### STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS

- ▶ The University of Houston women's basketball team closes out a season-long, six-game homestand against crosstown rival Rice Sunday at 2 p.m. CST in Conference USA play on Guy V. Lewis Court at Hofheinz Pavilion.
- ▶ The homestand was UH's longest since playing nine-straight at home from 12/14/96-01/10/97.
- ▶ UH (7-9, 1-1 C-USA) has had seven days off after playing three games in five days last week. UH went 2-1 last week, beating Lamar and Tulane but falling to UTEP.
- ▶ Twiggly McIntyre (13.4 ppg) and Tye Jackson (12.5) lead the way for Houston.
- ▶ McIntyre is the reigning C-USA Player of the Week. She averaged 20.7 ppg last week and was 18-for-18 from the free-throw line. She has made 22-straight free throws.
- ▶ Jackson, who recently became the 18th player in school history to break the 1,000-point plateau, appears on watch lists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS and Naismith Awards.

**TYE'D RICE ...**

- ▶ Tye Jackson has put together some of the best games of her career against the Owls.
- ▶ In five games against Rice, Jackson has averaged 24.2 ppg, 8.0 rpg and 3.8 apg.
- ▶ She scored a career-best 37 points against the Owls on Jan. 15, 2006. She scored 24 in the second game against Rice and 14 in the third and 30 in the Jan. 2 overtime win.
- ▶ Two of her six career 30-point games have come against Rice.

**MCINTYRE NAMED C-USA PLAYER OF THE WEEK ...**

- ▶ Twigg McIntyre was named the C-USA player of the week for the week ending Jan. 8.
- ▶ She averaged a team-best 20.7 points per game and went 18-for-18 from the charity stripe.
- ▶ She ended the week shooting .531 (17-of-32) from the field, and hit 10-of-22 attempted 3-pointers (.455).
- ▶ She also had 13 rebounds, 11 assists and three steals, while playing 36.3 minutes per game.
- ▶ Of her 62 points scored, 56 came in the second half, including all 18 of her free throws.
- ▶ Her 10-for-10 effort from the line against Tulane tied a school record for free-throw pct. when attempting 10-or-more.
- ▶ McIntyre has made 22-straight free throws dating to Dec. 28.
- ▶ McIntyre leads the league with a 2.19 3-pointers made per game average and has hit a C-USA-best 35 treys in 16 games.
- ▶ The senior also ranks sixth in the conference in scoring, averaging 14.1 points per game, as well as third in free throw percentage firing at an 83.9 percent clip.
- ▶ This is her first C-USA Player of the Week honor.

**QUITE A WEEK AT GVLCAHP ...**

- ▶ The Cougars went 2-1 at home last week, including a 74-64 victory over defending C-USA regular season champion Tulane on ESPN2 on Jan. 6.
- ▶ UH also rallied from a 26-point second-half deficit to knock off Lamar, 82-75, in overtime at Hofheinz Pavilion, marking the second largest come-from-behind victory in NCAA Division I women's basketball history.
- ▶ Houston lost to league leader UTEP, 79-61, Jan. 4.

**JACKSON APPEARS IN SLAM MAGAZINE ...**

- ▶ Tye Jackson is featured in the March 2008 issue of SLAM Magazine, available on newsstands nationwide.
- ▶ She is featured in SLAM's 'In Your Face' section on page 25.
- ▶ She ranks second on the team averaging 12.4 ppg and leads the squad with 57 assists, 22 of which came in three games last week.

**RICE CONNECTIONS ...**

- ▶ Rice head coach Greg Williams headed the Cougars' program from 1985-90.
- ▶ During that span, he was 93-51 (.646) and led the Cougars to their first-ever NCAA Tournament spot in 1988.
- ▶ Williams led UH to a 66-60 upset of then No. 3 Louisiana Tech on Dec. 9, 1985. That led to UH's first-ever ranking in the top-25.
- ▶ Current UH assistant DeJuena Chizer played on Williams 1985-86 and 1987-88 squads.

**SCOUTING THE OWLS ...**

- ▶ Rice enters on a four-game losing streak and has dropped eight of 10 games overall.
- ▶ The Owls have been held under 55 points in each of the last four games, including a season-low 28 against Tulane (01/04).
- ▶ Leading scorer (16.7 ppg) and rebounder (8.7 rpg) Valeriya Berzhynska (ankle) has missed two straight games.
- ▶ Kadie Riverin (12.1 ppg) and Maudess Fulton (10.3) pace the offense in her absence.
- ▶ Brittney Hudson has averaged 13.0 ppg in the past two contests.
- ▶ Morgan Mayse made the first consecutive starts of her career last weekend and leads the team in rebounding (8.0 rpg) in C-USA play.
- ▶ Rice has the lowest ranked offense (46.0 ppg) in the league through two C-USA games.

**NOTING THE C-USA GAMES ONLY STATS ...**

- ▶ Through a pair of league games, the Cougars have several players at or near the top of conference -only stats.

**TWIGGY MCINTYRE** is ranked third in scoring (21.5 ppg), tied for first in free-throw percentage (12-12/1.000) and first in three-pointers made (3.50 ppg).

**COURTNEY TAYLOR** is tied for the league lead in field-goal percentage (12-18/.667) and ranks seventh in rebounding (8.5 rpg).

**TYE JACKSON** ranks second in assists (7.5 apg), is tied for 10th in blocks (1.5 bpg) and is listed 11th in assist/turnover ratio (1.67).

**FIRST FIVE MINUTES A STRUGGLE FOR UH ...**

- ▶ UH has struggled badly in the opening five minutes of games, shooting 38-for-115 (.330) with 46 turnovers (2.8 tpg).
- ▶ Houston's top opening minutes this year came against McNeese State (11/25) where it was 6-for-9 with one TO.
- ▶ UH's worst opening five minutes of the year came during a two-game span against Middle Tennessee and at Xavier where UH was 0-for-10 from the field with nine TOs.
- ▶ UH is 2-0 this year when shooting 60 percent or better in the first five minutes of games.

**JACKSON OVER 1,000 CAREER POINTS ...**

- ▶ Tye Jackson became the 18th player in program history to eclipse 1,000 career points against TCU (Dec. 21).
- ▶ Jackson tallied her first bucket of the night 3:36 into the game, sending her over the mark in only her 54th appearance.
- ▶ She has 1,066 points in her three-year UH career.
- ▶ She is the fourth active player in C-USA to achieve the milestone along with Janielle Dodds (SMU), Crystal McFadden (UAB) and Kendra Read (Southern Miss).
- ▶ The last UH player to pass 1,000 career points was Sancho Lyttle (2003-05) who finished her two-year career with 1,092 points.
- ▶ UH's all-time scoring leader is former standout Chandi Jones (2000-04) with 2,692 points.
- ▶ Assistant Coach/SWA DeJuena Chizer (1983-87) tallied 1,102 points during her four-year career with the Cougars.

- ▶ UH's 26-point comeback win over Lamar on Jan. 2 was the second-largest deficit overcome for victory in NCAA Division I Women's Basketball history.
- ▶ UH trailed 48-22 with 19:28 left in the second half and won 82-75 in overtime.
- ▶ The largest was a 32-point comeback for Texas State over

UTSA on Feb. 18, 2006. Texas State trailed 40-8 with 2:18 left in the first half and won 73-71 in overtime.

- ▶ The Cougars trailed 46-22 at the half and did not lead until the 2:29 mark of the second half.
- ▶ UH outscored the Lady Cardinals 48-24 for the final 18:30 of the second half.
- ▶ Twiggy McIntyre scored all 19 of her points after halftime.

**DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE ...**

- ▶ Three UH players, Courtney Taylor, Cobilyn Hill and Tye Jackson, have tallied double-doubles this season.
- ▶ Taylor's three are tied for seventh in C-USA this season.
- ▶ Jackson has 11 career double-doubles.

**INSIDE/OUTSIDE BALANCE ...**

- ▶ The Cougars have developed a quality inside game this season, something that has been lacking in the last few years.
- ▶ Of UH's 1,079 points this season, 456 (42%) have come off of layups or tip-ins.
- ▶ Three-pointers have accounted for 21 percent (231 pts) of the scoring.
- ▶ Houston's guards score 55 percent of its points while the post players grab 58 percent of the rebounds.
- ▶ Four players (McIntyre, Jackson, Taylor, Hill) have accounted for 60 percent (649) of the Cougars points.

- ▶ Jakobsone, a transfer from Trinity Valley CC, became eligible at the end of UH's Fall semester.
- ▶ She played only a minute against TCU as her practice time has been limited due to a thumb injury.
- ▶ She tallied a season-high six points against Duke (12/28).

**BIG TIME COBI ...**

- ▶ Freshman Cobilyn Hill put together a dominant performance in the paint against Akron on Dec. 16.
- ▶ The 6-3 center had her first-career double-double and set career bests with 23 points and 13 rebounds.
- ▶ Eight of her rebounds came on the offensive glass and she also added a blocked shot.
- ▶ During UH's second-half 14-2 run, Hill tallied eight of those 15 points on layups inside.
- ▶ Forty-two of UH's 76 points came in the paint and the Cougars scored 19 second-chance points off 20 offensive rebounds.

**JACKSON NAMED TO NAISMITH WATCH LIST ...**

- ▶ Tye Jackson was among 50 players named to the initial watch list for the 2007-08 Naismith Trophy presented by AT&T, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Dec. 18.
- ▶ Jackson is the lone C-USA player to be named a candidate.
- ▶ The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's players of the year.

**NOTING THE HOMESTAND ...**

- ▶ The Cougars started a season-long six-game homestand with a 73-68 win over TCU on Dec. 21.
- ▶ The homestand is UH's longest since playing nine-straight at Hofhienz Pavilion from 12/14/96-01/10/97.
- ▶ Houston is 3-2 on the homestand so far and four players, Twiggy McIntyre (17.0), Tye Jackson (13.4), Courtney Taylor (10.0), are averaging in double figures in the past five games.
- ▶ Taylor is pulling down 8.0 rebounds per game.
- ▶ Jackson has tallied 35 of her 57 season assists.
- ▶ McIntyre is 23-of-24 from the free-throw line and has made 22-straight attempts.
- ▶ She is also 16-for-36 (.444) from behind the three-point line and 65 of her 85 points (76%) have come in the second half.

**THE LONG ROAD AHEAD ...**

- ▶ After closing out a six-game homestand on Jan.13, UH faces the daunting task of playing eight of its next 11 games on the road, including a string of four-straight away from home.
- ▶ The Cougars have remained in the Houston area for 38-straight days after completing a three-game trip that took them from Lubbock to Miami to Akron, Ohio.
- ▶ UH is 2-4 on the road this year.
- ▶ Houston's last C-USA road win came at UAB on Feb. 26, 2006.

**COOGS SNAP ROAD LOSING SKID...**

- ▶ With its 66-63 win over Texas Tech on Dec. 4, UH snapped a number of ongoing losing streaks.
- ▶ Houston won its first road game since February 2006, snapping a streak of 16-straight road losses.
- ▶ It was the Cougars first win in Lubbock since Feb. 9, 1985. Assistant coach DeJuena Chizer was a member of the UH squad that knocked off Tech in 1985. Several members of the current roster had not been born yet.
- ▶ Texas Tech had won the previous 16 meetings in the series.
- ▶ The last time the Cougars beat a Big 12 team was Dec. 30, 2003, a 46-40 road win over Texas A&M.

**JACKSON NOT SICK BUT NOT WELL ...**

- ▶ Tye Jackson returned to the lineup against Texas Tech (12/04) after missing both the McNeese State (11/25) and LSU (11/29) games due to chronic left knee inflammation.
- ▶ She has had two previous surgeries on that knee and has been fitted with a brace.
- ▶ The knee is being drained of fluid on a weekly basis
- ▶ Since returning she has averaged 14.4 ppg and 6.7 apg.

**CRUNCHTIME TWIGGY ...**

- ▶ Senior Twiggy McIntyre has ended up with the game on her shoulders several times this season, sinking game-winning shots and free throws in the final minutes.
- ▶ Against Lamar (01/02), she knocked down a pair of free throws that gave Houston a two-point lead before overtime.
- ▶ Versus TCU (12/21), McIntyre knocked down a three-pointer with 26 seconds left to give Houston a four-point lead.
- ▶ Against Miami (12/08), McIntyre's pair of free throws with 1:04 left gave UH a 1-point lead and led to a 63-62 win.
- ▶ Against Texas Tech (12/04), McIntyre ended up on the charity stripe with nine seconds left, sinking both attempts to give the Cougars a three-point lead and sealing the victory.
- ▶ McIntyre is 21-for-24 (.875) from the line in the final five minutes of games this season ranking second on the team.
- ▶ As a team, UH shoots at a 74 percent clip (73-99) from the stripe with five minutes or less remaining in games.

**THE CROCKETT ROCKET ...**

- ▶ Courtney Taylor has come on strong in the last week, averaging, 11 ppg and 9.3 rpg.
- ▶ She has three double-doubles this season, leading the team.
- ▶ Taylor leads UH and ranks eighth in C-USA in field-goal percentage, shooting at a 51-percent clip (55-108).
- ▶ The freshman is also tied for eighth in rebounding (7.6 rpg) and ranks third among league freshmen in that category.
- ▶ She moved into the starting lineup at the National City Xavier Invitational and earned a spot on the All-Tournament Team.
- ▶ Taylor averaged 12.0 ppg and 9.3 rpg in three games against Xavier, Liberty and McNeese State.
- ▶ She was joined on the All-Tournament Team by Ne'Aisha Anderson (McNeese State), Moriah Frazee (Liberty) and Ta'Shia Phillips (Xavier). Liberty's Megan Frazee was voted as the Most Valuable Player.

**UH ADDS TWO DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD ...**

- ▶ Roxana Button (Dallas, Texas/Coppell HS) and Deeva Vaughn (Albuquerque, N.M./Highland HS), both rising seniors in high school, have signed National Letters of Intent to join UH in the Fall of 2008.
- ▶ Button, a 5-9 guard, has been selected First-Team All-District 6-5A in each of the past two seasons. She is ranked among the top-30 players at her position in Texas.
- ▶ She averaged 15 points per game, four rebounds per game and six assists per game as a junior. Button has played on the varsity team at Coppell each of the previous three seasons.
- ▶ Vaughn is a 6-0 swing player who is a two-time Associated Press First-Team All-State honoree.
- ▶ She is a two-time First-Team All-Metro selection (2006, 2007) who averaged 24.0 ppg and 14.0 rpg. She is ranked as one of the top prep players in Albuquerque and in the State of New Mexico.

**THE BLOCK PARTY ...**

- ▶ Houston has 67 blocks in 2007-08 with 30 of those belonging to Cobilyn Hill.
- ▶ Last season, UH tallied only 53 blocks in 28 games, the fewest for a UH team since the 1998-99 season (45).
- ▶ UH is on pace for 130 blocks this season, which would be the highest season total since 1984-85.
- ▶ The Cougars ranks fourth in Conference USA with an average of over four blocks per game.
- ▶ Hill is on pace for 60 individual blocks, which would be UH's top total since Darla Simpson tallied 79 blocks in 1990-91.
- ▶ She stuffed a career-best seven shots at Cal State Bakersfield (11/13) and has three or more blocks in four games this year.

- ▶ From 1992 -2000, Hughes served as athletic director and men's basketball coach at Cross Roads High School in his hometown of Malakoff, Texas.
- ▶ Hughes began his coaching career at Sam Houston State University as a graduate assistant from 1990-91.
- ▶ A former standout player at TCU, Hughes was one of the most prolific three-point shooters in school history.
- ▶ In two seasons (1987-89), Hughes averaged .450 (108-240) from behind the arc, a mark that ranks third on the Horned Frogs career lists.
- ▶ His single-season best of .452 (70-155), during the 1988-89 campaign, ranks second on TCU's single-season chart.
- ▶ The two-year starter at shooting guard was a two-time winner of the Jim Killingsworth MVP award.

**HOUSTON** - The University of Houston women's basketball team got the 2007-08 campaign started with a 76-58 win over Texas Southern, Friday on Guy V. Lewis Court at Hofheinz Pavilion.

Houston (1-0) moved its all-time record to 25-8 in season openers and earned its eighth-straight win over TSU (0-1).

The Cougars found themselves in a fight early in the second half as TSU came out and took a 40-39 lead with 15:39 to go, erasing UH's three-point halftime advantage.

The teams traded buckets over the next two minutes and a turnaround jumper by Tye Jackson with 13:36 left started a 7:57, 27-7 run that put the game away for the Cougars.

During that span, Houston held Texas Southern to just three field goals. TSU made only eight field goals in the second half and shot 32.1 percent (18-for-56) for the game.

The Cougars won the game in transition with 16 steals that were converted into 12 fast-break points. It was UH's most steals in a game since Feb. 3, 2006, a 75-62 win over Rice.

Jackson finished with 18, leading all players. The 2007 Conference USA Preseason Player of the Year has scored in double-figures in 24 consecutive games and played in a season opener for the first time in her UH career.

Whitney James finished with 12 points and four rebounds.

Ryan Meyers showed no rust from her long layoff tallying 14 points and seven rebounds. Meyers missed all but the first nine games of the 2006-07 season due to injury.

Also coming off a long layoff, 587 days to be exact, was Twiggy McIntyre. McIntyre, a senior transfer, last played on March 31, 2006 in the WNIT Championship game while with KState. She finished with nine points, six rebounds, five steals and four assists.

Courtney Taylor pulled down a game-high eight rebounds in her Houston debut.

Jamelah Lewis and Camille Parks both found double figures for the Tigers, finishing with 18 and 11 points, respectively.

UH led 33-30 at the break despite shooting 31.3 (10-for-32) in the first half. The Cougars trailed by as many as seven with five minutes to go, but an 8-1 run to close the half gave UH the three-point halftime advantage.

**BAKERSFIELD, Calif.** - Twiggy McIntyre scored a career-high 30 points, but it was not enough as The University of Houston women's basketball team committed 28 turnovers in a 95-83 loss to Cal State Bakersfield, Tuesday at the Icardo Center.

McIntyre was 12-for-20 from the field and 5-for-5 from the line. She also added five assists. She eclipsed her previous career best of 22 points, set against Colorado while she played at Kansas State.

The Cougars (1-1) trailed by as many as 21 in the second half, but cut the deficit to five with 3:08 to go. UH turned it over on two of its next three possessions and CSUB (2-0) ran the lead back to 11 and went on for the 16-point win, the team's 17th straight victory.

Houston climbed back in the game on the strength of a 30-14 run that spanned 9:41. UH could not overcome its 28 turnovers and a 4-for-17 effort (.235) from behind the three-point line.

UH's turnovers were converted into 32 points for the Roadrunners. The Cougars outrebounded CSUB 50-33, including a 21-14 edge on the offensive glass. Houston turned those 21 offensive boards into 14 second-chance points.

Houston used the fast break to its advantage for the second-straight game, scoring 18 points in transition. Through two games, the Cougars have 30 fast-break points, a feat which took them eight games to achieve last season.

Cobilyn Hill set career highs with seven blocks and nine rebounds. The last time a Houston player had seven or more blocks in a game was Jan. 17, 1990 when Darla Simpson finished with eight stuffs against Baylor.

Tye Jackson closed the night with 15 points and five assists, the only other UH player to finish in double digits.

Kelley Tarver finished with a team-high 27 points for CSUB. Krista Arase added 17, Naomi Johnson finished with 15 while Christine Kepenekian finished with 14 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

The Roadrunners led 54-38 at the half after knocking down eight first-half three pointers, with three coming from Tarver. CSUB started 4-for-4 from behind the line and ended the half 8-for-12 (.667) from distance.


The Cougars led by five early, but costly turnovers let CSUB back in the game. Jackson sunk a jumper at the 14:52 mark giving UH a 16-15 advantage, the last lead for the Cougars on the night. The Cougars were outscored 39-22 for the rest of the half.

The Cougars made one field goal in the final 3:30 of the half and trailed by six heading into the locker room.

Morton finished with a career-best 11 points in 19 minutes. McIntyre also finished with 11, the only two Houston players in double figures. Jackson added eight points and eight rebounds, snapping a 24-game streak scoring in double figures.

Brittany Mason played a career-high 26 minutes and responded with nine rebounds and two assists.

**HOUSTON** - The University of Houston women's basketball team had a pair of game-winning shots come up short in the final seconds as the Cougars dropped their third-straight game, a 69-68 decision to Middle Tennessee.

After a turnover by MTSU's Johnna Abney with nine seconds left and no UH time-outs remaining, Tye Jackson brought the ball up the floor and took the ball down the lane and her layup attempt found the back iron with three seconds left.

The rebound ended up in the hands of Twigg McIntyre but her jumper at the buzzer fell short and the Blue Raiders escaped with the one-point win.

Houston (1-3) mounted a late second-half comeback from a 13-point deficit thanks to 19-7 run in the game's final 6:04. The Cougars held Middle Tennessee (2-1) to three field goals in the final eight minutes of the game.

After trailing by five at the break, UH used a 15-4 run in the first 7:07 of the second half to knot things up at 49 apiece with 12:53 left. The Cougars would not score for the next 6:51 and trailed 62-49 with 7:08 to go.

Courtney Taylor split a pair of free throws with 6:04 left to snap the scoreless skid and started Houston's closing run. Taylor added seven of her team- and career-high 18 points in the last six minutes of the game.

Brittney Scott added a pair of big three pointers during the run, including the 21-footer with 37 seconds left that pulled the Cougars within one. She finished with a career-high 14 points.

Jackson finished with 15 and McIntyre added 11 along with five assists. Brittany Mason added a team-high eight rebounds.

The Blue Raiders' Amber Holt led all players with 30 points and 15 rebounds. Anne-Marie Lanning added 11 off the bench.

Houston shot nearly 60 percent in the first half (12-for-21/.571), was a perfect 10-for-10 from the charity stripe and still trailed by seven. MTSU knocked down seven three pointers in the half and used a full-court press to force UH into 16 turnovers. Those giveaways were converted into 18 Blue Raider points.

After leading by 5, 5-0 at the 14:52 mark, MTSU went on a 27-8 run that was paced by four triples and seven UH turnovers. The Blue Raiders held a 14-point cushion, 27-13, with 8:15 left in the half.

A 9-0 UH run pulled the deficit down to five, 27-22, with 5:54 to go, but the Cougars failed to capitalize and found themselves down by 11, 39-28, with 2:02 left.

McIntyre scored six of Houston's final 10 points in the half and the Cougars whittled the margin to seven, 41-34 at the break.

The action was slow to get started with the teams starting a combined 0-for-8 from the field with 10 turnovers. Taylor scored the game's first field goal with 14:52 left in the first half.

Houston (1-5) dropped its fifth-straight game after struggling offensively. The Cougars shot 25.7 percent (19-74), were just 2-19 (.105) from behind the three-point line and were 21-for-32 from the charity stripe.

Liberty (4-1) got double-doubles from Megan and Moriah Frazee and out-rebounded UH 56-47. Megan Frazee had a game-high 19 points and 12 rebounds while Moriah Frazee finished with 16 points and 11 rebounds.

Courtney Taylor finished with a team-high 11 points and nine rebounds. Cobilyn Hill had 10 points, seven rebounds and three blocks.

Tye Jackson saw her streak of 49-straight starts come to an end as the senior had nine points in 28 minutes off the bench. Jackson has been mired in a season-long shooting slump, firing at a 28.4 percent (29-102) clip.

The Flames had UH in a 10-point hole 5:08 into the second half as UH missed nine of its first 10 shots. The Cougars scored only three field goals over the next eight minutes and trailed by 15, 57-42, with 6:17 left in the game.

A three by Molly Frazee with six seconds left in the first half knotted things up at 29 apiece heading into halftime. Frazee's triple was Liberty's only field goal in the final 8:26 of the half.

Houston (2-6) was held to a 33 percent shooting night (18-for-54) including a 3-for-12 (.250) effort from behind the line.

Brittney Scott tallied a team-high 11 points and was the only UH player in double digits.

Scott and Ryan Meyers tied for the team lead with six rebounds while Twiggy McIntyre dished out a game-high six assists.

LSU (5-2) won its first game in Houston on in four tries on the strength of 19 points, seven rebounds and three blocks from Sylvia Fowles. Fowles was 8-for-9 from the field and moved past two players and into sixth place on the Southeastern Conference's all-time rebounds list with 1,275 career boards.

Lady Tigers' head coach Van Chancellor returned to the city where he led the WNBA's Houston Comets for 10 seasons. Chancellor took over Houston's WNBA franchise in 1997 and led the Comets to the first four league championships. He won 211 games, a league record, before taking the LSU job.

UH scored only six points in the first eight-plus minutes of the second half and trailed by 31 with 11:46 remaining. LSU led by as many as 35 before closing it out.

Quianna Chaney and Ashley Thomas scored 11 points apiece for LSU who scored 29 points off 25 UH turnovers.

Tye Jackson missed her second-straight game due to a knee injury. Her status remains day-to-day.

The Cougars were in a 41-19 hole after a turnover-laden first half. UH turned it over 13 times and LSU converted those giveaways into 15 points.

Houston moved out to an 11-10 lead with 12:38 remaining, but failed to score over the next three minutes and was down 17-11 with 9:16 left. The Cougars pulled the lead down to two, 17-15, with 8:06 left but LSU pulled off a 13-2 run to move ahead by 15, 32-17, with 4:10 left.

Hill knocked down a jumper the next time down the floor, the last basket UH would tally in the opening 20 minutes. The Lady Tigers scored seven points in the final 3:30, leading to the 22-point deficit at the break.

**HOUSTON** - The University of Houston women's basketball team snapped a 16-game road losing streak by knocking off previously undefeated Texas Tech 66-63 at the United Spirit Arena.

Houston (3-6) won its first road game since February 2006 and its first game in Lubbock since Feb. 9, 1985. Texas Tech (9-1) had won each of the previous 16 meetings in the series.

The last time the Cougars beat a Big 12 team was Dec. 30, 2003, a 46-40 road win over Texas A&M.

"It's a great road victory for our basketball team," interim head coach Danny Hughes said. "To be able to come in, compete and beat a quality team like Texas Tech on the road speaks highly of the effort our players gave tonight. Hopefully this gives us some momentum as we go on a little road swing."

Twiggy McIntyre scored a game-high 17 points, 12 of them on 3-pointers. Houston built a 7-point lead midway through the second half by scoring 10 straight, including a pair of 3-pointers by McIntyre.

But Tech came back to take the lead 58-55 on a 3-pointer by Raquel Christian, who scored eight of her 11 points in the second half. The second half featured 10 lead changes.

Houston finished the game on an 11-5 run, including five from Courtney Taylor. She blocked a shot by Jordan Murphree and then drove the court and scored on a layup to give the Cougars a 4-point lead with less than a minute to play. Taylor had her second-career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 11 rebounds.

The Cougars held a 38-30 advantage in the paint and tallied 20 points off of 20 Tech turnovers. Despite being out rebounded 52-42, UH converted its 18 offensive rebounds into 17 second-chance points.

Whitney James added 10 points, five rebounds, two steals and two assists off the bench.

Murphree scored 14 to lead the Lady Raiders, who had won all of their games by at least 10 points. Dominic Seals had a double-double for Tech with 12 points and a game-high 14 rebounds.

The Cougars were held scoreless for the first four minutes of the game, shot 34.2 percent (13-38) in the first half and still managed to carry a three-point, 31-28 lead into the locker room at halftime.

Houston was 2-for-16 in the first 9:45 of the contest and trailed 17-4 with 10:15 remaining. Moments later, a three by McIntyre started a 27-11 run to close out the half that saw UH go 11-for-22 (.500) from the field.

MIAMI, Fla. - The University of Houston women's basketball team won its second-straight road game, holding on for a 63-62 victory over Miami, Saturday at the BankUnited Center.

Miami (4-5) had five shots to tie or win the game in the final minute but all fell short. Albrej Grimsley's jumper with less than a second left ended up in the hands of Tye Jackson as the buzzer sounded.

The Cougars had taken the one-point lead after Twigg McIntyre sank a pair of free throws with 1:04 left.

Jackson grabbed another of her eight rebounds on the next possession but made an errant pass that sailed out of bounds, giving UM a shot at their last-second flurry of attempts.

Houston (4-6), winners of consecutive road games for the first time since 2006, held a 17-point lead with 8:13 to go after opening the second half on a 22-9 run.

The Cougars forced Miami into five of its seven second half turnovers during that span and were 13-for-17 (76%) from the field.

Leading 58-41 after a triple by Jackson, Miami would start a 21-3 run over the next six-and-a-half minutes enabling the Hurricanes to take a 62-61 lead with 1:09 to go.

UH turned passive, did not attack the basket and turned it over eight times during that span struggling to find an answer for the Hurricanes' full-court press.

UM's run was keyed by four-straight three pointers with Epiphany Woodson and Maurita Reid each hitting a pair. Reid had a game-high 20 points, with 13 coming in the second half. Woodson finished with 11 while Grimsley had 12.

Whitney James scored a season-high 13 points along with six rebounds, but fouled out with 3:16 remaining.

Jackson had a team-high 15 points and tied Taylor for the game high with eight boards. Jackson also added a season-best 7 assists and two steals. Taylor scored 12 and was 6-for-8 from the field while McIntyre had 11 along with six assists.

UH held a 15-12 advantage on the offensive glass, converting 25 second-chance points and outrebounding UM 39-31 overall.

Houston's 24 turnovers were its second-most of the season and Miami turned those into 21 points.

The Cougars held a slim one-point lead at the half, 27-26, after a nip-and-tuck opening 20 minutes that featured five lead changes.

McIntyre knocked down three triples in the half to lead all scorers into the locker room with nine points.

Former UH football player Marquay Love was in the stands for the game. Love now plays for the NFL's Miami Dolphins.

AKRON, Ohio - The University of Houston women's basketball team dropped a 81-76 decision to Akron in non-conference action Sunday at Rhodes Arena.

Houston (4-7) led by nine with just over 10 minutes left and had its two-game winning streak snapped. The Cougars had three chances to tie it up in the final 30 seconds, but all three attempts hit the rim.

Akron (5-5) knocked down 11 three pointers and was 24-32 from the free throw line, including a 10-for-15 effort in the final five minutes.

Coblyn Hill finished with a game-high 23 points along with 13 rebounds. She was 10-for-18 from the field and set career highs in both categories and earned her first-career double-double.

UH used a 14-2 run midway through the second half to lead 55-46 with 10:04 remaining. Hill tallied eight of those 15 points on layups.

Akron answered back with a 22-8 run over the next six-plus minutes to lead by seven, its biggest lead of the night, with 3:58 to go. During that span, the Zips knocked down five of their 11 triples while Houston was 3-for-11 from the field.

UH used a 9-1 rally to lead 72-71 with 2:25 left. Akron moved back to a six-point advantage with just under a minute left, after Sarah Tokodi knocked down 3-of-4 free throws after the Cougars' bench was assessed with a technical foul. Houston made a late rally at the free-throw line to get within two, but would get no closer.

Offensively, UH was 6-for-18 in the last 10 minutes of the game and did not have a field goal in the final 2:27 of the game.

Courtney Taylor missed the game due to a back injury.

UH had a dominant inside game, scoring 42 of the team's 76 points in the paint and converting 20 offensive rebounds into 19 second-chance points.

Twigg McIntyre was 7-for-10 from the charity stripe and finished with 18 points. Tye Jackson had 13 points, five rebounds, four assists and two steals in her second game back from a knee injury.

UA's Keyla Snowden led the Zips with 22 points after hitting five three-pointers. Rianna Miller finished with 14 points, nine rebounds and five blocked shots. Kara Murphy scored 20 points.

Tokodi nearly had a triple-double with 16 points, nine rebounds and seven assists.

Akron shot over 40 percent from both the field (23-for-56/41.1) and from behind the arc (11-for-23/47.8).

The Cougars led 33-29 at halftime following a slow start that saw UH miss its two shot attempts while turning it over five times in the first five minutes. The Cougars turned it over 11 times in the half.

The game was a see-saw battle through the half with five ties and four lead changes. Houston led by four, trailed by as many as six and moved back to a four-point lead before heading into the locker room.

HOUSTON - Twigg McIntyre sank a three pointer in the final 30 seconds to help lead Houston to a 73-68 win over longtime rival TCU in non-conference action.

McIntyre's three from the right wing off a dish from Tye Jackson gave Houston (5-7) a four-point lead with 26 seconds left.

TCU (5-7) had two shots come up short on its next two possessions and Whitney James split a pair of free throws with under three seconds left to close out UH's 29th win over the Lady Frogs.

TCU, coming off a 34-point drubbing of No. 20/23 Oklahoma State on Dec. 18, dropped to 0-5 in road games this season.

Jackson had a milestone night as she became the 18th player in the program's 32-year history to score more than 1,000 points in her career and the fourth active Conference USA player to achieve the milestone. The last Cougar to break the 1,000 point plateau was Sancho Lyttle in 2005.

Jackson tallied her first bucket of the night 3:36 into the game, sending her over the 1,000-point mark in only her 54th appearance for Houston. She finished with a team-high 14 points and four assists on a 5-for-7 shooting night.

The game was a sloppy affair as the team's combined for 47 fouls and 41 turnovers. Neither team had much of an advantage on the scoreboard until TCU broke out with a 9-0 run midway through the second half, giving the Lady Frogs a 59-52 lead with 7:02 remaining.

A bucket by James the next time down the floor started a 20-9 run for Houston over the final 6:45 of the game.

Houston shot 50 percent (24-for-48) from the field, 54.5 percent (6-for-11) from behind the three-point line and 86.4 percent (19-for-22) from the charity stripe, setting season bests in all three categories. UH's free-throw percentage was the sixth-best mark in program history.

McIntyre finished with 10 and Brittney Scott added 10 off the bench. Ryan Meyers was 4-for-4 from the field and 5-for-5 from the free-throw line for 13 points along with five rebounds and a career-high tying four steals.

Courtney Taylor returned from a back injury to grab a team-high eight rebounds and Zane Jakobson made her UH debut in the first half.

The Cougars trailed by two at the half 34-32 despite shooting 44 percent (11-for-25) for the opening stanza. Both teams led by as many as six points but combined for 22 turnovers in the half.

Adrienne Ross had 17 points to lead four Lady Frogs in double figures. Emily Carter, Monkea Knight and Danielle Nunn each scored 10 points. TCU's second-leading scorer Lorie Butler-Rayford was held to five points.

TCU struggled from the field shooting 34.5 percent (20-for-58) from the floor with a 5-for-21 effort (.238) from behind the line. The Lady Frogs' free-throw shooting (23-for-30) kept them in the game.

**HOUSTON** - The University of Houston women's basketball team rallied from a 26-point second-half deficit to knock off Lamar 82-75 in overtime.

The Cougars (5-8) trailed 46-22 at the half and did not lead until the 2:29 mark of the second half. The 26-point comeback for the win is the second-largest deficit overcome in NCAA Division I Women's Basketball history, ranking behind Texas State's 32-point comeback win over UTSA on Feb. 18, 2006.

UH took a 75-73 lead with 3:07 left in the extra period and didn't look back, holding the Lady Cardinals (7-6) to two points the rest of the way and earning its first overtime win of the season.

Down 48-22 with 19:28 left in the game, UH outscored the Lady Cardinals 48-26 the rest of the half and got some clutch free-throw shooting from Twiggy McIntyre in the final seconds of regulation.

After Houston took its first lead of the game, 64-63, with 2:29 left, Lamar's Aida Bakhos tipped in a layup off her own miss to put Lamar up 65-64 with 2:23 left.

Ryan Meyers pulled the Cougars within one at 67-66 with 1:32 to go. Lamar's Brittany Williams split a pair of free throws with 44 seconds left and the Cougars trailed by two, 68-66.

On the ensuing possession, Courtney Taylor tipped in a rebound of a McIntyre missed three with 23 ticks left on the clock to knot things at 68-68.

Lamar's Nikki Williams missed a jumper the next time down the floor and fouled McIntyre. After a Lady Cardinals timeout, McIntyre stepped up and drained both free throws, giving Houston a 70-68 lead with four seconds left.

Nikki Williams was fouled attempting a game-winning three, giving her three shots from the charity stripe with half a second left on the clock. After Williams missed the first and drained the second two, UH's Tye Jackson had a half court shot bounce around the rim and out of bounds, sending the game to the extra period.

Jackson finished the game with 21 points and seven assists while Meyers had a season-high 18 points and eight rebounds. McIntyre added all of her 19 points and six of her seven assists in the second half while Taylor finished with nine points, 11 rebounds and four assists.

Houston scored 28 of its 48 second-half points in the paint, scored 17 points off of 15 Lamar turnovers and also tallied 14 points off the fast break in the half.

The Cougars' 20 assists was a season-high and the 13 turnovers was the lowest number of giveaways in the past seven games.

The first half was as forgettable as the second half was memorable after UH shot just 26.7 percent (8-for-30) from the field and 0-for-5 from behind the arc.

Coupled with Lamar shooting 65.4 percent (17-for-26) from the field, the Cougars were dominated up and down the floor. UH made only three field goals in the final 11 minutes of the half and was dominated 16-8 in the paint.

Lamar's Nikki Williams scored 16 of her game-high 26 points in the opening 20 minutes. Brittany Williams finished with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

**HOUSTON** - The University of Houston women's basketball team opened up Conference USA play with a 79-61 loss to UTEP at Hofheinz Pavilion.

Houston (6-9, 0-1 C-USA) turned it over 21 times and was only 4-for-19 (.211) from behind the three-point line. UTEP (10-2, 1-0 C-USA) converted those giveaways into 29 points and used a mid-second half run to seal its sixth-straight win.

After trailing by one a the half, the Cougars went down seven in the first four minutes of the second half before pulling back to within three, 43-40, with 14:52 remaining.

The Miners closed the door with a 22-10 run over the next 8:13 to lead 65-50 with 6:39 left. UH never got the margin under 13 and tallied only five field goals in the last 10 minutes of the game.

UTEP has won three in-a-row and four of the last five in the all-time series, dating back to Feb. 12, 2006.

The Miners won the battle in the paint 42-36 despite playing with a small lineup most of the evening. Izabela Piekarska, UTEP's 6-5 center, was limited to only 15 minutes to due foul trouble. The Cougars failed to take advantage at the free-throw line, shooting only 50 percent (7-for-14).

UTEP's Natasha Lacy nearly had a triple-double, finishing with a game-high 19 points, nine assists and eight rebounds.

Jareica Hughes and Kasia Krezel each finished with 18 points. Hughes added five steals and four assists.

Twiggy McIntyre finished with a team-high 18 points, 15 of which came in the second half.

Courtney Taylor also found double digits, earning her third-career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

Tye Jackson struggled to a career-low two points on a 1-for-9 shooting night along with six turnovers.

The Cougars trailed by seven twice in the opening half, but were able to close the gap to 31-30 at the break. With 8:58 left in the opening stanza, UTEP led 21-14 before a layup by Meyers started a 16-10 UH run to close the half.

The Cougars tied it up at 28-28 with 3:56 to go, but tallied only one bucket in the final three-plus minutes.

The Miners converted 11 UH giveaways into 20 points and also scored eight on the fast break. Hughes and Krezel both hit for 11 in the opening half.

**HOUSTON** - The University of Houston women's basketball team used a 19-4 run out of halftime to knock off Tulane 74-64 in a nationally-televised Conference USA game on Guy V. Lewis Court at Hofheinz Pavilion.

Houston (7-9, 1-1 C-USA) earned its first win over Tulane (11-4, 1-1 C-USA) since Jan. 7, 2005 and halted the Green Wave's four-game winning streak. ESPN2 televised Sunday's game live.

"We executed a lot better in the second half," Interim head coach Danny Hughes said. "We got out in transition and once we made a run to start the half, it built up our confidence. Overall it was a great defensive effort and a great win for our team."

Down 33-25 at the break, the Cougars opened the second half on a 10-0 run over the first 3:55. Minutes later, UH moved the lead to nine, 46-37, with 11:44 to go.

A 6-0 run for the Green Wave had the margin back down to three, 46-43, with 9:57 left. The Cougars responded with a 10-2 run that had the lead back to double digits, 56-45, with 6:08 to go.

Tulane pulled it down to five, 67-62, after a three-pointer by Ashley Langford with 1:30 left, but would get no closer. Houston knocked down eight of its nine free throws in the final 64 seconds to seal the win.

After shooting just 38 percent in the first half, Houston came out in the second half and fired a season-best 66.7 percent (12-for-18) against C-USA's top defensive team. Entering the game, the Green Wave led C-USA by holding opponents a league-low 56.6 ppg. Tulane shot 45.5 percent in the first half and 29.4 percent in the second.

Twiggy McIntyre tied a school record by going 10-for-10 from the charity stripe. She became the 22nd player all time to achieve the milestone. McIntyre scored 22 points in the second half and finished with 25.

The Cougars hit a season-high 26 free throws and finished 26-for-32 (.813) from the line, including a 22-for-24 effort in the second half.

Tye Jackson, recovered from a career-worst performance Friday night against UTEP and tallied her first double-double of the season after scoring 18 points and dishing out a season-high 10 assists. She also tied a career-high with three blocks. Jackson finished Friday's game with two points and six turnovers. UH's 17 assists tied for the second-most in a game this season.

UH scored 32 points in the paint and added 10 on the fast break. Cobilyn Hill had 12 points, five rebounds and two blocks while Courtney Taylor added 10 points and seven rebounds.

Ashley Langford and Brittany Lindsey led the Green Wave with 15 and 14 points respectively. Tulane finished the game only 4-for-14 (.286) from behind the three-point line.

Tulane closed the first half on a 20-9 run to lead 33-25 at the break. UH struggled from behind the three-point line, shooting only 1-for-7 (.143).
