2008 Spring Preview

After posting overall records of 7-4 and 4-2 marks in the Patriot League during both the 2006 and 2007 seasons, the Holy Cross football team has high hopes as it prepares for the 2008 campaign during spring practice. The team has shown constant improvement during its four years under the direction of head coach Tom Gilmore, and has now finished with a winning record during each of the last three seasons. This fall, the Crusaders will look to win their first Patriot League title since 1991.

On the offensive side of the ball, Holy Cross returns eight starters and 17 of the 22 players on last season's final two-deep chart. That group will look to build on the success which they had a year ago, when they led the conference in scoring offense (35.9 points per game), total offense (463.4 yards per game) and passing offense (335.2 yards per game). With all of this experience returning, Holy Cross should once again have one of the top offenses in the nation this season.

As for the defense, the Crusaders have five starters back from a unit which will look to become one of the better defenses in the Patriot League. Holy Cross allowed 24.0 points and 373.4 yards per game in 2007, and will look to improve upon those numbers with a number of talented young players ready to break into the lineup. The strength of the defense could come from the linebackers, where three of four starters return from 2007.

Here is a position-by-position breakdown of how the Crusaders should look in 2008.

Offense

The Holy Cross offense will be led by senior quarterback Dominic Randolph, who earned Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year honors and finished 12th in the voting for the Walter Payton Award last season. In 2007, Randolph completed 297 of 482 attempts for 3,604 yards and 30 touchdowns with just eight interceptions. He set school single season records for completions and total offense (3,741 yards), and ranked second in the nation in passing yards, total offense and completions. This fall, Randolph will be one of the favorites to win the Walter Payton Award, after he finished higher in last year's voting than any other returning quarterback in the nation. A number of players will compete for the backup job behind Randolph, including juniors Joe Kosich and Taylor Glor, and sophomores Rob Koster and Ryan Taggart.

Randolph should have a number of excellent targets to hit, as Holy Cross returns two of its starting wide receivers from last season. Leading the way is senior Brett McDermott, who totaled 56 catches for 727 yards and five touchdowns last season. Senior Jon Brock is also coming off a strong year in 2007, when he totaled 45 receptions for 537 yards and two scores. Sophomore Josh Jenkins could also become one of the team's top receivers, following a freshman season in which he made six catches for 52 yards, while juniors Bill Edger and Mike Frawley and sophomore Luke Chmielinski will all play major roles off the bench. Seniors Danny Bluth, Tommy Flemming and Joe Strzempka; junior Nick Cole; and sophomores Freddie Santana, Rob Turner and Kyle Van Wygerden will also look to earn playing time.

At tight end, senior Ryan McGuire returns as a fifth-year senior after earning first team All-Patriot League honors in 2007. Last season, McGuire totaled 12 receptions for 113 yards and a touchdown. Senior Kevin Golden should play a key role as McGuire's backup, while senior Nate Langelier and juniors Mike Argillander, Paul Nielsen and Josh Nims will also look to contribute.

The Crusaders look to be strong in the offensive backfield as well, with the return of seniors Terrance Gass and Mike Kielt at tailback. Gass started 10 games last season, and was selected second team All-Patriot League. He led the team in rushing with 563 yards and six touchdowns on 101 carries, while posting 27 receptions for 318 yards and four touch-

downs. Kielt ranked second on the team in rushing last season with 367 yards and six touchdowns on 73 carries, in addition to catching 16 passes for 150 yards. Junior Matt Jackson and sophomore Drew Volkman will also look to earn playing time.

In addition to all of the talent returning at the skill positions, the Crusaders return four out of five starters on the offensive line. Last year, the line paved the way for Holy Cross to average 463.4 yards of total offense and 35.9 points per contest. The Crusaders also allowed just 14 sacks during the 2007 season, while the team attempted 497 passes (just one sack for every 36.5 times the team dropped back to pass). Leading Holy Cross this season will be four players who started all 11 games during the 2007 campaign. Senior Chris Smith will be back for his third year as the starting center, while senior Chris Poole and junior Aaron Jones return as the starting guards, and senior Mason Olson is back as the starting left tackle. Sophomore Mike McCabe, who played in all 11 games off the bench last season, looks to take over as the fifth starter at right tackle. A number of others will look to compete for playing time, including seniors Luke Botting, R.J. Buchholz and David Gang; juniors Matt Brady, Chris Fucillo, Justin Johnson, Rob Petrosino and Brandt Tierney; and sophomores Mike Bernazzani, Graham Gawryszewski and Scott Wise.

Defense

The linebackers looks to be a strength for Holy Cross, with three out of four starters returning. Junior Marcus Rodriguez is back at one of the inside linebacker spots, after leading the team with 69 tackles in 2007, despite missing two games due to injury. Senior Ryan Stewart returns as the other starter on the inside, after ranking second on the team with 65 tackles last season, while posting six tackles for loss and three pass breakups. Senior Brian Billman and junior Andrew Cialino should also see a good deal of time off the bench at inside linebacker. On the outside, senior Evan Byrd will be back in the starting lineup, following a 2007 campaign in which he posted 27 tackles, six tackles for loss and three sacks. Junior Sean Lamkin is the favorite to take over as the other starter on the outside, after recording 22 tackles and four tackles for loss off the bench a year ago. Juniors Anthony Campbell and Niko Williams should also play key roles off the bench at outside linebacker. Other players who will push for playing time include senior Andrew Sherwood, junior Wayne Nesbit, and sophomores Brian Mauthe, James McLaughlin, Rory Sullivan and Perry Townsend.

The secondary needs to replace three starters, but has a number of talented young players ready to step up. At one cornerback spot, senior Kyle Mushaweh will be in his third season as a starter. Mushaweh totaled 57 tackles and five pass breakups last fall, while tying for the team lead with four interceptions. Sophomore Anthony DiMichele, who made six

tackles off the bench in 2007, will look to take over as the other starting cornerback. Juniors John Myrick (nine tackles in 2007) and Michael Wright (nine tackles in 2007) will also compete for starting roles. At strong safety, senior Daryl Brown will take over as a starter, after totaling 36 tackles and two interceptions as the first defensive back off the bench last season. Playing alongside Brown at free safety will be sophomore Alex Johnson, who posted five tackles and an interception as a reserve a year ago. Junior Pat Haidon and sophomore Kyle Smith should also be key factors at safety. Others competing for playing time in the defensive backfield will be seniors Mike Holloway and Ty Shaw; juniors Dakota Allosso, Jachin Leatherman and Quentin Liggins; and sophomore D.J. Kernisant.

The defensive line will be led by senior Bryan Walwyn, who returns as a starter at one defensive end spot. Last season, Walwyn recorded 31 tackles and tied for the team lead with four sacks. Junior Nicholas MacDonald will look to take over as the other starting defensive end, after posting 13 tackles and two sacks as a reserve in 2007. Sophomores Mude Ohimor and Kevin Regan should also play key roles as backups at defensive end. Junior Alex Carson returns as the starter at nose tackle, after recording 22 tackles a year ago. He will be pushed for the starting spot by junior Don Matheney, who started the first three games in 2007 before suffering a season-ending injury. Also looking to compete for playing time along the defensive front will be seniors Steve Buller and Rory Glowik, and sophomores Matt Ferrel, Marcus Morgan and Anthony Ruoti.

Special Teams

The Crusaders look to be solid in the kicking game with the return of their top placekicker and punter. Senior placekicker Matt Partain earned first team All-Patriot honors last year, after leading all kickers in the conference with 86 points scored. He connected on 12 of 16 field goal attempts in 2007, including a school record 49-yarder, in addition to hitting all 50 of his extra point attempts.

Holloway is back as the team's top punter, after averaging 37.5 yards on 42 kicks a year ago. Holloway dropped nine punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line, while booting a long punt of 73 yards. Senior Kyle DiLella and sophomores Rob Dornfried and Don Lemieux look to push both Partain and Holloway for playing time.

As for kick returners, the Crusaders have a number of experienced players. Jenkins led the team by averaging 8.0 yards on 28 punt returns last season, in addition to posting a 20.1 yard average on 10 kickoff returns. McDermott and Mushaweh have also shown outstanding ability as kickoff returners. McDermott averaged 24.8 yards on 12 returns last year, while Mushaweh brought back seven kicks for an average of 17.0 yards in 2007.

Schedule

The 2008 schedule looks to be tough, as it includes six contests against schools which won at least seven games in 2007. The Crusaders open the season on Sept. 6 at home against 2007 Colonial Athletic Association co-champion Massachusetts, which advanced to last year's NCAA quarterfinals. After an off week, Holy Cross will travel to 2007 Ivy League champion Harvard on Sept. 20. The Crusaders stay on the road to take on Georgetown in their Patriot League opener on Sept. 27, before heading to Yale on Oct. 4.

Holy Cross returns to Fitton Field to face Brown on Oct. 11, before traveling to Dartmouth on Oct. 18. The Crusaders then begin a three-game homestand against Lehigh, as part of Family Weekend on Oct. 25. Holy Cross next plays host to Bucknell on Nov. 1, before facing 2007 Patriot League champion Fordham on Nov. 8. The Crusaders conclude the 2008 season with a pair of road games, at Lafayette on Nov. 15, and at Colgate on Nov. 22.

CRUSADERS REACH SEVEN WINS FOR SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR:

With its 27-20 victory over Colgate in the 2007 season finale, Holy Cross reached the seven win-mark for the second year in a row. The Crusaders' 14-8 mark in 2006 and 2007 combined is also their best in a two-year span since the 1991 and 1992 squads went a combined 17-5. In addition, Holy Cross has also posted a winning record in each of the last three seasons, going 6-5 in 2005, 7-4 in 2006 and 7-4 in 2007. This marks the best three-year stretch by the Crusaders in 15 years (9-1-1 in 1990, 11-0 in 1991 and 6-5 in 1992).

OFFENSE PUTS UP POINTS: Holy Cross enjoyed one of the best offensive seasons in recent history during the 2007 campaign. In 11 games played, the Crusaders averaged 35.9 points and 463.4 yards per game. The 35.9 points per game are the best mark since the 1989 squad averaged 36.0 points per contest, while the 463.4 yards are the school's best since the 1991 team averaged 467.1 yards per contest. Holy Cross also scored over 40 points five times this year, including four consecutive games from October 6-27. Prior to that, the Crusaders had not scored 40 points in four straight contests since the 1991 season, when they did it against Brown (42-28), Lehigh (43-42), Lafayette (48-14) and Bucknell (42-6). The school record for most consecutive 40 points games is nine, set in 1987.

CRUSADERS AMONG PATRIOT LEAGUE LEADERS: Several Holy Cross players ranked at or near the top of the Patriot League standings in a number of statistical categories, at the end of the 2007 season. Quarterback **Dominic Randolph** led the league in passing yards (327.6 yards/game), total offense (340.1 yards/game) and pass efficiency (141.6 rating). Wide out **Ryan Maher** led in the league in receptions (6.8 catches/game) and receiving yards (82.5 yards/game), while standing third in scoring (6.0 points/game). Wide receiver **Thomas Harrison** ranked third in the conference in both receiving yards (72.3 yards/game) and receptions (5.1 catches/game), while wide receiver **Brett McDermott** was third in the conference receptions (5.1 catches/game) and fourth in receiving yards (66.1 yards/game). In addition, placekicker **Matt Partain** ranked first in extra points (100.0 percent), first in field goals (1.1 made/game) and second in scoring (7.8 points/game); cornerback **Casey Gough** stood first in interceptions (0.4 picks/game) and second in kickoff returns (24.8 yards/return); cornerback **Kyle Mushaweh** was first in interceptions (0.3 picks/game); tailback **Terrance Gass** ranked fourth in both rushing (51.2 yards/game) and scoring (5.5 points/game); wide out **Josh Jenkins** was fourth in punt returns (8.0 yards/return); and wide receiver **Jon Brock** stood fifth in receptions (4.1 catches/game). As a team, Holy Cross led the league in total offense (463.4 yards/game), scoring offense (35.9 points/game), passing offense (335.2 yards/game), turnover margin (+1.0 turnovers/game) and pass efficiency (140.0 rating); while standing second in pass defense (183.8 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (117.0 rating); and ranking third in kickoff returns (21.4 yards/return).

DEFENDING THE HOME TURF: Holy Cross has enjoyed great success at Fitton Field over the years. The Crusaders, who played their first game at Fitton Field in 1903, have posted an all-time home mark of 349-165-27 (.670). Fitton Field is the second-oldest stadium still used for Division I college football, behind only Franklin Field at the University of Pennsylvania (opened in 1895). Holy Cross' best decade at home occurred from 1980-1989, when the Crusaders recorded a 41-12-1 mark. In the current decade, the Crusaders have posted a record of 21-23 at home, with a 4-2 mark in 2007. This season, Holy Cross posted a winning record at home for the second straight year, after going 3-2 at Fitton Field in 2006.

TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE: The 2008 campaign will mark the 113th season of Holy Cross football. The Crusaders will enter the year with an overall record of 576-462-54, good for a .552 winning percentage. Prior to the start of the 2007 season, Holy Cross' 569 all-time victories ranked as the 15th most among all Division I-AA schools. Holy Cross has had 31 first team All-America selections, sent 69 players on to professional football, won five Lambert Cups, claimed five Patriot League championships, and was named the Division I-AA Team of the Year in 1987. The Crusaders also played in the 1946 Orange Bowl, losing to host Miami on the game's final play.

Head Coach Tom Gilmore



Tom Gilmore is now in his fifth season as the head football coach at the College of the Holy Cross. The Crusaders have gone 23-16 over their past 39 games under Gilmore's leadership, and enter 2008 looking to contend for the Patriot League title, after finishing just one game out of first place in each of the last two seasons.

During the 2007 campaign, Gilmore led Holy Cross to an overall mark of 7-4, while placing second in the Patriot League at 4-2. The Crusaders led the conference in in total offense (463.4 yards/game), scoring offense (35.9 points/game), passing offense (335.2 yards/

game), turnover margin (+1.0 turnovers/game) and pass efficiency (140.0 rating), while standing second in pass defense (183.8 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (117.0 rating). Seven of Gilmore's players earned all-conference honors in 2007, including Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and Walter Payton Award finalist Dominic Randolph.

In 2006, Gilmore was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year, after his squad posted an overall record of 7-4, while finishing just a game out of first place in the conference at 4-2. The Crusaders nearly tied for the league title, as they suffered a one-point loss at Colgate in the season finale. Holy Cross also led the Patriot League in several statistical categories, including total offense (384.4 yards per game), passing offense (271.5 yards per game), pass efficiency defense (108.4 rating), first downs (239) and third down conversions (46.3 percent). In addition, seven members of Gilmore's team earned All-Patriot League honors.

During the 2005 campaign, Gilmore led the Crusaders to an overall record of 6-5 and a fourth place finish in the Patriot League with a 3-3 mark in conference games. In addition, Gilmore's team posted a 13-10 road victory over 10th-ranked Lehigh, good for the school's first win against a ranked opponent since the 2000 season. Following the conclusion of the 2005 campaign, seven Crusaders earned All-Patriot League honors, with tailback / kick returner Steve Silva being named a consensus first team All-American, and earning National Special Teams Player of the Year honors from *Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette*. Gilmore's 2005 team also led the Patriot League in turnover margin (+1.0 turnovers per game), kickoff returns (23.4 yards per return), punt returns (16.0 yards per return) and red zone efficiency (scoring 90.5 percent of the time).

In 2004, Gilmore's first Holy Cross squad finished with an overall record of 3-8, rebounding from an 0-5 start to win three of their final six games. The Crusaders tripled the team's win total from the year prior to his arrival, and finished among the Patriot League leaders in both kickoff returns (first, 23.7 yards per return) and passing offense (second, 207.3 yards per game).

Gilmore was introduced as the 27th head football coach in Holy Cross history on January 8, 2004, after serving as defensive coordinator at Lehigh University for the previous four seasons. During his time with the Mountain Hawks, he helped lead the team to an overall record of 39-9, two undefeated regular seasons, two Patriot League championships and two trips to the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs. Gilmore also helped Lehigh to first round playoff victories in both 2000 and 2001, with the Mountain Hawks winning the 2001 Lambert Cup.

In 2003, he shaped the Lehigh defense into one of the top defenses in all of Division I-AA football. The Mountain Hawks were ranked at the top of the Patriot League in several categories, including scoring defense (first, 16.8 points per game), sacks (first, 34 for a loss of 177 yards), rushing defense (second, 126.2 yards per game), total defense (second, 304.9 yards per game) and pass defense (third, 178.7 yards per game). Lehigh also led the conference and ranked among the national leaders in first downs allowed (just 16 per game) and third down defense (23.8 percent conversions allowed).

In 2001, Gilmore was named the American Football Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year, after molding a young and inexperienced defense into a unit that allowed just 15.8 points per game and 86.6 rushing yards per game. The Mountain Hawks ranked fifth in the nation in rushing yards allowed and 12th in the nation in points allowed that season. Lehigh also ranked 19th in the nation in total defense (295.0) and fifth in turnover margin (+1.30). Three of his players were named to the 2001 All-Patriot League team, including Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year Abdul Byron.

In his first season at the helm of the Lehigh defense, Gilmore helped the Mountain Hawks rank sixth in the nation in scoring defense (14.5 points per game), and fifth in both rushing defense (98.0 yards per game) and turnover margin (+1.45 per game). In addition, the team ranked fourth in the nation in interceptions (22) and scored five defensive touchdowns.

Prior to his time at Lehigh, Gilmore coached at Dartmouth College for eight seasons. While at Dartmouth, he served as offensive line coach, linebackers coach and defensive coordinator. He helped the Big Green to two Ivy League titles, and in the 1996 season, Dartmouth finished the year ranked 17th in the nation after posting a perfect 10-0 mark. Gilmore also helped Dartmouth to a 22-game unbeaten streak from 1995-1997, which still ranks as the third-longest unbeaten streak in Division I-AA history. In addition, Gilmore coached a team of Ivy League All-Stars at the 1996 Epsom Ivy Bowl in Osaka, Japan.

As Dartmouth's defensive coordinator during the 1997 season, he led one of the best defensive units in the school's recent history. The Big Green ranked second in the nation in rushing defense, allowing just 77.3 yards per game and 2.3 yards per carry. Dartmouth also allowed just 16.5 points per game in 1997, while recording 40 quarterback sacks, 57 tackles for loss and 17 interceptions in 10 games. Gilmore's defense also scored four touchdowns that season, two of which were game-winning scores.

Gilmore began his coaching career as an assistant defensive line coach at the University of Pennsylvania in 1986. From 1987-1989 he served as the defensive line and outside linebackers coach at Columbia, before returning to Penn in 1990. He coached the Quakers offensive line for two seasons before heading north to Dartmouth.

#3 UMass 40, Holy Cross 30

September 1, 2007 • Amherst, Mass.

Dominic Randolph threw for two touchdown passes and set a school record with 62 passing attempts, but it was not enough as Holy Cross fell to No. 3 UMass 40-30 at Warren McGuirk Alumni Stadium. Randolph completed 32 passes and threw for 296 yards, in addition to rushing for a touchdown. UMass started off the scoring with a 48-yard field goal by Chris Koeplin, then extended its lead to 10-0 when Matt Lawrence scored on a one-yard run. The Crusaders answered back early in the second quarter, when Terrance Gass scored on a two-yard run. But Courtney Robinson returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown, then Liam Coen threw a six-yard scoring pass to Joe Sanford to make the score 23-7. The Crusaders would record a safety following a bad snap on a punt attempt, before the Minutemen concluded the first half scoring when Lawrence scored on a 28-yard run to take a 30-9 lead into the locker room. UMass made the score 37-9 early in the third quarter on a 28-yard touchdown pass from Coen to J.J. Moore, before the Crusader offense came to life. Randolph would score on a one-yard run and throw a 23-yard touchdown pass to Justin Maher to make the score 37-23 at the end of the third quarter. Randolph then connected with Thomas Harrison for a four-yard score to cut the lead to seven points, but Holy Cross was unable to move the ball on its next possession. UMass added a late field goal to conclude the scoring.

Holy Cross 31, Harvard 28

September 15, 2007 • Worcester, Mass.

Dominic Randolph threw a 40-yard touchdown pass to Thomas Harrison with 19 second remaining in the fourth quarter, to lead Holy Cross to a 31-28 victory over Harvard at Fitton Field. Randolph completed 29 of 55 passes on the day for 339 yards and four touchdowns, and received the Johnny Turco Memorial Trophy as the most valuable player of Holy Cross' Homecoming game. After a scoreless first quarter, Harvard jumped out to a 14-0 lead, as Matt Lagace caught a 35-yard touchdown pass from Liam O'Hagan, then O'Hagan scored on a one-yard run. Holy Cross responded with a 10-yard scoring pass from Randolph to Brett McDermott, and added a 26-yard field goal by Matt Partain on the final play of the quarter, to make the score 14-10 at the break. The Crusaders then took the second half kickoff and marched right back down the field, with Randolph throwing a 22-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Maher, putting Holy Cross in front 17-14. Later in the quarter, Randolph hit Jon Brock with a 14-yard scoring strike, to increase the Crusader lead to 24-14. Harvard refused to go away, as O'Hagan tossed a four-yard touchdown pass to Corey Mazza, then Cheng Ho scored on a 47-yard run, putting the Crimson back in front 28-24 with 12:10 left in the fourth quarter. But the Crusader defense stiffened, forcing Harvard to punt on its next three possessions, giving Holy Cross one last chance from its own 23-yard line with 1:19 remaining. The Crusaders then marched 77 yards in six plays, with Harrison's catch concluding the scoring. Mark Kelliher led the Holy Cross defense with seven total tackles and one tackle for loss, while Glenn Dorris had seven tackles, a sack and an interception for Harvard.

#22 Yale 38, Holy Cross 17

September 29, 2007 • Worcester, Mass.

Yale's Mike McLeod rushed 40 times for 256 yards and five touchdowns, to lead the 22nd-ranked Bulldogs to a 38-17 victory over Holy Cross at Fitton Field. Following the contest, McLeod received the Dr. Edward N. Anderson Award as the most valuable player of the Crusaders' Family Weekend game. The Bulldogs opened the scoring with a 36-yard field goal by Alan Kimball at the 8:55-mark on the first quarter, after an interception gave Yale possession at the Holy Cross 21-yard line. Later in the quarter, McLeod scored on a three-yard run to make the score 10-0. Early in the second quarter, Casey Gough intercepted a pass and returned it 21 yards to the Yale 17-yard line, setting up a 40-yard field goal by Matt Partain. McLeod then began to dominate the game, scoring on runs of one-yard, 23 yards and one yard to make the score 31-3 late in the second quarter. The Crusaders were able to cut the lead to 31-10 before halftime, marching 65 yards in just 51 seconds as Dominic Randolph tossed a 14-yard touchdown pass to Brett McDermott. The only points of the third quarter came on McLeod's fifth touchdown of the day, a 23-yard run after the Bulldogs converted a fake punt, making the score 38-10. Holy Cross made the score 38-17 early in the fourth quarter on a two-yard run by Mike Kielt. The Crusaders would threaten again a few minutes later after Daryl Brown blocked a punt, which he then recovered at the Yale 11-yard line. Holy Cross 45, Bucknell 21

October 27, 2007 • Lewisburg, Pa.

Terrance Gass accounted for 195 yards from scrimmage and two touchdowns, to lead Holy Cross to a 45-21 victory over Bucknell at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. Gass rushed 12 times for 125 yards and a touchdown, in addition to catching three passes for 70 yards and a score. The Crusaders opened the scoring on their first possession of the game with a 13-yard touchdown run by Ryan Maher. Following a fumble recovery by Alex Carson, Mike Kielt added a one-yard scoring run. Later in the first quarter, Dominic Randolph threw a 47-yard touchdown pass to Gass, giving Holy Cross a 21-0 lead. Bucknell then put its first points on the board, with Marcello Trigg throwing a 16-yard touchdown pass to A.J. Kizekai to make the score 21-7 at the end of the first quarter. Randolph threw his second touchdown pass of the day early in the second quarter, with a 16-yard strike to Thomas Harrison. Gass then added a five-yard scoring run, to give Holy Cross a 35-7 halftime lead. The Bison cut into the lead with an 11-yard touchdown run by Trigg early in the third quarter, but the Crusaders came right back with a five-yard scoring pass from Randolph to Maher. Dominic Randolph threw for 309 yards and three touchdowns, but it was not enough as Holy Cross was defeated by Fordham 24-21 at Jack Coffey Field. Randolph completed 32 of 53 passes on the day and also rushed for 26 yards on five carries, to finish with 335 yards of total offense. Fordham opened the scoring at the 12:38-mark of the first quarter, when Jonte Coven ran 61 yards for a touchdown. The Rams then increased their lead to 14-0 late in the first quarter on a 26-yard scoring pass from John Skelton to Cody Kritzer. The Crusaders scored their first points midway through the second quarter, when Randolph tossed a 30-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Maher, and trailed 14-7 at halftime. The Rams built their lead back up to 14 points in the third quarter, when James Crockett recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown. But Holy Cross came right back with a 19-yard scoring pass from Randolph to Brett McDermott. Midway through the fourth quarter, Adam Danko kicked a 32-yard field goal to put Fordham up 24-14. The Crusaders then marched right back down the field, with Randolph tossing a two-yard touchdown pass to McDermott to cut the lead down to three points. But Holy Cross was not able to score again when it got the ball back with 1:26 left in the game, and Fordham held on for the win. McDermott caught a game-high nine passes for 106 yards, while Jon Brock added seven receptions for 61 yards. Coven led Fordham by rushing for 167 yards on 29 carries. Defensively, Marcus Rodriguez led Holy Cross with 15 tackles, while Casey Gough added eight tackles, an interception and a pass breakup, and Evan Byrd totaled two sacks with a forced fumble. Crockett had seven tackles, an interception and a fumble recovery for the Rams.

Dominic Randolph threw for 247 yards and accounted for two touchdowns, but it was not enough as Holy Cross was defeated by Lafayette 31-21 at Fitton Field. Randolph completed 26 of 47 passes on the day, while throwing for a score and rushing for a touchdown. Holy Cross opened the scoring on its first possession of the day, with Randolph throwing a 14-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Maher. Lafayette would tie the score early in the second quarter on a one-yard scoring run by Brandon Mitchell. Dominic Randolph completed 29 of 42 passes for 441 yards and three touchdowns, to lead Holy Cross to a 27-20 victory over Colgate at Fitton Field. Randolph had the second-most passing yards in Holy Cross history, while setting new career highs for both passing yards and total offense (473 yards). Colgate scored touchdowns on its first two possessions of the game, to take a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter. Jordan Scott scored both times for the Raiders, on runs of four yards and one yard. Holy Cross put its first points on the board midway through the second quarter on a 35-yard touchdown pass from Randolph to Terrance Gass, then Matt Partain added a 41-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 14-10 at halftime. The Raiders increased their lead to 20-10 on their first possession of the third quarter with a nine-yard scoring run by Scott, but Mike Buck's extra point attempt was wide left and the Crusaders were down by just 10 points. Partain then kicked his second field goal of the day, from 27 yards out, to make it a seven-point game. Colgate drove back down the field into the red zone, before Casey Gough intercepted a pass in the end zone early in the fourth quarter. Holy Cross then marched 80 yards in just four plays, with Randolph tossing a 26-yard touchdown pass to Brett McDermott, tying the score at 20-20. The Crusaders forced the Raiders to punt after just five plays on their next possession, then came right back down the field with Randolph tossing a three-yard touchdown pass to Justin Maher for the winning score. Colgate had one more chance in the closing seconds, but Adam Sadowski sacked Alex Relph near midfield on the final play of the game to secure the victory. Gough led the Holy Cross defense with five tackles and two interceptions, while Kyle Mushaweh had nine tackles and an interception.
