Toledo Hosts High-Scoring Houston on Saturday Night; Begin Stretch with Four of Next Five Games in Savage Arena

TOLEDO, OH - Toledo (2-7) returns from a 10-day layoff on Saturday, Dec. 20 when it hosts Houston (6-1) in the first contest of a five-game stretch that will see the Rockets play in Savage Arena on four occasions.

UT will be looking to remove the sour taste from its mouth of a 50-35 defeat at Wright State on Dec. 9 when it takes on the red-hot Cougars. Since opening the season with a 65-63 loss to Georgia Southern, UH has won six games in a row and is averaging an impressive 81.1 ppg.

The Rockets opened Savage Arena with a thrilling 57-56 buzzer-beating triumph over UMass on Dec. 3 but followed that with a 67-58 setback at Oakland (Dec. 7) before losing to WSU.

Senior G **Tyrone Kent** is pacing UT's offense with 15.3 points per

game but was limited to three points on 1-of-4 shooting by the Raiders. Senior G **Jonathan Amos** also is scoring in double figures with 10.6 points per game in addition to leading the team in field-goal percentage (52.2), assists (25) and steals (12).

The Rockets are tied for fourth in the MAC with a +0.9 rebounding margin and will need to control the boards to contain Houston's high-powered offense.

Junior G Kelvin Lewis is leading the way for the Cougars offensively, averaging 18.9 points per game along with a 46.9 three-point FG%. Junior G Aubrey Coleman and senior C Marcus Cousin are also averaging in double figures with 16.6 and 14.4 ppg, respectively.

Houston is leading the nation in fewest turnovers per game, committing just 8.6 miscues per contest.

GENE CROSS TAKES OVER REINS OF ROCKET PROGRAM

Former Notre Dame assistant **Gene Cross** is in his first season at the Rockets' helm after being hired on April 11, 2008 as the 17th head coach in the 94-year history of the Toledo's men's basketball program.

Cross and the Rockets opened the 'new' Savage Arena with a memorable 57-56 win over UMass on Dec. 3. Sophomore **Justin Anyijong** tipped in the winning basket at the buzzer to give UT the victory.

"You couldn't have picked a better ending to win a game like this," Cross said. "It so exciting for all of our fans and especially for our guys. You should have seen the looks on their faces when I walked into the locker room. That's why you do this as a coach, to see the looks on their faces after the ball goes in and they experience a victory like that."

Cross served as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Notre Dame under head coach Mike Brey for the past two years. In both seasons, the Fighting Irish qualified for the NCAA Tournament, going 25-8 in 2007-08 and 24-8 in 2006-07.

Cross, a native of Chicago who played his college basketball at Il-

linois, also has been an assistant at Virginia, DePaul and Illinois-Chicago. He has been a part of teams that qualified for post-season play in each of the last seven years.

AN OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

Senior guard **Tyrone Kent** set a new Cintas Center record for most points by an opponent with a career-high 37 points (including 32 in the second half) in UT's loss at Xavier (Nov. 17).

Kent ranks eighth in the MAC in scoring with 15.3 ppg. He also ranks seventh in the conference with 2.11 treys per game and ninth with a 78.4 free-throw percentage.

The Chicago native has scored in double figures in seven of nine games this season and has led the Rockets in scoring on five occasions. He has improved his outside shooting this season, improving from last year's three-point mark of 31.1 to 38.0 in nine games this season.

KENT AND HIS SCORING TITLE

Tyrone Kent became the first Rocket to lead the Mid-American Conference in scoring in 27 years with 16.9 points per game last season. The last Toledo player to pace

ROCKET NEWS AND NOTES

BOARDWORK: The Rockets have made a dramatic improvement in the rebounding department from a year ago. UT is tied for fourth in the MAC in rebounding margin and is outrebounding its opponents by 0.9 rpg.

In 2007-08, UT was outrebounded by 6.4 rpg to rank last in the MAC.

TOUGH OPENING: Toledo has opened its 2008-09 campaign with the 21st-toughest schedule in the country, according to *USA Today's* Sagarin ratings through games played Dec. 16. Xavier and Florida rank sixth and 38th in the ratings, respectively.

THE WIN STREAK CONTINUES: Toledo won its 16th straight home opener with its 57-56 win over UMass on Dec. 3. The Rockets' last loss in their first home game was a 66-55 setback to Alaska-Fairbanks on Dec. 12, 1992.

KENT NAMED PRESEASON ALL-MAC WEST: Senior guard **Tyrone Kent** was named to the preseason MAC All-West Division team. Kent was an honorable-mention All-MAC selection last year after leading the league in scoring with 16.9 points per game.

ATLANTIC 10 FAMILIARITY: Toledo is facing four Atlantic 10 schools this year. UT lost at preseason favorite Xavier, 81-65, on Nov. 17 and posted a 57-56 win over UMass on Dec. 3. The Rockets will also host Dayton (9-1) on Jan. 2 and Rhode Island (8-3) on Jan. 6.

COACH NICHOLS COURT: The University of Toledo honored former basketball coach **Bob Nichols** before its home opener by officially dedicating the court in his honor in a pre-game ceremony.

Nichols coached at UT for 22 seasons from 1965-87, leading the Rockets to the NCAA Tournament in 1967, 1979 and 1980. The 1979 squad advanced to the Sweet 16 with a win over Iowa. Nichols' lifetime record at UT was 376-212, the most wins by any coach in MAC history.

Kent's scoring average was the lowest by a conference scoring leader since KSU's Jim Nowakowski tallied 17.9 points per game in 1951-52.

HITTING THE BOARDS

Tyrone Kent has provided the Rockets with a rebounding presence this season, especially on the defensive glass.

He ranks second on the team with a career-high 5.2 rpg and is tied for ninth in the MAC with 4.0 defensive rebounds per game.

Kent has grabbed six or more rebounds in six of his last seven contests.

AMOS IMPROVES ACCURACY

Senior **Jonathan Amos** leads the Rockets and is tied for fourth in the MAC with a 52.2 field-goal percentage.

BYRD BRINGING IT UP

After seeing action primarily at shooting guard last year, senior guard **Anthony Byrd** ranks fourth in the MAC with a team-high 34.0 minutes per game as UT's starting point guard.

Byrd ranks third on the team with 7.3 ppg and appears in the MAC rankings in three categories. He also is tied for 10th in three-point FGs per game (1.78) and 14th in three-point FG% (39.0).

Byrd put his name in the Rocket record book last year with his performance from the charity stripe. His 88.1 free-throw percentage (37-of-42) ranked sixth in school history.

Byrd shot 94.1 percent (32-of-34) his first two years as a collegian at Canisius and is shooting 90.8 percent (69-of-76) for his career. He has yet to attempt a free throw this season.

Rockets Picked to Finish Fourth in West by MAC News Media Association

The Toledo men's basketball program is picked to finish fourth in the MAC's West Division by the MAC News Media Association. DEFENSIVE DYNAMO

Senior **Jonathan Amos** has made his mark on the defensive end throughout his Rocket career. He has ranked in the MAC's Top 10 in steals in each of his three seasons in a Rocket uniform and ranks fourth at UT with 195 career steals.

Amos led the MAC with 2.6 steals per game last year and ranked eighth nationally. His 78 thefts last season were the third most in school history.

The Dallas, TX native also has improved his point production each year averaging 4.5 ppg as a freshman, 6.1 ppg as a sophomore and 12.1 ppg as a junior. He is averaging 10.6 ppg so

GETTING BACK INTO RHYTHM

Senior guard **Ridley Johnson** scored a season-high 17 points to lead Toledo to a 77-62 victory over West Georgia (Nov. 26). He played a season-best 25 minutes (at the time) in the contest and is averaging 5.6 ppg this season.

Johnson was slowed at the start of this season by his recovery from arthroscopic knee surgery in early October. He played eight and 12 minutes, respectively, in UT's first two games at Florida and Xavier.

The Boston, MA native ranked fourth on the team with 8.9 points per game last year and shot 30.8

ROCKETS FACING TOUGH SCHEDULE

The Rockets will be challenged by a non-conference schedule that includes seven schools which appeared in post-season play last year, including 2008 NCAA Elite Eight participant Xavier.

In total, the cumulative record (241-128) of its non-conference opponents is an impressive .653 winning percentage. Xavier was ranked No. 9 in last year's final RPI with seven other Rocket opponents appearing in the Top 100.

Toledo will face four Atlantic 10 members in addition to schools from the Southeastern Conference, Conference USA, Horizon League, Colonial Athletic Association, Summit League and Sun Belt Conference.

percent (48-of-156) from three-point range. His top performance of the season was a career-high 18-point showing at UMass (Dec. 15).

ANYIJONG'S EXTRA STRENGTH KEYS QUICK START

Sophomore forward **Justin Anyijong's** hard work over the summer has paid off for the Rockets early in the 2008-09 campaign. The 6-9, 205-pound Grand Rapids, MI native added 15 pounds to his frame by hitting the weights and increasing his caloric intake.

Anyijong ranks fourth on the team in scoring with 7.2 points per game and leads the team with 5.9 rebounds and 0.8 blocked shots per game. He blocked a shot in six straight contests (Nov. 17 - Dec. 3) and is tied for fifth in the MAC with 2.78 offensive rebounds per contest.

The East Grand Rapids, MI native registered his first double-digit scoring effort as a collegian against Florida (Nov. 14) with 11 points and also has scored 10 points against Cleveland State (Nov. 25) and West Georgia (Nov. 26). He also tipped in the winning basket at the buzzer in UT's 57-56 win over UMass (Dec. 3).

FRESHMEN GETTING THEIR FEET WET

Toledo has seven first-year players on its 2008-09 roster, and the Rockets are beginning to receive contributions from them as they become adjusted to collegiate game.

Ian Salter is averaging 2.2 points and 2.2 rebounds in 16.4 minutes per game, while **Emeka Okafor** is averaging 1.8 points and 2.7 boards in 11.3 minutes per contest. Salter scored a season-best six points in a season-high 25 minutes vs. UMass (Dec. 3), while Okafor grabbed a season-best six boards at Wright State (Dec. 9).

Freshman point guards **Larry Bastfield** and **Clayton Sterling** have also made their presence felt at times.

Bastfield scored a season-best six points vs. Cleveland State (Nov. 25), while Sterling dished out a season-high three assists vs. West Georgia (Nov. 24).

Redshirt freshman **Terrance Tubbs** has sat out the last seven games with a shoulder injury, while freshman **Stephen Albrecht** is sidelined until at least the end of December due to back surgery. Freshman **Zac Taylor** has been slowed by knee surgery in the fall and has played two games.

HOMECOURT SUCCESS

Toledo is looking to carry over its homecourt success from Savage Hall to the brand-new court of Savage Arena.

The Rockets have posted an impressive 56-8 (.875) record at home since the start of the 2003-04 campaign.

UT's only setbacks during that span are to Eastern Michigan in 2003-04, Miami in 2004-05, Northern Illinois and Ohio in 2005-06, Old Dominion in 2006-07 and Vanderbilt, Delaware and Western Michigan in 2007-08.

A DIVERSE GROUP

Toledo's 13-player roster originates from 10 different states. This year's Rockets hail from California, Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, New York, Ohio and Texas.

THREE-POINT DISCUSSION

Toledo is averaging just 14.4 three-point field-goal attempts this season after putting up 19.5 shots from behind the arc last year.

SIZE COMING TO ROCKETS' PROGRAM IN 2009-10

Head Coach **Gene Cross'** vision for the Toledo basketball program is to become bigger, stronger and to control the paint. The Rockets' first-year head coach put the wheels in motion to accomplish just that with the signing of three student-athletes to national letters of intent during the early signing period.

Cross said that 6-8, 245-pound forward/center **Jordan Dressler** (Columbia, MO), 6-8, 210-pound forward **Hayden Humes** (Valparaiso, IN) and 6-9, 210-pound forward/center **Devin Russell** (Toledo, OH) will each be joining UT's program starting in the 2009-10 campaign.

"We're very pleased with the quality student-athletes who have decided to become a part of our program next year," Cross said. "We're adding a lot of size with this class, because ideally we want to be able to compete with anyone we're going to face."

Dressler is expected to provide the Rockets an inside presence and someone with the potential to produce double-doubles on a nightly basis. He posted a team-high 17.8 points and 12.8 rebounds per contest for Rock Bridge High School's 24-3 squad as a junior en route to earning a spot on the Missouri Basketball Coaches Association's Class 5 All-State Team.

Humes possesses a nice shooting touch and has made his mark at the prep level as a face-the-basket type of player. He averaged 12.5 points, 5.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game for Valparaiso High School last year.

Russell adds another big body to the Rockets' frontcourt and is someone who can alter opponent shots and help UT control the boards. He led the City League in rebounding as a junior with 12.6 boards per contest for Start High School in addition to averaging 9.5 points and 3.0 blocked shots per game.

can't have a good team without good leadership."

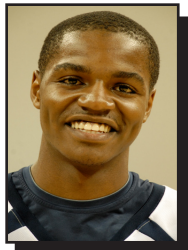
