UIC hosts crosstown foe DePaul inside the UIC Pavilion for the first time ever this Saturday night...Saturday is the fourth meeting between the two schools since UIC became a Division I program in 1981-82 and the third matchup since 2004-05...UIC defeated DePaul last season at the Allstate Arena, 85-80...That win over the Blue Demons was UIC's first over a member in the current configuration of the BIG EAST since defeating Marquette in 1994-95...The last time a member of one of the "big six" conferences came to the Pavilion was SEC school Ole Miss in 2005-06... Senior guard Josh Mayo is averaging a team-best 20.0 ppg through two games...Dating back to last season, UIC has won two straight at home and six of its last seven at the Pavilion...Sophomore forward Tori Boyd is coming off a career-high 17-point effort against UNI this past Wednesday, draining a career-best four 3PT FG.

Blue Demon Notes: DePaul won its season opener this past Monday against Albany by a score of 75-64 at McGrath Arena in Lincoln Park. Dar Tucker scored 23 while Mac Koshwal contributed eight points and 10 rebounds. The Blue Demons, a member of what many pundits consider the best conference in the country this year in the BIG EAST, were picked to finish 15th in the league's preseason coaches poll. Jerry Wainwright is in his fourth season as DePaul's head coach with a record of 44-48 and an overall record of 230-192 in 15 seasons as a head coach.

UIC AND DEPAUL, THE SERIES:

While just five miles separate the two campuses, UIC and DePaul have met on just five prior occasions. The two teams had a pair of meetings in the 1940s when UIC was located at Navy Pier, and since the Flames became a Division I program in 1981-82, UIC and DePaul have had just three encounters (all of which have taken place inside what is now known as Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Ill.). Last year was UIC's first-ever victory over DePaul; UIC is 1-4 all-time against the Blue Demons.

LAST TIME WE MET:**UIC 85, DePaul 80 - Dec. 15, 2007 (Allstate Arena - Chicago, Ill.)**

Paced by a potent three-guard attack, UIC knocked off city rival DePaul, 85-80, in a back-and-forth affair at Allstate Arena. The win was the Flames' first-ever against the Blue Demons. UIC's backcourt trio of Robo Kreps, Josh Mayo and Spencer Stewart led the way for the Flames, combining for 53 points and 12 assists. Kreps posted a season- and team-high 19 points, going 7-for-9 from the field. Stewart also reached a personal-best scoring number with 16 points while adding seven rebounds and four assists. Mayo shook off a cold start (0-6 FG-FGA to begin the game) to the contest to finish with 18 points and a team-high six assists. Scott VanderMeer provided UIC with plenty of production out of the post with 13 points and seven boards, while Jeremy Buttell came off the bench to pull down a team-best 10 rebounds for the Flames. The two squads traded runs throughout the second half, but UIC made the final surge as a 9-2 spurt, propelled by six points from Stewart, staked the Flames to a 78-70 lead with 1:49 left. Three-pointers by Draelon Burns and Dar Tucker and a lay-up by Cliff Clinkscales sandwiched between a VanderMeer dunk cut the Flames' lead to just 80-78 with 43 seconds remaining, but Mayo would sink four straight clutch free throws on UIC's next two possessions to put the Flames ahead to stay. Tucker led DePaul with a game-high 26 points

FLAMES vs. BLUE DEMONS SERIES NUGGETS:

* The first meeting between the two schools occurred during the 1947-48 season. UIC, then located at Navy Pier, dropped a pair of contests against DePaul that year.

* The two teams resumed their rivalry during the 1981-82 season. DePaul won 78-53 on Dec. 1, 1981 at the Rosemont Horizon (now Allstate Arena) in what was supposed to be the first-ever men's basketball game at the UIC Pavilion. Construction on the Pavilion was not completed due to a two-month operating engineers strike, forcing the change of venue.

* The game between UIC and DePaul during the 1981-82 season pitted legendary Blue Demon coach Ray Meyer against his son, then-UIC head coach Tom Meyer.

* While this is the first time DePaul will play UIC at the Pavilion, this is not DePaul's first game at the Pavilion. The Blue Demons beat UIC's fellow Horizon League school Loyola, 84-65, on Jan. 15, 1987, a season when the Ramblers played home games at the Pavilion due to Alumni Gym renovations.

* UIC is 2-1 all-time against Jerry Wainwright-led teams. In addition to last year's win over DePaul, the Flames defeated Wainwright's UNC Wilmington squad during the 1998-99 season, 72-55, and fell by two points,

54-52, to UNCW the following year.

* UIC assistant coach Tracy Dildy was an assistant coach (1997-2000), associate head coach (2000-02) and acting head coach (2001) at DePaul, where he signed and coached the likes of current NBA players Quentin Richardson, Bobby Simmons and Steven Hunter.

* DePaul sophomore forward Mac Koshwal was a prep teammate of UIC freshman forward Jelani Poston at Chicago's Boys to Men Academy in 2006-07.

LAST TIME OUT:

UIC 84, UNI 77 - Nov. 19, 2008 (UIC Pavilion)

Josh Mayo scored a game-high 27 points and Tori Boyd hit four three-pointers in a career-high 17-point effort to pace UIC to an 84-77 victory over UNI in the Flames' 2008-09 home opener on Wednesday night. In the first regular season game at the revamped UIC Pavilion, the Flames (1-1) picked up where they left off last season by displaying red-hot shooting from their home floor. UIC shot 50 percent (26-for-52) from the field, including a 62.5 percent (10-for-16) clip from downtown, after finishing near 50 percent in both categories as a team at home in 2007-08. Mayo hit three of his four attempts from downtown and was a perfect 12-for-12 from the free throw line, while Boyd nailed a career-high four treys in addition to pulling down seven rebounds. UIC rallied from a five-point deficit early in the second half with a pair of big runs, using a 10-2 run to take the lead for good and using a 15-0 eruption to build a lead of as many as 17. Mayo scored nine of those points during the latter spurt.

FLAMES AT THE PAVILION UNDER COLLINS:

Since taking over the reigns in the 1996-97 season, head coach Jimmy Collins has seen plenty of good things at the UIC Pavilion. UIC is 117-46 at the Pav under Collins, with the Flames winning 10 of his 13 home openers.

THAT'S THE JOSH WE KNOW:

After scoring 13 points and hitting just one of his seven three-point attempts against Bradley on Nov. 14, Josh Mayo was back to his high-scoring ways against UNI this past Wednesday. Mayo scored a game-high 27 points, hitting 6-of-9 field goal attempts and 3-of-4 from long range. It was the 32nd time in his career that he has led UIC in scoring and moved him into sole possession of 11th place on UIC's career scoring charts (1,247).

PAVILION A JOSH PIT:

In his fourth season at UIC, Josh Mayo has become very comfortable shooting on the Flames' home court. For his career Mayo is shooting 48.3 percent (188-for-389) from the floor and 47.7 percent (103-for-216) from downtown. With an increased scoring load on his shoulders last season, Mayo delivered at home by shooting 55.4 percent (93-for-168) from the field and 57.8 percent (52-for-90) from beyond the arc.

TORI TAKES CHARGE AGAINST UNI:

After a short night plagued by foul trouble against Bradley on Nov. 14, Tori Boyd rebounded with the best game of his young career against UNI this past Wednesday night. He scored a career-best 17 points thanks to a red-hot 4-for-5 evening from behind the three-point line. It was his best-ever output from downtown. Boyd also added a career-high seven rebounds to lead the Flames in that category.

EPPINGER STOUT IN FIRST START:

Newcomer Rob Eppinger made a nice impression in front of the home fans against UNI on Nov. 19, scoring 10 points on 5-for-7 shooting during a 28-minute outing that was his first Division I start.

KREPS KEEPS SCORING:

Robo Kreps continued where he left off in 2007-08 when he scored a career-high 24 points in UIC's season opener at Bradley on Nov. 14. His effort against the Braves was the third straight game that he scored in double digits dating back to last season, with a team-high 15 points in a Horizon League semifinal loss to Butler on Mar. 8 and a 14-point outing in a quarterfinal win over Loyola on Mar. 7.

VANDERMEER DOES THE DOUBLE-DOUBLE AGAIN:

Senior center Scott VanderMeer opened 2008-09 with his ninth career double-double by scoring 15 points and taking down 11 boards against Bradley on Nov. 14.

DON'T HOLD THE MAYO:

Senior guard Josh Mayo proved he was more than able of taking the reigns as the Flames' go-to guy last season. The 5-foot-11 guard averaged 17.1 points per game, the second-best scoring average in the Horizon League in 2007-08. Mayo, a 2008 All-Horizon League First Team selection, scored in double-figures in all but two of the Flames' 33 contests last year, including nine 20-plus point performances and a pair of 30-plus point outbursts. He enters his final college season as the Horizon League's Preseason Player of the Year, a Preseason All-Horizon League First Team pick and a collegeinsider.com Preseason Mid-Major All-American. He is the first UIC player to have earned all three honors since Cedrick Banks pulled the same trifecta prior to 2004-05.

THE THREE WAS KEY:

One of the Flames' biggest weapons last season was the three-point shot. UIC shot 39.1 percent (237-for-606) as a team from downtown in 2007-08, led by Josh Mayo's 47.0 percent (94-for-200) shooting from beyond the arc. Mayo led the nation in three-point field goal percentage for six consecutive weeks before finishing the year seventh nationally in the category last season, while the Flames ranked 25th as a team in the final three-point percentage listing. In 18 wins last year the Flames shot 45.0 percent (141-for-313) from behind the three-point line, while UIC has posted a 32.8 (96-for-293) three-point field goal percentage in 15 defeats.

HELPING EACH OTHER OUT:

Through two games the Flames have been assisting each other well, with 31 assists credited on 46 made baskets.

SCOTT THE KING OF SWAT:

7-foot senior center Scott VanderMeer has made his name turning away opponents' shots. VanderMeer already owns the single-season (111 in 2006-07) and career (200) blocks records at UIC in just over two seasons, getting to 200 blocked shots with four swats against Bradley on Friday. He needs just 27 blocked shots from setting a new Horizon League career record. Wednesday's game against UNI was just the third time in VanderMeer's career that he did not register a single block in a home game in 29 career outings at the Pavilion.

MY KIND OF CLASS, CHICAGO:

UIC's 2008-09 class of newcomers has more of a Chicago feel than recruiting hauls of years past. Freshmen Jelani Poston, Zavion Neely and DeMarkus Isom-Jones, along with junior Kris Harris, are from the city of Chicago and competed in the Chicago Public League during their prep careers. The Flames now feature 7 players who were raised in Chicago and its surrounding suburbs, including Scott VanderMeer, who graduated from Lake Central High School in Dyer, Ind. but was originally from Chicago's south suburbs (Tinley Park).

ROBO A MACHINE:

Sophomore guard Robo Kreps had a rookie campaign to remember as a true freshman in 2007-08. Kreps appeared in all 33 games and averaged 8.1 points per game, the third-best scoring mark on the team last year. He shot 48.7 percent (92-for-189) from the floor and 46.2 percent (49-for-106) from behind the three-point line. Kreps' given first name is Robert, which is what he went by last year, but prefers to go by his life-long nickname Robo.

HOME COOKIN':

UIC took care of its home court last season, accumulating a sparkling 12-2 record at the UIC Pavilion that was the Flames' best home mark since a 13-1 record in 1997-98. The Flames shot 49.8 percent (381-for-765) as a team at home, including a team season clip of 47.7 (125-for-262) from downtown, while outscoring opponents by an average of 12.9 ppg.

JOSH AS MONEY AS BANKS:

Josh Mayo is the Flames' most prolific scorer since Cedrick Banks donned a UIC uniform from 2001-2005. Banks finished his career as UIC's all-time leading scorer with 2,097 points in four seasons. Here is how Merrillville native Mayo, who earned the same trifecta of accolades (league Preseason POY, Preseason All-League First Team, collegeinsider.com Mid-Major All-American) this preseason that Banks garnered prior to his senior season in 2004-05, stacks up to the former pride of Westinghouse High School after each played 93 games at UIC:

2008-09 UIC FLAMES MEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

WHAT WE GAINED:

This year's crop of newcomers to UIC has brought in plenty of size and athleticism. 6-foot-8 Rob Eppinger, 6-foot-7 Jelani Poston and 6-foot-5 DeMarkus Isom-Jones enhance a frontcourt anchored by returning 7-foot center Scott VanderMeer, while 6-foot-1 freshman Zavion Neely, 6-foot-3 freshman and 6-foot-3 junior college transfers Kris Harris and Chris Buchanan add significant depth to the Flames' experienced backcourt.

WHAT WE LOST:

Guards Robert Bush and Karl White Jr., a pair of veterans who spent four years at UIC, and two-year letterwinner Jermaine Dailey, an athletic 6-foot-7 forward who came on as the 2007-08 season wound down, are the three letterwinners that the Flames lost to graduation. Bush averaged 7.4 ppg and 3.1 rpg, while White scored 8.1 ppg. Dailey led the team in field goal shooting (62.8 percent) last year and averaged 7.8 ppg and 7.0 rpg in UIC's final seven games, including a double-double (12 points, 10 rebounds) in the Horizon League semifinals against eventual champion Butler. Senior Ebenezer Noonoo, a reserve who served as the team's spiritual leader, also exhausted his eligibility last season.

UIC head men's basketball coach Jimmy Collins announced on Wednesday, Nov. 12 that **Louis Green (Hillside, Ill./St. Joseph H.S.)** has signed a National Letter of Intent to play for the Flames beginning in the 2009-10 campaign. Green is a 6-foot-9, 240-pound center who plays for legendary head coach Gene Pingatore at St. Joseph High School in Westchester. A varsity starter since his sophomore season, Green was a teammate of current NCAA Division I student-athletes Demetri McCamey (Illinois) and Evan Turner (Ohio State) on the Chargers' 2007 IHSA Sectional championship squad. Green played this past summer with the Illinois Flames AAU team under coach Dedrick Shannon.

COACH COLLINS ON LOUIS GREEN:

"Louis is a young man who likes to be aggressive around the basket. However, he is not limited to that. He can step out and hit the 15-footer, he handles the ball well, he can pass it well, and he fits into our program in terms of being a smart player who is very coachable, and he is only going to get better. He is also learning from a legend and a man I really respect in Gene Pingatore, who is known across the coaching profession as a great developer of talent."

UIC HEAD COACH
Jimmy Collins
(195-172, 13th season)

Head Coach Jimmy Collins is in his 13th season at the helm of the UIC men's basketball program. The veteran mentor is not only the winningest coach in school history with 195 career wins, but is also the longest tenured Division I men's basketball coach in the state of Illinois and the Horizon League. He has captured a conference regular season title (1998) and two league tournament crowns (2002, 2004) during his tenure, and has guided the Flames to four 20-win seasons, including a school-record 24 victories in 2003-04.

Named co-conference coach of the year after his first season with the Flames, Collins has also guided UIC to its only three NCAA Tournament appearances in school history, taking the team to the Big Dance in 1998, 2002 and 2004. He also guided the Flames to their first-ever NIT bid in 2003.

Collins, who served as an assistant coach at Illinois for 13 years prior to his arrival at UIC, earned All-American honors as a player at New Mexico State, averaging 20.1 ppg while leading the Aggies to the Final Four during his senior season.

JIMMY COLLINS FAST FACTS

- * Jimmy Collins was introduced as the ninth head coach in UIC history on March 27, 1996.
- * Collins has propelled UIC to its first three NCAA Tournament bids (1998, 2002, 2004) and first NIT berth (2003) in school history.
- * Collins has led UIC to four 20-win seasons in his 12 years on the sidelines: 22 (1997-98); 20 (2001-02); 21 (2002-03); 24 (2003-04).
- * Collins is the program's all-time winningest coach with 195 career victories.
- * Collins has guided UIC to a league regular-season (1998) and two league tournament titles (2002, 2004) during his tenure.
- * Collins is the longest tenured Division I men's basketball coach in the state of Illinois and the longest tenured coach in the Horizon League.
- * Collins was an assistant coach at the University of Illinois under Lou Henson for 13 years, including the 1989 season in which the Fighting Illini advanced to the Final Four.
- * As Illinois' top recruiter, Collins' high-profile Illini signees included: Kendall Gill, Nick Anderson, Marcus Liberty, Deon Thomas, Kiwane Garris and Lowell Hamilton.
- * Collins is the co-chairman of the Chicago Special Olympics.
- * Collins and his family are heavily involved with the Lupus Foundation of America Illinois Chapter. His daughter, Erica, serves on the Board of Directors for the Illinois Chapter.
- * Collins, as well as the rest of his 1970 New Mexico State Final Four squad, were inducted into the school's Hall of Fame on Feb. 7th, 2004.
- * Collins is a former first-round draft pick of the Chicago Bulls (1970).
- * Collins served as a hearing officer for the Cook County Probation Department prior to his appointment as an assistant coach at Illinois.
