HOUSTON TRAVELS TO NCAA CENTRAL CHAMPIONSHIPS: The University of Houston men's golf team will travel to Stillwater, Okla., and play in the NCAA Central Championships on May 16-19. This marks the fifth straight year that Houston has qualified for the NCAA Central Region Championships. The Cougars won the Central Regional in 1998 and finished fourth last season. Houston also finished fifth in 1997 and 1999.

COUGARS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS: The Cougars enter the tournament ranked 19th nationally in the latest Mastercard Collegiate Golf rankings and *Golf Week* magazine. Individually, Houston has four of the top 96 golfers in Mastercard's Collegiate Golf national rankings. Andy Sanders is ranked 47th, Wade Ormsby is 57, Simon Robinson is 65th and Conference USA individual champion Brad McIntosh is 96th.

In *Golf Week* individual rankings, Sanders is ranked 40th with a 71.22 rating. Ormsby is 105th with 72.27, while McIntosh is 110th with a rating of 72.29. Robinson is 127 with a 72.44 rating.

The Cougars also are ranked third among the top NCAA District VI leaders heading into the Tournament.

FIVE FOR FIVE: Conference USA Championships are becoming second nature for the University of Houston. Since joining C-USA in the 1996-97 academic season, the Cougars have owned the conference crown, winning all five tournaments. Houston shot an 857 as a team on April 23-25 in Navarre, Fla., to win the 2001 title. The Cougars easily out-distanced runner-up, UAB, by 16 strokes.

Houston was a model of consistency at the league championships, firing 290, 292 and 290 to claim the crown. Four Cougars placed in the top 10, including medalist Brad McIntosh, who shot a two-under par, 214. Simon Robinson finished in third place with a 217 and Wade Ormsby tied for sixth with a 219. 2000 All-American Andy Sanders was in a three-way tie for 10th at 222.

DIGGIN' DIRKS: Houston head coach Mike Dirks has continued the storied tradition of Cougar Golf since his arrival in 1994. With Houston's fifth straight Conference USA Championship this season, Dirks has now guided the Cougars to 12 tournament titles in his seventh year at the helm. Last season Dirks directed the Cougars to a fourth-place finish at the NCAA Championships, and has now guided Houston to four top nine finishes during the last four seasons. Houston has finished ninth in 1997, eighth in 1998 and 1999 and fourth in 2000.

Dirks came to UH after four years as the head coach at Tulane. He also coached his alma mater, Lamar, to a seventh-place finish at the 1986 NCAA Championships.

TITLES GALORE: The Conference USA title won by the Cougars last month was the 19th conference championship claimed by the Cougars. The Cougars won five consecutive Missouri Valley Conference Championships (1956-60) before spending the next 13 years as an independent. After joining the Southwest Conference in 1973, the Cougars won or shared seven straight titles. UH rounded out its SWC titles with back-to-back wins in 1984-85 before claiming its five C-USA championships.

LOOKING FOR NUMBER 17: Houston is the nation's most storied golf program with 16 national championships collected between 1956 and 1985. In addition, the Cougars have finished second four times and third four times. Before the 90s, the Cougars had won at least one NCAA title in each of the previous four decades. In 43 trips to the NCAA Championships, Houston has finished 10th or better 35 times. Last season, the Cougars had their best finish since 1985 when they finished in fourth place at the Grand National Lake course in Opelika, Ala. Chris Morris was Houston's top individual performer in Alabama, as he finished second with a four-round total of 273. Andy Sanders tied for seventh with a score of 277.

UH in the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championships

In 1956 the University of Houston began a dynasty that is unparalleled in all of college sports. Beginning that season, Houston dominated the college golf world, winning 12 of the next 15 NCAA golf championships. The Cougars have won 16 titles in all, and incredibly, finished second four times and third four other times. A Cougar has won the individual championship eight times, which only trails Yale (13). The following is a year-by-year look at the NCAA Championships since 1952.
