2007 Spring Preview

Coming off a 2006 season in which it went 7-4 overall and 4-2 in the Patriot League, the Holy Cross football team has high hopes heading into the spring of 2007. The team has shown constant improvement during its first three years under the direction of head coach Tom Gilmore, and will look to compete for the Patriot League title this season.

On the offensive side of the ball, the Crusaders return seven starters and 15 of the 22 players on last season's final two-deep chart. That group will look to build on the success which they had a year ago, when they led the conference in total offense (384.4 yards per game), passing offense (271.5 yards per game) and third down conversions (46.3 percent). With all of the experience returning, Holy Cross could develop one of the top offenses in the nation this season.

As for the defense, the Crusaders have six starters back from a unit which began to establish itself as a force in the Patriot League. Holy Cross allowed just 21.4 points and 335.4 yards per game in 2006, which ranked as the team's best numbers since the 2000 campaign. The Crusaders should remain strong against the pass this season with three starters returning in the secondary, after leading the conference in pass efficiency defense (108.4 rating) a year ago.

Here is a position-by-position breakdown of how the Crusaders should look in 2007.

Offense

The Holy Cross offense will be led by junior quarterback Dominic Randolph, who established himself as one of the top signal callers in the Patriot League last season. In 2006, Randolph completed 184 of 299 attempts for 2,237 yards and 19 touchdowns with just six interceptions. Now that he has a year of collegiate experience under his belt, Randolph should lead the Crusaders to even more success in 2007. Senior Brian McSharry proved to be a solid backup last year, and should return to that role this season. During the 2006 campaign, McSharry connected on 71 of 118 passes for 727 yards and six touchdowns, including three starts when Randolph was injured. Others who will provide depth at quarterback include junior Tommy Fleming and sophomores Taylor Glor and Joe Kosich.

Randolph should have a number of excellent targets to hit, as Holy Cross returns what could be the top group of receivers in the country. The Crusaders have four of the top five wide outs back from last year's team, and all of them had over 20 catches for at least 250 yards in 2006. Leading the way is senior Ryan Maher, who led the Patriot League with 69 catches for 797 yards and six touchdowns last season. Senior Thomas Harrison is also coming off a strong year in 2006, when he totaled 46 receptions for 569 yards and four scores. Junior Brett McDermott (39 catches, 518 yards and four touchdowns) and junior Jon Brock (24 receptions, 257 yards and three scores) round out the top line of receivers for Holy Cross. Senior Justin Maher (nine catches, 110 yards and one touchdown) should also see a good deal of action, while junior Danny Bluth and sophomores Bill Edger and Mike Frawley will look to break into the rotation at receiver.

The Crusaders look to be strong in the offensive backfield as well, with the return of juniors Mike Kielt and Terrance Gass at tailback. Kielt led the team in rushing last season with 524 yards and six touchdowns on 108 carries, in addition to catching 15 passes for 90 yards. Gass was also very effective, running for 450 yards and four scores on 107 carries, while posting 15 receptions for 137 yards and two touchdowns. Junior Kevin Golden and sophomore Matt Jackson also showed promise in limited action last year, while sophomores Nick Cole, Tom Hagan and Kevin Houghton will look to earn playing time.

At tight end, senior Ryan McGuire will look to take over the starting duties, after missing all of last season due to injury. McGuire saw action in 10 games during the 2005 campaign, serving primarily as a blocker, and will look to become more of a receiving threat this season. Senior Nate Langelier and sophomores Paul Nielsen, Josh Nims and Kevin Watters will also look to contribute.

Even though the Crusaders return the majority of their starters at the skill positions, three spots will need to be filled along the offensive line. Last year, the line paved the way for Holy Cross to average 384.4 yards of total offense and 25.0 points per contest. Leading the Crusaders this season will be senior right tackle Dan Nolan and junior center Chris Smith, who both started all 11 games during the 2006 campaign. A number of others will look to compete for starting spots or key roles as back-ups, including senior Rob Kerbstat; juniors Luke Botting, R.J. Buchholz, David Gang, Brenton Good, Mason Olson and Chris Poole; and sophomores Matt Brady, Chris Fucillo, Justin Johnson, Aaron Jones, Rob Petrosino and Brandt Tierney.

2007 Spring Preview

Defense

The secondary looks to be a strength for the Crusaders, as three out of four starters from the 2006 season return. At one cornerback spot, fifth-year senior Casey Gough will be in his fourth season as a starter, after earning first team All-Patriot League honors in 2006. Gough totaled 54 tackles, seven pass breakups and three interceptions last fall, in addition to posting eight tackles for loss. The other cornerback spot will be manned by junior Kyle Mushaweh, who recorded 54 tackles and six pass breakups as the starter last season. Seniors Seun Bayode (25 tackles, six pass breakups last year) and Demetrick Perkins (eight tackles, one interception in 2006) provide solid depth and experience for the Crusaders at cornerback. At strong safety, senior Kent Flanders returns after totaling 37 tackles, an interception and three pass breakups during the 2006 season. Playing alongside Flanders at free safety will be fellow senior Obi Green, who recorded 11 tackles and three pass breakups a year ago, and looks to win back the starting spot he held in 2004 and 2005. Junior Daryl Brown (15 tackles in 2006) should also see a good deal of time at safety. Others competing for playing time in the defensive backfield will be juniors Mike

Holloway and Ty Shaw, and sophomores Dakota Allosso, Pat Haidon, Jachin Leatherman, Quentin Liggins, John Myrick and Michael Wright.

Holy Cross looks to be strong at linebacker as well, with two out of four starters returning. Senior Mark Kelliher is back at one of the outside linebacker spots, after totaling 37 tackles, three tackles for loss and two fumble recoveries in 2006. Junior Evan Byrd looks to win the other starting spot on the outside, after making seven tackles and breaking up a pass last season. On the inside, juniors Brian Billman and Ryan Stewart look to be the starters, after splitting starting duties at one of the spots last year. Billman totaled 40 tackles and five tackles for loss a year ago, while Stewart added 30 tackles and three tackles for loss. Other players who will push for playing time include senior Dana Buglione, junior Andrew Sherwood, and sophomores Anthony Campbell, Andrew Cialino, Sean Lamkin, Pat McCoy, Wayne Nesbit, Marcus Rodriguez, Niko Williams and Randy Wright.

The defensive line will be led by senior Adam Sadowski, who totaled 31 tackles and three tackles for loss from his defensive end spot last season. Looking to join Sadowski in the starting lineup are senior Will Collins and junior Bryan Walwyn. Both players saw action in all 11 games last season, with Collins making four tackles and Walwyn totaling six stops. Also looking to compete for starting spots or play key roles as back-ups along the defensive front will be senior Doug Graiser, junior Rory Glowik and sophomores Alex Carson, Don Matheny and Nicholas MacDonald.

Special Teams

Following the graduation of four-year starters Mike DeSantis and Ryan McManaway, Holy Cross will need to find a new placekicker and punter this season. Junior Matt Partain looks to be the favorite to take over both jobs in spring practice. Partain does have collegiate experience, handling the kickoff duties for the Crusaders during each of the last two seasons, and averaging 55.2 yards per kickoff with two touchbacks in 2006. Junior Kyle DiLella will push Partain for both kicking spots during the spring.

As for kick returners, the Crusaders have a pair of experienced players. Gough has averaged 25.4 yards per kickoff return over the course of his career, and could be one of the nation's top kick returners in 2007. Ryan Maher also has experience as a return man, averaging 22.0 yards on kickoff returns and 6.3 yards on punt returns last season.

Schedule

The 2007 schedule looks to be tough, as it includes four teams which either won or shared their conference title in 2006. The Crusaders will open the season on Sept. 1 with a trip to 2006 Atlantic 10 champion Massachusetts, which advanced to last year's NCAA Division I-AA championship game. After an off week, Holy Cross will then play host to Harvard in its home opener on Sept. 15. The Crusaders stay at home to take on Georgetown in their Patriot League opener on Sept. 22, before facing off with 2006 Ivy League co-champion Yale on Sept. 29, as part of Family Weekend.

Holy Cross hits the road for a contest at Brown on Oct. 6, before returning to Fitton Field to face Dartmouth on Oct. 13. The Crusaders then begin a three-game road trip at 2006 Patriot League co-champion Lehigh on Oct. 20. Holy Cross next travels to Bucknell on Oct. 27, before heading to Fordham on Nov. 3. The Crusaders conclude the 2007 season with a pair of home games, against 2006 Patriot League co-champion Lafayette on Nov. 10, and Colgate on Nov. 17.



2007 Spring Notebook

KEY PLAYERS RETURN FOR HOLY CROSS ON OFFENSE: The Crusaders should have one of the top offenses in the nation during the 2007 campaign, with most of the key skill position players returning from last year's team. Junior quarterback Dominic Randolph will once again lead the offense, after connecting on 184 of 299 attempts for 2,237 yards and 19 touchdowns with just six interceptions in 2006. Four of Randolph's top five targets also return, to give Holy Cross what could be the top group of receivers in the nation. Senior **Ryan Maher** led the Patriot League in receiving last season with 69 catches for 797 yards and six touchdowns, while senior **Thomas Harrison** was second on the team with 46 receptions for 569 yards and four scores. Junior **Brett McDermott** (39 catches for 518 yards and four touchdowns) and junior **Jon Brock** (24 receptions, 257 yards and three scores) are also back to round out the outstanding assortment of receivers. In addition, the Crusaders also return their top two tailbacks from 2006. Junior **Mike Kielt** led the team in rushing last year with 524 yards and six touchdowns on 108 carries, while junior **Terrance Gass** added 450 yards and four scores on 107 rushes. All told, Holy Cross averaged 384.4 yards and 25.0 points per game in 2006, to lead the Patriot League in total offense and rank third in scoring offense.

CRUSADERS RETURN EXPERIENCE IN SECONDARY: Holy Cross will have four experienced players starting in its defensive backfield this fall. Senior **Casey Gough** will man one of the cornerback spots for the fourth straight season, after earning first team All-Patriot League honors in 2006. Gough ranked second on the team with 54 total tackles last season, in addition to leading the team with three interceptions and seven pass breakups. Junior **Kyle Mushaweh** will return for his second season at the other cornerback spot, after totaling 54 tackles and six pass breakups a year ago. Senior **Kent Flanders** will man the strong safety position for the fourth straight season, after recording 37 tackles, an interception and three pass breakups last year. And senior **Obi Green** will return to the starting role he had at free safety during the 2004 and 2005 seasons. Green came off the bench in 2006, and made 11 tackles while breaking up three passes. Last year, the secondary led a Holy Cross defense which gave up just 335.4 yards and 21.4 points per game.

CRUSADERS AMONG PATRIOT LEAGUE LEADERS: Several Holy Cross players finished the 2006 season ranked at or near the top of the Patriot League standings in a number of statistical categories. Quarterback **Dominic Randolph** led the league in passing yards (248.6 yards/game) and total offense (258.4 yards/game), and ranked second in pass efficiency (141.3 rating), while wide receiver **Ryan Maher** led the conference in receptions (6.3 catches/game) and receiving yards (72.5 yards/game), and stood fifth in all-purpose yards (99.3 yards/game). Wide out **Thomas Harrison** ranked third in the league in receptions (4.2 catches/game) and fourth in receiving yards (51.7 yards/game), while wide receiver **Brett McDermott** stood fifth in receptions (3.6 catches/game). In addition, cornerback Casey Gough was fourth in interceptions (0.3 picks/game) and fifth in kickoff returns (21.1 yards/return), placekicker Mike DeSantis ranked fourth in field goals (0.5 made/game) and extra points (94.3 percent), tailback **Mike Kielt** stood fifth in rushing (58.2 yards/game) and wide receiver Matt Fanning was fourth in punt returns (10.4 yards/return). As a team, Holy Cross led the league in total offense (384.4 yards/game), passing offense (271.5 yards/game), pass efficiency defense (108.4 rating) and third down conversions (46.3 percent); while standing second in pass efficiency (137.4 rating), scoring defense (21.4 points/game), passing defense (176.0 yards/game) and kickoff returns (21.3 yards/return); and ranking third in scoring offense (25.0 points/game), turnover margin (+0.4 turnovers/game) and net punting (35.0 yards/punt).

DEFENDING THE HOME TURF: Holy Cross has enjoyed great success at Fitton Field over the years. The Crusaders, who played their first game at Fitton Field in 1903, have posted an all-time home mark of 345-163-27 (.669). Fitton Field is the second-oldest stadium still used for Division I college football, behind only Franklin Field at the University of Pennsylvania (opened in 1895). Holy Cross' best decade at home occurred from 1980-1989, when the Crusaders recorded a 41-12-1 mark. In the current decade, the Crusaders have posted a record of 17-21 at home, with a 3-2 record in 2006. Last year, Holy Cross posted its first winning record at home since the 2001 team went 3-2.

Head Coach Tom Gilmore



Tom Gilmore is now in his fourth season as the head football coach at the College of the Holy Cross. The Crusaders have gone 16-12 over their past 28 games under Gilmore's leadership, and enter 2007 looking to contend for the Patriot League title, after showing constant improvement throughout the last three seasons.

In 2006, Gilmore was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year, after his squad posted an overall record of 7-4, while finishing just a game out of first place in the conference at 4-2. The Crusaders nearly tied for the league title, as they suffered a one-point loss at Colgate in the season finale.

Gilmore led Holy Cross to its best overall record and its best league mark since the 2000 team also went 7-4 overall and 4-2 in the conference. The Crusaders also led the Patriot League in several statistical categories, including total offense (384.4 yards per game), passing offense (271.5 yards per game), pass efficiency defense (108.4 rating), first downs (239) and third down conversions (46.3 percent). In addition, seven members of Gilmore's team earned All-Patriot League honors.

During the 2005 campaign, Gilmore led the Crusaders to an overall mark of 6-5 and a fourth place finish in the Patriot League with a 3-3 mark in conference games. In addition, Gilmore's team posted a 13-10 road victory over 10th-ranked Lehigh, good for the school's first win against a ranked opponent since the 2000 season. Following the conclusion of the 2005 campaign, seven Crusaders earned All-Patriot League honors, with tailback / kick returner Steve Silva being named a consensus first team All-American, and earning National Special Teams Player of the Year honors from *Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette*. Gilmore's 2005 team also led the Patriot League in turnover margin (+1.0 turnovers per game), kickoff returns (23.4 yards per return), punt returns (16.0 yards per return) and red zone efficiency (scoring on 90.5 percent of its possessions).

In 2004, Gilmore's first Holy Cross squad finished with an overall record of 3-8, rebounding from an 0-5 start to win three of their final six games. The Crusaders tripled the team's win total from the year prior to his arrival, and finished among the Patriot League leaders in both kickoff returns (first, 23.7 yards per return) and passing offense (second, 207.3 yards per game).

Gilmore was introduced as the 27th head football coach in Holy Cross history on January 8, 2004, after serving as defensive coordinator at Lehigh University for the previous four seasons. In 2003, he shaped the Lehigh defense into one of the top defenses in all of Division I-AA football. The Mountain Hawks were ranked at the top of the Patriot League in several categories, including scoring defense (first, 16.8 points per game), sacks (first, 34 for a loss of 177 yards), rushing defense (second, 126.2 yards per game), total defense (second, 304.9 yards per game) and pass defense (third, 178.7 yards per game). Lehigh also led the conference and ranked among the national leaders in first downs allowed (just 16 per game) and third down defense (23.8 percent conversions allowed).

In 2001, Gilmore was named the American Football Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year, after molding a young and inexperienced defense into a unit that allowed just 15.8 points per game and 86.6 rushing yards per game. The Mountain Hawks ranked fifth in the nation in rushing yards allowed and 12th in the nation in points allowed that season. Lehigh also ranked 19th in the nation in total defense (295.0) and fifth in

turnover margin (+1.30). Three of his players were named to the 2001 All-Patriot League team, including Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year Abdul Byron.

In his first season at the helm of the Lehigh defense, Gilmore helped the Mountain Hawks rank sixth in the nation in scoring defense (14.5 points per game), and fifth in both rushing defense (98.0 yards per game) and turnover margin (+1.45 per game). In addition, the team ranked fourth in the nation in interceptions (22) and scored five defensive touchdowns.

Prior to his time at Lehigh, Gilmore coached at Dartmouth College for eight seasons. While at Dartmouth, he served as offensive line coach, linebackers coach and defensive coordinator. He helped the Big Green to two Ivy League titles, and in the 1996 season, Dartmouth finished the year ranked 17th in the nation after posting a perfect 10-0 mark. Gilmore also helped Dartmouth to a 22-game unbeaten streak from 1995-1997, which still ranks as the third-longest unbeaten streak in Division I-AA history. In addition, Gilmore coached a team of Ivy League All-Stars at the 1996 Epsom Ivy Bowl in Osaka, Japan.

As Dartmouth's defensive coordinator during the 1997 season, he led one of the best defensive units in the school's recent history. The Big Green ranked second in the nation in rushing defense, allowing just 77.3 yards per game and 2.3 yards per carry. Dartmouth also allowed just 16.5 points per game in 1997, while recording 40 quarterback sacks, 57 tackles for loss and 17 interceptions in 10 games. Gilmore's defense also scored four touchdowns that season, two of which were game-winning scores.

Gilmore began his coaching career as an assistant defensive line coach at the University of Pennsylvania in 1986. From 1987-1989 he served as the defensive line and outside linebackers coach at Columbia, before returning to Penn in 1990. He coached the Quakers offensive line for two seasons before heading north to Dartmouth.

An Academic All-American at Pennsylvania, Gilmore graduated in 1986 with a bachelor's degree in computer mathematics. He helped lead the Quakers to four consecutive Ivy League titles, while earning All-America honors during his junior and senior years. As a senior in 1985, Gilmore received the Asa S. Bushnell Cup as the Ivy League Player of the Year, and he remains one of only two linemen to have ever claimed the award. He also earned the George A. Munger Award as the team's Most Valuable Player, and the Class of 1917 Award as Penn's top scholar athlete.

During his playing days, Gilmore set school career records for both quarterback sacks and tackles for loss, while being named National Player of the Week by Sports Illustrated following the final game of his career against Dartmouth. He was also named one of 11 National Scholar Athletes by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame in 1985. After graduating from Penn, Gilmore signed with the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League, where he played that summer at outside linebacker.

Born September 25, 1964, Gilmore and his wife, Joan, reside in Shrewsbury, Mass., with their two children, Sarah and John.

Casey Gough recorded six solo tackles, four tackles for loss, a quarterback sack and a key interception to lead the Holy Cross football team to a 28-21 victory over Fordham on Homecoming Weekend. Game #6 • Holy Cross 35, Brown 30

Dominic Randolph completed 30 of 39 passes for 329 yards and four touchdowns, to lead Holy Cross to a 35-30 victory over Brown at Fitton Field. Randolph set career highs for passing yards, completions and touchdown passes, with the most passing yards by a Crusader since 2002. The Leopards scored on their first two possessions to take an early 14-0 lead, with Maurice White (21 yards) and Brad Maurer (one yard) both running for touchdowns. The Crusaders put their first points on the board late in the opening quarter, as Randolph rushed one yard for a touchdown. In the second quarter, the Leopards went up 21-7 on a one-yard touchdown run by Jonathan Hurt. But before halftime, Holy Cross cut the lead to seven points on a seven-yard touchdown pass from Randolph to Jon Brock. The Crusaders tied the score at 21-21 midway through the third quarter, on a 14-yard touchdown pass from Randolph to Ryan Maher. But Lafayette regained the lead on its next possession, with Hurt running 31 yards for his second touchdown of the game. Early in the fourth quarter, Holy Cross tied the score at 28-28 as Randolph and Maher hooked up once again, this time for a seven-yard touchdown pass. On the ensuing kickoff return, Randy Wright forced a fumble by Lafayette's Tim Watson, which was recovered by Sean Lamkin at the 29-yard line. Five plays later, Randolph threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Brock to give the Crusaders their first lead of the day, 35-28. With 1:31 remaining in the game, Mike DeSantis hit a 20-yard field goal to put the game out of reach, making the final score 38-28. Maher finished the game with nine catches for 97 yards and two touchdowns, while Brock totaled six receptions for 79 yards and two scores.

Dominic Randolph threw for 309 yards and a pair of touchdowns, but it was not enough as Holy Cross was defeated 28-14 by Lehigh in a driving rain storm at Fitton Field. Lehigh's Marques Thompson rushed 30 times for 141 yards on the day, and received the Dr. Edward N. Anderson Award as the most outstanding player of the Family Weekend game. The Mountain Hawks jumped out to an early 7-0 lead, when Matt McGowan rushed two yards for a touchdown to cap a 16-play, 69-yard drive. Lehigh then increased its lead to 14-0 before the end of the first quarter, when Julian Anderson recovered a fumble and returned it 21 yards for a score. The Crusaders made the score 14-7 early in the second quarter, when Randolph threw a 53-yard touchdown pass to Thomas Harrison. But later in the quarter, McGowan scored two more touchdowns, on runs of three yards and one yard, to put the Mountain Hawks up 28-7. With just 36 seconds remaining in the second quarter, the game was delayed for approximately 45 minutes, due to lightning in the area. In the second half, Holy Cross scored the only other points of the game at the 5:16-mark of the fourth quarter, on a 19-yard touchdown pass from Randolph to Ryan Maher. Maher finished the game with eight catches for 102 yards and a touchdown, while Harrison added six receptions for 91 yards and a score. Defensively, Dan Adams led Holy Cross with 14 total tackles, while Casey Gough added seven tackles. Daynin Blake had a team-high seven tackles for Lehigh.

Game #10 • Holy Cross 27, Bucknell 10

November 4, 2006 • Worcester, Mass.

Mike Kielt rushed for a career-high 149 yards and two touchdowns, to lead Holy Cross to a 27-10 victory over Bucknell at Fitton Field on Senior Day. Dominic Randolph also had a big day, throwing for 277 yards and a pair of touchdowns. The Crusaders opened the scoring at the 8:31-mark of the first quarter, on a four-yard run by Kielt. With just 19 seconds left in the first quarter, Mark Kelliher recovered a fumble at the Bucknell 29-yard line, to put the Crusaders back in position to score. Holy Cross increased its lead to 14-0 on the next play, when Randolph found Brett McDermott in the end zone for a 29-yard touchdown pass. Bucknell scored the only points of the second quarter on a Will Carney 30-yard field goal, as Holy Cross led 14-3 going into the break. Holy Cross continued to dominate play in the second half, and would go up 20-3 on a 17-yard touchdown pass from Randolph to Matt Fanning, which was set up by a 56-yard run from Kielt. Bucknell responded with a score of its own on a 24-yard run by Josh DeStefano to make the score 20-10, but that would be as close as the Bison would get. Kielt finished off the scoring with a five-yard touchdown run, capping an eight-play, 68-yard drive. Ryan Maher finished the game with eight catches for 129 yards, while McDermott added two receptions for 48 yards and a score. Defensively, Dan Adams led Holy Cross with 13 total tackles, including two tackles for loss, while John Markus Pinard added seven tackles. Dorian Petersen had a team-high 14 tackles for Bucknell. With the win, the Crusaders posted their seventh overall victory and their fourth conference win, their best marks in both categories since 2000.

Game #11 • Colgate 29, Holy Cross 28

November 11, 2006 • Hamilton, N.Y.

Mike Kielt ran 15 times for 83 yards and a pair of touchdowns, but it was not enough as Holy Cross was defeated by Colgate 29-28 at Andy Kerr Stadium. After a scoreless first quarter, Colgate drove into Holy Cross territory, before Casey Gough forced a fumble, which Adam Sadowski recovered at the seven-yard line. The Crusaders then marched 93 yards on seven plays, with Matt Fanning catching a 35-yard touchdown pass from Dominic Randolph to make the score 7-0. The Raiders had the ball in Holy Cross territory again, before Chris Nielsen knocked the ball from the hand of Mike Saraceno, and Dan Adams recovered at the 30-yard line. The Crusaders would convert on the turnover once again, as Randolph threw a 13-yard scoring pass to Justin Maher. But before the end of the half, Colgate made the score 14-8, as Saraceno threw a five-yard touchdown pass to Ty Henry, then Jordan Scott ran for the two-point conversion. Holy Cross increased its lead to 21-8 early in the third quarter on a 10-yard touchdown run by Kielt, before the Raiders came back with a 56-yard touchdown pass from Saraceno to Erik Burke. Brian Billman then recovered a fumble on the Colgate four-yard line, setting up a four-yard touchdown run from Kielt. But on the opening play of the fourth quarter, Saraceno ran 23 yards for a touchdown to make the score 28-22. The Raiders then took the lead with 8:25 left in the fourth quarter, when Scott ran three yards for a touchdown. Holy Cross had one last chance to win the game, but Mike DeSantis' 30-yard field goal attempt was blocked with 5:36 left. Randolph completed 18 of 42 passes for 268 yards on the day, while Fanning had a team-best four catches for 81 yards. Saraceno led Colgate by hitting on 19 of 31 passes for 289 yards, in addition to running for 17 yards. Defensively, Adams totaled 11 tackles, two tackles for loss, a fumble recovery and an interception, while Kyle Mushaweh added 15 tackles and a pass breakup.
