- The game will air live nationally on **CBS College Sports** with Dave Ryan (pxp) and Akbar Gbaja-Biamila (analyst) calling the action.
- Rich Phillips (pxp), John Hampton (analyst) and Sean Bass (sidelines) will call the action on the **Mustang Radio Network**. The flagship station for the broadcasts is **KTCK-1310 AM** in Dallas. The broadcast begins 30 minutes prior to kickoff.
- **Mustang All-Access** will stream audio and live stats on **SMUMustangs.com**.

SETTING THE SCENE

- SMU heads to Houston to take on the Cougars in a nationally-televised game that will pit UH's top-ranked offense against an SMU defense that **ranks second in the nation with 13 interceptions** and has registered **20 takeaways** on the year.
- SMU enters the game **tied for the C-USA Western Division lead** with Tulsa at 2-0.
- With a win at UAB already under their belts, the Mustangs head to Houston in search of their **second straight C-USA road win** and their first road win over a ranked opponent since **1986**.
- Wide receiver Emmanuel Sanders **set a new SMU career record for catches** in the Navy game and now ranks as SMU's **all-time leader in career catches (240), TD catches (29) and yards (3,033)**. With those 29 TD grabs, Sanders is tied with Dez Bryant of Oklahoma State among **active NCAA players in career touchdown catches**. Sanders also **leads the nation in punt return average** in 2009 at 22.62 yards per return.
- SMU back **Shawnbrey McNeal** has rushed for **500 yards** through six games - more than SMU rushed for as a team in 2008 (497).

- Mustang senior linebacker **Chase Kenemer** has registered **five 10-plus-tackle games** in 2009 and is tied for fifth nationally in tackles, averaging 11.33 stops a game.

ABOUT HOUSTON

- UH tops the nation in total offense and passing offense and ranks third in scoring, averaging nearly 41 points per game in 2009. The Cougars are led by junior quarterback Case Keenum, who has passed for 2,501 yards and 19 scores this season while throwing just four interceptions. UH enters the game ranked 17th in both polls and has already owns wins over BCS-AQ schools Oklahoma State, Texas Tech and Mississippi State in 2009.

THE SERIES

- SMU and Houston face off on Saturday for the fifth straight season. UH holds a 14-9-1 edge in the all-time series. The two teams met every year between 1975 and 1995, with the exception of 1987 & 1988, when SMU did not field a team, played again in 2000 and resumed the yearly series again in 2005 when SMU joined Conference USA. SMU's last win over Houston came back in 2005 in Houston, when the Mustangs prevailed 29-24.

THE COACHES

- **June Jones** is in his second season at the SMU helm. His SMU record is 4-14 and his career mark is now 80-55. Jones went 76-41 in nine seasons at Hawaii, leading the Warriors to the All-State Sugar Bowl in 2007. Prior to heading to Hawaii, Jones had a 12-year coaching career in the NFL, including head coaching stops at Atlanta and San Diego.
- Kevin Sumlin is in his second season at UH, where he is 13-6. He led Houston to a victory in the Armed Forces Bowl in 2008 and has the Cougars ranked for the first time in 18 years.

LAST TIME VS. HOUSTON

DALLAS - Case Keenum threw a 26-yard touch-down pass to Tyron Carrier with 24 seconds left as Houston rallied to beat SMU 44-38.

Houston trailed 35-23 heading into the fourth quarter before engineering a comeback. Trailing 38-36, the Cougars got the ball at their own 15 with 1:58 left. Keenum capped the comeback with a TD pass to Carrier, who made a nice over-the-shoulder catch in the end zone.

Bo Levi Mitchell was 29-of-39 for 365 yards and four touchdowns, and Aldrick Robinson had 186 yards receiving and two touchdowns for the Mustangs.

After an SMU field goal, Bryce Beall scored on a 1-yard run but Houston's two-point conversion attempt to tie the game failed. The Mustangs were forced to punt on their next possession, setting up the Cougars' game-winning drive. Mitchell's desperation pass from near midfield on the final play of the game was intercepted.

"D" GIVETH AND "D" TAKETH AWAY

SMU's defense has given up nearly 400 yards a game so far in 2009, but has excelled in taking the ball away from its opponents.

While SMU may rank 92nd in total defense, **the Mustangs rank second in the nation in interceptions with 13.** Making the picks even more impressive is the fact that SMU had just eight picks during the 2008 season.

Leading the way is safety Rock Dennis, who is tied for sixth in the nation with four picks.

SMU has also forced nine fumbles and ranks **fourth in the nation with 20 takeways** on the year.

EMMANUEL LABOR

Emmanuel Sanders continues to work his way up the SMU receiving record lists and the NCAA charts.

Sanders ranks as SMU's **all-time leader in career catches (240), TD catches (29) and yards (3,033).**

With the 29 TD grabs, Sanders is tied with Dez Bryant of Oklahoma State among **active NCAA players in career touchdown catches.** He's also fourth in catches and fifth in yards among current FBS student-athletes.

He holds SMU records for career 100-yard-receiving games with 12 and season 100-yard games with six (2008). He is the first player in SMU history to record three 600-yard receiving seasons and, with 19 yards against UH, will break the 600-yard mark again in 2009.

Sanders earned C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors on Sept. 21 after a huge game at Washington State that saw him pull down a school- and conference-record 18 catches for a career-high 178 yards.

He has added a new wrinkle to his game in 2009 - returning punts. In the season opener, he returned a punt 79 yards for a touchdown against SFA, the first for SMU since 2003. He **leads the nation in punt return average** in 2009 at 22.62 yards per return.

BIG MAC

SMU running back **Shawnbrey McNeal** was ruled eligible to play this season by the NCAA on Sept. 4. McNeal had transferred to SMU last spring after spending two seasons at Miami. SMU had submitted the waiver request, which will allow him to play in 2009 as opposed to sitting out the traditional one season, and the Dallas native was granted the exemption based on mitigating personal circumstances.

The 5-10, 190 lb. junior back responded by rushing for a career-high 158 yards on 19 carries in the season opener. It marked the first 150-yard rushing game for an SMU player since DeMyron Martin had 171 against Rice in 2005. McNeal added a second 100-yard game with a 131-yard day against Navy.

McNeal already has 500 yards rushing on the year after SMU rushed for only 497 total yards in 2008.

McNeal has proved himself a "crunch-time" carrier. He sealed the SFA win with a 49-yard TD run with 1:31 remaining and his 19-yard TD run with 4:04 remaining helped SMU seal the road win at UAB. **In all, four of McNeal's five career rushing TDs have come in the last 4:19 of the fourth quarter**, including both this year.

BABY 'BACKERS

A pair of true freshmen SMU linebackers are making an impact in 2009 - **Ja'Gared Davis** and **Taylor Reed**.

The frosh pair started at UAB and combined for nine tackles in the game. Reed showed exceptionally well, pulling down an interception in the end zone with 14:44 left in the fourth quarter and helping stop UAB QB Joe Webb on the potential game-tying two-point try with 13 seconds left in the game.

They combined for 11 tackles in the Navy game, and on the year, the tandem has combined for 44 tackles with four for-loss.

TRIBUTE 23

Chris Banjo has been awarded the number "23" for the 2009 season. Last spring, Head Coach June Jones announced that starting in 2009, a deserving student-athlete on the SMU football team would be chosen to wear the number "23" on his jersey throughout the season to honor **Jerry LeVias** for his contributions to America, the sport of football and SMU.

When Jerry LeVias started as an end for SMU in a September 24, 1966, game against Illinois, he forever changed the Southwest Conference. LeVias was the first African-American to receive an athletic scholarship in the SWC. Born in Beaumont, Texas, Jerry had played quarterback for Hebert High School. He was small (5-9, 177 lbs.), but made up for it with his great speed. At SMU, LeVias made athletic and academic All-America teams and, in 1966, contributed to the Mustangs' first SWC title in 18 years. He still holds two SMU records as a receiver - 213 yards in one game (N.C. State, 1968) and 1,131 yards receiving in a season (1968). He was a consensus All-American in 1968 and was chosen All-SWC in 1966, 1967, and 1968.

Banjo, a native of Sugar Land, Texas, has responded in 2009, tallying 45 tackles, one interception, two pass break-ups, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery this season.

DON'T STOP BO-LEVI-N'

In 2008, quarterback **Bo Levi Mitchell** became the first true freshman to start at QB for SMU since 2003, but the Katy native showed why June Jones handed him the reins to the Run-and-Shoot.

In his collegiate debut, Mitchell threw for three touchdowns at Rice. In game two, he was 24-of-37 for 370 yards with five TDs and no INTs. The five TD passes tied for second-most all-time in a game at SMU and the 370 passing yards were 13th all-time.

In 2009, Mitchell has continued his impressive run. He completed 28 of 47 attempts in the C-USA opener at UAB for 353 yards and three touchdowns and was 40 of 57 for 421 yards and two TDs at Washington State. The 421 yards are the third-highest in a game at SMU and his 40 completions tied the SMU record. In the ECU win, Mitchell completed a 96-yard TD pass to Aldrick Robinson tying the mark for the longest pass play in SMU history.

He now has 4,550 career passing yards, moving into sixth at SMU, 36 career TD passes and six career 300-yard passing games, tying Mike Romo (1989-92) for second-most at SMU (record is eight).

CHASE-ING THEM DOWN

After transferring to SMU in 2006, linebacker **Chase Kennemer** saw action primarily on special teams for two seasons, until late 2008 when he got the start at UTEP in place of a suspended Mustang. Kennemer responded with a block punt and an 11-tackle effort against the Miners and has never looked back.

Kennemer was voted a captain this season by his teammates and has tallied a team-best **67 stops with 7.5 for-loss in 2009**, while adding a sack, an interception, two pass break-ups and a fumble recovery. Against Navy, he notched 11 stops and now has five 10-plus-tackle games in 2009. He is tied for fifth nationally and ranks second in C-USA, averaging 11.33 stops a game.

He's also a classroom standout, having earned his undergraduate degree and two C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll listings.

HERE'S TO YOU, MR. ROBINSON

SMU junior receiver **Aldrick Robinson** has speed to burn. Not long into 2008 spring drills, Coach Jones singled Robinson out as a future star. Robinson proved Jones right in 2008, hauling in 11 TD catches, which is tied for the most ever in a season at SMU, and ranking sixth in the nation with 104.7 receiving yards per game. With 1,047 yards on the year, he became just the third player in SMU history to record a 1,000-yard season and had a streak of five straight games with a receiving TD.

He entered 2009 as one of 37 players on the "Watch List" for the **Biletnikoff Award**, which recognizes the top wide receiver in college football. He had 125 yards receiving in the ECU win, marking his first 100-yard receiving game of the season and the fifth of his career. He also hauled in a 96-yard TD pass against the Pirates, tying the mark for the longest pass play in SMU history. With a 94-yard TD reception at UCF in 2008, Robinson now has been involved in **two of the three longest pass plays in school history**.

GIVING FOOTBALL A "SHOT"

SMU redshirt freshman defensive end **Margus Hunt** is not your average rookie. He has been enrolled at SMU since fall of 2007 but is in his first year of playing football. His only football experience until now consisted of playing Madden NFL video games.

Hunt made the first big play of his football career at TCU, blocking a Frog extra point try, and then blocked two FG attempts in the ECU win. One of Hunt's blocks against the Pirates led to a 65-yard TD return, SMU's first FG block for a TD since Oct. 13, 2001. For his efforts, Hunt was awarded an **ESPN Helmet Sticker** and was named the **C-USA Special Teams Player of the Week**.

While his experience level could be questioned, his athleticism will not be. Hunt won **gold medals in both the shot and the discus at the 2006 World Junior Championships** in Beijing, becoming the first junior athlete ever to win a shot/discus gold medal double.

He still trains with Dave Wollman, SMU's world-renowned throwing coach, and hopes to represent Estonia in the 2012 Olympics in London.

CENTER OF ATTENTION

SMU senior center **Mitch Enright** is gaining notice both on and off the field. Enright is a two-time member of the **Rimington Trophy Watch List**, which is awarded to the nation's top center, and was named the 2009 **Anson Mount Scholar/Athlete** as part of the 53rd-annual *Playboy* Preseason All-America football team.

Enright graduated with a 3.9 GPA as a management major in three years and is now enrolled in SMU's prestigious Cox School of Business, pursuing his MBA. He is a two-time member of the *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District Football Team and a Conference USA Academic Medal winner.

In early October, Enright added another accolade as he was named a semifinalist for the **2009 William V. Campbell Trophy**.

FOR PETE'S SAKE!

During 2008 spring drills, SMU linebacker **Pete Fleps** was leaving his apartment for a 6 a.m. workout when he noticed a smoke alarm going off and smoke in a neighboring apartment. He knocked on the front door, and getting no response, tried the handle. It was unlocked, so he opened the door to discover a room filled with heavy smoke. He called out to see if anyone was home, but no one replied. He then located the source of the smoke - a red-hot pan on a stove burner, turned it off, and moved the smoking pan outside. He then looked for occupants and found a mostly unresponsive female in a bedroom. He alerted her, then opened all the windows. Concerned for her privacy, he notified female neighbors and asked them to come over to attend to the woman. With the fire danger gone and the situation under control, Fleps hurriedly went on his way, making sure to arrive at the workout on time.

Fleps led the team with 106 tackles in 2008 - 32 more than SMU's No. 2 tackler. Against Navy, Fleps notched 23 tackles, the fourth-most ever in a game by a Conference USA player. He's also a standout in the classroom and was one of 14 players named to the 2008 Conference USA Football All-Academic Team.

The events of Sept. 11, 2001, convinced SMU defensive lineman **Jesse Andrew** to enroll in the Army. A year later, he was sent to Germany. Shortly thereafter, he found himself in **Baghdad, Iraq**, where his unit was responsible for one of the main checkpoints into the Green Zone and patrolled a sector.

FAST FOURSOME

SMU's roster includes **four 100m track champions** from three different states. Senior **Bryan McCann** won the Oklahoma state title in 2006, junior **Aldrick Robinson** won a Texas state crown in 2007, junior **Shawnbrey McNeal** was a two-time 3A Texas state champ and sophomore **B.J. Lee** won the Mississippi state championship in 2008.

THE RED CARPET

With the arrival of June Jones, SMU may need to install a red carpet in the Mustang locker room as SMU has become "the place to be" in Dallas. Among the celebrities, Mustang legends, pros and former pros that have attended practice or stopped by the stadium are: **Roger Staubach, Troy Aikman, Daryl "Moose" Johnston, Terrell Owens, Jeff George, Reggie Dupard, Eric Dickerson, Craig James, Jerry Ball, Devin Hester and Deion Sanders.**

Former **President George W. Bush** has even visited SMU football practice. Bush was joined by SMU President R. Gerald Turner and the former President addressed the players after the practice session.

Coach June Jones had given the 43rd President a practice schedule and asked him to stop by when he could. Mr. Bush watched about an hour of drills and even put on a red SMU hat for part of his stay.

Jones later Tweeted, "(The President) talked to the guys and told them he will be supporting SMU and Dallas for the years to come."

In early October, two **Maasai warriors** got their first experience of American football, watching Mustang practice. The experience was part of a National Geographic show slated for the spring of 2010, titled "Two Kenyan Guys" that features Lemarti and Boni, two Kenyans from neighboring tribes who are taking in various cultures around the world.

OH CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS

The SMU football team selected three team captains for the 2009 season on Sunday, Aug. 30. On the offensive side of the ball, **Kelvin Beachum** and **Emmanuel Sanders** were selected, while **Chase Kennemer** was chosen by the defense.

Sanders' and Kennemer's exploits have already been documented in these notes. Beachum, a sophomore from Mexia, was named to *Dave Campbell's Texas Football's All-Texas Team* this preseason. Beachum started all 12 games at left tackle in 2009, blocking for an offense that threw for a school-record-tying 29 TDs and ranked 17th in the nation in passing offense.

THE LAST OF THE MOJICAS

SMU redshirt freshman defensive back **Robert Mojica** did not see action this season until late in the fourth quarter of the win at UAB. While he didn't register any stats against the Blazers, it did prepare the California native for future game action.

In his next two games - at Washington State and at TCU - Mojica responded by notching interceptions and even added four tackles at Wazzu. **Mojica ranks second on the team with those two picks** and figures to see additional playing time as the season progresses.

GOAL LINE

Freshman running back **Zach Line** was recruited to SMU as a linebacker, but the Michigan native has found his role as the team's goal-line specialist, with **three of his 19 carries resulting in TDs.** Line rushed for two scores against Navy, becoming the first SMU player to rush for multiple TDs since 2007 and the first freshman to do so since 2005.

HILLTOP TIES

Back-up quarterback **Braden Smith's** father, Scott Smith, is head coach at Rockwall High School just outside of Dallas. The elder Smith does have another tie to SMU, as he was a member of Forrest Gregg's SMU coaching staff in 1988 and '89, and helped the Mustangs resurrect their football program.

The younger Smith etched his name in the Mustang record book by **scoring a TD on his first career snap**, rushing for a 7-yard TD at UAB and helping SMU snap a 15-game road losing streak.

THE NFL CONNECTION

Five of SMU's 10 football coaches have either played or coached in the NFL - **Head Coach June Jones** and assistant coaches **Joe Haering, Bert Hill, Adrian Klemm** and **Dennis McKnight.** In addition, two more assistants - **Tom Mason** and **Jeff Reinebold** - coached in NFL Europe and the Canadian Football League and offensive graduate assistant **Carlos Barocio-Leon** was a head coach in the European Leagues, winning two Eurobowl Titles (XIV & XV).

GRIDIRON GRADS

SMU student-athletes excel in the classroom, as a remarkable 96 percent of the scholarship student-athletes who entered SMU between 1992 and 2002 and exhausted their eligibility at SMU earned degrees.

Football student-athletes play a big part of SMU's academic success, as 26 players made the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll and three won Commissioner's Academic Medals in 2008-09. In addition, SMU's **Mitch Enright** and **Pete Fleps** were selected to the 14-man C-USA All-Academic Team.

As a team, SMU won the American Football Coaches Association's 2006 Academic Achievement Award after recording a 100 percent graduation rate. Although it was the Mustangs' first win, SMU has been named to the honorable mention category 11 times.

In 2009, SMU has two student-athletes on the roster that have already received degrees - **Mitch Enright, Chase Kennemer.**

Nico Grasu kicked a 39-yard field goal in overtime as Washington State came back to beat SMU 30-27.

The Mustangs had the first drive of overtime, but Bo Levi Mitchell threw deep into the end zone on the first play and was picked off by Chima Nwachukwu. It was Washington State's fourth interception of the game.

The Cougars took over on the 25 and gained just three yards on three plays before Grasu's game winner. It was the first time Washington State had led all day.

SMU led 24-7 in the third quarter and seemed to be cruising to victory, but then turnovers struck.

Linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis picked off Mitchell at mid-field and ran the ball back 52 yards for a touchdown late in the third, but the snap for the conversion was fumbled, and the Cougars trailed 24-13.

Matt Szymanski kicked a field goal early in the fourth for SMU.

Linebacker Myron Beck picked off a scrambling Mitchell and outran the Mustangs for a 67-yard touchdown that cut SMU's lead to 27-20 with 10:07 left.

Mitchell led SMU deep into WSU territory on the next drive but was picked off by Brandon Jones. The Cougars' offense went 3-and-out, but SMU did the same and Washington State got the ball back on its 20 for one last drive.

The Cougars benefited from a key pass interference call on fourth down against Sterling Moore on receiver Jared Karstetter that gave them first down on SMU's 34. Quarterback Marshall Lobbestael completed two passes to give them first down on the SMU 7 with 36 seconds left.

On the second play, Lobbestael hit a diving Karstetter in the end zone with 28 seconds left. Grasu kicked the extra point to tie the game at 27-27.

The loss ruined a career day for Mitchell, who completed 40 of 57 passes for 424 yards and two touchdowns, but also four interceptions. Receiver Emmanuel Sanders caught a school record 18 passes for 178 yards, while Terrance Wilkerson caught two touchdown passes.

The Mustangs had 504 yards of offense, compared to 276 for WSU.
