

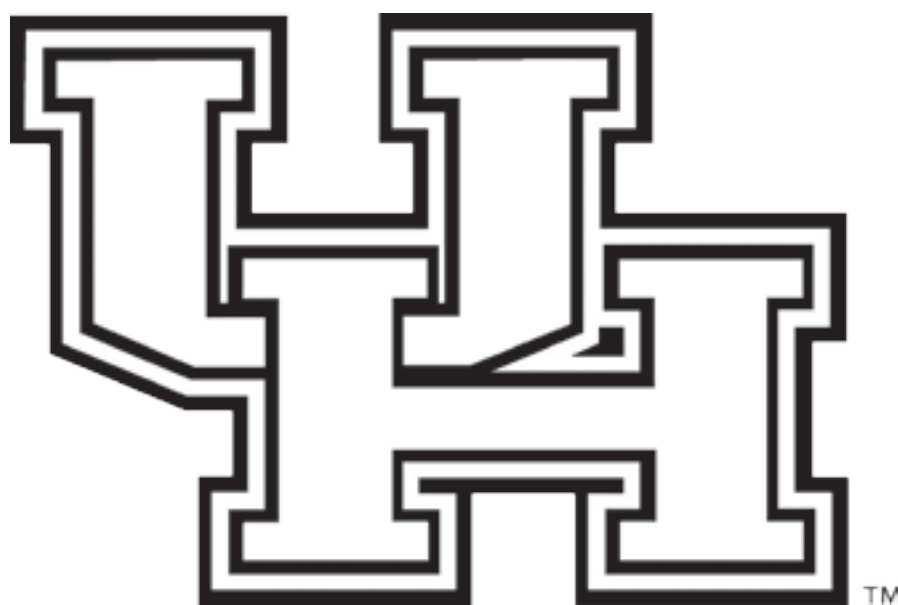

## MEDIA INFORMATION

### CREDENTIALS »

All requests for working press, radio, television, photography or scouting credentials should be mailed, emailed or faxed on letterhead to Athletics Communications Assistant Director Jamie Zarda at least one week prior to the game. Season credential requests should be sent at least two weeks prior to the first game.

All space for the working press, radio and television is allocated by the UH Athletics Communications Office, which reserves the right to deny credentials to any outlet. Spouses, dates, children, equipment carriers and non-workers are restricted from the press area, sidelines and locker rooms. Any abuse of a working credential will result in the media agency losing credential privileges.

Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. Admission to the press area is by pass only.

### Accreditation Guidelines »

- ← Only full-time, salaried employees intending to provide actual game coverage may receive credentials.
- ← A requesting media agency must represent a collective, organizational editorial voice, not simply the offerings of a single individual.
- ← Membership in a writer's association does not automatically qualify an agency for credentials.
- ← A media agency may assign one of its credentials to its online entity.
- ← An online entity, not associated with a traditional media agency, may qualify for one credential, subject to the following conditions:
  1. An online entity may receive a credential only if its own full-time staff writes a majority of that site's material.
  2. Online entities that focus primarily on University of Houston Athletics and sponsor message boards or chat rooms, may receive credentials provided they adhere to a policy that requires that a posted message or opinion is identified with the actual name and city of the individual posting the message.
  3. Any online service that is recognized as an outlet intended primarily for the purpose of delivering news related to the recruitment of student-athletes will not qualify for credentials.
  4. Online entities will not receive photography credentials.
  5. Online entities (other than those identified above) registering 20,000 legitimate unique users per month in each of the past 12 months will be given first consideration.

The Athletics Communications Office is in the Ted Nance Suite (No. 2008) on the second floor of the Athletics/Alumni Center, located on Cullen Boulevard between Cougar Field and Hofheinz Pavilion. If available, parking will be provided in the front lot of the Athletics/Alumni Center.

### COACH INTERVIEWS »

Interviews with Houston head coach Molly Alvey are coordinated by the Athletics Communications Office. In general, Alvey is available for interviews Monday-Friday before or after practice. Please contact the Athletics Communications Office at 713-743-9404 to set up an interview.

### PRACTICE »

All members of the working press are welcome to attend University of Houston practices, which are held inside the Athletics/Alumni Center. Please notify the UH Athletics Communications Office when you will be attending practice so that we may inform the coaching staff. Photographers and videographers are allowed to shoot during practice at Coach Alvey's discretion. Practice may be closed subject to the coach's request.

### PLAYER INTERVIEWS »

Houston student-athletes are available for media interviews, either in person or on the phone, prior to practice, following practice and at different hours during the day depending on class and meeting schedules.

Please contact the UH Athletics Communications Office to arrange all player interviews. The locker, training and weight rooms inside the UH Athletics/Alumni Center are off-limits to reporters.

For phone interviews, please call the UH Athletics Communications Office at 743-9404 at least one day in advance of the day you would like to talk to the player.

The UH Athletics Communications Office does not release student-athletes' phone numbers.

### DIRECTIONS »

Complete directions and a campus map are available online at UHCougars.com.

### MEDIA WILL CALL »

In most cases, credentials will be available on the day of the game. Credentials may be picked up through Friday on a game week from the Athletics Communications Office. Credentials not mailed or picked up will be held at the Will Call window at the ticket office at the entrance to the Athletics/Alumni Building.

### PHOTOGRAPHERS »

Only accredited photographers on assignment from recognized media outlets will be issued sideline credentials. In accordance with NCAA rules, no freelance photographers will be admitted to the sidelines. All photographers must obtain a media pass to shoot inside the Athletics/Alumni Building.

The University of Houston is, and shall be, the sole owner of any and all copyrights, intellectual property rights and proprietary rights for images, sounds and data arising from or during UH home athletics contests.

### PARKING »

Separate parking passes will not be needed to enter the parking lots on campus the day of a game.

### PRESS ROW »

The Athletics/Alumni Building press row is accessible through the front entrance of the building on Elgin St. The row on the right of the court will be available to the media. Wireless internet will be available on press row for use by the media.

### TELEPHONES »

The Athletics Communications Office will provide telephones in the Communications Office, Suite 2008, at all home games. These phones will accept only credit card, collect or third-party long distance calls. To order a separate phone line, contact the UH Athletics Communications Office.

### VISITING RADIO INFORMATION »

The official radio broadcast network for the opposing team must be designated in writing by the visiting team's athletic director or sports information director. For information on radio lines, contact Athletics Communications Assistant Director Jamie Zarda at (713) 743-9406.



## 2011 SEASON PREVIEW

Head volleyball coach Molly Alvey is eagerly waiting Aug. 26 when she can begin her second season at the helm of the Cougar volleyball program. Houston returns First Team All-Conference selections Lucy Charuk and Chandace Tryon and welcomes seven newcomers to the program. With a wealth of talent and experience in her second season, Alvey recently sat down to take a look back on the last year and look forward to what she sees as a successful upcoming season.

### What have you learned about your team and program in the last year?

"At the beginning of this season, I took time to reflect on where we were when I got here. We are light-years ahead of that point. It feels good to know that you are doing the right things while being surrounded by the right people."

"The biggest lesson or insight I've gained for myself is that when you're training mentality and teaching a culture of change, it is an everyday thing. We, as a staff, cannot take a break and think that our players and the program will grow and mature in this area on their own. If we take a break at any moment, then it's very easy for the program to fall back. I don't think that's a bad thing. I just think it's something we have learned through this process. Culture change is ongoing. Hopefully, we continue to get better by working on the fine details in this area of our development."

### The team made a huge turnaround in 2010 finishing with a 19-13 record and a third-place finish in Conference USA. How do you build off that in 2011?

"One of the main components to improving is scheduling. As we were going through last season and we were winning and competing well, I thought we must play tough competition in 2011. This season we're playing four top-25 teams and three top-60 teams, so that helps us prepare. In a way there is a little more at stake because we know we can win those matches. We will only get better by playing better competition. I am very excited for us and the competition ahead."

"Secondly, we need to approach conference differently. It's very clear from last season that we need to go in with the mindset that we must win the conference title in order to get into the NCAA Tournament. There is no taking a break mentally. We continue to get stronger physically. We have to go in preparing for two solid matches every single weekend."

### What do you hope to have learned about your team following the non-conference portion of the schedule?

"There are a few things that we have to learn during the non-conference portion of our schedule. We have to learn that regardless of who we play, preparation for every match should be exactly the same. We have been training all preseason how to mentally prepare for practice. If we have kept this focus, then we will be prepared for every one of our opponents come competition time."

"I would also like us to learn how to eliminate point runs which will be a really quick check in non-conference play. If you allow the competition we are playing a point run it's over. We will be facing good competition that is not going to give you five points in a row, catching up is difficult with rally scoring."

"With those two points being made, I would like us to learn how to play good, strong volleyball point for point. It's preparing from the start the

same way every single match and finishing all the way to the end. Any slight break against any of our non-conference opponents is a loss. If we learn that lesson early and take it into conference play we will go a long way."

### How important is it to open the season at home, especially with a tournament like the Flo Hyman Collegiate Cup?

"It's great to be at home the first weekend of the season. You come out of training camp being able to take those two and a half weeks and put that in front of your fans. It's an unbelievably competitive tournament that we are hosting. Among all four of us, anyone can win or lose in any given match. Last year our fans were amazing; we really had a lot of repeat fans that have joined the bandwagon and they saw the amazing things we're doing and how fun volleyball is to watch. To be able to give our product to the fans on the first weekend is exciting."

"One important thing to me about the opening weekend is that we were able to name our tournament the Flo Hyman Collegiate Cup. Flo Hyman was not only a great athlete but she was one of the best volleyball players in the entire world. While she was playing, people in the volleyball world would still know her name and recognize how she changed the game. To be able to have this tournament at home, in Flo's name, is really special to me. Hopefully we can get share our history with our fans and celebrate in the tradition of our athletic history at UH."

### Talk about how you see the conference portion of the season playing out.

"Conference USA should be really strong again. The league is interesting in that there seems to be a lot of variation from year to year. Tulsa has had a coaching change, but they have a very good coach coming in that has won and has been successful so they'll continue to be strong. SMU is returning almost everybody, and Rice will always be competition for us since they are our neighbors. Conference USA is unique in that there is a large group of teams that have ongoing competitiveness. On any given day any of those teams can win a match. That's why you always have to be on in conference play."

### Fans will notice an exhibition match against the Israeli national team. How did that come about and what made you want to compete against them?

"My trips abroad this summer have really opened up this opportunity. All of a sudden we are in the mix of universities that are doing pretty well. As the face of the program, I am trying to get our name out in the volleyball community. Since I've been involved with USA volleyball, the Israeli National Team thought enough of us to bring the team to Houston for a match while they are in Texas. They are also playing Texas A&M and Texas, so we're with major universities as a part of that is amazing event."

"The most exciting part of it all is the connection between the Israel National Team and the University of Houston. The head coach of the Israeli National Team, Arie Selinger, was the head coach for the US National Team back in the late 70s and 80s. He coached our Houston Olympians on the USA National Team, and they trained here at UH in Garrison Gym. At that time, USA was one of the best teams in the world and won a silver medal in the 1984 Olympics. To have that connection and tradition and to be able to bring it back to our fans is amazing."

### The main pieces to your team return this year

### -- Lucy Charuk, Chandace Tryon and Stephanie Nwachukwu. What do you expect to see out of them this season?

"Lucy has a lot of weight on her shoulders this year. She's been a premier player in the conference and a great player for us, so I expect her to take charge of this team and to command what we need to accomplish. There is really no reason that she shouldn't be an All-Conference player again, which I know is one of her goals. She has the ability to be an All-American if she chooses that for herself. Lucy's role on this team is invaluable. We tend to rely on seniors a lot but the best thing about Lucy is that she's ready for that. She has shown that throughout the summer by keeping in contact with her teammates even though she's been playing with the Canadian National Team. She has a true sense of responsibility for her team and even though we demand a lot of her, she's comfortable with that role. We expect her to be our leader."

"Chandace led the conference in hitting percentage last season and she's a First Team All-Conference player. For her it's time to take the next step. Now instead of helping us beat conference teams, how does she help us beat top 25 teams? That's her role stepping in this season. She's going to be a junior and has had significant playing time for two years so if she can take what she's done already and step it up another level or two, she will be a huge piece to making this team. If she gets that much better, the team gets exponentially better. She is one of the ones that works the hardest on the team, so I know that is something that is within her capabilities."

"Last year, Stephanie finally got a sense of having a role on the team. She's a pretty raw player but she has some intangibles that are invaluable. She has a natural knack for blocking which you cannot teach. She has a whip of an arm, and she has bought into what we are doing here at Houston. She's had a couple of skills that have just locked into her repertoire because she has been very focused this past spring and the summer. However good Stephanie is in any given match can really change the dynamic of the team. The positive with Stephanie is that she realizes that, and she's ready for the challenge."

### Ingrida Zauere is also a senior this season and has the most experience at the outside hitter position. What do you want to see from her this season?

"Ingrida is one of the more skilled volleyball players on the team. She has played for a long time and has a skill and knowledge of the game that is important to the program. To have that sort of knowledge on a team of raw players is a huge piece to our core. She can do things on the team that a coach can't necessarily teach. It is skill development over time, which is a great example for the team. We will rely on her as a senior."

### How do you see Ashley Applequist stepping up at outside hitter this season?

"Ashley is a multi-dimensional player, she plays both outside and right side. She's always working hard whether I'm watching or not. She's an outstanding student-athlete, and she is a phenomenal teammate. Her thought processes and her focus are always on the team and never about herself. It's amazing. With the effort and time she has put in the gym, she should be fighting and pushing for time."

### One question you have regarding the team at this point is the setter position. Who have you brought in to fill that void and how do you see

### that playing out in the preseason?

"Caitlin Ogletree joins the program as a true freshman. She's played at a very high level of in high school and club and she brings the mentality that I'm trying to breed here at Houston. She's a fighter and a competitor and a true teammate. She will be one of the setters fighting for a starting position."

"Chelsey Harding is transferring in from San Jacinto Junior College and will have three years left of eligibility. She also has competed at a high level in club. Caitlin and Chelsea are both extremely relentless competitors. They both hate losing, but they have really upbeat personalities."

"They will be fighting for the starting position along with Esther Longoria. Esther is a little bit more of a multi-dimensional player, so I need her fighting for a setter position and defensive position. She is very good at both. She has a phenomenal platform and is a tremendous athlete. She makes the gym immediately better by having her in either role."

"The setter position is pretty competitive. We haven't had three setters in the gym before. They all know that every day is going to be a competition. I feel pretty strong about that position. Everything I view as a coach is pretty much through the setter's eyes since that's the position I played. For me, to have fresh young people that want to learn and that I can train outside of practice is really exciting to me."

### You also have to replace a four-year starter in Amanda Carson at libero this season. Do you see a veteran stepping up this season or do you think a freshman will jump in to that starting position?

"We return three veterans in Alex Edwards, Krysta DeAngelis and Meredith Ware. They've been training under my system for a year now, so they understand my demands from that position and how important of a role it is. We added a new twist this year by bringing Natalie Keck in to the mix. Natalie has played for one of the best club teams and one of the top-five high school programs in the country. She understands work ethic, is one of the most mentally tough athletes I know and is another great teammate. When you put the four of them in the mix for that role then there will be some tough competition."

### Seven newcomers are joining the team this fall. What roles do you see them taking this season?

"There is no reason that Katie Norris shouldn't be standing out this season. She played two years in the SEC, where half of the conference is in the top 25. The experience that she brings is untouchable. There is no reason that she is not a face that we will be seeing. She brings a fierce personality to the game. She understands my coaching style and demands so she's definitely one that will be noticed."

"Courtney Smith is a raw Houston talent who will most likely redshirt this year. She is a good athlete but needs some time to develop and strengthen a little bit. In the long run she will help us out in the middle."

"Kadi (Kullerkann) is definitely another player to look out for. At 6-4 there is not a lot you can't do on the volleyball court. Just being that size allows you to do so many things physically at the net, regardless of any other skill. On top of that she brings a competitive mindset on our gym. She'll bring a different style than what our fans are used, to seeing but she is a tall, powerful volleyball player with a huge presence at the net. I expect her to compete to be in the mix for playing time."

**MOLLY ALVEY**  
**HEAD COACH**  
**Second Season at Houston**  
**Centre College, 2001**

Molly Alvey is entering her second season as head volleyball coach at the University of Houston after taking over the program on Jan. 25, 2010. She came to Houston after spending five seasons as an assistant coach at Ole Miss, including her final two as the associate head coach.

Following her first season as head coach, Alvey guided the Cougars to a third-place finish in Conference USA with a 13-7 record. It was the program's first top three finish since 2005, and the 13 C-USA wins were also the most in league play since 1999.

In addition, Alvey tutored All-C-USA first-team selections Lucy Charuk and Chandace Tryon. Charuk went on to be named an AVCA Honorable Mention while earning a spot as an AVCA Midwest All-Region selection. She also earned a spot on the Canadian National Team during the summer of 2010.

Not only did Alvey have success on the court in her first season at UH, but she also guided the program to a 3.37 GPA during the 2010-11 school year, the highest departmental GPA and the best in program history. That success earned the team the AVCA Team Academic Award.

Following her first season at the helm of the Houston volleyball program, Alvey continued to hone her coaching skills by being selected to serve as a coach for Team USA at the China-USA Challenge Invitational in Beijing in the summer of 2011. She followed that up by serving as a coach on the A2 Junior National Team at the European Global Challenge in Pula, Croatia.

**AT OLE MISS**

In her five seasons at Ole Miss, Alvey was a key component in the Rebels success as she helped guide Ole Miss to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances in 2006 and 2007 and a pair of record setting seasons those same years.

In that time, Alvey was responsible for coaching All-SEC setter Rachel Kieckhaefer who garnered the honor in 2007 and 2008 while also picking up AVCA All-Region Honorable Mention honors as a junior. She also played a part in developing All-SEC selection Jaclyn Toohey as well as SEC All-Freshman selections Jackie Jones, Regina Thomas and Whitney Craven. As recruiting coordinator, Alvey also was key in securing the nation's 23rd-ranked recruiting class in 2009.

In 2006, the Rebels advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history while tying the school record for conference wins in a season with 10. Ole Miss then advanced to the NCAA Tournament for a second-straight season in 2007 with a 25-9 mark on the year and a record-setting 14 wins in SEC play. The Rebels finished third in the Southeastern Conference and second in the Western Division that season while posting the first 20-win season since 1989.

**AT SOUTHERN INDIANA**

During just one season at Southern Indiana as head coach, Alvey took the Screaming Eagles to excellence and set an example for what she expects out of a volleyball team.

Her 2004 squad finished the regular season 24-7 claiming the Great Lakes Valley Conference regular-season title with a 15-1 conference record. After winning the regular season title, Southern Indiana then stormed through the conference tournament to earn the program's second-ever NCAA Division II Tournament berth, advancing to the second round.

In her time at USI, Alvey coached two All-Region selections and the program's second All-America selection in Laura Ellerbusch.

**AT TEMPLE**

During her three years as a graduate assistant coach at Temple, Alvey was part of a program that posted an overall record of 72-25 (.742), claimed an Atlantic 10 Championship and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in 2002.

The Owls finished as A-10 Conference Runners-Up in 2001 and 2003.

Alvey was also a part of a coaching staff that coached A-10 Player of the Year Xu Yun in 2002, and two-time A-10 Setter of the Year in Allison Runk in 2002 and 2003. The Temple coaching staff also produced eight All-Conference First Team selections in those three seasons.

**AT CENTRE COLLEGE**

As a setter at Centre College, Alvey lettered all four seasons and held the Centre College career record for assists with 4,340 at the time of her graduation and helped lead her team to an 82-59 overall record in that time.

In her time at Centre, Alvey stood out on the court, being named as an All-SCAC Third Team selection in her junior season and a First Team selection in her senior season. She also helped Centre rank fourth nationally in digs-per-game.

Alvey also played basketball for Centre and was an All-SCAC Second Team selection as a senior. She holds the single-season three-point percentage record as she hit .456 in the 2000-01 season.

In his role as assistant coach, Vencl will serve as the team’s travel coordinator and will restructure the program’s utilization of video for training and scouting in addition to on-court training and recruiting.

“Our plan for Steve is to grow and develop our teaching methods by advancing the application of our video systems for training,” Alvey added. “He will also play an integral role in recruiting.”

Prior to coming to Houston, Vencl served as the volunteer assistant coach at Marquette during the 2010 season. That year the program set the school record for wins (23) and conference wins (11) and posted a school-record 14-match win streak. They finished third in the Big East standings, and Vencl coached three players to AVCA All-Region honors.

He also assisted with the implementation of practice plans and provided daily position training to the middle hitters, outside hitters, right-side hitters and the defensive specialists while at Marquette. In his role as volunteer assistant, Vencl also was responsible for all opponent video breakdown and the execution of the weekly video exchange.

Prior to his time at Marquette, Vencl was the assistant coach at Baldwin-Wallace College where he assisted with the daily organization and planning of practice. He also provided individual training to the middle and outside hitters. In addition, Vencl was responsible for scouting and compiling game plans. He also assisted with the development of the strength and conditioning program and coordinated all home match management duties.

Vencl was also the head coach of the Toledo men’s volleyball club from 2005-2006. While in that position he managed all try-outs, practices and matches. He also developed the strength and conditioning program and managed the team’s administration including, team travel and equipment and uniform purchases. He was a member of the team from 1999-2002.

He has also served as a club coach with the Cleveland Volleyball Company and the Toledo Volleyball Club and was an assistant coach at St. Ursula Academy in Toledo, Ohio.

Vencl received a bachelor of arts from the University of Toledo.

## NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

Entering its 40th season of volleyball, the University of Houston has become known as one of the more consistent programs in the country.

Since volleyball became a competition sport in 1972, Houston is one of just a handful of programs in the nation to have racked up more than twenty 20-win seasons and 20 national postseason tournament appearances.

Beginning with its inaugural postseason appearance in 1972, the Cougars compiled seven other AIAW National appearances, highlighted by a third place finish in 1975.

In 1989, former head coach Bill Walton led the Cougars to its first NCAA appearance and followed that up with an N.I.V.C Championship in 1990.

Houston made ten consecutive NCAA appearances from 1991-2000 that included the Cougars magical run to the Elite Eight in 1994.

# 1994 NCAA ELITE EIGHT TEAM

### NCAA Elite Eight

This one was for the books.

The record books, the scrapbooks and the history books.

The 1994 Houston volleyball program burst back into the national spotlight with its first Southwest Conference regular season and postseason championships that ended Texas' 12-year reign, a stunning 26-7 record that included a school-record 17-match winning streak and one of the top seeds in the NCAA Tournament, where the Cougars came within a single match of reaching the Final Four.

The 1994 campaign also included a wealth of success in the classroom. Houston totaled one Academic All-American and three members of the SWC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll.

It didn't take long to figure out what kind of season was in store for the team. The Cougars opened the season on road against No. 5 Ohio State after the Buckeyes had just defeated Long Beach State, the defending national champions, the week before in Los Angeles. Undaunted, the Cougars rolled into Columbus and promptly upset OSU 3-2, setting a tone that would last the rest of the season.

Houston was led in that match by Lilly Denoon-Chester, who racked up 24 kills on a .429 hitting percentage, 14 digs and six blocks. It was the first of many dominating performances by the 6-0 middle blocker from California. It also was the first glimpse of what would be a season-long theme for the team. Denoon-Chester would be the visible force on the court while the other players, going two and even three deep into the bench, turned in quiet but solid performances to led UH to victories.

No sooner had the team begun to make a little noise than a trip to Flagstaff, Ariz. and its 7,000 feet of altitude caught the Cougars off-guard. Cal-State Northridge, who would go on to win the NIVC postseason tournament along host Northern Arizona both defeated UH on the same day. A team meeting that night helped the team refocus for a match the next day against Great Midwest Conference champion Memphis.

The Cougars dominated the match 3-0 and set a new tone for the season. Clearly the team had enough of losing. It was the first win of what later became know as "the streak". After those two losses on Sept. 16, Houston didn't lose again for another seven weeks, 17 matches in all. The team set a school record for consecutive wins and won an incredible 54 of 62 games during "the streak".

On Sept. 28, Houston traveled to Austin to face No. 11 Texas in front of over 1,800 fans. After coasting to a 15-6 win in game one, the Cougars battled to a dramatic 18-16 victory in the second game. Houston pulled out game three 15-11 to claim a 3-0 sweep and Walton's first win against the Longhorns in 19 matches. Denoon-Chester smacked a match-high 15 kills, but it was the play of Nashika Stokes (8 kills and 10 digs), Emily Leffers (7 kills), Carla Maul (6 kills and 18 digs) and Marie-Claude Tourillon (4 kills and 8 blocks) that won the match.

The Cougars rolled into Lubbock with a No. 25 ranking the following week and hung on to snap Texas Tech's 24-match Rec Center win streak with a 3-2 win.

On Oct. 12, the Cougars won their seventh match in a row over Texas A&M at Hofheinz Pavilion to complete the first round of SWC competition undefeated. In one of the most hard-fought contests of the year, the Cougars prevailed for a 17-15, 19-17, 15-7 win that lasted almost two hours.

Ten days later, nearly 2,000 fans were on hand at Hofheinz Pavilion for the Cougars' rematch with Texas, which was broadcast nationwide on cable-TV's Prime Network. The Cougars pushed their winning streak to 10 matches and swept the season series with a 3-1 win against the No. 19 Longhorns to improve to 7-0 in the SWC. Tourillon and Leffers combined for 25 kills on 47 swings, while Denoon-Chester popped a match-high 18 kills.

Houston returned to Hofheinz Pavilion the next afternoon and knocked off regionally-ranked Arkansas State. The Cougars clinched a share of the SWC regular season title with a convincing 3-0 sweep of Texas Tech. The Houston offense cranked a .384 attack percentage in the win.

The following weekend Houston swept Tennessee for its straight win, setting up a clash with No. 19 Georgia in what was one of the most anticipated matches of the season. The Cougars shut down the explosive UGA offense, holding the Bulldogs to just an .080 hitting percentage in the 3-0 sweep. Denoon-Chester once again outdueled Priscilla Pacheco, outhitting the UGA All-American .682 to .163.

On Nov. 2 at Autry Court, Houston clinched the SWC regular season championship outright, defeating Rice. The Cougars' bid for an undefeated SWC crown fell short as Texas A&M defeated No. 17 Houston 3-1 in College Station.

Houston saw the Aggies again in the SWC Tournament championship. Not to be denied, Sami Sawyer set a balanced attack as four Cougars recorded double-digit kills. Denoon-Chester earned All-SWC First-Team honors and was selected the league's Player of the Year. Tourillon won SWC Newcomer of the Year and notched an All-SWC Second-Team selection, while Sawyer and Leffers also were named to the All-SWC Second Team.

The Cougars headed west for a pair of matches against No. 6 Long Beach State and No. 9 UC-Santa Barbara. Denoon-Chester remained in Houston with an illness as Houston lost back-to-back matches for the first time in over two months.

The team returned to Houston and found out the next day that even though it was the No. 1 ranked team in the South Region that it wouldn't host the regional finals should it advance. The Cougars would have to be content with a second-round home matchup Clemson. It was the second straight year that Houston would open the NCAA Tournament with the Tigers.

History repeated itself as the Cougars rolled to 3-0 sweep against Clemson. It marked Houston's 15th consecutive home win and 23rd straight win in the city of Houston dating back to the 1993 season.

The Cougars took their 25-6 record back to the University of Florida with a chance to make the Final Four. Having faced nationally-ranked teams in hostile environments all season, No. 17 Houston would take on No. 14 Florida in the Sweet 16.

The Gators claimed the first game 15-13, but Houston silenced the 1,500 fans at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center in taking the next three games. Denoon-Chester put the Cougars on her back with 10 kills in a pivotal game three as Houston snapped Florida's home winning that had reached 60 matches.

Houston's dream of a Final Four in Austin ended against No. 3 UCLA in front of another nationally-televised audience and didn't start playing the way it had all season until after falling behind by two games.

Denoon-Chester went on to be named All-America Second Team, while Heidi Sticksel picked up Academic All-America recognition. Tourillon joined Denoon-Chester on the AVCA All-South Region First Team. Walton, who could only manage a Co-Coach of the Year in the SWC, was later rewarded with South Region Coach of the Year by the AVCA.

### 1994 Team Highlights

- Houston opened the season defeating No. 5 Ohio State, 3-2. The Buckeyes were coming off an upset of the defending National Champions, Long Beach State.
- The Cougars won their first Southwest Conference regular season and conference tournament title.
- Head coach Bill Walton recorded his first win over Texas in 19 tries with a 3-0 defeat of the Longhorns in Austin. Houston also won the rematch in Houston, 3-1.
- Lilly Denoon-Chester was named the SWC Player of the Year while Marie-Claude Tourillon was the Newcomer of the Year.
- Walton was named the SWC Co-Head Coach of the Year as well as the South Region Coach of the Year.
- In the classroom, Heidi Sticksel was named an Academic All-America.
