COUGARS OPEN 2008 NCAA COLLEGE STATION REGIONAL ON FRIDAY

The Cougars open the 2008 NCAA College Station Regional at 12:30 p.m., Friday when they meet No. 2 seed Dallas Baptist at Olsen Field.

The Cougars, who will compete in the double-elimination tournament as the No. 3 seed, earned Conference USA's automatic bid to the NCAA postseason after winning the 2008 Entergy C-USA Championship last weekend at Tulane's Greer Field at Turchin Stadium. After losing the second game of the tournament to UAB, the Cougars fought their way through the losers' bracket, sweeping UAB in two games on Saturday, before taking a hard-fought 3-2 win over Marshall in the C-USA Championship game.

It was the third C-USA Tournament championship for the Cougars in school history but the first since 2000. The Cougars also will compete in the NCAA postseason for the second time during the last three years and the 18th time in school history.

ON DECK

If the Cougars win Friday's opener over Dallas Baptist, they face the winner of the No. 1 seed Texas A&M-No. 4 seed UIC game at 6:30 p.m., Saturday in the winner's bracket.

If the Cougars lose to Dallas Baptist, they will meet the loser of the Texas A&M-UIC game in the first elimination contest at 12:30 p.m., Saturday.

NEWS & NOTES

- With their performance last weekend, the Cougars claimed their third Conference USA Championship title and fourth tournament crown in school history... It also was their first since the 2000 Cougar squad won in St. Petersburg, Fla... It was the program's first title since the 2002 won the C-USA regular-season title.
- Junior infielder **Jimmy Cesario**, senior third baseman **Bryan Pounds**, sophomore centerfielder **Zak Presley** and freshman righthander **Jared Ray** were named to the 2008 Entergy Conference USA All-Tournament Team for their respective performances... Pounds was named the Championship's Most Valuable Player, becoming only the sixth player in UH history to take home that conference hardware.
- Senior outfielder **Jake Stewart** has established himself as one of UH's and Conference USA's premier players in 2008 with a rare combination of power and speed... The Santa Fe native tops the Cougars and ranks among the C-USA Top-Five leaders in batting average, home runs and slugging percentage but also has added 24 stolen bases, second on the team and fourth in the league... He is one of only four players to blast 10+ home runs and swipe 20+ stolen bases in a single season in UH history and the only player in C-USA this season to accomplish that feat.
- Senior second baseman **Ryan Lormand** has established himself as one of the top base stealers in Conference USA. Lormand leads the Cougars with 29 stolen bases in 31 attempts and successfully swiped 21 bases before being mowed down in the series finale at Southern Miss on Sunday... Lormand now owns two of the Top-Four marks in UH history and is the only player in UH history to steal 15 consecutive bases twice during his career... With one more stolen base, he will become only the fifth player in school history to steal at least 30 bases in a single season, joining **Michael Bourn** (2001-02), **Trey Williams** (1969), **Shaun Skrehot** (1997) and **Thad Altman** (1976).
- Senior second baseman **Ryan Lormand** is the only player to start all 117 games to date during the last two seasons... Freshman shortstop **Blake Kelso** joins Lormand as the only Cougars to start all 61 games in 2008.

ON THE MOUND VS. DALLAS BAPTIST

Friday – Sophomore southpaw **Wes Musick** will make his 15th consecutive weekend start this season during the Cougars' opening game against No. 3 seed Dallas Baptist on Friday during the 2008 NCAA College Station Regional.

It also will be Musick's 21st consecutive start dating back to 2007. He has not missed a start since sitting out the Rice series on April 13-15, 2007, This season, the Lufkin native has posted an 8-4 record with 79 strikeouts and a 4.08 ERA in 90.1 innings.

He leads all Cougar hurlers in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts and is tied for third among all C-USA hurlers with his win total.

With his impressive totals, he also ranks among the Top-10 Conference USA leaders in all three pitching Triple Crown categories (win, ERA, strikeouts), making him one of only five players in that exclusive group. Musick ranks 10th in ERA, third in strikeouts and is tied for fourth in wins.

He joins Tulane's Shooter Hunt (2.45 ERA – 2nd; 119 Ks – 1st; 9 wins – t-1st); Southern Miss' Barry Bowden (1.62 ERA – 1st; 75 Ks – 7th; 8 wins – t-4th); East Carolina's Justin Bristow (3.22 ERA – 7th; 78 Ks – t-4th; 8 wins – t-4th) and Seth Maness (2.87 ERA – 4th; 77 Ks – 6th; 9 wins – t-1st) and Rice's Ryan Berry (3.10 ERA – 6th; 80 Ks – 2nd; 7 wins – 8th).

Earlier this season, Musick made his second straight Opening Day start against Pacific, becoming the first player since 2006 National Player of the Year **Brad Lincoln** to achieve that milestone. In starting the 2007 opener, Musick became the first freshmen hurler since **Jason Hart** against Texas Southern on Feb. 7, 1991 to accomplish that feat.

Last Start: Musick helped set the tone for the entire 2008 C-USA Championship with a solid start against No. 5 seed East Carolina on May 21 during the first round.

He scattered three runs off seven hits and three walks with five strikeouts in 6.2 innings. However, he did not collect a decision as the Cougars rallied to score two runs in the bottom of the 10th inning on the way to a 5-4 win over the Pirates.

Last Game: Musick threw 1.1 innings of shutout relief with two walks and a pair of strikeouts during the Cougars' second win over UAB on May 24 during the 2008 Entergy C-USA Championship. He collected the hold against the Blazers in a 3-1 win that propelled the Cougars into the C-USA Championship game against Marshall.

It was only the second relief appearance during Musick's career and his first since a one-inning relief stint against Texas State on Feb. 26 at Cougar Field.

vs. Dallas Baptist: Friday's game will be Musick's first career game against the Patriots

in NCAA Postseason: Friday's game also will be Musick's first career game in the NCAA postseason.

ON THE MOUND VS. (1) TEXAS A&M/(4) UIC

Saturday – Sophomore righthander **John Touchton** will make his 10th start when he toes the rubber during the Cougars' second game at the 2008 NCAA College Station Regional on Saturday. It also will be Touchton's fifth straight weekend start in 2008 after making his C-USA starting debut against Memphis on May 3.

This season, the Houston native has posted a 5-3 record with 57 strikeouts and a team-best 3.98 ERA in 63.1 innings. In 12 relief appearances, he also has compiled two saves to rank among the team's and C-USA individual leaders.

On April 21, Touchton earned the Cougars' first C-USA Pitcher of the Week honor in 2008 and the first of his career following solid back-to-back outings at Stephen F. Austin on April 15 and at C-USA rival UAB on April 19. He struck out a career-high six batters in both appearances to earn the award.

Last Start: Touchton was touched up a bit, allowing four runs off nine hits and two walks with a pair of strikeouts in 4.2 innings during the Cougars' first game against No. 8 seed UAB during the 2008 Entergy C-USA Championship on May 23. However, he did not collect a decision as the Cougars rallied from a four-run deficit to tie the game in the eighth inning before losing on a walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth.

vs. Texas A&M: If the Cougars face No. 1 seed Texas A&M on Saturday, it will be his second appearance but first start against the Aggies during his career.

In only his second career appearance, Touchton allowed two runs off three hits and a walk with two strikeouts in 2.1 innings won the way to a 3-2 loss on Feb. 10, 2007, during the second game of the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park.

vs. UIC: If the Cougars face No. 4 seed UIC on Saturday, it will be Touchton's first career appearance against the Flames.

in NCAA Postseason: Saturday's game will be Touchton's first career appearance in the NCAA postseason.

STREAKING

NCAA REGIONAL HISTORY

For the second time in the last three years, the Cougars will make a return to the NCAA postseason when they compete at the NCAA College Station Regional this weekend.

The Cougars have appeared in 17 NCAA Regionals previously, posting a combined 25-27-1 (.481) record during those games. Combined with UH's berths in the NCAA Super Regionals, UH has compiled a 31-37-1 (.457) all-time record during the NCAA postseason.

UH last competed in the NCAA postseason during the 2006 NCAA Norman Regional in Oklahoma. The Cougars dropped a 2-1 decision to Wichita State in the opening round before falling 8-6 to host and No. 1 seed Oklahoma in an elimination game.

at College Station: This weekend's Regional will be the second time that the Cougars have competed in College Station, and few Cougar fans can forget the previous appearance.

After falling to Alabama in the first round of the 2003 NCAA College Station Regional, the Cougars reeled off four straight wins, including a pair against host Texas A&M to win their third NCAA regional in a four-year span. The Cougars claimed a 4-2 win over Oral Roberts and gained their revenge over Alabama with a 16-8 thumping in an elimination game.

The Cougars then claimed back-to-back 7-6 wins against the host Aggies with the championship game going 10 innings. UH rallied from a 6-2 deficit after seven-and-a-half innings, scoring five runs in the final three frames to upset the Aggies.

SERIES HISTORY VS. DALLAS BAPTIST

For the second time in the last three seasons, the Cougars will face Dallas Baptist during the first round of the 2008 NCAA College Station Regional. Dallas Baptist owns a 3-2 (.600) lead in the all-time series, which featured doubleheaders in 1982 and 1983.

The Patriots can boast of the most recent success after taking a 7-5 win over the Cougars on Feb. 23, 2007 at Dr. Pepper Ballpark in Frisco during the second day of the Southwest Diamond Classic.

That win pushed DBU's winning streak over the Cougars to three games, dating back to 1983. The Cougars swept the first doubleheader on April 13, 1982, winning 10-9 and 15-1, in Houston.

However, the Patriots rallied a year later to sweep another doubleheader in Houston by 8-7 and 5-3 margins.

at NCAA Regional: This weekend's game will be the first time that the Cougars have faced Dallas Baptist in a postseason game.

at neutral site: Friday's game will be the second time that the two teams have played one another outside of Houston. DBU held off a late Cougar comeback in a 7-5 win on Feb. 23, 2007, at Dr. Pepper Ballpark in Frisco during the Southwest Diamond Classic.

LAST TIME VS. DALLAS BAPTIST

Feb. 23, 2007 • Southwest Diamond Classic • Dr. Pepper Ballpark • Frisco – Dallas Baptist took advantage of two walks and two key infield errors in the eighth inning to score two runs and break a tie on the way to a 7-5 win over the Cougars during the second day of the Southwest Diamond Classic.

The loss spoiled a valiant comeback by the Cougars, who trailed 3-0 after the first inning and 5-1 after four innings, but tied the game at 5-5 in the top of the eighth on **Jimmy Cesario's** opposite-field, three-run homer.

In the bottom of the eighth, J.T. Bloodworth reached on the first infield error with one out and moved up a base following Austin Krum's walk. After both runners moved up on a wild pitch, Austin Knight drew a walk to load the bases. Garrett Baker then reached following the second miscue that allowed two runs to score.

UH reliever **Dereck Cloeren** collected the loss after giving up two unearned runs off two walks in one inning. DBU reliever Randall Taylor picked up the win and improved to 1-1 after holding the Cougars scoreless over the final 1.1 innings.

Cesario went 2-for-4 with two runs and three RBIs to lead the Cougars, who outthit DBU 9-8. **Felix Fanaselle** finished the night 2-for-4 with a pair of runs, while first baseman **Josh Stirneman** went 2-for-4 with two RBIs in the losing effort.

Krum went 3-for-3 with a triple, RBI and three runs scored, while Nick Santos batted 2-for-4 with an RBI for DBU.

SERIES HISTORY VS. TEXAS A&M

The 2008 season marks the 44th consecutive season that the Cougars have faced Texas A&M on the baseball diamond. The Aggies own a 104-52-1 (.666) lead in the all-time series, which began in 1949 but has been played at least once every season since 1965.

The Aggies also bring a three-game winning streak over the Cougars into the 2008 NCAA College Station Regional after winning in Houston earlier this season and have won six of the last seven contests against UH.

With 157 games to date, the Texas A&M series features the most games against any Cougar opponent. Current C-USA rival Rice is second with 145 games, while Baylor and Sam Houston State are tied for third with 144 games.

At 44 consecutive seasons, the Texas A&M series also holds the longest active streak against any Cougar opponent. Again, Rice is second with a streak of 37 consecutive seasons.

The Cougars own a 2-0 record against the Aggies after winning twice on the final day to clinch the NCAA College Station Regional championship on June 1, 2003.

at College Station: During its history, Olsen Field has not been a friendly place for the Cougars. Texas A&M owns a 42-20 (.677) lead in the all-time series during games played in College Station.

The Aggies also have won four of their last five home games against the Cougars with only a 9-6 win on April 18, 2006, preventing a much longer losing skid.

However, UH has enjoyed some success at Olsen Field in recent history. From 1998 to 2003, the Cougars won six of seven games in College Station, including the 2003 NCAA College Station Regional crown.

LAST TIME VS. TEXAS A&M

No. 8 Texas A&M scored five unearned runs in the first inning and never looked back in taking a 13-6 win over the Cougars during non-conference action.

The Aggies rapped out four hits and took advantage of a costly two-out, Cougar infield error to grab a lead they would never relinquish. UH scored single runs in the second and third innings to pull to within three, but would get no closer as Texas A&M scored at least one run in each of the last five innings.

Bryan Pounds went 2-for-5 with a run to lead the Cougar offense, which rapped out seven hits in the game.

UH starter **Jared Ray** collected the loss after giving up seven runs (only two earned) off 10 hits with four strikeouts in 4.2 innings.

Texas A&M starter Scott Migl earned the win after holding the Cougars to five runs (two earned) off five hits and two walks with six strikeouts in 7.2 innings.

Kyle Colligan went 3-for-4 with a double, two runs and RBI to lead the Texas A&M offense, which posted 17 hits and saw all but one starter record a hit in the game. Dane Carter went 3-for-6 with a run, double and two RBIs, while Jose Duran finished the night 2-for-6 with four runs and two RBIs.

Darby Brown went 2-for-5 with an RBI, and Anders batted 2-for-5 with a run and three RBIs. Brian Ruggiano batted 2-for-5 with a run, home run and four RBIs in the winning.

Senior outfielder **Jake Stewart** scored from third base on a groundout in the eighth inning to break a tie and help lead the Cougars to a 3-2 win over Marshall in the championship game of the 2008 Conference USA Entergy Championship.

In a game that went back and forth

throughout the day, it was the Cougars who had the final word in the eighth inning. Stewart reached first on a Marshall infield miscue and moved to second following a walk to **Bryan Pounds**. After Stewart advanced to third following a deep fly ball to right field, **Ryan Lormand** hit a sharp ground ball to Marshall third baseman Brandon Casamassima, who flipped the ball to second base in an attempt for the double play.

However, the quick-footed Lormand, who swiped three stolen bases in the game, beat out the relay throw to first base, scoring Stewart for the final run of the game.

That would be all the run support that freshman closer **Chase Dempsay** would need. The Baytown native struck out Tommy Johnson to end the game and induced two groundouts to end the game and give the Cougars their third C-USA Championship crown and first since 2000.

The 11th-ranked Cougars scored six runs during the final two innings, but it would not be quite enough as UH dropped an 8-6 decision to No. 1 seed and 13th-ranked Oklahoma in an elimination game.

Trailing 8-0 after seven-and-a-half innings, the Cougars rallied with three runs in the eighth inning, courtesy of back-to-back home runs from **Matt Weston** - a two-run, opposite-field shot to left center - and a towering solo shot to center field from **Brad Lincoln**. It was the third time during the 2006 campaign that the Cougars recorded consecutive home runs.

The Cougars continued their rally in the bottom of the ninth inning. After back-to-back singles from **Matt Farrington** and **Bryan Pounds**, **Jake Stewart** smashed a three-run homer to left field to pull the Cougars to within 8-6.

However, that would be as close as the Cougars would get the rest of the way. UH ended its 2006 season with a 39-22 overall record, the most victories since the 2000 squad tied a school record with 48 wins.

Righthander **Ricky Hargrove** collected the loss after surrendering seven runs off eight hits with three strikeouts in 3.2 innings of work. Reliever **Shea Hancock** performed admirably in relief, holding the Sooners to only one run off four hits with a career-best seven strikeouts in 4.1 innings.

40 AND BEYOND

With a win during the NCAA College Station Regional this weekend, the Cougars will enjoy their 40th victory of the 2008 campaign.

It would become only the 11th team in school history to reach 40 wins in a single season and the first since the 2002 team tied a school record with 48 wins.

The group includes **2002** (48 wins), **2000** (48), **1999** (40), **1997** (40), **1990** (44), **1989** (43), **1987** (40), **1985** (44), **1983** (43) and **1982** (42).

As an player, assistant coach and head coach, Cougar skipper **Rayner Noble** was a part of eight of those 10 teams.

THE 10-20 MAN

Senior outfielder **Jake Stewart** joined an exclusive group in Cougar history during the 2008 campaign. With 14 home runs and 24 stolen bases entering the 2008 NCAA College Station Regional, Stewart is only the fourth member of the 10-20 Club in UH history.

Goefrey Tomlinson (16 home runs; 25 stolen bases in 1997), **Dustin Carr** (11 home runs; 23 stolen bases in 1997), **Shane Buteaux** (12 home runs; 27 stolen bases in 1994) are the only players in UH history to previously accomplish the rare combination of speed and power in a single-season.

The Santa Fe native is the only member of the 10-20 Club in Conference USA by a wide margin. Among the C-USA players with at least 20 stolen bases in 2008, UAB's Brint Hardy leads the way with five home runs.

MVP! MVP! MVP!

Senior third baseman **Bryan Pounds** added to his trophy case last weekend when he was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2008 Entergy Conference USA Championship.

In six games, he batted .524 (11-for-21) with a double, home run, three runs scored, six RBI's and .714 slugging percentage.

Pounds became the sixth player in school history to be named the MVP of a postseason conference tournament. He joined catcher **Jarrold Bitter** (2000 C-USA); catcher **Scottie Scott** (1997 C-USA); infielder **Ricky Torres** (1990 Southwest Conference); pitcher **Larry Coker** (1987 SWC) and DH **Dale Oliver** (1982 SWC).

Ray and junior infielder **Jimmy Cesario** each earned their first berths on a C-USA All-Tournament Team.

The four selections were the most since the 2006 squad placed four players on the postseason team and tied that team for the most since 2000.

Presley batted .409 with three runs, a triple and six RBI's and played errorless ball in center field during 17 chances. He smashed the game-winning hit in the bottom of the 10th inning against East Carolina in the Cougars' tournament opener and rapped out three of the team's five hits during the Championship game against Marshall on Sunday.

Cesario batted .304 (7-for-23) with a team-high five runs and two doubles along with four RBI's.

Ray helped lead the Cougars into the C-USA Championship game with a stellar pitching performance in the elimination game against UAB on Saturday night. After giving up a leadoff hit, the Waco native did not allow another hit until the leadoff batter of the seventh inning.

Ray tossed a career-high-tying 6.2 shutout innings with six strikeouts to pick up the win against the Blazers

ALL-CONFERENCE USA, ALL THE TIME

Five players were named to the All-Conference USA teams for their production throughout the 2008 season.

Senior outfielder **Jake Stewart** and senior third baseman **Bryan Pounds** each were named to the First Team, the first honors of their careers.

Stewart leads the Cougars with 14 home runs and is second with a .342 batting average and 24 stolen bases.

Pounds has led the Cougars and ranked among the league leaders in batting average and other categories since Feb. 24 when he first entered the UH lineup.

It was the fourth straight season and the 32nd time in the last 33 years that the Cougars had at least one representative on the league's postseason team. Outfielder **Travis Tully** was a Second-Team honoree following the 2004 season.

Sophomore southpaw **Wes Musick** was named to the league's Second Team, a year after earning a First-Team berth.

Musick was the Cougars' regular Friday night starter, leading UH in wins, strikeouts, innings pitched and starts.

Shortstop **Blake Kelso** and closer **Chase Dempsay** were named to the C-USA All-Freshmen Team.

Kelso was one of only two players to start all 61 games, while Dempsay set a UH freshman record with 11 saves to date.

Senior second baseman **Ryan Lormand** has been a menace for opposing batteries throughout the 2008 season, leading the Cougars in stolen bases for the second straight season.

He would join **Trey Williams** (36 in 1969), **Michael Bourn** (35 in 2001; 32 in 2002); **Shaun Skrehot** (33 in 1997) and **Thad Altman** (32 in 1976) as the members of that group.

RUNNING WILD

With three stolen bases during the Cougars' 3-2 win over Marshall in the C-USA Championship game on May 26, senior second baseman **Ryan Lormand** set a Cougar record in conference tournament games.

His three steals topped the previous best of two, done three times, and most recently by **Stuart Muslewhite** against TCU on May 29, 2004 during the C-USA Tournament at Cougar Field.

LET'S PLAY FIVE

As impressive as the Cougars' run through the 2008 Entergy Conference USA Championship, that feat is even more remarkable when one considers the time it took for the Cougars.

After being rained out on the second day, the Cougars won five consecutive game, beginning at 12:56 p.m., May 23 against UAB and ending with the 3-2 victory over Marshall in the Championship game at 4 p.m., May 26.

The Cougars played two games each day on May 23 and May 24, giving the team five straight wins over a 51-hour stretch.

By claiming the championship from the loser's bracket, several players also tied a UH record for conference tournaments by playing in all six games.

That group includes **Bryan Pounds**, **Zak Presley**, **Jimmy Cesario**, **Caleb Ramsey**, **Blake Kelso**, **Ryan Lormand**, **Jake Stewart**, **Bryan Tully** and **Chris Wallace**.

They tied the mark of six games, first set by Sean Allen, Eric Lee, Brandon Caraway, Kris Wilken and J.P. Woodward during the 2000 C-USA Championship.

ADDITIONAL ACCOLADES

With their selections to the 2008 Silver Glove All-Series Team, senior second baseman **Ryan Lormand** and junior DH **Jimmy Cesario** were named to the squad for the second straight year. Senior third baseman **Bryan Pounds** also received his second straight All-Series honor after first being named to the Team in 2005.

The Cougar trio became the 13th, 14th and 15th Cougar players to receive multiple All-Series awards during their careers.

Cesario and Lormand joined utility star **Brandon Caraway**

(1998-99), pitcher **Bryan Moore** (1998-99), catcher **Jarrod Bitter** (1999-00), infielder **Kris Wilken** (1999-00), catcher **Chris Snyder** (2001-02), infielder **Hyung Cho** (2001-02), centerfielder **Michael Bourn** (2001-02), infielder **Thanos Papavasiliou** (2001, 2003), outfielder **Travis Tully** (2003, 2005) and utility star **Brad Lincoln** (2005-06) as the other two-time Team members from Houston.

Outfielder **Gabe Lucas** (2001-03) is the only Cougar to be named to the All-Series Team for three seasons.

EXCELLENCE IN THE CLASSROOM

In addition to the achievements on the field during the 2008 campaign, the Cougars also showed excellence in the classroom, placing 11 members on the 2008 C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll. That total tied as the second most by any Cougar men's team, trailing only football's 13 honorees.

The Cougar award-winners include **Jimmy Cesario**, **Austin Goolsby**, **Taylor Hammack**, **Blake Kelso**, **David Murphy**, **Zak Presley**, **Caleb Ramsey**, **Jared Ray**, **Matt Taylor** and **Tom Wertz** as well as former letterwinner **Josh Stirmeman**. The players earned their places on the Honor Roll for maintaining a 3.0 cumulative grade-point average or better.

Cesario, Goolsby and Presley won the award for the second straight season, while Stirmeman was recognized for the third consecutive year. Stirmeman also received the C-USA Academic Medal for recording a GPA of 3.5 or better for the third straight season. He is the only player in UH history to win the Medal multiple times.

The Cougars posted a cumulative 2.81 team GPA during the 2007 fall semester. It was the highest men's GPA and the second-highest all-time mark for the Baseball team.

More than half (17 of 32) players recorded a 3.0 GPA or higher during the fall semester with three current players (Cesario, Taylor and Wertz) being named to the Dean's List.

A LITTLE MORE ACTION

Sophomore centerfielder **Zak Presley** emerged as one of the Cougars' most consistent offensive performers during the last month. Although he saw his career-best 18-game hitting streak snapped during the series opener against Memphis on May 2, the Southlake native enjoyed the second-longest streak by any Cougar hitter in 2008 and tied for the seventh longest in school history.

During his streak, Presley batted .387 (24-for-62) with 13 runs, five doubles, two triples and 12 RBIs. As a result, he raised his season batting average 73 points.

After going 3-for-6 with two runs and a pair of RBIs during the Cougars' loss to UTSA on April 30, Presley brought his batting average up to .305. It was the first time since March 21 and only the second time all season that Presley topped the .300 mark.

ANOTHER WEEK, ANOTHER AWARD

For the second time in a three-week stretch, a Cougar hurler was

honored as the Conference USA Pitcher of the Week when freshman closer **Chase Dempsay** picked up the award on May 5. In four appearances, Dempsay earned a win and two saves. The Baytown native threw a combined 7.2 shutout innings, allowing just three hits while striking out five and walking three.

He set a UH freshman record with his seventh save of the season at Lamar and added another save during the series opener against C-USA rival Memphis on May 2.

During the Memphis series finale, he earned his fifth win with 2.2 innings of one-hit ball, getting the Cougars' out of a seventh-inning jam and striking out two on the way to his career-best fourth straight win.

It was his first C-USA weekly award and the second by a Cougar pitcher in 2008. Sophomore righthander John Touchton picked up the honor on April 21.

LET'S CUT TO CHASE

Freshman righthander **Chase Dempsay** certainly has made his presence felt on the mound in 2008 during his first collegiate season.

He already ranks among the Cougars' all-time single-season and career leaders with 11 saves in 2008 and is only the fourth player in UH history to reach double-digit saves in a single-season.

With his seventh save, Dempsay set a UH freshman record, moving past the old record set by **Robert Dieudonne** in 1997.

This season, Dempsay has pitched to a 6-3 record with 46 strikeouts, a .210 opposing batting average and a 2.50 ERA in 57.2 innings. Both his ERA and opposing average would be team leaders if he qualified with enough innings.

In addition, Dempsay has posted a .195 batting average with four RBIs and a solo home run that tied the game in the bottom of the ninth inning against Pacific on Feb. 24 during Opening Weekend at Cougar Field.

STOPPER OF THE YEAR

With his impressive numbers this season, freshman closer **Chase Dempsay** has emerged as one of the leading relievers in Conference USA. The Baytown native recently was one of 45 players named to the mid-season watch list for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, given to the nation's top collegiate baseball reliever.

Dempsay has emerged as a force out of the Cougar bullpen during his first collegiate season at UH. He has made 30 appearances and thrown 57.2 innings, posting a 6-3 record with a UH-freshman-record 11 saves and a 2.50 ERA. He also has struck out 46 batters while walking only 18.

He is the only pitcher in Conference USA to rank among the league's Top-10 individual leaders in both wins and saves.

The Cougars have signed six players to National Letters of Intent to date during the signing periods.

TOUCHTON NAMED C-USA PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore southpaw **John Touchton** earned the first weekly award of his career when he was named the Conference USA Pitcher of the Week on April 21. It also was the first C-USA weekly pitching accolade for the Cougars in 2008.

Touchton made a pair of appearances, starting at Stephen F. Austin in a non-conference game on April 15 and coming out of the bullpen during the middle game of the UAB series on Saturday to pitch a combined 9.1 innings.

The Kingwood High product recorded a career-high six strikeouts in both outings and allowed just one walk. He earned his third win at SFA, tossing six shutout innings while scattering four hits.

Touchton extended his career-high streak of 8.1 consecutive scoreless innings before surrendering a solo home run in the eighth inning against UAB.

GOING STREAKING

Senior infielder **Bryan Pounds** saw his 11-game hitting streak snapped against Sam Houston State on April 16 after going 0-for-5. It was the Houston native's second hitting streak of more than 10 games after enjoying a career-high 19-game hitting streak dating back to last season to open the 2008 campaign.

Although his 11-game hitting streak came to an end, Pounds became only the 13th player in school history to enjoy at least two 10-game hitting streaks in one season. He became the first since current teammate **Bryan Tully** accomplished the feat in 2005-06.

Here are the other Cougars who have recorded at least two 10-game hitting streaks in one season: 1. **Dustin Carr** (4 streaks, 1993); 2. **Tyson Schweitzer** (3, 2000); 3. **Bryan Pounds** (2, 2008); **Bryan Tully** (2, 2005-06); **Travis Tully** (2, 2005); **Jarrold Bitter** (2, 1999); **Jayne Sperring** (2, 1998); **Goefrey Tomlinson** (2, 1997); **Ricky Freeman** (2, 1994); **Brian Blair** (2, 1993); **Phil Lewis** (2, 1993); **Fred Hinojosa** (2, 1988) and **Mark Lavespere** (2, 1981).

THE RUNNING MAN

In only two years at UH, senior second baseman **Ryan Lormand** has established himself as one of the school's premier base stealers.

The Waco native has stolen 29 of 31 bases this season, including 21 straight at one point. That streak – which was snapped during the series finale at Conference USA rival Southern Miss on April 27 – tied for the second longest in school history.

Earlier this season, Lormand saw his streak of 19 consecutive stolen bases snapped during the first inning of the Pacific series finale on Feb. 24 at Cougar Field. The Waco native was caught in a rundown between first and second to end the streak. It was the first time since March 2, 2007, against Northwestern State that Lormand was tagged out on the basepaths.

Altogether, Lormand stole 40 of 41 bases he attempted during one stretch.

He is the only player in UH history to have two streaks of at least 15 consecutive stolen bases.

Shaun Skrehot stole 24 consecutive bases in 1997 to set the school record. **Goefrey Tomlinson** is tied with Lormand for second in UH history with 21 consecutive stolen bases from 1996 to 97.

THREE OF A KIND

During the Southern Miss series on April 25-27, the Cougars started a trio of left-handers on the mound in sophomore **Wes Musick**, freshman **Ty Stuckey** and **Donnie Joseph**. It marked the sixth straight weekend that **head coach Rayner Noble** picked the all-southpaw rotation.

It was the first time since 1989 that the Cougars have started three southpaws on the mound during a weekend series. In 1989, southpaws **Louis Francescon**, **Eric Rasberry** and **Keith Darter** toed the rubber against Texas A&M on April 28-29 in a Southwest

Conference series in Houston.

However, the three-southpaw combination was a regular occurrence during the 1989 season. Rasberry and Darter were regulars in the weekend rotation with Francescon joining fellow lefties **Garth Buresh** and **Ben Pardo** at various times.

LIGHTS... CAMERA... ACTION

The Cougars competed on television for the third time in 2008 during the 2008 Entergy Conference USA Championship on May 26 at Tulane's Greer Field at Turchin Stadium.

Earlier in the season, the Cougars split the first two games of a weekend series against Tulane on April 11-13 at Cougar Field.

A year ago, the Cougars appeared in four televised games, posting a 2-2 (.500) record in those contests. UH enjoyed wins over No. 5 Rice (April 13) and at No. 23 Tulane (April 20) before falling to East Carolina (May 4) and Southern Miss (May 17).

This was the third straight season and the ninth time in the last decade that the Cougars appeared at least one time on television.

With the Championship win, the Cougars improved to 18-20 (.474) all-time in televised games. In addition, the Cougars improved to 6-4 (.600) all-time when playing on CBS College Sports/CSTV.

RED ALERT

Although he drew a pair of walks, stole a pair of bases and scored a run during the Cougars' 13-6 loss to No. 8 Texas A&M on Tuesday, freshman shortstop **Blake Kelso** saw his career-best 11-game hitting streak snapped against the Aggies. During his streak, Kelso batted .420 (21-for-50) with 15 runs, nine doubles, 10 RBIs and four stolen bases.

The streak tied with current Houston Astros outfielder **Michael Bourn** (Feb. 18-March 11, 2001) for the second-longest streak by any Cougar freshman and trailed only the UH freshman-record 13-game streak by **Sam Mitchell** from Feb. 21 to March 16, 2001.

As one of only two players to start all 61 games to date, Kelso has posted a .290 batting average with three home runs, 14 doubles, 34 RBIs and 15 stolen bases.

C-USA HITTER OF THE WEEK

Senior infielder **Bryan Pounds** earned one of the Cougars' first regular-season honors when he was named the C-USA Hitter of the Week on March 31.

In helping lead the Cougars to two wins – including an 8-5 decision over No. 12 Rice on March 2 – the Houston native led the Cougars in average (.476), hits (10), home runs (2), slugging percentage (.952) and on-base percentage (.520) while adding a pair of doubles and a triple.

He recorded at least two hits and one RBI in all but one game and went 4-for-5 with two home runs (including his first career grand slam) and a career-best seven RBIs against the Owls.

HEAD WEST, YOUNG COUGARS

With their trip to San Diego State on March 28-30, the Cougars headed to the West Coast as part of their regular-season schedule for the 10th consecutive season. The Cougars were swept by the Aztecs during their final non-conference series of the season.

UH's annual western swing began in 1999 when the Cougars squared off at Cal State Fullerton in a three-game series and has been continued every year since.

Here is a breakdown of the Cougars' annual West Coast Trip by year and opponent: **1999**, at Cal State Fullerton; **2000**, at USC; **2000**, at San Diego State; **2002**, at Kia Baseball Bash, hosted by Cal State Fullerton; **2003**, at Battle at the Beach, hosted by Pepperdine; **2004**, at Aztec Invitational at PETCO Park, hosted by San Diego State; **2005**, at Long Beach State; **2006**, at UC Irvine; **2007**, at San Diego and **2008**, at San Diego State.

DOING IT ALL

Senior reliever/outfielder **Bryan Tully** certainly did that during the Cougars' 5-4 win over Texas Tech during the first day of the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park on Feb. 29.

The Houston native belted a home run to lead off the eighth inning and give the Cougars a 5-1 advantage. He entered the game on the mound in the bottom of the ninth and recorded the final two outs to earn his first save of the season.

It marked the second time in his career that Tully hit a home run and recorded a save in the same game. He first accomplished that feat against UTSA on Feb. 22, 2007, during the Southwest Diamond Classic in Frisco.

He also joined former reliever/shortstop and current Minnesota Twin **Jesse Crain** and **Shane Buteaux** as the only players in school history to accomplish that feat. Like Tully, both Crain and Buteaux each did the double-duty twice.

DOUBLING UP

Sophomore catcher **Austin Goolsby** added his name to the Cougar records book against Oklahoma during the second day of the Houston College Classic on March 1.

The Coppell native smashed three doubles in his final three at-bats to tie the UH single-game record. He became the 13th player to accomplish the feat and the first since **Josh Stirneman** at Conference USA rival Southern Miss on April 14, 2006.

Goolsby batted .500 (4-for-8) with two runs and two RBIs during the second week of the season to raise his batting average 114 points.

FRESHMEN ENJOY SOLID SEASONS

Several freshmen are a big reason for the Cougars' success to date. Through 61 games, shortstop **Blake Kelso** has batted .290 with 56 runs, 34 RBIs, 19 stolen bases and 14 doubles.

Kelso also ranks among the Conference USA individual leaders in run scored, triples, walks and leads all defensive players with 186 assists.

The Pflugerville native went 4-for-5 with two stolen bases, a run and an RBI during the series finale at No. 23 East Carolina

Utility player **Matt Murphy** started 41 games at first base and in right field. The Pearland native was hitting .278 with 22 runs, eight doubles and 28 RBIs before being sidelined with a shoulder injury in late April.

Murphy smashed his first collegiate home run with a towering shot to right field at UAB during the series opener April 18.

Chase Dempsay has started 11 games at DH, in right field and one at pitcher. While batting .195 with seven runs, he made his first collegiate home run a memorable one.

The Baytown native blasted a home run to lead off the ninth inning and tie the game at 9-9 during the series finale on Feb. 24. Dempsay ignited a ninth-inning comeback as the Cougars eventually pushed another run across, rallying from a 9-4 deficit after six-and-a-half innings.

Dempsay also leads the Cougars with a UH freshman-record 11 saves and has compiled a 2.50 ERA with 46 strikeouts in 57.2 innings.

Southpaw **Ty Stuckey** has recorded 50 strikeouts in 57.2 innings. After being sidelined in early May with an injury, Stuckey returned to the mound on May 24 against UAB during the 2008 Entergy C-USA Championship, eating up 4.1 valuable innings

Righthander **Jared Ray** has added 54 strikeouts in 61.2 innings and was named to the C-USA Championship All-Tournament Team after throwing 6.2 shutout innings with only two hits allowed against UAB during an elimination game at the C-USA Championship on May 25.

OPENING DAY HISTORY

With their 3-1 win over Pacific on Feb. 22 during the 2008 opener at Cougar Field, UH improved to 38-24 (.613) all-time in

season openers. It was the third straight season that the Cougars opened in front of the hometown faithful.

It also marked the first time since 1992-94 that UH has played in three consecutive Opening Days at home. The Cougars have enjoyed tremendous success on Opening Day, reeling off 13 consecutive wins from 1975-87.

REGULAR-SEASON TOURNAMENT HISTORY

In their lone regular-season tournament appearance in 2008, the Cougars finished with a 1-2 record at the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. UH enjoyed a 5-4 win over Texas Tech during their tournament opener on Feb 29 before falling in extra innings in back-to-back games against Oklahoma and No. 3 Texas.

With that total, the Cougars stood at 40-50 (.444) all-time during regular-season tournaments.

A LATE START

With new NCAA rules pushing the beginning of the season back to establish a uniform starting date for all schools, the Cougars won't open the 2007 campaign until Feb. 22 against Pacific.

That is the latest the Cougars have enjoyed Opening Day since the 1982 Cougar team opened with a home doubleheader against Louisiana-Lafayette on Feb. 23.

GETTING DOWN TO BUSINESS

With new NCAA rules pushing the collegiate baseball starting date back several weeks without extending the end of the season, the Cougars will venture into some uncharted waters this season.

Because of the schedule compression, the Cougars will face seven weeks with games on Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

PLAYING THE BEST

The Cougars will play some of the nation's best times this season. Never one to shy away from a challenging schedule, UH will play 17 games against seven teams which were ranked in at least one preseason poll.

In addition, the team will play 35 games against 14 teams which received votes in at least one national preseason poll.

PLAYING THE BEST, PART II

There is even more when talking about the Cougars' 2008 schedule. Here is the breakdown of games against teams that competed in the NCAA postseason in 2007.

NCAA College World Series (5 games vs. one opponent): Rice (5).

NCAA Super Regional (5 games vs. two opponents): Rice (5), Texas A&M (1).

NCAA Regional (19 games vs. eight opponents): Rice (5), East Carolina (3), Memphis (3), Southern Miss (3), Sam Houston State (2), Louisiana-Lafayette (1), Texas (1), Texas A&M (1).

COUGARS PICKED FIFTH IN C-USA

The Cougars were picked to finish fifth in the 2007 Conference USA Preseason Coaches' Poll released by the league office in late January. Individually, junior infielder **Jimmy Cesario** was named to the Preseason All-Conference USA Team.

No. 1 Rice received all but one vote by the league's nine coaches as the preseason favorite. East Carolina, Southern Miss and Tulane rounded out the Top Four leaders.

Rice's Aaron Luna was named the Preseason Player of the Year, while Rice senior southpaw Cole St. Clair was tabbed the Preseason Pitcher of the Year.

BIG CITY, BRIGHT LIGHTS

Cougar Field, always one of the nation's premier collegiate facilities, added a nice touch at the beginning of the 2007 season with a state-of-the-art scoreboard and video board. Located in

right-center field, the scoreboard, which measures about 47 feet high and 60 feet wide, holds a 13-by-18-foot video board and digital message board.

Costing about \$650,000, the new scoreboard was built by Spectrum Corporation and made possible by the generous donations of Cougar Baseball fans and former players.

THE OLD-TIMERS

Although the Cougars boast 15 letterwinners from the 2007 campaign, only three players this season as three-year letterwinners.

Pitcher/outfielder **Bryan Tully**, outfielder **Jake Stewart** and third baseman **Bryan Pounds** have been members of the Cougar program since 2005 at the earliest. Stewart became a Cougar in 2004 but sat out most of the 2007 season following a shoulder injury.

Infielder **Ryan Lormand** is the other senior on the 2008 Cougar squad, but the Waco native joined the team in 2007 after an award-winning career at McLennan Junior College.

HOUSTON/ISP SPORTS NETWORK

Fans and media can catch all the excitement of 2008 Cougar Baseball at **UHCougars.com**. **Jeremy Branham** and **Pat Cauley** will team up to bring all the action of Cougar Baseball.

Branham is in his first season as a member of the Cougar Baseball broadcast team but is no stranger to the UH Athletics Department.

He is now in his second season as the voice of UH women's basketball while working on his bachelor's degree at Houston.

Branham has extensive broadcast experience, first working as a fill-in broadcaster for the Houston ISP Sports Network during the 2005-06 women's basketball season.

Cauley is in his sixth season of providing color analysis. A 1995 Houston graduate, he was a former Cougar letterwinner in 1993 and served as a student assistant coach for **head coach Rayner Noble** in 1995.

He is married to **Traci Cauley**, the Cougars' director of baseball operations.

In more than 13 seasons as the head coach at the University of Houston, Rayner Noble has set a standard of excellence. Looking at his resume, it is easy to see why he is considered one of the nation's top collegiate coaches.

Noble has led UH to seven NCAA Regionals, three NCAA Super Regionals, three C-USA regular-season crowns and three C-USA Tournament championships.

Individually, Cougar players have flourished under Noble's tutelage. As the Cougar leader, Noble has guided one National Player of the Year, 19 All-Americans, 21 All-C-USA First Team honorees and 35 players to be drafted in the annual amateur draft.

Noble has posted an all-time record of 496-355 (.583) and an even better record of 220-103 (.681) in C-USA play.

After winning the C-USA regular-season title for the second straight year in 2000, the league's coaches and media members selected him as the C-USA Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

Noble played for the Cougars from 1980-83 and was named All-America as a pitcher and outfielder as a senior.

After playing professionally for five years in the Houston Astros organization, he served as an assistant coach at Rice from 1991 to 1993 and at UH from 1987-90.

Noble received both his bachelor's and master's degrees from UH. He and his wife Lisa are the parents of two daughters, Hannah and Kelsey.

800 GAMES AND COUNTING

With the Cougars 9-8 win over Sacred Heart on March 5, head coach Rayner Noble competed in the 800th game of his career as the Cougar skipper.

WHY NOBLE WEARS #85

One of the more common questions asked about the Cougars during games concerns the number on Noble's back.

With No. 85, Noble probably wears one of the nation's highest numbers in the collegiate game on his jersey. He wears it to remind him of 1985, the year that he became a Christian.

IN THE NCAA POSTSEASON

This marks the eighth time during his career that Noble has guided the Cougars into the NCAA postseason.

From 1999-03, he led UH into five straight NCAA Regionals, making him the

only coach in program history to accomplish that feat.

During his career, Noble has compiled a 12-10 (.545) all-time record in NCAA Regional play.

He also has led UH to a 2-4 (.333) record in NCAA Super Regionals with berths in the championship game in 2000, 2002 and 2003.

Altogether, Noble has assembled a 15-16 (.484) all-time record during the NCAA postseason (Regionals and Super Regionals combined). He has guided the Cougars to more than half (53.6 percent) of the school's total wins (28) at the College World Series, Super Regionals and Regionals.

NOBLE VS. DALLAS BAPTIST

Noble's teams have posted an 0-1 all-time record against Dallas Baptist during his career.

in NCAA postseason: Friday's game will be the first time that Noble has faced the Patriots in the postseason.

NOBLE VS. TEXAS A&M

Noble's teams have posted a 12-23 (.343) all-time record against Texas A&M during his career.

at College Station: Noble has posted an 8-8 (.500) all-time record against the Aggies at Olsen Field during his career.

in NCAA Postseason: Noble's teams have posted a 2-0 record against the Aggies during the NCAA postseason.

The Cougars rallied to take two wins on the final day of the 2003 College Station Regional and advance to the NCAA Houston Super Regional against eventual national champion Rice.

in Postseason: Noble's teams have posted a 2-1 (.667) record against the Aggies in all postseason games.

Before the 2003 NCAA College Station Regional, the Cougars dropped a 12-10 decision in Lubbock during the Southwest Conference Tournament on May 16, 1996.

NOBLE VS. UCI

Noble has not faced UCI during his career.

RARE COMPANY

As he enjoyed his 400th career victory against UC Irvine in the series opener on March 10, 2006, Noble joined some rare company in the history of the UH Athletics Department.

Noble, current volleyball head coach Bill Walton and legendary men's basketball head coach Guy V. Lewis are the only coaches in the history of UH Athletics to post 400 career victories as Cougars.

Lewis racked up 592 career victories from 1956-86, while Walton has recorded 429 victories since taking over the reins of Cougar Volleyball in 1986.

ALONE AT THE TOP

With the Cougars' 3-2 win in the finale of a Conference USA series against USF on April 24, 2005, at Cougar Field, head coach Rayner Noble became the winningest coach in program history.

Noble broke out of a tie with the man who coached him at UH, Rolan Walton, when he recorded his 379th career win.

TO THE TOP OF THE LIST

When the Cougars opened their 2006 season against Texas-San Antonio on Feb. 7, 2006, head coach Rayner Noble moved to the top of the UH records book in another category.

That season opener was the 674th career game that Noble has led the Cougars and moved him into sole possession of first place in UH career history.

He moved out of a tie with former head coach Lovette Hill, who coached 673 games from 1950-74.

Noble already is the program's winningest head coach, moving past former head coach Rolan Walton's 378 wins (1975-86) in 2005.

RICE TIES

After serving as an assistant coach at Houston from 1987-90, Noble worked at Rice as an assistant coach from 1991-94 before returning to UH as the skipper.

He worked under current Rice head coach Wayne Graham for the last three years of that stint.

During his tenure with the Owls, Noble's Rice teams posted a combined record of 115-99 (.537), including a 9-6 (.600) record against the Houston Cougars.

ANOTHER MILESTONE

With the Cougars' 15-1 win over Marshall during the series finale on March 26, 2006, Noble competed in the 700th win of his UH career as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

As a player (1980-83) and assistant coach (1987-90), Noble was a part of 294 UH victories. The victory over the Thundering Herd gave him 406 wins as the Cougar skipper for a grand total of 700.

Noble picked up his 600th career win in a Cougar uniform with a 7-3 win at Sam Houston State on March 25, 2004.
