The Game . . .

√ The **TULSA GOLDEN HURRICANE (8-1, 5-0 C-USA)** returns to Conference USA action this week against the **HOUSTON COUGARS (5-4, 4-1 C-USA)** in a showdown of league rivals . . . the game is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. (CT) at John O'Quinn Field (32,000) in Houston, Texas . . . the game has been added to the CBS College Sports Network schedule.

The Series . . .

√ This is the 34th meeting between Tulsa and Houston . . . the Cougars lead the series 17-16 . . . the Hurricane won last year's game in Tulsa 56-7 . . . the year before, Houston captured a 27-10 victory at home . . . UH leads the series at home, 11-7, while Tulsa holds a 9-6 series edge on its home field . . . the most points by Houston in the series was 100 points in a 100-6 win in 1968, while Tulsa's is 56 points established last year.

Tulsa-Houston Looks to be an Offensive Affair . . .

√ Two potent offenses hook up in Houston on Saturday for a Conference USA West Division showdown . . . Tulsa ranks among the top-10 nationally in six major offensive categories, including first in three of those categories – total offense, scoring offense and third down conversions . . . Houston is ranked among the top-5 in four offensive categories — total offense, passing offense, third down conversions and first downs . . . here's a look at how the two teams compare in national statistics . . .

Tulsa Moves Back in the Polls; Hurricane Ranked 24th in USA Today/Coaches Poll and 25th in AP Poll . . .

√ Tulsa is ranked 24th nationally in the *USA Today/Coaches* poll and 25th in the *Associated Press* poll this week . . . Tulsa moved into the top-25 national rankings for the first time this season on Sunday, Oct. 19, when the Hurricane came in ranked 19th in the *USA Today/Coaches* poll and 22nd in the *Associated Press* poll . . . it was the first national ranking for the Hurricane since ending the 1991 season ranked 21st in both the *AP* and *USA Today/CNN* polls . . . Tulsa finished that season with a 10-2 record . . . Tulsa moved up to 18th in the *USA Today* poll and 19th in the *AP* poll the week of Oct. 26, before suffering its first loss of the season at Arkansas and dropping out of the poll the week of Nov. 2.

Hurricane 23rd in BCS Standings . . .

√ Tulsa is ranked 23rd in the fourth week of the BCS Standings . . . in the first Bowl Championship Series Standings (BCS), announced on October 19th, the Golden Hurricane had a rating of 19th . . . a week later, Tulsa moved up to 18th, and then last week was not ranked . . . the only other time Tulsa was ranked in the BCS Standings was on October 15, 2006 when the Hurricane was ranked No. 25.

Tulsa's 8-0 Start is the Sixth Time in School History . . .

√ Tulsa started the season with an 8-0 record, before losing its first game at Arkansas, 30-23 . . . it was the first time Tulsa started the season 8-0 since the 1942 campaign when the Hurricane posted a 10-0 record before losing its first game in the Sugar Bowl against Tennessee . . . the 8-0 start was the sixth time that Tulsa has been 8-0 in a season . . . the others came in 1916 (10-0), 1919 (8-0), 1920 (9-0), 1922 (9-0) and 1942 (10-0).

Tulsa Ranks as the Nation's Top Offense . . .

√ Tulsa ranks among the nation's top-10 in five major offensive categories . . . the Hurricane ranks first in three categories — total offense with an average of 593.0 yards per game, scoring offense with a 52.0 average and pass efficiency with a rating of 194.38 . . . Tulsa also ranks fifth in passing offense with an average of 345.8 yards per game, and is ninth in rushing offense at 247.2 yards per game . . . the Hurricane is also first nationally in third down conversions with a percentage of 58-percent, and second in first downs with 249 for an average of 27.7 per game.

QB Johnson Named O'Brien Award Semifinalist . . .

√ Tulsa quarterback David Johnson was named as one of 13 semifinalists for The Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award® (The O'Brien) on October 27 . . . The O'Brien honors the nation's best college quarterback of the year and inspires student-athletes to triumph both on and off the field . . . Johnson is the only quarterback from Conference USA to be named as a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award . . . among the semifinalists, six are from Big 12 schools, three from the SEC and one each from the Mountain West, Pac-10, Big Ten and Johnson from Conference USA . . . finalists are announced November 24.

Defense Comes Up Big . . .

√ The Hurricane defense had their best performance of the season holding UCF to 187 total yards, 124 passing yards and 13 first downs, all season lows for a Tulsa opponent . . . the Hurricane also had a NCAA high this year of nine quarterback sacks for -67 yards . . . Tulsa had gone seven quarters dating back to the second quarter vs. UTEP of holding the opposition to 261 yards, an average of 37.3 yards per quarter.

The Coaches . . .

√ Tulsa's **Todd Graham (East Central '87)** is in his second season as head coach of the Golden Hurricane . . . he has an overall coaching mark of 25-11 and a 18-5 mark at Tulsa . . . he led Tulsa to a 10-4 mark and the GMAC Bowl Championship last year . . . before returning to Tulsa, Graham spent 2006 as head coach at Rice, where he led the Owls to a 7-6 record, second-place in the C-USA West Division and the school's first bowl berth in 45 years . . . before that, Graham spent three years as the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Tulsa . . . he helped Tulsa post a 21-17 record and win the 2005 C-USA Championship and 2005 Liberty Bowl titles . . . prior to coming to Tulsa, he spent two years at West Virginia . . . he coached in the prep ranks in Texas and Oklahoma before moving to the college level.

√ Houston's **Kevin Sumlin (Purdue '86)** is in his first season as the Cougars head coach and has a 5-4 record . . . he came to Houston after serving as an assistant coach at Oklahoma for four years (2003-04, 2006-07), including his final year as the co-offensive coordinator . . . before that, he spent two years at Texas A&M (2001-02), four years at his alma mater Purdue (1998-01), five years at Minnesota (1993-97) and two years at Wyoming (1991-92) . . . he was a two-time honorable mention all-Big Ten linebacker at Purdue in the 1980's.

Hurricane Puts Up Over 70 Points and 700 yards . . .

√ Tulsa amassed 77 points against UTEP and gained 791 yards of total offense . . . the 77 points is the most for a Tulsa team since defeating Tampa, 77-0, on October 14, 1967 . . . the 791 yards of total offense missed by eight yards of tying the school record of 798 yards against Idaho State on October 7, 1967 . . . Tulsa's 791 yards is the most in the NCAA this year, while it is only the third 700+ total offense game for a team this season . . . the closest was Troy's 736 yards against Alcorn State on Sept. 13 . . . Tulsa's 77 points is the second most in the NCAA this year, while just six teams have scored 70 or more points this season.

Johnson is Top-Ranked QB in the Nation . . .

√ Tulsa's David Johnson ranks first nationally in passing efficiency with a rating of 198.2 . . . he ranks fourth in points responsible for with an average of 24.2 points and passing yards per game (331.4), fifth in total offense (341.4) and eighth for total passing yards (2,983) . . . he now has the third-best single-season passing performance in school history with 2,983 yards . . . his 33 passing touchdowns ranks second behind Paul Smith's 47 TDs (2007) for a single-season in school history.

Lock it . . .

√ Junior safety James Lockett, who played in just six games before this season, is ranked third in the NCAA stats for forced fumbles with five on the year . . . he also ranks 16th for quarterback sacks (7.5/-57 yards) and 30th in tackles for lost yards (11.5/-69 yards) . . . Lockett caused two fumbles against UCF, and added five solo tackles, including three quarterback sacks for -27 yards . . . on the year, Lockett has 48 tackles, 11.5 stops for -69 yards, 7.5 sacks for -57 yards and five forced fumbles.

Two Plays Go For 90-Yard Touchdowns . . .

√ Tulsa had two scoring drives for over 90 yards against UTEP earlier this season, marking the second time in school history such a feat has occurred . . . senior quarterback David Johnson connected on a 97-yard touchdown pass to senior receiver Brennan Marion, while true freshman Damaris Johnson had a 94-yard kick-off return for a TD . . . the previous game in which Tulsa had two 90+ yard scoring plays came in 1994 against UNLV when Solomon White had a 94-yard TD run from scrimmage and Jason Jacoby returned a kick 100 yards . . . the 97-yard pass play is the third longest in school history, behind a 99 and 98-yarder . . . the 93-yard kickoff return ties for the 13th longest . . . it ranks behind four 100-yard returns, six 98-yard returns and two that went 96 yards.

Bryan is Tackles Leader . . .

√ Junior linebacker Mike Bryan has a team-leading 72 tackles in his first season as a starter . . . among those tackles is seven stops for -26 yards and two quarterback sacks . . . he has had three games with 13 or more tackles this year . . . against UCF, Bryan had a game-high 14 stops with three tackles for -22 yards . . . he also had 13 tackles vs. New Mexico and Central Arkansas.

Marion, Johnson Have Big-Time Performances in UTEP Rout . . .

√ Senior receiver Brennan Marion had the third-best receiving performance in college football this year with 233 yards and three TDs on six receptions against UTEP . . . his touchdown catches went for 97, 51 and 40 yards . . . senior quarterback David Johnson had his third game this year with at least five touchdown passes, as he completed 21-of-27 passes for 434 yards and five TDs.

Tulsa Has Most Single-Game Yards in NCAA This Year; Five of the Top-35 Performances . . .

√ Tulsa gained 791 total yards against UTEP on October 18th for the NCAA's season-best single-game performance this year . . . Tulsa has compiled five of the top-35 single-game bests for total offense this season . . . Tulsa's performance against UCA (641) ranks 14th, New Mexico (606) is 29th, SMU (602) is 31st and UAB (601) ranks 33rd . . . Tulsa also has five of the top-40 scoring games . . . Tulsa's 77 points is the second-most points scored this year in the NCAA . . . four more Tulsa games are ranked among the nation's top-40 this year, including Rice (63) ranked 18th, UCA (62) ranked 22nd, and the 56 points vs. North Texas and New Mexico ranks 36th.

Adams Ranks Second on Tulsa's Rushing List . . .

√ Tarrion Adams entered his senior season with 2,128 career rushing yards, after coming into his junior season with 903 yards . . . Adams now has 2,816 career rushing yards and is ranked second on the school's all-time rushing list, trailing all-time leader Micheal Gunter by 720 yards . . . this year, Adams has gained 688 yards and five touchdowns, while tallying four 100+ rushing games, all consecutively . . . Adams has 11 multiple TD games in his career and now has 30 career touchdowns (23 rushing and 7 receiving), while also throwing for two TDs . . . in 2007, he had six 100+ rushing games and now has 12 for his career . . . his 100+ rushing games this year have included 120 yards vs. UCA, 112 yards vs. Rice, 121 yards vs. SMU and 114 yards against UTEP.

Adams Becomes School's First 2,000-1,000 Yard Man . . .

√ Senior running back Tarrion Adams became the first player in school history to reach the 2,000-yard rushing and 1,000-yard receiving plateau in a career . . . he accomplished the feat with a 24-yard touchdown reception against Central Arkansas . . . in that game, Adams also had his ninth career 100-yard rushing game with 120 yards on 13 carries . . . he now has 2,816 rushing yards to rank second on the school's career rushing chart and also has 1,095 receiving yards in his career.

Tulsa Scores 50+ in Four Straight Game for First Time Since 1919 Season; Goes over 70 for First Time Since 1975 . . .

√ Tulsa scored over 50 points in five of its first nine games, including four coming consecutively with 56 each against North Texas and New Mexico, 62 against Central Arkansas and 63 vs. Rice . . . it's the first time since the 1919 season that the Hurricane has scored 50+ points in at least four straight games . . . in 1919, the five consecutive wins came against Central Oklahoma, Northwest Oklahoma, Arkansas, Trinity and Burelson College . . . Tulsa has had two consecutive games scoring over 60 points, marking the first time since the 1975 season when the Hurricane scored wins of 70-7 over Drake and 62-7 over Indiana State . . . the Hurricane scored over 70 points in a game with 77 vs. UTEP for the first time since 1975 in a 70-7 win over Drake . . . Tulsa ranks first nationally in scoring with a 52.0 average.

Tulsa Gains 300+ Rushing Yards in Four Straight Games . . .

√ The Hurricane offense rushed for over 300 yards in four straight consecutive games . . . Tulsa gained more yards on the ground in the first three of those games than through the air . . . Tulsa had 329 yards rushing vs. Central Arkansas, a season-high 391 yards against Rice, 321 yards vs. SMU and 321 yards vs. UTEP . . . the last time Tulsa had four straight 300+ rushing games came in 1982 when Tulsa put together four straight with 369 yards vs. Drake, 364 vs. Wichita State, 362 against West Texas State and 421 against Indiana State.

Johnson Continues to Lead . . .

√ Since the first week of the season, senior quarterback David Johnson leads the nation in passing efficiency at 198.24, while ranking among the top-5 in three more NCAA statistical categories . . . Johnson is fourth in points responsible for with 24.2 and passing yards per game at 331.4 ypg . . . he ranks fifth in total offense with 341.4 ypg . . . Johnson has had three 400+ passing games and two games with 6 TD games this season . . . he completed 24-of-39 passes for 469 yards and 6 touchdowns in a 56-14 win over New Mexico, and the game before that completed 25-of-33 passes for 418 yards and 6 TDs . . . against UTEP, Johnson completed 21-of-27 passes for 434 yards and 5 touchdowns . . . he has now completed 66.7-percent of his passes for 2,983 yards and 33 TDs this year . . . Johnson made his first career start in the season opener . . . he came into the season having completed just 41-of-63 passes for 472 yards and two TDs in his previous three seasons . . . his career totals are 213-of-321 for 3,473 yards and 35 TDs . . . he ranks 11th on Tulsa's career passing chart and needs 120 yards to move into 10th place and 251 for ninth place.

More on Johnson at Quarterback . . .

√ In his first game as the starter, Johnson completed 83-percent of his passes (20-of-24) for 332 yards and three touchdowns in a 45-22 win over UAB in the season opener . . . Johnson threw TD passes of 10, 5 and 73 yards, and also had throws of 58, 56, 32 and 29 yards . . . in his second game, Johnson threw for a career-best 418 yards and six touchdowns, the most for a Tulsa quarterback since Nov. 6, 1993 when Gus Frerotte had six TD passes against East Carolina . . . he was just 33 yards shy of tying the single-game school record for passing yards with 469 yards and 6 TDs vs. New Mexico in Tulsa's third game of the season.

TU Player Earns C-USA Weekly Honors Seven Times . . .

√ Seven times this year a TU player has earned C-USA Player of the Week honors . . . on Oct. 27, safety James Lockett was named the defensive player of the week after a 5-tackle, 2-forced fumble, and 3-sack for -27 yard performance against UCF . . . KO returner Damaris Johnson had four returns for 134 yards, including a 70-yarder that led to Tulsa's go-ahead touchdown vs. UCF to earn special teams player of the week for the second straight game . . . for their performances against UTEP, receiver Brennan Marion and Damaris Johnson earned the award on Oct. 20 . . . Marion's six catches for 233 yards and 3 TDs to earn the offensive award . . . Johnson returned six kicks for a school record 211 yards and had a 94-yard TD return . . . junior defensive end Un'Tavious Scott was named the C-USA Defensive Player of the Week for his performance against Rice the week of Oct. 4 . . . he had three tackles, including one stop for -5 yards, and had two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble . . . senior quarterback David Johnson shared C-USA Offensive Player of the Week honors with Marshall's Darius Passmore (Sept. 20) for his performance against New Mexico, while junior free safety Charles Davis was named the C-USA Defensive Player of the Week . . . Johnson had his second consecutive game with more than 400 yards passing and six touchdowns, as he completed 24-of-39 passes for 469 yards and six TDs in a 56-14 win over New Mexico . . . QB Johnson Added to Maxwell Award List . . .

√ Senior quarterback David Johnson was one of nine players added to the 2008 Maxwell Award list on October 7th, an award given to the nation's Outstanding Player of the Year by the Maxwell Football Club . . . he is one of 83 offensive players up for the award.

Tulsa is Only Undefeated Team in C-USA West Division . . .

√ In its first five Conference USA contests, Tulsa defeated UAB, 45-22, and UCF, 49-19, from the East Division, and West Division foes Rice (63-28), SMU (37-31) and UTEP (77-35) . . . the Hurricane has a 5-0 C-USA mark, while Rice is 5-1 and Houston is 4-1 in the league . . . there is no undefeated team in the East Division . . . the West Division teams have a 7-3 mark against East Division foes this year.

Tulsa Opened Renovated Stadium With a 56-14 Victory Over New Mexico . . .

√ The Tulsa Golden Hurricane opened its new home, the renovated H.A. Chapman Stadium, against the New Mexico Lobos on Saturday, September 20, 2008 . . . wearing throw-back uniforms from the 1950's, Tulsa scored on its first four possessions and built a 35-0 halftime lead en route to a 56-14 win in front of a sellout crowd of 30,000 fans . . . H.A. Chapman Stadium went through major renovations since the 2007 season ended last December . . . the stadium renovation included new seating throughout the stadium, restrooms, concession areas, new press box with luxury suites and club level seating, and a new scoreboard on the south side of the stadium, a new FieldTurf and other amenities.

Defense Shuts Down UTEP After First Quarter Barrage . . .

The Tulsa defensive unit was under barrage in the first quarter against UTEP as the Miners scored 28 first quarter points, but the Hurricane settled down after that . . . after allowing 264 yards and 28 points in the first quarter, Tulsa's defense held the Miners to just seven points and 74 total yards in the final three quarters in a 77-35 victory.

FS Davis Returns to Lineup in Big Way Vs. New Mexico . . .

√ Free safety Charles Davis played the first series of the season opener before suffering an injury and missing the next game . . . he returned to the lineup against New Mexico on Sept. 20, and blocked the first Lobo punt of the game which led to Tulsa's first TD in a 56-14 win . . . the junior also had two interceptions, the first of which stopped a UNM drive in the second quarter as he picked off the pass at the Tulsa 23-yard line, which led to Tulsa taking a 28-0 lead . . . his second interception came on New Mexico's first possession of the second half at the one-yard line . . . he returned it 21 yards . . . Davis also added five tackles in the contest.

Tulsa's 18 Consecutive 300-Yard Passing Games Streak Snapped . . .

√ Tulsa quarterbacks threw for 312 yards against Central Arkansas to give the Hurricane 18 straight games of surpassing the 300-yard passing plateau . . . however, this time it was two quarterbacks, David Johnson and Jacob Bower, who accomplished the feat . . . but in the next game against Rice, it was the rushing game that raced for over 300 yards, as Tulsa passed for just 191 yards . . . the individual streak by one quarterback ended vs. UCA as Johnson threw for 286 yards on 18-of-22 passes . . . Johnson surpassed the 300-yard passing plateau in his first three games as the starting quarterback this year, while Paul Smith had 14 straight 300+ passing games last year . . . Johnson had a 332-yard passing game against UAB in the season opener, 418 yards and six TDs at North Texas and followed that with 469 yards and six touchdowns against New Mexico . . . among the 18-game streak, Tulsa surpassed 400 yards passing seven times.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46). Tulsa has played in 14 bowl games.

- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive stand-out for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.

- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.

- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.

- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which is just north of Skelly Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000.

- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

- Some other former TU players went on to the NFL — Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner and Steve August.

- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and, Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears). Chicago Bears Defensive Coordinator Bob Babich is also a Tulsa graduate.

Johnson First to Throw Six TDs Twice in C-USA . . .

√ When senior quarterback David Johnson threw for six touchdowns in back-to-back games against North Texas and New Mexico, he became the first quarterback in Conference USA history to accomplish that feat in the same season . . . previously, there were only four other times that a quarterback in C-USA history threw for six TDs in a game.

The Lil' Guy Sets a School Record . . .

Five-foot, eight-inch true freshman Damaris Johnson may be small in stature, but is big on the football field and should be considered for Freshman All-America Honors . . . the frosh receiver/kick return specialist from Norco, Louisiana, leads Tulsa in all-purpose yards with 1,596 yards for a 177.3 average per game and has scored eight TDs . . . he has 415 yards and six TDs receiving, 209 rushing yards and one TD and 965 kick return yards and one TD in Tulsa's first nine games . . . against UTEP, he totaled 211 kickoff return yards which is a new school record, breaking the previous mark of 199 yards by Ashlan Davis vs. SMU on Nov. 6, 2004 . . . Johnson totaled 296 all-purpose yards in the UTEP game . . . he ranks third nationally in all-purpose yards and 16th in kickoff return yards . . . vs. UTEP, he had a 94-yard kick return for a TD, a week later had a 70-yard return against UCF and a week after that returned a kick 81 yards against Arkansas.

Defense Forces Turnovers Against Rice . . .

√ The Tulsa defensive unit forced four Rice turnovers in a 63-28 victory -- 3 fumbles recoveries and one interception . . . two of those take-aways ended up in 14 points for the Hurricane against Rice . . . the Hurricane ranks 20th nationally with 13 turnovers gained, and also ranks sixth nationally in turnover margin . . . junior Un'Tavious Scott had two fumble recoveries, while red-shirt freshman Curnelius Arnick had the third recovery . . . junior Kenny D. Sims had the lone interception.

Marion in 10th Place on Career Receiving Chart . . .

√ With 2,131 receiving yards on 72 receptions in 23 career games, senior Brennan Marion has moved into 10th place on the school's all-time receiving list . . . he needs 23 yards to tie Harry Woods' (1966-68) total of 2,154 yards for ninth place . . . he has the fewest receptions of any player on the career top-10 list for receiving yards . . . among the top-10 career receivers for Tulsa, Steve Largent (1973-75) has the least amount of receptions with 136 catches while reaching 2,385 career yards.

Touchdown Trae . . .

√ Sophomore receiver Trae Johnson had a team-high 13 touchdown receptions last year, but came into the SMU game with only one TD reception this season . . . none may have been any bigger than the 33-yard TD pass he caught in the corner of the end zone against SMU to tie the game at 31-31 with 9:53 left in the contest . . . he also had TD catches this year against North Texas and Arkansas . . . Johnson now has career totals of 86 catches for 1,503 yards, a 17.5 average per catch and 16 touchdowns.

He's a Slick Receiver Too . . .

√ Junior Slick Shelley, a transfer from the University of Tennessee, has been a key component of the nation's leading offense . . . in eight games, Shelley has caught 25 passes for 457 yards and six touchdowns . . . he has caught a TD pass in four of Tulsa's last six games, and has gone over 100 yards receiving in two contests this year . . . he had six receptions for 129 yards and two touchdowns against New Mexico, and hauled in six passes for 105 yards and two TDs against SMU . . . his TD receptions have gone for 13, 64, 14, 15, 40 and 31 yards.

"THE ROCK"

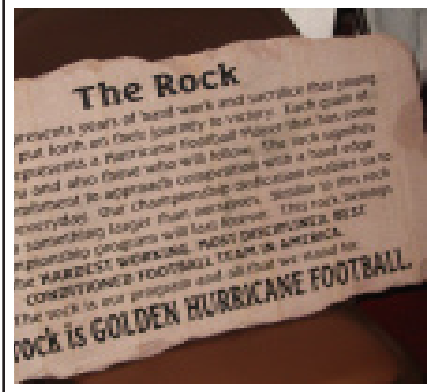
The Golden Hurricane unveiled a new tradition in 2007 as the "ROCK" took center stage at the team's practice the day prior to the season opener. Tulsa began practice as the entire travel team gathered in the end zone, and stretched out from sideline-to-sideline, hand-in-hand and began the walk.

Steve Craver, a senior safety and the player in charge of the "ROCK" for that road trip, was flanked by honorary coach Steve August, a 1976 All-American as an offensive lineman at Tulsa. The team walked the entire field with Craver carrying the 60-pound, 1.5x2-foot "ROCK". At the end of the walk, Craver, then August, talked to the team.

The "Rock" is inscripted with the following words: "The rock represents years of hard work and sacrifice that young men have put forth n their journey to victory. Each grain of this rock represents a Hurricane Football Player that has come before you and also those who will follow. The rock signifies our commitment to approach competition with a hard edge mentality every day. Our championship dedication enables us to belong to something larger than ourselves. Similar to this rock our championship program will last forever. This rock belongs to the HARDEST WORKING, MOST DISCIPLINED, BEST CONDITIONED FOOTBALL TEAM IN AMERICA. The rock is our program and all that we stand for. The rock is GOLDEN HURRICANE FOOTBALL."

The "Rock" travels with the Hurricane and accompany the team at meetings, meals and to the stadium.

The "Rock" was a tradition that Tulsa Head Coach Todd Graham originated at Allen High School as that school's head coach in the 1990s.



Tulsa Has Scored in 35 of 36 Quarters . . .

√ Tulsa has scored in 35 of 36 quarters this season, including the first 35 quarters of the season . . . Tulsa's streak was snapped when the Hurricane failed to score in the fourth quarter at Arkansas . . . Tulsa has scored at least one touchdown in 33 of those 35 quarters . . . dating back to last year, Tulsa scored in 40 consecutive quarters . . . the last scoreless quarter was the third quarter of the Conference USA Championship Game last year at UCF.

Tulsa Rushers Have Big Per Carry Averages . . .

√ Seven of Tulsa's top-eight ballcarriers this year have each gained over 100 yards per game, but more importantly their yards per carry average are each over 5.5 yards . . . Tarrion Adams is the leading rusher with 688 yards and has a 5.5 average . . . the yard per carry averages from top to bottom include — Jacob Bower (8.6), A.J. Whitmore (8.1), Charles Opeseyitan (7.9), Damaris Johnson (7.2), Charles Clay (7.1), Jamad Williams (6.9) and Adams (5.5).

Freshman Comes Up Big . . .

√ True freshman safety DeAundre Brown has made an impact in the Hurricane defensive secondary this year . . . he is sixth on the team in tackles with 38 stops and has two interceptions . . . the biggest play of his young collegiate career may have come against SMU . . . after Tulsa tied the score at 31 in the fourth quarter, Brown intercepted an SMU pass on the next play giving the Hurricane the ball at the SMU 26-yard line, which led to Tulsa's go-ahead touchdown, 37-31.

Tulsa Goes for 40, 50, 60 and 70 . . .

√ Tulsa scored over 40 points in seven of its nine games this year, including three games over 50 points, two over 60 and one over 70 points . . . the two games in which Tulsa did not score 40 or more points came at SMU, when Tulsa tallied 37 points, and at Arkansas with a season-low 23 points . . . Tulsa has now scored 40+ points in 12 of the last 15 games dating back to last season, and has had over 50 points in seven of those games and 60+ points in four of those contests . . . over the last 15 contests, Tulsa has averaged 50.5 points (758) per game.

Marion Gets 100 Yards in Four Games; Goes Over 200 in One Game This Year . . .

√ Brennan Marion, the 2007 Conference USA Newcomer of the Year, broke a 30-year NCAA record last year when he averaged 31.9 yards per catch on 39 receptions for 1,244 yards . . . he has picked up where he left off last year, catching 33 passes for a team-leading 887 yards and a 26.9 average per catch . . . in the first two games when he went over 100 yards in each contest, he totaled eight receptions for 232 yards and a 29.0 average per reception . . . he had four receptions for 125 yards against UAB in the season opener, and 107 yards and one TD on four catches at North Texas . . . he had his third 100+ game of the year with six catches for 136 yards against Central Arkansas . . . Marion had his second career 200+ receiving game with 233 yards and three TDs on six receptions vs. UTEP this year . . . in that game, his 38.8 yard average per catch set a new Conference USA single-game record, surpassing Brandon Middleton of Houston's previous record of 38.7 fgrom 2003 against TCU . . . in the season opener, two of Marion's receptions covered 58 and 56 yards and he also had a 50-yarder against North Texas . . . in 23 career games, Marion has now caught 72 passes for 2,131 yards, a 29.6 yard average per catch and 92.7 yards per game.

Oklahoma QBs 1-2-3 in Passing Efficiency . . .

√ The quarterbacks from the three Oklahoma Bowl Subdivision schools are ranked 1-2-3 in the nation in passing efficiency . . . Tulsa's David Johnson is first at 198.2, Oklahoma's Sam Bradford is second at 188.9 and OSU's Zac Robinson is third at 181.0.

Tulsa's Holloway is a Nominee for 2008 FedEx Orange Bowl Courage Award . . .

√ Tulsa red-shirt freshman offensive tackle Wilson Holloway was selected for the week of Sept. 29 as the nominee for the 2008 FedEx Orange Bowl/FWAA Courage Award, to be announced at the end of the season . . . Holloway, from Oklahoma City, was diagnosed with cancer last spring, underwent chemotherapy treatment throughout the spring and summer . . . Holloway played on special teams and in a reserve role for the Golden Hurricane in six games this year . . . tests in March revealed a softball-sized tumor, which was diagnosed as Hodgkin's Lymphoma . . . Holloway had difficulty breathing because the tumor was pressing against his lungs . . . Holloway began undergoing biweekly chemo treatments March 21 . . . he restarted chemotherapy treatments in September.

No Sophomore Slump for This Guy . . .

√ Sophomore H-back/fullback Charles Clay put up big numbers last year as a true freshman with 1,024 receiving yards and 304 rushing yards and a total of eight TDs . . . in the season opener, Clay not only put up big numbers on offense, but tried his hand on the defensive side of the ball as well . . . he caught three passes for 87 yards and two TDs, and rushed for 45 yards on five carries for a 9.0 yard average per attempt . . . in some situational duty on defense, Clay had a sack for -2 yards . . . on the year, Clay has caught 24 passes for 367 yards and 7 TDs, while rushing for 127 yards, a 7.1 average and two touchdowns . . . he had his first 100+ receiving game of the year and the fourth of his career with 117 yards and one TD on seven receptions against Arkansas.

Tulsa's Success Over a Six-Year Period . . .

√ Although Todd Graham was in his first season as Tulsa's head coach in the 2007 season, he came to the Hurricane in 2003 and spent three seasons as Tulsa's defensive coordinator before serving as the head coach at Rice in 2006 . . . Graham helped lay the groundwork for the recent success that the program has seen . . . in addition to appearing in four bowl games, Tulsa has 47 victories in the past six seasons (including 2008), posting a 47-27 (.635) record . . . in an 11-year stretch before that, Tulsa won just 34 games from 1992 through the 2002 campaign, compiling a 34-88 mark for a .279 winning percentage.

Hurricane Surpasses 600 Yards Five Times This Season . . .

√ Tulsa has surpassed the 600-yard mark for total offense in five games this year, while going over 500 yards in eight contests . . . the only game Tulsa didn't surpass the 500+ yard mark was 436 yards against UCF . . . Tulsa put up 601 yards in a 45-22 season-opening win over UAB . . . had 606 yards vs. New Mexico . . . tallied 641 yards against Central Arkansas, and had 602 yards against SMU . . . the Hurricane surpassed the 700-yard plateau for just the second time in school history with 791 yards against UTEP . . . those totals marked the fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth and ninth times in the last two years that Tulsa's offense has surpassed 600 yards . . . last year, Tulsa had 695 vs. UAB, 648 vs. UTEP, 600 vs. Tulane and 622 vs. Army . . . Tulsa has 17 games of over 500 yards in the last 23 contests dating back to the 2007 season opener.

TD Tennial . . .

√ Senior running back Courtney Tennial had his fourth career multiple rushing touchdown game with three TDs against Central Arkansas . . . what makes it so unique is that he had three one-yard TD runs on his only three carries of the game . . . Tennial sat out the 2007 campaign with an Achilles tendon injury, but was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA . . . in 2006, Tennial was Tulsa's leading rusher with 845 yards and 14 touchdowns, while also catching 15 passes for 181 yards and two TDs . . . his 16 touchdowns ranked second on the school's single-season list for touchdowns . . . in his first game back, Tennial had two carries and scored one TD against UAB . . . on the year, he has 29 carries for 124 yards, but leads the team with seven rushing touchdowns . . . Tennial has 20 career rushing touchdowns.

√ The Hurricane had three players named to the C-USA preseason all-conference team this year . . . Tulsa running back Tarrion Adams, receiver Brennan Marion and defensive end Moton Hopkins, all seniors, were selected to the Coaches all-C-USA squad . . . Adams rushed for 1,225 yards, eight touchdowns and a 5.6 per carry average, while catching 30 passes for 301 yards and three TDs. He also passed for two touchdowns on the season . . . in Tulsa's 63-7 GMAC Bowl over Bowling Green, Adams rushed, passed and caught one touchdown . . . Marion, the Conference USA Newcomer of the Year, broke a 30-year NCAA record when he averaged 31.9 yards per catch with 1,244 yards and 11 touchdowns on 39 receptions a year ago . . . Hopkins was a second-team all-C-USA selection last year and was credited with 71 tackles and 10 stops for lost yardage as he started all 14 games.

QB Johnson Named Draddy Trophy Semifinalist . . .

√ Tulsa senior quarterback David Johnson was selected as one of 164 semifinalists for the Draddy Trophy as announced by the National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame (NFF) . . . it's the third time in the last four years that Tulsa has had a Draddy Trophy semifinalist. In 2005, tight end Garrett Mills, and last year, quarterback Paul Smith, were semifinalists for the award and advanced to the finalist stage as well as being named NFF National Scholar Athletes . . . Johnson has maintained a 3.92 grade point average in exercise sports science . . . the Draddy Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best in the country for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary community leadership . . . semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2, have outstanding football ability and demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

Adams Named to Doak Walker Award List . . .

√ Senior running back Tarrion Adams was named as a preseason candidate for the 2008 Doak Walker Award, given to the nation's top running back . . . Adams is one of five C-USA players named to the list . . . the Guaranty Bank SMU Athletic Forum Board of Directors will select the semifinalists on Nov. 10, and the Doak Walker Award National Selection Committee will cast votes to determine the finalists, who will be announced on Nov. 24 . . . a second vote will be cast beginning on Dec. 1 to determine the recipient.

Tracy on Top-10 Lists for Scoring and Field Goals . . .

√ Tulsa senior kicker Jarod Tracy has made 24-of-32 field goals and 177-of-184 PATs while totaling 249 points in 41 career games . . . he ranks sixth on the school's career scoring list and seventh on the all-time field goals chart . . . Tracy was one of 30 players named to the watch list for the Lou Groza Award this year, and was one of four C-USA kickers named to the list . . . he played in all 14 games last season and converted 7-of-12 field goals, while connecting on 73-of-76 PATs . . . his 73 PATs established a new single-season school record . . .

Tulsa Turned in Sixth 10-Win Season in 2007 . . .

√ Tulsa ended the 2007 campaign with a 10-4 record and its fourth Bowl Game appearance in the last five years . . . the 10 wins marked the sixth time in the 108-year history of Tulsa football that the Hurricane has won 10 games . . . the 1916 (10-0), 1920 (10-0-1), 1942 (10-1), 1982 (10-1) and 1991 (10-2) are the only other 10-win seasons.

Tulsa Sets School, C-USA, NCAA Records in 2007 . . .

√ The 2007 campaign was a record-setting one for the Golden Hurricane team and individuals . . . Tulsa established 29 school records, 15 Conference USA records and four NCAA marks . . . the Hurricane set nine C-USA team records and six C-USA individual records, while establishing 12 school team records and 17 individual records . . . the four NCAA marks were individual records — 31.9 average per catch by Brennan Marion; first school with a 5,000-yard passer (Paul Smith), three 1,000-yard receivers (Brennan Marion, Trae Johnson and Charles Clay) and one 1,000-yard rusher (Tarrion Adams); most yards compiled by a passer and rusher with 6,290 yards between Paul Smith and Tarrion Adams; and the record for single-season 300-yard straight passing games with 14 by Paul Smith.

TU Plays For Two Titles in First Three Years of C-USA . . .

√ Tulsa entered Conference USA as a member in all sports on July 1, 2005 . . . a little over five months later the Golden Hurricane captured the school's first C-USA title in any sport . . . Tulsa completed its first season by winning the C-USA West Division with a 6-2 league record and posted a win over UCF in the C-USA Championship Game . . . last year, Tulsa had another 6-2 record to win the West Division and went on to face UCF in the title game once more. This time the Knights captured the championship game victory . . . Tulsa's has won 34 conference titles in school history. Tulsa's C-USA crown in 2005 was the first since 1985 when the Hurricane won the Missouri Valley Conference Championship.

Tulsa is Nation's Returning Total Offense Leader . . .

√ Tulsa ended the 2007 campaign as the nation's top-ranked offense with a 543.9 total offense average per game . . . Tulsa was ahead of Texas Tech's 529.6 and Hawaii's 512.0 totals . . . Tulsa averaged 371.0 yards passing to rank third nationally and was 41st in the nation for rushing with a 172.9 yard average . . . Tulsa's offense also ranked fourth in pass efficiency (158.8) and sixth in scoring (41.1) in 2007.

Tulsa Goes to Third Straight Bowl Game; 15th Overall . . .

√ With its appearance in the GMAC Bowl last year, a 63-7 victory over Bowling Green, Tulsa played in its third straight Bowl game, fourth in the last five years and 15th in school history . . . Tulsa played in the 2006 Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl and the 2005 AutoZone Liberty Bowl . . . only one other time in school history has Tulsa played in three straight Bowl games, coming between 1941-45 when Tulsa played in five straight Bowl games . . . Tulsa's five-year stretch of playing in four Bowl games is the second longest streak in school history as the Sun, two Sugar's, Orange and Oil Bowls (1941-45) is the best Bowl streak.

Tulsa 2007 Trio Surpass 1,000 Receiving Yards for Only Third Time in NCAA History . . .

√ Brennan Marion, Trae Johnson and Charles Clay were the first trio of receivers in school history to go over 1,000 receiving yards in the same season (there had also never been two receivers go over 1,000 yards in the same season) . . . all three are back on the Tulsa roster this year . . . Marion surpassed 1,000 yards on just his 29th reception of the season, coming in the Rice game . . . Johnson went over 1,000 yards in the C-USA Championship Game and Clay went over 1,000 ayrds in the GMAC Bowl game . . . the trio became just the 11th, 12th and 13th players in school history to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a single season . . . it is just the third time in NCAA history for one team to have three 1,000-yard receivers in the same season . . . Texas Tech's 2003 trio of Carlos Francis, Wes Walker and Nehemiah Glover each hit the 1,000-yard mark, while also in 2007, Hawaii's trio of Ryan Grice-Mullen, Davone Bess and Jason Rivers reached 1,000 receiving yards apiece . . . Marion is fourth on the school's single-season receiving chart, while Johnson is in 10th place and Clay in 11th place.

Sophomores Clay & Johnson Back After Turning in Freshman All-America Seasons . . .

√ A year ago, Charles Clay was named to the Rivals.com Freshman All-America second-team as an all-purpose player, while fellow true freshman Trae Johnson was named to the CollegeSportsReport.com True Freshman All-America team and CollegeFootballNews.com second team . . . Clay, a fullback/H-back, caught 69 passes for 1,024 yards and seven touchdowns, while also rushing for 304 yards and a 5.3-yard average on 57 carries . . . he had three games with over 100 yards receiving and one game with 100+ rushing yards . . . Johnson, who is Tulsa's all-time freshman receiving leader, completed his rookie season with a team-high 70 receptions for 1,088 yards and a team-high 13 touchdowns.

Tulsa's Offense Led C-USA in 2007 . . .

√ Tulsa's offense led Conference USA in four major statistical categories . . . Tulsa ranked first in pass offense with 371.0 yards per game, followed by Memphis' 305.8 yards . . . the Hurricane was also first in total offense at 543.9 yards, followed by Houston at 501.9 yards . . . Tulsa was first in pass efficiency at 158.86, followed by Houston's 147.3 rating . . . Tulsa was first in scoring with 41.1 points, followed by UCF's 35.9 points . . . the Hurricane was sixth in rushing offense with 172.9 yards.

The Coaching Tree . . .

√ Tulsa Head Coach Todd Graham has coached with five of Tulsa's nine assistant coaches before . . . defensive coordinator Keith Patterson and Graham were college teammates and roommates at East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma . . . Patterson then coached three years under Graham at Allen High School, and was also at Tulsa three years with Graham . . . Graham and co-offensive coordinator/line coach Herb Hand were on the staff together at West Virginia for one year . . . when Graham was the co-defensive coordinator at West Virginia in 2002, Paul Randolph was coaching the defensive line . . . tight ends coach Dean Jackson coached under Graham for two years (1998-2000) at Allen High School and in 2006 at Rice . . . Graham's son, Bo, was a student coach at Tulsa from 2003-05, and was on the football strength staff at Rice in 2006.

√ Gus Malzahn’s video titled “The Hurry-Up, No-Huddle:”, that he created in 1997 while the head coach at Arkansas’ Shiloh Christian High School, is what started a friendship between he and Todd Graham . . . Graham was enamored with the “spread no-huddle offense” and after hearing about the video, purchased it and called Malzahn, and since then the two have stayed in touch and became friends . . . Malzahn authored a book on the offense in 2004, titled “The Hurry-Up, No-Huddle: An Offensive Philosophy”.

Fifty Years Experience as Head Coaches . . .

√ Tulsa’s coaching staff consists of five coaches who have served as high school head coaches for a combined 50 years . . . Head Coach Todd Graham was a head coach for seven seasons on the prep level including six years in Texas and one in Oklahoma . . . special teams coordinator Bill Blankenship has the most years as a high school head coach with 22, followed by co-offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn’s 14 . . . defensive coordinator Keith Patterson was a prep head coach in Oklahoma for four years, while Dean Jackson was a head coach for three seasons in Texas.

The Famous Relatives . . .

√ A few Tulsa players claim famous sports personalities as relatives . . . the closest relative is the father of linebacker Mike Bryan, as Rick Bryan was an All-American defensive end at Oklahoma and went on to a solid NFL career with the Atlanta Falcons . . . cornerback Nick Henderson’s second cousin is former Olympic Gold Medalist and three-time 100-meter World Champion Maurice Greene . . . defensive end George Clinkscale is second cousin to former Dallas Cowboys linebacker Dexter Clinkscale.

Tulsa Among Phil Steele’s Top Units . . .

√ Phil Steele’s National Football Preseason Publication picked the top position units in college football . . . Steele ranked Tulsa’s receiving corps as the fourth-best unit behind Florida, Texas Tech and Missouri . . . the magazine also picked Tulsa with the eighth-best set of running backs behind Ohio State, Georgia, Pittsburgh, Clemson, USC, Wisconsin and Boise State.

√ Skelly Stadium received a new name in April 2007, changing to Skelly Field at H.A. Chapman Trust are Donne Pitman and Jerry Dickman . . . following the 2007 football season, a complete renovation of H.A. Chapman Stadium began . . . the stadium renovation includes new seating throughout the stadium, restrooms, concession areas, new press box with luxury suites and club level seating, and a new scoreboard on the south side of the stadium, among other amenities . . . new FieldTurf was installed in April 2008.

Fulton joined The University of Tulsa Board of Trustees in 1993 and served as Chairman from 1997 to 2008. He quickly rallied others around the vision of TU as a nationally competitive university with a dynamic residential campus, solid finances, and selective admissions. That focus has produced remarkable results; during Fulton’s term, TU

- Doubled its endowment;
- Doubled its physical assets;
- Doubled research funding from outside sources;
- More than doubled undergraduate applications ;
- Built 1.2 million square feet of facilities, including improvements for every sports program;
- Raised on-campus residency to an all-time high of 70%;
- Increased annual scholarships by \$12 million;
- Won 27 conference titles
- And broke into the Top 100 of the influential U.S. News & World Report rankings.

Fulton was a hands-on leader, guiding the development of campus facilities (including Collins Hall and the Fulton and Susie Collins Fitness Center) and working with TU’s business faculty to re-engineer the MBA program to better address the evolving needs of Tulsa employers. Honoring his leadership, TU named its business college the Collins College of Business. President Steadman Upham announced the decision during the Spring 2008 Commencement ceremony, when Fulton received an honorary doctorate – the first degree to be awarded from the Collins College of Business.

His previous long was 50 yards . . . for the 15th straight game going back to last year, Tulsa has had a 300-yard passer. David Johnson completed 20-of-24 passes for 332 yards and three TDs . . . also dating back to last year, Tulsa has gone over 500 yards in total offense in 11 times in the last 15 contests and has surpassed 600 yards for the fifth time . . . Jarod Tracy moved into 10th place on the school's all-time scoring list with six points to reach 184 points . . . Tarrion Adams moved just five yards shy of tying Gordon Brown (1984-85) for seventh place on the school's all-time rushing chart.

Vs. NORTH TEXAS . . . Moton Hopkins started his 25th consecutive game at defensive end and offensive guard Justin Morsey started his 26th straight contest . . . David Johnson's 6 touchdown passes is the most for a Hurricane quarterback since Gus Frerotte threw for 6 TDs against East Carolina on Nov. 6, 1993 . . . Tulsa scored on its first possession for the second consecutive week. It was also the second straight week that the Hurricane scored on its first two offensive possessions . . . on his first carry of the game, senior running back Tarrion Adams gained five yards and moved into a tie for seventh-place on the school's all-time rushing list . . . Jake Collums caught his first pass of the game for a 5-yard TD, giving him two catches on the season, both for TDs. It was also his eight reception of his career with five of those going for touchdowns. In the last two seasons, he now has five receptions for four TDs . . . Tulsa's 32-point halftime margin was the most since the final game of the 2007 season against Bowling Green in the GMAC Bowl (35 points) . . . David Johnson accounted for five first half touchdowns (4 passing and 1 rushing) for the most in a first half since Paul Smith accounted for five TDs (4 passing and 1 rushing) against Houston last year (Nov. 10, 2007) . . . in the first six quarters this year, first-year starting quarterback David Johnson has thrown for seven touchdowns while completing 34-of-42 passes for 545 yards and for 81-completion percentage. He totaled three TD passes last week vs. UAB and four in the first half against North Texas . . . in his first two games this year, David Johnson has completed 45-of-57 passes for 750 yards, 9 TDs and a .789 completion percentage . . . Tulsa surpassed 500 yards of total offense for the second straight game. It was the 12th time in the last 16 games that the Hurricane had over 500 yards in total offense . . . Johnson's six TD passes marks the fifth time in the last two years that the Tulsa quarterback has thrown for at least five TDs in a game . . . dating back to last year, Tulsa has scored over 45 points in seven of the last eight games . . . Tulsa has now thrown for more than 300 yards in its last 16 games dating back to last year's season opener, and for over 400 yards in six of the last 16 games . . . for the second straight week, Brennan Marion surpassed the 100-yard receiving plateau and for the eighth time in 16 career games.

Vs. NEW MEXICO . . . Moton Hopkins started his 26th consecutive game at defensive end and offensive guard Justin Morsey started his 27th straight contest . . . Charles Davis' blocked punt was Tulsa's first blocked punt of the season and the first of Davis' career . . . on the second offensive drive of the game, junior Slick Shelley scored his first career touchdown on a 13-yard pass from David Johnson . . . Damaris Johnson eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark in the first quarter with four receptions including two for touchdowns . . . in the second quarter, David Johnson threw his first interception of the season after 74 attempts. It was only his second career interception in 137 attempts . . . Tulsa's 35 first half points marks the fourth time in the last eight games when Tulsa has scored 35 points or more in the first half . . . Tulsa's first half shutout is the first since leading Bowling Green 35-0 in the GMAC Bowl (January 6, 2008) . . . David Johnson's 469 yards marks the 17th consecutive game in which a Tulsa quarterback has thrown for at least 300 yards, and it's the 11th time that a Tulsa QB has surpassed 400 yards and that performance ranks fifth on the single game chart . . . David Johnson's 469 passing yards mark the third time in Tulsa history in which a quarterback has thrown for at least 400 yards in back-to-back games joining Paul Smith (Rice and UCF in 2007) and Billy Guy Anderson (Cincinnati and Southern Illinois in 1965) . . . Tulsa's 56 points marks the eighth time scoring at least 40 points in the last nine games . . . Tulsa's 42-point margin of victory is the most in a home opener since 2001 when Tulsa defeated Indiana State 51-0 . . . in the third quarter, Tarrion Adams surpassed Ken Lacy for sixth place on Tulsa's career rushing chart. He now has 2,294 career rushing yards . . . Slick Shelley's 129 receiving yards marks the most by a Tulsa receiver this season and most for a Tulsa receiver since Trae Johnson's 158 yards against SMU (October 27, 2007) . . . Damaris Johnson's three touchdown receptions marks the first time a freshman has accomplished that feat since Charles Clay did so against BYU (September 15, 2007) . . . Roy Roberts' interception for a touchdown was Tulsa's first since Roberts accomplished the feat against BYU last season (September 15, 2007) . . . with his eighth PAT of the game, senior placekicker Jarod Tracy tied Michael Gunter and Steve Largent for seventh place on Tulsa's career scoring chart with 192 points . . . Mike Bryan collected a career-high and team-leading 13 tackles. His previous career high was seven tackles against UAB earlier this season (August 30, 2008) . . . with the win, Tulsa starts a season 3-0 for the first time since 1978 when the team started 4-0 and finished 9-2 . . . with the win, Tulsa collects its third consecutive home opening victory . . . Tulsa's 606 yards of total offense marks the sixth time the team has surpassed 600 yards and the 13th time the team has surpassed 500 yards in 17 games under Head Coach Todd Graham. It also marks the fourth consecutive game Tulsa has had at least 500 yards total offense and seventh game in the past eight games with at least 500 yards total offense . . . Slick Shelley (129 yards) and Damaris Johnson (109 yards) are the first two Tulsa receivers to tally over 100 yards receiving in the same game since Trae Johnson (119 yards) and Brennan Marion (110 yards) accomplished the feat against Army last season (November 17, 2007) . . . David Johnson has thrown for 15 TD passes in the first three games of the season compared to Tulsa's single-season record-holder Paul Smith's 10 touchdown passes at the same time last season.

Vs. CENTRAL ARKANSAS . . . Moton Hopkins started his 27th consecutive game at defensive end and offensive guard Justin Morsey started his 28th straight contest . . . on his first reception for a 24-yard touchdown, senior running back Tarrion Adams became the first player in school history to have 1,000 career yards receiving and 2,000 career yards rushing . . . on the game's opening drive David Johnson hit Brennan Marion for a 51-yard touchdown, marking Marion's second touchdown reception of the season, with both being for 50 or more yards . . . it is the fourth straight game that Tulsa has scored on its first two offensive possessions, and the second straight contest they have scored on their first four offensive series . . . when Central Arkansas scored on its opening possession it marked the first time an opponent has scored on its opening drive since Tulsa's season opener against UAB . . . Central Arkansas is the first team this season to score on its first four offensive possessions against Tulsa . . . Slick Shelley's 14-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter marks the second straight game he has scored a touchdown . . . David Johnson moved into eighth place on the all-time single-season touchdown passes chart with 19 touchdowns this season . . . Tarrion Adams had his first 100-yard rushing game this year, and the ninth time in his career . . . Courtney Tennial's three rushing touchdowns runs is the fourth time in 16 career games that he has rushed for two or more touchdowns . . . for the third time this season Brennan Marion has recorded 100 or more receiving yards, and with his touchdown reception in the third quarter, he now has four career games with two or more touchdown receptions . . . George Clinkscale and Charles Davis recorded seven tackles apiece, which is more than their season totals coming into the game . . . Nathan Brown's 60-yard touchdown pass to Willie Landers in the third quarter was the longest offensive play given up by the Tulsa defense this season . . . Central Arkansas 342 passing yards, and three passing touchdowns are the most passing yards and touchdowns thrown for an opponent this year . . . it is the fourth-straight game and ninth out of the last 10 games that Tulsa has scored 40 or more points. It is also the third-straight game that Tulsa has scored 50 or more points in a single game, and the first time since 1920 . . . Tulsa set a season-high with 329 yards rushing. It is the second time this season Tulsa has rushed for 200 or more yards and the most rushing yards since gaining 362 yards against UAB also in the fourth game last year . . . Damaris Johnson's 159 return yards is the highest single-game performance this season . . . with the win, Tulsa is 4-0 for the first time since the 1978 season . . . with 14 points scored, Jarod Tracy now has 206 career points which places him alone in seventh place on TU's all-time chart . . . with 286 yards passing, David Johnson snapped a 17-game streak where a Tulsa quarterback had at least 300 yards, but the team still kept up the streak as it is now 18 straight games that Tulsa has passed for 300 yards . . . Jarod Tracy (14 points) and Courtney Tennial (18 points) combined for 32 of Tulsa's 62 points . . . Tulsa's 62 points marks the second time in two seasons that the team has scored 60 points or more in one game and just the fourth time the team has scored 60 points or more in one game since 1975. . . the other games were Bowling Green in the 2008 GMAC Bowl (63 points) and Drake (70 points) and Indiana State (62 points), back-to-back during the 1975 season.

Vs. RICE . . . Tulsa's honorary captain for the game was TU Athletic Hall of Famer Al Humphrey (1971-74), and the honorary coach was F.A. Dry (1972-76) . . . Moton Hopkins started his 28th consecutive game at defensive end and offensive guard Justin Morsey started his 29th straight contest . . . when Tulsa did not score on its first drive, it broke a four-game streak of opening-drive touchdowns . . . with his ninth carry of the game in the second quarter, Tarrion Adams moved past Uril Parrish for 5th place on Tulsa's career rushing chart (2,467 yards). He ended the game with 2,526 yards for his career . . . with his fourth touchdown pass of the game, David Johnson surpassed T.J. Rubley (1989) and James Kilian (2003) for fourth place on Tulsa's season touchdown pass chart (23) . . . it also marks the 4th consecutive game that Johnson has thrown for at least four touchdown passes . . . in the second quarter, Michael Such booted his first punt since the second game of the year (North Texas). It was only his 4th punt of the season for Such and 7th total punt on the season . . . Damaris Johnson moved into sixth-place on Tulsa's single season freshman receiving yards chart (301 yards) . . . Slick Shelley's 25-yard punt return for a touchdown was Tulsa's first since Jermaine Landrum's 41-yard punt return for a TD against Arkansas State on September 20, 2003 . . . this was the third straight game in which Slick Shelley has scored a touchdown. He has scored four during that same span . . . Jarod Tracy moved into second-place on Conference USA's list for most career PATs with 152 . . . Tarrion Adams surpassed the 100-yard mark for the 10th time in his career, and it was his second consecutive 100-yard rushing game . . . Tulsa has scored at least 40 points in all five games this season and 10 out of its last 11 games . . . Tulsa has scored at 50 points in four consecutive games marking the first time Tulsa has achieved that feat since the 1919 season when Tulsa had five consecutive games with at least 50 points . . . with 577 yards this marks the sixth consecutive game in which Tulsa has compiled at least 500 yards and the ninth game in the last 10 in which Tulsa has reached that milestone . . . Tulsa's 63 points are the most scored against Rice in 14 meetings surpassing last season's 48 points . . . Tulsa and Rice's 91 combined points ties for the most points scored in 14 meetings between the two teams — Rice defeated Tulsa 59-32 in 2001 and Tulsa defeated Rice 48-43 in 2007 . . . the last time Tulsa started 5-0 was 1945 when the team started 5-0 before finishing 8-3 with an appearance in the Oil Bowl . . . the last time Tulsa scored 60 or more points in consecutive games was in 1975 when Tulsa beat Drake 70-7 and Indiana State 62-7 . . . for the second consecutive game, Tulsa compiled more rushing yards (386) than passing yards (191) . . . with only 191 total passing yards, Tulsa snaps its 18-game streak with at least 300 yards . . . Un'Tavious Scott's two fumble recoveries is the most for a Tulsa player since Bobby Klinck had two against SMU on Oct. 22, 2005.

Vs. SMU . . . Tulsa game captains were David Johnson and Moton Hopkins . . . the honorary captain for Tulsa is former TU and Dallas Cowboys offensive lineman Tony Liscio (1959-62) . . . Moton Hopkins started his 29th consecutive game at defensive end and offensive guard Justin Morsey started his 30th straight contest . . . with the win, Tulsa moved to 6-0 for the first time since 1942 when the Hurricane posted a 10-0 record before losing its first game . . . Tarrion Adams moved into second place on the school's all-time rushing chart with 2,647 yards, surpassing Eric Richardson's total of 2,645 by two yards . . . Adams went over 100 rushing yards for the third straight game, which is the first time since Uril Parrish had three straight 100 rushing games in 2004 . . . Tulsa went over 300 yards rushing for the third straight game, and the most since 1986 when the Hurricane had three consecutive 300+ rushing games . . . Tulsa failed to score 40 points for the first time this season . . . Tulsa has gone over 500 yards for the sixth time this season, and has surpassed 600 yards for the fourth time this year . . . after scoring on their first possession in the first three games, Tulsa has now failed to score on its first possession in the last two games . . . Tulsa's three first-quarter points was the fewest in the first quarter for the Hurricane since the SMU game last year in Game 8, when Tulsa was held scoreless . . . Tulsa trailed at the end of the first quarter for the first time since the season opener when Tulsa trailed UAB 13-7 at the end of the first period . . . Michael Such punted twice in the first half against SMU, it marked only the second game this year that he punted more one time in an entire game . . . Slick Shelley has scored a touchdown in each of the last four games, scoring in three games by reception and the Rice game on a punt return . . . Tulsa trailed at halftime 17-13. The last time Tulsa trailed at halftime was against UAB in the season opener, 22-21. It's also the second straight year that Tulsa has trailed SMU at halftime, as last year SMU led 13-7.

Vs. UTEP . . . Tulsa game captains were David Johnson, Charles Davis, Kenny D. Sims, Mike Bryan, Justin Morsey, Rod Thomas, Moton Hopkins and Terrel Nemons . . . Tulsa's honorary captains were Paul Smith (2003-07) and Jean Barrett (1969-71) . . . Moton Hopkins started his 30th consecutive game at defensive end and offensive guard Justin Morsey started his 31st straight contest . . . UTEP's touchdown drive to open the game marks the first time since the opener against UAB that Tulsa's opponent has registered the game's first scoring play . . . David Johnson's 97-yard touchdown pass to Brennan Marion is Tulsa's longest since 1996 when Troy DeGar completed a 99-yard touchdown pass to Wes Caswell against Oklahoma. It also marks the third-longest touchdown pass in Tulsa history . . . Damaris Johnson's 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown was Tulsa's first since Roy Roberts returned a kickoff 92 yards against Tulane (Nov. 3, 2007). Johnson's return is tied for 13th longest in Tulsa history (4 for 100, 6 for 98, 2 for 96, 2 others for 94) . . . his game marks the second time in school history that Tulsa has scored two touchdowns from 90-yards or more in the same game. The first time this happened was in 1994 when Solomon White rushed a 93-yard touchdown and Jason Jacoby returned a kickoff for a 100-yard touchdown against UNLV (Oct. 15, 1994) . . . Tulsa's 28 first quarter points is Tulsa's most single quarter points scored since scoring 29 points in the second quarter against SW Missouri State (Sept. 5, 1998) . . . UTEP's 28 first quarter points is the most single quarter points scored by at Tulsa opponent since Texas A&M scored 28 points in the second quarter (Sept. 18, 1999) . . . Tulsa's 49 first half points mark the second time this season the team has scored 40 or more points in the first half. The other time was against North Texas when Tulsa scored 42 first half points (Sept. 6, 2008) . . . with David Johnson's fifth touchdown pass of the game, he surpassed Billy Guy Anderson (1965) for third on Tulsa's season chart (31) and he also surpassed Anderson for eighth on Tulsa's career chart (31) . . . he also surpassed Kevin Kolb of Houston (2006) for third most touchdown passes in a season among Conference USA quarterbacks . . . Tarrion Adams' 114 yards rushing marks his fourth consecutive 100-yard game and 12th career 100-yard game . . . Tulsa's six sacks are the most recorded this season. The previous game high was four against UAB (Aug. 30, 2008) . . . with 434 yards passing, David Johnson tied Paul Smith for second on the all-time 400-yard passing chart (3). Billy Guy Anderson is first on that chart with four career 400-yard passing games . . . Brennan Marion caught six passes for 233 yards. That average of 38.8 yards per catch broke Brandon Middleton of Houston's previous record (38.7 yards per catch vs. TCU in 2003) . . . Marion's 233 receiving yards is the 11th most in Tulsa history and most yards in a game since Dan Bitson hauled in 14 catches for 235 yards against Iowa (Sept. 30, 1989) . . . he now has 1,999 career receiving yards which surpasses Rick Eber's 1,771 yards (1966-67) for 10th on Tulsa's all-time receiving chart . . . this was Marion's second career 200-yard receiving game. His previous 200-yard game was last year with 244 yards against Rice (Nov. 24, 2007). He became only the 4th player in Tulsa history to catch for multiple 200-yard games in his career (Howard Twilley with 6; Dan Bitson with 3; Chris Penn with 3) . . . this was Marion's 10th career game with at least 100 receiving yards. He trails only Dan Bitson (16), Howard Twilley (14) and Chris Penn (12) . . . with 321 yards rushing, this marks the fourth consecutive game that Tulsa has rushed for at least 300 yards . . . ith 77 points, this marks the fifth time this season Tulsa has scored at least 50 points in a game and the third time this season Tulsa has scored at least 60 points in a game . . . Tulsa's 77 points are the most since Tulsa defeated Tampa 77-0 (Oct. 14, 1967) . . . With 791 yards, this marks the eighth consecutive game in which Tulsa has compiled at least 500 yards and the 10th game in the last 11 games in which Tulsa has reached that milestone . . . Tulsa's 791 yards of total offense is the most by any FBS school thus far during the 2008 season, and the most for a Tulsa team since gaining 798 yards against Idaho State in 1967 . . . Tulsa and NEO A&M combined for 151 points in 1920 (151-0). Tulsa and St. Gregory's combined for 121 points in 1920 (121-0) . . . the last time Tulsa started 7-0 was 1942 when the team finished with a 10-1 record and an appearance in the Sugar Bowl . . . with 211 kickoff return yards, Damaris Johnson set a new school record for kickoff return yards in a game, surpassing Ashlan Davis' 199 yards set verse SMU on November 6, 2004.

Vs. UCF . . . Tulsa improved to 8-0 on the season for the first time since going 10-0 in 1942 . . . Tulsa's honorary captains were Howard Twilley (1963-65), Jerry Rhome (1963-64), Steve Largent (1972-75) and Tulsa's honorary coach tonight was John Cooper (1977-84) . . . Moton Hopkins started his 31st consecutive game at defensive end and offensive guard Justin Morsey started his 32nd straight contest . . . with his ninth completion of the game, David Johnson surpassed T.J. Rubley (1988) for ninth on TU's single season passing yards chart with 2,502 career yards . . . UCF kicker Darren Daly's 54-yard field goal in the second quarter is the longest by a TU opponent this season . . . with David Johnson's 10-yard rushing touchdown in the opening drive of the third quarter, he tied J.P. Losman of Tulane (2003) and Dave Ragone of Louisville (2000) for fifth on C-USA's season TD responsibility chart with 33 total TD's . . . with his 11th completion of the game, David Johnson surpassed Josh Blankenship (2000) for seventh-place on TU's single-season passing yards chart with 2,520 career yards . . . with David Johnson's second rushing touchdown of the game, he tied Kevin Kolb of Houston (2006) for fourth on C-USA's season TD responsibility chart with 34 total TDs . . . with David Johnson's touchdown pass to Damaris Johnson in the fourth quarter, he tied Jerry Rhome for second-place on Tulsa's season TD pass chart with 32. He also tied Ronnie Morris (1950-52) and Gus Frerotte (1990-93) for sixth on the school's career TD passing chart with 32 . . . James Lockett's two forced fumbles marks the first time a TU player has forced two fumbles in a game since Nick Bunting achieved the feat against UCF in the C-USA Championship Game on Dec. 3, 2005 . . . Tulsa's nine total sacks are the most this season. The previous high was six sacks last week against UTEP . . . Tulsa's nine total sacks also ties the NCAA season-high (Stanford recorded nine sacks against San Jose State on September 20, 2008) . . . Tulsa only allowed UCF to gain 187 total yards which is the fewest this season for a Hurricane opponent. The previous low this season was 316 vs. New Mexico (September 20, 2008). It also marks the least total yards allowed since TU gave up 152 yards against Tulane (November 3, 2007) . . . Tulsa's 436 total offense yards is the fewest this season and the first time since the C-USA Championship Game versus UCF (December 1, 2007) that TU has not reached the 500-yard mark. TU's previous low this season was 555 yards versus North Texas (September 6, 2008) . . . Tulsa's six rushing touchdowns is the most this season. The previous high was five rushing TD's against UTEP (October 18, 2008).

Vs. ARKANSAS . . . Tulsa suffered its first loss of the season and fell to 8-1 overall . . . quarterback David Johnson moved into third-place on the school's single-season passing chart . . . Moton Hopkins started his 32nd consecutive game at defensive end, and offensive guard Justin Morsey started his 33rd straight contest . . . this was just the third game this season that the opposition has scored first. The other two were also touchdowns by UTEP and UAB . . . Tulsa's first completion of the game was to tight end Jake Collums. It is the first time since the second game of the season against North Texas that a tight end has caught a pass. It was Collums that caught the pass in that game as well . . . when Arkansas took a 17-0 lead in the first quarter, it was the biggest deficit of the season for the Hurricane. The previous largest deficit was 11 points when Tulsa trailed SMU 14-3 in the second quarter in Dallas . . . Tulsa's first score of the game came at the 0:47 mark of the first quarter, which is the longest this year that it took the Hurricane to score. The previous was 3:34 of the first quarter against SMU when Tulsa scored on a Jarod Tracy field goal . . . Damaris Johnson had an 81-yard kickoff return, making it the third straight game that he has returned a kickoff for 70 or more yards. He had a 94-yard TD return vs. UTEP and a 70-yarder last week against UCF . . . Tulsa trailed at halftime for the fourth time this season, including 22-21 at UAB, 17-13 at SMU and 19-14 vs. UCF last week . . . Tulsa has now scored 20+ points in the first half in seven of nine games this year. SMU and UCF are the only games in which Tulsa did not have at least 20 first-half points . . . Damaris Johnson had his third straight game of over 100 yards on kickoff returns, and his fourth of the season. He had 159 yards vs. UCA, 211 yards vs. UTEP and 134 yards vs. UCF . . . Tulsa trailed at the end of three quarters for only the second time this year. The other game was a 31-24 SMU lead on October 11th . . . Charles Clay went over 100-yard receiving for just the first time this season, but the fourth time in his two-year career . . . Tulsa had scored in every quarter this year until the fourth quarter of this game, having its nation-leading streak stopped at 35 consecutive quarters with a score.

√ On Tulsa's first defensive stand at the opening of the newly-renovated Skelly Field at H.A. Chapman Stadium on Sept. 20, 2008 against New Mexico, junior Charles Davis blocked Adam Miller's punt (recovered by red-shirt freshman Charles Opeseyitan). Tulsa scored two plays later on a 23-yard pass from senior David Johnson to freshman Damaris Johnson. On October 4, 1930, Tulsa christened the brand new Skelly Field in similar fashion when Johnny Potts recovered an Arkansas fumble on the opening kickoff. Tulsa's Billy Boehm ran in a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage en route to a 26-6 victory.
