LEADING OFF

- **Final Drive:** The 2013 Fighting Illini doubled their win total from 2012, going 4-8 overall and 1-7 in Big Ten Conference play to finish fifth in the Leaders Division.
- **Saving His Best for Last:** Senior QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** led the Big Ten and ranked in the top 25 nationally in total offense (295.2 ypg, 22nd), passing yards per game (272.7, 19th), completions per game (23.9 cpg, 11th) and completion percentage (66.7, 15th), while also breaking the UI single-season passing efficiency record (140.7).
- **Squeezed the Juice:** Scheelhaase finished his Illinois career as the school's all-time leader in total offense (10,634 yards, 7th-most in Big Ten history), ranked second in career completions (775), completion percentage (63.0) and rushing yards by a QB (2,066), and third in passing yardage (8,568), touchdown passes (55) and passing efficiency (130.2).
- **Iron man:** Scheelhaase finished Illinois career with 48 starts, tied for the most career starts in Illinois history with Tim Simpson (1988-91) and Jeff Allen (2008-11), both offensive linemen.
- **The 8,000/2,000 Club:** Scheelhaase ended 2013 as the only active player in the nation with over 8,000 passing yards and 2,000 rushing yards. He and former Illini Juice Williams are the only two players in Big Ten history to reach those benchmarks in their careers.
- **Bentley Makes History:** Sophomore CB/KR/PR **V'Angelo Bentley** became the first player in 124 years of Illinois football history to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same season. He had a 67-yard punt return for TD against Ohio State and a school-record 100-yard kick return TD against SIU in the season-opener. He led the Big Ten and ranked seventh nationally in punt return average (15.8 ypr).
- **Ferguson a Dual Threat:** Sophomore RB **Josh Ferguson** broke the Illinois record for single-season receiving yards by a running back with 535 on 50 catches. His 44.6 receiving yards per game ranked second in the nation for a running back. Ferguson led the Illini in rushing yards (779) and total TDs (11), was second on the team in receiving yards (535), and ninth in the Big Ten in all-purpose yards per game (112.6).
- **Offensive Improvement:** The revamped Illinois offense, directed by new offensive coordinator **Bill Cubit**, made huge improvements. The Illini jumped at least 50 spots in the national rankings from 2012 to 2013 in first downs, passing offense, long scrimmage plays, total offense, passing efficiency and scoring offense, with the biggest turnaround an 95-place jump in first downs per game.

- **Brown has All-America Season:** Senior LB **Jonathan Brown** ranked second in the Big Ten and 18th nationally in tackles per game (9.9), racking up 119 stops on the season. Brown, who was a Phil Steel Mid-season All-American, ranked fourth in the conference in TFLs (15.0), racking up 45.5 during his Illinois career, good for third on the school's all-time TFLs list.
- **Home at WR:** Senior WR **Steve Hull** turned in one of the best seasons for a receiver in school history in his first season playing the position. Hull, who spent his first three years at Illinois as a starting safety, exploded for 40 catches, 653 yards and six TDs over the last four weeks of the season, the most receiving yards in the nation during that span. He had a career-high 224 yards receiving at Indiana on Nov. 9, the second-best single-game total in school history, and finished the season with 993 yards on 59 catches to earn honorable mention All-Big Ten status. He also picked up a Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor on Nov. 25 after hauling in a career-high 10 receptions for 169 yards in Illinois' win at Purdue.

BIG TEN HONORS

Senior QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** and senior LB **Jonathan Brown** were named second-team All-Big Ten by media who cover the conference, while conference coaches listed the pair as honorable mention. Senior WR **Steve Hull** earned honorable mention recognition from both the coaches and media, while junior DE **Houston Bates** was an honorable mention pick by the media. Scheelhaase also picked up his third consecutive Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honor.

WHOSE HOUSE? SCHEEL-HOUSE

- Senior QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** was named to the All-Big Ten second team by media who cover the conference and earned honorable mention laurels by the Big Ten coaches. It marked his first career All-Big Ten honors.
- With 362 yards of total offense in his final game, senior Scheelhaase broke Juice Williams' Illinois record for career total offense with 10,634 yards. Scheelhaase also finished seventh in Big Ten history.
- Scheelhaase surpassed 2,000 career rushing yards at Purdue on Nov. 23, becoming the second Illinois quarterback to rush for 2,000 career yards (Juice Williams, 2,557 yards, 2006-09) and the ninth quarterback in Big Ten history to rush for 2,000 career yards. Scheelhaase finished his career with 2,066 rushing yards, good for 15th in Illinois history.
- Scheelhaase posted a career-high 21 touchdown passes in 2013, tied for fifth-most in a season in school history, and finished his career tied for third on the all-time list with Jack Trudeau at 55 TD passes.
- Scheelhaase also finished his career second at Illinois in completions (775), second in career completion percentage (63.0), third in career passing yardage (8,568), third in career attempts (1,231), tied for third in career touchdown passes (55) and fourth in career passing efficiency (130.2). - Scheelhaase completed a career-high 38-of-57 passes for a career-high 450 yards at Indiana on Nov. 9. It was the fifth-best passing yardage total in school history and the third-most completions in a game in UI history.
- Scheelhaase had a career-high 495 yards of total offense at Indiana (450 passing, 45 rushing), the third-best total in school history behind only Dave Wilson (585 yards at Ohio State, 11/8/80) and Juice Williams (503 yards vs. Minnesota, 10/11/08)
- Scheelhaase blew past his 2012 season totals in every passing category, while improving his completion percentage by nearly six points and his passing efficiency by nearly 35 points. Take a look at his 2013 numbers versus his numbers last season:

- Scheelhaase found great success on first down, completing 148-of-204 (72.5 percent) passes on first down for 1,752 yards and nine touchdowns and a 154.64 passing efficiency rating. He ranks fifth in the nation in first-down completion percentage among QBs with 100 or more first-down attempts, and has 18 plays of 25-plus yards on first down, 12th-most in FBS.
- Scheelhaase has 24 first-half plays of 25-plus yards, eighth-most in FBS behind only Baylor's Bryce Petty (34), Clemson's Tajh Boyd (33), San Jose State's David Fales (30), Fresno State's Derek Carr (27), Washington State's Connor Halliday (26), Oregon's Marcus Mariota (26) and Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel (25).
- Scheelhaase set a school record for TD passes in a quarter with four in the second quarter against Miami (Ohio). He tossed a career-high five TDs in the game, all in the first half, one more than he had all of 2012.
- Scheelhaase threw for 340 yards in the first half of the season-opener against Southern Illinois, marking the most ever for an Illini in the first half.
- After starting all 12 games in 2013, Scheelhaase finished his career with 48 career starts, tied for the second-most in the nation by a quarterback with Troy's Corey Robinson, behind only Georgia's Aaron Murray (52). Scheelhaase also finished his career tied for the Illinois career record for starts along with OL Ryan McDonald and Tim Simpson, and with four more starts than Juice Williams (44), the previous record-holder for starts by a quarterback.
- Scheelhaase led Illinois to bowl victories in each his first two seasons (2010 Texas Bowl and 2011 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl), making him one of only two QBs in Big Ten history to start and lead their teams to bowl wins during both his freshman and sophomore seasons (Brooks Bollinger, Wisconsin).
- Scheelhaase was named to the Capital One Academic All-District first team and was a finalist for the prestigious Wuerffel Award in 2013, giving him quite a list of off-the-field accolades. He completed his bachelor's degree in 3.5 years and is currently on track to graduate with his master's degree in recreation, sport and tourism in December 2013. He is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree (2010-12) and was a 2012 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

- Senior LB **Jonathan Brown** earned second-team All-Big Ten honors from media who cover the conference and honorable mention recognition from the league coaches. It marked the third all-conference honors of Brown's career, as he was an honorable mention pick by the media in 2012 and a second-team selection by the media in 2011. Brown also earned honorable mention laurels from the coaches in 2011.
- Brown ranked second in the Big Ten and 18th in the nation, averaging 9.9 tackles per game. He led the conference for most of the season until Ohio State LB Ryan Shazier passed him in the next-to-last week.
- Brown had a team-high 15.0 TFLs in 2013, ranking third in the Big Ten, and stood 29th nationally with 1.3 TFLs per game. He finished his career with 44.0 TFLs, which ranks third on the UI career TFLs list.
- Brown was a member of preseason watch lists for the Butkus Award, Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy. Last season, he was one of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, which goes annually to the nation's top linebacker and is named after Illinois legend Dick Butkus.
- Brown had monster games late in the season, posting capping his career by averaging 10.7 tackles per game over his last three. He had a game-high 17 tackles, 1.5 TFLs and a PBU against Northwestern, eight tackles, 2.0 TFLs and a sack at Purdue, and seven tackles, 2.0 TFLs, one sack, one interception returned 16 yards to set up an Illini score, and one other pass break-up at Indiana. The interception was the third of Brown's career.
- Brown forced his first fumble of the season against Michigan State, saving a touchdown by jarring the ball loose as MSU QB Connor Cook reached for the end zone.
- Brown had a huge game at Nebraska, racking up a game-high 13 tackles and tying his career high with 4.0 TFLs, tied for the fourth-most TFLs in a game by an FBS player this season.
- In his final three seasons at Illinois, Brown put up monster numbers when healthy. In 2013, he led the team in tackles (119), TFLs (15.0) and sacks (5.0), while standing second in PBUs (4). He was leading the Illini with 59 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks in 2012 before having his season cut short by a shoulder injury. That followed a breakout 2011 season, when he earned All-Big Ten honors with 108 tackles, 19.5 tackles for loss and six sacks. He ranked sixth in the nation in TFLs per game (1.63) and led the Big Ten in TFLs per game during conference play (2.07) in 2011.

LINEBACKER U: NOT WHERE YOU THINK IT IS

- Like many Illini teams over the years, the 2013 Illini defense was led by its linebacking corps. Senior **Jonathan Brown**, a 2012 Butkus Award semifinalist, and sophomore **Mason Monheim**, a 2012 Freshman All-American keyed the attack. Brown piled up 286 tackles, 44.0 TFLs and 13.5 sacks over the last three seasons, while Monheim became the first true-freshman ever to lead the Illini in tackles and led all Big Ten freshmen with 86 stops in 2012. Not surprisingly, the duo is first and third on the team in tackles in 2013, as Brown is second in the Big Ten with 9.9 stops per game, 18th-best in FBS, and Monheim ranked ninth in the Big Ten with 8.1 tackles per game.
- Illinois' history at the linebacker position is up there with any program in the nation. It begins with football legend **Ray Nitschke**, who donned the Orange and Blue from 1955-57, and the greatest linebacker in football history, **Dick Butkus**, who was a two-time All-American and led the Fighting Illini to a 1964 Rose Bowl win over Washington. The Orange and Blue boast two Butkus Award winners, **Dana Howard** in 1994 and **Kevin Hardy** in 1995, and several first-team All-Americans like **Darrick Brownlow** (1990), **Simeon Rice** (1994 & '95) and **J. Leman** (2007), in addition to Butkus, Howard and Hardy. Illinois linebacker lore also includes multi-year NFL players **Scott Studwell**, **Danny Clark**, **Martez Wilson** and **Nate Bussey**.

FERGUSON A DUAL THREAT

- Sophomore running back **Josh Ferguson** had a breakout season for the Illini in 2013. He ranked second in the nation in average receiving yards by a running back (44.6 ypg) and also led the Illini in rushing yards (779) and touchdowns (11 total: seven rushing and four receiving).
- Ferguson broke Kameny Bell's Illinois record for single-season receiving yards by a running back at Purdue on Nov. 23. Ferguson finished the year with 535 receiving yards, surpassing Bell's total of 503 yards from 1991. He also moved up to second place on Illinois' career receiving yardage list for a running back. He has 800 career receiving yards, which surpassed Keith Jones (1984-88) total of 771. Ty Douthard (1993-96) owns the Illinois record with 1,250.
- With a career-high 115 rushing yards at Purdue, a new career-high, Ferguson passed 1,000 career rushing yards, becoming the third active Illini in the 1,000-yard club (Nathan Scheelhaase, Donovan Young). Ferguson now has 1,143 career rushing yards.
- Ferguson is averaging 109.5 scrimmage yards per game (64.9 rushing, 44.6 receiving), which ranks 42nd nationally and eighth in the Big Ten.
- Ferguson has five career 100-yard games: four rushing and one receiving. He ran for 110 yards on 14 carries (7.9 ypc) against Northwestern on Nov. 30, 115 yards on 20 carries (5.8 ypc) at Purdue on Nov. 23, 114 yards on 19 carries (6.0 ypc) at Nebraska on Oct. 5 and 101 yards at Arizona State on Sept. 8, 2012.

- In 2012, Ferguson led all Big Ten freshmen in all-purpose yards per game (90.7).

FORMER ILLINI IN SPACE

- Former Illini defensive back and current NASA astronaut **Mike Hopkins** is in the middle of his first space flight. Hopkins and crewmates Oleg Kotov and Sergey Ryazanskiy launched from Baikonur, Kazakhstan, at 3:58 p.m. CT on Sept. 25, and arrived at the International Space Station six hours later. Hopkins will remain on board as a flight engineer on Expedition 37/Expedition 38, which is scheduled to end with the Soyuz landing in March 2014. During its time on the station, the crew will conduct science experiments and maintenance.
- Each week, Hopkins sends the team a video from the International Space Station congratulating the previous week's special teams player of the game and giving the team a message for the upcoming game.
- Hopkins played for coach John Mackovic at Illinois, helping the Fighting Illini reach four straight bowl games from 1988-91. He started his career as a walk-on and by the time he was a senior, he was a team captain. He graduated from Illinois in 1991 with a degree in aerospace engineering and earned a master's degree in aerospace engineering from Stanford in 1992. A colonel in the U.S. Air Force, Hopkins was selected in July 2009 as one of 14 members of the 20th NASA astronaut class. COREY LEWIS: THE COMEBACK KID

Senior OT **Corey Lewis** is one the feel-good stories in college football. After missing more than two-and-half years (34 games) recovering from three ACL tears and five different knee surgeries, Lewis saw his first game action in over 1,000 days at Ohio State on Nov. 3, 2012, and played in the season's final four games. With a bachelor's degree in communication already in hand and a sixth year of NCAA eligibility granted, Lewis made his first career start in the 2013 season-opener against Southern Illinois, more than five years after first setting foot on campus, and started all 12 games in 2013, playing a huge role in Illinois' offensive resurgence. The icing on the cake for Lewis came at Indiana, when he pounced on a loose ball in the end zone for a touchdown, his first career points.

OFFENSIVE TEAM NOTES

- The 2013 Illini offense finished in the top five in school history in passing yards per game (third, 287.7 ypg), points per game (fourth, 29.7 ppg) and total offense per game (fourth, 426.7 ypg).
- Illinois led the Big Ten and ranked 16th nationally and third in the Big Ten in third-down conversion percentage (81-of-170, .476).
- Illinois showed a great ability to sustain drives this season, posting 30 drives of 10-plus plays, including five 14-play drives. Of those 30 drives, 18 ended with scores. In the last five games of the season (PSU, IND, OSU, PUR & NU), the Illini have had 13 10-plus play drives, topping last year's season total.
- The Orange and Blue's 50 passing plays of 20-plus yards rank 33rd nationally and their seven passing plays of 50-plus yards lead the Big Ten and rank 19th nationally.
- Illinois recorded the first two 20+ yard rushes against the Ohio State defense this season in the Nov. 16 loss to the Buckeyes. Illini QB Nathan Scheelhaase ripped off runs of 20 yards and 35 yards against the Buckeyes.
- The Illini piled up 612 total yards and 450 passing yards at Indiana, marking the seventh- and fifth-best performances in school history, respectively.
- In 124 years of football, Illinois has had 600-plus total yards in a game 11 times. Two of those 11 times came in 2013: 612 at Indiana and 601 vs. Miami (Ohio). Coming into the year, Illinois had not reached 600 yards of total offense since 2007 (655 yards at Minnesota on 11/3/07).
- Illini tight ends had a day to remember against Miami (Ohio), as **Matt LaCosse**, **Evan Wilson** and **Jon Davis** combined to catch four touchdowns, an Illinois single-game record by tight ends and one more than Illinoi's tight ends caught all of last season (Eddie Viliunas had two and Jon Davis one in 2012).
- The Miami (Ohio) game also marked the first time that three different tight ends caught at least one touchdown in a game, as LaCosse had two, and Davis and Wilson each caught one score. Davis also caught a two-point conversion pass from tight end/holder **Tim Russell** in the game.
- Illinois scored a school-record 161 points over its first four games, eclipsing the previous record of 158 points in the first four games of 1914, when the Illini won Big Ten and national titles.
- Against Miami (Ohio), the Illini tied a school record with 36 first downs and piled up 601 yards of total offense, surpassing 600 yards for the first time since 2007.
- Against Cincinnati, Illinois matched its longest drive in school history, covering 99 yards on 12 plays over 5:07. It marked the fifth time since 1971 that the Illini have recorded a 99-yard drive, and the first since Oct. 21, 2009, against Michigan.

OFFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Senior WR **Steve Hull** caught 13 passes for 155 yards at Purdue, his fourth-straight 100-yard receiving game and fifth in the last six games. After totaling 19 receptions for 340 yards and one touchdown in the first eight games of the season, Hull has recorded 40 catches for 653 yards and six touchdowns in the last four games, the nation's most prolific receiver by yards during that span.
- Hull fell just short of becoming the eighth player in UI history with a 1,000-yard receiving season, finishing the year with 993 yards. However, that total ranks eighth in a season in school history, his seven touchdowns rank ninth and his five 100-yard games stand tied for fourth as the second-most 100-yard receiving games in a season in school history.
- Hull had a career-high 224 yards receiving at Indiana on Nov. 9, marking the second-best single-game receiving total in school history behind only Jenkins' 268-yard performance against Northwestern in 2011.
- Hull had four 50-plus-yard receptions this season, which is tied for 11th in the nation. He had TD catches of 60 and 54 yards at Indiana, and also reeled in long bombs against Southern Illinois (55 yards) and Wisconsin (51 yards), all from Scheelhaase, his freshman-year roommate.
- Hull spent his redshirt season as a receiver before switching to safety prior to the 2010 season and making 15 starts there from 2010-2012. He switched back to WR in 2013 and had 59 catches for a team-high 993 yards for a whopping 16.8 ypc average on the season, 37th-best in the nation and third in the Big Ten.
- Senior receiver **Spencer Harris** caught a career-high 10 passes for a career-best 81 yards at Penn State, topping his previous bests of six and 63, respectively. Harris has hauled in 28 catches over the last six games after having only eight receptions in the first five games.
- QB **Aaron Bailey** earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors on Sept. 30 after rushing for a career-high 56 yards on six carries and a TD against Miami (Ohio). He threw his first career TD pass against Wisconsin, a one-yard pass to Matt LaCosse in the second quarter.
- The regular starters on the Illini offensive line were massive, as all five are listed at at least 300 pounds and have an average weight of 309 pounds (**Simon Cvijanovic** - 310, **Michael Heitz** - 305, **Alex Hill** - 310, **Ted Karras** - 300, **Corey Lewis** - 315).
- Junior TE **Matt LaCosse** caught his first two career touchdowns against Miami (Ohio), with a two-yard TD grab in the first quarter and a career-long 45-yard TD catch in the second quarter. He finished with

career highs for receiving yards (68) and receptions (3), and also recovered an on-side kick for the Illini against the RedHawks. He caught his third touchdown of the season against Wisconsin, a one-yard pass from Aaron Bailey.

- RB **Donovonn Young** was a perfect counterpart to Ferguson in the backfield. Young, the power back, ran for 376 yards and three touchdowns, while the speedy Ferguson had 779 yards and seven scores. The junior from Texas has 1,398 yards career rushing yards, which ranks 26th in school history.

DEFENSIVE TEAM NOTES

- The Illini defense stepped up big in the win at Purdue after a shaky start. Purdue piled up 150 yards and two touchdowns on its first two drives, but the Illini defense stiffened thereafter. Illinois held the Boilers to just 133 yards and five first downs over the game's final 48:19. Purdue recorded only three first downs in the second half, which was sealed by **V'Angelo Bentley's** interception with less than a minute to play.
- Against the Boilmakers, the Illini defense took the field after four Illini turnovers but held Purdue to zero points on those four possessions. Purdue twice took over inside the Illinois 30 yard line, and the Illini defense held the Boilers to a missed field goal and a turnover on downs.
- The Illini held Ohio State to 4-of-13 third-down conversions on Nov. 16, the fewest conversions and worst percentage (30.7 percent) the Buckeyes have registered in a game this season. Illinois limited Purdue to 4-of-15 on third downs, meaning the Illini have kept their last two foes to 8-of-28 (28.6 percent) on third down. That is a marked improvement over UI's first nine games, when opponents converted 54-of-120 (46.67 percent).
- Illinoi's defense stopped OSU RB Carlos Hyde for a loss of two yards on third-and-1 in the second quarter on Nov. 19, the first time and only time all season that the Buckeyes' workhorse back had been thrown for a loss.
- Three true-freshmen saw extended time in the secondary during Big Ten play. Cornerbacks **Caleb Day**, **Jaylen Dunlap** and **Darius Mosely** stepped up in the big roles during their rookie seasons, filling in for an already young secondary. Junior safety **Ernest Thomas III** was the veteran of the group, while sophomore **V'Angelo Bentley**, sophomore **Eaton Spence** and first-year sophomore transfer **Zane Petty** also gained valuable experience while also serving as mentors for the freshmen.
- Illinois held Penn State scoreless for the first 29:19 of the second half on Nov. 2 before allowing a field goal with 41 seconds remaining. It was the Illini's best second-half performance against a Big Ten foe since holding Purdue scoreless in the second half on Oct. 22, 2011.
- The Illini recorded a safety in the second quarter at Nebraska when LEO **Houston Bates** tackled Husker RB Imani Cross in the end zone. It marked the team's first safety since blocking a punt in the end zone against Indiana and having the Hoosiers recover on Oct. 23, 2010.
- The defense returned only four starters from 2012: DE **Tim Kynard**, LB **Jonathan Brown**, LB **Mason Monheim** and safety **Ernest Thomas III**.
- The entire defensive three-deep included only two seniors: LB **Jonathan Brown** and DL **Tim Kynard**. In fact, the three-deep lists only 10 players with junior or senior eligibility, two fewer than the number of true- and redshirt-freshmen listed.

DEFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Junior LEO **Houston Bates** set a career high with 3.0 tackles for loss at Indiana on Nov. 9 and added two TFLs and a sack at Purdue on Nov. 23. He ranked second on the team and tied for eighth in the Big Ten with 12.0 TFLs on the season. Bates forced a fumble against Ohio State that teammate **Tim Kynard** pounced on, and forced a safety at Nebraska with a TFL in the end zone.
- Senior DB **Ernest Thomas III** forced his third fumble of the year against Indiana, matching his total of three from 2012. With six career forced fumbles, Thomas is tied with five others for fifth place on Illinois' all-time career forced fumbles list. Thomas trails only Simeon Rice (13), Whitney Mercilus (11), Dana Howard (8) and Kevin Hardy (7). Thomas was second on the team with 101 tackles and seventh in the Big Ten with 8.4 tpg. He also ranks fifth in the conference in tackles during Big Ten play (9.1 tpg).
- Sophomore LB **Mason Monheim** had a game-high 14 tackles against Michigan State and finished 2013 with 97 tackles – which ranked third on the team and ninth in the Big Ten – 5.5 TFLs and a sack in 2013, a solid sophomore season after a stellar freshman campaign that saw him earn second-team freshman All-America honors by Phil Steele. Monheim started the final 10 games of the season and led all Big Ten freshmen with 86 tackles. He was the first Illini true-freshman ever to lead the team in tackles.
- Junior safety **Zane Petty** led the team and set a new career high with 15 tackles against Ohio State on Nov. 16. After recording 10 total tackles in the first five games of the season, Petty recorded 10 or more tackles in three of the last seven games and ranked fourth on the team with 75 stops this season. In Big Ten play, he averaged 8.4 tackles per game to rank ninth in the conference.
- Redshirt-freshman safety **Taylor Barton** notched his first career interception in the Cincinnati game.

SPECIAL TEAMS TEAM NOTES

- Illinois has streaks of 61 games and 174 attempts without missing a PAT kick, which both rank as the third-longest streaks in the nation. The last time the Illini did not convert a PAT kick was Sept. 5, 2009, against Missouri.
- The 2013 Illini team has both a punt return and kickoff return for touchdown (both by **V'Angelo Bentley**), marking the first time an Illinois team has had multiple return TDs in the same season since 2007.
- As a team, the Illini ranked 16th in FBS in punt returns (12.95 ypr), up 112 spots from 2012, when they averaged 1.56 ypr to rank 118th. Illinois posted its most punt return yards as a team since 2004, with 272 (22.7 yards per game). The 2004 Illini squad had 284 in 11 games (25.8 ypg).
- Illinois did not punt against Miami (Ohio), marking the first time since Sept. 14, 2002, a 59-7 win over Arkansas State, that the Fighting Illini did not have at least one punt in a game. In 11 total drives against the RedHawks, the Illini scored seven touchdowns, missed a field goal, had two drives end with interceptions and finished the game, and the final drive, by taking a knee.
- Illinois executed its first successful on-side kick since 2010 when it recovered **Taylor Zalewski's** on-side attempt in the second quarter against Miami (Ohio). On the play, Zalewski popped up the kick, Miles Osei tapped it backward and Matt LaCosse grabbed it out of the air. The last time the Illini had recovered an on-side kick was another surprise attempt against Purdue on Oct. 30, 2010, when Derek Dimke kicked the ball off a player on Purdue's front line and Nate Bussey recovered it.

SPECIAL TEAMS INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- **V'Angelo Bentley** leads the Big Ten and ranks seventh in the nation in average punt return yardage with 15.8 ypr this season. His 189 punt return yards this season are the most since E.B. Halsey's 226 in 2004 and his season average of 15.8 ypr ranked third in school history.
- Bentley's 67-yard punt return for touchdown against Ohio State was the first for an Illini since E.B. Halsey took one back 41 yards for a score against Purdue on Oct. 4, 2003. It was the longest for an Illini since Eugene Wilson's 70-yarder at Southern Miss on Sept. 7, 2002.
- Bentley's punt return TD against Ohio State, combined with his school-record 100-yard kickoff return for TD against Southern Illinois, made him the first player in Illinois history to return both a punt and a kickoff for a touchdown in the same season.
- Bentley's 100-yard kickoff return for touchdown against SIU was the longest by a single player in school history and equaled the longest touchdown in Illinois history. It matched the record set by Travis Williams and Eugene Wilson, who combined for 100 yards on a kick return lateral play, against Purdue on Oct. 12, 2002. It also marked Illinois' first kick return TD since A.J. Jenkins (96 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 18, 2008.
- Junior **Justin DuVernois**, a 2013 Ray Guy Award semifinalist, earned Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week honors on Sept. 16 following a stellar performance against Washington at Soldier Field. DuVernois punted five times for an average of 45.2 yards, pinning the Huskies inside the 20 three times and inside the 10 twice. He also had a career-high three punts over 50 yards. For the season, he averaged 41.1 yards per kick.
- Sophomore kicker **Taylor Zalewski** hit 12-of-17 field goals and 38-of-38 extra points to lead the Illini in scoring with 74 points. In 2012, he nailed a 54-yard field goal against Purdue, the third-longest field goal in school history and the longest in the Big Ten that season. Zalewski also handled kickoff duties, booting 35 touchbacks in 66 kickoffs in 2013 and averaging 62.6 yards per kickoff as 49 of his 66 kickoffs reached the end zone.
- Senior TE/holder **Tim Russell** converted his fifth career two-point conversion (fourth passing) with a toss to TE Jon Davis in the fourth quarter against Wisconsin. It was Russell's third two-pointer of the season, as he connected with TE Matt LaCosse in the season opener against SIU and with Davis against Miami (Ohio). His other two conversions came at Ohio State in 2012 (one rush, one pass).
- In 2012, **V'Angelo Bentley** blocked a goal attempt against Penn State, marking the first blocked FG for an Illini since Derek Walker at Michigan on Oct. 4, 2008, and the first blocked kick of any kind for an Illini since Clay Nurse swatted away a PAT at Fresno State on Dec. 3, 2010.
- With the loss of three-year long-snapper Zak Pedersen to graduation after 2012, the Illini turned to redshirt-freshman **Zach Hirth** for long-snapping duties in 2013 and he performed admirably. Hirth was ranked the No. 2 long-snapper in the nation by ESPN coming out of high school.
- Redshirt freshman kicker **Ryan Frain** made his Illini debut against Miami (Ohio), nailing two second-half PATs.

TEAM NOTES

- Illinois' 20-16 win at Purdue on Nov. 23 snapped a 20-game Big Ten losing streak. It was the Illini's first Big Ten win since a 41-20 win over Indiana on Oct. 8, 2011.

- Illinois kicked off to start the game against Ohio State on Nov. 16, marking the first time Illinois started a game on defense since Minnesota came to Memorial Stadium on Nov. 11, 2012. The Illini had received the opening kickoff in 11 straight games prior the OSU game, the third-longest streak in the nation.
- The overtime loss at Penn State on Nov. 2 marked Illinois' first overtime contest since losing a 67-65 triple-overtime thriller at Michigan on Nov. 6, 2010. The Illini are 3-5 all-time in overtime (since 1996), with their last OT win coming against Rutgers, 33-30, on Sept. 3, 2005.
- With the victory over Miami (Ohio), Illinois snapped a 10-game losing streak when coming off a bye. Prior to this season, the Illini's last win after a bye week was on Oct. 26, 2002, when they topped Indiana, 45-14.
- The Aug. 31 win over SIU was the Illini's 16th consecutive home-opening victory, the fourth-longest streak in the Big Ten behind Ohio State (35), Nebraska (28) and Wisconsin (18). Illinois is 86-33-5 all-time in home-openers.
- The Illini are 13-0 all-time against FCS opponents (formerly I-AA). All but two of those wins have been by at least 21 points. Four of UI's 13 FCS wins have come against Southern Illinois, including the only two that were close games, a 28-25 win over the Salukies in 1985 and this year's 42-34 season-opening victory.
- Illinois is 14-0 all-time against the other public universities in the state. The Fighting Illini are 4-0 against Northern Illinois, 4-0 against Southern Illinois and Illinois State, 2-0 against Eastern Illinois and 1-0 against Western Illinois. The combined score of those meetings is 553-224 in favor of the Illini.

NEW FACES TAKE THE FIELD

Illinois had 27 players make their Illini debuts in 2013: 10 true-freshmen (**Aaron Bailey, Dillan Cazley, Jarrod Clements, Caleb Day, Jaylen Dunlap, Darius Mosely, Austin Schmidt, Dawuane Smoot, Donte Taylor, Tyler White**), 11 redshirt-freshmen (**Robbie Bain, Taylor Barton, B.J. Bello, Devin Church, Cedric Doxy, Ryan Frain, Zach Hirth, Javaris Little, T.J. Neal, Joe Spencer, LaKeith Walls**), two sophomores (**Tim Clary, Chris O'Connor**) and four transfers (**Martize Barr, Abe Cajuste, Eric Finney, Zane Petty**).

SHOW ME THE MONEY - FOUR ILLINI EARN SCHOLARSHIPS

Coach Beckman awarded scholarships to four Fighting Illini walk-ons for the 2013 campaign. Senior safety **Ben Mathis**, redshirt-freshman long snapper **Zach Hirth**, tight end/holder **Tim Russell** and kicker **Taylor Zalewski**, all walk-ons in 2012, are now on full scholarship for 2013.

ILLINI ARE ALL OVER THE NFL

- Illinois had 26 former players on 2013 NFL active rosters, tied for second-most among Big Ten teams behind only Ohio State (31). The 26 for players is tied with Iowa and is ahead of Penn State (25), Wisconsin (25), Michigan (23), Nebraska (23), Purdue (18), Michigan State (15), Northwestern (7), Indiana (5) and Minnesota (4).
- Illinois led all Big Ten schools with four players selected in the 2013 NFL Draft: OL **Hugh Thornton** (third round, Colts), DT **Akeem Spence** (fourth round, Buccaneers), CB **Terry Hawthorne** (fifth round, Steelers) and DE **Michael Buchanan** (seventh round, Patriots).
- Illinois has had four players chosen in each of the last four drafts (2010-2013).
- Sixteen Illini have been drafted since 2010, including 10 in the first three rounds (most in the Big Ten).
- Despite not having a first-rounder in 2013, Illinois has had five first-round draft picks since 2008, which is the most of any Big Ten team.
- **Akeem Spence** was the eighth Illini in the last six years to enter the draft with eligibility remaining. All eight were taken in the first four rounds, including four first-rounders.
- Four Illini DL have been drafted in the last three years – **Corey Liuget** (first round, 2011), **Whitney Mercilus** (first round, 2012), **Akeem Spence** (fourth round, 2013) and **Michael Buchanan** (seventh round, 2013).

SWEET HOME CHICAGO

- Illinois played its second-ever game at Soldier Field on Sept 14, a 34-24 loss to No. 19/23 Washington in front of 47,312 fans. More than 10,000 tickets were sold in the final week leading up to the game. The only other time the Illini have played in Soldier Field was a 10-9 loss to Washington State on Sept. 1, 1994, in front of 39,472.
- The game against Washington was Illinois' first in the city of Chicago since the 48-27 victory over Northwestern at Wrigley Field on Nov. 20, 2010.

LOVE IS IN THE AIR

This past July, Illini QB **Nathan Scheelhaase** married his high-school sweetheart, Morgan Miller, with several of his Fighting Illini teammates by his side. WR **Miles Osei** served as Scheelhaase's best man, while QB **Reilly O'Toole**, WR **Ryan Lankford** and WR **Steve Hull** served as groomsmen. And Scheelhaase isn't the only Illini

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

The football team once again excelled in the classroom during the 2013 spring semester, with 51 players earning at least a 3.0 grade-point average, 12 more than Spring 2012 and nine more than fall 2013. As a team, the Illini posted a 2.87 cumulative GPA, up from a 2.70 in fall 2012 and 2.71 posted in spring 2012. In addition, 16 Fighting Illini football players earned degrees in 2013, 18 earned Academic All-Big Ten status, and four were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars – DL **Houston Bates**, OL **Corey Lewis**, OL **Tyler Sands** and QB **Nathan Scheelhaase**.

ILLINI HOLD LIFT FOR LIFE FUNDRAISER

Fighting Illini players raised nearly \$5,000 for acoustic neuroma, which ended the career of former Illini offensive lineman **Andrew Carter**, with their second annual Lift for Life fundraiser through Uplifting Athletes on June 21, 2013. Acoustic neuroma is a rare, slow-growing tumor of the nerve that connects the ear to the brain. Uplifting Athletes is a network of university chapters run by current football student-athletes. Each chapter adopts a rare disease that has personal meaning to their team. Football players hold special events, fundraising campaigns or awareness drives to support research for their adopted cause. **Corey Lewis**, Illinois' senior offensive tackle, serves as president of the UI chapter of Uplifting Athletes and helped organize the event, which featured the entire Fighting Illini team participating in a strongman competition at Memorial Stadium. GAME NOTES

- With today's win, the Illini have won 16 consecutive home openers, including the first two season openers under head coach Tim Beckman. Illinois is now 4-0 all-time against SIU, 13-0 all-time against FCS teams and 14-0 against the other public universities in the state.
- Illinois scored its first two touchdowns of the season in the span of 29 seconds in the second quarter (Josh Ferguson 53-yard TD reception, forced fumble and Donovan Young 2-yard rushing TD).
- Illinois had two 100-yard receivers (Lankford - 115, Ferguson - 103) for the first time since A.J. Jenkins (148) and Darius Millines (119) against Arkansas State on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Nathan Scheelhaase turned in a career-high 416 passing yards, which ranks as the 10th-best single-game total in school history and surpasses his previous personal best of 391 yards. His 416 yards also rank as the fifth-most ever by an Illinois quarterback at Memorial Stadium and the first 400-yard game since Juice Williams broke the Memorial Stadium record with 462 passing yards against Minnesota on Oct. 11, 2008.
- Sophomore V'Angelo Bentley notched the longest kickoff return by a single player in school history and equaled the longest touchdown in Illinois history with his 100-yard kickoff return, matching the record set by Travis Williams and Eugene Wilson, who combined for 100 yards on a lateral play, against Purdue on Oct. 12, 2002. It also marked Illinois' first kick return TD since A.J. Jenkins (96 yards) against Indiana on Oct. 18, 2008.

GAME NOTES

- With today's win over the Bearcats, Illinois improved to 1-1 all-time against Cincinnati and started the year 2-0 for the second time in the past three seasons (UI began the 2011 season 6-0).
- Following Illinois' goal-line stand that forced a turnover on downs with 7:55 left in the third quarter, the Illini out-scored the Bearcats 24-7, including scoring the game's final 17 points.
- The Illini converted 9-of-15 third downs, while holding Cincinnati to 3-of-13 on third down conversions and 0-of-2 on fourth down, including the game-changing goal-line stop in the third quarter. Illinois averaged 11.8 yards on its nine third-down conversions, with seven of the nine going for nine yards or more.
- The Orange and Blue held the Cincinnati offense under 20 points for only the second time in the past 18 games, dating back to Nov. 26, 2011. The only other team to achieve the feat was Rutgers in a 10-3 Scarlet Knight victory on Nov. 17, 2012.
- Illinois registered 40-plus points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2010 when they topped Purdue 44-10 on Oct. 30 and fell to Michigan 67-65 on Nov. 6.
- The Illini racked up 522 yards of total offense, marking their first 500-yard game since Oct. 8, 2011, at Indiana. They also notched 210 yards on the ground, their first 200-yard rushing game since Sept. 8, 2012, at Arizona State.
- Senior quarterback Nathan Scheelhaase finished 26-of-37 with 312 yards, marking the first time he has passed for 300 yards in back-to-back games in his career. The last Illinois quarterback to accomplish the feat was Juice Williams at Michigan (310, 10/4/2008) and vs. Minnesota (462, 10/11/2008).

- Steve Hull caught 10 passes for 169 yards, this third-straight 100-yard receiving game. After totaling 19 receptions for 340 yards and one touchdown in the first eight games of the season, Hull has recorded 26 catches for 498 yards and five touchdowns in the last three games, the nation's most prolific receiver by yards during that span.
- Josh Ferguson caught four passes for 11 yards, breaking Kameno Bell's Illinois record of single-season receiving yards by a running back. Ferguson now has 509 receiving yards this season, surpassing Bell's total of 503 yards from the 1991 season.
- Ferguson passed 1,000 career rushing yards, becoming the third active Illini in the 1,000-yard club (Nathan Scheelhaase, Donovan Young). With 115 yards today, Ferguson now has 1,033 career rushing yards.

Tim Beckman was in his second season leading the University of Illinois football program in 2013. He was named the 23rd Fighting Illini head football coach by director of athletics Mike Thomas on Dec. 9, 2011.

Beckman's first Fighting Illini team produced four 2013 NFL Draft picks – OL Hugh Thornton (third round, Colts), DT Akeem Spence (fourth round, Buccaneers), DB Terry Hawthorne (fifth round, Steelers) and DE Michael Buchanan (seventh round, Patriots) – the most by any Big Ten team.

The Illini also have excelled in the classroom under Beckman's leadership. Sixteen players earned their degrees in 2013, after 15 did so in 2012. And a record number of football student-athletes posted at least a 3.0 grade-point-average in three consecutive semesters: 39 in spring 2012, 42 in fall 2012 and 51 in spring 2013. The Illini also have been active in the community, hosting free weekly youth clinics during the season and making regular visits to local schools and hospitals throughout the year.

Prior to Illinois, Beckman spent three years as head coach at Toledo, where he led the Rockets to two bowl appearances and a Mid-American Conference West Division co-championship.

Beckman engineered an impressive turnaround at Toledo in his three years at the helm after inheriting a team that went 3-9 in 2008. The Rockets improved to 5-7 in 2009 before going 8-5 with a 7-1 record in the MAC and a berth in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl in 2010. Toledo posted an 8-4 record in 2011, including another 7-1 MAC record, a share of the MAC West Division title and a berth in the Military Bowl. In the last two seasons, Beckman compiled a 14-2 record in MAC games, second best in the conference over that span.

He has learned under some of the finest coaches in America, including Pat Dye, Urban Meyer, Mike Gundy and Jim Tressel. When he guided the Rockets to an 8-4 regular-season record and a bowl appearance in 2010, it was UT's first bowl since 2005. In addition, his last two recruiting classes at Toledo have been widely praised, earning a No. 1 ranking among MAC teams by Rivals.com in both seasons after landing two of the three four-star prospects signed by conference schools.

Beckman sent a pair of Toledo players to the NFL in defensive back Barry Church and receiver Stephen Williams in 2010. Three players earned first-team All-MAC honors in 2011, including Eric Page, who

earned first-team honors as a receiver, kick returner and punt returner.

Before accepting Toledo's head coaching position, Beckman had 21 years of experience as an assistant coach. He served as the defensive coordinator at Oklahoma State (2007-08), the cornerbacks coach at Ohio State (2005-06), the defensive coordinator/assistant head coach at Bowling Green (1998-2004), the defensive coordinator at Elon (1996-97), the secondary coach/recruiting coordinator at Western Carolina (1990-95) and a graduate assistant at Auburn (1988-89).

Beckman's two seasons as the defensive coordinator at Oklahoma State were successful, as the Cowboys posted a 16-10 record, including a 9-4 mark in 2008 and an appearance in the Holiday Bowl. In 2007, the Cowboys went 7-6, including a win over Indiana in the Insight Bowl.

At Ohio State, Beckman mentored the Buckeye cornerbacks. During his stay at Ohio State, the Buckeyes were 22-3 and played in two BCS bowl games. Along

the way, he coached six All-Big Ten defensive backs and five future NFL players. His final game as a coach with Ohio State was the 2007 BCS National Championship Game against Florida, where Beckman faced his former boss from his days at Bowling Green, Urban Meyer.

At Bowling Green, Beckman was a three-time nominee for the Frank Broyles Award, presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach. He was a finalist for the Broyles Award in 2001, and *College Football News* named him one of the country's top defensive coordinators. During his stay at Bowling Green, the Falcons won two bowl games, a MAC East division title and finished ranked in the national polls in 2003.

Beckman began his coaching career in 1988 as a graduate assistant at Auburn, where he earned his master's degree in education. His first full-time coaching job came at Western Carolina, where he coached the secondary and served as recruiting coordinator from 1990-95. Beckman then served as the defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator

at Elon College from 1996-97 before moving on to Bowling Green.

Beckman started his collegiate playing career at Kentucky but transferred to Findlay and excelled under Hall of Fame head coach Dick Strahm. A 1988 graduate of Findlay, Beckman majored in physical education and lettered in 1984 and 1985 on Oiler teams that qualified for the NAIA playoffs both seasons. Prior to that, he attended Forest Park High School in Beaumont, Texas, for two years before completing high school at Berea (Ohio) High School near Cleveland.

The son of longtime college and NFL coach Dave Beckman, Tim is a native of Berea, Ohio. He and his wife, Kim, also a Findlay graduate, have three children: Tyler, Lindsay and Alex. Tyler is a senior linebacker at the University of Findlay, while Lindsay is a junior at Oklahoma State. Alex is a sophomore quarterback at Urbana High School.
