FOR OPENERS

- ▶ Illinois opens its 120th season of varsity football Saturday against Missouri.
- ▶ The Illini have compiled an all-time record of 74-40-5 in season openers, are 23-8-1 when opening the season on the road and 0-5 in neutral-site season openers.
- ▶ Illini coach Ron Zook begins his fifth season as the Illinois head coach this weekend. Zook was the 2007 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year after taking the Illini to the Rose Bowl. He has an overall record of 19-30 at Illinois and is 2-2 in season openers.
- ▶ Illinois returns 17 starters from a year ago, eight on offense, six on defense and three specialists.
- ▶ The Illini return to St. Louis, bringing with them five natives of the area in London Davis (Cahokia), Jason Ford (Belleville Althoff), Antonio Gully (Cardinal Ritter), Terry Hawthorne (East St. Louis) and Tommie Hopkins (East St. Louis).
- ▶ In the last two seasons, the Illinois offense has averaged over 425 yards of total offense.

HIGHLIGHTS VS. MISSOURI

- ▶ Last season's game vs. Missouri produced a combined total of 94 points, 1,081 total yards and 14 touchdowns.
- ▶ Quarterback Juice Williams had a career day, breaking the Edward Jones Dome stadium record for total offense by an individual. He passed for 451 yards, rushed for 10, threw five touchdowns and completed 62 percent of his passes.
- ▶ Receiver Chris Duval played in his first game at position against the Tigers last year and caught two touchdown passes.
- ▶ Linebacker Martez Wilson posted 11 tackles, including 2.5 for loss and one sack.

JUICE PUTS SQUEEZE ON ILLINI RECORD BOOK

Illinois senior quarterback Juice Williams has a chance to leave the Illini program as one of the most productive signal callers in school history.

- ▶ Needs **426** yards of total offense to set the Illinois career mark (holds the season record)
- ▶ Needs **2,321** passing yards to become the school's all-time passer
- ▶ Needs **six** starts for the most career starts as a quarterback
- ▶ Needs **662** rushing yards to break into the Illinois top-5 all-time rusher list
- ▶ Needs **27** touchdown passes to set the record for career scoring strikes
- ▶ Already holds the record for most rushing yards by an Illinois quarterback in a career, season and single game.

IT'S BENN DONE BEFORE

- ▶ Junior receiver Arrelious Benn needs 1,956 all-purpose yards to break the school's all-time record and 1,662 receiving yards would make him Illinois' all-time leading receiver.
- ▶ Benn has caught a pass in every game of his college career, 25 consecutive. That number is among the best in the nation, ranking tied for seventh-longest streak among active players.

- ▶ Last season, Benn broke the 1,000-yard mark receiving on 67 catches to lead the team. It was the first 1,000-yard season for an Illini receiver since 2002.
- ▶ Benn earned first-team All-Big Ten honors in 2008 after recording five 100-yard receiving games and averaging 15.7 yards per catch.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

- ▶ Illinois' 2009 schedule has been rated as the toughest in the Big Ten and the 10th-toughest in the nation by *The Sporting News*. In the preseason rankings, eight Illinois opponents are either ranked or receiving votes.
- ▶ The 2009 Illinois football schedule includes eight teams that played in bowl games a year ago — Missouri, Penn State, Ohio State, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Fresno State and Cincinnati — including three that played in BCS games.
- ▶ Illinois' first four FBS opponents in 2009 were a combined 40-13 last season.
- ▶ After opening against 2008 Big 12 North champion Missouri, the Illini face Illinois State on Sept. 12 before starting the Big Ten season at Ohio State and then hosting Penn State and Michigan State, the top three teams in the preseason Big Ten Coaches poll, in consecutive weeks. The Orange and Blue close the regular season with a pair of tough non-conference games at 2008 Big East champion Cincinnati on Nov. 27 and home against 2008 New Mexico Bowl participant Fresno State on Dec. 5.

BIG TEN RETURNING LEADING RUSHER

Entering the 2009 season, the Big Ten's returning career rushing leader is not a running back. With 2,050 yards rushing in his three seasons as a quarterback, Illinois' Juice Williams has the most yards among the league's active players. Illini running back Daniel Dufrene ranks fourth with 957.

MISSOURI SERIES NOTES

- ▶ Mizzou leads the all-time series 15-7 and has won all four games in the State Farm Arch Rivalry series played in St. Louis.
- ▶ Missouri has won five of the last six games in the series and six of the last eight, dating back to the 1991 season.
- ▶ Mizzou leads the series 5-1 in neutral-site games, all six being played in St. Louis. The Illini won the first game of the series, which was played in St. Louis, in 1896, but the Tigers took victories in 1969, 2002, 2003 and 2007.

KING OF THE HOUSE

- ▶ Last season, Juice Williams accomplished a feat unprecedented in history. In three games during 2008 (Missouri, Michigan, Minnesota), he set stadium records in total offense numbers.
- ▶ Williams passed for 451 yards and rushed for 10 against Missouri on Aug. 30 at the Edward Jones Dome in St. Louis, Mo., eclipsing the 456 yards posted by Rams quarterback Marc Bulger against the New York Jets in 2004. Others that Williams surpassed include Kansas State's Michael Bishop, who had 442 total yards in the 1998 Big 12 championship game, and Tommy Corwin, who had 453 for DeSmet in a high school state title game in 2005. Williams managed to surpass Bulger's best day despite being sacked five times by Missouri for a loss of 42 yards. In college, sacks count against a quarterback's rushing yards but in the NFL they don't.

- ▶ Williams compiled 431 yards of total offense at Michigan Stadium on Oct. 4, which is a Michigan Stadium record. One week later on Oct. 11 against Minnesota, Williams threw for 462 yards and rushed for another 41, making his 503 total yards an Illinois Memorial Stadium record.
- ▶ Based on research collected by Division I SIDs, there are no other current players who own stadium records in more than one venue, much less three.

THE ILLINI OFFENSE

- ▶ In the last three seasons, the Illinois offense has led the Big Ten in rushing twice (2006, 2007) and in passing in 2008.
- ▶ Last season, Juice Williams led the conference in both passing and total offense. His 324.3 total yard average was 82.3 yards better per game than the next league player.
- ▶ Illinois has put together back-to-back seasons of 5,000 yards of total offense. The 2007 total of 5,525 was a school record, while the 5,273 yards in 2008 ranks third in the Illini record book.
- ▶ The Illinois offense returns 100 percent of its 2,034 rushing yards from the 2008 season and 87 percent of its 3,232 passing yards, as well as three starters from the offensive line. The only skill player lost offensively was receiver Will Judson who accounted for 401 receiving yards.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- ▶ In each of the past three years, Illinois linebackers have led the Big Ten Conference in tackles per game — J Leman in 2006 and 2007, and Brit Miller in 2008.
- ▶ In 2008, the Illini defense led the Big Ten in both tackles for loss and quarterback sacks.

THE SPECIAL TEAMS

- ▶ The Illini return placekicker Matt Eller for his sophomore season after a stellar debut campaign. He hit 15 field goals, just two shy of breaking into the Illinois career top-10 after only one season. His 15 made field goals ranked fifth in a season in the Illinois record book and broke a school freshman kicking record. He led the team in scoring and his 84 points were seventh-most in a season in school history.
- ▶ Receivers Arrelious Benn and A.J. Jenkins were Illinois' return men for kickoffs and punts in 2008. Jenkins averaged 22.3 yards per kickoff return and Benn averaged 7.6 per punt return.

BLOCK, PILCHER, WILLIAMS RETURN FOR 5TH YEAR

Of Illinois' 15 seniors, only three are back for their fifth seasons. Center Eric Block returns with 25 starts under his belt. The New Orleans native went through senior day last season, but petitioned the NCAA to have his fifth year restored due to limited playing time and injuries in his first season. Defensive end Doug Pilcher has been a full-time starter for the Illini since 2006 after reshirting his first season at Illinois. Defensive tackle Sirod Williams was set for his senior year in 2008, but suffered a knee injury that forced him to redshirt. He will return this fall with a chance to lead the defensive line.

TRIO OF COACHES LEARNING THE LINGO

Illinois welcomes three new faces to the coaching staff for the 2009 season. Replacing Mike Locksley at offensive coordinator is former TCU offensive general Mike Schultz, while Joe Gilbert joins the staff to coach the offensive line. The sole change on the defensive side of the ball has former Cincinnati coach Keith Gilbert taking over the defensive line.

HOOMANAWANUI HONORING HIS POLYNESIAN DECENT

- ▶ Tight end Michael Hoomanawanui, while growing up in Bloomington, Ill., lived much of the Hawaiian heritage passed down by his father, Isy. Isy came to the States to play football at Illinois State then stayed to raise his family.
- ▶ When Michael came to Illinois, he began many of the traditions carried on by Polynesian and Samoan football players. He entered his freshman year with clean-cut short hair, but then began to grow it out to the long black mane that can be seen out the backs of football helmets. This tradition dates back to Samoan warriors to signify battle. It also is very noticeable to the public in the stands and draws attention to their heritage.
- ▶ Hoomanawanui also got two tattoos, called Aumakua, which means "protectors." His family's protectors are the shark and the turtle, two images that have been passed down for centuries and are now tattoos on Michael's arms and shoulders.
- ▶ Michael also can be seen on campus wearing what looks to be a brightly adorned skirt. However, it is called a kikepa and is traditional dress for men in Hawaii.

BO KNOWS FOOTBALL ... AND BASEBALL

- ▶ Sophomore safety Bo Flowers will turn 26 later this season. He is the oldest player on the Illini roster. Flowers began his college career last season after four years in professional baseball. He was a fifth-round draft pick in 2003 by the Detroit Tigers. After spending three seasons in the Detroit organization, he was traded to the Chicago Cubs, where he played the 2006 season. Currently, Flowers is a walk-on on the Illini team because the Tigers are footing the college bill.

- ▶ **Ron Zook** was named the 2007 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year after leading the Illini to the 2008 Rose Bowl. He was also the Big Ten Coach of the Year that same season.
- ▶ **Ron Zook** The University of Illinois has led the Big Ten in passing in 2008, rushing in 2007 and 2006; and was tops in sacks and tackles for loss in 2008. Illinois' middle linebackers have led the Big Ten in tackles the last three seasons (Miller, 2008; Leman, 2006-07).
- ▶ **Ron Zook** has won games at both "The Big House" at Michigan and "The Horseshoe" at Ohio State. He is only the 13th Big Ten coach ever to accomplish the feat.
- ▶ The 2007 Fighting Illini made a seven-win improvement from the 2006 season, which was the biggest turnaround in college football that season.
- ▶ On Nov. 10, 2007, **Ron Zook** became the first coach in the nation in 10 years to defeat the Associated Press' No. 1 team on the road, when the Illini upset Ohio State, 28-21.
- ▶ **Ron Zook** is one of only two coaches in the nation (Jim O'Brien of N.C. State) to beat the two winningest coaches in college football history, Joe Paterno and Bobby Bowden.
- ▶ The Illinois offense led the Big Ten in rushing for two consecutive years. In 2007, the Illini averaged 256.8 yards, which also ranked fifth in the nation. One year earlier, Illinois' 188.8 yards per game were good enough for 10th nationally.
- ▶ The Illini offense set 10 season and career records in 2007, including single-season rushing, season touchdowns, total offense and fewest quarterback sacks.
- ▶ In his six years as a head coach, **Ron Zook** has led four different squads to bowl eligibility. All three bowl games Zook has coached were played on Jan. 1.
- ▶ In four of his seven seasons as a head coach, **Ron Zook's** teams have finished the year ranked in the final Top-25 polls.
- ▶ **Ron Zook** is in his 33rd season of coaching col-

lege football, and his eighth as a head collegiate coach.

- ▶ During the 2008 offseason, **Ron Zook** spent two days on the USS John C. Stennis aircraft carrier, during its training mission. It had been a dream of Zook's to land and take off from a carrier. While on the ship, Zook saw and studied the similarities of the military and college football with its attention to teamwork and detail.
- ▶ **Ron Zook** led the Illini to wins over three ranked opponents in 2007, the most since the 2001 season. It is also the first time Illinois had wins over two Top-5 opponents since 1963.
- ▶ Illinois' win over No. 1 Ohio State in 2007 marked **Ron Zook's** ninth win over a ranked opponent in his six years as a head coach.

- ▶ **Ron Zook** began his tenure at Illinois in 2005 with a 33-30 come-from-behind, overtime victory over Rutgers, marking the first win for a first-year Illinois coach since Mike White, who guided the Illini to a 35-9 win over Northwestern on Sept. 6, 1980.
- ▶ **Ron Zook** has put together four consecutive top-30 recruiting classes for the Illini. In 2007, Illinois ranked among the top-15 and third in the Big Ten. Illinois was ranked as high as 15th in 2008, good enough for third in the conference.
- ▶ In 2005, the Illinois football team was the youngest in the nation, starting 15 freshmen and sophomores. In 2006, the Illini were among the top-3.
- ▶ **Ron Zook** led the University of Florida to three bowl games in three seasons. In 2002, against a sched-

ule that ranked sixth toughest in the nation, the Gators ranked 24th in the final ESPN/USA Today Poll and extended their school record of consecutive January bowl appearances to 10.

- ▶ While not the head coach, Zook was integral in the University of Florida's 2007 national championship. Twenty-two of the 24 starters on the team were recruited by Zook and his staff, while at Florida.
- ▶ During his time at Florida, his Gator teams defeated six ranked teams, including a stretch of three weeks in a row in 2003. Florida's win at Florida State in the 2004 season finale was the first win for the Gators in Tallahassee since 1986.
- ▶ In 2004, at Florida, Zook's Gator team dominated the SEC rankings with the league's leading rusher (Ciatrick Fason), passer (Chris Leak), receiver (O.J. Small) and scorer (Matt Leach).
- ▶ Zook has participated in 16 bowl games —three as a player and 13 as a coach.
- ▶ Zook has spent 21 years coaching BCS conference teams (SEC: Florida-8 seasons; Tennessee-3 seasons; Big Ten: Illinois-5 seasons; Ohio State-3 seasons; Big 12: Kansas-1 season; Big East: Virginia Tech-1 season).
- ▶ Zook coached for six seasons in the NFL, the Pittsburgh Steelers (1996-98), the Kansas City

Chiefs (1999) and New Orleans Saints (2000-01).

- ▶ Despite his many seasons in the SEC, Zook has midwestern blood. He was born in Loudonville, Ohio and played defensive back for the Miami of Ohio from 1973-75. He began his college career as a walk-on and left as the team captain.

During his time at Miami, the team posted a 32-1-1 record and played in three Tangerine Bowls.

- ▶ Zook coached on five SEC championship teams, including a tie for the SEC East title in 2003 as the head coach at Florida.
