NOTEBOOK

RETURNING FIRE:

Coming off a 2001 season in which UIC finished with a successful 11-6-1 mark, the Flames return nine starters to the field, including All-Horizon League honorees **Bruno Rasich** and **Joe Morelli**, along with all-newcomer team recipient **Patrick Grange**. UIC also returns its three top goal scorers from last season - **Dennis King** (10), **Grange** (9), **Jake Stasko** (5), as well as keeper **Jeff Kusciel**, who posted 10 wins in his first full season between the posts.

FIT TO BE KING:

UIC will be looking for junior standout **Dennis 'Mooch' King** to continue his offensive prowess this season. In 2001, he led the Flames with 10 goals while finishing second on the squad in assists with seven. His 27 points ranked seventh in the UIC single-season record books and he is currently slotted eighth on the career goals list with 15.

HOME ON THE GRANGE:

Sophomore **Patrick Grange** is hoping for no signs of a sophomore slump after putting together a stellar rookie campaign in 2001. All in all, Grange, who was the leagues highest scoring rookie, tallied nine goals and six assists for 24 points - second best on the team - and earned All-Horizon League Newcomer Team honors for his efforts.

HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE:

Flames Field has proven to be one of the hardest places to win in college soccer for visiting teams the last four years as UIC has compiled a record of 36-3 at the venue since the start of the 1998 campaign.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK:

Despite a large contingent of returning players, UIC will also feature eight newcomers in 2002. Head coach **Sasha Begovic** has brought in six prep players in defenseman **Jason Keiffer** (Frankfort, Ill.) and **Derek Kosek** (Batavia, Ill.), midfielders **Danjiel Bartulovic** (Gates Mills, Ohio) and **Roberto Gallo** (Roselle, Ill.), forward **Sinsia Ubiparipovic** (Mentor, Ohio) and goalkeeper **Ross Cain** (Rochester, Minn.). Begovic is also welcoming in a pair of transfers in defensman **Chris Berena** from West Virginia and **Ryan Singer** from Valparaiso.

KEEPING THAT WINNING FEELING:

The UIC soccer team will be vying for its sixth straight winning season in 2002. The Flames, who have gone 72-23-5 in the last five years, had not had a winning season since 1981 prior to their 13-6-1 campaign in 1997.

NOT AN EASY SLATE:

UIC takes on its usual mix of Midwest rivals during the 2002 scheduled, including home dates with Wisconsin (9/15), DePaul (9/25), Northwestern (10/16) and Michigan (10/25), as well as Horizon League foes UW-Milwaukee (10/2), Cleveland State (10/13) and UW-Green Bay (10/29).

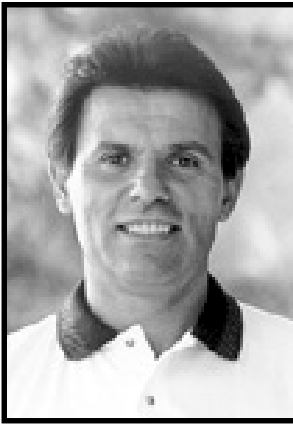

SASHA BEGOVIC

Not much more could be asked of UIC soccer head coach Sasha Begovic.

Entering his 13th season at the helm of the Flames program, Begovic has turned UIC into a premier team both in the Horizon League and the Midwest, compiling five consecutive winning seasons, two league championships, two NCAA tournament berths and a trip to the NCAA 'Sweet 16' in 2000.

Begovic has been successful by bringing the top local and national soccer talent to UIC. During his tenure, he has helped produce 13 First Team All-League honorees, five all-region performers and the school's first-ever NSCAA/Adidas All-American, Eric Lukin.

The 2001 season was another successful one for Begovic, who despite losing All-American forward Eric Lukin, guided the Flames to an 11-6-1 record while ranking nationally in NSCAA Poll during the year. UIC battled though injuries during the regular season to finish second in the Horizon League with a 4-2-1 mark, then had its hopes of a third straight trip to the NCAA Tournament dashed in the league tournament semifinals with a 2-0 loss to eventual champion, Butler.

Begovic, who enters the 2002 campaign with an overall mark of 111-107-9, earned his 100th collegiate coaching victory with the Flames' 1-0 win over 24th-ranked Bradley on Nov. 19, 2000 in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. That victory launched UIC on to its first-ever NCAA Sweet 16 appearance where it eventually fell to #3 Stanford. The Flames also notched an impressive milestone of their own as they finished ranked nationally for the first time ever, coming in at 21st in the country in the final 2000 National Soccer Coaches Association of America poll.

Along the road to its second straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2000, the Flames also captured their second straight Midwestern Collegiate Conference regular-season and tournament titles while also racking up a school record 18 victories. UIC landed seven players on the All-MCC teams with senior Eric Lukin collecting All-America recognition and MCC Player of the Year honors for the second straight season while rookie Pablo Melgar shared the league's newcomer of the year accolades.

In 1999, UIC enjoyed a storybook season as it captured its first-ever MCC regular-season and tournament titles while establishing a (then) school record with 17 wins. After compiling a 5-3 record through the first eight outings of the season, UIC caught fire in early October and went undefeated the remainder of the regular season, winning a record 12 straight games before falling to nationally-ranked Saint Louis in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, 3-2.

At the conclusion of the MCC season, Begovic was hailed MCC Coach of the Year by his peers while Lukin collected MCC Player of the Year accolades. In all, the Flames landed six individuals on all-conference teams.

In 1998, Begovic's squad enjoyed its (then) finest season in history as they matched a school record with 13 wins, recorded the most conference victories ever with five, ended up ranked eighth in the NCAA's Midwest Region and finished 10th in the country for win percentage (.794).

The Flames' recent success hasn't just happened overnight, however, as UIC has shown continued improvement each year under Begovic, highlighted by its back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances. After building and growing during his early years, Begovic's 1996 squad showed marked improvement as it compiled eight victories, the most since the school's first year of NCAA competition in 1981. In 1997, UIC put together its first winning season under Begovic as it finished up with a 13-6-1 overall record and matched the school record for victories. 1998's team matched the 13 wins and the 1999 squad smashed that record with its 17 victories only to be outdone again in 2000 as the Flames piled up 18 wins.

A native of Yugoslavia, Begovic has also worked as an assistant coach at Wilfrid Laurier University in Waterloo, Ontario.

One of Begovic's former players, Herc Anastasakis, continued his soccer career in Greece as he signed a contract with the First Division Team. Two-time All-American Eric Lukin, who concluded his record-setting career in 2000, became Begovic's first-ever draft pick as the star forward was selected by the Colorado Rapids in the Major League Soccer draft. Lukin was also drafted by the Detroit Rockers of the National Professional Soccer League in the first round.

Begovic has extensive soccer playing experience as he enjoyed a professional career in Europe, Canada and the United States.
