FOR OPENERS

• The Fighting Illini (2-1) return to Memorial Stadium to host the Miami (Ohio) Redhawks (0-3) after an open date last weekend. Illinois is coming off a 34-24 loss to No. 19 Washington at Soldier Field on Sept. 14.

• The revamped Illinois offense, directed by new offensive coordinator **Bill Cubit**, has jumped at least 60 spots in the national rankings from last year to this year in passing offense, passing efficiency, scoring offense, total offense and turnovers lost, with the biggest turnaround a 95-place swing in long plays from scrimmage. The results have been astounding:

• Illinois tallied nine scrimmage plays of 20-plus yards against Cincinnati and has 21 plays of 20-plus yards on the season, ranking 27th nationally. The Illini had 34 plays of 20-plus yards in the entire 2012 season, ranking 122nd nationally (out of 124). The Orange and Blue's 17 passing plays of 20-plus yards is the 15th-most nationally and their four passing plays of 50-plus yards ranks sixth nationally.

• Senior QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** appears to have saved his best season for last. A four-year starter, Scheelhaase has thrived in Cubit's system, leading the Big Ten and ranking in the top 25 in the nation in both total offense (300.7 ypg, 24th) and passing yards per game (294.7, 15th) through week four.

• Running back **Josh Ferguson** and wide receiver **Ryan Lankford** rank 1-2 in the Big Ten in yards per reception. Ferguson ranks third in the nation with a 26.4 yards-per-catch average (seven receptions, 185 yards, two TDs), while Lankford ranks 12th nationally at 22.5 yards per catch (10 receptions, 225 yards, one TD).

• Senior LB and Butkus Award candidate **Jonathan Brown** leads the Big Ten and ranks third nationally in tackles per game (12.7). Brown had 15 stops against Washington, a B1G single-game high this season. Sophomore LB **Mason Monheim** is averaging 10.0 tackles per game to rank 24th nationally and second in the Big Ten behind only teammate Brown.

• The Illinois return game has improved in a big way. After ranking 107th nationally in kick returns (18.83 ypr) and 118th in punt returns (1.56 ypr) in 2012, the Illini have a 100-yard kickoff return TD from sophomore **V'Angelo Bentley** vs. SIU, the first UI kickoff return TD since 2008, and a 38-yard punt return from **Miles Osei** vs. Cincinnati, the longest by an Illini since 2004. Illinois currently ranks 11th nationally in kickoff returns (28.00 ypr) and 51st in punt returns (8.7 ypr), improvements of 96 and 67 spots, respectively.

• Illinois is one of five teams in the nation with a perfect fourth-down conversion percentage (1-of-1) and one of 16 teams with a perfect fourth-down conversion percentage defense (0-of-3). Only the Fighting Illini and top-ranked Alabama (1-of-1 and 0-of-1, respectively) are perfect in both categories this season.

• The Illini are playing their fourth-straight game in the state of Illinois on Saturday, with the Southern Illinois, Cincinnati and Miami (Ohio) contests at Memorial Stadium and the Washington game on Sept. 14 in

FORMER ILLINI HEADING TO SPACE

- Former Illini defensive back and current NASA astronaut **Mike Hopkins** is scheduled to make his first space flight this Wednesday, Sept. 25. Hopkins and crewmates Oleg Kotov and Sergey Ryazanskiy will launch from Baikonur Kazakhstan at 3:58 pm CT on Wednesday, and will arrive at the International Space Station approximately six hours later. Hopkins will remain on board as a Flight Engineer on Expedition 37/Expedition 38, which is scheduled to end with the Soyuz landing in March 2014. During its time on the station, the crew will conduct science experiments and maintenance.
- Hopkins played for coach John Mackovic at Illinois, helping the Fighting Illini reach four straight bowl games from 1988-91. He started his career as a walk-on and by the time he was a senior he was a team captain. He graduated from Illinois in 1991 with a degree in aerospace engineering and got his master's degree in aerospace engineering from Stanford in 1992. A colonel in the U.S. Air Force, Hopkins was selected in July 2009 as one of 14 members of the 20th NASA astronaut class.

BUSY SPORTS WEEKEND IN CHAMBANA

Saturday's football game against Miami (Ohio) is the centerpiece of a busy sports weekend in Champaign-Urbana, which is fitting for the annual Dads Weekend on campus. On Friday night, Fighting Illini volleyball hosts Iowa at State Farm Center (7 p.m.), while soccer also hosts the Hawkeyes at the same time. Following the football game on Saturday, volleyball faces Nebraska at Huff Hall at 4 p.m. before the men's and women's basketball teams kick off their preseason at Illini Street Jam, which will be held outdoors at the intersection of Green and Wright Streets in Campustown. Then on Sunday, the Illini host the eighth-annual SoccerFest against Nebraska at 1 p.m.

BYE WEEK FACTS

- The Fighting Illini are coming off an open weekend heading into Saturday's Miami (Ohio) game. It's the first of two byes for Illinois this season, marking just the fourth time in school history that the team has more than one open week in a season. The only other times were in 1989, 2009 and 2010.
- Illinois has played 32 games after a bye in the modern era (since 1985, when bye weeks became commonplace) and is 11-21 in those contests. The Illini have lost 10 straight games coming off a bye, with their last win coming over Indiana (45-14) on Oct. 26, 2002.

MIAMI (OHIO) SERIES NOTES

- Illinois holds a 2-0 lead in the all-time series against Miami (Ohio), winning 20-7 in Champaign in 1932 and 45-0 in Champaign in 1941.
- Illini head coach Tim Beckman is 1-1 against Miami (Ohio) as a head coach, beating them 49-28 in 2011 when he led Toledo, and falling to the RedHawks 31-24 in 2009, his first season at UT.
- Illini defensive line coach **Greg Colby** and RedHawk defensive coordinator Jay Peterson coached together at Northwestern in 2002 and 2003, when Colby was defensive coordinator and Peterson led the defensive line. Illinois executive senior associate athletics director and football sport administrator **Jason Lener** came to Champaign-Urbana in December 2011 after serving as deputy athletic director at Miami from 2006-11.

DID YOU KNOW?

Illinois has four passing plays of 50-plus yards already this season, tied for the sixth-most in the nation. The Illini had only one 50-plus passing play in 2012, ranking 106th out of 124 teams.

ILLINOIS AGAINST THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

The Illini are 9-2 all-time against the Mid-American Conference, with the most recent matchup a 24-7 win over Western Michigan to start the 2012 season. Illinois has won four of its last five meetings against MAC opponents. The Broncos also hold one of Illinois' two MAC losses, with WMU beating the Illini in 2008. Ohio also beat UI in 2006. All games except for the 2008 game against Western Michigan – which was at Ford Field in Detroit – have taken place in Champaign.

LINEBACKER U: IT'S NOT WHERE YOU THINK IT IS

- Like many Illini teams over the years, the 2013 Illini defense is led by its linebacking corps. This year, senior **Jonathan Brown**, a 2012 Butkus Award semifinalist, and sophomore **Mason Monheim**, a 2012 Freshman All-American key the attack. Brown has piled up 190 tackles, 30 TFLs and 9.0 sacks over the last two-plus seasons, while Monheim became the first true-freshman ever to lead the Illini in tackles and led all Big Ten freshmen with 86 stops last season. Not surprisingly, the duo is leading the team, and the Big Ten, in tackles so far this season as Brown is averaging a Big Ten-best 12.7 stops per game, third-best in the NCAA, and Monheim ranks second in the Big Ten and 24th nationally with 10.0 tackles per game.
- Illinois' history at the linebacker position is up there with any program in the nation. It begins with football legend **Ray Nitschke**, who donned the Orange and Blue from 1955-57, and the greatest linebacker in football history, **Dick Butkus**, who was a two-time All-American and led the Fighting Illini to a 1964 Rose Bowl win over Washington. The Orange and Blue boast two Butkus Award winners, **Dana Howard** in 1994 and **Kevin Hardy** in 1995, and several first-team All-Americans like **Darrick Brownlow** (1990), **Simeon Rice** (1994 & '95) and **J Leman** (2007), in addition to Butkus, Howard and Hardy. Illinois linebacker lore also includes recent NFL Draft picks **Danny Clark**, **Martez Wilson** and **Nate Bussey**.

WHOSE HOUSE? SCHEEL-HOUSE

- Senior quarterback **Nathan Scheelhaase** already has surpassed his 2012 season totals for touchdown passes, 30-plus-yard pass plays and 50+ pass plays. Take a look at his three-game 2013 numbers versus his 10-game 2012 numbers below:

- Scheelhaase threw for a career-high 416 yards in the season-opener, the 10th-best single-game passing performance in school history and the fifth-most by an Illinois quarterback at Memorial Stadium.
- Scheelhaase followed that up with 312 yards and tied his career high with four TD passes against Cincinnati, marking the first time he has passed for 300 yards in back-to-back games in his career. The last Illinois quarterback to have consecutive 300-yard passing games was Juice Williams at Michigan (310, 10/4/2008) and against Minnesota (462, 10/11/2008).
- Scheelhaase's 728 yards in the first two games were the most for an Illini QB in the first two games of a season since Jason Verduzco passed for 783 yards in the first two games of 1991. Scheelhaase also had six passing touchdowns, equaling the school record for most TD passes in the first two games of a season shared by Juice Williams (2008) and Kurt Kittner (2000).
- Scheelhaase ranks fifth on the Illinois career touchdown passes list with 41, just one behind Jason Verduzco's fourth-place total of 42. He also holds the No. 4 spot in career total offense at Illinois with 7,993 yards, is fourth in career passing efficiency (128.3), sixth in passing yardage (6,180), sixth in completions (551), seventh in attempts (903) and 18th in rushing yardage (1,813) – second among quarterbacks – at Illinois.
- Scheelhaase racked up 340 of his 416 passing yards against Southern Illinois in the first half, marking the most ever for an Illini in the first half and the most in any half since Juice Williams totaled 347 passing yards in the second half against Minnesota on Oct. 11, 2008. Scheelhaase earned week one Big Ten Player of the Week honors after his performance against the Salukis.
- After starting the first three games this season, Scheelhaase now has 39 career starts under his belt, tied for the fifth-most in the nation by a quarterback behind only Georgia's Aaron Murray (44) and Nebraska's Taylor Martinez (42), Louisiana-Monroe's Kolton Browning (40) and Troy's Corey Robinson (40).
- Scheelhaase has flashed the big-play ability in 2013 that Illini fans saw from him early in his career, posting 16 plays of 20-plus yards in the first three games. Scheelhaase had only 18 such "big plays" in 2012, when he missed two games and was limited in many others because of injuries, but he posted 29 big plays in 2011 and 33 in 2010.
- Scheelhaase is one of only seven active quarterbacks in the nation with three or more games where he posted at least three passing touchdowns and one rushing touchdown. Clemson's Taj Boyd leads the list with eight, Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel has seven and Louisiana-Monroe's Kolton Browning and Wyoming's Brett Smith each have four. Scheelhaase is tied for fifth on the list with Cody Fajardo (Nevada) and Connor Shaw (South Carolina).
- Scheelhaase started his fourth consecutive season-opener this season, making him one of only seven current quarterbacks in the nation to start four straight openers. Scheelhaase joins Kolton Browning (Louisiana-Monroe), Logan Kilgore (Middle Tennessee), Taylor Martinez (Nebraska), Taylor McHargue (Rice), Aaron Murray (Georgia) and Corey Robinson (Troy) in the select club.

• Scheelhaese led Illinois to bowl victories in each his first two seasons (2010 Texas Bowl and 2011 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl), making him one of only two QBs in Big Ten history to start and lead their teams to bowl wins during both his freshman and sophomore seasons (Brooks Bollinger, Wisconsin). After missing a bowl in 2012, Scheelhaese is looking to end his UI career with a third bowl win, something no Illini QB has done previously.

COREY LEWIS: THE COMEBACK KID

Senior OT **Corey Lewis** is one the feel-good stories in college football. After missing more than two-and-half years (34 games) recovering from three ACL tears and five different knee surgeries, Lewis saw his first game action in over 1,000 days at Ohio State on Nov. 3, 2012, and played in the season's final four games. With a bachelor's degree in communication already in hand and a sixth year of NCAA eligibility granted, Lewis made his first career start in the 2013 season-opener against Southern Illinois, more than five years after first setting foot on campus, and also started against Cincinnati and Washington.

NEW FACES TAKE THE FIELD

Illinois has had 25 players make their Illini debuts this far in 2013: 10 true-freshmen (**Aaron Bailey, Dillan Cazley, Jarrod Clements, Caleb Day, Jaylen Dunlap, Darius Mosely, Austin Schmidt, Dawuane Smoot, Dionte Taylor, Tyler White**), 10 redshirt-freshmen (**Robbie Bain, Taylor Barton, B.J. Bello, Devin Church, Cedric Doxy, Zach Hirth, Jevaris Little, T.J. Neal, Joe Spencer, LaKeith Walls**), one sophomore (**Tim Clary**) and four transfers (**Martize Barr, Abe Cajuste, Eric Finney, Zane Petty**).

ILLINI ARE ALL OVER THE NFL

- Illinois had 24 former players on 2013 NFL opening day rosters, plus two on a practice squad, the fifth-most among Big Ten teams behind Ohio State (31), Iowa (26), Penn State (25) and Wisconsin (25) and ahead of Michigan (23), Nebraska (23), Purdue (18), Michigan State (15), Northwestern (7), Indiana (5) and Minnesota (4).
- Illinois led all Big Ten schools with four players selected in the 2013 NFL Draft: OL **Hugh Thornton** (third round, Colts), DT **Akeem Spence** (fourth round, Buccaneers), CB **Terry Hawthorne** (fifth round, Steelers) and DE **Michael Buchanan** (seventh round, Patriots).
- Illinois has had four players chosen in each of the last four drafts (2010-2013).
- At least three Illini have been drafted in each of the last five drafts (2009-2013).
- Sixteen Illini have been drafted since 2010, including 10 in the first three rounds (most in the Big Ten).
- Despite not having a first-rounder in 2013, Illinois has had five first-round draft picks since 2008, which is the most of any Big Ten team.
- **Akeem Spence** was the eighth Illini in the last six years to enter the draft with eligibility remaining. All eight were taken in the first four rounds, including four first-rounders.
- Four Illini DL have been drafted in the last three years – **Corey Liuget** (first round, 2011), **Whitney Mercilus** (first round, 2012), **Akeem Spence** (fourth round, 2013) and **Michael Buchanan** (seventh round, 2013).

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- Illinois has shown a great ability to sustain drives early in the season. Through three games, the Illini have six drives of 10-plus plays, five of which ended with scores and resulted in a total of 27 points. Last year, Illinois managed only 11 scoring drives of 10 or more plays.
- Conversely, the Illini also have shown quick-strike capability, with four scoring drives of zero, one or two plays. V'Angelo Bentley's 100-yard kickoff return against Southern Illinois doesn't even register in the game's drive chart, and the Illini had two-play scoring drives against SIU and Cincinnati. Most recently, Nathan Scheelhaase hit Ryan Lankford with a 72-yard touchdown strike late in the third quarter against Washington, a one-play drive that required only 16 seconds.
- Illinois' offense has been amazingly balanced, as 13 different players have caught a pass and nine different players have had a rushing attempt. Against Cincinnati, 11 different players caught passes, equaling the most since 11 players caught at least one pass against Purdue on Oct. 30, 2010.
- Against Cincinnati, Illinois matched its longest drive in school history, covering 99 yards on 12 plays over 5:07. It marked the fifth time since 1971 the Illini have recorded a 99-yard drive, and the first since Oct. 21, 2009, against Michigan. The Illini also had a 94-yard TD drive (seven plays in 1:15) and an 88-yard TD drive (7 plays in 3:16) in the season opener against SIU.
- Senior wide receiver **Ryan Lankford** has had a pair of 100-yard game already this season (career-high 115 against SIU and an even 100 against Washington), giving him three career 100-yard receiving games. Against Cincinnati, Lankford did his damage on the ground, rushing for 46 yards on three carries, including a darting 29-yard TD run, the first of his career, on an end-around. For the season, Lankford is averaging a whopping 22.5 yards per reception (10 catches, 225 yards), which ranks second in the Big Ten and 12th in the nation.
- Against Washington, Lankford caught a career-long 72-yard touchdown from Scheelhaase, equaling the 15th-longest touchdown pass in school history. It is the longest touchdown reception since the 77-yard TD catch by A.J. Jenkins on Oct. 8, 2011, at Indiana.
- True-freshman QB **Aaron Bailey** recorded his second career touchdown, a 10-yard TD run on fourth down, against Washington at Soldier Field. On the season, Bailey has seven total carries resulting in four first downs and two touchdowns.
- Sophomore running back **Josh Ferguson** posted his first career 100-yard receiving game with 103 yards on four catches against SIU, highlighted by a career-long 53-yard touchdown reception, the first TD catch of his career. He had three "big plays" against the Salukis with a 53-yard touchdown reception on a screen pass, a 26-yard reception and a 34-yard run. He followed that up with a 48-yard TD reception against Cincinnati in week two and a 27-yard catch against Washington. For the season, Ferguson ranks second in the nation in yards per reception with seven catches for 185 yards (26.4 ypr). In 2012, Ferguson led all Big Ten freshmen in all-purpose yards per game (90.7).
- The starters on the Illini offensive line are massive, as all five are listed at at least 300 pounds and have an average weight of 309 pounds (**Simon Cvijanovic** - 310, **Michael Heitz** - 305, **Alex Hill** - 315, **Ted Karras** - 300, **Corey Lewis** - 315).
- The line didn't allow a sack against Cincinnati, marking the first time in 13 games that an Illini opponent didn't record one. The last time UI protected that well was against Western Michigan on Sept. 1, 2012.
- Senior **Steve Hull** played wide receiver for the first time in his career in the season opener against SIU, hauling in two catches for 64 yards. He then had three catches for 53 yards, including a 22-yard TD reception, the first of his career, against the Bearcats. Hull spent his redshirt season as a receiver before switching to safety prior to the 2010 season and making 15 starts there from 2010-2012.
- Junior RB **Donovonn Young** leads a balanced rushing attack with 128 yards and two touchdowns on the season. In 2012, Young led the Illini ground attack with 571 yards on 121 carries (4.4 ypc), including three touchdowns, and led the team with 38 receptions for 172 yards and another TD in 2012. The junior from Texas has 1,150 yards career rushing yards.
- Junior tight end **Jon Davis** had an acrobatic 11-yard touchdown reception just before the half against SIU, finishing with a leap and reach for the pylon for the score, and also had a 15-yard rush in the second half. Davis is Mr. Versatility for the Illini, as he lines up as a tight end, receiver, H-back and running back.
- Senior tight end **Evan Wilson** caught his sixth career touchdown on a 23-yard reception from Scheelhaase in the Cincinnati game. It marked his first TD since Oct. 15, 2011, against Ohio State.
- Junior wide receiver **Martize Barr** earned his first career touchdown reception, a 26-yard over-the-shoulder grab in the the fourth quarter, and led the Illini in receiving with five catches for 72 yards against the Bearcats. Barr also added a 24-yard rush on an end-around against Cincinnati.
- The Illini racked up 522 yards of total offense against Cincinnati on Sept. 7, marking the first time they surpassed 500 yards in a game since Oct. 8, 2011, at Indiana. They notched 210 yards on the ground, marking their first time over 200 rushing yards since Sept. 8, 2012, at Arizona State.
- With 42 points against SIU and 45 against Cincinnati to open the season, Illinois registered 40-plus points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2010 when they topped Purdue 44-10 on Oct. 30 and fell to Michigan 67-65 on Nov. 6.
- The Illini had six scrimmage plays go for 30+ yards against the Salukis, equaling the team's total for the entire 2012 season in one game. Only Oregon (7) had more plays of 30+ yards in week one. The Illini added one more 30-plus play from scrimmage against Cincinnati and two more against Washington and now rank 31st nationally with nine. The Illini also have four plays of 50-plus yards, which is tied for ninth nationally.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- The Illini have held opponents 0-for-3 on fourth down this year, making Illinois one of 16 teams in FBS yet to allow a fourth-down conversion and one of only eight to stay perfect in three or more attempts.
- Butkus Award candidate **Jonathan Brown** leads the Big Ten with 38 tackles and ranks third in the nation at 12.7 tackles per game after a 15-tackle performance against Washington, a single-game Big Ten high for this season. Over the last two years, Brown has put up monster numbers when healthy. He was leading the Illini with 59 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks in 2012 before having his season cut short by a shoulder injury. That followed a breakout 2011 season, when he earned All-Big Ten honors with 108 tackles, 19.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He ranked sixth in the nation in TFLs per game (1.63) and led the Big Ten in TFLs per game during conference play (2.07). Brown is a member of preseason watch lists for the Butkus Award, Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy.
- Sophomore LB **Mason Monheim** has 30 tackles – which ranks second in the Big Ten and 24th nationally – 2.5 TFLs and a sack in 2013, a solid start after a stellar freshman season that saw him earn second-team freshman All-America honors by Phil Steele. Monheim started the final 10 games of the season and led all Big Ten freshmen with 86 tackles. Monheim ranked 15th in the conference in tackles per game (7.2), while no other Big Ten freshman was in the top 50. He was the first Illini true-freshman ever to lead the team in tackles.
- Sophomore **Eaton Spence** reached double-digit tackles for the first time in his career with 14 stops against Washington, which equaled the second-most tackles by a Big Ten player in a game this year (behind only Jonathan Brown's 15 tackles). For the season, Spence ranks fifth in the Big Ten in tackles per game (8.3 tpg).
- Senior **Tim Kynard** forced his first career fumble against SIU, then added his first sack of the season among a career-high 2.5 TFLs against Washington.
- Senior safety **Earnest Thomas III** ranks fourth on the team with 21 tackles in 2013 after a breakout 2012, where he was fourth on the team with 69 tackles and ranked fourth in the Big Ten with three forced fumbles. He is one of only two upperclassmen in the secondary listed on the depth chart, and the only other junior is Zane Petty, a junior college transfer in his first season of Division I football.
- Redshirt-freshman safety **Taylor Barton** notched his first career interception in the Cincinnati game in his second career start. He also added seven tackles in the Illini victory.
- The defense returned only four starters from 2012: DE **Tim Kynard**, LB **Jonathan Brown**, LB **Mason Monheim** and safety **Earnest Thomas III**.
- The entire defensive three-deep includes only two seniors (LB **Jonathan Brown** and DL **Tim Kynard**). In fact, the three-deep lists only nine players with junior or senior eligibility, two less than the number of true and redshirt freshmen listed.

THE SPECIAL TEAMS

- Junior **Justin DuVernois**, a 2013 Ray Guy Award candidate, earned Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors following a stellar performance against Washington at Soldier Field. DuVernois punted five times for an average of 45.2 yards, pinning the Huskies inside the 20 three times and inside the 10 twice. He also had a career-high three punts over 50 yards. For the season, he is averaging 42.1 yards per kick – fourth-best in the Big Ten – up from his 41.9 average last season, which ranked fourth in the conference and was 3.6 yards per kick better than 2011.
- **V'Angelo Bentley's** 100-yard kickoff return for touchdown against Southern Illinois was the longest by a single player in school history and equaled the longest touchdown in Illinois history. It matched the record set by Travis Williams and Eugene Wilson, who combined for 100 yards on a kick return lateral play, against Purdue on Oct. 12, 2002. It also marked Illinois' first kick return TD since A.J. Jenkins (96 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 18, 2008.
- Bentley is averaging 37.5 yards per kick return this season, which leads the Big Ten and ranks third in the nation.
- Senior WR **Miles Osei** recorded a career-best 38-yard punt return in the fourth quarter against Cincinnati, marking the Illini's longest punt return since 2004. He has 55 punt return yards on the season, marking Illinois' most since Arrelious Benn had 114 punt return yards in 2008.
- Illinois has streaks of 52 games and 147 attempts without missing a PAT. The last time the Fighting Illini did not convert a PAT kick was on Sept. 5, 2009, against Missouri.
- Sophomore kicker **Taylor Zalewski** has started off 2013 by hitting 4-of-6 field goals and 13-of-13 extra points. In 2012, he nailed a 54-yard field goal against Purdue, the third-longest field goal in school history and the longest in the Big Ten that season. Zalewski also handles kickoff duties, booting 10 touchbacks in 21 kickoffs this season and averaging 64.6 yards per kickoff as 18 of his 21 kickoffs have reached the end zone.
- Senior holder **Tim Russell** converted his third career two-point conversion (second passing) with a toss to TE Matt LaCosse in the second quarter against SIU. His other two conversions came at Ohio State in 2012 (one rush, one pass).
- In 2012, **V'Angelo Bentley** blocked a goal attempt against Penn State, marking the first blocked FG for an Illini since Derek Walker at Michigan on Oct. 4, 2008, and the first blocked kick of any kind for an Illini since Clay Nurse swatted away a PAT at Fresno State on Dec. 3, 2010.
- With the loss of three-year long-snapper Zak Pedersen to graduation at the end of 2012, the Illini turned to redshirt-freshman **Zach Hirth** for long-snapping duties this season. Hirth was ranked the No. 2 long-snapper in the nation by ESPNU coming out of high school. He has handled his duties in the first three games of 2013 without any issues.

TEAM NOTES

- The Aug. 31 win over Southern Illinois was the Illini's 16th consecutive home-opening victory, the fourth-longest streak in the Big Ten behind Ohio State (35), Nebraska (28) and Wisconsin (18). Illinois is 86-33-5 all-time in home-openers.
- The Illini are 13-0 all-time against FCS opponents (formerly I-AA). All but two of those wins have been by at least 21 points. Four of UI's 13 FCS wins have come against Southern Illinois, including the only two that were close games, a 28-25 win over the Salukies in 1985 and this year's 42-34 season-opening victory.
- Illinois is 14-0 all-time against the other public universities in the state. The Fighting Illini are 4-0 against Northern Illinois, 4-0 against Southern Illinois and Illinois State, 2-0 against Eastern Illinois and 1-0 against Western Illinois. The combined score of those meetings is 553-224 in favor of the Illini.
- Illinois is looking to reach a bowl game for the third time in the last four years in 2013, something that hasn't been done at Illinois since a run of three bowl games from 1991-94.
- Offensively, the Fighting Illini returned 100 percent of their passing, 99.5 percent of their rushing and 80.3 percent of their receiving production from last season in 2013. The only major loss for the offense from last year to this year is WR Darius Millines, who was second on the team with 319 receiving yards in 2012.

INJURED LIST

- Six Fighting Illini missed the season opener due to injury, including two projected starters – STAR Eric Finney and OL Ted Karras – but both returned to play against Cincinnati in week two. OL Chris Boles, LB Ralph Cooper and DL Vontrell Williams have missed the first three games due to injury, while LB Henry Dickinson has missed the last two games (Cincinnati and Washington). DT Abe Cajuste and DT Bryce Douglas both sat out the Washington game.
- Offensive lineman Tony Durkin is out for the season (announced 8/29).

- Illinois played its second-ever game at Soldier Field on Sept 14, a 34-24 loss to No. 19/23 Washington in front of 47,312 fans. More than 10,000 tickets were sold in the final week leading up to the game. The only other time the Illini have played in Soldier Field was a 10-9 loss to Washington State on Sept. 1, 1994, in front of 39,472.
- The game against Washington was Illinois' first in the city of Chicago since the 48-27 victory over Northwestern at Wrigley Field on Nov. 20, 2010.

This past July, Illini QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** married his high-school sweetheart, Morgan Miller, with several of his Fighting Illini teammates by his side. WR **Miles Osei** served as Scheelhaase's best man, while QB **Reilly O'Toole**, WR **Ryan Lankford** and WR **Steve Hull** served as groomsmen. ILLINI ON THE BIG SCREEN

Fighting Illini fans at Memorial Stadium this season will see and hear a new \$7.2 million Daktronics video display and state-of-the-art sound system. The south end zone features a new HD video display measuring 36 feet tall by 96 feet wide, nearly four times larger than the previous display. In addition, a new supplemental ribbon display hangs below the video display in the south end that measures over 50 feet wide, and two LED ribbon displays measuring more than 420 feet in length are attached to the fascia between the seating decks on each side of the field. Additional video displays measuring 17 feet by 10 feet are mounted to the northeast and southeast towers.

NIKE REBRAND IN THE WORKS

Illinois athletics is in the midst of a large-scale, 18-month brand evaluation program with Nike. The collaboration begins in January 2013 and will result in an updated brand identity for 2014, including logos, marks, uniforms and equipment for all 19 Fighting Illini sports. In the meantime, the football team will be wearing a new primary orange helmet for the 2013 season. This year's orange helmet features a navy blue Block I logo on the sides in place of the slant ILLINOIS wordmark, along with navy facemasks and the traditional blue-white-blue center striping. The 2013 secondary helmet will remain the navy blue matte finish with orange Block I logo and no stripes that was introduced during the 2012 season.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

The football team once again excelled in the classroom during the 2013 spring semester, with 51 players earning at least a 3.0 grade-point average, 12 more than Spring 2012 and nine more than fall 2013. As a team, the Illini posted a 2.87 cumulative GPA, up from a 2.70 in fall 2012 and 2.71 posted in spring 2012. In addition, 16 Fighting Illini football players earned degrees in 2013, 18 earned Academic All-Big Ten status, and four were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars – DL **Houston Bates**, OL **Corey Lewis**, OL **Tyler Sands** and QB **Nathan Scheelhaase**.

ILLINI HOLD LIFT FOR LIFE FUNDRAISER

Fighting Illini players raised nearly \$5,000 for acoustic neuroma, which ended the career of former Illini offensive lineman **Andrew Carter**, with their second annual Lift for Life fundraiser through Uplifting Athletes on June 21, 2013. Acoustic neuroma is a rare, slow-growing tumor of the nerve that connects the ear to the brain. Uplifting Athletes is a network of university chapters run by current football student-athletes. Each chapter adopts a rare disease that has personal meaning to their team. Football players hold special events, fundraising campaigns or awareness drives to support research for their adopted cause. **Corey Lewis**, Illinois' senior offensive tackle, serves as president of the UI chapter of Uplifting Athletes and helped organize the event, which featured the entire Fighting Illini team participating in a strongman competition at Memorial Stadium. Hosted by Fighting Illini football play-by-play voice Brian Barnhart, the live show allows University of Illinois students and the Champaign-Urbana community the opportunity to meet Coach Beckman and ask questions about the Illinois football program.

Fighting Illini Athletics produces and airs the weekly 30-minute Fighting Illini Insider television show, which starts the week of Sept. 2 and runs through the end of May. In the fall, the primary focus of the show is on Illinois football and features Coach Beckman as a regular guest. Illinois radio voice Brian Barnhart will host the majority of the fall shows, which will include game highlights, in-studio interviews, special features and Olympic sports reviews in a 30-minute magazine style format.

- With today's win, the Illini have won 16 consecutive home openers, including the first two season openers under head coach Tim Beckman. Illinois is now 4-0 all-time against SIU, 13-0 all-time against FCS teams and 14-0 against the other public universities in the state.
- Illinois scored its first two touchdowns of the season in the span of 29 seconds in the second quarter (Josh Ferguson 53-yard TD reception, forced fumble and Donovan Young 2-yard rushing TD).
- Illinois had two 100-yard receivers (Lankford - 115, Ferguson - 103) for the first time since A.J. Jenkins (148) and Darius Millines (119) against Arkansas State on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Nathan Scheelhaase turned in a career-high 416 passing yards, which ranks as the 10th-best single-game total in school history and surpasses his previous personal best of 391 yards. His 416 yards also rank as the fifth-most ever by an Illinois quarterback at Memorial Stadium and the first 400-yard game since Juice Williams broke the Memorial Stadium record with 462 passing yards against Minnesota on Oct. 11, 2008.
- Sophomore V'Angelo Bentley notched the longest kickoff return by a single player in school history and equaled the longest touchdown in Illinois history with his 100-yard kickoff return, matching the record set by Travis Williams and Eugene Wilson, who combined for 100 yards on a lateral play, against Purdue on Oct. 12, 2002. It also marked Illinois' first kick return TD since A.J. Jenkins (96 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 18, 2008.

- With today's win over the Bearcats, Illinois improved to 1-1 all-time against Cincinnati and started the year 2-0 for the second time in the past three seasons (UI began the 2011 season 6-0).
- Following Illinois' goal-line stand that forced a turnover on downs with 7:55 left in the third quarter, the Illini out-scored the Bearcats 24-7, including scoring the game's final 17 points.
- The Illini converted 9-of-15 third downs, while holding Cincinnati to 3-of-13 on third down conversions and 0-of-2 on fourth down, including the game-changing goal-line stop in the third quarter. Illinois averaged 11.8 yards on its nine third-down conversions, with seven of the nine going for nine yards or more.
- The Orange and Blue held the Cincinnati offense under 20 points for only the second time in the past 18 games, dating back to Nov. 26, 2011. The only other team to achieve the feat was Rutgers in a 10-3 Scarlet Knight victory on Nov. 17, 2012.
- Illinois registered 40-plus points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2010 when they topped Purdue 44-10 on Oct. 30 and fell to Michigan 67-65 on Nov. 6.
- The Illini racked up 522 yards of total offense, marking their first 500-yard game since Oct. 8, 2011, at Indiana. They also notched 210 yards on the ground, their first 200-yard rushing game since Sept. 8, 2012, at Arizona State.
- Senior quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase finished 26-of-37 with 312 yards, marking the first time he has passed for 300 yards in back-to-back games in his career. The last Illinois quarterback to accomplish the feat was Juice Williams at Michigan (310, 10/4/2008) and vs. Minnesota (462, 10/11/2008).

GAME NOTES

- Illinois played its second-ever game at Soldier Field today in front of 47,312 fans. More than 10,000 tickets were sold in the final week leading up to the game. The only other time that the Illini have played in Soldier Field was a 10-9 loss to Washington State on Sept. 1, 1994.
- Senior quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase earned his first rushing touchdown of the year and passed for his seventh touchdown, marking his third consecutive game with multiple TDs. He now has eight career games with at least one passing and rushing touchdown.
- Senior wide receiver Ryan Lankford caught a career-long 72-yard touchdown from Scheelhaase, equalling the ninth-longest touchdown pass in school history. It is the longest touchdown reception since the 77-yard TD catch by A.J. Jenkins on Oct. 8, 2011, at Indiana.
- Lankford finished with three catches for 100 yards, marking his second 100-yard receiving game this year and the third of his career.
- Freshman Aaron Bailey recorded his second career touchdown on a career-long 10-yard rush. On the season, he has four first downs and two touchdowns on seven carries.
- Senior Miles Osei threw a career-long 35-yard pass to junior Matt LaCosse for his first pass completion of the season and fifth of his career. The play also marked a career-long reception for LaCosse.
- Senior linebacker Jonathan Brown led the Illini for the third-straight game with a season-high 15 tackles, including his first full sack and 1.5 TFLs. It marked his most tackles since posting 17 against Ohio State on Oct. 15, 2011.
- Sophomore Eaton Spence reached double-digit tackles for the first time in his career with 14 tonight, which equaled the second-most tackles by an Illini this year.

Tim Beckman is now in his second season leading the University of Illinois football program. He was named the 23rd Fighting Illini head football coach by director of athletics Mike Thomas on Dec. 9, 2011.

Beckman's first Fighting Illini team produced four 2013 NFL Draft picks – OL Hugh Thornton (third round, Colts), DT Akeem Spence (fourth round, Buccaneers), DB Terry Hawthorne (fifth round, Steelers) and DE Michael Buchanan (seventh round, Patriots) – the most by any Big Ten team.

The Illini also have excelled in the classroom under Beckman's leadership. Sixteen players earned their degrees in 2013, after 15 did so in 2012. And a record number of football student-athletes posted at least a 3.0 grade-point-average in three consecutive semesters: 39 in spring 2012, 42 in fall 2012 and 51 in spring 2013. The Illini also have been active in the community, hosting free weekly youth clinics during the season and making regular visits to local schools and hospitals throughout the year.

Prior to Illinois, Beckman spent three years as head coach at Toledo, where he led the Rockets to two bowl appearances and a Mid-American Conference West Division co-championship.

Beckman engineered an impressive turnaround at Toledo in his three years at the helm after inheriting a team that went 3-9 in 2008. The Rockets improved to 5-7 in 2009 before going 8-5 with a 7-1 record in the MAC and a berth in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl in 2010. Toledo posted an 8-4 record in 2011, including another 7-1 MAC record, a share of the MAC West Division title and a berth in the Military Bowl. In the last two seasons, Beckman compiled a 14-2 record in MAC games, second best in the conference over that span.

He has learned under some of the finest coaches in America, including Pat Dye, Urban Meyer, Mike Gundy and Jim Tressel. When he guided the Rockets to an 8-4 regular-season record and a bowl appearance in 2010, it was UT's first bowl since 2005. In addition, his last two recruiting classes at Toledo have been widely praised, earning a No. 1 ranking among MAC teams by Rivals.com in both seasons after landing two of the three four-star prospects signed by conference schools.

Beckman sent a pair of Toledo players to the NFL in defensive back Barry Church and receiver Stephen Williams in 2010. Three players earned first-team All-MAC honors in 2011, including Eric Page, who

earned first-team honors as a receiver, kick returner and punt returner.

Before accepting Toledo's head coaching position, Beckman had 21 years of experience as an assistant coach. He served as the defensive coordinator at Oklahoma State (2007-08), the cornerbacks coach at Ohio State (2005-06), the defensive coordinator/assistant head coach at Bowling Green (1998-2004), the defensive coordinator at Elon (1996-97), the secondary coach/recruiting coordinator at Western Carolina (1990-95) and a graduate assistant at Auburn (1988-89).

Beckman's two seasons as the defensive coordinator at Oklahoma State were successful, as the Cowboys posted a 16-10 record, including a 9-4 mark in 2008 and an appearance in the Holiday Bowl. In 2007, the Cowboys went 7-6, including a win over Indiana in the Insight Bowl.

At Ohio State, Beckman mentored the Buckeye cornerbacks. During his stay at Ohio State, the Buckeyes were 22-3 and played in two BCS bowl games. Along

the way, he coached six All-Big Ten defensive backs and five future NFL players. His final game as a coach with Ohio State was the 2007 BCS National Championship Game against Florida, where Beckman faced his former boss from his days at Bowling Green, Urban Meyer.

At Bowling Green, Beckman was a three-time nominee for the Frank Broyles Award, presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2001, and *College Football News* named him one of the country's top defensive coordinators. During his stay at Bowling Green, the Falcons won two bowl games, a MAC East division title and finished ranked in the national polls in 2003.

Beckman began his coaching career in 1988 as a graduate assistant at Auburn, where he earned his master's degree in education. His first full-time coaching job came at Western Carolina, where he coached the secondary and served as recruiting coordinator from 1990-95. Beckman then served as the defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator

at Elon College from 1996-97 before moving on to Bowling Green.

Beckman started his collegiate playing career at Kentucky but transferred to Findlay and excelled under Hall of Fame head coach Dick Strahm. A 1988 graduate of Findlay, Beckman majored in physical education and lettered in 1984 and 1985 on Oiler teams that qualified for the NIAA playoffs both seasons. Prior to that, he attended Forest Park High School in Beaumont, Texas, for two years before completing high school at Berea (Ohio) High School near Cleveland.

The son of longtime college and NFL coach Dave Beckman, Tim is a native of Berea, Ohio. He and his wife, Kim, also a Findlay graduate, have three children: Tyler, Lindsay and Alex. Tyler is a senior linebacker at the University of Findlay, while Lindsay is a junior at Oklahoma State. Alex is a sophomore quarterback at Urbana High School.
