NEWS & NOTES:

THE NEW GUY:

In the season debut for the Flames against Eastern Illinois, **LeRoy Stevens** (Arlington Heights, Ill./Prospect) was strong in his college premiere winning the 200-yard free in 1:47.49. He also anchored the Flames' winning 400-yard medley relay team (3:39.72), but the Panthers prevailed, 124-112.

OTHER NEW GUYS:

A few other newcomers had solid debuts for the Flames. **Ari Bernstein** (River Forest, Ill./Oak Park-River Forest) was second in the 50-yard free (22:42) and 100-yard free (48:29) versus the Panthers. **Adan Jimenez** (Tinley Park, Ill./Tinley Park), **Bill Hare** (Lockport, Ill./Lockport) and **Matt Huffman** have also looked good in the first few meets of the ledger.

MAGEE OF DIFFICULTY:

Senior diver **Mike Magee** (Hinsdale, Ill./Hinsdale South) has started his season on the right pike. Magee has yet to lose, winning each of the four events he has entered. On the one-meter board versus EIU, Magee went 257.35 and 264.40 in the three-meter event. Against St. Louis, Magee won the one-meter with a score of 280.80 and three-meter scoring 300.50 points, as the Billikens won the meet, 140-101.

CAREY 5132D:

Sophomore diver **Caitlin Carey** (Buffalo, N.Y./Amherst Central) will be counted on heavily this season, and she has had steady shoulders thus far. Like Magee, Carey is undefeated, winning her first four competitions. Recently against St. Louis, Carey took the one-meter with a score of 258.60 and the three-meter scoring 271.00 points, but the Billikens won, 127-114.

MARTENS-IN THE HOUSE:

Newcomer **Laura Martensen** (Oak Park, Ill./Fenwick) hasn't shown any freshman jitters yet. Martensen got off to a quick start versus EIU, winning the 1000-free (10:41.78) and the 500-free (5:15.55) as the Flames were defeated 137-105. On Saturday against St. Louis, Martensen one-upped her performance from the prior week, winning three times versus the Billikens. Martensen pulled off the triple winning the 1650-free (17:51.92), the 200-fly (2:21.67) and the 500-free (5:16.90).

A-WILL:

Fellow frosh **Aisha Williams** (Sacramento, Cal./St. Francis) has also emerged out of the gates in the sprint-free events. Against EIU, Williams was third in the 50-free (25.71) and second in the 100-free (52.90) and versus SLU, Williams won the 50-free (25.64) and 100-free (54.78) to cap-off an exciting first seven days of competition for the Flames.
