The Game: The Southern Jaguars will open up the 2008 season on the road in a tough out-of-conference matchup with Conference USA's, University of Houston. This is the first ever meeting between the two schools. Southern will look to build on last season's 8-3 overall mark, 6-3 in the SWAC Western division. SU finished in 2nd place in the division, behind Grambling State. The Jags return 46 lettermen for 2008, including 17 starters (6 offensive, 8 defensive 3 special teams).

The University of Houston will look to expand on their 8-5 overall record (6-2 in C-USA). The Cougars finished second in the West division a year ago, although they would make it to the Texas Bowl. They eventually would fall to TCU, 20-13 in the contest.

The Coaches - SU - Pete Richardson is in his 16th season at the helm for Jaguars... Brings a career record of 164-66-1 into this contest (15 yrs)... Has a 122-52 record at the helm of the Jaguars... Has five SWAC Championships and four HBCU National titles to his claim... Spent 1988-1992 as head coach of Winston-Salem State University, where he was 41-14-1... Five time SWAC Coach of the Year (1995, '97, '98, '99, '03)... Led the SU Jaguars to the first ever SWAC Championship Game title in 1999... Spent four seasons as a defensive back for the Buffalo Bills, and started for two seasons (1968-72)... A 1968 graduate of Dayton University... Married to the former Lillian Raines, and has one adult daughter, Deborah Bouie, one grandson, Nathan and one granddaughter, Monet.

UH - Kevin Sumlin is in his first season at the helm of the UH Cougars... Began his career as a graduate assistant at Washington State for Mike Price (1989-90). He also has been an assistant coach under Bob Stoops (Oklahoma), R.C. Slocum (Texas A&M), Joe Tiller (Purdue and Wyoming), Jim Wacker (Minnesota) and Glen Mason (Minnesota)... Has coached in nine bowl games, including all four BCS games. Five came during his time at Oklahoma (2008 Fiesta, 2007 Fiesta, 2005 Holiday, 2005 Orange, 2004 Sugar), one at Texas A&M (2002 GalleryFurniture.com) and three with Purdue (2002 Rose, 2000 Outback, 1998 Alamo). A four-year letterman as a linebacker at Purdue (1983-86), Sumlin still ranks among the top 10 in career tackles for the Boilermakers. He was named to Sports Illustrated's All-America walk-on list as a freshman after leading Purdue with 91 tackles... He was named Honorable mention All-Big Ten in 1984 and helped the team reach the Peach Bowl. Sumlin also earned honorable mention All-Big Ten honors as a senior, ranking No. 5 in the league with 114 tackles.... The Indianapolis, Ind., native graduated from Purdue in 1988 with a bachelor's degree in both criminology and criminal justice... Sumlin and his wife Charlene have four children: daughters Courtney and Shelby, and sons Jackson and Joey.

News releases, photos, and any pertinent information will be made available to accredited media members upon special request. Special requests must be made at least two weeks in advance to ensure that enough time is given to the SU Sports Information Office to accommodate your request. Please feel free to contact the SU Sports Information Office should you require any additional information.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials for Southern University home games are issued for *WORKING* media only and should be requested through the proper forms, as early as possible due to space limitations and demands. All members of the media must request credentials in writing through SID, Kevin Manns.

If the Southern University Sports Information Office does not receive a copy, or cannot view your publication or materials of media members activities surrounding SU Athletics, you will be denied credentials and/or dropped from the credential list.

Credentials for Southern University ROAD games, are submitted to the opponent's SID office or AD's office by the SU SID office. *These requests are at the discretion of the opponent, and all credentials DO NOT have to be honored or supplied.*

Requests are honored from sports editors of daily newspapers and sports directors of television and radio stations. Requests from individuals not employed by a media outlet WILL NOT be honored or considered.

Spouses, dates, non-workers and anyone under the age of 18 years of age are not allowed in the working press area of the press box.

RADIO

Permission to broadcast a Southern University should be requested through Kevin Manns, Director of Sports Information. Stations must order their own phone lines through BellSouth, listing the Southern University office of sports information as the contact person for placement.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

All photographers must wear a sideline pass to be allowed on the field. NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line around the field and outside designated team areas (between the 30 yard lines). No passes will be issued the day of or during any game. No freelance photography will be allowed unless an arrangement has been made through the SID office at least one week prior to the game or event. Also, if the SU Sports Information Office grants permission and credentials, the SU SID Office *MUST* receive at the minimum, *15 cover quality photographs per contest allowed to shoot, and additional photos by request.*

FAX SERVICES

Following each Southern University Jaguar home game, the sports information office will be happy to fax whatever information media members need to their respective agencies.. Please ask any member of the Jaguar SID staff for assistance on this matter.

ON THE RADIO

Southern's games will be broadcast on the "Q", WQXL, 106.5 FM this season, with Henry Baptiste doing the color, Clarence Buggs on the play-by-play and Clayton Lewis as the halftime host. Elliot Darensbourg and Eric Randall (side-line) will also join the SU Radio Network broadcast. The pre-game show starts an hour before the game, with the post game show immediately following the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete individual and team statistics, running play-by-play, and game facts will be distributed to members of the working media. Press kits are provided 30 minutes prior to kickoff, or earlier upon request. Press kits include game program, flip card, updated stats for each team, conference stats and game-day notes.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

All sit-down player/coach interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance through the sports information office. Head coach Pete Richardson, his staff and players will be available for a brief period following practice on Tuesday's and Wednesday's upon request. An exception would be if a player has an evening class or tutorial session to attend.

Coach Richardson is normally available on the practice field for a short brief period following practice, but it is urged and recommended that members of the media attend the weekly press luncheon to ensure that you get the information needed for your organization.

Player interviews are to be scheduled through the Sports Information Office – **NO EXCEPTIONS!** Also, no players interviews will take place after Wednesday, of game week. Special requests will be considered by the Sports Information Office.

The locker room, training room, weight room and administrative offices are off limits at all-times. Special requests will be considered by the Sports Information Office should an interview request be given for the head trainer, strength & conditioning coach, athletic director, etc...

The Jaguar Sports Information Office asks that the media refrain from attempting to contact players at home, in dorms, on campus or at any other public setting without prior approval.

PRACTICE POLICIES

Practices are generally open to the media, however, the coaching staff reserves the right to close practices without notice. This can be done at the discretion of head coach, Pete Richardson. Please contact Kevin Manns, or the Southern University Sports Information Office at (225) 771-2601, prior to coming to practice to determine whether or not it can be viewed.

All video should be taken between the goal lines (sidelines - no endzone shots). Video of practice must be shot in the first 10 minutes of practice. This time frame covers, stretching and individual periods. Still pictures can be taken, making certain that the focus is on one individual, and not a group. During an open practice, the coaching staff reserves the right to request certain plays or formations not be filmed or shot by still cameras.

INJURY UPDATES

SID, Kevin Manns, will get a report on Monday morning as to injuries suffered during Saturday's game, and announce their probability for action in a release or through the email system.

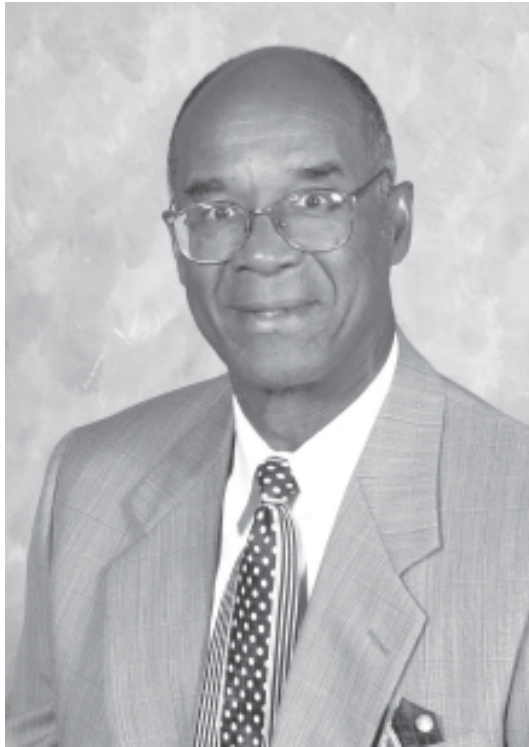
PARKING

HEAD COACH PETE RICHARDSON, 15th Season



To play for championships, to graduate his players and to have a team whose members are well respected in society, both on and off the playing field, is the vision of success Southern University head football coach Pete Richardson has for his program.

The success of the football program under Richardson has been well documented. Southern University has four, 11-win seasons and one 12 win season – the 2003 Championship season in Richardson's tenure.

Last season Pete Richardson suffered his first losing season in 18 years of coaching, and if his off-season work ethic is any measruing stick, the Jags look well on theri way to a successful return.

Southern University has won five conference titles under Richardson, including back-to-back-to-back crowns in 1997, '98 and '99; and the 2003 SWAC Championship, put the Jags and Richardson back into the football fray, as Black College National Champions, all while posting a 105-38 overall mark under Richardson's guise. His 105 wins ranks him second in SU's history, trailing only the legendary, A.W. Mumford.

Southern continues to rank among the nations best in Division I-AA attendance per football game, and in 2003, Southern topped all SWAC schools in attendance and finished third in all of NCAA Division I-AA in attendance.

Exploding on the scene in 1993, Richardson's impact was immediately felt around the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) as he led Southern to a 11-1 season (only the school's second, 11-plus win season), its

first conference title in 18 years (a shared title in 1975) and the school's first outright crown in 34 seasons (1959).

Though there have been setbacks in Richardson's 11-year stay, those setbacks have done nothing but breed more success. In Richardson's second season, Southern notched an inconsistent 6-5 mark, including a four-game losing skid — the longest record of futility in the Richardson era.

After an off-season that focused on the 'basics of football,' a rigorous strength and conditioning regiment and a new defensive scheme, the Jaguars bounced back and posted the school's third 11-plus win season (11-1) and was declared national champions of black college football with a 30-25 win over Florida A&M University in the fifth annual McDonald's Heritage Bowl.

Richardson would use a rigorous off-season program to instill a winning attitude in the members of the Jaguar football team. His team would respond by going 11-1 overall and an undefeated 8-0 in conference play. Southern University claimed its second conference title under Richardson and was regarded as black college national champions by the American Sports Wire after handing South Carolina State a 34-28 defeat in Heritage Bowl VII.

With the Jaguars setting the standard in the SWAC, and now challenging for championships and national recognition, the Pete Richardson Era is well on its way to becoming one of the more colorful and legendary in collegiate football history.

Pete Richardson came to Southern after five years at Winston-Salem State (1988-1992). In five seasons there, he compiled a record of 41-14-1. After assuming the reigns of an already successful program, Richardson's task was to maintain the established level of success and move the program beyond. He did just that. Richardson captured three CIAA conference championships (1988, '90-'91) and led the Rams to two berths in the Division II playoffs (1990-'91). At Winston-Salem State Richardson joined the coaching staff at Winston-Salem State in 1979 and initially gained quality experience as the offensive backfield coach of the program. The following year, he moved to the defensive backfield and became the defensive secondary coach. After a two-year stint there, Richardson was elevated to defensive coordinator before being named the head coach in 1988.

Richardson's honors include being named the Black Coaches Association's Coach of the Year in 1998, five-time SWAC Coach of the Year (1995, '97, '98, '99 and '03), Atlanta's 100% Wrong Club's Coach of the Year (1995, '97, '98, '99 and '03), Washington D.C.'s Pigskin Club's Coach of the Year (1995, '98 and '03), the Kodak Region IV Coach of the Year (1995) and the Sheridan Broadcasting Network's Coach of the Year (1997 & 2003). Richardson's also had the distinction of being named the 1999 Nokia Sugar Bowl Louisiana Coach of the Year.

Richardson has coached in five bowl games, has six collegiate conference crowns to his accord (three CIAA and three SWAC) and holds the honorable distinction of being the only Southwestern Athletic Conference coach never to have lost a game to the legendary Eddie Robinson, formerly of Grambling State. A first team all-state running back at Ohio's Youngstown South High, Richardson was recruited out of high school as a running back and defensive back by the coaching staff at the University of Dayton (OH).

At Dayton, Richardson began his career at tailback, before enduring an ankle injury, which forced a move to defensive back at the end of his freshman year. Richardson went on to become a three-year starter at the University of Dayton in the defensive backfield.

Richardson realized a childhood dream as he became a sixth-round draft choice of the NFL's Buffalo Bills in 1968, the roots of a four-year stint in the National Football League, where he established himself on the playing field as a two-time starter in the Bills' defensive backfield. After suffering a career-ending injury to his left knee, Richardson proceeded to further his education and acquired a master's degree in guidance counseling in 1978 from the University of Dayton.

His lifetime involvement in athletics eventually led him to a coaching career, one that began in the halls of Ohio's Dayton Dunbar High. In only his second season on the staff, Richardson took over the head coaching reigns.

With the opportunity of moving to Division I-AA as the head coach of Southern University, along with the national exposure the Bayou Classic brought to SU football, Richardson opted to accept the challenge and signed on as the Jaguars mentor in 1993.

Since coming to Southern, Richardson has rallied the supporters of the program and has energized recruiting efforts, renewing the fortune of Jaguar football. In his first season, Southern University captured the NCAA division I-AA's national attention by going 11-1 on the year and grabbing the school's first bowl appearance and victory, an 11-0 blanking of South Carolina State.

Pete Richardson's ability to motivate his players to personal, academic and athletic success, his public relations acumen and his vision for the program means great things for the University for years to come.

A 1968 graduate of the University of Dayton, Richardson earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education and later acquired a master's degree in Guidance Counseling in 1978.

Pete Richardson has one adult daughter, Deborah Bouie of Mechanicsville, Pennsylvania, and two grandchildren, Nathan and Monet.

Richardson is married to the former Lillian Raines of Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

2008 SEASON OUTLOOK

“CHAMPIONSHIPS UNDER CONSTRUCTION”

With a new three year contract in hand, head coach Pete Richardson and the Southern Jaguars will look to improve on an 8-3 record in 2007. SU finished 6-3 in the SWAC's Western Division, good for a second place finish. After back-to-back losing seasons in '05 (4-7) and '06 (5-6), Southern bounced back strongly last season with their eight wins, but even in their three losses, SU had opportunities to win those games. The Jags three losses were by a total of 13 points.

Southern will return 43 lettermen in '08 (22 Off, 18 Def, 3 Sp) and also return 17 starters (6 Off, 8 Def, 5 Sp). SU will have to replace three big names that helped lead the Jags turnaround. Darren Coates finished last season in record form, becoming the first player in 13 years to lead Southern in both rushing (146 rushes for 732 yds) and receiving (49 catches for 566 yards). Coates was a 2nd team all-SWAC selection last season.

The Jags will also have to replace Gerard Landry, who finished his SU career with 159 catches for 2,055 yards and 20 touchdowns. Landry finished his career #2 on SU's all-time career receiving yards list. Landry was also 2nd team all-SWAC selection last season.

The final big piece that SU must replace is safety, Jarmaul George. George finished his SU career with 10 interceptions and 118 tackles over three seasons. George was SWAC Freshman of the Year in '03, and made back-to-back 1st team all-SWAC ('06 & '07).

RACE HORSE OFFENSE

Quarterback Bryant Lee (6-2, 195, R-JR) returns to lead the Jaguar offense in 2008. Lee, in his first full year as a starter in '07, led the SWAC in passing average (232.6 yd/g), total offense (260 yd/g) and pass efficiency (152.6) — despite missing the Alcorn State game with an ankle injury and half of the Bayou Classic with a broken thumb. He went 199-for-303 (65.7 percent) for 2,326 yards, 23 touchdowns and four interceptions (two of which first bounced off the intended receiver and a third after the thumb injury). He also rushed 126 times for 174 yards and four touchdowns. Bryant moved into seventh all-time on SU's passing list, surpassing Thomas Ricks, with 2,897 passing yards and 26 touchdowns. Lee was named 2nd team all-SWAC in 2007.

Lee's backup, Warren Matthews (6-3, 230, R-JR), also returns in '08 for Southern. Matthews proved more than capable of sunning the show if Lee goes down. In five games, Matthews went 29 of 52 for 294 yards and two touchdowns, with no interceptions. He also rushed 33 times for 69 yards.

The Jaguars top rushers returning for 2008 included Brian Threat (6-2, 210, JR) and Kendrick Smith (6-1, 218, SR). Threat rushed for 172 yards on 45 carries with two scores in '07, while Smith rushed for 161 yards on 38 carries. Both were hampered by injuries in '07 and missed portions of the spring rehabbing those injuries.

Southern receiving corps returns several players that have been at the top of the heap in catching balls from the SU QB's. Del Roberts (5-9, 190, SR) leads the SU receivers, after catching 42 passes for 474 yards and two touchdowns in '07. He also rushed nine times for 84 yards. Juamorris Stewart (6-3, 195, JR) also returns for SU in the fall. Stewart caught 23 passes for 237 yards and one score last season. Others who look to make a big splash in 2008 include Clevan White who caught 20 passes for 196 yards and one touchdown and Isaiah Nelson (5-10, 180, R-SO), who will see his playing time increase on both offense and on special teams as a returner. Also, look for back-up receiver and back-up long/snapper, Curry Allen (6-3, 200, JR) to join the receiver fray this season. Allen had a great spring is battling for a starting position after the spring workouts.

After limping into the 2007 season due to academic issues, the SU offensive line ended up being one of the brighter spots on the SU offense. The Jags must replace left tackle, Trent Thomas, whom the Jags lost to graduation, but several other players stepped up and played admirably, and the o-line as a whole was a solid unit once they gelled.

Returning for his redshirt senior season is center/guard, Demarcus Stewart (6-0, 290, R-SR), along with center Daniel Stephens (6-3, 290, JR), guard Rafael Louis (6-3, 280, R-SR) and tackle Myles Williams (6-3, 285, SR). This group will get some help with the return of center/guard, Roman Chinyong (6-1, 285, JR), tackle Adrian Banks (6-4, 320, JR), Allen Buckner (6-4, 205, JR) and guard/tackle Jacoby Collins (6-6, 370, SR).

THE NEW DOG DAY DEFENSE

Although the Jags must replace Jarmaul George in the defensive secondary, along with Efe Osawemenze (six interceptions in '07), the “Dog Day Defense” of SU returns for the most part, fully intact.

Leading the way will be the Jags top tackler from the past two seasons in strong safety, Glenn Bell (5-9, 190, R-SR). Bell led the team in tackles with 80 (42 solo), including nine tackles for 33 losses in yards and two sacks for 10 yards. Bell also had three quarterback hurries and one fumble recovery, while he tied for third in interceptions on the team with three picks. He also had two pass deflections. Bell was ranked tied for ninth in the SWAC in tackles in '07 at 7.3 p/g.

Linebacker John Malveaux (6-0, 255, SR), returns in the middle of Jags defense as one of the anchors. Malveaux was second on the team in tackles in '08, with 79 total tackles (34 solo). He also recorded 4.5 tackles for loss and two sacks. He tied for third on the team with five pass deflections. Malveaux was sixth in the SWAC in tackles in '07 at 8.8 p/g.

Defensive end, Vince Lands (6-1, 260, R-SR) is also back to wreak havoc on the opposing quarterbacks. Lands is a standout and role model wherever he sets foot - the classroom, the weight room or the field. He had 60 tackles,

with 7½ sacks and 22 tackles for loss. That went along with seven pass breakups, 11 quarterback hurries and one fumble recovery last season. Lands was named first team all-SWAC in 2007. He also received a degree from SU in the spring and is now enrolled in graduate school, along with doing a summer internship.

“He just plays hard. His leadership and dedication, academically and athletically, shows people you can be effective at doing both,” Richardson said.

Outside linebacker, Gary Chatman (6-3, 225, JR) finished 2007 as the Jags sixth best tackler, with 57 total tackles (26 solo). The athletically gifted Chatman also recorded nine tackles for losses and four sacks. He had one interception, two pass deflections and one forced fumble. He tied lands for a team high 11 QB hurries.

Michael Williams (5-11, 195, R-SR) returns in the Jags secondary for his final season on the bluff. Williams recorded 53 tackles (41 solo), with four tackles for loss. He had three interceptions, five pass deflections and one fumble recovery. Williams has had a wonderful career to this point, as shown with 168 total tackles (112 solo), seven interceptions with one returned for a 82 yard touchdown, and 21 pass deflections from the corner position.

Defensive tackle, Joseph Selders (6-2, 325, R-SR) recorded 39 tackles, including four for losses and two sacks. Selders also had five QB hurries. “Midnight” as he is known, is a force in the middle of the Jags defensive front, and usually commands a double team, open up holes for the SU linebackers to fill.

Toyin Akinwale (5-10, 190, SR), the Jags nickel back, recorded 19 tackles (10 solo), with three sacks and a forced fumble. Akinwale is very physical for his stature, and has plenty of playing experience dating all the way back to his freshman season.

Corner, Joe Manning (6-0, 185, SR) stepped in last season after transferring from Florida State, and recorded 20 tackles (13 solo), to go along with two pass deflections, one interception, one fumble recovery and one blocked kick. Manning was a solid defender for SU last season spot starting, and will move in to that starting role this season.

Also look for players like defensive ends, Don Holloway and Westley King to make an impact this season, along with linebackers Donald Steele, Corey Ray and DJ Bolton also to make a large splash.

The SU special teams unit returns almost fully intact from the snapper to the punter/kicker, with the exception of kickoff returns, where SU lost the services of Albert Turner to graduation.

Josh Duran (5-8, 175, SO) returns for kicking/punting duties in 2008. Duran was named 2007 1st team all-SWAC last season. He led the SWAC with 40.3 yards per punt, and

landed 18 of his 65 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line. Though recruited primarily to be the Jags goal kicker, Duran impressed the coaching staff with his punting in preseason and quickly became a force for SU with his pinpoint punting in crucial situations.

“He surprised as far as punting, and he's still going to develop into a fine field-goal kicker for us,” Richardson said

SU also has a good backup in Willie Joseph (5-7, 160, JR). Joseph connected on his only attempt at PAT's last season.

Long/short snapper, Demarcus Turner (2-9, 230, SR) returns for his final season of snapping duties. A very reliable snapper, Turner has proved to be a valuable asset to the Jags special team unit. He also recorded three special teams tackles last season.

The Southern University football schedule will take on a new look in 2008 as the Jags open up with two games on the road to start the season. SU will travel to Houston on August 30th, to take on the Cougars of the University of Houston.

Houston is the first FBS team the Jags have faced since playing Tulane in 2001 and 2002. The second week of the season will see SU travel to Nashville, TN on September 6th to take on the Tigers of Tennessee State University in the John Merritt Classic. Southern will finally get a home game when the host Mississippi Valley State in the home opener on September 13th. Two weeks later, the Jags will travel to Lorman, MS to take on the Braves of Alcorn State on September 27th. The month of October starts off with a bang, as SU stays out on the road with a trip to Jackson, MS to face the Jackson State Tigers on October 4th. The following week, the Jags return home for homecoming, as they host the Texas Southern University Tigers on October 11th. The Rattlers of Florida A&M return to AW Mumford Stadium on October 18th, before SU closes out the month with another trip to Houston, to take on the Panthers of Prairie View A&M University on October 25th. The Jags open up the month of November on the 1st, when the Jags host Arkansas-Pine Bluff for Senior Day. Fresh off of signing a new contract that will see SU play Alabama State in the Gulf Coast Classic thru 2011, the Jags and Hornets will meet up in Mobile, AL on November 15th. Southern will close out the month when they play hosts to the Grambling State University Tigers in the XXXV State Farm Bayou Classic on November 29th, in New Orleans. With the SWAC Championship scheduled for December 13th in Birmingham, AL, Pete Richardson is poised once again to lead his Jaguars in December play in 2008.

THE DEAN IS HERE FOR 16: Pete Richardson, known as the “Dean” of the SWAC because of his longevity, returns to Southern for his 16th season as head coach of the Southern Jaguar football program.

SOUTHERN AND SEASON OPENERS: Saturday’s game marks the start of the 84th season of Southern University Jaguar football. SU is 49-28-6 in season opening games.

PETE RICHARDSON AND SEASON OPENERS: Although he ranks second on Southern’s all-time coaching list in victories, Coach Pete Richardson’s teams have had mediocre success in opening games. Coach Richardson is 8-7 (.533) in season opening games, including last season’s 33-27 win over Florida A&M on ESPN Classic in the MEAC/SWAC Challenge in Birmingham, AL.

RICHARDSON 9TH WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH: With 164 career victories, head coach Pete Richardson ranks 9th on the list of winningest active coaches in the Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA). His .718 winning percentage is sixth among active coaches as well.

RICHARDSON WINS 124TH AT SU: With the 22-13 win over Grambling State in the 2007 season finale, SU’s Pete Richardson claimed his 124th career win at Southern. He trails only the legendary and College Hall of Fame coach AW Mumford in wins, who won 176 games at SU.

SOUTHERN VS. HOUSTON: This will be the first ever meeting between the Southern Jaguars and the Houston Cougars on the gridiron, although the two schools have met once a piece in men’s and women’s basketball, including last season’s 73-49 Houston win at Hofheinz Pavilion on the UH Campus.

SOUTHERN VS. C-USA: This will be the third meeting of a Pete Richardson coached Southern Jaguar football team against a Conference USA opponent. The Jags faced C-USA’s Tulane in the 2001 and 2002 (Big Easy Classic’s) seasons. The Green Wave defeated Southern, 7-41, in ‘01 and, 19-37, in ‘02.

A FAMILIAR SETTING: When the Jags line up against the Houston Cougars on Saturday, at least they will know one thing -- we’ve been here before, literally. The Jags have routinely played in Robertson Stadium, when Houston’s neighbor, Texas Southern University, has hosted the Jags in Houston.

JAGS GARNER PRESEASON ALL-SWAC HONORS: When the Southwestern Athletic Conference announced its preseason All-SWAC teams, five Southern Jaguars were named to the 1st team, with one garnering Preseason Offensive Player of the Year honors.

Redshirt-Sophomore quarterback, Bryant Lee was named preseason SWAC Offensive Player of the Year. Named the preseason offensive player of the year, Lee (6-2, 195, Jr.) spearheaded an offensive unit that finished first in passing offense, second in total offense and fourth in scoring offense last season. The Boutte, La., native tallied 2,326 passing yards in ten games in 2007. He threw for 23 touchdowns (leading the SWAC) while finishing with a pass efficiency rating of 152.6 (11th in the FCS). He ended the season garnering second-team All-Conference honors.

SOUTHERN PICKED TO FINISH 2ND IN SWAC WEST: The Southern Jaguars were picked to finish second in the the SWAC West in 2008. In the predicted order of finish, voters decided that the 2007 division winners will repeat in 2008. In the Western Division, 2005 champion Grambling State claimed 11 first-place votes as they earned 96 points. Southern -- the 1999 and 2003 champion -- received seven first-place votes as en route to 89 total points. Prairie View A&M earned four firstplace tallies as they finished with 75 points. Arkansas-Pine Bluff (38 pts) and Texas Southern (32 pts) rounded out the Western Division. In the Eastern Division, SWAC champion Jackson State received 17 first-place votes en route to 105 total points. Alabama A&M, the 2006 SWAC champion, received five first-place tallies as they received 92 points. Mississippi Valley State (51 pts), Alabama State (49 pts) and Alcorn State (33 pts) rounded out the divisional voting.

JAGUAR CAPTAINS: Senior strong safety Glenn Bell, senior defensive tackle, Joseph Selders, and senior defensive end, Vince Lands, have been named the team captains for the 2008 season.

EFFICIENT-LEE: Southern quarterback, Bryant Lee, had one of the best seasons in America last season - in any division. Lee completed 199 of 303 passes for 2326 yards and 23 touchdowns with only four interceptions. He finished 11th in FCS in passing efficiency with a 152.57 mark.

GOING TO LAND ON HIS FEET: When SU defensive end Vince Lands' football career ends, he knows exactly what his plans are for his next life. Lands graduated with honors in the spring of 2008, with a degree in biology/pre-med. He then spent the summer in Nashville, TN at MeHarry Medical College, which is considered perhaps the major educator of black physicians in the US. He also took the Optometry School Entrance Exam in July, while working an internship and studying for the MCAT (Medical College Admissions Test), he also continued to work out preparing for the season. On Friday of last week, he was excused from practice so he could take the MCAT exam.

EARLY STARTS: The SU Jags will play in the month of August for the first time in five years. SU's last August start was coincidentally on the 30th, when SU defeated Mississippi Valley State 29-0 in 2003.

SCORING IS OUR FORTE: SU refuses to get shutout. The SU Jags under Pete Richardson have now scored in 131 consecutive games. The streak dates all the way back to to the eighth week of the season in 1996, when Nicholls State blanked Southern 14-0.

FRESHMEN REPORT: The SU football program has 17 of 23 signees currently eliglble and practicing witht he team. Two more players have yet to be cleared for either medical purposes or waiting for the NCAA Clearinghouse.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: The SU Jags have seen a few freshmen step into fall camp, pick up the system, and have made thier marks in battling for key playing time in their freshmen campaigns. Wide Receiver, LaQuinton Evans; runningbacks, Jerry Joseph, Silas Gibbs and Byron Williams; tight end, Tyus Harris; offensive linemen, Lee Almanza and Chris Browne; defensive linemen, Ken Frankson, Kennon Gilliard, along with linebacker Justin Fletcher and transfer Austin Thomas have made some eyebrows rise with thier camp play.

HOUSTON CONNECTION: The Houston, Texas area has always been a hotbed for Southern recruiting. This season is no different as the Jags have 13 players on the roster that call Houston home. SU has a total of 15 players

2007 SOUTHERN JAGUARS

GAME BY GAME SEASON IN REVIEW

GAME #1: Southern 33, Florida A&M 27 (MEAC/SWAC Challenge - Birmingham, Ala.)



The third time proved to be the charm as the Southern Jaguars downed the Florida A&M Rattlers 33-27 to claim the 2007 MEAC/SWAC Challenge. The win gives the SWAC its first win in the series and brings the challenge series to 2-1 for the MEAC.

Southern used its first play from scrimmage to jump on the board as Darren Coates took the pitch up the right side and after several moves along the sideline - scampered 90 yards for the opening score.

Trailing 6-0, FAMU's Leon Camel scored on a nine-yard run, following a fumble recovery with just over four minutes left in the opening period, to put the Rattlers ahead, 7-0. Rattler RB Phillip Sylvester would score on a 45-yard run to push the lead to 14-6, midway through the second period.

Both teams would trade scores with failed PAT tries as Florida A&M carried an eight-point lead, 20-12, into intermission. Southern closed to within two points, 14-12, when Bryant Lee connected with Gerard Landry on a 46-yard scoring play with 4:26 left. FAMU countered with a 40-yard scoring strike from Camel to Javares Knight with 2:14 left in the half.

In the second half, the Jaguars took control of the contest, outscoring FAMU, 21-7. The next 16 minutes of play would see Southern score on three running plays: a 14-yard run by Brian Threat, a 3-yard run by Bryant Lee and a 1-yard plunge by Darren Coates. With the score 33-20 late in the final period, Florida A&M would get a late 4-yard run from Sylvester for the final point total.

GAME #4: Southern 41, Tennessee State 34 (AW Mumfords Stadium - Baton Rouge, LA)



Southern University's Bryant Lee passed for a career high 305 yards and a career high four touchdowns and the SU "Dog Day D" forced five second half turnovers, as the Jaguars overcame a 27-6 deficit to beat Tennessee State 41-34 Saturday night and remain undefeated.

Antonio Heffner, who finished with 316 yards passing and four touchdowns, got Tennessee State (2-2) off to a fast start with a 1-yard run for the game's first touchdown and a 61-yard pass to Brandon Belvin for the second with 9:13 left in the first quarter, to put Tennessee State up 13-0 early in the first quarter. Bryant, who was 23-of-33 for Southern (4-0), hit RoShon Jacobs with a 13-yard scoring pass to make the score 13-6.

Jackson State's Jimmy Oliver passed for 308 yards and three touchdowns and Eric Perri kicked three field goals and every extra point as the Tigers beat the Southern Jaguars, 32-26 Saturday night at AW Mumford Stadium.

Oliver finished 21-for-31 with three interceptions for Jackson State (4-2), which remained unbeaten in four Southwestern Athletic Conference games. The loss was the second in a row for Southern (5-2, 3-2).

The teams traded scores for the first two quarters. An 8-yard pass from Oliver to Jaymar Johnson was answered by Bryant Lee's 31-yard pass to Darren Coates. It was ugly, but it was a win and we're 6-2, and that all that matters. SU fullback, Alvin Fossilman's one-yard plunge with 5:13 remaining, gave Southern a 14-10 victory over Alcorn State Saturday afternoon on Senior Day on the bluff.

Southern (6-2, 4-2 SWAC) broke a two-game losing skid and secured its first winning season in two years -- since claiming the Western Division title in 2004.

Neither team managed to score in the first quarter. Southern scored its first touchdown on Warren Mathews' 24-yard pass to Darren Coates early in the second quarter. Mathews completed a career-high 14 of 27 passes for 117 yards.

Alvin Fossilman scored the winning touchdown with 5:13 remaining.

Down 7-0 at halftime, Alcorn State got back in the game with the only score in the third quarter, on a 26-yard pass from Tony Hobson to Emman Arceneaux pulling ASU even at 7-7. ASU's Alexander Oelfke's 33-yard field goal put the Braves ahead, 10-7 with 13:11 to go in the fourth quarter.

Then Mathews settled down and took SU on a 13-play, 59-yard drive, capped off with Fossilman's touchdown to put the Jaguars ahead.

But it took two big stops and one goal line stand by the "Dog Day D", to secure the win. First, Alcorn converted a third-and-9 with a 14-yard completion to running back Vernardus Cooper, movin the ball to the SU 22 with 3:13 left.

Then nickel back Toyin Akinwale, who injured his right ankle in the first half but came back after halftime, broke up a touchdown pass to Arceneaux. The ball was already in Arceneaux's hands when a massive hit knocked the wind out of Arceneaux and the ball from his hands with 2:30 left. On a fourth-and-7 from the 18, a fluttering Chris Walker pass to the end zone drew pass interference from cornerback Michael Williams, giving Alcorn new life, with a first and-goal at the SU 2 with 1:44 remaining. But cornerback Michael Williams was flagged for pass interference, even though the ball was tipped. That gave ASU first and goal. On first down, Cooper got stopped for a 1-yard loss by linebacker Donald Steele. On second down, defensive ends Vince Lands and Don Holloway crashed in to snare Cooper for a 3-yard loss. On third down, Walker's pass to Arceneaux on the left side sailed wide. That left 23.7 seconds to play and a fourth-and-goal at the SU six yard line. Drop linebacker Gary Chatman slid into coverage, and helped Jarmaul George squeeze Arceneaux as he ran a slant route. George made good, closing from behind on the Alcorn State receiver Emmanuel Arceneux in the end zone to poke away and secure a thrilling last second goalline stand.

Backup quarterback, CJ Byrd, also saw his first action of the 2007 season, going three for three passing for 29 yards, and rushing five times for two yards.

Coates led all rushers with 57 yards on 16 carries and picked up another 49 yards on six catches. Del Roberts also had

GAME #10: Ark.-Pine Bluff 23, Southern 21 (Golden Lions Stadium, Pine Bluff, AR)



Arkansas-Pine Bluff's John Heflin kicked a 32-yard field goal as time expired to give Arkansas-Pine Bluff a 23-21 victory Saturday over Southern University.

The kick came after a somewhat controversial play. With 10 seconds remaining, Heflin attempted a 30-yard field goal.

Southern's Gary Chatman blocked the kick and a scramble for the ball ensued. Meanwhile, thinking the game was over the SU players rushed the field and the Jags were flagged for a 15 yard unsportsmanlike conduct penalty. Also, Ark-Pine Bluff recovered the kick. Here is where things are a little "cloudy". On UAPB's winning drive, Chris Wallace threw a 44-yard "Hail Mary" to Jason Jones on second down, giving UAPB the ball on SU's 20 with approximately 26 seconds on the clock. The Golden Lions rushed to the line, the official put the ball in play and stepped away and Wallace spiked the ball.

Then after calling a timeout, the officials reversed the call saying the ball never was put into play, thus making it 1st down and not second down. UAPB rushed the ball two more times (so is it 3rd or 4th down?) before attempting the kick that Chatman blocked.

UAPB (3-7, 3-5 SWAC) jumped out to a 20-0 lead on early in the second quarter after a 62-yard pass play from Chris Wallace to Jason Jones and two running TDs by Mickey Dean, one from 2 yards out, the other from the 3. Heflin's pointafter kick on Dean's first TD was blocked by the Jaguars.

But Southern (7-3, 5-3 SWAC) then scored three touchdowns of its own. Gerard Landry took a 4-yard pass from Bryant Lee; Lee threw another scoring pass to Albert Turner from 40 yards out, and he threw for another TD to Juamorris Stewart from the 16. The Jaguars made all the extra points to take a 21-20 lead with 1:05 left in the game.

UAPB took seven plays to cover 60 yards in the game's final minute to get within range of Heflin's leg for the winning kick.

Lee was 31-of-40 for the night, with no interceptions, for 373 yards. UAPB's Wallace went 16-for-21 but was intercepted twice.

GAME #11: Southern 22, Grambling State 13 (Bayou Classic XXXIV, La. Superdome, New Orleans, LA)



Southern University finished the 2008 season on a high note, as the Jaguars defeated the Grambling State Tigers 22-13, before 53,297 fans at the Louisiana Superdome in the State Farm Bayou Classic XXXIV.

The loss end Grambling State's quest for an undefeated season.

After receiving the opening kickoff, Southern jumped out on top when running back Darren Coates scored on a one-yard run at the 11:43 mark of the first quarter. SU's Josh Duran nailed the PAT for a 7-0 Jaguar advantage. Grambling State quickly answered and tied the game at 7-7 with a 13-play 61 yard drive.

With the score tied at 7-7, SU moved back on top, when the Jags used a 10 play-80 yard drive to move back ahead when Bryant Lee connected with Darren Coates for a 10-yard touchdown pass. Duran's PAT was good as the Jaguars took a 14-7 lead. From that point, the contest turned into a defensive struggle as both teams alternated possessions en route to a 14-7 halftime lead by Southern.

The second half was a mirror image of the first as neither team took advantage of good field position on several occasions. Southern finally took advantage late in the third quarter when Joe Manning blocked a Tim Manuel punt that rolled into the end zone for a team safety and a 16-7 advantage. Southern moved ahead 19-7 when Duran nailed a 23-yard field goal with 1:19 left.

Grambling State would not go away easy, as quarterback Brandon Landers completed 7-of-8 passes on their next drive, en route to finding wideout Clyde Edwards for a 27-yard scoring strike. Manuel's PAT was blocked as GSU continued to trail 19-13 in the middle of the fourth quarter.

With the momentum shifting and time winding down in the final stanza, SU backup quarterback Warren Matthews, came in for an injured Bryant Lee, and converted a huge 3rd-and-2 when he found Coates for a 32-yard reception. Four plays later, SU's Josh Duran connected on a 37-yard field goal to move Southern ahead by two possessions at 22-13.

GSU never got on track at that point as Landers was intercepted on the next drive. SU ran the clock out on the ensuing drive and captured its second consecutive Bayou Classic contest.

For the game, SU amassed 366 (214 P, 152 R) total offensive yards to GSU's 253 (195 P, 58 R). Darren Coates led Southern in rushing with 107 yards on 20 carries while, Gerard Landry caught five passes for 72 yards. Bryant Lee finished with 120 passing yards before leaving the game with a right hand
