Saturday, Oct. 15, 7:00 p.m. • Lubbers Stadium (8,550)

THE GAME:

#1-ranked Grand Valley State will host #4 Saginaw Valley State in a battle of unbeaten Saturday in Lubbers Stadium. Also at stake is first place in the GLIAC standings as GVSU and SVSU are the only two teams with unblemished records in league play.

THE SERIES: Grand Valley State leads the all-time with Saginaw Valley State series by a 22-10 margin. Saginaw Valley State claimed a 31-20 victory over the Lakers a year ago in University Center. GVSU is 13-2 in Lubbers Stadium versus the Cardinals. This will be the fifth straight meeting between GVSU and SVSU when one team has been ranked #1 in the country. In addition, this will be the seventh consecutive meeting when both teams have been ranked in the top 25.

GRAND VALLEY STATE

Grand Valley State has an all-time overall mark of 256-114-3 (.686) in 35 years of playing football. GVSU has the second best winning percentage of football playing schools in the State of Michigan, behind Michigan's 846-278-36 (.746) mark...GVSU is 64-9 since the 2000 season and 57-5 since 2001 with back-to-back National Championships (2003-2004). The Lakers are 40-3 in GLIAC action since 2001 and its senior class enters the Saginaw Valley State contest with a 44-4 overall mark.

RADIO: You can listen to every Laker football game live on the GVSU Radio Network. WBBL AM 1340 (Grand Rapids) is the flagship station, while WMFN AM 640 (Grand Rapids/Zeeland), WVFN AM.730 (Lansing) and WEFC FM 97.5 (Muskegon) are affiliates.

• Chuck Martin is just the sixth head coach in GVSU Laker football history. Most recently, GVSU was led by Tom Beck (1985-1990), a 2004 National Football Foundation Hall of Fame inductee and Brian Kelly (1991-2003), who led GVSU to the 2002 & 2003 NCAA DII Football National Championships.

• Grand Valley State has been ranked #1 in the AFCA coaches poll for four straight weeks. GVSU has been ranked in the top 10 55 times since the 2001 season. In addition, the Lakers have been ranked in the top five 52 weeks and number one 34 weeks...Grand Valley State opened the 2005 season ranked third in the AFCA Division II Coaches Poll...The Lakers opened the three previous years as the number one ranked team in the AFCA preseason poll. GVSU was ranked number one in the country by Sports Illustrated, marking the fourth straight year the Lakers have opened the year ranked number one in a preseason poll.

• Grand Valley State concluded the 2004 season ranked 9th in the final AFCA coaches poll in 2004, marking the fourth straight year GVSU has finished the year ranked in the top 10 (2001-2, 2002-1, 2003-1, 2004-9). The Lakers are 28-2 when being ranked number one since 8/30/02, GVSU is 57-5 when ranked in the AFCA top 25 since 2001. GVSU has been ranked in the AFCA top 25 in 69 straight polls.

• **1,000 Yard Rushers** -- Grand Valley State has three 1,000-yard career rushers in its backfield. Cullen Finnerty became the top rushing QB in Laker annals with his 71 yards versus Ferris State and enters the Saginaw Valley State game with 1,558.. Finnerty is 17th on the all-time list. Senior Ryan Hukill is 24th in the Laker record books with 1,263 career rushing yards. First-year Laker Astin Martin has rushed for 724 yards and two TDs in six games and rushed for 1,221 yards at Toledo in his two years as a Rocket.

LAKER BYTES

• **Getting Defensive** -- The Grand Valley State defense has yielded five TDs in six games this season, with two of those five TDs coming in the final five minutes of two games (Indianapolis/Hillsdale). The Lakers held three opponents out of the endzone for over 11 quarters to start the season.

• **Third Down "INEFFICIENCY"** --

The Grand Valley State defense is holding opponents to just 28.1 percent on third down conversions this season (27-for-96). In addition, GVSU's opponents are converting just 52.3 percent of its passes for a pass efficiency rating of 81.41 and just one passing TD.

• **Rushing Defense** - GVSU is yielding 102.2 rushing yards per game this season. GVSU's opponents have rushed for 613 yards and four TDs in six games. Grand Valley State has held 21-of-its-last-34 opponents under 100 yards rushing. Laker opponents are averaging 85.5 yards rushing per game during that stretch and have rushed for just 23 TDs.

• **Passing Defense** - The Grand Valley State pass defense has yielded just 938 yards (156.3 ypg) and one passing TD this season. Laker opponents are completing just 52.3 percent of their passes for a pass efficiency rating of 81.41.

• **Balanced Attack** -- Grand Valley State has rushed the ball 254 times for 1,375 (229.2 ypg) yards and completed 92 passes for 1,416 yards (236.0 ypg)...GVSU is averaging 6.7 yards per play and 465.2 yards per game (229.2 rushing/236.0 passing).

• **Cullen Finnerty** -- Finnerty has completed 76-of-135 passes for 1,071 yards and 10 TDs, while rushing for 277 yards and four TDs on 52 carries...Completed 11-of-18 passes for 98 yards and one TD, while rushing for 52 yards and a TD at Hillsdale (10/8). Notched a 30 yard TD run on a fourth and one play...Completed 14-of-22 passes for 175 yards and rushed 10 times for 95 yards vs. Wayne State (10/1). Tallied 270 yards of total offense vs. the Warriors...Completed 14-of-28 passes for 208 yards and two TDs, while rushing for 52 yards on 14 carries...Completed 9-of-18 passes for 140 yards at Indianapolis (9/10)...Completed 15-of-26 passes for 247 yards and two TDs vs. Gannon (9/3)...Rushed for 71 yards and a TD on 12 carries and completed 13-of-23 passes

for 203 yards and two TDs vs. Ferris State (8/27).

• Senior all-purpose performer Brandon Langston (Northville, Mich.) has 13 plays that have gone for 15 yards or more this season...Tallied 151 all purpose yards vs. Ferris State (8/27), including two plays of 38 yards or longer...Notched 156 all-purpose yards and two TDs vs. Wayne State (10/1). Caught a 47 yard TD pass and returned a kickoff 91 yards for a TD...Langston is third on the Lakers' all-time receptions list (133), fifth in all-purpose yards (3,774), fourth in kickoff return yards (1,126), and eighth in all-time receiving yards (1,783)...Langston is averaging 106 all-purpose yards per game this season.

• Astin Martin is GVSU's leading rusher with 109 carries for 724 yards and three TDs, while catching 10 passes for 93 yards. Martin is averaging 120.7 yards rushing and 136.8 yards of total offense per game...Martin has broke the 100-yard rushing mark in five of six games played this season, including a career-high 169 yards and one TD at Hillsdale (10/8)...Rushed for 116 yards on 19 carries and caught two passes for 19 yards vs. Ferris State (8/27)...Toted the ball 14 times for 129 yards and one TD, while catching one pass for 12 yards vs. Gannon (9/3)...Toted the ball 22 times for 136 yards and one TD and caught two passes for 18 yards at Indianapolis (9/10)...Rushed for 104 yards on 21 carries and caught two passes for 16 yards vs. Wayne State (10/1).

• Junior receiver Eric Fowler entered the 2005 season with eight catches, but in six games this season he has a team-high 30 catches for 472 yards and four TDs. Eric has broke the 100-yard receiving mark twice this season...Hauled in six passes for 87 yards vs. Wayne State (10/1)...Caught a career-high nine passes for 104 yards and one TD at Ashland (9/17)...Caught seven passes for a career-high 152 yards vs. Gannon (9/3).

• Grand Valley State junior WR Terry Mitchell is averaging 27.7 yards per reception (12-332) and a TD every 4.0 catches. Mitchell caught six passes for 122 yards and three TDs vs. Gannon...• Terry Mitchell -- Averaged 42.3 yards on three catches (127) at Hillsdale (10/8)...Recorded second 100-yard receiving game of the year. Hauled in a 57 yard TD pass...Caught six passes for

122 yards and three TDs vs. Gannon (9/3)...Hauled in one pass for 56 yards at Indianapolis (9/10).

• Junior DL Mike McFadden ranks second on the squad in total tackles (46). McFadden has a team-high eight QB sacks (-44) and 7.5 tackles for loss (-46)has recorded a QB sack and a tackle for loss in each of first six games...Notched five tackles, a QB sack (-7) and a tackle for loss at Hillsdale (10/8)...Tallied six total tackles, three QB sacks (-18) and two tackles for loss (-18) vs. Ferris State (8/27)...Notched a career-high 12 total tackles and a QB sack vs. Gannon (9/3)...Made nine stops, including two tackles for loss (-5) and a QB sack at Indianapolis (9/10)...Recorded eight total tackles, two tackles for loss (-9) and one QB sack (-8) vs. Wayne State (10/1).

• The Laker defense has picked off nine passes and notched 23 pass deflections this season. Sophomore CB Brandon Carr leads the way with three picks, while senior Joe Ballard and sophomore Bill Brechin each have two interceptions. Freshman LB Dan Skuta and junior LB Matt Beaty each have one interception.

• **Offensive Safety** -- Senior safety Joe Ballard scored the third defensive touchdown of his career at Indianapolis. Joe picked off a pass and returned it 50 yards for a TD with 43 seconds left in the first half vs. the Greyhounds. Ballard had previously returned a fumble (vs. UC Davis) and an interception (vs. Michigan Tech) for TDs...Ballard tallied eight solo tackles at Hillsdale (10/8)...Notched five tackles, picked off a pass and recorded a pass deflection vs. Wayne State (10/1)...Recorded seven tackles, including six solo at Ashland (9/17)...Tallied a season-high nine tackles and returned an interception 50 yards for a TD at Indianapolis (9/10).

• GVSU punter Matt Regnery is averaging 38.8 yards per punt and has dropped 14 inside the opponent 20 yard line...Punted seven times for an average of 43.4 vs. Wayne State (10/2).. Regnery's first four punt went for 54, 54 and 57 yards.

• Redshirt freshman Todd Carter set a GVSU record when he kicked off seven times to Indianapolis and all seven resulted in touchbacks.

• PK Scott Greene, a 2004 All-American pick, is 9-for-12 this season and 28-for-35 in his career.

• Justin Ulberg -- Notched four tackles, one tackle for loss and forced a fumble at Hillsdale (10/8)...Tallied five tackles and a QB sack vs. Ferris State (8/27)...Recorded five tackles and one tackle for loss (1-7) at Indianapolis (9/10).

• Antione Trent -- Hauled in two passes for 35 yards vs. Ferris State (8/27), including a career-long 26 yarder...Caught two passes for 31 yards vs. Gannon (9/3)...Caught a six yard TD pass vs. Wayne State (10/1).

• Dan Skuta -- Tallied four tackles, including a QB sack (-6) and a tackle for loss (-6) at Hillsdale (10/8)...Recorded five tackles and picked off a pass and returned it 24 yards in first collegiate game vs. Ferris State (8/27)...Recorded 10 tackles, three tackles for loss (-10) and a QB sack vs. Gannon (9/3)...Notched a season-high 11 total tackles vs. Wayne State (10/1).

• Tamayrr Salahudin -- Notched two tackles, including a QB sack (-4) and a tackle for loss (-4) at Hillsdale (10/8)...Recorded three total tackles, including two tackles for loss (-4) vs. Gannon (9/1)...Recorded six tackles and a QB sack (-3) at Ashland (9/17).

• Zach Jones -- Recorded eight total tackles vs. Gannon (9/30), including seven solo...Tallied five tackles at Indianapolis (9/10).

• Derrick Jones -- Tallied three tackles and a QB sack vs. Gannon (9/3)...Notched three tackles at Indianapolis (9/10).

• Ryan Hukill -- Rushed for a season-high 81 yards and one TD on 12 carries...Toted the ball 10 times for 55 yards and caught two passes for 14 yards vs. Gannon (9/3).

• Quartez Vickerson - Recorded a career-high seven tackles, a QB sack (-7) and a

tackle for loss at Hillsdale (10/8)...Notched five tackles, two tackles for loss (-6) and a QB sack vs. Wayne State (10/1). Blocked a PAT vs. the Warriors...Tallied six tackles, a QB sack (-4) and a fumble recovery at Indianapolis (9/10).

• Anthony Adams -- Named GLIAC Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts at Hillsdale (10/8). Recorded nine total tackles, including two tackles for loss (-13) and a QB sack (-9) versus the Chargers...Tallied a career-high 13 tackles vs. Wayne State (10/1)...Picked up eight tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass breakup at Ashland (9/17)...Recorded six total tackles, a forced fumble, a QB hurry and a pass breakup at Indianapolis (9/10)...Notched nine total tackles and two tackles for loss vs. Gannon (9/3)...Recorded seven tackles, a QB sack and a tackle for loss versus Ferris State (8/27).

• **Preseason Honors:** GVSU senior place kicker Scott Greene is a consensus preseason first-team all-american. GVSU senior offensive tackle Josh Bourke is a preseason All-American by D2Football.com.

• **Injury Report:** GVSU will be without three players for the 2005 season that would have played if not for season-ending injuries. Freshman linebacker Jacob McGuckin had season-ending knee surgery following the spring game, while fellow freshman, Jordan Munson, injured his knee in the Lakers' preseason drills and will be lost for the season. Sophomore guard Brian Lydigsen is lost for the second straight season after injuring his knee in preseason practice
