TDs...1,196 all-purpose yards.

- RB/Ret. P.T. Gates ranks second the team in all-purpose yards with 1,207 yards (639 rushing/265 KO returns/175 receiving/128 punt returns)...Ranks second on the team in rushing yards with 639 and is averaging 7.1 yards per carry.
 - Rushed for 62 yards on eight carries and returned two punts for 16 yards at WT.
 - Rushed for 83 yards on 12 carries, caught two passes for 36 yards and returned three kickoffs for 79 yards...Team high 213 all-purpose yards at Indy.
 - Recorded 100 all-purpose yards...53 KO ret., 32 receiving with TD vs. SVSU
 - Tallied 93 all-purpose yards (50 rush, 18 receiving, 25 PR) at FSU.
 - Rushed for 108 yards and a TD on 10 carries...Caught one pass for 15 yards at MT.
 - Tallied 54 all-purpose yards in five touches vs. Tiffin.
 - Notched 99 all-purpose yards at Hillsdale.
 - Rushed for 64 yards and a TD on 10 carries...Caught three passes for 28 yards vs. UF.
 - Rushed for 95 yards on 10 carries and tallied 126 all-purpose yards at Ashland.

- Trailing 9-7 with :14 seconds left in the first half, GVSU outscored WTAMU 27-0 to build a 34-9 lead with 3:11 left in the third quarter. GVSU scored points on four straight possessions.

- Grand Valley State scores two TDs in final 2:31 of second quarter to give the Lakers a 23-7 halftime lead and Indianapolis.

- GVSU scored on 5-of-6 drives to open the game, including four TDs...Led 24-0 and 31-7 at half vs. Saginaw Valley.

• **Stuffing The Run** - The Laker rushing defense is allowing 75.1 rushing yards per game this season. Dating back to last season, the Lakers have held nine opponents under 100 yards rushing, including seven this season.

- 18 rushes for 44 yards at West Texas A&M
- 14 rushes for 11 yards at Indianapolis
- 35 rushes for 170 yards vs. SVSU; **72 yards vs. first Def. in three Qrts.**
- 36 rushes for 108 yards at FSU; 35 yards on one play in 2nd Q
- 36 rushes for 91 yards at MTU
- 24 rushes for 44 yards vs. Tiffin
- 25 rushes for 58 yards at Hillsdale
- 21 rushes for 63 yards vs. Findlay
- 34 rushes for 177 yards vs. Ashland; 26 rushes for 106 yards vs. starting defense
- 20 rushes for 41 yards vs. Northern Michigan

• **GVSU Starting Defense**

- The Laker starting defense allowed just 347 yards of total offense at WTAM...Allowed 106 yards in five drives prior to the second unit yielding 79 yards in 10 plays over the final 1:42.

- Indianapolis managed 273 yards of total offense (11 rushing/262 passing), 74 of which came on one pass play.
- SVSU recorded 226 yards of total offense vs. the Lakers' 1st D in three quarters.
- FSU tallied 210 yards of total offense; 109 of which came on two plays (74 yard pass/35 yard rush).
- MTU recorded 163 yards of total offense vs. the GVSU starting defense.
- Tiffin managed 20 yards on 17 plays versus the Laker starting defense.
- Findlay tallied 150 yards on 27 plays versus the GVSU starting D.
- Ashland recorded 155 yards on 39 plays vs. starting D...AU passed for 49 yards and rushed for 106 yards.
- Northern Michigan tallied 197 yards of total offense vs. GVSU...NMU rushed for just 41 yards.

The Laker starting defense has yielded 100 points (10.0 ppg) this season in 10 games.

• The GVSU defense has forced 17 turnovers (11 INT and 7 FR), recorded 33 QB sacks (-211) and 75 TFL (-319) this season. 17 different Lakers have a tackle for loss...GVSU leads the GLIAC in tackles for loss (75) and QB sacks (33).

• The GVSU front four (Danny Richard, Nick Lawrence, Andre Thomas and Alex Gilde) have been impressive this season, combining for 111 tackles, 29 TFL and all 19.0 QB sacks.

• All-America candidate Danny Richard has 34 tackles, 13.0 TFL (-68), 8.0 QB sacks (-46) and two QB hurries, 2 pass breakups and a blocked kick.

- Tallied eight tackles (5 solo/3 assisted) and 2.0 TFL vs. SVSU.
- Two tackles, 1.0 TFL (-8), 1.0 QB sacks (-8) and forced a fumble at FSU.
- Three total tackles, 1.5 TFL (-3) and .5 QB sacks at Hillsdale.
- Three total tackles, 1.0 TFL (-7) and 1.0 QB sacks vs. Findlay.
- Five total tackles, 3.5 TFL (-13) and 2.0 QB sacks at Ashland.
- Four total tackles, 2.0 TFL (-15) and 2.0 QB sacks vs. Northern Michigan.

• Junior LB Justin Victor leads the Lakers in tackles with 64 (23 solo/41 assists), ranks second in QB sacks with 4.5 (-30) and TFL with 8.5 (-39)...Recorded the third-best single-game QB sack total at Ferris State with 3.0 (-19).
