2008-2009 Holy Cross Basketball Outlook

Heading into the 2008-2009 season, the Holy Cross men's basketball team looks to return to its place as one of the top teams in the Patriot League. The Crusaders are coming off an injury-plagued campaign, in which three of the team's top seven scorers all missed significant action. But Holy Cross does return three starters, and 10 out of 12 players who saw action in at least 10 games last season. With the addition of two talented freshmen, the Crusaders have the ingredients necessary to return to the upper echelon of the conference.

Holy Cross is coming off a 2007-2008 campaign in which it posted an overall mark of 15-14, good for its seventh winning record in the last eight years. But injuries caught up to the Crusaders in the second half of the season, and the team finished with a losing record in the Patriot League (5-9) for the first time since 1999-2000.

Holy Cross did continue to impress with its defensive play last year, ranking 16th in the nation in scoring defense (60.5 points per game), 26th in rebound margin (+5.6 rebounds per game) and 47th in field goal percentage defense (41.0 percent). The Crusaders also led the Patriot League in scoring defense, rebounding margin, field goal percentage defense and blocked shots (3.9 blocks per game).

If Holy Cross can avoid key injuries this season, expect the Crusaders to be among the Patriot League's best, and in contention for a postseason tournament bid in March.

Frontcourt

At the low post positions, Holy Cross will be led by senior forward Alex Vander Baan. Entering his fourth year as a starter, Vander Baan led the team with an average of 5.7 rebounds per game last season, while ranking second on the squad in scoring at 8.5 points per game. But after playing in all 66 of the team's games during his first two seasons, including 64 starts, he was limited to just 19 appearances and 14 starts in 2007-2008 due to injury. If Vander Baan can stay healthy this season, he should be one of the top big men in the Patriot League.

Junior forward Eric Meister looks to win the other starting spot for the Crusaders' down low. Meister also missed time due to injury last season, playing in 18 games with eight starts. But he did show promise when healthy, ranking third on the team with an average of 4.7 rebounds per game. Meister should also become more of a factor on the offensive end of the court, after averaging 4.8 points per contest last season.

Senior center Greg McCarthy could contend for a starting spot or play a key role off the bench. Last season, he averaged 3.3 points and 2.0 rebounds per contest for the Crusaders, while making 24 appearances with five starts. McCarthy has the ability to become one of the team's top offensive options in the low post, after hitting 52.2 percent of his field goal attempts in 2007-2008.

Sophomore forward Andrew Keister should also become more of a factor this year. After receiving a medical redshirt in 2006-2007, Keister worked his way into the rotation during the second half of last season, averaging 1.7 points and 2.2 rebounds per game. Sophomore forward Josh Jones will also look to earn increased playing time off the bench for Holy Cross. Jones totaled six points and two rebounds in 10 appearances last year.

Backcourt

Holy Cross returns five perimeter players this season, who will look to develop into one of the Patriot League's top backcourts. Leading the way is senior guard Pat Doherty, who will return to the starting lineup at point guard. The 2005 Patriot League Rookie of the Year, Doherty has battled through injuries in each of the last three seasons to become a key contributor for the Crusaders. Last year, he led the team and ranked second in the Patriot League with an average of 4.3 assists per game, in addition to posting 7.4 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.7 steals per contest.

Returning as a starter at one of the wing positions will be senior forward Colin Cunningham. As a starter in 28 out of 29 games last season, Cunningham averaged 8.1 points and 4.4 rebounds per contest, while shooting 36.8 percent from three-point range and 72.3 percent at the foul line. He scored in double figures in three straight games to end the 2007-2008 season, including a career-best 20 points at American in the Patriot League quarterfinals.

Sophomore guard Andrew Beinert will contend for the other starting spot on the wing, in addition to serving as Doherty's backup at the point. Last season, Beinert was named to the Patriot League All-Rookie team, after playing in all 29 games with 12 starts. He finished the 2007-2008 campaign averaging 3.9 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.4 assists per contest.

Junior forward Adam May will also compete for the final starting spot or play a key role off the bench, after seeing action in 23 contests with one start last season. May led all Holy Cross reserves in scoring last year at 5.2 points per game, in addition to averaging 2.0 rebounds.

Senior guard Lawrence Dixon, another player who has missed significant time due to injury, looks to earn key minutes at the wing positions. Dixon was limited to just 21 appearances a year ago, averaging 2.6 points and 1.7 rebounds per game.

Freshman guard Devin Brown and freshman guard R.J. Evans will also look to earn playing time in the backcourt. Brown comes to Holy Cross from Notre Dame Preparatory School in Fitchburg, Mass., while Evans attended Norwich Free Academy in Norwich, Conn.

Schedule

The Crusaders have played challenging non-league schedules over the last several years, with Holy Cross' non-conference strength of schedule ranking in or near the top 100 in the nation during each of the last four seasons. This year will be no different, as the Crusaders are scheduled to once again play one of the Patriot League's best non-conference slates.

The home portion of the non-conference schedule includes seven games at the Hart Center, including visits by 2008 NCAA Tournament participants Siena and St. Joseph's. Holy Cross will also play host to a Western Michigan team which won 20 games last year, and a Brown squad which took part in the 2008 Collegiate Basketball Invitational. Road games out of the league include a visit to Ohio, which also won 20 games in 2007-2008, and Conference USA member Central Florida. One more non-conference opponent is still to be added.

The Patriot League looks to be well balanced this season, with Holy Cross playing home-and-home series against each of the seven other teams in the league. The conference schedule will be highlighted by two contests against American, the team which eliminated the Crusaders from last year's Patriot League Tournament and won the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

CRUSADERS LOOK TO REMAIN TOUGH ON DEFENSE: Holy Cross should once again be among the top defensive teams in the nation in 2008-2009. Last season, the Crusaders held their opponents to 60.5 points per contest and 41.0 percent shooting from the field. Holy Cross also outrebounded the opposition by 5.6 boards per game, while forcing 13.9 turnovers per contest. Since the beginning of the 2001-2002 campaign, Holy Cross has held its opposition to only 58.9 points per contest. In addition, the Crusaders have ranked in the top 10 in the nation in scoring defense in five of the last seven seasons (sixth in 2001-2002 at 59.6; third in 2002-2003 at 58.7; seventh in 2003-2004 at 58.6; fifth in 2004-2005 at 56.8; and eighth in 2006-2007 at 57.5). Here is a look at Holy Cross' defensive statistics under Ralph Willard.

HOLY CROSS HAS GOOD SUCCESS ON THE BOARDS: The Crusaders look to once again be an outstanding rebounding team this year. Last season, Holy Cross was outrebounded only five times in 29 games, while averaging 33.5 rebounds per game and outrebounding the opposition by 5.6 boards per contest. The Crusaders were even more impressive in Patriot League play, outrebounding conference foes by 6.3 boards per game. The rebounding load was well balanced, with five different players averaging at least 3.6 rebounds per game. Forward **Alex Vander Baan** led the team with an average of 5.7 rebounds per game, followed by center **Tim Clifford** with 5.4 boards per contest. Forward **Eric Meister** totaled 4.7 rebounds per game, while forward **Colin Cunningham** added 4.4 boards per contest, and guard **Kyle Cruze** contributed 3.6 rebounds per game. The Crusaders have now posted a positive rebounding margin in nine straight seasons, including seven years in which they outrebounded the opposition by at least four boards per game.

HOLY CROSS IN THE NCAA STATISTICS: The Crusaders finished the 2007-2008 season ranked among the NCAA Division I leaders in six statistical categories. In addition, center **Tim Clifford** stood among the national leaders in field goal percentage, blocked shots and scoring. The rankings:

CRUSADERS OWN FIVE PATRIOT LEAGUE REGULAR SEASON TITLES: Throughout its first 18 years of play in the conference, Holy Cross has won five Patriot League regular season titles. The last championship for the Crusaders came in 2006-2007, when they tied for first place in the conference with Bucknell, as both teams posted 13-1 records in league play. Prior to that, Holy Cross won outright Patriot League regular season titles in 2001, 2003 and 2005, while sharing the regular season championship in 1994. The Crusaders are the only team in league history to win more than two outright titles, while their five total championships are tied for the most in conference history with Navy (one outright, four shared) and Bucknell (two outright, three shared).

HOLY CROSS IN THE RPI: Holy Cross finished the 2007-2008 season ranked 149th in the nation in the Ratings Percentage Index, with a rating of .5107. The Crusaders were the second-highest ranked team in the Patriot League, behind only American (91st, .5441). In addition, Holy Cross' non-conference schedule ranked as the 113th-best in the country, and the hardest in the Patriot League. The Crusaders concluded the 2006-2007 season ranked 59th in the country in the RPI with a rating of .5730. Holy Cross was also ranked 111th in the RPI in 2005-2006 (.5304) and 49th in 2004-2005 (.5657).

CRUSADERS KEEP WINNING AT THE HART CENTER: Holy Cross posted an 8-5 mark at the Hart Center last season, and now owns an all-time record of 299-109 in the building. The Crusaders had a 23-game winning streak at the Hart Center from Feb. 15, 2006-Jan. 2, 2008, which was the longest streak in the history of the building and the sixth-longest home court winning streak in the nation at the time. In 2006-2007 Holy Cross posted a perfect 14-0 mark at the Hart Center, setting a school record for the most home victories since it moved into the building. During the Hart Center's history, Holy Cross has posted a winning record at home in 29 out of 33 seasons, while recording double-figure home victories 15 times. The Crusaders stand 86-17 at home since the beginning of the 2000-2001 season, including a 54-10 record against Patriot League foes.

TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE: This year will mark the 90th season of Holy Cross men's basketball. The Crusaders own an overall record of 1264-813 (.609), while making 24 postseason tournament appearances — 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament and 12 to the National Invitation Tournament. In the history of collegiate basketball, Holy Cross is one of only 16 schools to have won the NCAA Tournament (1946-1947) as well as the National Invitational Tournament (1953-1954). Throughout its history, Holy Cross has had six first team All-America selections, sent 10 players to the National Basketball Association, had four players inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, had 23 players drafted by professional teams, had three players go on to coach professionally, and had 15 players who have coached in college, including current Crusader coach Ralph Willard.

CRUSADERS HAVE FIVE PATRIOT LEAGUE TOURNAMENT CROWNS: Two years ago, the Crusaders captured their fifth Patriot League Tournament with their 74-66 victory over Bucknell on March 9, 2007. Holy Cross' previous tournament titles came in 2003 (72-64 over American), 2002 (58-54 at American), 2001 (68-64 over Navy in overtime) and 1993 (98-73 at Bucknell). The Crusaders' five conference tournament championships are the most in Patriot League history, with Navy having the second most (three in 1994, 1997 and 1998). Holy Cross has also appeared in the championship game in six times in the last eight years. Overall, the Crusaders have made a conference-record nine appearances in the Patriot League championship game.

Ralph Willard Head Coach

10th Season at Holy Cross

Ralph Willard is in his 10th season at the helm of the Holy Cross men's basketball program in 2008-2009, and if the first nine seasons are any indication, the Crusaders should enjoy sustained success for years to come.

During his nine years at Holy Cross, Willard has directed his squad to 174 wins, averaging over 19 wins per season. The 174 victories are the second highest total for a Crusader head coach in school history, trailing only George Blaney (357-276 / 1972-1994).

Willard led the Crusaders to three straight Patriot League tournament titles in 2001, 2002 and 2003, marking the first time in conference history that a team has accomplished that feat. He has posted a 84-38 mark in regular season conference play, and a 15-5 mark in conference tournament action. In 2005, he led Holy Cross to the Patriot League's first-ever postseason victory, a 78-73 win at Notre Dame in the first round of the National Invitation Tournament.

Holy Cross has won at least 20 games in five of the last eight seasons, including a streak of three straight years with 20 victories from 2005-2007. The Crusaders have also advanced to postseason play five times in the last eight seasons, taking part in the NCAA tournament four times (2001, 2002, 2003 and 2007) and the National Invitation Tournament once (2005). During that time, Holy Cross has twice been eliminated from the NCAA Tournament by teams that went on to the Final Four (Kansas in 2002; Marquette in 2003). The average margin of defeat in those two games was less than 10 points and the Crusaders led both games late in the second half.

In 2006-2007, Willard guided the Crusaders to an overall record of 25-9, with a 13-1 mark in the Patriot League. Holy Cross won the conference regular season and tournament titles, while making its fourth NCAA Tournament appearance under Willard. Following the conclusion of the season, Willard was honored as the Patriot League Coach of the Year for the third time in his career.

During the 2004-2005 campaign, Willard led his team to an overall record of 25-7 and the second round of the National Invitation Tournament. The Crusaders also posted a 13-1 mark in Patriot League regular season games, to claim the conference regular season title after being picked to finish fourth in the preseason. In addition, Willard was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year for the second time in his career, and was a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award.

In 2002-2003, Willard led Holy Cross to its second highest win total in school history (26) and its second regular season league title during his tenure. It marked the first time in Holy Cross history that the Crusaders advanced to three straight NCAA Tournaments.

Willard came to Holy Cross in the 1999-2000 season, and was asked to turn around a Crusader team which had won just 22 of its 89 games in the three seasons before his hiring. In his debut season, Willard led the Crusaders to their best record (10-18) in four years, despite losing four starters to injury for much of the season. Willard's Holy Cross debut was a memorable one, as he led Holy Cross to an upset of Big East foe Providence in the season opener. Then in his second season, Willard earned Patriot League Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Crusaders to both the regular season and tournament titles in 2000-2001.

Willard is just the 14th head coach in the 88-year history of the program. He is the seventh Holy Cross graduate to hold the position, and also serves as an assistant athletic director. A 1967 graduate of the college, Willard was a three-year letterwinner and served as the head coach at Western Kentucky and Pittsburgh before his current tenure at Holy Cross. Overall, in 18 years of coaching he holds a 318-227 mark.

This is Willard's third collegiate head coaching position. He previously served as the head coach at Western Kentucky and Pittsburgh before his current tenure at Holy Cross. Overall, in 18 years of coaching he holds a 318-227 mark.

He has taken his teams to the postseason in nine of his 18 seasons, including a run to the Sweet 16 with Western Kentucky in 1993. His experience also includes two seasons as an assistant coach with the New York Knicks, as well as assistant coaching positions at Syracuse and Kentucky. While at Syracuse, he helped the Orangemen advance to the NCAA championship game in 1987.

Willard's first collegiate head coaching position came at Western Kentucky. At Western Kentucky, Willard inherited a team picked last in the Sun Belt Conference and led the Hilltoppers to a 14-14 mark and third place in the league in the 1990-1991 season. The next year, Western Kentucky posed a 21-11 mark and earned an NIT berth. Willard then led the Hilltoppers to even greater heights, as his 1992-1993 team finished 16th in the *USA Today* poll and 20th in the Associated Press poll. It was the school's highest finish in the polls since its run to the Final Four in 1970-1971. Included in the 1992-1993 campaign was a victory over nationally ranked Louisville, an NCAA tournament win over Memphis State, and an NCAA upset of No. 5 Seton Hall to earn a spot in the Sweet 16.

At Pittsburgh, Willard helped to develop such players as Mark Blount (drafted by the NBA's Seattle SuperSonics) and Vontee Cummings (a District I All-American in 1999).

Prior to taking the Western Kentucky job in 1990, Willard compiled 19 years of coaching experience. After a one-year stint as an assistant at the Merchant Marine Academy (1971-1972), he spent 13 seasons as the head coach of his high school alma mater, St. Dominic (Oyster Bay, N.Y.), where he posted a 162-89 mark. His 1980 squad won the New York Class B Championship with a 24-3 record, and he was chosen as the conference coach of the year five times.

He returned to the collegiate ranks in 1984 as an assistant coach at Hofstra, followed by a year on Jim Boeheim's staff at Syracuse, where he helped the 1986-1987 Orangemen team reach the national championship game.

Andrew Sachs **Assistant Coach** **Fifth Season at Holy Cross**

Andrew Sachs is in his fifth year as an assistant coach at the College of the Holy Cross in 2008-2009. Sachs serves as the Crusaders' recruiting coordinator, in addition to handling all game and practice scheduling and team apparel. He is also heavily involved in opponent scouting, academic advising, game preparation and player development.

Holy Cross has an overall record of 85-42 during Sachs' first four seasons on the staff, posting a winning record each year, with three 20-win seasons. In 2006-2007, Sachs helped the Crusaders to an overall record of 25-9, while winning the Patriot League regular season and tournament titles, and advancing to the NCAA Tournament. During the 2004-2005 campaign, he helped the team to a 25-7 overall record, a Patriot League regular season title and a trip to the second round of the National Invitation Tournament.

Sachs came to Holy Cross after spending three seasons as an assistant coach at Archbishop Spalding High School in Severn, Md. He helped Archbishop Spalding to an overall record of 85-22 and two conference championships, while developing 10 players who went on to play at the collegiate level in Division I.

From 1996-2001, Sachs was the associate head coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. He helped the squad to five straight winning seasons, including a pair of 20-win campaigns and an NCAA Elite Eight appearance. Sachs previously spent four years as an assistant coach at Virginia Wesleyan College from 1992-1996, where he also served as the head men's tennis coach and sports information director. In 1993, the Marlins won their first Old Dominion Athletic Conference title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Sachs also worked for five years as an assistant coach at Salisbury State University, helping the team to two NCAA Tournament bids and a 28-2 record in 1991-1992. The 28 victories in 1991-1992 set a school record, with the team winning 27 straight games and advancing to the NCAA Elite Eight. He received his bachelor's degree from Salisbury State in 1990, then went on to earn a master's degree in 1992.

Sachs is married to the former Paula Handy, and resides in Auburn.

Guillermo Sanchez **Assistant Coach** **Third Season at Holy Cross**

Guillermo Sanchez is in his third year as an assistant coach at the College of the Holy Cross in 2008-2009. Sanchez's primary responsibilities include recruiting and handling all team travel. He is also heavily involved in opponent scouting, academic advising, game preparation and player development.

Holy Cross has an overall record of 40-23 during Sanchez's first two seasons on the staff, posting a winning record each year. In 2006-2007, he helped the Crusaders to an overall record of 25-9, while winning the Patriot League regular season and tournament titles, and advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

Sanchez came to Holy Cross from Assumption College, where he served as an assistant coach during the 2005-2006 season.
