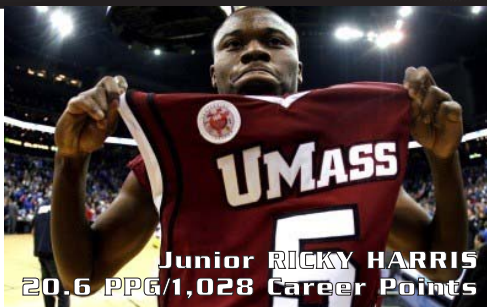

## RED-HOT UMass CLOSSES 2008 AT HOUSTON, TUESDAY

- The team which UMass opened its memorable 2008 year with is the same team the Minutemen will finish the year with. UMass travels to Houston to take on the Cougars for the final game of the calendar year as the team will tip off at 2 p.m. (ET)/1 p.m. (CT). The game time was moved earlier to accommodate Houston's football team playing in the Armed Forces Bowl on Wednesday at 11 a.m., allowing Cougars fans to attend both games easily. The Minutemen's eventful 2008 featured a run to the NIT Finals last April and the hiring of native son and four-time A-10 Champion Derek Kellogg later that month.
- UMass is riding a four-game win streak which raised their record to 5-6 overall under first-year head coach Derek Kellogg. Houston had its seven-game winning streak broken on Sunday night as the Cougars lost to Iowa State, 71-67 at Hofheinz Pavilion.
- Following Tuesday's game, the lone road game in a span of four of five games at home, UMass will return home to host Vanderbilt on Saturday at 5 p.m. That game is a special one as it is the Jack Leaman Legacy Game, where proceeds from the ticket sales go to benefit the Leaman Legacy Fund, to benefit scholarships. Saturday will also be 1960s Night as part of the 100 Seasons of UMass Basketball Celebration. More than 25 former players from the decade are expected to attend. Tip-off is just after 5 p.m. in the nationally-televised game on CBS College Sports.
- After the Vanderbilt game, UMass will play a home game at the MassMutual Center in Springfield against Dayton on Jan. 10 to open the Atlantic 10 portion of its schedule. That game has been moved to a 1 p.m. start and will be televised locally on CBS3 Springfield.

### Top Tidbits

- UMass played its first game of 2008 against Houston, beating the Cougars 95-89 in Jan. 2. In the calendar of 2008, UMass has posted a 20-15 record including a run to the 2008 NIT Finals.
- Over UMass' four-game win streak, UMass is shooting 48 percent from the floor and 44 percent from 3-point range. Opponents are shooting just 37 percent overall and 27 percent from 3-point land.
- Ricky Harris became the 40th UMass player with 1,000 career points on a free throw with 9:50 left in the first half vs. Hofstra. Harris stands 37th with 1,028 to date. Up next are: No. 36 Derick Claiborne (1,033), No. 35 David Brown (1,037), No. 34 Charlton Clarke (1,041), No. 33 Dana Dingle (1,043).
- Harris, who is 23rd in the NCAA in scoring at 20.6, has led UMass in scoring in eight of 11 games this year including the last four of the last five.
- Tony Gaffney is fifth in the NCAA in rebounding (11.9) and second in blocked shots (5.1). He came into the year averaging 3.8 rebounds and 1.1 blocks.
- Gaffney has six double-doubles this season after none in 81 career college games entering 2008-09.
- Chris Lowe is averaging 9.2 assists in his last five games with 10 or more in four of those five games. All 11 career game with 10 or more assists have come in his last 24 games. Lowe is tied for 13th in the NCAA in APG with 6.6.

- This road game comes in the middle of UMass hosting a stretch of five of seven games in Amherst, starting with the Boston College game on Dec. 6 until the Vanderbilt game on Jan. 3. If you include the Jan. 10 game against Dayton in Springfield (which will be counted as a home game), UMass has a run of seven of 10 games at the Mullins Center until Jan. 17. The Hofstra game on Dec. 20 began six straight Saturdays of home games until Jan. 24 against La Salle.
- Tuesday's game can be heard on the UMass Sports Network across the state. Flagship station WRNX 100.9 (Springfield) and 830 AM WCRN in Worcester. "Voice of the Minutemen" **Josh Maurer**, will call the action with **Tim Kenney** and former Minuteman **Tim Collins**.

## MINUTEMEN CLICKING IN FOUR-GAME WIN STREAK

- After a slow 1-6 start, UMass has kicked it into gear winning four in a row. There are some distinct statistics that show UMass marked improvement.
- In scoring, UMass is posting 73.8 points per game and allowing just 64.2 points per game. Prior to the win streak in the six-game losing run, UMass was scoring 68.2 and allowing 76.8 per game. UMass has taken it scoring margin from -8.6 to +9.6.
- From the floor, UMass is doing the job on both offense and defense. In the last four games, UMass is shooting 47.9 from the floor overall and a sparkling 44.0 from new 3-point line. On defense, UMass is holding foes to 37.3 from the floor and a tremendous 26.8 from beyond the arc. Prior to the win streak in the losing run, UMass shot 41.1 from the floor and 34.5 from 3-point land. On defense, the Minutemen allowed foes to 46.6 overall and 36.0 from the triffecta circle.
- Some other key stats. Turnovers are down from 19.7 in the 6-game skid to 14.5 in the last four games. UMass has also handed out 18.8 assists per game compared to 11.8 in the losing games. That is keyed by **Chris Lowe** who has 10 or more assists in four of the last five games. UMass has taken its assists-to-turnover ratio from -0.6 in the losing skid to +1.3 in the winning games.
- Overall, the players scoring averages are similar for the most part with two major differences, **Matt Glass**, who was inserted into the starting line-up four games ago -- the start of the win streak -- is scoring 7.3 per game after just 1.8 in the 6-game skid. Also, **Luke Bonner** has returned with 10.0 additional points after being hurt during the 6-game losing run.

## LAST YEAR'S UMASS-HOUSTON MEETING

- After scoring just one point in the first half, **Etienne Brower** scored 17 points and grabbed eight rebounds in the second half to lead UMass (11-2) to a 95-89 victory over Houston (11-1) on Jan. 2, 2008 in a matchup of up-tempo teams at the Mullins Center. **Gary Forbes** led all scorers with 19 points. **Chris Lowe** tallied 18 points on 7-for-11 shooting and **Ricky Harris** rounded out the four Minutemen in double-figures with 16 points and five assists. UMass trailed by as many as 13 late in the first half, but used an early second half run fueled by the energized home crowd to make the comeback.
- The Minutemen struggled to find their shooting touch early, connecting on five of their first 17 shots, including 2-for-11 from 3-point range, while falling behind, 18-14, 8:42 into the game. A **Luke Bonner** 3-point play pulled UMass to within one, 23-22, with 9:15 left, but the Cougars then went on a 8-1 run over a 41 second span to take a 31-23 lead. Two straight Forbes layups and a **Papa Lo** block ended the run, but Houston would outscore UMass, 17-10, over the final 6:35 of the half to send the Minutemen to the locker room down, 48-37.
- UMass was 14-for-35 (40.0%) from the floor in the first half, including 3-for-15 from 3-point range. Houston shot 18-for-34 (52.9%) and was 2-for-7 from behind the arc. The Cougars held a 22-19 advantage on the glass in the opening 20 minutes. Lowe led the Minutemen with 10 points on 5-for-6 shooting and Forbes added seven first half points. Houston was paced by **Tafari Toney** and **Robert McKiver** with 10 points each.

## HOUSTON-UMASS SERIES NOTES

- UMass and Houston are playing the second of a home-and-home series after starting the series last season for the first-ever meeting between the teams.
- UMass head coach **Derek Kellogg** has coached against the Cougars many times as an assistant coach under **John Calipari** for the last eight seasons at Memphis, a fellow Conference USA foe. During Kellogg's time at Memphis, the Tigers were 13-3 against Houston including a 5-1 mark at Hofheinz Pavilion since 2000.
- Houston coach **Tom Penders** is no stranger to UMass. He has coached at three Atlantic 10 schools in Fordham (1979-86 -- they were not in the A-10 during his tenure), Rhode Island (1986-88) and George Washington (1998-2001). All-time against the Minutemen, Penders is 7-5 after last season's loss at UMass. He was 1-0 at Fordham winning in 1982, 4-1 at Rhode Island and 2-3 with GW.
- Against schools from the current Conference USA, UMass is 7-5 (1-0 vs. Memphis, 1-1 vs. Memphis, 3-3 vs. Marshall, 1-0 vs. Central Florida, 1-0 vs. Tulsa and 0-1 vs. UAB). Earlier this season, UMass lost at

## This Date In UMass History

Dec. 30

- 1966: Led by 34 points from **Bill Tindall**, UMass beats Texas, 85-74, in the All College Tournament. Tindall finished the tournament with 98 points to earn him first team all-tournament honors.
- 1970: UMass wraps up the inaugural Hall of Fame Holiday Tournament with a 79-67 win over Colgate. **Julius Erving** averages 30.7 points and 25.3 rebounds/game in the three-game tournament on his way to MVP honors.
- 1981: The Minutemen top Navy, 64-61, to win the Providence Inkbank Classic. **Donald Russell**, who scored 37 points over the two games, including a win over North-eastern the previous day, is named tournament MVP.
- 1995: The Minutemen defeat Syracuse in the Rainbow Classic Finals in Honolulu, Hawaii, 65-57.

Memphis, the defending Conference USA Champion, 80-58 on Nov. 17 at the FedEx Forum. Prior to last season's game vs. the Cougars, the last game vs. a CUSA team was an 86-77 loss to UAB in the final Hall of Fame Tip-Off Classic on Nov. 25, 2004 in Springfield, Mass.

- Houston is 28-39 against Atlantic 10 teams, with the big chunk coming against former CUSA foes Saint Louis (12-24) and Charlotte (2-10).

## GAFFNEY AMONG THE NATIONAL LEADERS

- With his amazing start this season, UMass senior forward **Tony Gaffney** is ranked in the Top 5 in the NCAA in two major statistics. He is fifth in the country in rebounding with 11.9 per game. He is also second in blocked shots per game with 5.1. Gaffney is averaging a double-double with a 11.9 scoring average. Coming into the year, Gaffney's career averages were 3.4 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game. Gaffney is tied for 35th in steals per game with 2.4 per game.
- Gaffney is off to an amazing start in his senior season averaging a double-double with six double-doubles this season after none in his career in 81 games entering the season. He also had grabbed at least eight rebounds in 10 of 11 games and at least 11 in eight of the 11 games. His most recent double-double came in the win over IUPUI (12/27).
- Gaffney nearly had triple-doubles in back-to-back games on Dec. 6 and 10. In those contests he has a combined 32 points, 29 rebounds and 17 blocks. Against Holy Cross, (12/10), he had 17 points, 11 rebounds and eight blocks. That followed a titanic effort vs. Boston College (12/6) with 15 points, 18 rebounds and a career-high nine blocked shots. At #25/23 Kansas (12/13), he posted 13 rebounds and six blocks.
- Some of Gaffney's best performances of 2008-09 have come against national powers. One came against Boston College when he had 15 points, 18 rebounds, and a career-high nine blocked shots. His put-back of a missed **Chris Lowe** free throw sent the game to overtime, giving UMass a chance for its second-straight win over BC. His other outstanding game came at Memphis (11/17), *one which Memphis John Calipari called him the best player on the court.* Against the No. 13 Tigers, Gaffney scored 16 points and grabbed 19 rebounds along with five blocks. It was his second career double-double. He opened the year with 16 points and 13 rebounds against Arkansas-Monticello (11/11).
- Gaffney played 32 or more minutes in the first nine games, all more than any game he previously played at UMass. He set a career-high in minutes, playing 43 of the 45 against the Eagles. He played a then career-high 39 minutes when he had his third double-double with 20 points and 13 rebounds along with eight blocked shots vs. Jacksonville State (11/24) in the home opener. The 20 points were also a UMass high. He scored 20 while at Boston University against Stony Brook in 2006.

## LOWE MOVING UP ASSISTS CHART

- Chris Lowe** is moving up on the all-time assists list at UMass as he stands third with 557, just 76 shy of the all-time record. His 11 assists against Boston College (12/6) propelled him past **Alex Eldridge** (518) and into third place. Next on the list is **Edgar Padilla** (597). Carl Smith (633) is the all-time leader. *In the final 18 regular-season games, Lowe would need to average 4.3 assists to get the record before any possible postseason.*
- Lowe is tied with UNC's Ty Lawson in the NCAA with 6.6 assists per game, leading the A-10. He has led the league in assists in each of the last two years and would become the first player to lead the A-10 in assists for three years in a row.
- Lowe has five 10-assist games this season and 11 in his career, all in the last two seasons (**all in the last 24 games**). With 10 assists in each of the last two games vs. Hofstra (12/20) and IUPUI (12/27), Lowe has 46 assists in the last five games (9.2 per game). He has 10 or more in four of those five games with 12 vs. Holy Cross (12/10) and 11 against Boston College (12/6). That total of 46 games after he had 15 total in the previous five games. Lowe became the fourth player with 500 career assists at UMass after he gained five against Jacksonville State (11/24). He passed his coach **Derek Kellogg** (453) most recently at the end of last year.
- With a career-high 14 against La Salle (3/5/08) - part of the sixth triple-double in UMass history (14 pts, 10 reb), Lowe moved past UMass Hall of Famer **Joe DiSarcina** (431) into fifth. With five assists against CCSU (12/22), he passed BC Coach **Al Skinner** (320) and then with five more against Houston (1/2), he passed Louisville coach **Rick Pitino** (329).
- With his 214 assists last season, Lowe had the third-best single-season in UMass history after passing Smith (212), Smith (191), **Alex Eldridge** (174) and **Rick Pitino** (168). With a similar season as a senior, Lowe would become the all-time career assist leader Smith (633).

## HARRIS HITS 1,000TH CAREER POINT

- Ricky Harris became the 40th UMass player to score 1,000 career points on a free throw with 9:50 left in the first half against Hofstra (12/20). In 79 college games, Harris has 1,028 points to rank 37th in UMass history.
- He tallied 23 in the win over IUPUI and has 115 in his last five games (23.0 PPG) including a career-high 35 against Boston College (12/6) and 23 vs. Holy Cross (12/10). Prior to Harris, the last UMass player to reach the plateau was **Gary Forbes** (vs. La Salle on March 5, 2008), who did it in his two seasons with UMass as he finished his career with 1,128 in 69 games. Forbes is playing with the Sioux Falls Skyforce of the NBA's D-League.
- Next on the list for Harris to pass are No. 36 **Derick Claiborne** (1,033), No. 35 **David Brown** (1,037), No. 34 **Charlton Clarke** (1,041), No. 33 **Dana Dingle** (1,043) and No. 32 **Alex Eldridge** (1,053).
- Harris has picked up where he left off last season, when he was named the A-10 Chris Daniels Most Improved player. Harris is leading UMass with a 20.6 scoring average and led the team in scoring in eight of the first 11 games. **Harris is 23rd in the NCAA in scoring per game.** He dropped a season and career-high 35 points on BC (12/6). The 35 points were good for the 13<sup>th</sup> most in school history and only six behind the school record of 41 held by **Billy Tindall** on Feb. 10, 1968 vs. Vermont. It was also Harris' second ever 30+ point scoring effort. Two games prior, he netted 27 at Green Bay (11/29) and had 24 points at Southern Illinois (11/12).

- Junior Ricky Harris has also continued to blister from 3-point range. In 11 games, he is shooting 42.5 from beyond the new extended-distance arc. He has made 37-of-87 from 3-point range.
- Harris who tied **Carmelo Travieso** for the single-season mark for made treys last year with 104, is rising on the career charts. Harris stands sixth in career made 3-pointers with 158 and fifth in career attempts with 432. With four treys at Green Bay, he passed **Edgar Padilla** (136) and his coach **Derek Kellogg** (138). Next on the list at No. 5 is **Lorenzo Sutton** (178). On the attempts list, Harris is fifth pass Sutton (424), **James Life** (425) and **Edgar Padilla** (431) after passing Kellogg (362) earlier this season.

## UMASS 5-1 VS DEFENDING NCAA CHAMPS

- With the 61-60 over #25/23 Kansas (12/13), UMass is now 5-1 all-time against defending national champions, as the Minutemen have won three in a row against the champs. With last year's win over Florida in the NIT Semifinals, UMass has beaten the last two NCAA champs in their title defense year.
- UMass head coach **Derek Kellogg** has been a part of three of the wins over the champ as a player in 1993 and 1994 and the head coach in 2008 vs. Kansas.
- On Dec. 9, 2004 as the Minutemen downed No. 7 UConn at the Mullins Center, 61-59 as Rashaun Freeman scored with seconds left to lift UMass to the historic win. The game marked the first time a defending champion visited the Mullins Center.

- UMass knocked off North Carolina, 91-86, in overtime on Nov. 24, 1993 in the semifinals of the Preseason NIT at Madison Square Garden.
- One year later, UMass thumped Arkansas, 104-80, on Nov. 25, 1994 in the Tip-Off Classic at the Springfield Civic Center.
- That win over No. 1 Arkansas is symbolic, as it vaulted UMass to the No. 1 ranking in the AP poll for the first time in school history. Last week was the 14-year anniversary of the school's first No. 1 ranking, as the Minutemen played their first game as the No. 1 team on Dec. 3, 1994.
- UMass' only loss against a champ came on Nov. 22, 1999, as the Minutemen lost to UConn at Gampel Pavilion, 79-65, on Nov. 22, 1999.

## NOTES ON UMass' WIN OVER KANSAS

- UMass topped No. 25/23 Kansas, 61-60 on Dec. 13 in Kansas City. The UMass win was its first in 17 tries against a non-conference ranked team outside the state of Massachusetts. The win ended Kansas' 30-game home win streak (the game at KC was counted officially by the NCAA as a home game since it was part of the season-ticket package and was staffed by KU).
- UMass won a non-conference game against a ranked team, away from Massachusetts for the first time since it beat Georgetown in the 1996 NCAA Elite Eight on March 23, 1996.
- For head coach **Derek Kellogg** the win was sweet as his Minutemen picked up their first win over a ranked team under his watch in just his ninth game as a head coach. The previous fastest UMass coach to beat a ranked team was **Bruiser Flint**, who beat then-No. 19 Boston College in his 17th game as the head man on Jan. 18, 1997. Kellogg also gained a win against Kansas, the team which downed Memphis in the 2008 NCAA title game when Kellogg was an assistant for former UMass coach **John Calipari**.
- UMass beat a non-conference ranked team on the road for the first time since win at #21 Louisville on March 2, 1996, 62-59.
- UMass beat a non-conference ranked team for the first time since topping UConn, 61-59, on Dec. 9, 2004. Since that game, UMass is 4-7 against ranked teams (1-1 this season, losing at Memphis).
- UMass last beat a ranked team at #14 Dayton on the road last season, 82-71 on Jan. 16, 2008.
- The Minutemen have won the last two games against Kansas, winning at the Mullins Center in 1999. All-time Kansas leads the series, 3-2. All five games have been played in different states (New York, California, Kansas, Massachusetts and Missouri).

## GAME 1 - Nov. 11, 2008 2K Sports Classic First Round UMass 90, Ark.-Monticello 71

CARBONDALE, Ill. - Behind double-doubles from seniors Chris Lowe and Tony Gaffney, the Minutemen kicked off a new era of UMass men's basketball with a 90-71 win over Arkansas-Monticello in Derek Kellogg's head coaching debut on Tuesday evening. Lowe (18 points, 11 assists) finished just four assists shy of tying the school-record of 15 while Gaffney's double-double (16 points, 13 rebounds) was the first of his collegiate career. The final three minutes of the first half proved to be the difference as the Minutemen erased a two-point deficit with a 15-4 run to take a nine-point advantage heading into the locker room.

Junior Ricky Harris avenged a slow start to pour in 22 points, two rebounds, and three steals. He finished 7-of-19 from the floor and 5-of-9 from behind the three-point arc.

For the game, the Minutemen shot 46% (31-67) and 44% (12-27) from three-point range. Rebounds were even at 41-41, a number coming on the offensive end (18 for UMass and 19 for Arkansas-Monticello).

After surviving a first-half scare, the Minutemen came out strong out of the locker room to seal the victory in the second. Arkansas-Monticello wouldn't go away, pulling back within 11 at 67-56. Freshman David Gibbs responded with a three-pointer, the first collegiate points of his career, to make it 70-56.

Gaffney's alley-oop from freshman Tyrell Lynch was icing on the cake, making it 83-64 with three minutes remaining in the second half. The Minutemen would go on to open up two 21-point leads, their largest leads of the game, at 88-67 and 90-69.

UMass controlled play early in the first half, taking an 11-point advantage at 14-3 after senior Luke Bonner's three-pointer at the 16:06 mark. Arkansas-Monticello hung tough, eventually taking a 33-31 advantage, but the Minutemen answered with a 13-0 run (and 15-4 to end the half), for the 47-38 halftime lead.

## GAME 1 - Nov. 12, 2008 2K Sports Classic Second Round Southern Illinois 80, UMass 73

CARBONDALE, Ill. - Despite opening up a 15-point first half lead, the UMass men's basketball team couldn't hold off a charging Southern Illinois Salukis squad, which used a late 12-0 run to turn a two-point deficit into a 10-point advantage on its way to an 80-73 win on Wednesday night. Junior Ricky Harris (24 points) was the offensive star for the Minutemen while senior Tony Gaffney shined on the defensive end with a career-high seven blocks.

Harris impressed with a 7-for-14 shooting night, including 4-of-9 from behind the arc and 6-of-6 from the charity stripe. Sophomore Anthony Gurley chipped in with 15 points (5-for-10), 10 of which came in the first half.

Gaffney finished with six points and nine rebounds to go along with the seven blocks. He continued his high-energy pace from the get-go with a blocked shot less than five minutes into the game, springing freshman David Gibbs for a layup and the 14-4 lead. Gaffney later cleaned up freshman Tyrell Lynch's miss and scored on the put back to make it 30-20 in favor of the Minutemen.

Trailing by as many as 15, the Salukis used an 11-0 run spanning the end of the first half and the start of the second to pull right back within four at 39-35 with 18:26 still remaining. The Minutemen responded with two Lowe free throws and a Harris three pointer to reopen a nine-point advantage, 44-35.

Southern Illinois' hot streak continued, culminated by its first lead since it was 2-0, as Kevin Dillard's fourth three-point field goal of the second half made it 53-51 in favor of the Salukis with 11:55 remaining in the contest.

The back-and-forth half continued as the Minutemen responded with a 7-0 run to retake a five-point advantage at 58-53. The Salukis then used a run of their own (7-1) to retake a one-point lead at 60-59 with 6:42 remaining in the game.

The score was later tied at 60, 63, 65, and 67 before the Salukis took over with three minutes remaining to open up a 10-point lead at 77-67 after two Dillard free throws.

After Southern Illinois' Bryan Mullins scored the game's first points, UMass responded to close out the first half with a bang. The Minutemen went on to score seven-consecutive to make it 7-2 capped off with one of Harris' four threes. UMass opened up a double-figure lead, with its biggest advantage being 15 after a Lowe three-pointer at the 3:08 mark which made it 39-24.

GAME 3 - Nov. 17, 2008

#13/12 Memphis 80, UMass 58

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - Antonio Anderson had 15 points and a career-high 12 rebounds and No. 13 Memphis shook off a poor shooting performance to beat Massachusetts 80-58.

Freshman Tyreke Evans had 19 points and Robert Dozier added 18 for the Tigers, who were limited to 39 percent shooting for the game, including 2-of-19 outside the arc. It marked the second straight game where Evans, one of last season's prized recruits, has led the Tigers (2-0) in scoring. Evans keyed a first-half rally that put the Tigers up for good.

Ricky Harris led the Minutemen (1-2) with 17 points, while Tony Gaffney scored 16 points and grabbed a career-high 19 rebounds.

John Calipari became the winningest coach in Memphis history with 221 victories, surpassing Larry Finch, who led the program from 1986-1997.

The game was a meeting of mentor and pupil. Derek Kellogg, in his first year as coach at Massachusetts, played for Calipari from 1991-95 during Calipari's tenure as coach of the Minutemen. Kellogg was an assistant under Calipari for eight years at Memphis before moving to his alma mater.

Memphis built the lead to double digits in the first half and extended it to as many as 27 in the second half.

UMass was without 7-foot-1 senior center Luke Bonner, who injured his left knee in an 80-73 loss at Southern Illinois last week. In the second half Monday, the Minutemen lost 6-7 reserve forward Matt Hill to a left leg injury. But Gaffney's effort allowed UMass to rebound the Tigers 49-48.

While Memphis struggled from the field, UMass was even worse, shooting 30 percent. Add 24 turnovers, and the Minutemen were unable to stay in the game in the second half.

The Tigers led 33-25 after a first half that saw poor shot selection, sloppy ballhandling and plenty of misfires from both teams.

Harris was 3-of-5 outside the arc to lead UMass with 12 points in the first half.

Dozier had 12 points for Memphis, and Evans had 11, seven coming as part of an 11-0 run that erased an early UMass lead and put Memphis up by double digits.

Dozier got inside for a handful of baskets to keep the Tigers in the game early, but turnovers, shots that barely caught rim and difficult unsuccessful layup attempts led to anemic shooting percentages.

Memphis rebuilt the lead to double digits when Shawn Taggart, who had seven points and 11 rebounds, converted a three-point play with 15:37 left in the game, and Massachusetts never got the deficit under 10 the rest of the way.

GAME 4 - Nov. 24, 2008

Jacksonville State 75, UMass 74

AMHERST, Mass. - Despite Tony Gaffney's third double-double in four games and an inspired second half run, UMass dropped its home opener, 75-74, to Jacksonville State. The Minutemen, in head coach Derek Kellogg's Mullins Center debut went on a late 13-0 run and led by five with 40 seconds left, but the Gamecocks scored six points in the final 22 seconds to pull out the victory. With the loss, UMass drops to 1-3 on the season, while JSU improves to 3-1.

Gaffney led the Minutemen at both ends of the court once again, netting a career-high 20 points to go along with 13 rebounds and eight blocks. Chris Lowe scored 20 points as well and led UMass with five assists. For Jacksonville State, Jonathan Toles led the team with 18 points and five assists. Brandon Crawford contributed 17 points and two steals for the Gamecocks.

The Minutemen came out of the gates strong, converting a Tyrell Lynch layup and Lowe 3-pointer to take a quick 5-0 lead, but the Gamecocks used an 11-0 run over a 3:47 stretch, capped off by three-straight buckets by Brandon Crawford, to take a 20-13 with 9:27 left in the half.

Jacksonville State led, 29-23, with 5:13 left in the half when the Minutemen, sparked by increased intensity at the defensive end, closed the half on an 11-2 run to take a 34-31 lead into the locker room. The Minutemen held the Gamecocks scoreless for the final 4:42 of the half.

Gaffney led the way in the second with 12 points, six rebounds, and four blocks. With just under two minutes left he secured a defensive rebound and took it coast to coast for a dunk that gave UMass its first lead since the 11:33 mark.

After a Ricky Harris layup to start the half upped the UMass lead to five, matching its largest up to that point, the Gamecocks went on a 10-0 run to take the lead back, 41-36, with 16:44 to go. Two Jeremy Bynum 3-pointers fueled the run.

Lowe kept the Minutemen close throughout the middle portion of the half, scoring nine-straight of UMass' points. Anthony Gurley then heated up, scoring eight-straight points, including two 3-pointers, but the Gamecocks, led by Jonathan Toles, kept the Minutemen at arms-reach.

With just over six minutes left and JSU leading by six, UMass again cranked up the defense, which led to offensive opportunities, and used a 13-0 run between the 5:47 and 1: marks to retake the lead, 72-66.

A Lowe layup with 40 seconds left gave UMass a 74-69 lead, but Brandon Crawford converted a four-point play with 22 seconds remaining to cut the lead to one. Two missed front ends of one-and-ones for UMass led to a Toles basket with eight seconds left that gave JSU the lead back, 75-74.

Gurley's ensuing 3-point attempt missed and Lowe secured the offensive rebound, but his rushed attempt at the buzzer missed as well.

## GAME 5 - Nov. 29, 2008

### Green Bay 84, UMass 67

GREEN BAY - UMass played with intensity and energy but turnovers proved to be a bug-a-boo all night long as the Minutemen fell at Green Bay, 84-67. UMass turned the ball over 29 times and the Phoenix had 35 points off turnovers in handing the Minutemen (1-4) their fourth loss in a row.

The Minutemen were led by Ricky Harris, who scored 27 points. The nation's second-leading rebounder Tony Gaffney corralled 12 boards for UMass. Anthony Gurley added 11 for UMass.

Green Bay had five players score in double-figures led by Troy Cotton (21), Terry Evans (18), Mike Schachtner (14), Rahmon Fletcher (11) and Randy Berry (10). The Phoenix made 12 3-point field goals nearly matching UMass' school-record 15 treys in the meeting between the schools last season.

The knockout punch came when Schachtner connected on a 4-point play which fouled Tyrell Lynch out of the game with 11:14 left in the game and gave Green Bay a 64-52 lead. The Phoenix's Cotton blasted a 3-pointer to finish off an 11-0 run and giving UWGB a 67-52 lead.

The Minutemen continued to battle, cutting the lead to four several times, but each time Green Bay came back to build its lead back to seven or eight points.

UMass cut back to within five points on a Gary Correia free throw with 16:07 left, 51-46. The Phoenix took a 10-point lead on a swooping lay-up by Fletcher with 16:59 left in the half, making it 51-41.

Green Bay came out blazing in the second half nailing back-to-back 3-pointers by Chop Tang and Cotton before a Fletcher steal and lay-up gave the Phoenix a 45-39 lead with only one minute elapsed in the second.

The Minutemen were hot from a the outside in the first half making 6-of-10 3-pointers and shooting 60 percent overall from the floor, but 15 turnovers kept Green Bay close as the Minutemen led 39-37 at intermission. Harris had a game-best 13 at the half.

After UMass took a its largest lead of the half at 10, 33-23 on a trio of Harris free throws with 6:09 left in the half, Green Bay went on a 9-0 run. It was finished by a Schachtner lay-up with 3:32 left in the half, making it 33-32. The Minutemen quickly responded on a 3-balls by Harris and Lowe giving UMass a 39-32 edge with 2:16 left.

Harris' trey and quick jumper on back-to-back plays gave UMass a 28-19 edge with 8:45 left in the half. UMass took a 23-17 lead with 9:23 left on Gurley's second 3-pointer of the half.

The game began with a frenetic pace with the Minutemen forcing tons of turnovers, but also turning the ball over themselves many times. UMass took a six-point lead on an Lowe driving full court lay-up with 11:14 left in the first half, giving the Minutemen an 18-12 lead. It was Lowe's third fastbreak lay-up in the first nine minutes of the game.

## GAME 6 - Dec. 3, 2008

### Toledo 57, UMass 56

TOLEDO, Ohio - Justin Anyijong's tip-in at the buzzer lifted Toledo to a win in their first game at the new Savage Arena, 57-56 on Wednesday night. In a match-up of first-year head coaches, each looking for their second win in their young careers, Derek Kellogg's Minutemen and Gene Cross' Rockets went back and forth all night, changing leads 10 times. UMass took the lead on two Tony Gaffney free throws with 16 seconds left, before Anyijong's buzzer-beating tip-in.

Senior Chris Lowe, playing his 100th career game, led the Minutemen with 15 points, four assists and four steals. Ricky Harris scored 13 points, while Gaffney added 11 points and nine boards. Tyrone Kent and Jonathan Amos led the Rockets with 13 points each. Anthony Byrd added 11.

Gaffney calmly made two free throws with 16.4 seconds left to give UMass their first points in more than six minutes and a 56-55 lead, all of which followed a Gaffney steal that gave the Minutemen possession with 26 seconds left.

Gaffney forced Kent's driving attempt in the closing seconds to rattle out, but Anyijong was there to tip in the rebound at the buzzer.

The Minutemen looked to retake the lead but Anthony Gurley was called for a charge with just over two minutes left in regulation. Then with 1:27 Lowe was apparently tripped, but no call was made as he slid across the floor and was called for travelling. Lowe missed a runner in the lane with 32 seconds left then Tyrell Lynch was tied up and the possession arrow pointed towards the Rockets with 29 seconds left.

Toledo regained the lead at 55-54 on a Jonathan Amos lay-up with 3:20 left in regulation.

Toledo jumped out to a 12-5 lead early, capped by a 3-pointer by Kent with 14:44 left in the first. UMass took its first lead of the game at 15-14 on a 3-pointer by Gary Correia with 9:39 left in the first. The 3-ball bounced high off the top of the backboard and down into the net. Tyrell Lynch then pumped in a putback lay-up to finish off a 12-2 UMass spurt and a 17-14 edge.

Toledo tied the game on a long jumper by Ian Salter with less than a minute left in the first half. Gaffney's 3-pointer with 4:53 left in the first increased UMass lead to five points at 25-20. Lowe's runner in the lane as time expired gave the Minutemen a 32-31 halftime lead after the Rockets re-took the lead on a lay-up by Ridley Johnson with 11 seconds left in the half.

Down by six, UMass went on a 7-0 run finished by a Lowe steal and lay-up forcing Toledo to call timeout as the Minutemen regained the lead, 50-49 with 8:31 left in the second. That came on the heels of a show by Kent, who started to heat up in the second half as he scored 10 of Toledo's 12 points in a spurt finishing with a steal, fastbreak thunder dunk with 9:50 left in the second. That gave Toledo a 49-43 lead.

UMass then went on a scoring drought of over six minutes late in the half that set the stage for what transpired in the final minute.

Boston College 85, UMass 81 (OT)

AMHERST, Mass. - A career-high 35 points by Ricky Harris and a near triple-double by Tony Gaffney highlighted a gallant effort by UMass, but it wasn't enough, as the Minutemen fell to Boston College, 85-81, in overtime on Saturday night at the Mullins Center. UMass came back from five down with 23 seconds left to force overtime and the teams traded leads six times in the extra frame, but the Eagles were able to outscore the Minutemen, 6-1, in the final 1:02 of overtime.

Harris shattered his old career-high of 27 by shooting 12-for-19 from the field and 5-for-6 from the line. He added four rebounds and an assist. Gaffney nearly reached a triple-double with 15 points, 18 rebounds and nine blocks.

The two teams slugged it out in overtime, exchanging the lead six times, before BC took the lead for good on a Josh Southern jumper with 1:02 remaining. With the Eagles leading, 83-80, with 8.3 seconds left, Rakim Sanders missed two free throws. Lowe was fouled on the ensuing UMass possession, where he made one of two, cutting the BC lead to two, 83-81, with 3.9 seconds remaining.

The Eagles came out of the gates strong, making their first three shots and taking a 9-2 lead just over three minutes into the game. UMass came back with a 7-0 spurt to tie the game at nine, and after two-straight field goals by BC, Anthony Gurley scored five-straight points in a 8-0 UMass run to give the Minutemen a 17-13 lead with 11:06 left in the half.

The Minutemen took their biggest lead of the half after Gaffney dunked home the rebound of missed shots on two possessions in a row, making it 26-20 with 5:15 left, but a 7-0 BC run that followed erased that lead. The teams exchanged the lead four times in the final 2:28 before a Gaffney layup at the buzzer sent the Minutemen to the locker room ahead, 32-29.

The teams battled back and forth throughout the first early portions of the second half. Just over three minutes in, two-straight hoops by Rakim Sanders gave the Eagles a 38-35 lead, but Harris struck back with a two and a 3-pointer to put the Minutemen back on top, 40-38, with 16:10 to go.

UMass led, 45-40, with 14:55 left when the Eagles went on a 9-0 run over the three minutes to take the lead, 49-45. The Minutemen used three 3-pointers, by Matt Glass and two by Harris, over a two minute span to take the lead back, 54-53, with 9:46 to play.

The Eagles followed that up by reeling off seven-straight points, giving them a 60-54 lead, their biggest since the opening minutes of the game.

Harris then put the Minutemen on his back, scoring five-straight points while securing a rebound and a block at the defensive end. A Gurley bucket at the 4:35 mark tied the game, 64-64, but a Raji basket 13 seconds later gave BC a lead they would keep until the final seconds.

BC led, 74-69, with seven seconds left when Lowe hit a 3-pointer from the top of the key to pull UMass within two. Reggie Jackson missed the front end of a one-and-one after a UMass foul. Lowe took the outlet pass and flew up the court before being fouled as he entered the lane. After missing the front end of his one-and-one opportunity, Gaffney tipped in the rebound with 2.2 seconds left to send the game to overtime.

UMass 73, Holy Cross 59

AMHERST, Mass. - Needing a victory, UMass' senior leaders got just that at the Mullins Center, as Tony Gaffney and Chris Lowe led the Minutemen to a 73-59 victory over Holy Cross. Gaffney, for the second-straight game, had a near triple-double with 17 points, 11 rebounds, and eight blocks. Lowe dishd out 12 assists to go with nine points as UMass used a suffocating defense in the second half to erase a halftime deficit. Ricky Harris led all scorers with 23 points. UMass improves to 2-6 on the season, while Holy Cross falls to 3-7.

Anthony Gurley tallied 14 points and six rebounds to give UMass three players in double figures. Holy Cross was led by RJ Evans' 17 points and eight boards.

The Minutemen finished shooting 25-for-50 (50%) from the field while Holy Cross was 20-for-56 (36%).

After Holy Cross made a 3-pointer on the first possession of the game, the Minutemen scored the next eight points, including to layups by Lowe, on their way to 13-5 lead at the first time out just over four minutes into the game.

The Crusaders went on 9-0 run over a 2:34 stretch to take their first lead, 16-15, with 12:30 left in the first half.

The teams traded the lead five times in the middle of the half, but another 9-0 Crusaders run over a span of 5:39 gave them a 29-21 lead with 4:44 on the clock.

The Minutemen closed the half with a 6-1 spurt, capped off by Lowe finding Tyrell Lynch for a layup with one second left, to pull within three, 32-29, at halftime.

Holy Cross' Evans led all scorers with 10 points in the first half, while UMass was led by Gurley's seven. UMass outshot the Crusaders, 45.5% to 33.3% in the half, but trailed in rebounding, 21-16.

The Crusaders started the second half with two-straight hoops to take their biggest lead, 36-29, but the Minutemen came roaring back. The home team used a 7-0 run to tie the game, 36-36, and after Holy Cross retook the lead by four, a 12-0 run over a 2:12 span that gave UMass a 53-45 lead with 10:30 left. The run, finished off by a Matt Glass 3-pointer, was fueled by increased defensive intensity as the Minutemen switched to a full-court press and held the Crusaders without a field goal for 6:02.

UMass kept the pedal down for the rest of the game. Another Glass 3-pointer followed by a Lowe-to-Gaffney dunk led to a Holy Cross timeout and gave UMass a 67-51 lead with 5:25 remaining. At 3:32 the same duo brought the crowd to their feet when Lowe lobbed to Gaffney for the jam to make it 72-54 with 3:32 left.

## GAME 9 - Dec. 13, 2008 M&I Bank Kansas City Shootout UMass 61, #25/23 Kansas 60

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP)—As an assistant coach at Memphis last season, Derek Kellogg watched Kansas guard Mario Chalmers take a handoff on the wing and hit a 3-pointer that sent the national championship game into overtime.

Faced with a similar situation, this time as Massachusetts' head coach, Kellogg knew what was coming—and his team defended it perfectly.

Tony Gaffney got a piece of Sherron Collins' final shot and Massachusetts survived a mad scramble in the closing seconds, holding off No. 25 Kansas for a 61-60 victory Saturday.

"They ran the same play they did in San Antonio," Kellogg said. "I kind of told my guys what they would run."

UMass (3-6) had trouble pulling out close games this season, with four of its six losses by seven points or less. The Minutemen appeared to be headed for another disappointment after watching a 14-point first-half lead get trimmed to one on a long 3-pointer by Collins with 20 seconds.

Chris Lowe had a chance to push the lead to three, but missed two free throws with 20 seconds left. Kansas had a final shot.

In the national championship game, Collins dribbled up the court and handed the ball off to Chalmers, who hit a tying 3-pointer with 2.1 seconds left. Kansas went on to win 75-68 in overtime for its fifth national championship.

This time, Collins kept the ball and drove to the basket, flipping up a tough left-handed shot that Gaffney partially blocked. Kansas guard Conner Teahan grabbed the rebound, decided he couldn't get a shot off, then tried to flip it to the top of the key.

Tyrel Reed ended up with the ball, but it was too late to get a shot off before the buzzer, setting off a celebration by the Minutemen near midcourt.

Ricky Harris had 18 points, Lowe added 12 and Massachusetts improved to 5-1 against defending national champions.

"We always joke around because the ball never seems like it trickles our way at the end of the game," said Gaffney, who had 13 rebounds, six blocked shots, three assists and three steals. "We joke around about the basketball gods not being with us. I guess they were today. It's a great feeling."

Kansas (7-2), back in the Top 25 after being knocked out last week, came out flat, making sloppy passes and taking quick shots to fall behind by 14. The Jayhawks rallied to make it close, but couldn't hit the shots down the stretch and saw their 30-game home winning streak end.

The game was played at the Sprint Center, about 45 minutes from KU's campus. It was still considered a home game for the Jayhawks and felt like it, with most of near-sellout crowd of 17,252 wearing red and blue, cheering like it was Allen Fieldhouse.

Kansas also had numerous defensive breakdowns, giving UMass uncontested jumpers from the top of the key, 3-pointers from the corners. The Minutemen took advantage, getting eight points from Harris during a 16-1 run that put them up 32-18 with just over 3 minutes left.

Sparked by Reed's 3-pointer from the wing, the Jayhawks started hitting shots and picked up the defensive pressure, pulling within 36-30 by halftime.

Kansas kept the momentum going in the second half, chipping away until Reed hit a 3-pointer to give the Jayhawks a 46-45 lead, setting up a back-and-forth final 12 1/2 minutes.

## GAME 10 - Dec. 20, 2008 UMass 97, Hofstra 81

AMHERST, Mass. - Behind an offensive explosion, UMass basketball cruised to its third-straight victory by defeating Hofstra, 97-81, on a snowy Saturday afternoon at the Mullins Center. Anthony Gurfley led the onslaught with 5-for-7 shooting from 3-point range on his way to 19 points. The Minutemen tied a school-record with 15 3-point field goals as they just missed recording the fourth 100-point game in Mullins Center history. Ricky Harris scored 16 points, eclipsing the 1,000-point mark for his career, while Luke Bonner and David Gibbs had career-highs of 15 and 11, respectively. Chris Lowe tallied 10 assists in the game to go along with his eight points.

While the Minutemen shot 57.7 percent from 3-point range and 52.5 percent overall, Hofstra had a huge advantage on the boards, outrebounding UMass, 61-32. The Pride was led by Cornelius Vines' 21 points.

The Minutemen jumped out to an 11-4 lead just under five minutes into the game, thanks to four-straight points by Harris. That lead increased to 18-8 at the 11:56 mark when Bonner, seeing his first action since injuring his knee in the second game of the season, hit a 3-pointer and followed that up with a tip-in off a missed shot on the next possession.

UMass received three points on three-straight trips up the court on 3-pointers by Harris and Gibbs, and three free throws by Harris after he was followed on another attempt from behind the arc, making it a 28-10 game with 9:13 left in the half. It was with the third free throw that the junior guard eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for his career.

The Pride cut into the UMass lead when Vines led an 8-1 run that made it 35-25 with 4:19 remaining in the first half, but the Minutemen responded by outscoring Hofstra, 13-7 over the duration of the half to take a 48-32 lead into the locker room.

Harris and Bonner led the way in the opening 20 minutes with 12 and 10 points, respectively, while Tony Gaffney sat the final 13 minutes of the half after picking up his second foul. Vines led all scorers in the half with 18 points, 12 of which came on 3-pointers. UMass shot 50 percent (7-for-14) from behind the arc in the first half, while Hofstra held a 32-17 advantage in rebounding.

After Vines started the second half off with a 3-pointer for the Pride, the Minutemen, led by two threes from Matt Glass and capped off by a Gaffney dunk on the break, went on a 13-2 run over a 2:13 span to open up a 24 points lead, 61-37, with 16:19 remaining.

The Minutemen's lead reached 26, 79-53, on a Bonner 3-pointer from the deep wing with 10:51 left in the game.

The Pride closed the game on a 16-5 over the final 4:45 of the game as Derek Kellogg emptied his bench.

## GAME 11 - Dec. 27, 2008

### UMass 64, IUPUI 57

AMHERST, Mass. - Behind a 23-point performance from Ricky Harris, a double-double from Tony Gaffney, and 10 assists from Chris Lowe, UMass men's basketball defeated IUPUI, 64-57. The win was Derek Kellogg's Minutemen's fourth-straight as they improve to 5-6. The Jaguars, led by Alex Young's 19 points, fell to 7-5 with the loss.

Harris was 5-for-8 from 3-point range as he logged his sixth 20-point game of the season. Gaffney finished with 11 points, 11 rebounds, five blocks, and three steals for his sixth double-double of the year. Lowe's double-digit assist day was his third in the last four games.

After IUPUI scored the game's first hoop, the Minutemen scored eight-straight points, including a nifty reverse layup by Gaffney for a three-point play off a feed from Matt Glass, who finished with a season-high nine points.

UMass kept the lead until Young scored six points in an 11-2 Jaguars run that tied the game, 18-18, with 7:54 left in the half. The freshman tallied 11 of IUPUI's 18 points to that point.

A Glass 3-pointer quickly gave the Minutemen the lead back and started a 7-2 spurt that gave them a 25-20 lead with 5:50 left in the half. The Jags countered with 7-0 run that gave them their first lead since 2-0, 27-25, with 2:35 remaining. The teams would trade the lead back and forth three more times in the final two minutes of the half. Harris sent the Minutemen into the locker room with a 34-31 lead by hitting a 3-pointer from 30 feet as the shot clock expired with six seconds left.

Harris led UMass in the first half with 11 points, while Glass added nine and Lowe dished out six assists. Young paced the Jags with 15 first half points. The Minutemen were 7-for-13 from 3-point range over the first 20 minutes, while IUPUI was 3-for-8.

UMass came out firing to start the second half, going on a 10-3 run over the first three minutes. Harris hit two 3-pointers and Gaffney added two dunks, the first coming off the rebound of a missed shot after he blocked a Young shot at the other end, and the second coming off a Harris lob from almost halfcourt. That gave UMass its biggest lead of the game, 44-34.

IUPUI reeled off nine-straight points over a 1:50 span to cut the UMass lead to one, 44-43, with 15:03 to go.

The Minutemen slowly rebuilt their lead, thanks to defensive play that held the Jags without a field goal for an 8:55 span between the 13:47 and 4:52 marks. A Harris layup off a long lead pass from Lowe put UMass on top, 58-51, with 5:35 remaining.

The Jags cut the UMass lead to three with under a minute left, but a Lowe driving layup with 14 seconds left and two free throws from Gaffney with four seconds left secured the victory, 64-57.

# Derek KELLOGG

## HEAD COACH

### First Year as UMass Head Coach • UMass '95

UMass has brought one of its own home to run the men's basketball program.

Former Minuteman point guard and Springfield native Derek Kellogg was named the 21st head coach in University of Massachusetts men's basketball history, on April 23, 2008. The 1995 UMass graduate returns to his alma mater for his first head coaching job after serving as an assistant coach for 12 years, the last eight at the University of Memphis under former UMass head coach John Calipari. The energetic and hard-working Kellogg is largely credited for recruiting many of the Tigers which helped Memphis reach the NCAA Championship game this past season and eight straight 20-win seasons and eight consecutive postseason berths.

"We couldn't be more excited to have Derek Kellogg return to UMass as our head basketball coach," said Athletic Director John McCutcheon. "His proven track record as one of the country's top recruiters, the coaching experience he has gained and his deep passion and love of UMass make him a perfect fit for this position."

As a four-year letterwinner at Massachusetts from 1992-95, Kellogg played on four Atlantic 10 Conference regular season and tournament championship teams. The Minutemen were just the second team in NCAA history to win four-straight outright season and tournament championships. During his four-year career at UMass under Calipari, the Minutemen were 111-24, including 51-11 in the Atlantic 10, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament each year, including the Elite Eight in 1995. Kellogg was named the team's captain as both a junior and senior. He was named a 1995 Atlantic 10 All-Conference selection and was a three-time All-Atlantic 10 Academic honoree. On UMass' career lists, he is fifth in assists (453), seventh in all-time three-pointers (138), as well as seventh in three-point percentage (38.1). Kellogg played his high school basketball at Springfield Cathedral where he was a two-time Massachusetts All-State player and McDonald's honorable mention All-American.

Kellogg recently finished his eighth year on the Memphis staff under Calipari where he brought his "coach on the floor" mentality at UMass to the sidelines, and it has paid huge dividends for the Tiger program. In Kellogg's eight seasons in Memphis, he has helped lead the Tigers to eight-straight 20-win seasons and eight-consecutive postseason berths (2003, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008 NCAA; 2001, 2002, 2005 NIT). Prior to this recent run, the last time Memphis had eight-straight 20-win seasons was from 1982-89. This current stretch of eight-consecutive postseasons is a first for the Tiger basketball program, breaking the previous mark of six-straight postseason tournaments from 1988-93.

This past season, Kellogg was an integral part of another magical Tiger campaign, which continued through the 2008 NCAA Tournament championship game. The NCAA Final Four appearance was the Tigers' first since 1985, and the NCAA title contest was the program's first since 1973. Memphis set an NCAA single-season record for victories with 38 wins (38-2 mark) and held down the No. 1 spot in both national polls for five-straight weeks during the season. The Tigers finished 2007-08 ranked No. 2 in both national polls, the highest final ranking in school history. Memphis also won a school-record 26-straight games, and swept the Conference USA regular season and tournament titles for a third-consecutive season.

The Tigers won 30 games for a third-straight year in 2007-08, becoming the second school in NCAA Division I history to accomplish the feat. Kentucky was the first to do so from 1947-49 and 1996-98. UCLA joined the elite group later in 2007-08. From 2005-06 to 2007-08, Memphis won 104 games (104-10 record) and tied the 1996-98 Kentucky squads for the most victories in a three-year period in NCAA Division I history.

In 2006-07, Kellogg helped lead Memphis to another record-setting campaign. The Tigers won 33 games for a second-straight season (33-4 record) and captured their second-consecutive Conference USA regular season and tournament titles. The back-to-back outright regular season crowns were a first for the Memphis program, and the consecutive tournament championships were the Tigers first since they won two-straight Metro Conference Tournaments in 1984 and 1985. Memphis advanced to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight for a second-straight year (2006, 2007), marking the first time in school history that happened.

The 2006-07 Tigers also pulled a first in Conference USA history. Memphis posted a perfect 16-0 regular season mark and captured the league's postseason

tournament. The Tigers were the second squad in C-USA history to go 16-0 in the regular season as Cincinnati did so in 1999-2000. That Bearcat team, though, did not win the Conference USA Tournament title. The Tigers received a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament and finished in the top 10 in both national polls (No. 5/AP; No. 7/ESPN-USA Today).

Kellogg also played an integral role in the Tigers' 2005-06 remarkable season. Memphis posted a 33-4 record and won the Conference USA regular season and tournament titles. The conference regular season crown was the Tigers' second in three years. The 2005-06 Memphis squad earned the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament No. 1 seed and advanced to the Elite Eight for the first time since 1992. The Tigers finished the season ranked in the top 10 of both national polls (No. 4/AP; No. 6/ESPN-USA Today). Those final rankings were the highest in Memphis basketball history.

From when Kellogg joined the Memphis staff in 2000-01, the Tigers won the 2002 National Invitation Tournament championship, claimed a share of the 2004 Conference USA regular season crown and took home the 2002 and 2003 C-USA National Division titles. The Tigers have posted 219 overall victories (27.3 wins per year) and 101 conference wins (12.6 league victories per year) in his eight seasons. The eight years prior to that span, the Tigers had 140 total wins and 66 conference victories.

In addition to the 2006, 2007 and 2008 final national rankings, the Tigers also finished the 2003 (No. 19) and 2004 (No. 24) seasons ranked in the final Associated Press poll. Prior to the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons, the last time Memphis was ranked in the final polls in consecutive years was the 1984-85 and 1985-86 campaigns.

Kellogg was an off-campus recruiter for the Tigers, and also assisted in scouting opponents. His hard work — especially on the recruiting trail — gained him national recognition. In the summer of 2007, Rivals.com listed Kellogg (No. 7 spot) as one of the nation's 10 assistants "ready to move up." A year earlier in 2006, the same web site named Kellogg as one of the nation's top 25 recruiters, and HoopScoop magazine tabbed him as one of the nation's top assistant coaches.

Prior to joining Calipari's staff, Kellogg spent one season at Youngstown State. In his lone year at Youngstown State, Kellogg was a member of a coaching staff led by former UMass assistant John Robic that re-energized a community about Penguin basketball. Youngstown State finished fourth in the Mid-Continent Conference regular season standings, but were in first place in the league before losing their top scorer, Elmer Brown, with seven games left in the regular season. Youngstown State signed a freshman class which included three top-100 recruits during Kellogg's tenure.

Kellogg joined the Youngstown State staff after two seasons at George Mason University in Fairfax, Va., where he worked for Jim Larranaga. The Patriots posted a 19-11 record during the 1998-99 season, captured both the Colonial Athletic Association regular-season and tournament championships and earned an automatic bid to the 1999 NCAA Tournament.

Kellogg began his coaching career at his alma mater. He was a graduate assistant and part-time radio broadcaster at UMass for the 1996-97 season. Kellogg also played a season with the Connecticut Skyhawks in the United States Basketball League in 1995.

Kellogg, 35 (born June 20, 1973), is a 1995 graduate of Massachusetts with a degree in Real Estate/Finance. In May of 2005, he married Nicole Flory, who graduated from UMass in 1997. The couple welcomed their first child Maximus Antonio Kellogg on April 28, 2008 (five days after he was hired at UMass. Kellogg's parents George and Ruth Kellogg currently reside in Belchertown, Mass.
