C-USA WEEKLY AWARDS

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jermaine Taylor, UCF Senior, G, Tavares, Fla.

Taylor led UCF to an 85-60 win over Valparaiso, scoring a game-high 21 points on a 7-of-10 shooting performance from the floor. The senior made 6-of-8 3-point field goal attempts. The six triples tied for seventh on UCF's single-game 3-pointers made register. The shooting guard also added three rebounds and a pair of assists in just 26 minutes. During the game, he moved to third all-time at UCF with 183 career treys. This is Taylor's first C-USA Player of the Week honor this season and third of his career.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Aubrey Coleman, Houston Junior-JC, G, Houston, Texas

Coleman repeats as C-USA Rookie of the Week, and earns his third honor of the season, after leading the Cougars with a career-high 28 points, seven rebounds and five steals against Iowa State on Sunday. He scored nine straight Cougar points near the end of the game and assisted on the final 3-pointer that pulled UH to within three points with 10 seconds remaining in the game. It was Coleman's third 20-point game this season, and the highest scoring output by a Cougar this season. The guard played all 40 minutes for the first time in his career.

SHOOTING STARS

- Marshall hit 24-of-25 free throws to lead to a 74-60 win against Tennessee State Sunday. Sophomore F **Tirrell Baines** was a perfect 8-of-8 from the line for a team-high 18 points.
- Rice guards **Rodney Foster** and **Lawrence Ghoram** combined for 32 points, nine rebounds and six assists to lead the Owls to a 79-72 victory at Arkansas-Little Rock Sunday.
- Houston junior G **Aubrey Coleman** scored a career-high 28 points and contributed seven rebounds and five steals against Iowa State Sunday.
- East Carolina sophomore **Brock Young** led the Pirates with 16 points, eight rebounds and three assists in a road game at Coastal Carolina Sunday. Young is currently the top playmaker in the nation, averaging 7.92 assists per game.
- UAB senior G **Robert Vaden** scored 22 points against No. 19 Louisville on Saturday. It was the eighth time this season he has reached the 20-point plateau.
- Junior G **Jeremy Wise** scored 17 of his game-high 19 points for Southern Miss in a 68-49 victory over Weber State Tuesday. Wise was also 4-of-4 from the free throw line to extend his school-record consecutive free throws made streak to 38. He set a single-game C-USA record with a 19-of-19 free-throw performance on Dec. 18.
- Tulsa won its 18th-straight game at the Reynolds Center with an 88-79 win against UT-Arlington on Dec. 23. It ties as the nation's eighth-longest current home court winning streak in NCAA Division I.
- TU junior **Ben Uzoh** scored 16 of his game-high 25 points against UTA in the first half.
- SMU senior C **Bamba Fall** scored a team-high 14 points at Northwestern Tuesday and added game-highs of nine rebounds and five blocks and a career-high three steals.
- Senior G **Jermaine Taylor** scored 21 points and the Knights shot 63.3 percent as UCF rolled to an 85-60 win over Valparaiso Dec. 22.
- Freshman G **Tyreke Evans** scored 20 points off the bench and four other Tigers finished in double figures as Memphis defeated Drexel, 87-49, in a Dec. 22 afternoon tilt.
- UTEP senior G **Stefan Jackson** scored 33 points in an 84-69 win over New Mexico State on Dec. 20. It was Jackson's ninth career 30-point game and moved him past Charlotte's Demarco Johnson into seventh place on the C-USA career scoring chart. Jackson now has 1,784 career points, which is 47 shy of the UTEP school record.
- Sophomore G **Julyan Stone** dished out a career-high 12 assists in the Miners' win. That total tied for the fourth-best effort in school history.

3,000 AND COUNTING

Conference USA coaches have combined for more than 3,000 career wins over their careers. The league boasts some of the winningest coaches in NCAA Division I (Houston's **Tom Penders** with 615 career wins and Rice's **Ben Braun** with 557), three National Coaches of the Year (Memphis' **John Calipari**, SMU's **Matt Doherty** and Southern Miss' **Larry Eustachy**) and seven coaches who have been on the NCAA Final Four sidelines (Calipari, UAB's **Mike Davis**, Doherty, Marshall's **Donnie Jones**, Tulane's **Dave Dickerson**, Tulsa's **Doug Wojcik** and UTEP's **Tony Barbee**). UCF's **Kirk Speraw** and East Carolina's **Mack McCarthy** also have more than 300 career wins. Only the Big East, with 16 coaches, and Atlantic Coast Conference and Big Ten coaches have combined for more than 3,000 wins. More info on the success of C-USA coaches can be found on page 6.

MORE "GRAND" NEWS

Memphis senior **Robert Dozier** became the fifth Conference USA player this season to reach the 1,000-point plateau for his career. Dozier reached the mark on Dec. 20 against No. 11 Syracuse and now has 1,016 points. UAB senior **Paul Delaney III** reached 1,000 earlier that week and became the second Blazer this season. Delaney joined teammate **Lawrence Kinnard**, who reached the milestone Nov. 26 during the Blazers' game against then-No. 11 Oklahoma in the NIT Season Tip-Off semifinals at New York City's Madison Square Garden. Two others reached the exclusive 1,000-Point Club last month. Southern Miss senior guard **Courtney Beasley** hit the 1,000-point mark on Nov. 21 - the same night he recorded his third career double-double (13 points, 10 rebounds) in a 74-61 win against Alabama State. Tulsa junior guard **Ben Uzoh** became the 32nd player in school history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau in TU's 67-56 win over Texas A&M on Nov. 29.

Dozier made it a perfect 10 current C-USA players with more than 1,000 points, joining five who were already in the club -- UTEP senior **Stefon Jackson**, UCF's **Jermaine Taylor**, **Jeremy Wise** of Southern Miss, Marshall's **Markel Humphrey** and UAB's **Robert Vaden**. Jackson, who averages 23.6 ppg, currently ranks seventh overall on the C-USA career scoring chart with 1,784 points and needs just 49 points to move into sixth place. Dozier's teammate **Antonio Anderson** is waiting by the ropes with 972 career points.

EAST CAROLINA (8-4, 0-0)

Sophomore G **Brock Young** led East Carolina with 16 points and eight rebounds, but host Coastal Carolina defeated the Pirates, 63-55, on Sunday afternoon. ECU's leading scorer, senior **Sam Hinnant**, was held to nine points and did grab six rebounds. Young, the nation's top playmaker in NCAA Division I (averaging 7.92 assists per game), was also credited with three helpers. The Pirates close out their non-conference regular season against No. 16 Clemson on Saturday. Tip-off is 4 p.m. EST.



HOUSTON (7-2, 0-0)

Junior G **Aubrey Coleman** scored a career high 28 points and added five steals, but Iowa State escaped with a 71-67 win over Houston Sunday. Playing all 40 minutes for the first time in his career, Coleman converted 10-of-24 attempts from the field and 8-of-10 free throws to lead the Cougars. His point total was the highest by any Cougar this season. Junior G **Kelvin Lewis**, playing all 40 minutes as well, finished with 15 points, while senior C **Marcus Cousin** topped UH with 11 rebounds. The loss also snapped the Cougars' seven-game overall winning streak and was the program's first home loss since an 89-78 setback to #1 Memphis on Jan. 30, 2008. The Cougars play host to Massachusetts at 1 p.m. CT on Tuesday.



MARSHALL (7-5, 0-0)

Marshall led by 21 (42-21) at the half against Tennessee State and held on for a 74-60 win on Sunday at the Cam Henderson Center. Marshall had a superb night at the free-throw line, sinking 24-of-25 attempts. Sophomore F **Tirrell Baines** went 8-for-8 from the line and redshirt junior G **Chris Lutz** sank 6-of-6. Lutz scored a season-high 17 points (3-for-7 3FG) while Baines netted a team-high 18 points with six rebounds. Four of Baines' six boards were from the offensive glass, helping the Herd to a 33-28 rebounding advantage. Senior G/F **Markel Humphrey** contributed eight points and six rebounds even after suffering a deep bone bruise in his left foot Dec. 23 at Dayton. Freshman **Damier Pitts** added 14 points, six assists and three steals. Marshall went 5-2 in December for its first five-win December since 2001 (5-1). The Herd will play defending WCC champion San Diego on Jan. 2 at 7 p.m. PT. The Herd dealt the Toreros, who would go on to defeat UConn in the first-round of the NCAA Tournament, a 76-60 defeat at the Henderson Center last December.



MEMPHIS (7-3, 0-0)

Freshman G **Tyreke Evans** scored 20 points off the bench and four other Tigers finished in double figures as Memphis pulled away early to defeat Drexel, 87-49, in a Monday afternoon tilt. Evans was 8-of-14 from the field. Senior F **Robert Dozier** had 14 points for Memphis on 6-of-9 shooting, while junior F **Shawn Taggart** finished with 13 points and seven rebounds. Juniors **Roburt Sallie** and **Doneal Mack** added 11 and 10 points, respectively. Memphis was ranked No. 23 in the AP poll before Saturday's 72-65 loss to Syracuse dropped the Tigers into the receiving votes category at No. 26. That snapped a string of 64 weeks in the Top 25, as Memphis was last unranked at the end of the 2004-05 season. The Tigers are in the midst of a seven-game home-stand and will welcome Cincinnati tonight for an 8 p.m. tip on ESPN2.



RICE (5-7, 0-0)

Senior G **Rodney Foster** and junior G **Lawrence Ghoram** each scored 16 points as Rice came back to beat host UALR, 79-72, Sunday. Ghoram was 7-for-9 from the field and also had five rebounds in 19 minutes of play off the bench. Foster added six assists, four rebounds and two steals. Freshman F **Lucas Kuipers** finished with 15 points, going 6-for-12 from the field, while sophomore C **Trey Stanton** added 10 points and seven rebounds. Rice made 10 of its final 12 free throws to ice the victory. The Owls also outrebounded UALR 39-27 and 15 offensive rebounds led to 20 second-chance points. Rice heads into a New Year's Eve game against Texas A&M. Tip-off is 3 p.m. CT at Tudor Fieldhouse.



SMU (3-6, 0-0)

Senior C **Bamba Fall** led SMU with 14 points on 7-of-11 shooting, but SMU dropped a 66-55 decision to host Northwestern on Tuesday. Fall also had game-highs of nine rebounds and five blocks with a career-best three steals. He became the second SMU player to reach 200 career blocks as he upped his total to 202. At SMU, he trails only Jon Koncak's 278 career blocks. SMU forced 18 turnovers by Northwestern, which only averages 11.8 per game, and scored 21 points off the miscues. The Mustangs also got 12 points from freshman F **Robert Nyakundi**, which hit all four of his three-point shots. Sophomore G/F **Alex Malone** added nine points in just 10 minutes, all in the second half. The Mustangs play the next four games at home. The stretch starts tonight when UT-San Antonio visits Moody Coliseum for a 7 p.m. CT tip. That is followed by a New Year's Eve matinee when Texas A&M-Corpus Christi comes to Dallas for a 2 p.m. contest on Dec. 31.

SOUTHERN MISS (8-4, 0-0)

Junior G **Jeremy Wise** scored 17 of his game-high 19 points in the opening half and Southern Miss converted 63 percent from the floor in the second half in a 68-49 victory over Weber State Tuesday in the final game of the Mississippi Gulf Coast Classic in Biloxi. The Golden Eagles won their fourth consecutive contest as seniors **Courtney Beasley** and **Craig Craft** chipped in 18 and 13 points, respectively. Wise scored 13 of the Golden Eagles' first 15 points and also extended his school-record consecutive free throw made streak to 38, hitting 4-of-4 for the contest. The Golden Eagles return to Biloxi to play Ole Miss on Tuesday at the Mississippi Coast Coliseum. Tip off is 7 p.m. CST and will be televised on CSS.



TULANE (5-6, 0-0)

Senior F **Daniel Puckett** led three Green Wave players into double figures with 20 points, but Binghamton slipped past Tulane, 74-73, Saturday afternoon. The two teams traded the lead 16 times and the contest featured 10 ties. The Bearcats led by six points with nine seconds remaining, when junior G **Kevin Sims** fed senior **Robinson Louisme** for a dunk and Sims drained a long trey at the buzzer for the final score. Sophomore G **Kris Richard** finished with 15 points, while Sims chipped in 11 points and five assists. Puckett also grabbed a team-best seven boards. Tulane hosts Grambling State tonight for a 7 p.m. CST tip at Fogelman Arena.



TULSA (8-4, 0-0)

Junior G **Ben Uzoh** scored 16 of his 25 points in the first half to lead Tulsa to a 88-79 victory over Texas-Arlington Tuesday night. It was the 18th straight win for the Golden Hurricane at the Donald W. Reynolds Center. Sophomore G **Glenn Andrews** added 20 points for the Golden Hurricane, who had five players in double figures. Junior C **Jerome Jordan** finished with 12 points, 13 rebounds and five blocks. Senior F **Ray Reese** and sophomore G **Justin Hurtt** also scored 12 points apiece. Tulsa has a week off before welcoming BYU to the Reynolds Center on Dec. 30. Tip-off is 7:05 p.m. CST and will be televised on the CBS College Sports Network.



UAB (8-4, 0-0)

Senior G **Robert Vaden** scored 22 points, but UAB dropped an 82-62 decision to No. 19 Louisville on Saturday. Vaden's 22 points marked the eighth time this season he has reached the 20-point plateau. Senior F **Lawrence Kinnard** finished with 19 points and eight boards, while classmate **Paul Delaney III** added 16 points six steals and four assists for the Blazers. Vaden, who scored 33 points at Freedom Hall last year in a neutral site win over Kentucky, got off to another hot start. He knocked down three 3-pointers in the first seven minutes but eventually cooled as Louisville wore him down by throwing body after body at him. Vaden hit three of his first four 3-pointers but made just one of his last eight. The Blazers will not have much rest as they face another tough test on Tuesday night, when UAB takes on No. 25 Butler at 6 p.m. CST.



UCF (6-4, 0-0)

Senior G **Jermaine Taylor** scored 21 points and the Knights shot 63.3 percent as UCF rolled to an 85-60 win over Valparaiso Monday. The Knights, who hit 13 3-pointers, never trailed during the contest. UCF's field-goal percentage was the seventh-highest mark in school history. Taylor connected on 7-of-10 field goals and made 6-of-8 shots from deep to score 15 of his points before the half. Off the bench, freshman G **Isaac Sosa** hit all four of his 3-point field goal attempts and finished with 15 points in just 14 minutes. Freshman **A.J. Rompza** totaled seven assists. Junior F **Tony Davis** scored 11 points and also grabbed a game-high six rebounds. With the win, the Knights improved to 4-0 at home this year as they began a six-game homestand. The Knights return to action tonight at 7 p.m., hosting Penn on the opening day of the UCF Holiday Classic.



UTEP (6-4, 0-0)

Senior **Stefon Jackson** scored 33 points and the Miners harassed New Mexico State into a 32.8-percent shooting night on their way to an 84-69 triumph over their I-10 rivals. UTEP outscored the Aggies 45-36 in the second half and shot 54.2 percent from the field. The end result was the first split of the I-10 series since the 2001-02 season. One team had swept the other in each of the last six years. It was Jackson's ninth career 30-point game, tying him for the second-best total in school history and sliding him past Charlotte's Demarco Johnson into seventh place on the C-USA career scoring chart. He now has 1,784 career points and is just 47 shy of the school record. Sophomore G **Randy Culpepper** added 11 first-half points and freshman F/G **Jason Jones** supplied eight points, seven rebounds, two assists and a steal. Sophomore G **Julyan Stone** dished out a career-high 12 assists, tied for the fourth in school history. UTEP has been on a nine-day holiday break and returns to action tonight against James Madison at the Cable Car Classic in Santa Clara, Calif. Tip is 9 p.m. MST.

DOZIER AND VADEN ON NAISMITH EARLY SEASON LIST

Memphis senior F **Robert Dozier** and UAB senior G/F **Robert Vaden** have both been named to the 2008-09 Naismith Trophy early-season watch list, the Atlanta Tip-Off Club announced on Thursday. The Naismith Trophy watch list is compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2008-09 college basketball season. The watch list does not include incoming freshmen, although those student-athletes will be considered in the first vote in February, 2009. The Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T will be awarded at the 2009 NCAA Men's Final Four in Detroit, Mich.

C-USA TRIO LISTED AMONG WOODEN AWARD HOPEFULS

Three C-USA men's basketball players have been selected as a candidate for the 2009 John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy, as announced by Richard "Duke" Llewellyn, Wooden Award Chairman and founder. Memphis senior F **Robert Dozier**, UTEP senior G **Stefon Jackson** and UAB senior G/F **Robert Vaden** are among 50 student athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. The trio is among 42 schools and 13 conferences represented on the preseason list. In mid-January, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 30 list, then the National Ballot will consist of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation. The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament.

TULANE'S SIMS NAMED TO BOB COUSY WATCH LIST

Tulane junior point guard **Kevin Sims** is one of 34 players from around the nation, and the lone representative from Conference USA, to be named to the 2009 Bob Cousy Award Watch List. Sims has started 61 of 71 games and has produced 811 points and 265 assists in three seasons, and he is one of the top guards in C-USA.

The Bob Cousy Award presented by The Hartford is given to the top collegiate male basketball point guard annually spanning across all divisions within the game by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The selection criteria emphasize leadership, team work, success, and fundamentals as being critical parts for the game of basketball as a point guard.

TULSA EXTENDS REYNOLDS CENTER WINNING STREAKS

Tulsa has now won 28-straight non-conference games at the Donald W. Reynolds Center, and has won its last 18 home games overall at the Reynolds Center. The 28 victories tie as Tulsa's longest non-league winning streak in school history, established on Dec. 11, 1982 with a 75-53 win over Henderson State and ended on Dec. 18, 1986 with a 53-51 loss against Colorado. The last homecourt loss came last season against No. 1-ranked Memphis, 56-41, on Jan. 23, 2008. The last non-conference homecourt loss came against North Texas on Jan. 2, 2006. Tulsa's record at the Donald W. Reynolds Center is 125-36 overall and 57-13 in non-conference games since the arena opened in December 1998.

BRAUN TABBED TO GUIDE OWLS

Ben Braun, who guided the University of California at Berkeley to more postseason appearances and postseason wins than any other basketball coach in school history, was introduced as the 23rd head men's basketball coach at Rice University on April 7. During his 12-year tenure at Cal, Braun directed the Bears to five NCAA Tournament berths and three trips to the NIT. He led the 1998 Bears to a berth in the NCAA Sweet 16 and to an NIT championship in 1999. During his career, he has coached more than a dozen players who have gone on to play in the NBA. With additional head coaching stops at Eastern Michigan and Siena Heights, Braun entered the season ranked 10th among all active Division I coaches with 552 victories. He was 219-154 in his 12 seasons at Berkeley and ranked second among active Pac-10 coaches in overall wins and Pac-10 wins (110). The 1997 Pac-10 Coach of the Year and a finalist for the 2003 Naismith National Coach of the Year, Braun entered the season with a 31-year career mark of 552-389. He finished his Cal career with a .594 winning percentage, which was the best at the school since Hall of Famer Pete Newell guided the Bears to a 119-44 mark from 1955-60. Braun's players have proved to be successful both on the court and in the classroom, with Golden Bears earning Pac-10 All-Academic recognition 14 times under his direction.

ALL-STAR COACHES

Conference USA boasts some of the top coaches in the nation. Check out the credentials of C-USA's leading men:

- Seven Conference USA head coaches have coached in the final four, two (**John Calipari**/Memphis & UMass and **Mike Davis**/Indiana) as head coaches who have advanced to the title game.
- **Donnie Jones** was on staff for the 2006 and 2007 Florida national championship teams, **Dave Dickerson** was an assistant coach for the 2002 Maryland national champions and **Mike Davis** was head coach of the national runners-up that same season.
- Conference USA head coaches have combined for 3,037 career wins (see below).
- Houston head coach **Tom Penders** reached the 600-win plateau, while Rice head coach **Ben Braun** has 550-plus victories.
- Memphis head coach **John Calipari** was named the 2007-08 Naismith National Coach of the Year by the Atlanta Tip-Off Club.
- Southern Miss head coach **Larry Eustachy** was named the 2000 AP National Coach of the Year, then SMU head coach **Matt Doherty** took the honor the following year in 2001.

C-USA REPRESENTED IN FINAL FOUR CHOICES

Among 10 hopefuls vying for NCAA Men's Basketball Final Four hosting duties, Conference USA schools successfully earned bids for the premier events in 2012 (New Orleans) and 2016 (Houston). Mike Slive, commissioner of the Southeastern Conference and chair of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee, made the announcement of sites for 2012 through 2016. The University of Houston and Rice University are already scheduled to host the 2011 NCAA Final Four, and will have the event return in 2016. Tulane University and the city of New Orleans will be hosting its fifth NCAA Final Four in 2012, also earning bids in 2003, 1993, 1987 and 1982.

Additionally, north Texas was awarded the 2014 NCAA Final Four to be played at the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas. North Texas is also the home to the Conference USA headquarters, as well as C-USA member institution SMU. It will be the second men's Final Four in the area as Reunion Arena in Dallas hosted the 1986 NCAA Final Four.

CONFERENCE USA GOES INTERNATIONAL

Conference USA men's basketball was represented on two different continents over the summer. A contingent of Conference USA "All Stars" led by Memphis head coach **John Calipari**, Tulsa head coach **Doug Wojcik** and UTEP head coach **Tony Barbee** were in China as student-athletes from all three schools, as well as Southern Miss, played three games in three different cities during a week-long trip. The trip was arranged through Memphis' relationship with the Chinese Basketball Association. The 12-man team featured All-Conference USA selections **Antonio Anderson**, **Robert Dozier**, **Ben Uzoh** and **Jeremy Wise**. The all-star squad, which wore C-USA uniforms, played exhibition games against the Chinese Olympic team (who were without the services of Yao Ming and Yi Jianlian) throughout the Guangdong Province on the southern coast of China.

SMU, under the direction of head coach **Matt Doherty**, went to Africa to play exhibition games and teach clinics in Senegal and South Africa during a 12-day trip. The trip began with four days in Dakar, Senegal, where the Mustangs played the Senegalese National Team and a game against the SEEDS Academy. There was also a visit to St. Louis, Senegal - the hometown of Mustangs **Bamba Fall** and **Papa Dia**. In South Africa, the team took a safari at Pilanesburg National Park and had a separate trip that visited Soweto and its memorials of the struggle against apartheid (that included a trip by Nelson Mandela's home). The squad also ran a youth clinic in Johannesburg and faced the South African National Team in an exhibition. Before departing, the team took an anthropology class called People of Africa, but the trip provided life-long lessons and great memories.
