What's On Tap:

FLAMES PREPARE FOR HORIZON LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS
UIC takes three weeks off for training as both the men's and the women's squads look to better their 2002 finish.

NEWS & NOTES:

IF I COULD BE LIKE MIKE:

Senior **Mike Magee** (Hinsdale, Ill./Hinsdale South) qualified for the NCAA Zone C Diving Championships as he tallied a season-best, first-place finish of 320.75 on the one-meter board versus Valparaiso on Friday at the UIC Natatorium. Magee also came back to win the three-meter competition later in the evening with a six-dive score of 281.90.

GETTING THE VICTORY:

The UIC men's and women's swimming and diving squads capped the 2002-03 regular season in fine fashion with wins over visiting Valparaiso at the UIC Natatorium. The men's team rolled to a 152-71 triumph while the women's squad downed the Crusaders, 131-88. The Flames are now off until opening competition at the 2003 Horizon League Swimming and Diving Championships in Cleveland, Ohio, on Feb. 26th.

A PAIR WITH A PAIR:

Freshman **Brian Kroes** (Hoffman Estates, Ill./Northern Illinois) and **LeRoy Stevens** (Arlington Heights, Ill./Prospect) helped the UIC men's swimming and diving team secure a victory over Valparaiso on Friday with each tallying a pair of event wins. Kroes won both the 500-yard freestyle (4:59.89) and 1,000-yard freestyle (10:28.20). Stevens dominated the sprint events with victories in the 50-yard freestyle (21.95)

and 100-yard freestyle (47.32). His 100-free time was the best posted by a UIC swimmer this season.

ADAN IS ABLE:

Adan Jimenez (Tinley Park, Ill./Tinley Park) should head into Horizon League Championship training with plenty of confidence after posting a season-best time of 1:45:09 en route to winning the 200-yard freestyle event versus Valparaiso on Friday evening. The time was the best posted by a UIC swimmer this season, bettering the time of 1:45:14 put up by LeRoy Stevens back on Feb. 1.

WHERE THERE'S A 'WILL,' THERE'S A WAY:

Rookie **Aisha Williams** (Sacramento, Calif./St. Francis) helped guide the UIC swimming and diving team to a victory over Valparaiso on Friday evening with a pair of individual event wins. Williams finished first in a season-best time of :25.50 in the 50-yard freestyle event, then posted her second triumph of the day, touching the wall in 1:01.61 in the 100-yard butterfly.

CAREY CRUISES:

Underclassman **Caitlan Carey** (Buffalo, N.Y./Amherst Central) joined men's diver Mike Magee in picking up a pair of victories on Friday versus Valparaiso. Carey swept the diving events with a 240.75 on the 1-meter board and a 263.75 on the 3-meter board.
