### Series Notes: Indiana

# 2007-08 FIGHTING ILLINI BASKETBALL NOTES

## Tough Road

Illinois is in a stretch of having four of five games, as well as five of seven, on the road. Following Thursday's game at Wisconsin, the Illini are next at Indiana Sunday. After a home game vs. Michigan on Jan. 16, the Illini hit the road again for back-to-back games at Purdue (Jan. 19) and at Ohio State (Jan. 22). And after a home date vs. Northwestern (Jan. 27), the month wraps up with a contest at Michigan State (Jan. 30).

## Taking on the Top 25

Illinois faces its fourth ranked opponent this season on Sunday in No. 10 Indiana. Illinois is 0-3 vs. ranked opponents this season, falling to No. 13 Duke in Maui on Nov. 20 (79-66), No. 22 Arizona in Chicago on Dec. 8 (78-72, ot) and No. 21 Wisconsin in Madison on Thursday (70-60).

Illinois owns a record of 17-17 vs. Top 25 teams under Weber. The Wisconsin and Indiana games mark the first time Illinois is playing ranked teams in back-to-back games since Jan. 20 and 23, 2006, when the Illini faced the same two programs, hosting the 2nd-ranked Badgers (L, 71-64) and 23rd-ranked Hoosiers (W, 51-43).

The last time Illinois played consecutive games on the road against ranked opponents was nine years ago -- Jan. 3 and 7, 1999 -- at No. 8 Indiana (L, 62-53) and at No. 17 Iowa (L, 84-62).

## Oh So Close

In five of its eight losses, Illinois has either led, been tied or trailed by no more than two points with less than two minutes remaining ... Illinois has led during the second half in four losses ... Five of Illinois' losses have been by eight points or less ... Illinois is 3-5 on the year in games decided by less than nine points.

## Illini Notes ...

- Eight different players have been the Illini's leading scorer in a game this season (Brian Randle-5, Shaun Pruitt-3, Trent Meacham-4, Calvin Brock-2, Rodney Alexander-1, Demetri McCamey-1, Mike Tisdale-1, Chester Frazier-1)
- Losing streaks have been extremely rare during Bruce Weber's five-year tenure at Illinois. This is the first time under Weber that the Illini have lost four

straight games. It is the program's first four-game losing streak since 1999 and the first time the UI has lost three straight Big Ten games since 2002.

- Only four opponents have scored more than 70 points against the Illini this season (last: Ohio State on Jan. 3, 74 pts).
- Illinois has not allowed an opponent to score 80 or more points in 42 consecutive games. The last team to do so was Arizona on Dec. 2, 2006 (84 points).
- Illinois has only had two opponents this season shoot better than 46 percent from the field (Duke on Nov. 20, 56.5%, and Wisconsin on Thursday, 52.1%).
- Illinois has outrebounded its opponent in 12 of 16 games and ranks fifth in the Big Ten in rebound margin at +4.8 rpg.
- Calvin Brock is averaging 14.5 points over the last two games after scoring a season-high 15 points vs. Penn State last Sunday and 14 points at Wisconsin on Thursday.
- Brock is shooting 60.9 percent from the field (14-23) and has made 5-of-6 from behind the arc in conference play.
- Demetri McCamey is averaging 11.0 points (55) on 44.7 percent shooting from the field (20-46) and 42.1 percent from 3-point range (8-19) over the last five games. McCamey is Illinois' leading scorer in Big Ten play, averaging 12.3 ppg.
- Trent Meacham knocked down 4-of-5 three-pointers vs. Wisconsin on Thursday, the top 3-point shooting performance by an Illini player this season.
- Chester Frazier has a 3-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio of over the last five games (27 a/9 to). He had a season-high seven assists at Wisconsin on Thursday and just one turnover in 30 minutes.
- Shaun Pruitt has scored at least nine points in all but two games this season.
- Illinois played seven road/neutral games during non-conference play, tied for the second-highest total of road/neutral games among BCS schools.
- Pruitt was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 24 after averaging 16.3 points and 10.3 rebounds over three games vs. Western Carolina, Miami (OH) and Missouri. He became the first Illini to earn Player of the Week honors since James Augustine on Dec. 5, 2005.
- Pruitt scored in double figures for five consecutive

## Illini Head Coach Bruce Weber

Bruce Weber has led the Fighting Illini to the top of the national charts while at the helm of the Illinois program.

Weber directed the Illini to 23 wins last season, a fourth-place Big Ten finish, and to the program's eighth straight NCAA Tournament appearance, tying a school record.

He led the Illini to 26 wins in 2005-06 which tied the fourth-winningest season in school history, a runner-up finish in the Big Ten and the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Weber led Illinois to an NCAA record-tying 37 victories and the school's first appearance in the national championship game during the 2004-05 season. Illinois won its first 29 games that year and was ranked No. 1 in the national polls the final 15 weeks of the season. Weber became the first coach in Big Ten history to lead his squad to outright Big Ten titles in each of his first two seasons, with Illinois' outright conference championship in 2005 with a 15-1 league record. The Illini success helped Weber be named National Coach of the Year by 10 different organizations.

Weber became just the third coach in Big Ten history to win an outright title in his first season in the league in 2003-04, leading the Illini to 10 straight victories to end the regular season and claim the title. The Illini won 26 games to tie the fourth-winningest season in school history and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the 2004 NCAA Tournament.

Now in his fifth year leading the Illini, Weber came to Illinois following five years at Southern Illinois where he led the Salukis to Missouri Valley Conference titles each of his last two seasons.

In his five seasons at SIU, Weber took the Saluki program to the top of the MVC, winning league titles in 2002 and 2003. He posted records of 28-8 and 24-7 in his last two seasons, leading the Salukis to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances.

A 1978 graduate of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Weber spent 18 years as an assistant at Purdue under Gene Keady before moving to SIU.

Weber has helped teams make 21 NCAA Tournament appearances in his previous 28 seasons as a collegiate coach, including one Final Four, one Elite Eight and four Sweet Sixteen appearances. Purdue won six Big Ten titles during his stay in West Lafayette.

games before the streak was snapped vs. Tennessee State (Dec. 30) when he finished with seven points. During the streak, Pruitt totaled 24 points vs. Arizona and Miami (OH), 16 vs. Loyola (MD), 14 vs. Missouri and 11 vs. Western Carolina. Over that five-game stretch, he averaged 17.8 points and 10.2 rebounds.

- Brian Randle averaged 12.4 points over a five-game stretch prior to Dec. 30. He left the Tennessee State game late in the first half after suffering a mild concussion. Randle returned to action vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3 and scored a team-high 14 points in a career-high 37 minutes.

- Pruitt and Randle combined for 38 points vs. Miami on Dec. 20, the duo's highest scoring total this season.

- Chester Frazier is averaging 5.1 assists over the last 11 games (56) after averaging just 2.6 assists over the first five games (13). He had a season-high seven assists at Wisconsin on Thursday.

- Shaun Pruitt leads the Big Ten in offensive rebounds with an average of 3.7 per game (59 total off. reb.). He ranks fourth in the league in total rebounds (7.9 avg).

- Pruitt has started every game over the past two-and-a-half seasons, entering the Indiana game with an active streak of 84 consecutive starts.

- There have been 53 consecutive sellout crowds at the Assembly Hall entering the next home game vs. Michigan on Jan. 16. The streak began on Dec. 6, 2004.

- Illinois held Loyola (MD) to 20 percent shooting (13-65) on Dec. 28, the lowest field goal percentage in the 44-year history of Assembly Hall.

- Illinois' defense held Western Carolina to 35 points on Dec. 17, the third-lowest point total in Assembly Hall history and just one point off the record-low score of 34 set by Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 1985 and tied by Savannah State last season.

- Illinois defeated Missouri on Dec. 22 in the 27th annual Braggin' Rights game in St. Louis. It marked the Illini's eighth straight win in the series, tying the school record for consecutive Braggin' Rights wins. Illinois also won eight straight over Mizzou from 1983-90.

## Last Time Out: Wisconsin

Illinois dropped a 70-60 decision at No. 21 Wisconsin on Thursday night. The Illini trailed by just three points, 44-41 with 9:30 left, when Wisconsin went on

a critical 16-5 run over the next four-and-a-half minutes that determined the game.

Trent Meacham and Calvin Brock scored 14 points each to lead the Illini. Brock made 6-8 from the field one day after a taking an elbow to the face in practice that required 16 stitches. Chester Frazier also performed admirably. A game-time decision after missing two days of practice with a rib injury, Frazier came off the bench to play 30 minutes and had a season-high seven assists.

## Legion Joins Illini

Alex Legion has joined the Illini basketball program after transferring from the University of Kentucky. Legion began practicing with the Illini on Saturday and will attend classes when the semester begins Monday. He must sit out the next two semesters under NCAA transfer rules and will be eligible to return to competition following the conclusion of the 2008 fall semester. He will have 2.5 years of eligibility remaining with the Illini.

Legion, a 6-5, 195-pound guard, hails from Detroit. He spent three years at Country Day High School before attending Oak Hill Academy as a senior. Legion was a 2007 *Parade Magazine* All-American after averaging 19.6 points, 5.7 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.8 steals at Oak Hill, where he shot 53 percent from the field, 42 percent from 3-point range and 85 percent from the free throw line. He also was a two-time first-team Class B All-State selection in 2005 and 2006 at Country Day by the *Associated Press*, *Detroit News* and *Detroit Free Press*.

Legion played in a total of six games last semester at Kentucky, starting twice. He averaged 6.7 points, 1.8 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.5 steals in 17.5 minutes per game.

## Lock Down "D"

Illinois has been one of the nation's top defensive teams each year under Bruce Weber. This year's squad looks to continue that style of aggressive man-to-man defensive pressure throughout each game. Illinois ranks sixth in the Big Ten in scoring defense with opponents averaging 61.9 points per game on the season. The Illini are fourth in the league in field goal percentage defense (.392) and second in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.301).

No team has reached 80 points on the Illini this season, with just four opponents scoring more than 70 points. Illinois' defense also has allowed only two teams (Duke and Wisconsin) to shoot over 46 percent from the field.

## Dominating the Glass

Illinois has outrebounded 12 of 16 opponents this year and owns a rebounding margin of +4.8 on the season. Illinois ranks fifth in the Big Ten in rebounding margin and also is fifth in the conference in total rebounds, averaging 38.4 rpg.

## Pruitt a Force Inside

Illinois has one of the top post players in the Big Ten in senior and three-year starting center Shaun Pruitt. A preseason All-Big Ten selection, Pruitt leads the Illini in scoring and rebounding, averaging 12.4 points (17th in Big Ten) and 7.9 rebounds (4th in Big Ten). He has scored at least nine points in all but two games this season, with a career-high 24 points vs. both Arizona and Miami (OH), 16 vs. Loyola (MD), 15 at Hawaii, 14 vs. Missouri, 12 vs. Northeastern and Ohio State, 11 vs. both Duke and Western Carolina, 10 at Maryland, and nine each vs. Arizona State, Oklahoma State, Penn State and Wisconsin.

Pruitt made 10-of-11 from the field against Arizona on Dec. 8, which tied the sixth-best shooting performance in school history and is the top percentage by a Big Ten player this season.

Pruitt scored in double figures for five consecutive games before the streak came to an end vs. Tennessee State on Dec. 30 (7 points). During that stretch, he had 24 points vs. Arizona, 11 vs. Western Carolina, 24 again vs. Miami, 14 vs. Missouri and 16 vs. Loyola. It marked the first time he reached double figures in five straight games since his streak of six straight games last season (1/20/07 through 2/7/07).

Pruitt has 12 career double-doubles including three this season: 12 pts-17 reb vs. Northeastern, 24 pts-15 reb vs. Miami and 16 pts-11 reb vs. Loyola. His career-high 17 rebounds vs. Northeastern marked the highest rebounding total by an Illini player in eight seasons, since Sergio McClain had 18 rebounds at Michigan on Jan. 16, 2000.

In addition to ranking fourth in the Big Ten in rebounding, Pruitt leads the league in offensive rebounds with an average of 3.7 per game (59 total).

One of the most Illini's most durable players in recent years, Pruitt has started every game over the last two-and-a-half seasons and enters the Indiana game with an active streak of 84 consecutive starts.

He is Illinois' active career scoring leader with

829 career points. If he maintains his season scoring average, Pruitt should join the 1,000-point club around the first week of March.

### Randle More Aggressive on Offense

Senior and three-year starter Brian Randle currently carries a career-high scoring average of 9.8 points, ranking third on the team. He reached double figures in each of the first four games this season, a career-best streak, before it came to an end vs. Oklahoma State on Nov. 21 when he left due to injury just seven minutes into the game. Randle had 14 points in the opener vs. Northeastern, 12 points at Hawaii, a career-high 17 points vs. Arizona State and 16 points vs. Duke.

Randle returned to double figures for the first time in four games vs. Arizona on Dec. 8, scoring 11 points. He also had a season-high five assists vs. the Wildcats. He just missed double figures vs. Western Carolina, finishing with nine points.

Randle scored 14 points vs. Miami (OH) on 6-10 shooting. He had 11 points in the win over Missouri and then tied his career high with 17 points against Loyola (MD), hitting 7-of-10 shots.

He was off to another strong start vs. Tennessee State on Dec. 30, with six points and six boards before suffering a mild concussion just before halftime.

Randle returned to the court vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3 and led the Illini in scoring with 14 points while playing a career-high 37 minutes.

Randle ranks second on the team in field goal percentage on the season, shooting 48.9 percent from the field. He also is the team's third-leading rebounder with an average of 4.9 boards on the season.

### D-Mac Emerges

Freshman point guard Demetri McCamey has been a bright spot for the Illini recently, earning increased playing time and his first career start Thursday at Wisconsin.

McCamey has averaged 11.0 points (55) on 43.5 percent shooting from the field (20-46) and 42.1 percent from 3-point range (8-19) over the last five games, playing an average of 24.2 minutes per game.

He had nine points each vs. Loyola (MD) and Tennessee State. He then reached double figures in his first career Big Ten game with 10 points vs. Ohio State.

McCamey had the best game of his young career last Sunday vs. Penn State, scoring a career-high 18 points on 7-12 shooting, including 4-6 from behind the arc. He scored Illinois' last eight points of the game, all in the final two minutes, on a layup and back-to-back 3-pointers.

McCamey most recently had nine points, a season-high seven rebounds and four assists at Wisconsin.

McCamey is fifth on the Illini in scoring on the year (6.6 ppg) and ranks third on the team in assists (2.4 apg). He leads the Illini in scoring in Big Ten play with an average of 12.3 points.

### Frazier Does It All

Point guard Chester Frazier has earned a reputation for his relentless play and ability to impact the game in all areas. Leading the team in playing time at 33.8 minutes per contest (fifth in Big Ten), Frazier is averaging 4.8 points. He leads the Illini and ranks seventh in the conference in assists (4.3 apg) and is second on the team in steals (0.8 spg).

Despite standing 6-2, Frazier also is second on the team in rebounding behind Pruitt with an average of 5.3 rpg. He currently ranks 15th in the Big Ten in rebounding and is the only point guard listed among the league's top 20 rebounders.

Frazier has twice grabbed a season-high nine rebounds, at Hawaii and vs. Duke. He also tallied eight

boards vs. Oklahoma State and Penn State, and seven at Maryland. He has been the UI's leading rebounder in five games this season.

Frazier has played through a number of injuries over the course of his career, including a strained quad, turf toe, sprained ankle, and sprained knee. His most recent episode came last Sunday during the Penn State game when he suffered a rib injury that caused him to miss two days of practice. He was scratched from the starting lineup vs. Wisconsin and was considered doubtful, but came off the bench to play 30 minutes despite the pain. Frazier had a career-high seven assists vs. the Badgers with just one turnover.

Over the last five games, Frazier has a 3-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio (27 assists/9 turnovers).

### Meacham Settles in at Shooting Guard

Junior Trent Meacham shared time at point guard and shooting guard last season, but with the addition of freshman Demetri McCamey to share point guard responsibilities with junior Chester Frazier, Coach Weber has Meacham focusing solely on the shooting guard position this season. The move has helped Meacham settle in and define his role on this year's squad.

Meacham is second on the Illini in scoring with an average of 10.3 points. He is also ninth in the Big

Meacham has had some big games, topping 20 points twice and reaching double figures six times on the year. Meacham scored a career-high 26 points vs. Weber State on Dec. 1 and had 24 vs. Tennessee State on Dec. 30. He also scored 17 vs. Oklahoma State (Nov. 21), 16 vs. Arizona (Dec. 8), 14 at Wisconsin and 13 vs. Missouri (Dec. 22).

### Illini Program Ranked Among Nation's Finest

Two national magazines recently ranked the Fighting Illini men's basketball program among the nation's elite in two very different categories.

*Forbes Magazine* ranked the Most Valuable College Basketball Teams and placed a value of \$19.4 million on the Illini program, which ranked sixth in the nation and tied Indiana for tops in the Big Ten. The valuations were based on what the basketball programs contribute to four important beneficiaries: their university (money generated by basketball that goes to the institution for academic purposes, including scholarship payments for basketball players); athletic department (the net profit generated by the basketball program retained by the department); conference (the distribution of tournament revenue); and local communities (incremental spending by visitors to the county during the regular season that is attributable to the program).

*Stack Magazine* ranked the nation's basketball programs using the 2008 *U.S. News* ranking for colleges and universities, the APR score, final national rankings for the past three seasons and games above .500 for the past three seasons. In this ranking, Illinois finished fifth nationally and again was tops among the Big Ten institutions.

### Pruitt Named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week Dec. 24

Shaun Pruitt was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Dec. 24, earning his first career weekly honor.

Pruitt averaged 16.3 points and 10.3 rebounds over three games to earn the accolade. He was the Illini's top scorer and rebounder in all three contests, record-

ing 11 points and eight rebounds vs. Western Carolina, 24 points and 15 rebounds vs. Miami (OH), and 14 points and eight rebounds vs. Missouri. His 24 points against Miami tied his career high, first set Dec. 8 vs. Arizona. Pruitt's top moment of the week came against Missouri, when he scored the game-winning basket off an offensive rebound with 35 seconds left, capping off an undefeated career for the Illini senior in the Braggin' Rights game.

### Illini Still Braggin'

Illinois brought home the Braggin' Rights trophy for the eighth straight year, defeating Missouri 59-58 on Dec. 22 in St. Louis. Shaun Pruitt made a game-winning basket off an offensive rebound with 35 seconds left to give Illinois the victory. Pruitt led the Illini with 14 points and eight rebounds while Trent Meacham had 13 points, five rebounds and five assists and Brian Randle added 11 points and eight boards.

With eight consecutive wins in the series, Illinois has tied its school record for consecutive Braggin' Rights wins. The Illini also won eight straight over Mizzou from 1983-90.

Illinois' defense was stifling in the win, holding Missouri to a season-low 58 points, more than 26 points below its season average and marking the first time Mizzou has scored less than 72 points on the season. The Tigers also shot a season-low 34.5 percent (20-58), its first game this season shooting less than 41 percent.

### Road Tested

Illinois played a challenging schedule prior to Big Ten play in a number of locations. Seven of Illinois' non-conference games came on the road (Hawaii, Maryland) or at neutral sites (Arizona State, Duke and Oklahoma State in Maui, Arizona in Chicago and Missouri in St. Louis). ### Topping the Big Ten

Two Illini players have had performances that rank at the top of the conference this season. Shaun Pruitt's 10-for-11 (.909) shooting day vs. Arizona on Dec. 8 is the best field goal percentage by a Big Ten player this season. Trent Meacham, meanwhile, had 11 baskets vs. Weber State on Dec. 1, tied for the most field goals by a league player on the year.

### Brock Named to Maui Invite All-Tourney Team

Junior Calvin Brock was named to the EA SPORTS Maui Invitational All-Tournament Team (Nov. 19-21) after averaging 9.3 points and 4.3 rebounds during the tournament in just over 21 minutes per game. Brock came off the bench to record a season-high 14 points vs. Duke, which was also the second-highest scoring output of his career. He earned his first start of the season the following day vs. Oklahoma State and scored in double figures again with 12 points on 5-7 shooting while pulling down a game-high eight boards. He shot 50 percent (11-22) on the week and also led the Illini with five steals.

### Illinois Finishes Third at Maui Invite

Illinois finished third at the 2007 EA SPORTS Maui Invitational, held Nov. 19-21. The Illini rolled past Arizona State 77-54 in the opening round, behind career-high totals of 17 points apiece from Brian Randle and Rodney Alexander. Illinois fell to No. 13 Duke 79-66 in the semifinal, as Brian Randle again led the UI with 16 points. Trent Meacham then came off the bench to score 17 points as the Illini won the third-place game with a 65-49 victory over Oklahoma State.

## Illini Storylines For the 2007-08 Season

- Illinois returns three starters on this year's squad in point guard Chester Frazier, forward Brian Randle and center Shaun Pruitt.

- Senior Shaun Pruitt is the Illini's leading returning scorer and rebounder. A third-team All-Big Ten selection last year and a preseason first-team All-Big Ten honoree this season, Pruitt was second on the team in scoring in 2006-07 (11.4 ppg) and led the Illini and ranked third in the Big Ten in rebounding (7.5 rpg). Pruitt also ranked fourth in the conference in field goal percentage (.549) and was second in the league with nine double-doubles on the year. He was the only Illini player to start all 35 games last season, and also started all 33 games as a sophomore.

- Junior Chester Frazier was named to the Big Ten All-Defensive Team last season. He averaged 7.2 points and 4.5 rebounds while ranking fourth in the conference in assists (4.5 apg) and sixth in the league steals (1.5 spg).

- Senior Brian Randle missed nearly one-third of the season last year due to a number of injuries. In 23 starts, he averaged 7.4 points and was third on the team in rebounding (5.0 rpg).

- Illinois welcomed a number of new faces to the program this season. In fact, Illini coach Bruce Weber believes it is the largest group of newcomers he has ever had in his 29 years coaching college basketball. There are six new players on campus this year: guards Demetri McCamey and Jeff Jordan, forwards Rodney Alexander, Bill Cole and Mike Davis, and center Mike Tisdale. In addition, junior Steve Holdren is eligible after sitting out last season as a transfer, and freshman Richard Semrau has rejoined the active roster after taking a medical redshirt last season.

- Illinois is happy to having a healthy and deep roster after a number of injuries took its toll on last season's squad. Six different players combined to miss a total of 58 games due to injury in 2006-07.

- Illinois ranked fourth in the nation in scoring defense last year, allowing an average of just 57.1 points on the season. The Illini also ranked 21st in the NCAA in field goal percentage defense (.402) and 29th in rebounding margin (+5.2 rpg).

- In conference games, Illinois led the Big Ten in scoring defense (55.8) and 3-point field goal percentage defense (.286), while ranking third in field goal percentage defense (.404).

## Illini Nation's Fifth-Winningest Team Under Weber

Illinois has won a total of 120 games during Bruce Weber's tenure in Champaign. Illinois currently ranks as the fifth-winningest team in the nation over the last four-and-a-half seasons. The Illini were tied with Duke and Florida for the most wins nationally at 112 each over a four-year period from 2004-07.

Illinois recorded 26 wins in 2003-04, an NCAA record-tying 37 victories in 2004-05, 26 wins in 2005-06, 23 wins last year, and eight victories so far this season. ## Illinois Appears in NCAA Tournament for Eighth Straight Year

Illinois made its 27th all-time appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2007, which is the second highest number of Tournament appearances among Big Ten schools (behind Indiana's 34). Illinois ranks 11th among NCAA schools for most Tournament appearances.

Last season also marked the Illini's eighth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, tying a school record. The UI previously appeared in eight straight Tournaments from 1983-90.

The Illini are one of only 10 schools in the nation to appear in the NCAA Tournament every year since 2000 and have advanced to the Sweet 16 or further four of the last seven years. The following is a look at Illinois' results in the NCAA Tournament over the past eight years:

## Illini By the Numbers Under Weber

Illinois has been a consistent winner under Bruce Weber, a tenure that spans the most successful period in school history. The following is a breakdown of Illinois' success under Weber:

- 120-36: Illinois' overall record under Weber, a winning percentage of .769.
- 60-9: Illinois' record at the Assembly Hall under Weber, a winning percentage of .870.
- 37-2: Illinois' record in 2004-05, which tied the record for the winningest season in NCAA history.
- 26-7: Illinois' record in 2005-06 as well as 2003-04, which tie the fourth-winningest seasons in school history.
- 23-12: Illinois' record last season.
- 48-19: Illinois' record in Big Ten play under Weber – which includes back-to-back outright championships in 2004 and 2005 – a winning percentage of .716.
- 105-29: Illinois' record in regular season games under Weber, a winning percentage of .784.
- 57-10: Illinois' record in regular season non-conference games under Weber, a winning percentage of .851.
- 24-14: Illinois' record in road games under Weber, a winning percentage of .632.

## Assembly Hall Turns Pink at Illini Madness

Illinois tipped-off the season on Oct. 12 with Illini Madness. The Assembly Hall, which is usually a sea of orange on game night, was painted pink that evening as over 12,000 fans wore pink Fighting Illini Basketball t-shirts that served as their ticket to the event along with raising awareness for the fight against cancer. Proceeds from shirt sales went to

Coaches vs. Cancer and with 20,000 shirts sold coupled with a donation from Orange Krush, the evening raised approximately \$47,500 for cancer research.

## Illini Get Headstart on Season with Trip to Canada

The Illini got off to an early start on the 2007-08 season by participating in an exhibition tour of Canada over Labor Day weekend. The Illini practiced on campus for nine days before playing two games in Ottawa, followed by two games in Montreal. The Illini went 3-1 on the tour and gained valuable experience heading into the official start of practice on Oct. 12. Shaun Pruitt led the team during the trip with an average of 14.5 points and 7.8 rebounds, while Steve Holdren averaged 14.3 points and Trent Meacham added 10.3 ppg.

## Illinois' Academic Success Under Weber

All 12 players that completed their athletic eligibility at the University of Illinois have earned their degrees during Bruce Weber's tenure. The Illini basketball team also has the highest Academic Progress Rate (APR) in the Big Ten in the most recent report released in May 2007, with a score of 986 based on three-year data from the 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06 school years. Illinois received a public recognition award by the NCAA for ranking in the top 10 percent nationally among schools that sponsor men's basketball, and the Illini were one of only 10 schools to both rank in the top 10 percent of the APR and participate in the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

## Weber Honored for Work with Coaches vs. Cancer

Bruce Weber has been one of the nation's most active participants in the Coaches vs. Cancer (CVC) program that raises money for the American Cancer Society. He was recognized for his efforts by being named the 2007 recipient of the Coaches vs. Cancer Champion Award, as chosen by members of the CVC National Council. Weber and the University of Illinois ranked sixth nationally during the 2006-07 season, raising nearly \$200,000 for cancer research.

## Howard Returns to Illini Family

Former Illini Jerrance Howard was hired as an assistant coach by Bruce Weber in September. Howard was a four-year letterwinner at point guard from 2001-04. During his career, Illinois compiled a record of 104-31 and won three Big Ten championships, a Big Ten Tournament title and appeared in the NCAA Tournament all four years, advancing to the Elite Eight in 2001 and the Sweet 16 in both 2002 and 2004.

## Illini Rewrite Attendance Records

A number of Illinois attendance records were broken last season. There were 17 sellout crowds at the Assembly Hall in 2006-07, setting a school record for most sellouts in a season.

Last year also set a school record for highest total attendance in a season, with a total of 282,506 fans passing through the turnstiles.

Illinois tied its record for highest average attendance for a season, with the sellout average of 16,618 equaling the mark first set in 2005-06. The Illini ranked 10th in the nation last year in average home attendance.

## Illini Fourth-Winningest Team in Big Ten History over Four-Year Period

Illinois won 112 games from 2004-07, which tied the fourth-winningest period in Big Ten history over four consecutive seasons. Illinois now owns three of the top five spots on that list, also ranking second with 114 wins from both 2002-05 and 2003-06. Simpson is a 6-9, 220-pound power forward/center that attends Simeon High School under the direction of head coach Robert Smith. Simpson transferred to Simeon, the two-time defending Class AA state champions, after playing at Leo High School for coach Noah Cannon. He is also a member of the Illinois Warriors AAU team coached by Larry Butler.

Simpson averaged 18 points, 11 rebounds and five blocks last season as a junior at Leo, earning All-Catholic League honors and honorable mention all-state accolades. He is rated a three-star recruit by both Rivals.com and Scout.com.

... Illinois has the highest all-time winning percentage among Big Ten schools, and ranks second behind Indiana in all-time victories. In all-time Big Ten play, the Illini are first in conference wins, and third in winning percentage behind Purdue and Indiana.

... Illinois ranks second in the Big Ten behind Indiana in total NCAA appearances with 27, including the last eight in a row.

... The Orange Krush student group is more than just a Fighting Illini cheering section. The students raised over \$300,000 last season, which went to the the I FUND and a variety of local and national charities. Krush has endowed two scholarships, the Matthew Heldman Memorial Scholarship Fund, which goes to an Illinois basketball player and is named after the former Illini point guard who was tragically killed in a car accident, and the Rod Cardinal Sports Medicine Fund, which goes towards UI student athletic trainers and is named for the man who served for 30 years as athletic trainer for the Illini basketball team. Since the inception of the Orange Krush Foundation in 1998, the group has distributed more than \$1.5 million to charities.

## Game #13 Illinois 58 Tennessee State 60 Dec. 30, 2007 Assembly Hall, Champaign, Ill.

Tigers' Bruce Price scored 17 points to lead Tennessee State to a 60-58 road win against Illinois.

Jerrell Houston added 12 points for Tennessee State (4-7), which last played on Dec. 22 in an 83-74 loss to No. 15 Vanderbilt.

The Tigers led 29-24 at halftime behind 40 percent shooting from the field and five 3-pointers. Tennessee State ended the game 8-for-19 from 3-point range.

The Tigers' second-half advantage increased to 47-33 before Illinois (8-5) rallied to cut the lead to 48-45 off a Trent Meacham 3-pointer.

Meacham hit five 3-pointers, including one with 1:04 to play that brought the score to 59-58. But the Tigers held off the Illini for the win.

Meacham led Illinois with a game-high 24 points. Demetri McCamey added nine points.

## Game #14 Illinois 58 Ohio State 74 Jan. 3, 2008 Assembly Hall, Champaign, Ill.

Jamar Butler scored 32 points to lead Ohio State to a 74-58 win over Illinois Thursday night in the Big Ten opener for both teams.

Butler accounted for almost half of his team's offense in the first half, then scored 15 straight points early in the second, when the Buckeyes (10-3, 1-0) pulled away from the Illini. The senior guard, who averaged 14.2 points coming into the game, was 4-for-7 from 3-point range.

Forward Othello Hunter added 15 points for Ohio State. Illinois held 7-foot center Kosta Koufos, the Buckeyes' leading scorer coming into the game, to eight points.

Senior forward Brian Randle led Illinois (8-6, 0-1) with 14 points. Center Shaun Pruitt added 12 points and eight rebounds.

Both teams struggled shooting in a physical first half, which saw the score tied seven times.

Aside from 13 first-half points from Butler, the Buckeyes were largely lifeless with the ball, hitting 2-of-11 3-point shots and 11-of-30 field goals in the first 20 minutes.

The Illini shot 2-of-10 from 3-point range in the first half and 12-of-29 from the field.

## Game #15 Illinois 64 Penn State 68 Jan. 6, 2008 Assembly Hall, Champaign, Ill.

Jamelle Cornley and Geary Claxton had their second straight pair of double-doubles Sunday and Penn State held off Illinois, 68-64.

Cornley had 18 points and 12 rebounds and Claxton added 11 points and 11 boards.

Freshman guard Demetri McCamey led the Illini with 18 points.

It was McCamey who breathed late life into the Illini. After Claxton hit a pair of free throws to put the Illini up 63-58 with 41 seconds left, McCamey hit a pair of 3-pointers that pulled Illinois within a point at 65-64 with 10 seconds left.

But he missed his last shot, and the Illini's last chance, floating up a shot from inside the lane.

Penn State started only one player taller than 6-5 Sunday, but outmuscled Illinois on the boards, 49-24.

Penn State watched Illinois pull away to a lead of 9 midway through the first half, 20-11. Seven early points from junior Calvin Brock, all on long-range jumpers, helped build that lead.

The Nittany Lions slowly reeled Illinois back in, closing to within a point twice late in the half before taking their first lead, 25-24, on a pair of Talor Battle free throws with 2:22 left. Battle had 9 for the game.

After falling behind by 9, Penn State outscored Illinois 38-23 over the next 25 minutes, giving the Nittany Lions a 49-43 lead with 12 minutes left in the second half.

Trevon Hughes scored 22 points and Brian Butch added 16 as No. 21 Wisconsin beat Illinois 70-60 in Madison on Thursday night.

The Illini (8-8, 0-3 Big Ten) are the only conference team to beat Wisconsin (13-2, 3-0) in the Kohl Center under coach Bo Ryan, who improved to 48-2 at home in Big Ten play.

Illinois managed to hang around for much of the game by grabbing 13 offensive rebounds while limiting Wisconsin to just four and shooting well from behind the 3-point line, a rarity for the Illini.

But the Badgers were finally able to take charge midway through the second half. Calvin Brock brought the Illini within 44-41 with just under 10 minutes to go before Wisconsin responded with consecutive 3-pointers from Jason Bohannon and Hughes. That sparked a 16-5 run over the next five minutes that put Wisconsin up 60-46, and Illinois wouldn't threaten again.

Brock and Trent Meacham both had 14 points for Illinois. Meacham was 4-of-5 from behind the 3-point arc and Illinois was 6-of-10. The Illini came into the game hitting just 28 percent from long range.

When the Illini found their stroke from the outside, their post presence was limited because of foul trouble. Shaun Pruitt was held to 25 minutes and scored nine points, while Brian Randle scored four points and fouled out. The two combined to shoot 5-of-15 from the field and grabbed nine rebounds.
