2012 PRESEASON NOTES

ILLINI LOOK TO CAPITALIZE ON STRONG FINISH

Illinois reached the NCAA Tournament in 2011, advancing to the championship game of the Fullerton Regional by eliminating No. 11 Cal State Fullerton and Kansas State before falling to No. 20 Stanford. It marked the first post-season appearance for the Illini since 2000.

The Orange and Blue have fared reasonably well in seasons following trips to the NCAA Tournament, posting an overall record of 188-151, including a 87-76 mark in Big Ten play. Illinois has made consecutive NCAA appearances three times (1947-48, 1962-63 and 1989-90), has won back-to-back Big Ten regular-season titles 11 times and has won consecutive Big Ten Tournament championships once (1989-90). The 2012 Illini will be in somewhat uncharted territory, though, since last season marked the first time in school history that Illinois won the Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles in the same campaign.

ORANGE & BLUE RELOAD FOR 2012

The Illini will have a much different look in 2012 than they did a year ago, as five starters in the field and two weekend starting pitchers graduated or were selected in the 2011 Major League Baseball Draft and signed professional contracts. Illinois' infield was hardest hit as shortstop Josh Parr was selected in the 12th round by the Arizona Diamondbacks, and second baseman Pete Cappetta and first baseman Matt Dittman both graduated. Catcher Adam Davis also was a 11th-round draft pick of the Baltimore Orioles. Plus, Casey McMurray, a four-year starter in left field, finished his eligibility in 2011.

Despite those prominent losses, Illinois still returns quite a bit of their offensive production. In all, the Orange and Blue return 47.8 percent (265 of 554) of their hits from last season and 42.7 percent of their runs (140 of 328). The Illini also return 42.6 percent of their extra-base hits (63 of 148), including 55 percent (11 of 20) of their triples. Illinois was hit a bit harder on the mound, though, as it returns 41.4 percent (206 2/3 of 499 2/3) of innings pitched and 42.9 percent (135 of 314) of strikeouts, but only 26.7 percent (8 of 30) of wins from 2011.

YOUTHFUL ILLINI READY FOR PRIME TIME...

After seeing a nine-man senior class graduate and having three juniors sign professional contracts following the 2011 season, the Illini will be an extremely young but talented squad in 2012. With 11 freshmen, five redshirt-freshmen and two junior college transfers, 18 members of Illinois' 35-man roster (51.4 percent) have yet to play in a game at the Division I level.

Infielder **Reid Roper** likely would have seen the field in 2011 had he not suffered a knee injury during 2010 fall practice. By the time he was cleared to play in the spring, Cappetta had taken hold of the second-base spot and the Illini coaches decided to preserve Roper's year of eligibility. Roper was a 29th-round draft pick by the Atlanta Braves in 2010 and was *Prep Baseball Report's* No. 5 overall prospect in the state in the class of 2010.

Right-handed pitcher **Drasen Johnson**, *PBR's* No. 25 prospect in Illinois in 2010, and left-handed pitcher **Rob McDonnell**, *PBR's* No. 32 prospect, also redshirted last season. As did catcher **Kelly Norris-Jones**, who has spent time with the Canadian Junior National Team in his career, and right-handed pitcher **Tyler Hamer**.

Sophomore **Jordan Parr** and junior **Brent Kuper** both transferred to Illinois from Parkland College and likely will challenge for time at first base and catcher, respectively.

...BUT TALENTED VETERANS PROVIDE FOUNDATION

But the Illini do have a strong group of talented veterans that will form the foundation of the 2012 team. Center fielder **Willie Argo** enters his fourth year in the starting lineup, while third baseman **Brandon Hohl** and No. 1 starting pitcher **Kevin Johnson** are in their third year as starters. Right fielder **Davis Hendrickson** and likely left fielder **Justin Parr** both will be in their second year starting for the Illini. Argo, Hendrickson, Hohl and Parr combined to start 220 out of a possible 228 games in 2011, and Johnson has started 29 games over the past two seasons. In their careers, Argo has started 155 of 163 games and Hohl has started 104 of 109.

ILLINOIS CONTINUES TO RUN AT WILL

The Illini were once again one of the most explosive teams in the nation on the basepaths, leading the Big Ten with 98 stolen bases and ranking 19th nationally with 1.72 steals per game. Illinois narrowly missed reaching 100 steals for the fourth time in the last five years but had four players with 15 or more steals. Willie Argo led the way by nabbing 25-of-35 bases and Josh Parr stole 17-of-19. Pete Cappetta swiped 15-of-16 bags and Adam Davis stole 15-of-19. Casey McMurray also reached double digits, stealing 10-of-11 on the season. Argo enters 2012 with 76 career steals, just eight shy of breaking Todd Schmitke's 30-year-old record of 83.

ILLINI GO 3-FOR-3 WITH PARR BROTHERS

Although shortstop Josh Parr left the Fighting Illini after being drafted by the Arizona Diamondbacks following the 2011 season, Illinois added Parr's younger brother, Jordan, to the fold when he transferred from Parkland College in Champaign, Ill. Jordan is the identical twin of Justin, who hit .317 primarily as Illinois' DH in 2011. A right-handed hitter like Josh, Jordan is the biggest of the three brothers at 6-foot-3, 195 pounds, and could serve as the Illini's first baseman after playing primarily third base and left field at Parkland. Jordan has three years of eligibility remaining because he redshirted the 2010 season.

ILLINOIS SIGNS ANOTHER STRONG CLASS

Illinois' coaching staff continued to recruit at a high level, signing an eight-man recruiting class in November 2011 that includes five players ranked in the top 30 in Illinois and a pair of promising out-of-state pitchers. Catcher Jason Goldstein will be in a position to continue Illinois' strong tradition behind the plate, as he is ranked the No. 4 catcher in the country and the No. 71 prospect nationally. Left-handed pitcher Kevin Duchene is *Prep Baseball Report's* No. 18 prospect in the state in the class of 2012, infielder Adam Walton is No. 20, utilityman Ryan Nagle is No. 22 and right-handed pitcher Nick Blackburn is No. 28. Right-handed pitcher and Davie, Fla., native Ryan Castellanos helped Archbishop McCarthy to a Florida Class 4A state championship and recognition as high school national champions by *Baseball America*, Perfect Game, *USA Today* and the National High School Coaches

Association. Left-handed pitcher J.D. Nielsen helped Martensdale St. Mary's to an Iowa Class 1A state championship in 2011, extending its winning streak to a national-record 87-games, by going 9-0 with a 1.43 ERA. And fellow left-handed pitcher Tyler Jay is a top-100 prospect in the state of Illinois by *PBR* after posting a 2.80 ERA with 70 strikeouts in 40 innings in 2011.

ILLINI POST ANOTHER 30-WIN SEASON

After an incredible late-season surge in which Illinois won 18 of its final 24 games, the Illini finished the year 30-27 overall to mark their fourth 30-win season in the last five campaigns. That appeared to be a very unlikely goal as Illinois entered the final series of the first half of Big Ten play in 2011, as the Orange and Blue carried a 12-20 mark into the three-game set against league-leading Michigan State. But after dropping the first game, the Illini rebounded to win the series.

Illinois won another series at Northwestern the following weekend and took a third-straight set from Ohio State the next week. After final exams ended, the Illini took advantage of a ninth-inning error in the rubber game at Purdue to take the series from the Boilermakers before sweeping Indiana at Illinois Field to mark the Orange and Blue's fifth-straight Big Ten series win, a new school record, and clinch a share of the conference title.

The Illini continued their improbable run, sweeping through the Big Ten Tournament with three straight wins, including a 5-4 comeback win over Ohio State in the tourney opener that required a four-run rally in the bottom of the ninth. Illinois notched its 30th win in a 7-5 victory over No. 11 Cal State Fullerton in an elimination game at the NCAA Fullerton Regional.

DICKINSON PROMOTED, ANDERSON JOINS STAFF

Former Illini All-American Drew Dickinson was promoted to a full-time assistant coach following the 2011 season after spending the campaign as a volunteer assistant. Dickinson starred for Illinois from 1999-2002, tying the school record for career wins and finishing with the third-most career innings pitched and strikeouts in school history. A two-time All-American in 2001 and 2002, Dickinson was drafted by the Oakland Athletics in 2002 and reached the Double-A level in their system. He also served as Illinois' volunteer assistant in 2009.

Another star Illini pitcher joined the coaching staff in the offseason as former All-American Jason Anderson is Illinois' volunteer assistant in 2012. Anderson retired from professional baseball in the summer of 2011 after a 12-year career. He reached the Majors with the New York Yankees, New York Mets and Cleveland Indians. Anderson was a first-team All-American in 2000, leading the Illini to the 2000 Big Ten Tournament title and an appearance in the NCAA Clemson Regional. He holds the school record for wins and innings pitched in a season, and ranks third in school history in career wins, fourth in career innings pitched and fifth in career strikeouts.

JOHNSON SEEKS JUNIOR JUMP

Junior starting pitcher Kevin Johnson looks to return to the success of his freshman year after a rocky sophomore campaign. Johnson went 2-7 with a 4.54 ERA but gutted out 103 innings in 2011, the eighth-most in a season in school history and most by an Illini pitcher since 2002. He allowed three or fewer runs in nine of 16 starts and pitched six-plus innings in 11 of 16 outings.

His 102 1/3 career innings in Big Ten play stand just outside of 10th place on the school record list (John Oestreich, 111 IP) and he needs 71 1/3 innings to make the overall career top 10 list. Johnson also needs 50 strikeouts to jump into the career strikeouts list and 11 to make the Big Ten career record list.

TRIO OF ILLINI ARMS RETURNS FROM INJURY

Three Fighting Illini pitchers sat out the 2011 season following Tommy John surgery, with right-handers Bryan Roberts and Nick Chmielewski, and lefty Rob McDonnell all being sidelined. Roberts compiled nine saves as Illinois' lights-out closer in 2010 after posting a 5-4 record as the Illini's Sunday starter in 2009. Chmielewski made only three late-inning relief appearances in 2010 before suffering his injury. He made 15 appearances, including three mid-week starts, as a freshman in 2008. McDonnell's surgery came after his senior year at Barrington High School. McDonnell and Chmielewski are two of the leading candidates to join Johnson in the starting rotation in 2012, while Roberts could return to his spot at the back end of the bullpen.

LINDAUER MOVES INTO STARTING ROLE

Sophomore **Thomas Lindauer** likely will take over at shortstop for Josh Parr in 2012 after seeing spot duty at shortstop and second base in 2011. Lindauer played well enough to earn All-Big Ten Freshman team honors, starting 10 conference games. He was named Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week on March 21 after keying an extra-inning Illini win at Southern Illinois to wrap up Spring Trip, and started nine consecutive games at second base from March 19-April 6. He slid over to shortstop when Parr was injured in batting practice prior to the April 8 game against Iowa and started seven straight games there, making only one error.

ILLINI FACE TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 2012

Illinois has one of its most imposing schedules on tap for the 2012 season, with six games against four teams that qualified for the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The Illini also will face four teams ranked in *Collegiate Baseball's* preseason Top 30 in No. 11 St. John's, No. 15 Louisville, No. 24 Oregon State and No. 27 Oregon. The Illini play the Red Storm twice, once at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge and once at the Coastal Carolina Invitational, and face both the Beavers and Ducks at the Nike College Showcase. In addition to OSU and St. John's, the Illini will play 2011 NCAA Tournament participants Coastal Carolina (twice) and Connecticut. The Orange and Blue also travel to Nebraska in their first Big Ten series and play at Purdue, Northwestern and Penn State in conference play.

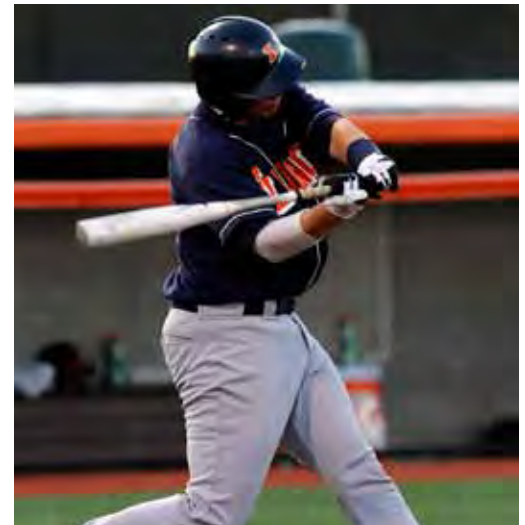
