

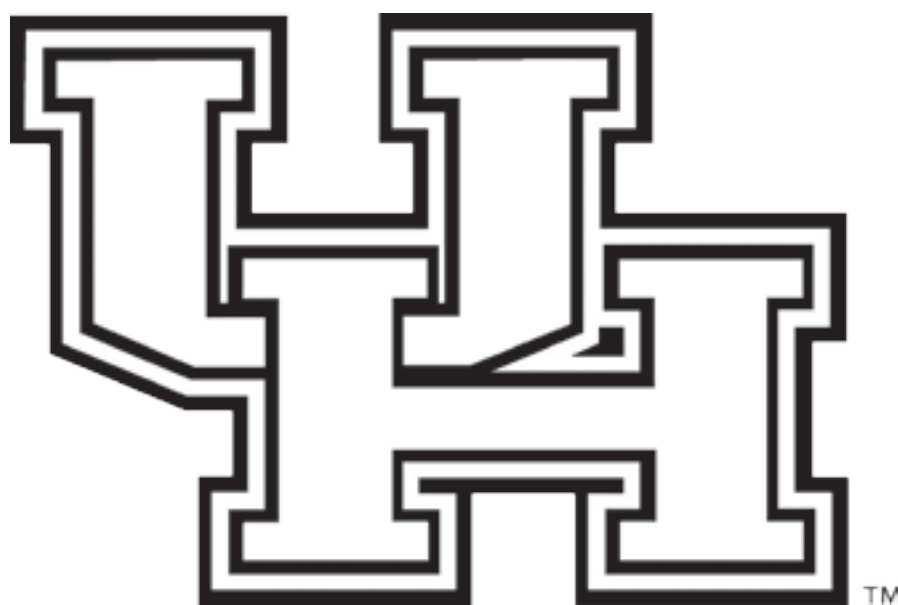

CREDENTIALS

All requests for working press, radio, television, photography or scouting credentials should be made through Alissa Bauer in the Athletic Communications office at least 48 hours before game time. Seating in the press box at Cougar Softball Stadium is for working media only.

All space for the working press, radio and television is allocated by the Houston Athletic Communications Office, which reserves the right to deny credentials to any outlet. Spouses, dates, children and non-workers are restricted from the press box. Any abuse of a working credential will result in the media agency losing credential privileges.

Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. Admission to the press box is by pass only.

ACCREDITATION GUIDELINES

- ← Only full-time, salaried employees intending to provide actual game coverage may receive credentials.
- ← A requesting media agency must represent a collective, organizational editorial voice, not simply the offerings of a single individual.
- ← Membership in a writer's association does not automatically qualify an agency for credentials.
- ← A media agency may assign one of its credentials to its online entity.
- ← An online entity, not associated with a traditional media agency, may qualify for one credential, subject to the following conditions:
 1. An online entity may receive a credential only if its own full-time staff writes a majority of that site's material.
 2. Online entities that focus primarily on University of Houston Athletics and sponsor message boards or chat rooms, may receive credentials provided they adhere to a policy that requires that a posted message or opinion is identified with the actual name and city of the individual posting the message.
 3. Any online service that is recognized as an outlet intended primarily for the purpose of delivering news related to the recruitment of student-athletes will not qualify for credentials.
 4. Online entities will not receive photography credentials.
 5. Online entities (other than those identified above) registering 20,000 legitimate unique users per month in each of the past 12 months will be given first consideration.

ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS OFFICE

The University of Houston Athletics Communications Office is located in the Ted Nance Suite (No. 2008) on the second floor of the Athletics/Alumni Center.

The Athletics/Alumni Center is located at 3100 Cullen Blvd., between Cougar Field (baseball stadium) and Hofheinz Pavilion.

CREDENTIALS

Arrangements for media credentials for the University of Houston's 2011 home softball season must be made through Alissa Bauer in the Houston Athletic Communications Office.

Credentials only will be mailed if specifically requested.

Those credentials not picked up or mailed will be left at the Cougar Softball Stadium media entrance near the ticket windows.

INTERVIEWS

All interviews with Houston coaches, student-athletes and administrators MUST be coordinated through the Athletic Communications Office.

Arrangements to speak with a member of the softball program should be made with **Communications Assistant Alissa Bauer** (785-550-2990/anbauer@central.uh.edu) at least one day prior to the desired interview date. Student-athletes and coaches are generally available before practice.

The locker rooms, training room and weight room inside the Athletics/Alumni Center and the clubhouse at Cougar Softball Field are off-limits to reporters.

On game days, no Houston student-athletes will be available until the postgame media session.

GAME DAY

Pregame packets, including notes and statistics, will be available in the press box at Cougar Softball Stadium prior to each home contest.

Final statistics plus running play-by-play will be provided.

Postgame interviews for **head coach Kyla Holas** and selected student-athletes will be held on the field following each home game. Interview requests must be made through Alissa Bauer prior to the end of the game.

PRESS SEATING

Press box seats are for working newspaper writers, radio and television reporters, along with Houston Athletics staff, and are allocated by the Houston Athletics Communications Office, which reserves the right to deny credentials to any outlet. Admission to the press box is by credential only.

TELEPHONES/INTERNET

Phone lines are available on press row on a first-come, first-serve basis. Cougar Softball Stadium also is equipped with wireless internet during games.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Only accredited photographers and videographers from recognized

media outlets will be issued field credentials.

The University of Houston is, and shall be, the sole owner of any and all copyrights, intellectual property rights and proprietary rights for all images, sounds and data arising from or during UH home athletics contests.

RADIO/TELEVISION BROADCASTS

All requests for radio/TV broadcasts must be made in advance through **Associate AD Cassie Arner** of the Houston Athletics Communications Office.

VISITING RADIO

The official radio broadcast network for the opposing team must be designated in writing by the visiting team's athletics director of athletic communications director.

SEASON PREVIEW

Despite returning the entire starting lineup and pitching staff from a year ago, the University of Houston softball team will still be considered a young squad heading into the 2011 season.

"When you look at the amount of people who will be starting on the field at one time, you're not going to see a lot of seniors," head coach Kyla Holas said. "I think people would still consider us young. They are going to look at things and see that it's going to be better, but we'd still be considered a young team."

That may surprise some who notice five seniors on the roster, but a closer look will reveal that three of the five seniors are on the pitching staff. Of those, one became a Cougar just this semester. To coincide with that, Houston brought in a junior transfer and five freshmen to bring this year's newcomer total to seven.

Regardless, Holas still has 12 student-athletes with at least one year of playing experience to their credit. She and her staff are pleased to have a solid returning core, a luxury they did not have at this time last season.

"It's easier in some sense because you don't have as many freshmen," Holas said, comparing the amount of returners in 2010 to 2011. "You're not spending everyday learning the system, learning terminology, figuring out how the season works, how long it is and all of those ups and downs. It's nicer in that aspect. With every team, you're going to have some rebuilding, with personalities coming together and leadership changeover. We've had some of that, but we've progressed well and we're really excited about the talent we have."

NEWCOMERS

Holas and her staff will work seven new Cougars into their system this season, five freshmen and two transfers. Although she acknowledges that the typical freshmen issues won't escape these five, Holas can't hide the excitement in her voice about her rookie crew.

Freshmen battery and twin sisters Haley (C) and Diedre Outon (P/UTL) came to Houston from Pflugerville High School. A four-year All-District pitcher for the Panthers, Diedre helped her team to a District Championship during the girls' 24-4 senior season. Haley was named a second team All-Central Texas catcher two years in a row and also made the All-District first team in all four of her years at PHS.

Sydney Gerbracht (P/UTL) and Stesha Brazil (C/IF) bring the team's Californian count to five as the freshmen pair came to Houston from San Diego and Turlock, Calif., respectively. A pitcher and team captain at Torrey Pines High School, Gerbracht led her team to the CIF Finals in 2010 and league championships in the 2009 and 2010 seasons. Brazil received All-League, All-Conference, Offensive and Team MVP awards while attending Hilmar High School.

Erin Martin (IF) rounds out the freshman class, joining the team from Allen, Texas. While at Allen High School, Martin was a two-time first team All-District member as well as her team's Co-Offensive Player of the Year from 2008-10.

"I really do think this will be a special freshmen class," Holas said. "Talent-wise, they can really make a run at some of the things in the record books that have been in there for a while. I do think that they're still going to be freshmen and that we're going to have that up and down a lot, but I'm hoping that their work ethic will move them through those ups and downs a little quicker than some of the freshmen that have had to struggle in the past."

After two years at McNeese State University, Spring, Texas, native Kelly Lindley (OF/UTL) moved closer to home when she made the decision to become a Cougar. She will begin her career at Houston as a junior.

Although she was the last newcomer to join this year's club, senior transfer Donna Bourgeois (P) made the biggest splash upon arrival. Bourgeois spent her first three years building an impressive resume in the circle at the University of Louisiana-Lafayette. Bourgeois enters her senior year with a career record of 69-24 and a career ERA of 1.37.

Last season, the Lafayette, La., native was named first team All-Sun Belt Conference, All-Louisiana and the Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSW) Pitcher of the Year. She was also named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA second team All-Region, while posting a 23-10 record with a 2.01 ERA in 32 starts.

During her sophomore campaign, Bourgeois ranked eighth in the nation with a 1.07 ERA in 235.1 innings pitched, holding opponents to a .169 batting average. The effort earned her Sun Belt Pitcher of the Year accolades after leading the Cajuns with 30 wins in 41 appearances.

As a freshman, Bourgeois led the SBC with a 0.97 ERA while leading ULL to a berth into Women's College World Series.

"Any team that gets a 20-game winner every year and has been in the postseason every year, including the Women's College World Series as a freshman, has the kind of experience that you can't fake," Holas said. "It does something different to you when you've played at that level. She is huge for us. Her expectations, her work ethic and her mentality is very different even when you just talk with her."

INFIELD

Houston returns its infield from 2010 in 2011, but Holas is predicting some changes in this year's defensive setup.

"We moved some people around this fall when Mary Tyler Dobson (2B) got injured," Holas said. "We have some offensive people that we really had to get in the lineup, including some of our newcomers."

2011 SEASON PREVIEW

"We've tried a few different spots and really spent some time at it. We didn't try to rush that process; we really tried to take our time getting them acclimated to those new positions."

Last year's home run leader Brooke Lathan (SS) will resume her spot as the starting shortstop, while Martin will compete with her for time. Once Dobson finishes her recovery from a shoulder injury, she will stand in as the other half of the middle infield. In the meantime, redshirt junior Jennifer Klinkert (1B/2B), who started all 55 games at first base last season, will spend time at second.

Sophomore Holly Anderson (3B) will reclaim her role after starting all but four games at the hot corner in 2010. Brazil (1B) and Haley Outon (C) look to be among the first freshmen to crack the starting lineup. Outon got a jump on showcasing her offensive power this fall, when she belted five home runs in just eight games. When Outon is not catching, last year's starter, Melissa Gregson (C/OF) and Brazil will step in.

"Of course there are always injuries that could happen, and then people would then shift a lot from that," Holas said. "That set of infielders gives us the most offense in the lineup that we can put in there, while not losing much defensively."

OUTFIELD

The outfielding core also returns in its entirety, but will have power in numbers this season as Holas and her staff have a welcomed problem to handle this season: depth.

"That depth and competing for positions is something that we haven't had in a while," Holas said. "It can be a good thing and a bad thing because too many people sitting the bench can get really unhappy really quickly. We've really tried to work with them on their role and our expectations so there are no surprises. No one is happy to sit, but we help them understand what they need to do to get out of it."

According to Holas, this season's crew of outfielders is so strong defensively that their offense will make the final determination of who will start. Sophomore outfielder and Conference USA All-Freshman team member Ashleigh Jones (OF) led the team in batting average (.333), triples (4), hits (61) and stolen bases (7) in 2010.

"Ashleigh is who you will see out there more than anybody," Holas said. "She had centerfield every day last year, barring injury. Mentally, she needs keep improving and stay more focused and aggressive."

Senior Katy Beth Sherman (OF) was one of just four Cougars to start every game last year and will likely return to the outfield again for her final season. Fellow senior Angela Spittler (OF) committed just one error in her 42 starts and led the team in on-base percentage (.398) to make a case to roam the outfield again in 2011. Last year's starting catcher, Gregson will get significant work in the outfield, as well.

PITCHING

The addition of Bourgeois will enhance an already explosive rotation. Sophomore Bailey Watts (P) posted the 15th-best ERA in the conference (2.85) last season to earn a spot on the C-USA All-Freshman team, while leading the Cougars in wins (14) and innings pitched (164.1).

Senior Amanda Crabtree (P) led the team in strike outs (189) to rank fifth in the conference. With Outon and the already-proven Bourgeois also stepping onto the scene, Holas is excited about what her revamped pitching staff can do.

"Going through the fall and based on last year and the successes and abilities they have,

I think that Donna Bourgeois and Amanda Crabtree are going to be our No. 1 and No. 2 pitchers pretty consistently, Holas said. "I think that Bailey Watts and Diedre Outon are going to battle for that third and fourth spot."

OFFENSE

Sophomore Reina Gaber (UTL/DP) returns as the Cougars' offensive specialist from a year ago. She was second on the team with a .323 batting average and led the Cougars with nine doubles. Her performance was awarded with second team All-Conference honors as well as a spot on the C-USA All-Freshman team.

The Cougars posted a better batting average, slugging percentage and more hits than their opponents last season, but Holas and her staff sensed a lapse in fundamentals that they wanted to address. This fall, the coaching staff took the time to break down each player's swing and reinstall proper mechanics with their hands and contact points.

Holas said she hopes her team continued working on those fundamentals following the fall season. She saw a lot of her players in the batting cages and on the field during the break.

"If they do what they're capable of doing, this is going to be a very impressive offensive lineup," Holas said. "That might be getting a little ahead of ourselves, setting expectations too high or keeping everyone healthy. It's a long season and we're facing some very good teams. We expect a lot out of them, but you have to have a good balance there."

SCHEDULE

The Cougars are slated to face nine NCAA Tournament Regional teams and a Super Regional team from a year ago.

Nine opponents lined up for UH finished the 2010 season either receiving votes or one of the top-25 teams on the ESPN/USA Today's final poll.

"I don't feel like this schedule is any tougher than previous seasons," Holas said. "It's pretty consistent, and we do it for a reason. Conference USA has proven to not send very many teams. Winning a conference is very difficult to do, sometimes even the best team in the conference doesn't always win the conference. Our way of getting there is through this schedule, playing some of those teams and getting some of those wins. I'm hoping this team is up to that challenge."

Louisiana-Lafayette '94

Head coach Kyla Holas embarks on her 11th season at the helm of the Cougar softball program she began constructing from scratch in 2001.

In the program's first 10 seasons, Houston has proven to be a mainstay at the top of the Conference USA standings on the way to national recognition with nine consecutive winning seasons, three NCAA Regional appearances in 2004, 2007 and 2008 and one NCAA Super Regional appearance in 2008. She also appeared in back-to-back Conference USA championship games in 2007 and 2008.

Prior to the start of her 11th spring, Holas and her Cougars were selected atop the preseason Conference USA standings, as three of her players were also voted to the league's preseason All-Conference team.

Under the direction of Holas, Houston has become a successful program that has registered 35 or more wins in five of the last nine seasons, including three consecutive 40+ win seasons from 2006-08. The Cougars have reached at least 30 victories eight times and emerged as one of the top programs in Conference USA, reaching the final day of the C-USA Championship in four of the last six seasons and clinching the tournament title in 2007.

"Recruiting players who want to win championships has been the key to our success," Holas said. "It takes a very dedicated and disciplined person to fit into our program. We demand a lot from them in the details category. The girls on this team know the stakes and rise every day to meet the challenge."

Holas has taken Houston from a 22-win season during that inaugural year to an NCAA Regional caliber team, proven by three Top-25 wins over No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 11 Michigan and No. 23 Louisiana-Lafayette in 2007, eight Top-25 wins in 2008, beating each team twice (No. 14 DePaul, No. 16 Louisiana-Lafayette, No. 21/18 Fresno State and No. 25 Washington) and a win against No. 6 Michigan in 2009. She and her team opened the 2010 season with a win over No. 14 Ohio State as rookie Bailey Watts tossed a complete game shutout in her first career start. The win kicked off a season that would see Houston finish fifth in the C-USA standings and would watch her reach and surpass her 350th career victory.

"The foundation for this program was laid in the beginning and each year another team adds to this grand piece of history they are creating," Holas said. "That takes a very visionary person to be part of something larger than themselves everyday."

Holas has committed herself to building a winning tradition at Houston. Her staff and players have all bought into this philosophy and bring all of the necessary key ingredients to producing a winning program.

In 2004, Holas picked up her 100th and 101st career victories, sweeping a doubleheader

at No. 15 Texas A&M. Houston rolled to a 39-25 mark, not only making its first NCAA Regional appearance, but also picked up the program's first postseason win with a 1-0 victory over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. In 2005 she reached her 200th career victory in the Conference USA Tournament against East Carolina.

In 2008, Holas posted a 54-11 record, making softball the only sport in Houston history to record more than 50 wins. The Cougars took home its second regular-season C-USA Championship title and advanced to the NCAA Regional and Super Regionals, which took place at Cougar Softball Field.

The Cougars went 3-0 at the Regional, defeating Delaware State 9-0, with a perfect game pitched by Angel Shamblin. UH beat Washington 2-0 in game two, and advanced to the Super Regionals with a 2-1 win over Washington.

In the Super Regionals, the Cougars played Louisiana-Lafayette, splitting the first two games, but with just one win shy of the World Series, the Cougars fell short in the final game, with a 4-0 decision going to the Ragin' Cajuns.

The philosophy towards winning is one that Holas learned as a three-time NCAA All-America pitcher at Southwestern Louisiana (now Louisiana-Lafayette) after leading the Ragin' Cajuns to a third-place finish at the 1993 NCAA Women's College World Series. She received WCWS All-Tournament Team honors and was a two-time finalist (1993-94) for the prestigious Honda Broderick Cup, a national award given to the top female student-athlete at the NCAA level.

Holas racked up a career 104-20 record, in addition to compiling a .301 career batting average, en route to setting seven school records. Her .839 winning percentage is still in the Top 15 in NCAA record books. In 1999, Holas was inducted into the Louisiana-Lafayette Athletics Hall of Fame.

Her dominant performance has earned her a spot in the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame. The Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) selected Holas to be among the eight Louisiana greats to enter the LSHOF in June 2011. She will become the first softball player to be bestowed with this honor.

In ten seasons at Houston, Holas has produced 10 National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-South Region awards, including three-time selection Kristen Glowacz to go along with 73 C-USA honors, including her second-consecutive Coach of the Year award. Glowacz was also named to the C-USA All-Decade team in 2005. In 2008, Jessica Valis, Wagner and Shamblin were the first in program history to be named NFCA All-Americans.

Houston has accumulated 17 Conference USA All-Freshman selections and three Freshman of the Year winners, including 2006 winner, Elaina Nordstrom and 2008 recipient, Jennifer Klinkert. The Cougars garnered a C-USA Co-MVP award with Glowacz in 2005 and C-USA Player of the Year Jessica Valis in 2007, in addition to Angel Shamblin's three-time C-USA Pitcher of the Year awards (2006, 2007, 2008). Shamblin also received the Co-Female Cougar of the Year award at the 2008 Academic Banquet.

Shamblin was named the 2008 C-USA Female Athlete of the Year, the first softball player to ever receive the honor and the fourth Cougar to be named Athlete of the Year.

In 2008, Holas produced four All-Conference USA First Team players including, Jessica Valis, Klinkert, Laurie Wagner and Shamblin. Three Cougars were members of the All-Conference Second Team, including Nordstrom, Christa Raley and Katie Bush. Klinkert, the 2008 Freshman of the Year, was also a member of the C-USA All-Freshman Team.

Shamblin, Wagner, Jessica Valis and Klinkert were also named to the NFCA All-South

Region Team. Shamblin and Wagner earned All-South Region First Team honors, while Jessica Valis and Klinkert were named to the Second Team.

In 2009, Jessica Valis received her fourth consecutive All-Conference USA First Team honor. Haley Valis, Katie Bush and Laurie Wagner joined the ranks on the All-Conference USA Second Team, and Melissa Gregson was named to the C-USA All-Freshman Team.

To go along with all the C-USA honors, three Cougars were also named All-Americans as announced by the NFCA. The trio included Shamblin, Wagner and Jessica Valis. They were the first in program history to be named All-Americans.

Three student-athletes were honored during the 2008-09 season, as Bush became a four-time Academic Medal honoree, while Klinkert and Baillie Lott picked up their second C-USA Academic Honor Roll selection.

To get to the top, Holas doesn't let anything get overlooked. Her dynamic personality, work ethic and past accomplishments as a player and coach make the program's sky-high outlook seem very realistic.

"Success comes by being obsessive about details," Holas said. "The little things are what separates the All-Americans from everyone else."

Since coming to Houston, Holas has worked endlessly to build a program focused on winning with high academic standards, something that is paramount to the student-athletes on the Cougar squad. The academic standards Holas has set for her team have also been a staple of the program as a program-record 12 players earned recognition on the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll during the 2007-08 academic year. In the fall of 2010, the Cougars posted its best semester GPA in program history (3.19) as six student-athletes were named to the Dean's List.

Bush was honored with the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VI Second Team award, and the C-USA All-Academic Team for her excellence in the classroom. Bush was also a two-time NFCA Academic All-America Scholar (2007, 2008). Joining her for the 2008 C-USA All-Academic Team was Wagner.

Holas came to the Cougar program from the University of Florida, where she was responsible for developing the pitchers and catchers for three seasons. She guided the Gators through its inaugural season and through a tough Southeastern Conference schedule.

While at Florida, Holas was instrumental in the development of Chelsey Sakizzie, who was named the 1998 SEC Player of the Year in addition to Louisville Slugger All-America Third-Team honors. She coached five other players to SEC accolades.

Before going to Florida, Holas spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Northern Illinois. While working in DeKalb, Ill., Holas tutored the Husky pitchers and coordinated the academics for the team. She coached the 1996 Midwestern Collegiate Conference Player of the Year, pitcher Angie Zuspahn, as the Huskies reached the NCAA Regionals for only the second time since 1988.

A native of Pasadena, Texas, Holas now lives in Pearland, Texas, with her husband, John, and their sons, Payton and Jase and daughter Brenan.

Abbie Sims enters her fourth season as an assistant coach for head coach Kyla Holas, taking charge of the pitching and catching for the University of Houston. She also serves as the program's recruiting and equipment coordinator.

In 2010, Sims guided freshman Bailey Watts to a spot on the Conference USA All-Freshman Team. Watts' 2.85 ERA in her rookie campaign placed her in the league's top-15 to finish the season. Sims also worked with junior Amanda Crabtree, who will enter the 2011 season with the third-lowest career opposing batting average in program history (.202).

"I have been very pleased with Abbie's time here," Holas said. "She transitioned in well to our philosophy and made an immediate impact in our pitching staff. I look to her to continue to grow as she develops this young staff."

In 2008, Sims coached Angel Shamblin as she broke several single-season records including the lowest ERA (0.94), most strikeouts in a game (16) and most wins in a season (36).

Sims also helped guide Shamblin to C-USA All-Tournament team honors at the 2008 C-USA Championship, and she was named the 2008 C-USA Pitcher of the Year.

Shamblin was the 2008 C-USA Female Athlete of the Year. She was the first softball player and fourth Cougar to be honored with that award.

With Shamblin's 36 wins and lowest ERA in a single-season, she was also named to the All-C-USA First Team, as well as NFCA All-South Region First Team. As a senior, Shamblin finished out the season with the second highest in C-USA career victories with 94 total wins. She also was second in C-USA career strikeouts with 877. Under Sims, Shamblin was honored with six C-USA Pitcher of the Week awards (Feb. 18, March 10, March 17, March 31, April 14, May 5). Shamblin also pitched a perfect game against Memphis on March 29.

With Sims guidance, Barbie Love finished with the lowest opposing batting average in C-USA with .162.

As a student-athlete, Sims became the first-ever NC State softball player to be named ACC Player of the Year in 2007. She had an impressive senior campaign as she tossed four no-hitters, including a perfect game. She owned the second-best pitching record (27-7) in the conference as well as one of the top marks in the nation.

Sims tossed four no-hitters, including a no-hit bid over No. 6 Oklahoma and a perfect game against Campbell, en route to being named national player of the week on two occasions by different organizations. Sims also was named ACC Player of the Week a league-best four times, and became the first Wolfpack softball player to take conference player of the year honors. In addition to her league accolades, Sims became the first State player to be named a Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-American, picking up third-team recognition.

In addition, Sims is one of five pitchers in ACC history to have collected 1,000 or more career strikeouts (1,091). A native of Artesia, N.M., she also saw action as an outfielder for the Wolfpack, compiling a .292 batting average with 45 hits, 25 runs scored, 11 home runs and 27 RBIs her senior year.

One of two ACC student-athletes to receive National Player of the Week recognition in 2007, Sims was tabbed by USA Softball (March 20) and Louisville Slugger/NFCA (April 22). She was also the only student-athlete named ACC Player of the Week four times in a season. In 2007, Sims made her third appearance as an All-ACC First-Team member, garnishing accolades in 2005, 2006 and 2007.

Sims finished her career at NC State as the active leader in career victories among all league hurlers and fourth all-time in wins by ACC pitchers with 90. With 1,091 strikeouts, Sims placed fourth all-time among ACC pitchers. Additionally, Sims' 102 complete games ranks fifth all-time and was tops among active pitchers in 2007.

Her pitching prowess was never more obvious than when she tossed a no-hitter over No. 6 Oklahoma at the Judi Garman Classic on March 16 in Fullerton, Calif. The Sooners entered the game as the nation's top offensive unit overall, leading the country in scoring and batting average, and ranked near the top of nearly every hitting statistic. None of that mattered to Sims, however, who allowed just four base runners while striking out 10 batters.

As Sims departed the Wolfpack she owned many of the program's all-time pitching records, including lowest career ERA (1.69), lowest opponent batting average (.179), wins (90), saves (5), appearances (146), starts (121), complete games (102), games finished (25), shutouts (36), innings pitched (836.2), strikeouts (1,091) and batters faced (3,491).

Since graduating with a bachelor's degree in business management, Sims played one season with the Rockford Thunder of the National Pro Fastpitch league in Rockford, Ill.

Kristin Vesely enters her first year as an assistant coach to start the 2010-11 season. Vesely will work primarily the Cougar hitters and outfielders. Vesely works with recruiting database management and is the director of Cougar Softball Camp.

“Coming from the program that she came from, playing in the College World Series, being a semifinalist for the USA Player of the Year and an All-American, I just think that’s a history and an experience that is needed for this group,” head coach Kyla Holas said.

The Phoenix, Ariz., native shares plenty of elite softball experience with the team. A USA Player of the Year semifinalist during her junior season and a quarterfinalist during her senior campaign at the University of Oklahoma, Vesely has a wide selection of success stories to pull from.

The Sooners all-time hits leader (293) started all but four games in the outfield during her freshman year in Norman, Okla., and took off from there. She was named to the All-Big 12 team in each of her four years and an NFCA All-American for her last two seasons.

Her role with the Cougars as the hitting and outfield coach will be backed by her strong resume in both aspects of the game. Vesely held a 73-game errorless streak that stretched from her junior to senior seasons, and the 97 hits she recorded as a junior still stands as the most in a single season by any Big 12 player.

Aside from being one of the most decorated players in Oklahoma’s storied softball program, Vesely competed all four years on the Sooners’ soccer team, as well. She helped guide the Sooners to its best start in program history, as they posted an 11-1 record to open her senior season en route to earning a Big 12 Tournament berth.

Following the completion of her collegiate career, the New England Riptide took Vesely in the first round of the National Pro Fastpitch (NPF) 2006 College Player Draft. The fourth-overall selection played professionally for the organization for one season.

Following her playing days, Vesely got her start in coaching. She returned to Oklahoma to coach the Oklahoma Twisters, an under-14 traveling softball team. After three years of working with younger players, Vesely coached the Blancherd High School squad to a 24-3 record in 2010.

One of the most decorated players in Houston softball history, Valis joins the Cougar coaching staff after a stint in the professional ranks. She wrapped up her career with the Akron Racers in the National Pro Fastpitch League, after helping them reach the NPF Championship Series in August 2010.

While with the Cougars, Valis was a standout player through the duration of her career. She was named to the Conference USA All-Freshman Team following the 2006 season, earned First Team All-Conference honors in each of her four years at Houston and was the C-USA Player of the Year in 2007.

Aside from earning recognition from the conference, Valis brought national attention to Houston softball in 2008 when she was one of three Cougars to reach NFCA All-America status for the first time in program history. She garnered NFCA All-South Region Second Team honors in 2007 and 2008, and was named to the ASA Player of the Year Top-50 Watch List prior to her junior and senior seasons.

She still holds several program records at Houston, including career batting average (.379), season batting average (.431, 2008), career runs scored (169), career hits (285), season hits (88, 2008), career triples (16), season triples (7, 2007), career stolen bases (61), season stolen bases (25), career assists (403) and career double plays turned (26).

Valis graduated from Houston in 2009 with a Bachelor of Science in Consumer Science and Merchandising with a minor in marketing.

DeJuena Chizer begins her fourth season as Senior Woman Administrator at the University of Houston in 2010-11. However, she is no stranger to the Athletics Department and begins her 11th year of service to the University.

In that role, she supervises each of Houston's nine women's sports, serves on the athletics senior staff and shares in the overall governance of the department. She also serves as the department's senior women's administrative liaison to the Conference USA office.

Chizer moved into her current position after serving for eight seasons as a women's basketball assistant coach at UH. Before returning to Houston in 2000, Chizer served nine years as the head volleyball coach and assistant basketball mentor at Thomas Jefferson High School (TJHS) in Port Arthur, Texas.

A member of the Texas High School Coaches Association and the Texas Girls Coaches Association (TGCA), Chizer successfully led the Lady Yellow Jackets into the UIL Playoffs in 1991-93 and 1996-99. She was recognized for her basketball accomplishments in the Museum of the Gulf Coast in 1994 and was honored by the TJHS Yellow Jacket Alumni at the Annual Crying Towel Dinner in August, 1994.

Prior to joining TJHS, Chizer played professionally four years in Europe and three years with the Houston Flames, a semi-professional and AAU team. She was named the AAU MVP and a member of the AAU National Championship Team in 1991.

Chizer received a bachelor's of science degree in kinesiology from Houston in 1990 and a provisional all levels physical education certificate in 1991.

She and her husband, Derrick, live in Pearland with their daughters, Kasei and Kaila.

2010 SEASON RECAP

The University of Houston softball team closed out the 2010 season finishing 30-24-1, and fifth place in Conference USA.

The Cougars would finish 12-10-1 in league play and 3-5 against top-25 teams in the 10th anniversary of the program's existence.

LEADING THE WAY

In her rookie season, Reina Gaber earned All-Conference USA Second Team honors as a utility player. The Whittier, Calif., native finished the season with a .323 batting average, 41 hits, with two homers and 29 RBI. She appeared in 46 games, starting 45 of them in the designated player role.

Freshman outfielder Ashleigh Jones topped the Cougars at the plate last season, posting a .333 batting average with 61 hits, four triples and a double. Her batting average, triples and hits placed her amongst the top 10 in C-USA. With this, she joined Gaber on the All-Conference USA Freshman Team.

In her sophomore campaign, Melissa Gregson played 53 games behind the plate and posted a .286 batting average with a team-leading 32 RBI. The Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., native finished second on the team in hits (46).

Freshman Brooke Lathan posted a .233 batting average and led the team with 11 homers. The Livingston, Texas, native put up 37 hits, with six doubles and a triple for the season.

Freshman Bailey Watts paced the Cougar pitchers in 2010 with 14 wins and a 2.85 ERA. The West Columbia, Texas, native was the go-to pitcher for the Cougars, appearing 33 games, starting 26 and throwing 21 complete games.

She joined Jones and Gaber with C-USA All-Freshman Team honors.

NON-CONFERENCE REVIEW

The Cougars began their season with a 1-0 victory over No. 14 Ohio State in the Marriott Houston Hobby Classic. Watts earned her first career victory in a complete game shutout. Watts only allowed three hits and struck out nine.

UH closed out the Marriott Houston Hobby Classic with a 1-0 victory over Sam Houston State. Gregson would account for the only run scored with her sixth-inning homerun.

Opening the Marriott Houston Invitational with a pair of wins over Louisiana-Lafayette and UTSA moved the Cougars to a 4-3 record on the season.

The Cougars then traveled to Baton Rouge, La., to compete in the LSU Tiger Invitational. Watts struck out eight in the Houston victory over Jacksonville State, 7-1. The next day, UH defeated Texas Southern University, 11-5.

The team would drop the next one against LSU in a grueling 2-0 affair. The following day the Cougars would bounce back against Southern with an 11-3 trouncing of the Jaguars.

A tough 6-4 loss to Texas A&M sparked the Cougars to an eight-game winning streak, the longest streak of the season.

CONFERENCE USA ACTION

During that streak, the Cougars swept C-USA rival Southern Miss and defeated NCAA Seattle Regional competitor North Dakota State to improve to 15-9 on the season.

In the first game against the Golden Eagles, Amanda Crabtree pitched eight innings, striking out a career-high 14 batters, while only giving up three hits.

In the second game of the Saturday doubleheader, the Cougars topped Southern Miss, 10-5. Watts improved to 7-3 on the season after pitching a complete game.

The first game of the doubleheader against North Dakota State took nine innings to decide a winner. In the bottom of the ninth, Jones hit a walk-off single, driving home junior Katy Beth Sherman, putting the Cougars on top, 4-3.

Watts would receive the win, improving her record to 8-3. The nine innings pitched against the Bison is her career high.

The second game of the doubleheader proved a little easier for UH as the team cruised to a 6-3 victory. Gregson belted two out of the park, the first time a Cougar has hit two home runs in a game since 2008.

UH hit a snag when the team dropped a three-game series to league-rival UCF in Orlando, Fla. The final game of the series gave the Cougars momentum despite the loss as they took the Knights to nine innings, falling short 1-0. The team dropped to 15-12, 3-3 in conference play.

Taking two-of-three from UTEP at home, the Cougars would improve to 18-14 (5-4 C-USA). The Cougars would lose the first, 2-1, but take the next two with a combined run differential of 13-7. The second game of the doubleheader featured Watts, who fanned nine batters in a complete game performance. Sophomore Mary Tyler Dobson was excellent at the plate, going 2-for-3 with an RBI and two runs scored.

The Sunday game featured a seven-run sixth inning to rally the Cougars from a 5-1 deficit. UH sparked the comeback with five hits combined with four UTEP errors to score the seven runs. Lathan went 2-of-3 with two RBI, a home run and two runs scored in the 8-5 affair.

2010 SEASON RECAP

The Cougars bounced back from a three-game losing streak at UAB with a five-consecutive wins. UH defeated Prairie View A&M 10-0 and 20-0, then swept C-USA rival, Memphis, to improve to 23-19 (8-7 C-USA).

PVAM proved no match for the Cougars in both games. Freshmen Lathan, Jones and Holly Anderson were perfect at the plate, combining for four runs, three RBI and seven hits in the Cougars first game. Junior Baillie Lott pitched a one-hit shutout in the victory and aided her cause with a homer, the fifth of her career.

The second game's scoring output was the highest of the season (20 runs). Crabtree also pitched a one-hit shutout, fanning 12 while only walking two batters. The Kingwood, Texas native would receive plenty of offensive support as the Cougars posted 13 runs in the first inning on nine hits, including two homers from junior Jennifer Klinkert.

This marked the first time UH scored double-digit runs in an inning since April 12, 2008, when the Cougars put 10 on the scoreboard against East Carolina.

UH then swept in-conference rival Memphis, with a combined run total of 16-4. Watts pitched her first career no-hitter in the second game of the doubleheader against Memphis, 5-0. Watts struck out nine and walked two to complete the career milestone.

Sherman was 3-for-4 with two runs scored, while Gregson and Anderson each recorded a run and an RBI.

The next day, UH would complete the sweep defeating the Tigers, 7-4, after overcoming a 4-0 deficit. The Cougars posted a five-run fourth and a two-run fifth to top Memphis. Gaber hit her first home run of her career in the game.

The team returned home for its final regular season series against ECU. The Cougars would take 2-of-3 from the Pirates to improve their record to 26-22 (10-10 in C-USA).

UH dropped the first game of the Saturday doubleheader on April 24 to ECU, 1-0. They would retaliate to take the second game, 4-3. Crabtree evened her record at 10-10 after striking out five in seven innings of work.

Junior Angela Spittler and Gregson both drilled round trippers, while Jones hit two triples to set a single-game Houston record.

The Cougars rounded out the series with a 4-2 victory. Watts improved to 12-9 with a six-strikeout performance in seven innings of work. Gaber went a perfect 3-for-3 at the plate with three RBI to seal the deal for UH.

UH had an eventful weekend in its final C-USA road trip, taking two and tying one against Marshall. Watts struck out nine in a complete game effort to give the Cougars a 5-3 victory in game one to move to 13-9 on the season.

The second game of the doubleheader was a tighter matchup. Crabtree fanned 10 batters while only walking one in a 3-2 complete game win. Sherman went 2-for-4 with two runs in the victory.

The final game of the series ended in a 4-4 tie, the first in Cougar softball history. The game was called due to inclement weather in the sixth inning. Crabtree received the tie after sitting down seven and walking one. Lathan hit a homer, to land her at 11 on the season. Sherman hit her third three-bagger of the season and advanced home on an illegal pitch.

The Cougars closed out their season in Waco, Texas against the Baylor Bears. They would split the May 8 doubleheader to finish the regular season 29-23-1.

UH dropped the first game 6-0, but fought back to score nine unanswered runs and take the final game of the series, 9-7.

Crabtree earned the win after fanning three in six innings of work, while Watts earned her second save.

The Cougars upset the No. 4 seeded UAB, 3-0, in the first game of the Conference USA tournament. Watts struck out six in a complete game shutout. At the plate, Anderson led the Cougars as she went 2-for-3 with two RBIs. Gaber and Gregson also contributed two hits apiece.

The win advanced the Cougars to the semifinals to face the top-seeded ECU Pirates.

The Cougars surrendered three early runs and were not able to overcome the deficit. Watts received the loss after giving up the first three runs, but Crabtree turned in a scoreless relief performance, striking out four.

Crabtree totaled 12 strikeouts and walked only two batters in the final game of the season.
