Recent Developments

- Won a grant from the National Youth Sports Program (NYSP) for summer camp program June, 2005, which brought over 160 area youth per day for 25 days to Campus Recreation Center.
- Hosted review sessions open to all enrolled students for Geol 1330, Hist 3330 and Theater 1331 in the Academic Center for Excellence.
- Appointed member of the staff to handle all facility tours for internal and external visitors.
- Received an award from the National Consortium for Academics and Sports (NCAS) for outreach achievements in 2003-2004 school year.

Notable Outreach Statistics 2006

- 40 Students Athletes employed through summer camp program
- 155 athletes volunteered in 2005-2006 in the surrounding UH community and school districts as far as Cy-Fair, Katy and Pasadena, Baytown, Aldine
- 51 Outreach programs performed
- Built relationships with 72 area schools and organizations
- 23,900 students and adults were exposed to our campus and Athletic Department since Outreach Program was expanded in 2005

National Youth Sports Program (NYSP)

- Serviced over 350 low-income elementary, middle and high school students
- Employed over 50 University of Houston students in summer camp and outreach programs
- Exposed students to (PBS/KUHF, University Center, Athletics/Alumni Center, College of Optometry, Melcher Hall, Bates, Bowling Alley, CRWC, Hofheinz Pavillion, Robertson Stadium, E. Cullen Building)
- Provided 9,100 meals to low-income students through the National Youth Sports Program summer camp
- Received over \$30,000 in University in-kind contributions to allow local youth to attend summer camp
