SETTING THE SCENE:

Its the home finale for UIC as they welcome cross-town rival Loyola to the UIC Pavilion for a 3:00 p.m. (Fox Sports Net, ESPN Radio 1000) tip. The Flames, who are 10-2 at home this year, have won their last three games, matching their longest winning streak of the season. Loyola dropped a tough decision at Detroit on Thursday night, but is looking for its first season sweep of UIC since the 1987-88 campaign. The Flames, who lead the all-time series 15-8, have dominated the Ramblers of late at the Pavilion, winning their last 10 contests versus Loyola at home.

FOLLOWING THE FLAMES:

The Flames received 38 points from their bench and got a strong performance from starting point guard Martell Bailey as they held off UW-Green Bay, 75-67, on Feb. 9. The win was UIC's third straight, which tied its longest such streak of the season. Bailey paced the Flames with 17 points and a career-high tying seven rebounds. Reserve guard Jonathan Schneiderman continued his recent hot shooting en route to tying for team-best honors with 17 points while Armond Williams gave UIC a spark off the bench with 13 points and six rebounds. The Flames rebounded from a tough first half to shoot 54% from the field in the second stanza.

HEAD COACH JIMMY COLLINS:

Head Coach Jimmy Collins is in his sixth season at the helm of the UIC men's basketball program. During his tenure with the Flames, Collins has compiled a record of 82-91 and earned co-conference coach of the year honors in 1997, his first season at UIC. Collins, who previously served 13 years as an assistant coach under Lou Henson at Illinois where he helped lead the Illini to the 1989 Final Four, guided the Flames to their most successful season in school history in 1998. During the campaign, UIC posted 22 wins en route to a share of the conference regular season title and its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Collins, a former first-round pick of the Chicago Bulls, enjoyed a standout playing career at New Mexico State where he averaged 20.1 ppg as an Aggie. He earned All-American honors as a senior after leading New Mexico State to the Final Four.

MEET THE RAMBLERS:

Record: 14-10, 8-5/T-3rd Horizon League

Head Coach: Larry Farmer

Outlook: Loyola, which was picked for a ninth-place finish in the Horizon League preseason poll, has proved many people wrong as they currently sit in a tie for third in the league with Detroit. The Ramblers started Horizon League action by winning their first six games, but have now won just two of their last eight. Loyola is paced on the floor by junior David Bailey, the older brother of UIC's Martell Bailey. David is the league's leading scorer, averaging 21.6 points per game, which also ranks him among the top 10 scoring leaders in the country. The Ramblers also receive plenty of help inside from Ryan Blankson, who is averaging a team-best 9.8 rebounds per contest and Corey Minnifield, who is tallying 8.1 ppg.

THE SERIES: (UIC leads 15-8)

Despite losing to Loyola earlier in the season, UIC still owns the edge in the all-time series, having taken 15 of the 23 prior meetings between the two schools. The Flames have done well versus the Ramblers under head coach Jimmy Collins, going 8-3 against Loyola under his guidance. UIC has been especially dominant at home in the series, taking the last 10 contests at the Pavilion.

LAST TIME WE MET:

Loyola 76, UIC 65

Jan. 17, 2002 (Gentile Center)

Despite a career night from sophomore Cedrick Banks, Loyola took round one of the city rivalry on Jan. 17 with a 76-65 triumph in front of 4,539 at the Joseph J. Gentile Center. Banks registered a double-double with a career-high 32 points (12-for-20 FG, 3-for-5 3PT) and 10 rebounds, but it was not enough as UIC dropped its second straight to fall to 2-3 in the Horizon League. Loyola point guard David Bailey (21 points, 6 rebounds) fared well in the touted inaugural match-up with his brother Martell (7 points, 7 assists) to keep the Ramblers (10-5, 5-0) in sole possession of first place in the league.

BENCH HELP:

UIC got a big boost from its bench on Feb. 9 as the reserves totaled 38 points in the Flames' 75-67 win over UW-Green Bay. Guard Jonathan Schneiderman popped for 17 points, connecting on 6-of-9 field goal attempts while forward Armond Williams gave the Flames a spark with 13 points and six rebounds. UIC also received strong efforts from Aaron Carr (5 points, 4 assists) and Kyle Kickert (3 points, 3 rebounds).

LITTLE BIG MAN:

Despite his 5-foot-10 stature, sophomore Martell Bailey has stepped up big of late for the Flames. In his last two games, Bailey has paced UIC to victory averaging 10.3 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game while shooting 52% from the field. Bailey started his hot streak with a 14-point, eight-assist, seven-rebound effort versus leagu-leading UW-Milwaukee, which he capped by banking in a game-winning 24-footer at the buzzer. He then backed that up with a team-high 17-point, seven-rebound effort in the Flames win over UW-Green Bay.

OFF THE SCNEID:

Junior Jonathan Schneiderman has got back into a groove offensively of late, averaging 15.8 ppg and shooting 65% from the field in his last four contests. Schneiderman had ice water in his veins in the second half of UIC's comeback win over UW-Milwaukee on Feb. 7, nailing five three pointers, including two in the last 90 seconds. The Forreston, Ill., native, started his run at Cleveland State on Feb. 2 with 16 points, before coming off the bench to net 15 in the Flames' triumph at Youngstown State on Feb. 4. In the team's last game, Schneiderman connected on 6-of-9 shots from the field en route to a team-high 17 points in a win over UW-Green Bay. For the season, Schneiderman is now averaging 9.5 ppg, third-best on the team.

CAREER DAY:

Sophomore Cedrick Banks had his best night in a UIC uniform on Jan. 17 versus Loyola, tallying a career-best 32 points and 10 rebounds for his second double-double of the season. Banks was 12-for-20 from the field and 3-for-5 from three-point range while also pilfering two steals in the contest.

TALK ABOUT A WEST SIDE STORY:

Former Westinghouse High School teammates Martell Bailey and Cedrick Banks showed why they were such highly touted recruits on Feb. 7 as they led UIC to a come-from-behind 73-71 win over league-leading UW-Milwaukee. The duo combined for 36 points, 15 rebounds and 11 assists with Bailey sending the fans home happy with a game-winning 24-footer at the buzzer. Banks finished with a game-high 22 points and eight rebounds while Bailey tallied 14 points, eight assists and a career-best seven boards.

COLLINS AMONG UIC'S BEST:

With the win over Youngstown State on Jan. 21, UIC Head Coach Jimmy Collins moved into fourth in the UIC record books for career coaching victories with 78, passing former Flames coach Tom Meyer (1977-83). Bob Hallberg's 133 career victories is the most in UIC history.

With just over two weeks remaining in the regular season, senior Jordan Kardos finds himself ranked fifth in the country in three-point field goal accuracy. The Northbrook, Ill., native also leads the Horizon League, connecting on 49.2% of his trifecta attempts.

HOME SWEET HOME:

UIC has found much success at home this season, posting a 10-2 record at the UIC Pavilion. This is nothing new for the Flames, who own an all-time record of 187-76 (.709) at the Pavilion. Their best season ever at home was the 1997-98 campaign, which saw UIC go 13-1 with wins over Michigan State and Illinois State.

HITTING 1,000:

With a jumper at the 7:13 mark of the second half versus Cleveland State on Feb. 2, senior Jordan Kardos became the 16th player in UIC history to reach the 1,000-point plateau. Kardos, who now owns 1,042 points for his career, ranks in 15th-place on the all-time scoring list, six points behind Larry Frey (1965-69). Kenny Williams (1990-94) is the Flames' all-time leading scorer with 2,025 career points.

KILLING CLEVELAND:

It would be suprising if Jordan Kardos' name didn't find its way on an all-Horizon League ballot from Cleveland State coaches after his two performances versus the Vikings this season. In the team's two meetinds, Kardos has tabbed 52 points and 13 rebounds. In game one of the season series at UIC on Jan. 5, the Northbrook, Ill., native tabbed 25 points and a career-best seven rebounds. He then topped that with a career-high 27 points and six rebounds at Cleveland State on Feb. 2.

SUPER SOPH:

Sophomore point guard Martell Bailey played the role of scorer and distributor on Jan. 26 versus Butler as he tallied a career-high 21 points while also handing out seven assists with just one turnover. Bailey was 6-for-13 from the field and 9-for-15 from the foul line en route to his career day, which bested his 14-point outing at Southern Illinois on Nov. 29.

MONDAY MAGIC:

The Flames have found Monday's to be just fine in Horizon League play as they are 3-0, notching a pair of wins over Youngstown State and one over Wright State on three successive Monday's.

FILLING IN NICELY:

Sophomore Jabari Harris did a fine job filling in for injured center Thor Solverson in the Flames' 68-66 win over Wright State on Jan. 28. Harris tallied a career-high 13 points with 11 coming in the opening half as UIC opened up an early lead. He also snagged three rebounds in the game.

DOUBLING UP:

Senior Cory Little entered the 2001-02 season with just five double-digit scoring games in his career. Little has passed his career output with nine double-digit scoring games this season. His career-best 18-point effort vesus Detroit on Thursday, Jan. 31, was also Little's fifth-straight double-figure scoring night, a first in his career.

LIGHTING IT UP:

UIC was scorching the nets in its triumph over Youngstown State on Jan. 21. The Flames shot a blistering 60% from the field - 71% in the first half - while connecting on a season-high 69% of their three-point attempts. UIC's three-point percentage was the eighth-highest posted by any NCAA Division I team this season and fell just short of the school record (.692) set back in 2000 versus UT-San Antonio. The Flames have now shot 50% or better from the field in eight games this year and 60% or better in three contests.

50% FG = W:

The 50% mark from the field has been the key to victory for the Flames this season as they are 8-0 when hitting at least half of their field goal attempts. UIC connected on 54% of its shots in its Feb. 4 win over Youngstown State.

SIGNED ON THE DOTTED LINE:

UIC announced the signing of a pair of junior college standouts, Richard Lesko and Josip Petrusic, to national letters of intent on the second day of the early signing period. Lesko and Petrusic, who will join the Flames lineup for the 2002-03 campaign, originally hail from overseas, as Lekso is a native of Slovakia while Petrusic came to the United States from Croatia. Lesko is currently in his second year at Danville Junior College in Danville, Ill. The 6-foot-8, 215-pound wing player helped the Jaguars to the 2001 Region 24 championship and a fourth-place finish in the NJCAA Nation Tournament. Petrusic (6-foot-10, 240lb.) is in his second season at Treasure Valley Community College in Ontario, Ore., where he averaged 12 points and eight rebounds per game last season.

Chicago, Ill. - Preseason expectations were high for head coach Jimmy Collins and the UIC men's basketball team.

On Sunday night at the UIC Pavilion, the Flames (1-0) arguably exceeded those expectations in an impressive 70-54 victory over Indiana State (0-1), a team that advanced into the second round of the NCAA Tournament last season, in front of 4,170 in attendance.

"This was a total team effort," said Collins of the win. "Everyone contributed in a positive manner. Everyone had a lot of energy against a very tough team and we came out and answered the bell."

The highly anticipated regular season debut of sophomores Cedrick Banks and Martell Bailey was well worth the wait.

Banks came off the bench for the Flames and scored 12 points, while Bailey played the role of distributor, delivering a game-high 11 assists, to go along with nine points.

Junior sharpshooter Jonathan Schneiderman led the Flames in scoring with 14 points, including three of his four three-pointers coming in the pivotal first half.

"I made it a point to be in shape this season knowing I'd be playing with these guys (Bailey and Banks)," Schneiderman said. "Coach gives me the opportunity to run through screens and when I do that Martell and Cedrick will find you."

After Indiana State's Kelyn Block hit a jumper with 14:13 left in the first half to make it 12-9 in favor of the Sycamores, UIC went on a 25-7 run to open up the game. The Flames forced Indiana State into nine first-half turnovers, converting them into 11 points.

It was more of the same in the second-half, as Bailey and Schneiderman orchestrated the offense to near perfection, while the Flames board-game excelled, finishing the game with 19 offensive rebounds to Indiana State's six.

"The miracle midgets came through for us both offensively and defensively," said Collins of Bailey and Schneiderman. "They really exhibited leadership out there for us."

Block led the Sycamores with 15 points on the evening, while UIC's Thor Solverson added 10 points.

There was one bit of misfortune for the Flames on the night, as junior forward Joe Scott left 90 seconds into the game with a right knee injury on a dunk attempt. Scott will be evaluated further on Monday.

Chicago, Ill. - On the eve of Thanksgiving, the UIC men's basketball team feasted on St. Joseph's (Ind.) College, carving up the Pumas for a 96-53 victory in front of 2,215 fans at the UIC Pavilion.

Sophomore forward Armond Williams led UIC with 14 points and seven rebounds, while teammates Jonathan Schneiderman (11 points, 3-for-3 3PT FG) and Jordan Kardos (10 points, 2-for-2 3PT FG) each turned in solid performances.

With the win, the Flames improve to 2-0 on the season while the Pumas, the 20th ranked team in Division II, fall to 0-2. This is the first time UIC has enjoyed a 2-0 start to a campaign since the 1997-98 season in which the Flames started 3-0 and eventually earned a share of the conference regular-season title and their first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament.

"We haven't been 2-0 in a long time," UIC senior center Thor Solverson said. "With Evansville, Southern (Illinois) and Old Dominion ahead, we know we have our work cut out for us.

"But we're confident we can keep things going."

UIC jumped out early in the contest and never looked back, taking a 30-point lead (55-25) into intermission. The Flames shot a blistering 64% in the opening stanza and were led by Schneiderman, who tallied all 11 of his points, going 3-for-3 from behind the three-point line.

UIC's 43-point triumph was its most lopsided since the 1987-88 season when they downed Northeastern Illinois, 108-66. Each player on the roster, including the walk-ons, scored for the Flames on Wednesday night.

"We've been on the other side of games like this before," UIC head coach Jimmy Collins said. "It was nice that we were able to give everyone a chance to play tonight."

Chicago, Illinois - Much of the preseason hype this year regarding the UIC men's basketball team has revolved around prized recruits, sophomores Cedrick Banks and Martell Bailey.

On this night, though, it was two of head coach Jimmy Collins' original recruits, senior's Cory Little and Thor Solverson, that helped guide the Flames to a nail-biting 64-61 victory over Evansville in front of 2,509 at the UIC Pavilion.

Solverson tallied a team-high 14 points and seven rebounds while Little, who led the Flames with seven rebounds, came up big for UIC down the stretch, netting seven of his 11 points in the final five minutes of the contest.

"Down the stretch we kept our composure and we are able to get the things done we wanted to do," Little said

The Flames (3-0) trailed the Purple Aces (1-3) by six points, 59-53, with 4:54 left when Little took control.

The 6-foot-5 forward splashed in a jumper to pull UIC to within four. Then after Solverson split a pair of free throws to cut the lead to three, Little scored five unanswered points, giving the Flames a 61-59 advantage.

Evansville would narrow the lead down again on a pair of free throws by Clint Cuffle, but Solverson got the Flames back up by four, turning a nifty pass from Jonathan Schneiderman into a three-point play for a 64-61 lead that would stand.

The Purple Aces would get one final look at the basket, as Jordan Watson, who had made five previous three-pointers, saw his trifecta attempt go long as time expired.

Watson led Evansville with a game-high 17 points while Clint Cuffle added 14 and Ian Hanavan chipped in with 11.

Banks was the other Flame to finish in double figures, recording 11 points on the night. Martell Bailey was limited to just 12 minutes of action after injuring his tailbone in the second half.

"Tonight's game was one of those games you learn a lot from," Collins said after the contest. "I guess you play a well coached team with players that come out and play hard, to win is good."

With the win, UIC is now 3-0 for the first time since the 1997-98 season in which the Flames shared the regular-season conference title and made their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

Carbondale, Ill. – The UIC men’s basketball team found life away from the Pavilion to be less than hospitable Thursday night, falling 76-68 in its road debut at Southern Illinois.

In front of 3,592 hostile fans at SIU Arena, the Flames (3-1) fell behind early and never took the lead from the Salukis (5-1), shooting a season-low 36% from the field on the night.

Sophomore Martell Bailey led UIC with a career-high 14 points (6-for-8 FG) while senior Thor Solverson collected the first double-double of his collegiate tenure with 10 points and a team-best 10 rebounds. Junior Jonathan Schneiderman also netted 13 for the Flames, hitting 3-of-5 from behind the three-point line.

Southern Illinois’ Kent Williams led four Salukis in double figures with a game-high 21 points, hitting 11-of-16 from the charity stripe. Forward Jermaine Dearman posted a double-double with 13 points and 11 boards for SIU.

The heated contest between two athletic teams saw 50 personal and seven technical fouls called. All seven technicals were issued in the second half as SIU center Roland Roberts was tossed after getting his second with 2:53 left before UIC head coach Jimmy Collins exited after getting teed twice with :23 remaining.

The Salukis owned a 34-28 lead at the half as UIC, which missed its first six shots of the stanza, was held to just 30% (9-for-30) shooting from the field. Dearman lead SIU with eight points and six rebounds in the period while Bailey and Schneiderman each had five for UIC.

In the second half, UIC quickly trimmed the lead to one, 38-37 at the 16:54 mark. SIU would regain momentum over the next eight minutes, though, going on a 23-9 spurt to take a 15-point advantage (61-46) with 8:04 left.

The Flames were hampered during the run as senior Cory Little left the game with a concussion after hitting his head on the floor after drawing a charge. Even with the loss, the Flames did not go away, chipping the lead down to as little as six in the waning moments, but could get no closer before the final horn sounded.

Norfolk, Va. – The UIC men’s basketball team held Old Dominion leading scorer Ricardo Marsh to just two points through the first 27 minutes of Saturday night’s game at ODU Fieldhouse.

Marsh, a 6-foot-7 forward who came in averaging 16.3 ppg, would not go quietly, though, as he scored 14 points (5-for-5 FG), including 11 straight in one stretch, over the final 13 minutes, leading the Monarchs to a 71-65 triumph over the Flames.

UIC, which fell to 3-2 with the loss, actually outshot (49%-48%) and outrebounded (29-27) Old Dominion, but missed free throws and 14 turnovers cost the Flames.

“I look down at the stat sheet and see we were 14-of-21 from the free throw line, and to lose by six that is really something that hurt us,” UIC head coach Jimmy Collins said after the game. “Also, 14 turnovers to just eight assists. We need to get better production out of our point guard spot.”

With the win, the Monarchs (4-1) improved to an impressive 108-12 all-time at the ODU Fieldhouse.

Sophomore Cedrick Banks led four Flames in double figures with 13 points while Thor Solverson and Jonathan Schneiderman each added 11 and Jon-Pierre Mitchom chipped in 10. Solverson also paced UIC with a team-best six rebounds.

Marsh led Old Dominion, which shot a blistering 67% (12-for-18 FG) in the second half, with 16 points. Chicago native Richard Greene was also strong for the Monarchs, recording 15 points and a team-high six rebounds

The Flames, who shot 55% from the field in the first half and owned a 32-29 lead at intermission, watched their advantage quickly disappear as ODU opened the half on a 9-0 run to take a 38-34 lead at the 14:56 mark.

After UIC battled back to tie the game at 38-38 with 13:49 left, Marsh took the game over, tallying the next 11 points and 13 total for the Monarchs during a 21-10 spurt that put ODU up 11 (59-48) with 5:50 remaining.

Collins’ crew refused to pack it in, closing to within three (68-65) in the waning moments. Old Dominion converted its final three free throws, though, to douse the Flames’ rally bid.

Chicago, Ill. – After a week of hitting the books for final exams, the UIC men’s basketball team was back on the floor Saturday afternoon as they rolled to a 93-53 victory over North Central College (Ill.) in front of 2,136 at the newly renovated UIC Pavilion.

“I thought that North Central really came to play today,” UIC Head Coach Jimmy Collins said after the game. “I just think our size and level of talent overwhelmed them, especially in the second half.”

With the win, the Flames snap a two-game losing streak and improve to 4-2 on the year. The Cardinals, a Division III school out of Naperville, Ill., fall to 2-5 on the year with the loss.

Sophomore Armond Williams led UIC, which shot season-high 59% from the field in the contest, with a career-high 22 points while also grabbing five rebounds.

Despite playing a sloppy first half that saw UIC turn the ball over 13 times, the Flames took a 19-point lead (36-17) into intermission as they shot 59% from the field in the period.

“I think our mental approach was lacking in the first half,” Collins said. “You want the players to be consistent everyday and that’s something we haven’t accomplished yet.”

Williams, who got his first career start, led the way, netting 10 points (5-for-6 FG) in the opening stanza. Kardos also added seven points while dishing out four assists. Mike Kulbeda paced North Central with six points on a pair of three-pointers.

UIC then put the game out of reach in the second half, slowly building its lead to the final 40-point differential.

Chicago, Ill. – It must have been some halftime speech.

Heading into the intermission, UIC trailed Northern Illinois 35-33, despite being out-rebounded 29-9, including 13 offensive boards that translated into 11 second chance points.

“All we did was read over the stat sheet and talk about the adjustments we needed to make,” UIC Head Coach Jimmy Collins said of his halftime speech to the team. “I told some guys they needed to step up.”

“I think they responded.”

After shooting a paltry 33 percent in the first half, UIC came out blazing in the final twenty minutes, outscoring the Huskies 51-34 to earn the 86-69 victory in front of 3,943 at the UIC Pavilion on Saturday afternoon.

The Flames (5-3) trailed by five after Jordan Kardos hit two 3-pointers, and Jonathan Schneiderman also made a three, but only 25 seconds remained and Purdue sealed the win with free throws.

Thor Solverson led the Flames with a season-high 15 points and seven rebounds. Schneiderman added 12.

Tampa, Fla. – UIC advanced to the championship game of the 2001 USF Holiday Classic with a 79-71 triumph over Hofstra on Friday night at the Sun Dome. The Flames will now meet tournament host South Florida tomorrow afternoon in the title contest at 4:00 p.m.

Junior Jonathan Schneiderman paced four UIC players in double figures with a career-best 22-point effort while sophomore Cedrick Banks, who was just 4-for-17 from the field in the game, tallied his first career double-double with 13 points and a personal-high 11 rebounds. Banks also added a career-high tying five assists.

Freshman Kenny Adeleke led the Pride (5-6), who dropped their fourth straight contest, with 15 points and 15 rebounds.

The Flames (8-4) were outrebounded (46-38) for the sixth-straight game, but UIC turned 19 Hofstra turnovers into 23 points while committing just eight turnovers themselves on Friday.

The Flames owned a 10-point lead (63-53) with 5:18 remaining, but had to hold off a furious Hofstra charge to secure the victory. Rick Apodaca led the Pride's comeback bid, scoring 11 straight points in one stretch of a 16-8 run to help close UIC's lead to two, 71-69.

Tampa, Fla. – In basketball, size matters.

The UIC men’s basketball team learned that first hand on Saturday afternoon as South Florida used its length – four starters at 6-foot-6 or taller - and its pressing style to edge the Flames, 82-78, in the championship game of the 2001 USF Holiday Classic at the USF Sun Dome.

“We’re not a big team, but we do hustle and play hard” UIC Head Coach Jimmy Collins said after the game. “Sometimes it is just very difficult for us to match-up versus a team like this.”

The Flames match-up problems centered around USF’s forward duo of Altron Jackson (6’6”) and B.B. Waldon (6’8”) as the pair combined for 36 points, 24 rebounds, 10 assists and eight steals in the game. Jackson finished with 25 points and 10 rebounds while Waldon just missed a quadruple double with 11 points, 14 rebounds, eight assists and seven steals.

The Bulls’ length also led to a 48-33 rebounding edge while forcing UIC into 16 turnovers.

Despite this, senior Jordan Kardos kept the Flames close, netting a season-high 25 points, shooting 8-for-13 from the field. Junior Jonathan Schneiderman also got into the mix late in the game, nailing four second-half treys to finish with 15 points. Senior Thor Solverson led UIC with seven rebounds, but the 6-foot-11 center was held scoreless in the game.

UIC erased a late 10-point deficit, behind a trio of triples from Schneiderman, to pull within three, 81-78, with 0:20 left, but Greg Brittian ended the Flames comeback bid by converting a pair of free throws in the final moments.

The Flames trailed by six at the break 35-29, after leading by as many as four in the period. Jackson, who tallied 21 points in the second half, would key the Bulls second-half surge, including a pair of tough baskets in a key 11-2 run that gave USF its biggest lead, 75-63.

With the loss, the Flames remained winless in enemy territory this season (0-4) and are now 8-5 on the year. South Florida, meanwhile, moved to 9-2 with the win, claiming the USF Holiday Classic title for the second-straight year.

Chicago, Ill. – The University of Illinois at Chicago men’s basketball team struggled through a physical Horizon League tilt at the UIC Pavilion Saturday afternoon, falling 83-69 to visiting Cleveland State.

Green Bay, Wis. – UIC scorched the nets at Brown County Arena on Thursday night, shooting a season-high 61% from the field and 65% from three-point range en route to a 75-66 victory over host UW-Green Bay.

The win was the Flames first on the road this season as they improved to 10-6 on the year, 2-1 in Horizon League play. UW-Green Bay dropped to 3-10, 0-2 in the league.

Senior Jordan Kardos and sophomore Cedrick Banks led the Flames' field goal barrage, which included a first half in which UIC shot 71% from the floor.

Banks, who also led the team with six rebounds, carried the Flames in the first half, connecting for 16 of his 24 points in the period.

Kardos then took over in the second stanza, nailing 18 of his game-high 25 points in the half. Kardos missed just two shots on the night (9-for-11 FG, 5-for-6 3PT) as he tallied 25 points for the third time in the last four games.

"Thank god for Jordan Kardos and Cedrick Banks," UIC Head Coach Jimmy Collins remarked after the game. "They seemingly responded to every one of (UW-Green Bay's) runs.

"They were patient out there tonight and took good shots."

Aaron Jessup led four UW-Green Bay players in double figures with 15 points. Slaven Markovic added 14 points and seven rebounds.

The first half had an auspicious beginning as UWGB guard Calix N'daiye was tabbed with a technical foul for dunking during warm-ups. Junior Jonathan Schneiderman would make both free throws to give UIC a 2-0 edge before the clock even started. Once the ball was tipped, Collins' crew came out of the gate smoking, hitting their first six shots en route to an early 16-6 lead. UIC would carry that 10-point lead into intermission, owning a 41-31 advantage.

The Phoenix would come out equally as hot in the second half, hitting their first seven shots to quickly cut the Flames' lead to 46-43 with 16:32 left.

Kardos would answer UW-Green Bay's charge, though, quieting the crowd of 2,524 with a pair of three-pointers to put UIC back up 52-43.

Later in the half, the Phoenix would mount another offensive, trimming the lead to 61-58 with 6:31 remaining. But once again, Kardos was their for the Flames, nailing back-to-back treys to put UIC ahead for good, 67-58.

When sophomore Cedrick Banks splashed in a pair of free throws with 4:23 left in the opening stanza, the Flames led 34-23 and were seemingly on pace to claim sole possession of second place in the Horizon League.

The Panther’s blew the doors open with a 19-2 run midway though the period keyed by six different UWM players who score during the run.

Junior Clay Tucker led UWM’s (8-8, 3-3 Horizon League) comeback charge, pacing five Panthers in double figures with a game-high 20 points.

Banks led UIC (10-7, 2-2 Horizon League) with 13 points. Senior Thor Solverson added 10 points and a team-high eight rebounds in the loss. Leading scorer Jordan Kardos was held to just two points after missing most of the first half after picking up two quick fouls.

The Flames 49-point output and 29% field goal percentage for the game were both season lows, as was UIC’s 21% shooting from three-point range – 0-fo-9 in the second half.

Chicago, Illinois – Four different players scored in double-figures for the University of Illinois at Chicago men’s basketball team as the Flames earned the 85-69 Horizon League victory over Youngstown State at the UIC Pavilion on Monday afternoon.

UIC’s hot shooting helped them erase a seven-point halftime deficit to tie the game 43-43 with 15:43 left on a trey by Kardos.

The Titans would put the clamps down on the Flames, though, going on a 14-2 run over the next six minutes to take a commanding 57-45 lead. Green paced the spurt with 10 of Detroit’s 14 points.

UIC did welcome the return of senior center Thor Solverson to the lineup after missing two games with a sprained knee. Solverson was limited in his effectiveness, being held scoreless and without a rebound in 29 minutes. Sophomore Cedrick Banks would lead the Flames, who were outrebounded 38-21 in the game, with seven boards.

UIC Head Coach Jimmy Collins did not make the trip to Detroit due to illness. Associate Head Coach Mark Coomes directed the Flames versus the Titans on Thursday. Collins will rejoin the team in Cleveland on Friday.

Detroit extends its NCAA-best home winning streak to 39 games

Cleveland, Ohio – The UIC men’s basketball team dug itself a hole it could never climb out of on Saturday afternoon, falling 76-70 to host Cleveland State in a physical Horizon League match-up.

After trailing by as many as 17 points in the first 10 minutes of the game, the Flames (13-11, 4-6 Horizon League) would twice trim the lead to three in the second half, but would get no closer as the Vikings staved off the comeback bid.

“We dug ourselves a hole and expended a lot of energy just trying to dig ourselves out” UIC Head Coach Jimmy Collins said after the game.

“You can’t beat a team when they shoot 54 percent and you shoot 35.”

UIC senior Jordan Kardos did his best to carry his team back versus the Vikings, scoring 21 of his career-high 27 points in the second half. With his jumper at the 7:13 mark in the second half, Kardos set a personal milestone, becoming the 16th player in UIC history to score 1,000 points in his career.

The Flames, who entered the contest as the second-best three-point shooting team in the country, had used the trey all season as an important weapon. On Saturday, though, UIC couldn’t find its touch from behind the arc, connecting on just 19% (5-for-26) of its attempts.

The Vikings (10-11, 4-6 Horizon League) were the aggressors from the opening tip, storming out to an 18-4 lead before the first official timeout. Senior guard Jamaal Harris led the charge, scoring nine points of his team-high 23 points during the early surge.

After trailing by as many as 17 points in the first 10 minutes of the contest, the Flames would get their feet underneath them and begin to chip away at CSU’s lead.

UIC would trail 41-31 at intermission and would open the second half on a 15-8 run, closing to within three, 49-46, on a trifecta from Jonathan Schneiderman (16 points) with 11:31 left.

The Vikings didn’t falter, though, going on a 14-3 run of their own to push the lead to 63-49 at the 7:31 mark.

The Flames, again, fought back to pull within three, but Theo Dixon (20 points) hit a pair of free throws with 0:19 remaining to ice the game.

Youngstown, Ohio - Never underestimate your opponent.

It took 20 minutes for that to register with the UIC men's basketball team against Youngstown State, but the Flames escaped with a 63-57 victory over the Penguins at the Beeghly Center on Monday night.

Sophomore Cedrick Banks paced the Flames' scoring attack with a game-high 17 points, followed by junior guard Jonathan Schneiderman (15 points) and senior guard Jordan (12 points).

"It was a very tough and hard played game," UIC coach Jimmy Collins said. "Jonathan Schneiderman went in and got control for us." With the victory, UIC improves to 14-11 on the season and 5-6 in Horizon League action, while Youngstown State falls to 3-18 overall and 1-10 in the league.

Youngstown State capitalized off 18 Flames' turnovers in the first half and took a 31-29 lead at the intermission. The Penguins scored 22 points off the Flames' miscues.

Youngstown State crept back into the game as they cut the lead to two points as Stephen Flores (7 points) canned a pair of free throws to put the score at 57-55.

Collins called a time-out and on the ensuing possession, Banks scored on a nice back-door feed from Schneiderman to end the Youngstown State rally.

Ryan Patton led Youngstown State with 15 points, while the Penguins also received solid efforts from Brian Radakovich (12 points) and Rafael Cruz (10 points).

The Flames were coming in off a buzzer-beater triumph over league-leading UW-Milwaukee on Thursday night and hosting a Phoenix squad they had rolled past a month earlier on the road.

Three minutes into the game things definitely seemed to be pointed in UWGB's favor as they came out firing to a quick 11-2 lead.

Despite shooting a paltry 28 percent in the first-half, UIC closed out the opening frame with a 28-26 lead over UWGB.
