Coach – **John Thompson III** is in his 13th season at the helm of the Hoyas ... In 12 years at Georgetown, Thompson has led the Hoyas to the 2007 NCAA Final Four, the 2007 BIG EAST Tournament Championship and to three BIG EAST Regular Season crowns (2006-07, 2007-08 and 2012-13) ... Georgetown has been to the postseason in 11 of his 12 seasons, including eight NCAA Tournament appearances ... The Hoyas have won at least 20 games eight times in the last 11 seasons ... He has a record of 278-150 (.650) at Georgetown and a 16-year record of 346-192 (.643), including a 68-42 record at Princeton.

FOR STARTERS

- The Georgetown University men's basketball team opens BIG EAST Tournament play on Wednesday, March 8, playing long-time conference rival St. John's ... This will be the third meeting of the season between the teams, with the Hoyas winning the first game, 83-55, in January, and SJU posting an 86-80 win on Feb. 25 at Madison Square Garden.
- The Hoyas closed out the regular season a loss to Villanova, the fifth-straight loss and the seventh in the last eight games ... GU enters the tournament with a 14-17 overall record, including a 5-13 mark in conference play.
- Georgetown has played 10 games against nationally-ranked teams – beating then-No. 13 Oregon (65-61), No. 16 Creighton (71-51) and No. 11 Butler (85-81) – and have also played two games against teams from the Big 10 Conference (Wisconsin, Maryland), one against the Pac-12 Conference (Oregon), one against the Big 12 (Oklahoma State) and one against the Atlantic Coast Conference (Syracuse) ... GU is ranked No. 28 in strength of schedule nationally ... The Hoyas have three wins this season against teams in the top-15 of the RPI.

ABOUT THE HOYAS

- Against Villanova, graduate student **RODNEY PRYOR** Pryor scored 21 points and had seven rebounds to lead the Hoyas, while sophomore center **JESSIE GOVERN** added seven points and seven rebounds and sophomore forward **MARCUS DERRICKSON** chipped in six points and seven rebounds.
- Pryor was named honorable mention All-BIG EAST on March 5 when the conference office announced its postseason award winners ... He was named BIG EAST Conference Player of the Week once this season (Nov. 14) and earned a spot on the weekly honor roll four times ... Pryor, a graduate student, leads Georgetown in scoring, and ranks third in the BIG EAST, with 18.1 points per game.
- Pryor has scored in double figures 29 times this season, including 15 games with at least 20 points ... He is tied for the team lead with 5.0 rebounds and ranks 19th in the conference in that category ... Pryor has hit a team-high 81 3-point field goals, which ranks tied for third in the BIG EAST ... He also ranks 13th in the BIG EAST in field goal percentage, connecting on 48.2 percent of his shots ... His 81 3-pointers are the second-most in a single season at GU.
- Junior guard **L.J. PEAK** is second on the team in scoring with 16.0 points per game, leads the team with 3.5 assists and is fifth with 3.8 rebounds.
- Peak ranks among the BIG EAST leaders in scoring (11th, 16.0), assists (5th, 3.5), field goal percentage (14th, 47.6%) free throw percentage (8th, 80.9%), assist/turnover ratio (12th, 1.3), and minutes played (6th, 33.1 mpg).
- Govan, who has scored in double figures 16 times this season, is third on the team in scoring with 10.2 points and is tied for the team lead with 5.0 rebounds, which ranks 21st in the league

- Derrickson is fourth on the team in scoring with 8.2 points and fifth with 4.2 rebounds per game ... Junior forward **AKOY AGAU** is averaging 4.6 points and 4.5 rebounds.
- Junior guard **JONATHAN MULMORE**, who has started the last 11 games, is averaging 3.6 points and 1.9 assists, while Mosely is averaging 4.2 points, 2.6 assists and 2.1 rebounds.
- Georgetown had its roster rotations fluctuate through the first 17 games of the season ... Hayes missed the first four games of the season ... Derrickson missed four games with an injury, but did return to play against Howard on Nov. 27 ... Junior guard Tre Campbell missed the Providence and Butler games with an illness and then missed the game at Villanova after suffering a bruised knee during a bus accident on Feb. 6 ... Freshman guard Jagan Mosely missed the St. John's game with a shoulder injury and is not expected to play at Seton Hall ... The Hoyas have had six players miss a total of 28 games this season.

PRYOR NAMED HONORABLE MENTION ALL-BIG EAST

Rodney Pryor was named honorable mention All-BIG EAST on March 5 when the conference office announced its postseason award winners ... Pryor, a graduate student, leads Georgetown in scoring, and ranks third in the BIG EAST, with 18.1 points per game ... He is also tied for the team lead in rebounds, with 5.0 per game ... Pryor has hit a team-best 81 3-point field goals and ranks third in the BIG EAST in that category ... His 81 3-pointers rank second all-time in a single season at GU ... A transfer from Robert Morris who was a two-time All-Northeast Conference selection, Pryor's 560 points rank among the top-25 all-time for a single season at Georgetown ... He was named BIG EAST Conference Player of the Week once this season (Nov. 14) and earned a spot on the weekly honor roll four times.

ALL-BIG EAST HONOREES UNDER JTIH

Under Head Coach John Thompson III, the Hoyas have had 30 All-BIG EAST selections, including nine first team selections, six second team honorees, four third team nods, three honorable mentions and eight All-Rookie recognitions ... ROSTER ROTATION

- Georgetown had its roster rotations fluctuate throughout the season ... Senior center Bradley Hayes missed the first four games of the season as part of his receiving a fifth year of eligibility from the NCAA ... Sophomore forward Marcus Derrickson missed four games with an injury, but did return to play against Howard on Nov. 27 ... Junior forward Isaac Copeland suffered a facial injury against Oklahoma State and missed two games (he left school at the end of the first semester and transferred to another institution) ... Senior forward Reggie Cameron took a leave of absence from the team after the season opener and missed six games, but returned to the team on Nov. 27 ... Junior guard Tre Campbell missed three games (Providence, Butler and St. John's) with an illness ... Hayes missed the game at DePaul after a pregame injury to his foot and has been hampered by that in the late stages of the season ... Campbell then missed the Villanova, Marquette and Creighton games after suffering a bruised right knee during the team's bus accident on the highway on Monday, Feb. 6 ... He dressed for the DePaul game but did not play ... Freshman guard Jagan Mosely missed the game at St. John's with a shoulder injury and is not expected to play at Seton Hall ... The Hoyas have had six players miss a total of 27 games this season.

EARLY-SEASON TESTS

- Head Men's Basketball Coach John Thompson III has annually played one of the nation's toughest schedules and the 2016-17 season has been no different.
- Through 30 games this season, the Hoyas have played nine games against nationally-ranked teams – beating then-No. 13 Oregon (65-61),





falling to then-No. 16 Wisconsin (73-57), to No. 17 Xavier (81-76), to No. 18 Butler in overtime, at No. 22 Xavier, beating No. 16 Creighton (71-51) and No. 11 Butler (85-81) – and another that was receiving votes, Maryland (L, 76-75).

- The Hoyas have played two games against teams from the Big 10 Conference (Wisconsin, Maryland), one against the Pac-12 Conference (Oregon), one against the Big 12 (Oklahoma State) and one against the Atlantic Coast Conference (Syracuse).

HOYAS SIGN 2 TO NATIONAL LETTERS-OF-INTENT

- Georgetown signed a pair of student-athletes to National-Letters-of-Intent in the early signing period, with guard Tremont Waters and forward Antwan Walker set to join the program.
- Waters, a 5-foot-11 prospect from Notre Dame High School (West Haven, Connecticut), is ranked No. 32 in the ESPN 100 and No. 7 among point guards ... Waters averaged 13.4 points, 4.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.1 steals during the spring and summer with Expressions Elite on the Nike EYBL circuit 2015.
- On Jan. 27, Waters was selected to play in the Jordan Brand Classic, which will be held on April 14 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn.
- Walker, a 6-7 forward from Washington, D.C., is currently ranked as a three-star recruit by 247 Sports and a four-star recruit by ESPN ... Named the D.C. Interscholastic Athletic Association Player of the Year in consecutive seasons after leading H.D. Woodson to the city title in 2015 and 2016 ... Currently enrolled at Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia.

AGAINST ST. JOHN'S

- The meeting with St. John's will be the 108th all-time between the programs, with the Red Storm leading the head-to-head series, 56-51.
- The Blue & Gray won the first meeting of the season between the teams, 83-55, in early January, and SJU won, 86-80, at home on Feb. 25.
- Georgetown has won three of the last four games in the series and nine of the last 12 meetings overall.
- The Hoyas have a 16-7 record against SJU under Head Coach John Thompson III, but St. John's has a 35-17 edge in games played at MSG.

ABOUT THE RED STORM

- St. John's enters the BIG EAST Tournament with a 13-18 overall record, including a 7-11 mark in conference play this season.

- The Red Storm closed out the regular season with an 86-75 loss to Providence on Saturday ... SJU lost four of its final five games.
- Freshman guard Marcus Lovett leads the team with 16.4 points and 3.5 assists while connecting on 50 3-point field goals.
- Freshman, guard Shamorie Ponds leads the team in scoring with 17.6 points, is averaging 3.1 assists and 4.5 rebounds and has a team-high 70 3-pointers.
- Junior forward Bashir Ahmed is third on the team with 13.4 points and leads the team with 5.6 rebounds.
- SJU ranks fourth in the BIG EAST in scoring offense (77.2 ppg) and 10th in the league in scoring defense (78.0 ppg).

FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Georgetown has gone to the free throw line early and often this season, averaging 23.3 trips to the line after 31 games ... The Hoyas have taken advantage as well, connecting on 73.8 percent of their shots ... GU has scored 23.2 percent of its points this season from the free throw line (533 of 2296).
- The Hoyas rank tied for No. 56 in the country in free throw attempts (722), No. 39 in free throws made (533) and No. 61 in free throw percentage (73.8%) ... With 17.2 free throws made per game, Georgetown ranks tied for No. 34 in the country in that category.
- In the game against Maryland, the Hoyas connected on 37-of-42 shots from the sin stripe ... The 37 made free throws were the most since the Hoyas hit 39 in a win over Villanova on February 6, 2010.

THE NAME IS THE SAME

- Georgetown has several recognizable names on its roster this season, starting with the obvious in Head Coach John Thompson III, the son of Hall of Fame Coach John Thompson Jr.
- On his staff is Patrick Ewing Jr., the son of former Georgetown All-American and Hall of Famer Patrick Ewing ... Ewing Jr., who graduated from Georgetown in 2008 and was part of JT3's 2007 Final Four team, joined returned to the Hilltop in 2015 as the Director of Basketball Operations.
- On the roster, fans will also see a pair of familiar names too ... Junior forward Alonzo "Trey" Mourning is the son of former Georgetown All-American and Hall of Famer Alonzo Mourning ... His father, who also wore #33 on the Hilltop, is a member of the Board of Trustees at Georgetown ... And freshman George Muresan is the son of former Washington Bullets and NBA standout GGeorge Muresan ... The younger Muresan, who grew up in the D.C. area, joined the team as a walk-on this year.

PRYOR SHINES IN DEBUT

Graduate transfer Rodney Pryor made an impressive debut in his first game as a Hoya, scoring 26 points in the first half and finishing with 32 ... His game-high 32 points were the most in a debut game under John Thompson III ... He is the ninth player to score at least 30 points under JT3 and it was the 16th 30-plus point game under Thompson ... Pryor's 32 points were also the most in a debut game for a Georgetown player since Brian Sheehan scored 30 points on Dec. 4, 1958 against Kentucky Wesleyan ... Pryor's 13 made field goals were also the most in a single game by a Georgetown player since Allen Iverson hit 15 against St. John's on January 27, 1996.

PREACH!

Graduate student guard **Rodney Pryor** was expected to help lead the Hoyas, and he's done that, leading the team in scoring with 18.0 points per game and scoring at least 20 points nine times this season ... Pryor is a leader off the floor too ... He took instruction and became a preacher two or three years ago after attending services with his mother back home in Illinois ... Recognizing his ability to speak, the pastor at his mother's church recommended he take classes and Pryor became a preacher, where he has spoken at mainly non-denominational churches.

He is the 46th player in Georgetown history to reach that mark and now has 1,162 for his career ... Peak is also the 12th player under Head Coach John Thompson III to score 1,000 points at Georgetown ... He now ranks tied for 32nd all-time in scoring at Georgetown and needs 30 more points to pass Merlin Wilson ('76) for 31st all-time with 1,191 points ... Michael Jackson ('86) ranks 30th with 1,225 points.

BENCH-MARKS

In Georgetown's opening game of the season, the Hoyas recorded 22 assists on 36 made field goals (61.1 percent) ... The Hoyas were 10-2 when handing out 15 or more assists in 2015-16 ... Through 31 games, Georgetown has handed out 468 assists on 781 field goals (59.9%).

INDICATORS

Since John Thompson III took over at the helm of the Hoya program, when the team has scored at least 69 points, good things happen ... In 12 years, Georgetown is 169-42 when scoring at least 69 points, including a 14-4 mark in 2014-15 ... The team was 18-1 during the 2006-07 season when scoring at least 69 points ... In his 15-plus years of head coaching, JTIII-led teams (Princeton, 2000-04; Georgetown, 2004-present) are 196-48 when scoring at least 69 points.

AGAU TAKES PART IN BIG EAST CONFERENCE SUMMER MEETING IN CHICAGO

- Georgetown men's basketball player Akoy Agau was among a group of representatives from the 10 BIG EAST member institutions who traveled to Chicago during the last weekend of June as part of the Conference's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) summer meeting.
- Student-athletes met to discuss important NCAA and BIG EAST Conference matters, while also hearing from various speakers, which included former student-athletes ... The SAAC representatives also participated in a service activity with the Special Olympics of Chicago.
- On Friday night, the student-athletes had a Welcome to Chicago dinner with BIG EAST Commissioner Val Ackerman, who shared her personal and professional experiences with the group from her former student-athlete days to her different executive positions in the work force.
- Saturday began with meetings at DePaul's Lincoln Park campus. Topics discussed included national issues that affect student-athletes today, such as time demands and NCAA governance; BIG EAST-centric issues that included SAAC's structure, various initiatives, the BIG EAST Health and Safety Working Group, the BIG EAST's position on the NCAA Autonomy Proposals, BIG EAST Championship feedback and review of the Athletic Director, SWA and Faculty Athletic Representative reports.
- "It was a good experience to be able to speak to and listen to some of our conference SAAC leaders," Agau said. "I was glad to have the chance to represent Georgetown and my team and to share my input on some of the topics that were discussed."

FORMER HOYA JONATHAN WALLACE JOINS MEN'S BASKETBALL STAFF

- Former Georgetown University men's basketball standout Jonathan Wallace has come back to the Hilltop, joining the coaching staff as a special assistant to Head Coach John Thompson III.
- Wallace, an All-BIG EAST guard who hit a game-tying 3-pointer in the 2007 NCAA Regionals to help lift the Hoyas past North Carolina and to the Final Four, finished his eighth season in the professional ranks this past season, playing for a team in Angola.
- Wallace ended up starting every game of his career (136), was part of four teams that went to the postseason, including three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, won back-to-back BIG EAST Regular Season titles (2006-07, 2007-08) and a BIG EAST Tournament Championship (2006-07) ... He ranks third all-time in career starts at Georgetown and the Hoyas won 100 games during his four-year career.
- Wallace earned All-BIG EAST honors in 2007-08 as a senior, when he was a co-captain and averaged 10.7 points, 2.6 assists and led the team with 71 3-point field goals ... As a junior in 2006-07, when the Hoyas went to the Final Four, he finished third on the team in scoring with 11.4 points and led the team with 73 3-pointers.

- For his career, Wallace averaged 9.2 points and 2.8 assists and hit 240 3-point field goals, the latter mark which stood as the school record until the 2015-16 season ... He ranks No. 24 all-time in scoring (1,256 points), third in 3-point field goal percentage (43.4%), fifth in free throw percentage (82.1%) and ninth all-time in assists (378).
- Following his graduation Wallace, who had been accepted in the Georgetown University School of Law, embarked on a professional career that took him from the NBA Developmental League to Germany, Belgium and Africa ... He played for the Houston Rockets team in the D-League in 2008 and won a championship with that squad ... Wallace moved to Germany in 2009 and won a pair of league titles there while also being selected as an all-league player during the 2012-13 season.

GEORGETOWN TO PLAY IN PK80 COLLEGE HOOPS EVENT IN 2017

- The Georgetown University men's basketball team will be among 16 schools to play in PK80, the Phil Knight Invitational, during Thanksgiving of 2017 ... The 16-team, early-season college basketball tournament will honor the Nike co-founder and 2012 Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Phil Knight in advance of his 80th birthday.
- The PK80, one of the largest regular-season tournaments in college basketball history, will be held from Thursday, Nov. 23 to Saturday, Nov. 26 in Portland, Ore., at the Rose Quarter's Moda Center and Veterans Memorial Coliseum.
- In addition to the Hoyas, participating schools include Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State, Stanford and Texas.
- "It's exciting to be a part of this tournament," Georgetown Head Coach John Thompson III said. "It is a privilege to be involved in an event that honors Phil Knight. Mr. Knight has not only been a pivotal figure in college athletics, but he has been a driving force in the entire sports industry. We are proud to participate in an event that celebrates him."

SIX FORMER GEORGETOWN PLAYERS ON NBA ROSTERS

When the National Basketball Association 2016-17 season started, several former Georgetown men's basketball players were on rosters for the season ... Former Hoya All-American Otto Porter Jr., who was named the BIG EAST Player of the Year in 2013 and was the No. 3 pick of the Washington Wizards in that year's NBA Draft, began his fourth season as a professional in D.C. ... Another former Hoya All-American, Greg Monroe, began his second season with the Milwaukee Bucks after starting his career with the Detroit Pistons ... Former BIG EAST Player of the Year and All-American Jeff Green is in his first season with the Orlando Magic ... Roy Hibbert began his first season with the Charlotte Hornets and is currently with the Denver Nuggets ... Hollis Thompson began the season with the Philadelphia 76ers and is now in New Orleans.





ALLEN IVERSON ENSHRINED INTO NAISMITH BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME

- Since it was announced last year that former Georgetown All-American Allen Iverson ('96) would be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, it was said in many different ways that the guard was one of the most unique and electrifying players to ever step foot on the hardwood.
- During NBATV's Red Carpet Show leading up to the Hall of Fame Ceremonies, former Georgetown All-American Alonzo Mourning (C'91), himself a member of the Hall of Fame, said "I can put it in its simplest terms – pound for pound, the best player to ever play the game."
- On Sept. 10 in Springfield, Mass., Iverson joined the best in the history of the game as he was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, alongside other basketball luminaries as Shaquille O'Neal, Yao Ming and John McLendon.
- As he was introduced to the crowd before his speech, NBATV host Ahmad Rashad said – with the crowd interrupting him with cheers – "Consider the willingness, the tenacity, the toughness to compete at the highest level, the mesmerizing handle, the breathtaking speed...and you will find The Answer."
- Iverson was joined on stage by his coach, legendary Georgetown Hall of Fame Coach John Thompson Jr., along with his coach with the Philadelphia 76ers, Larry Brown, and Julius Erving.
- His coach at Georgetown was one of his first mentions.
- "I want to thank Coach Thompson ... for saving my life, for giving me the opportunity," Iverson said. "I was recruited by every school in the country for football and basketball. All of that was taken away. No other teams, no other schools were recruiting me. My mom went to Georgetown and begged him to give me a chance and he did. And that's crazy to think that you're the best football player in the world, which I did, and to be sitting up here as a Hall of Famer in basketball. You tell me God ain't good."
- Iverson thanks many people throughout his career, but came back to Georgetown again.
- "I love Miss (Lorry) Michel so much," he said. "And Miss (Mary) Fenlon, if you're watching, I love y'all."
- This is the third-straight year a former Hoya has been enshrined into the Hall of Fame, following in the footsteps of Mourning and Dikembe Mutombo (C'91).
- Iverson is the fourth former Georgetown standout to play under Thompson Jr. to enter the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame, along with Mourning, Mutombo and Patrick Ewing (C'84).
- Iverson ranks 13th all-time in scoring at Georgetown with 1,539 points, a 23.0 per game average that is the best mark in school history. His 925 points during the 1995-96 season were the most by a Hoya in a single season. In addition, he ranks 14th all-time in assists with 307, is fourth all-time in steals with 213 and his 124 steals during the 1995-96 season are the most by a player in one year.
- Iverson retired from the National Basketball Association in 2013, ending a career that spanned 15 years, during which he won the 2001 MVP award and four scoring titles. He retired in Philadelphia, where he had his greatest successes and led the franchise to the 2001 NBA Finals. Iverson, who also played for Denver, Detroit and Memphis, scored 24,368 points in his career and was an 11-time All-Star selection.

GEORGETOWN OFFICIALLY DEDICATES JOHN R. THOMPSON JR. INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETIC CENTER

Standing outside the building that bears his father's name, the John R. Thompson Jr. Intercollegiate Athletic Center was officially opened in a ceremony on the Hilltop on Thursday, Oct. 6.

A public dedication ceremony for the Thompson Athletic Center was held in the plaza area outside the new facility and adjacent to McDonough Arena. More than 600 people were in attendance as Thompson cut the ribbon for the facility that bears the name of the coach who guided the Georgetown men's basketball team to the 1984 NCAA Championship, three Final Fours and 596 wins in 27 years on the sidelines.

"It's a pleasure to be together with all of you as we dedicate the John R. Thompson Jr. Intercollegiate Athletic Center and recognize John for the profound impact he has had – here, in our community, on the game of basketball and to larger questions of racial justice, equity, equality and opportunity in our nation."

Following the dedication ceremony, a Celebration Dinner was held in McDonough Arena, with many greats from Georgetown Basketball – former National Football League commissioner Paul Tagliabue, Alonzo Mourning and Allen Iverson among them – in attendance.

"My name's not on that building just because of me," Thompson Jr. said. "There's a lot of people who I can say contributed to that, and unfortunately you just don't recall all their names at one time, but you certainly don't forget them."

The Thompson Center will transform the athletics experience at Georgetown with a facility that supports the demands our student-athletes face on a daily basis. It was built adjacent to McDonough Arena and, with roughly 144,000 square feet of newly-constructed space, will house:

- New practice courts, locker rooms, team meeting rooms, lounge areas and coaches' offices for men's and women's basketball.
- Sports performance/weight training facility and sports medicine/training room areas for all varsity student-athletes.
- A student-athlete academic center, auditorium and team meeting facilities for all varsity sports programs.
- Team-dedicated locker rooms for men's & women's basketball, men's & women's soccer and men's & women's lacrosse.
- A new equipment room – more than 4,000 square feet – that will service all 29 intercollegiate sports and more than 750 student-athletes.
- Hoyas Forever Hallway to honor the University's rich athletic tradition and history.
- A courtyard for student-athletes that has a comfortable meditation area with a statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary.



"Our facilities have been used against us, and now they'll be used for us," Thompson III said during a tour following the dedication. "I don't think there's a place in the country as nice as this. Today's kids, they want all the bells and whistles, and this has a lot of that."

Thompson III said that it means a lot to him to know that he comes to work in the building bearing his father's name. "Proud happy, glad that it's named after Pops," Thompson III said. "I think if anything, that makes you emotional. It makes him emotional knowing that and appreciating that and seeing the great representation that you see as you walk through the building. It was important to us to recognize as much as we could the history of every sport and also men's basketball."

Near the main entrance of the building is a bronze statue of Thompson Jr., designed and created by Hanlon Sculptures, and an interactive photo wall chronicling the history of Georgetown Athletics. Also included are several quotes from Thompson Jr., including a famous line from an on-campus celebration following the 1984 NCAA Championship win, saying "When I'm gone, if I can't go to Heaven, take me back to Georgetown."

"I never thought it would happen in my lifetime because I've seen about four or five blueprints that had come out," Thompson Jr. said of having a building named for him. "It's way beyond what I thought it would be. It's spectacular."

"It's very hard to express what you really feel. I've sat out there and just looked at it, and said, "Can you believe this?"





JOHN THOMPSON III

HEAD COACH | 13TH SEASON
278-150 AT GEORGETOWN | 346-192 OVERALL

In 12-plus seasons as the head coach of the program he has been around since his youth, John Thompson III has made his mark not only on the Georgetown men's basketball program, but in the elite circles of college basketball. Thompson, who has been a collegiate head coach for 16 seasons, has compiled several coaching milestones:

- Since his arrival on the Hilltop, the Hoyas have reached the postseason in 11 of his 12 seasons on the sidelines.
- Including an appearance in 2015, Georgetown has been selected to the NCAA Tournament in eight of the last 12 seasons.
- In six of the team's eight NCAA Tournament appearances, the Blue & Gray have been seeded among the top four teams, earning three No. 2 seeds (2007, 2008, 2013), two No. 3 seeds (2010, 2012) and a No. 4 seed (2015).
- In 2006-07, Thompson led the program to a 30-7 record as the Hoyas won the BIG EAST Tournament Championship, the NCAA East Regional and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since 1985.
- In 2007-08, the Hoyas won back-to-back BIG EAST Regular Season titles (2006-07, 2007-08), posting a two-year record of 28-6 against conference opponents.
- In 2012-13, the Blue & Gray won the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship, winning 11-straight games at one point, and Thompson was named the BIG EAST Coach of the Year.
- He has led the Hoyas to three appearances in the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game.
- He has twice been named the Black Coaches Association (BCA) Male Coach of the Year and was named the 2007 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Coach of the Year.

In 12-plus years at Georgetown, Thompson has guided the Hoyas to a 278-150 overall record (.650 win percentage) and to a 131-97 record in conference play.

Overall in 16 years as a head coach, including four at his alma mater, Princeton, Thompson has compiled a 346-192 (.643) overall record, with a 176-108 record in conference play (BIG EAST and Ivy League combined), won six league championships and guided his teams to 12 postseason appearances.

Since arriving on the Hilltop, the Hoyas have advanced to one Final Four (2006-07), won a BIG EAST Tournament title (2006-07), won three BIG EAST regular season titles including back-to-back league titles (2006-07, 2007-08, 2012-13), reached the NCAA Tournament eight times (2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2014-15), been invited to the National Invitation Tournament three times (2004-05, 2008-09 and 2013-14) and played in the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game three times.

Off the court, Thompson has been an active member of Georgetown University and a presence in the Washington, D.C. community. He speaks at a variety of alumni events throughout the year and has annually joined the members of the Georgetown University Wall Street Alliance in New York City each October. Through his work with his self-named foundation, the JTIII Foundation (which was founded in 2007), Thompson and his wife, Monica, have worked to aid community-based charities that serve at-risk children and families.

Thompson also has international experience, serving as an assistant coach on the USA Basketball Men's Under-18 National team that competed in the 2008 FIBA Americas U-18 Championship in Argentina.

In addition, Thompson is also very active with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and serves on that organization's Board of Directors.

Prior to coaching at Georgetown, Thompson guided Princeton to three Ivy League Championships, two NCAA tournaments and an NIT appearance over his four years as head coach. He amassed a 68-42 record as Princeton's head coach after serving as an assistant coach at Princeton from 1995-2000. As assistant coach, he helped lead the team to a top 10 national ranking and five-consecutive postseason appearances.

Princeton not only made the postseason eight of nine years during Thompson's tenure, but he helped recruit and coach three All-Americans, three Ivy League Players of the Year, two Ivy League Rookies of the Year and 12 First Team All-Ivy League players.

Thompson also played basketball as an undergraduate for the Tigers while majoring in politics. As a forward, he ranks third on Princeton's all-time assist leader list with 358. Playing for legendary coach Pete Carril, Thompson produced with amazing proficiency with 103 assists and just 34 turnovers as a senior. He was co-captain of the 1988 team and shared the B.F. Bunn trophy that year as one of the Tigers' Most Valuable Players.

Thompson, 49, grew up in Washington, D.C., where he graduated from Gonzaga College High School. As a high school senior he was named First Team All-Met by the Washington Post.

Thompson's wife, Monica, is also a Princeton grad (Class of '89). They have three children: Morgan, John Wallace and Matthew.
