Scouting the Red Storm

St. John's (1-12, 0-4 BIG EAST) is coming off an 18-3 loss at then-No. 18/18 Villanova in BIG EAST action. Eight different Red Storm players have tallied at least 10 points this season, led by Joe Madsen with 24 (19G, 5A). Nick Heller adds 19 points (14G, 5A), Scott Scannell chips in 18 points (6G, 12A) and Jason DeBenedictis is good for 17 points (9G, 8A).

Daniel Costa has started all 13 games in goal for St. John's. He has collected 136 saves while posting a .435 save percentage and a 13.96 goals-against average.

All-time vs. St. John's

Georgetown and St. John's have faced each other 16 times in program history dating back to 1992, and the Blue & Gray own a 12-4 advantage in the series. The Hoyas won the first eight meetings between the two teams but have recently traded wins in consecutive seasons beginning with a GU victory in 2011. St. John's won the last showdown between the two rivals, claiming an 8-5 victory in last year's season finale in Queens, N.Y.

Moving Up in the Record Books

Daniel Bucaro paces the Georgetown offense with 50 points (37G, 13A) on the year. He has now recorded a point in 20-straight games during his career, including 14-consecutive games with a goal scored. Bucaro's 37 goals this season currently rank 10th all-time in a single season while his 50 points put him 16th in a campaign.

Peter Conley is right on Bucaro's trail with 43 points (26G, 17A) and continues to climb the all-time scoring ranks on the Hilltop. His 76 career goals rank 14th, his 42 assists are tied for 16th and his 118 total points rank 16th as well.

'Sup Bro?

Georgetown junior short stick d-middie Greg Galligan will go head-to-head with his younger brother, Grant, who is a freshman attackman for the Red Storm. This is the second time this season a Hoya has squared off against a sibling, as sophomore midfielder Patrick Aslanian played his brother, Chris, at Hobart. Four other Hoyas have brothers that currently play college lacrosse: Peter Conley (Chris, Hamilton [D3]), Zeke Morrill (Jackson, Yale), Peter Tagliaferri (Michael, North Carolina) and Derek Altobello (Michael, Randolph-Macon [D3])

Twice as Nice

Jake Carraway was named the BIG EAST Freshman of the Week for each of the past two weeks. He recorded his first career hat trick with four goals against Robert Morris and added a goal and an assist in the win at Hobart. The following week, Carraway added another hat trick against No. 12/13 Duke.

Mayer Repeats as Inside Lacrosse Preseason All-American

Michael Mayer was tabbed an Inside Lacrosse Honorable Mention Preseason All-American for the second-consecutive season. He started all 14 games for the Hoyas in 2016 and will transition to LSM in 2017. Named by Inside Lacrosse as a Preseason Honorable Mention All-American in 2016 as well, Mayer was a Second Team All-BIG EAST selection as a sophomore in 2015.

Georgetown Picked Fourth in BIG EAST Preseason Poll

The Hoyas were picked to finish fourth in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll with 14 points. Denver was selected in the top spot with 25 points and five first place votes, followed by Villanova with 21 points and the remaining first place nod, with defending conference champions Marquette edging GU. with 16 points. Providence (nine points) and St. John's (five points) rounded out the poll.

Three Hoyas Tabbed Preseason All-BIG EAST

Georgetown had three players named to the 2017 Preseason All-BIG EAST Men's Lacrosse Team. Sophomore Daniel Bucaro, senior Charlie Ford and senior Michael Mayer all collected the preseason accolade for Hoyas.

Bucaro, the reigning BIG EAST Freshman of the Year and a BIG EAST Second Team honoree in 2016, led the Blue & Gray with 18 goals and 13 assists for 31 points in his rookie campaign. His 13 assists led the Hoyas while his five man-up goals tied for a team high.

Ford, a defensive stalwart for the Hoyas, returns to close defense in 2017. An All-BIG EAST performer as a sophomore, he leads all returning players with 81 grounds balls, collecting at least 30 in back-to-back seasons, to go with 19 caused turnovers in his career. He was also recently named a 2017 preseason All-BIG EAST selection by Inside Lacrosse.

Mayer will move to LSM in 2017. Named by Inside Lacrosse as a preseason HM All-American in both 2016 and 2017, he leads all returning players with 23 caused turnovers in his career and has hauled in 69 grounds balls during his time on the Hilltop.

WASHINGTON – Georgetown dropped its 2017 home opener with a thrilling 11-10 setback to No. 13/12 Towson on Saturday afternoon at Cooper Field. The Hoyas rallied from a 10-5 halftime deficit to pull within one in the final frame but could not complete the comeback attempt.

Daniel Bucaro had a career game for the Hoyas (0-3) in the loss. The sophomore standout recorded a career-high, and game-best, six goals to lead the Blue & Gray's upset attempt. Peter Conley continued his scoring spree with a pair of goals and two assists while Jake Carraway and Eduardo White added lone goals. Craig Berge and Robert Clark both chipped in assists as well.

Georgetown's defense put together an impressive showing in the second half to keep the Hoyas in the game. WASHINGTON – Seven different players tallied goals as Georgetown picked up its first win of the season with a 12-7 victory over visiting Robert Morris on Tuesday afternoon. The 12 goals were a season high for the Hoyas who improve to 1-4 on the year.

Freshman Jake Carraway had a breakout game with his first career hat trick, recording four goals and an assist for a game-high five points. Sophomores Daniel Bucaro and Patrick Aslanian added four points (2G, 2A), and three points (1G, 2A), respectively. WASHINGTON – Georgetown dropped a 17-12 decision to visiting BIG EAST rival No. 20/RV Villanova on Saturday afternoon at Cooper Field. The Hoyas fall to 2-10 overall and 0-3 in league play while the Wildcats improve to 7-5 overall and 2-1 in the BIG EAST.

Daniel Bucaro and Jake Carraway both notched hat tricks for the Hoyas in the loss while Devon Lewis and Austin McDonald both added two. Peter Conley and Craig Berge both had a goal and two assists while Lewis and Bucaro each chipped in lone assists.

Earning his first career start between the pipes, freshman goalie Jack Stephenson hauled in 16 saves on the day, including seven in the opening quarter.

Conor Barr and Peter Tagliaferri both collected three ground balls for the Blue & Gray.

Georgetown took the early advantage in the game, scoring the opening two goals of the first quarter. Conley put the Hoyas on the board first courtesy of an assist from Lewis while McDonald added the second off a pass from Conley. Villanova would respond with two goals in the period, including one with 11 seconds remaining in the first, to knot things up at 2-2.

In the second quarter, the Wildcats tallied nine-straight goals to start the frame to take an 11-2 lead before the Blue & Gray closed out the half with back-to-back goals from Berge and Carraway to make it 11-4 going into halftime.

Coming out of the break, GU opened the scoring with a goal from McDonald but Villanova responded with a pair of goals to lead 13-5. Lewis notched both his goals just 23 seconds apart after that to cut the deficit to 13-7 but VU added another score at the 1:55 mark to lead 14-7 going into the final 15 minutes of play.

In the fourth, the Hoyas netted a pair of man-up goals from Carraway and Bucaro to pull within five at 14-9, but the Wildcats responded with three-consecutive goals in a 2:23 span to go ahead 17-9 with just less than 10 minutes to play. The Hoyas held their guests scoreless the rest of the way, and picked up goals from Carraway and two from Bucaro, but couldn't get any closer than the 17-12 final.

EMMITSBURG, Md. – Georgetown earned an 11-9 victory over Mount St. Mary's in the 2017 nonconference road finale on Tuesday night. Three different Hoyas recorded hat tricks as the Blue & Gray snapped a six-game losing streak to improve to 3-10 on the season.

Daniel Bucaro led the Hoyas with four goals, posting his seventh hat trick of the season. He has now recorded a point in 20-straight games during his career, including 14-consecutive games with a goal scored. Peter Conley added three goals and a pair of assists for five points, Austin McDonald posted his second career hat trick with three goals, and Craig Berge tallied a goal and three assists. Patrick Aslanian chipped in an assist for the Hoyas as well.

Jack Stephenson picked up his first career win between the pipes, hauling in nine saves on the day. Berge, Conley and Michael Mayer all collected five ground balls for GU.

Georgetown opened scoring in the game as Bucaro tallied his first goal of the contest courtesy of an assist from Aslanian. Mount St. Mary's (4-8) would respond with back-to-back goals to take its first lead before Conley and Bucaro scored 62 seconds apart to regain the lead, 3-2. The Mountaineers added a late goal in the frame to knot things up at three to close out the period.

In the second, the Blue & Gray rallied off three unanswered goals from Berge, McDonald and Bucaro to take a 6-3 lead at the 8:12 mark, including Bucaro completing his hat trick in the first half. The Mountaineers added a lone goal in the frame and both teams went scoreless in the final seven minutes as GU took a 6-4 lead going into halftime.

Coming out of the break, Bucaro netted his fourth goal of the game to give GU a 7-4 lead but The Mount responded with a goal at the 9:07 mark to keep it a two-goal differential. The Hoyas answered with back-to-back goals from McDonald, completing a hat trick of his own, to lead 9-5. Mount St. Mary's would score two goals within 28 seconds of each other in the waning moments, but the Blue & Gray added one of its own from Conley with 22 ticks left on the clock to take a 10-7 lead going into the final 15 minutes of action.

Keeping things close, the Mountaineers struck first in the fourth quarter to pull within a pair down 10-8 at the 7:09 mark. They would add another with just 2:14 remaining to make it a one-goal game, but The Hoya defense would force a turnover and Conley would complete his hat trick with 17 seconds remaining as the Hoyas sealed the 11-9 victory.
