UIC takes to the road for the first time this season with a set of three games at the 2007 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam at the University of the Virgin Islands' Sports & Fitness Center...The Flames will play Winthrop in the first round of the Paradise Jam, marking the first-ever meeting between the two schools...In addition to UIC and Winthrop, the Paradise Jam field includes Georgia Tech, Charlotte, Notre Dame, Baylor, Wichita State and Monmouth...UIC's next opponent in the Paradise Jam will be either Charlotte or Georgia Tech...The Flames' stay at the Virgin Islands is part of a season-long five-game road stretch...Through two games UIC is shooting nearly 60 percent (.595, 22-for-37) from three-point range...The Flames' 2-0 start is the third 2-0 start in the last 10 seasons for UIC (07-08, 05-06, 01-02)...UIC will seek its first 3-0 start to a campaign since 2001-02.

Eagle Notes: Winthrop, the three-time reigning Big South champion, is 1-0 entering Friday after winning its opener over Queens (NC), 68-61, on Nov. 10. The Eagles have appeared in seven of the last nine NCAA Tournaments. Winthrop made the second round of last year's Big Dance by upsetting Notre Dame. Winthrop was ranked 13th in the 2007-08 CollegeInsider.com Top 25 Mid-Major Poll. Randy Peele, an assistant at Winthrop the past four seasons, is in his first year at the helm.

UIC AND WINTHROP, THE SERIES:

UIC has never met Winthrop prior to Friday's game.

THE REST OF THE PARADISE JAM FIELD:

In addition to UIC and Winthrop, the 2007 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam includes Georgia Tech, Charlotte, Notre Dame, Baylor, Wichita State and Monmouth. The eight-team field has a combined record of 9-3 entering the tournament. UIC and Charlotte are the only teams with 2-0 records, while Notre Dame, Baylor, Wichita State and Winthrop are all 1-0.

Georgia Tech (2007-08 Record: 1-1)

Georgia Tech begins the Paradise Jam against Charlotte at 12:00 p.m. Central. The Yellow Jackets are 1-1 following a season-opening 83-74 home loss to UNC Greensboro last week that preceded a 99-85 road win over Tennessee State on Sunday. Anthony Morrow is averaging 27 ppg in the early going for GT. UIC is 1-1 all-time against the Ramblin Wreck. The two teams faced off in the Flames' 2004-05 season opener at the Pavilion in an exciting 60-59 contest that went in favor of the then-No. 3 Jackets, but UIC exacted revenge the following season with a 73-51 win over Georgia Tech at Alexander Memorial Coliseum behind then-freshman Josh Mayo's 21 points in his first collegiate start. Paul Hewitt is 128-96 in his eighth year at Georgia Tech.

Charlotte (2007-08 Record: 2-0)

The 49ers come to the Paradise Jam with a 2-0 record following wins over High Point and Appalachian State. Leemire Goldwire leads Charlotte with 24.5 ppg. UIC is 0-2 all-time against Charlotte, with the first meeting between the two teams coming in the 1998 NCAA Tournament. Tenth-year head coach Bobby Lutz is 170-112.

Baylor (2007-08 Record: 1-0)

Baylor is 1-0 after beating Jackson State, 100-76, in its season opener in Waco, Texas. Kevin Rogers led the Bears with a double-double of 20 points and 11 rebounds in the win. UIC lost the only meeting between the two schools, which occurred 21 years ago during the 1986-87 season. Scott Drew, who has Horizon League connections due to his affiliation with Butler (student assistant, 1991-93) and Valparaiso (son of current head coach Homer Drew, served as associate head coach and head coach prior to Baylor), is in his fifth year in Waco with a record of 37-69.

Notre Dame (2007-08 Record: 1-0)

The Fighting Irish are 1-0 heading into the Paradise Jam after winning an 82-50 game over Long Island. Rob Kurz had a double-dip of 19 points and 10 rebounds. UIC has never faced Notre Dame on the hardwood. The Flames do have an Irish connection, though, through former UIC assistant coach and current ND assistant Gene Cross, who was a member of Jimmy Collins' Flames staff from 1996-97 until 2001-02. Mike Brey is 143-78 in South Bend.

Wichita State (2007-08 Record: 1-0)

The Shockers are 1-0 following a 61-56 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff on Tuesday. Wichita State featured six players with at least eight points, led by Gal Mekel's game-high 16 points. The Flames have never met the Shockers.

Gregg Marshall, who was the head coach at Winthrop (UIC's opening-round foe in the Paradise Jam) for the past nine years, is in his inaugural season in Wichita.

Monmouth (2007-08 Record: 0-2)

The Hawks are 0-2 following road losses to Colgate and Seton Hall. Jhamar Youngblood is averaging 23.5 ppg through Monmouth's first pair of contests, highlighted by a 27-point performance against Seton Hall. UIC has played Monmouth once, winning the only meeting back in 1986-87. Head coach Dave Calloway is 142-142 in 11 seasons at the New Jersey-based program.

WHAT'S UP NEXT:

The winner of the UIC/Winthrop game will play the winner of the Charlotte/Georgia Tech on Sunday, Nov. 18 at 5:00 p.m. Central. The loser of the Flames/Eagles contest will meet the loser of the 49ers/Yellow Jackets matchup on Saturday, Nov. 17 at 5:00 p.m. Central. The Paradise Jam will wrap up with the final and consolation games on Monday.

FOLLOW THE FLAMES IN PARADISE FROM THE MAINLAND:

Live radio coverage of the Flames' entire three-game stay at the Paradise Jam is available online through Stretch Internet at uicflames.com. Play-by-play man Adam Levinson will call all the action. In addition to radio, the Paradise Jam will feature a live online video stream for a fee at WatchBTIHoops.com. A one-time fee of \$7.95 or an eight-game package featuring at least the Flames' opening game for \$17.95 are available. The semifinals and final will be broadcast on Fox College Sports.

A QUICK LOOK BACK:

UIC 81, UIS 55 - 11/13/07 (UIC Pavilion)

Scott VanderMeer scored a career-high 19 points as UIC scorched sister school UIS, 81-55, at the Pavilion on Tuesday night. Josh Mayo scored 13 points and dished out a game-high eight assists, while Jeremy Buttell registered a double-double of 13 points and 10 rebounds. UIC shot 61 percent (19-for-31) in the first half and led by as many as 31 in the final stanza.

FLAMES DOWN BRADLEY IN SEASON OPENER:

Josh Mayo's career-high 34 points propelled the UIC men's basketball team to a season-opening 84-75 victory over Bradley at the UIC Pavilion on Saturday night. In head coach Jimmy Collins' first game back on the bench after missing the final 19 games of last season with an abdominal aortic aneurysm, the Flames gave their veteran mentor a welcoming gift he will never forget in front of an energized Pavilion crowd of 6,080 by defeating one of the favorites in the Missouri Valley Conference. Freshman Tori Boyd chipped in 11 points in his UIC debut, and Spencer Stewart scored 10 points despite being plagued with foul trouble. Mayo finished 11-for-17 from the field, including 3-of-4 from three-point range, and went a perfect 9-for-9 from the free throw line.

CAN'T HOLD THE MAYO:

Most of the preseason publicity about UIC centered on junior guard Josh Mayo, and the third-year Flames stand-out showed he is more than capable of handling the high expectations in UIC's opener. The Merrillville, Ind., native scored a career-best 34 points, eight better than his previous single-game high, to key the Flames' 84-75 win over Bradley on Saturday. Mayo then put his passing skills on display with a career-high-tying eight assists to go along with 13 points in UIC's win over UIS.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Following Josh Mayo's impressive outing against Bradley, the Horizon League honored the junior UIC guard with the 2007-08 season's first Horizon League Player of the Week award on Monday (Nov. 12). The award was the second time Mayo has been honored as Horizon League Player of the Week in his career.

BOYD A BREATH OF FRESH-MAN AIR...:

Freshman forward Tori Boyd made an exciting debut in a UIC uniform against Bradley on Saturday. The 6-foot-5 rookie wing scored 11 points on 4-for-9 shooting from the field during 24 minutes of energetic play. Boyd netted two clutch treys to spur a 9-0 UIC run in the first half that extended the Flames' lead to 15.

...AND SO IS ROBO:

First-year guard Robert "Robo" Kreps also made a strong opening statement in his UIC debut against the Braves. The gritty 6-foot point man hit all three of his shots to score seven points and proved he's not afraid to stick his

nose in the paint, pulling down five rebounds. Kreps then scored eight points and pilfered a trio of steals against UIS this past Tuesday.

WELCOME BACK, COACH:

UIC head coach Jimmy Collins returned to the sidelines this past Saturday for his first regular season contest since Dec. 21, 2006. The 12th-year mentor, who is UIC's all-time winningest head coach with 178 career wins, missed the last 19 games of last season due to an abdominal aortic aneurysm. Collins looked like he hasn't missed a beat in guiding the Flames to a pair of wins in their first two games.

BLOCK PARTY:

UIC center Scott VanderMeer had 10 games last season in which he recorded at least five blocked shots. He has already notched five-block games in each of UIC's first two contests of 2007-08.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE CHARITY STRIPE:

UIC guards Josh Mayo extended his consecutive free throws made streak to 27 on Saturday by converting all nine of his attempts from the charity stripe against Bradley. Mayo went 18-for-18 from the foul line in the final two games of 2006-07 and is averaging nine attempts in his last three games. He did not attempt a foul shot in UIC's game against UIS.

FLAMES LIKE TO GIVE EACH OTHER A HELPING HAND:

The assists have been flowing for UIC in its first two games. The Flames have 40 assists on 59 baskets, highlighted by a performance against UIS on Tuesday that saw 24 assists on 30 field goals. Josh Mayo (12 assists), Spencer Stewart (10) and Karl White Jr. (8) have paced UIC in the assist category so far.

NEWCOMER NUGGETS:

UIC welcomes in a trio of talented newcomers to its lineup this season. Here is a quick look at what these new faces bring to the table for the Flames.

Robert Kreps (G, 6-0, Fr.) - Runner-up for Mr. Basketball honors in the state of Illinois (behind Simeon's Derrick Rose, now at Memphis) and First Team All-State honoree after leading Maroa-Forsyth to the Class A State Championship last season, averaging 23.9 points, 4.9 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game. Kreps, who prefers to go by his nickname "Robo," was also an All-State wide receiver for state champion football Maroa-Forsyth.

Tori Boyd (F, 6-5, Fr.) - All-State honoree in Illinois last season after leading Rockford Boylan Catholic High School to the Elite Eight in the IHSA Class AA State Tournament. Boyd averaged 17.0 points and 7.1 rebounds per game as a senior for the Titans.

Jeremy Buttell (F, 6-7, So.) - Sat out last season after transferring from Texas Tech, where he saw 19 games of action as a rookie for the Red Raiders under head coach Bobby Knight. Buttell was a two-time Texas All-State honoree during his prep days at Colleyville Heritage High School and was the 2005 Texas 5A Offensive Player of the Year.

SPENCER MANNING THE POINT:

UIC has handed the reigns of the offense to sophomore point guard Spencer Stewart. The Edwardsville, Ill., native showed tons of potential throughout an injury-plagued rookie season last year, and through two games in 2007-08 he has proven to be key as the Flames' QB. Despite playing only 16 minutes due to early foul trouble, Stewart scored 10 points, hit a pair of three-pointers, pilfered two steals and handed out a team-best six assists. "Spence" followed that up with four dimes and eight points against UIS.

DOWNTOWN - WHERE EVERYTHING'S WAITING FOR UIC:

Much of UIC's success in its first two games has come from the Flames' outside shooting. UIC is hitting treys at a clip of nearly 60 percent (.595), knocking down 22-of-37 from behind the arc. The Flames have a better percentage from downtown than overall field goal percentage (.532).

KEEPING THE GOOD START GOING:

UIC is 2-0 for the second time in three years, with its last set of two season-opening victories coming during the 2005-06 campaign. The Flames have started a season 2-0 three times in the last 10 seasons. A 3-0 start could be a good indicator of postseason plans for UIC; under Jimmy Collins UIC has gone 3-0 to begin a season twice (1997-98, 2001-02), with both seasons ending in NCAA Tournament berths.

MID-MAJORING IN BEATING COLLEGEINSIDER.COM FAVORITES:

Five teams in CollegeInsider.com's Top 25 Mid-Major Poll appear on the Flames' 2007-08 schedule. UIC already beat eighth-ranked Bradley this past Saturday, with a pair of games against Butler (No. 2) and single games against Winthrop (No. 13), Akron (No. 14) and Central Michigan (No. 24) on the docket. UIC also has a chance to play Wichita State (No. 21) in the Paradise Jam.

DOUBLE-T, DOUBLE-L, DOUBLE-DOUBLE IN BUTTELL:

First-year Flames forward Jeremy Buttell put on a fine all-around display against UIS this past Tuesday, recording his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. The 6-foot-7 sophomore is now averaging 6.5 points and 6.5 rebounds per game in the early going of the season.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF TURNOVERS:

Thus far UIC has made the most of opponent giveaways. Through two games the Flames have scored 51 points off of 35 turnovers committed by their first pair of foes.

COACHING STAFF HAS MORE OF A UIC FLAVOR NOWADAYS:

UIC head coach Jimmy Collins added two new assistant coaches to his staff over the summer, and both are no strangers to UIC basketball. Here's a look at new assistant coaches Tracy Dildy and Bryant Lowe:

TRACY DILDY

Tracy Dildy returns to the sidelines for the Flames after a standout career as a player (1987-89) and assistant coach (1990-94) for UIC. Dildy was a two-year letterwinner as a point guard for UIC under coach Bob Hallberg, finishing with the eighth-most assists (260) in UIC history. He then got his start in coaching as a graduate assistant coach on Hallberg's staff during the 1990-91 season and was promoted to a full-time assistant coach the following year. In his first stint as assistant coach for the Flames Dildy recruited three of UIC's all-time greatest players: Kenny Williams, Sherell Ford and Mark Miller.

Dildy went on to coach at Ball State (1994-97), DePaul (1997-2002), Auburn (2002-2004), Ole Miss (2004-2006) and UAB (2006-2007). Among the many high-profile players Dildy has signed or coached include a who's-who of NBA stars: Bonzi Wells (Ball State); Quentin Richardson, Bobby Simmons, Steven Hunter, Eddy Curry (DePaul); and Marquise Daniels (Auburn).

BRYANT LOWE

After spending the 2006-07 season as the Flames' Director of Basketball Operations, Bryant Lowe will enter his first season as an assistant coach on Jimmy Collins' staff. Lowe, a two-year letterwinner for UIC from 1996-98, spent the final 19 games of last season as an assistant to interim head coach Mark Coomes when Collins was forced to take a leave of absence due to an abdominal aortic aneurysm. Lowe was a 1998 All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference First Team selection after averaging 15.1 points and 8.7 rebounds per game to help UIC secure its first-ever NCAA Tournament berth that season.

SCHEDULE NOTES:

* UIC will play five games against 2007 NCAA Tournament teams, with Winthrop, Butler (2) and Wright State (2) on the slate. There is a chance that the Flames will play three more games against squads who competed in last year's Big Dance, with possible matchups against Georgia Tech and Notre Dame at the Paradise Jam and a possible 2007 NCAA Tournament qualifier in this year's ESPNU BracketBuster game.

* Once again the Flames will feature a schedule with plenty of in-state opposition. UIC began its home state slate with Saturday's home game against Bradley, followed by Tuesday's game against UIS. Road contests against Illinois State and DePaul come up in December, along with the annual two-game set against crosstown and Horizon League rival Loyola. UIC has enjoyed great success against its intrastate rivals under head coach Jimmy Collins, boasting a 46-28 record against foes from the state of Illinois since the 1996-97 campaign.

* UIC will begin a season-long five-game road swing at the 2007 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam. After three games on the island of St. Thomas, UIC will return to the mainland to take on Central Michigan (Nov. 28) and Illinois State (Dec. 1) on the road.

KARL KEEPS DEFENSES ON THEIR HEELS:

Speedy senior guard Karl White Jr. has shown he is a dangerous offensive weapon through the first two games of 2007-08. White is averaging 11.0 ppg, scoring a season-high 14 against UIS, on 9-of-20 (.450) shooting. He has shot well from close range (6-of-14 inside the arc) and from three-point range (3-of-6 beyond the arc).

FLAMES IN THE EARLY HORIZON LEAGUE STATISTICAL STANDINGS:

In the latest set of statistical rankings released by the Horizon League on Friday morning, UIC sits atop numerous individual and team rankings. Josh Mayo leads the league in scoring (23.5 ppg), assists (6.0 apg) and free throw percentage (1.000), while Scott VanderMeer is tops in the league in total blocked shots (10) and blocks per game (5.0). Jeremy Buttell is fifth in rebounding (6.5 rpg) and Robert Kreps is third in steals (2.5 spg). As a team UIC leads the conference in scoring offense (82.5 ppg), field goal percentage (.532) and three-point field goal percentage (.595).

BACKCOURT BALANCE:

If the key to a strong basketball team is a solid backcourt, then the Flames should be primed for a strong season as UIC boasts a quartet of seasoned guards. Anchored by junior combo guard Josh Mayo, the Flames also return senior shooting guards Robert Bush and Karl White Jr. and sophomore point guard Spencer Stewart. The group combined for 200 assists last season while committing just 131 turnovers. They were also a phenomenal group at the free throw line, combining to convert 87 percent (138-for-159) of their charity tosses in 2006-07.

UIC HEAD COACH
Jimmy Collins
(178-156, 12th season)

Head Coach Jimmy Collins enters his 12th season at the helm of the UIC men's basketball program. The veteran mentor is not only the winningest coach in school history with 178 career wins, but is also the longest tenured Division I men's basketball coach in the state of Illinois. He has captured a conference regular season title (1998) and two league tournament crowns (2002, 2004) during his tenure, and has guided the Flames to three 20-win seasons in the last five years, including a school-record 24 victories in 2003-04.

Named co-conference coach of the year after his first season with the Flames, Collins has also guided UIC to its only three NCAA Tournament appearances in school history, taking the team to the Big Dance in 1998, 2002 and 2004. He also guided the Flames to their first-ever NIT bid in 2003.

Collins, who served as an assistant coach at Illinois for 13 years prior to his arrival at UIC, earned All-American honors as a player at New Mexico State, averaging 20.1 ppg while leading the Aggies to the Final Four during his senior season.

JIMMY COLLINS FAST FACTS

- * Jimmy Collins was introduced as the ninth head coach in UIC history on March 27, 1996.
- * Collins has propelled UIC to its first three NCAA Tournament bids (1998, 2002, 2004) and first NIT berth (2003) in school history.
- * Collins has led UIC to four 20-win seasons in his 11-plus years on the sidelines: 22 (1997-98); 20 (2001-02); 21 (2002-03); 24 (2003-04).
- * Collins is the program's all-time winningest coach with 178 career victories.
- * Collins has guided UIC to a league regular-season (1998) and two league tournament titles (2002, 2004) during his tenure.
- * Collins is the longest tenured Division I men's basketball coach in the state of Illinois and the second-longest tenured coach in the Horizon League behind Perry Watson of Detroit.
- * Collins was an assistant coach at the University of Illinois under Lou Henson for 13 years, including the 1989 season in which the Fighting Illini advanced to the Final Four.
- * As Illinois' top recruiter, Collins' high-profile Illini signees included: Kendall Gill, Nick Anderson, Marcus Liberty, Deon Thomas, Kiwane Garris and Lowell Hamilton.
- * Collins is the co-chairman of the Chicago Special Olympics.
- * Collins and his family are heavily involved with the Lupus Foundation of America Illinois Chapter. His daughter, Erica, serves on the Board of Directors for the Illinois Chapter.
- * Collins, as well as the rest of his 1970 New Mexico State Final Four squad, were inducted into the school's Hall of Fame on Feb. 7th, 2004.
- * Collins is a former first-round draft pick of the Chicago Bulls (1970).
- * Collins served as a hearing officer for the Cook County Probation Department prior to his appointment as an assistant coach at Illinois.
