### JUST FOR KICKS

#### Illinois...

... was undefeated for 12 straight games for the first time in program history, eclipsing the previous mark set by the 2003 Illini.

... went 15-0-0 when scoring the first goal of the game and 11-1-1 when scoring at least two goals in a contest.

... was undefeated in 10 contests when taking the lead before halftime.

... scored five or more goals in three straight games for the first time in program history and four separate contests for the first time since 2000.

... has won its last 73 games when scoring three or more goals, dating back to 1999.

... finished 6-2-0 in non-conference play, the fifth consecutive and 13th overall year Illinois started the Big Ten season with a winning mark.

... produced five consecutive shutouts for the third time in program history and first since 2007.

... won six games by 1-0 margins and 10 one-goal contests overall.

### 2011 SEASON-IN-REVIEW

Illinois adjusted to changes all over the field to earn one of the most successful campaigns in program history, finishing 17-5-2 overall while securing the second Big Ten Tournament Championship in program history. The Orange and Blue also earned second in the conference with an 8-2-1 mark, tied for the most Big Ten victories in a single season in program history.

Illinois opened the year with three consecutive blowout victories, outscoring Gonzaga, Toledo and Ball State, 15-2, to begin the season with the offensive firepower expected of the dynamic squad. After a set-back against USC, Illinois downed Pac-12 foe Colorado before undertaking a difficult road trip that sent the Orange and Blue to Baton Rouge, La., for two games during the LSU Invitational, including one against #14 Pepperdine, before heading to Iowa, Ohio State and Penn State.

Upon returning from the regular season program-record five-game road trip, during which Illinois went 1-3-1, the Illini responded with eight consecutive wins over conference opponents to vault themselves into Big Ten Tournament Title

competition - climbing from the 10th spot in the standings all the way up to second place to secure the No. 2 seed for tournament action.

To begin the streak, the Illini dominated Indiana, 4-1, before taking down Purdue, Michigan State, Minnesota and Wisconsin by identical 1-0 scores. After dominating Northwestern, 3-0, Illinois' shutout streak was finally snapped at Nebraska during a 3-1 victory - with the Cornhuskers scoring in the second half to end 2011's longest streak at 533:36 minutes, only 77:32 shy of eclipsing the program record.

The Orange and Blue wrapped up the regular season with a hard-fought 3-2 win over a desperate Michigan squad in need of a win to stay in contention for the Big Ten Tournament - closing the regular season at 14-4-1 overall.

The Illini then headed to Evanston, Ill., to participate in the Big Ten Tournament as the predicted eventual champion according to various news outlets, including the Big Ten Network. Illinois needed a strong penalty kick performance from goalkeeper Steph Panozzo to move past Ohio State in the quarterfinals, with Panozzo stopping a pair of Buckeye attempts to send the Orange and Blue to the next round with a 4-2 PK win after tying, 1-1, through extra time.

In the semifinals, Marissa Mykines proved clutch against the Michigan State Spartans in a similar fashion to her performance during the regular season in East Lansing, Mich. Mykines connected for the lone goal of the game during overtime, slotting a shot by the outstretched arms of MSU's

Jill Flietstra as Mykines had accomplished nearly one month prior in double overtime during the regular season contest between both teams.

Mykines again proved clutch during the championship contest. Against No. 11-nationally ranked Penn State, the Spokane, Wash., native found classmate Julie Ewing in front of the Nittany Lions goal with a perfect low cross, with Ewing re-directing the play on goal to break an early scoreless tie as Illinois played into the wind. After Penn State answered with a goal late in the first half to tie the contest at 1-1, and neither team notched a goal in the second frame, the title match headed to overtime. This time, NSCAA All-American Vanessa DiBernardo provided the game-ending shot following passes from Shayla Mutz and Nicole Denenberg in the 93rd minute to secure the second Big Ten Tournament Title in program history, playing through injury to secure the championship hardware.

With the Big Ten's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament locked up, the Orange and Blue drew defending National Champion Notre Dame in the first round, hosting the Fighting Irish at Illinois Soccer and Track Stadium on Nov. 13. With sustained winds of over 40 MPH from the South, each team mainly controlled possession when it played with the wind at its back. Niki Read used the conditions to help propel a perfectly placed 35-yard shot just under the center of the cross bar but still out of the reach of Notre Dame goalkeeper Maddie Fox, providing the lone tally of the game in the 50th minute to send Illinois into the second round.

For their final contest, the Orange and Blue headed to No.4-nationally ranked Oklahoma State, falling to the Cowgirls, 1-0, in a hard fought game where the Illini outshot Oklahoma State, 18-12, and earned more corner kicks, 8-1.

On the season, Illinois eclipsed a trio of noteworthy team statistics. The 17 wins are the most in in any single Illinois season, one more than the previous record, while the eight consecutive wins and 12-game unbeaten streak stand as the longest such marks in the history of Illini soccer.

## NODS OF APPROVAL

Illinois finished the season as the 19th-ranked squad in the country and No. 2 team within the Great Lakes region listing. The Illini were the second-highest ranked Big Ten program, behind only No. 8 Penn State. In addition, the Massey Performance Ratings calculated the Illini as the 10th-ranked program on the season, when factoring in performance with a number of different statistical success rankings. Illinois also appeared in the season-ending listings for a number of media outlets, including earning the No. 25 spot in Top Drawer Soccer's Tournament 64.



## HEAD COACH JANET RAYFIELD TENTH SEASON (130-71-18, .635)

After nine seasons and 113 victories as head coach of the Fighting Illini, Janet Rayfield has established the University of Illinois soccer team as one

of the premier programs in the nation. Seasons after season, her Illini squads have broken school records and set new benchmarks for conference and national levels of success.

The 2010 season saw Rayfield guide the Illini to a 13-5-1 overall finish, as well as their seventh NCAA tournament appearance since assuming head coaching duties before the 2002 season and yet another top-25 national ranking. Throughout the regular season, Illinois exhibited the dominance against non-conference opponents and visiting foes that has made the Orange and Blue successful throughout the program's history. Illinois rolled through its out-of-conference slate, accumulating a 7-1-0 record with six shutout victories to enter Big Ten play as the 20th-ranked team in the nation by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). Following non-conference action, Rayfield guided the Illini through a treacherous conference schedule to earn another NCAA Tournament bid. In order to secure postseason play, Rayfield totaled six Big Ten victories, including a key come-from-behind win at eventual College Cup participant Ohio State, ranked No. 17 in the nation at the time with an undefeated conference mark and only one home loss to that point in the season.

In 2010, Rayfield created a dynamic offense, integrating talented newcomers with established veteran attacking players, while maintaining the shutdown defense that has highlighted her tenure with Illinois. The 32 goals produced by the Illinois offense marked the second-highest

## HIGH OCTANE OFFENSE

In 2011, the Illini owned 142 points on 53 goals and 36 assists - the most points ever recorded during the Janet Rayfield era. The Orange and Blue have achieved this feat through consistently scoring goals, while producing tallies in excess on occasion to supplement the total.

Illinois earned its most points in any individual season during the 1998 campaign, when the Illini totaled 161 points over the 20-game campaign. Illinois has also topped the 100-point plateau in 2000 (158 points), 1999 (133), 2006 (123), 2004 (119), 2001 (113), 2007 (112), 2003 (110), 1997 (107) and 2002 (104).

Under Rayfield, the previous best was the 119 points earned in 2004 as the Illini made their way to the NCAA Tournament Elite Eight. As a testament to the Illini's consistent production this season, Illinois recorded at least one tally in all but two contests this season, one of only two postseason-bound Big Ten teams held to fewer than three shutouts this year, with No. 8 Penn State joining the Orange and Blue.

seasonal total in program history as the defense stifled opponents, holding foes to only 16 goals in 19 games, the third-fewest ever for an Illinoi team. For her efforts, Rayfield earned the NSCAA Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year Award, the second time she earned regional coaching honors as Soccer Buzz named Rayfield its 2003 regional award recipient.

Following a successful 2010 collegiate season, United States Women's National Team head coach Pia Sundhage called upon Rayfield twice more to assist in leading the senior U.S. squad during international competition. In the spring of 2011, Rayfield traveled to Portugal to serve as a technical assistant during Team USA's championship run through the Algarve Cup. While in Portugal with the U.S. National Team, Rayfield was responsible for maintaining athlete tracking devices and programs, including player positioning systems and software and heart-rate monitors, as well as providing video packages of practices and games for the Team USA staff to disseminate and build game plans around.

Following the Algarve Cup, Rayfield was asked by Sundhage to return to the U.S. staff for the 2011 World Cup - traveling to Germany for over three weeks with Team USA from late June through mid-July. While in Germany, Rayfield served as an advance scout for the U.S., documenting the tendencies, decisions and tactics of potential elimination-round opponents for Sundhage and the rest of the coaching staff. Rayfield's work proved to be paramount to the success of Team USA as the Illini head coach scouted Brazil on three occasions leading up to the U.S.'s impressive last-minute, game-tying goal and penalty kick shootout victory over the Brazilians in the quarterfinals. In total, Rayfield scouted eight games featuring 10 different nations, including Brazil, Germany, France and England.

The 2008 season was an absolute success, as Illinois made a trip to the NCAA Round of 16 for the third time in the past five seasons. Three Illini earned All-Big Ten honors, including first-team defender Emily Zurrer and second-team honorees midfielder Jackie Santacaterina

and defender Danielle Kot. Zurrer also became the first Illini to earn All-America honors three years in a row. Additionally, goalkeeper Alexandra Kapicka was named a National Player of the Year finalist by Soccer Net News. The past year also was special because of the development of the Women's Professional Soccer league. Three Illini that played under Rayfield's tutelage were drafted, including Ella Masar, Mary Therese McDonnell and Christen Karniski. Rayfield also gained valuable coaching experience in the summer of 2008 as an assistant with the U.S. Women's National Team for two of its matches against Canada.

In 2007, Rayfield led the Illini to their fifth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, advancing to the second round for the fourth year in a row. The squad featured seven All-Big Ten selections, including three named to the all-freshman team. In addition, the Orange and Blue dominated their opponents at home, setting a Big Ten record with seven consecutive shutouts at the Illinoi Soccer Stadium.

Rayfield guided the 2006 squad to a school record-tying 16 wins, a top-10 ranking, a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament and a berth in the Round of 16. That Illini team also became the first in the history of the Big Ten to boast the conference Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year and the Freshman of the Year in Ella Masar (offensive), Zurrer (co-defensive) and Chichi Nweke (freshman). In addition, Masar was named a second-team All-America selection by the NSCAA, while Zurrer was a third-team selection by the NSCAA.

Rayfield not only has a wealth of soccer experience but also a fierce determination to succeed and an immense amount of respect from her peers. Rayfield served as President of the NSCAA, an organization that includes over 16,000 members, in 2003-04. In addition, she continues to assist at the youth national team level whenever possible.

## NATIONWIDE STANDARDS OF SUCCESS

In the final NCAA statistics update, of the 330 ranked teams, the Orange and Blue's .750 winning percentage this year tied for 23rd in Division-I women's soccer, while the Illini finished in the No. 26 overall spot in the nation in scoring offense (2.21 goals per game). Individually, Vanessa DiBernardo finished among the top-25 in five separate categories. DiBernardo tied for third in game-winning marks (8) and 11th in total goals (17). The Naperville, Ill., native earned 19th in goals per game (0.739) and tied for No. 19 in total points (39). With 2,224 minutes of action on the season, goalkeeper Steph Panozzo totaled the seventh-most minutes in net among all goalies - one of only 21 to post more than 2,000 minutes on the year.

## BIG TEN LEADERS

Within the Big Ten Conference, the Illini placed among the top-two in a cluster of major offensive statistics, taking second in shots (422), points (142) and goals (53), while ranking third in goals per game (2.21) and tied for third in shutouts (9) and assists (36). Within Big Ten play specifically, Illinois finished in the top-5 in shots (2nd, 181), goals (t-2nd, 20), goals per game (t-2nd, 1.82), fewest goals allowed (t-2nd, nine), goals against average (3rd, 0.78), points (3rd, 58), assists (t-4th, 18) and assists per game (t-4th, 1.82).

Individually, goalkeeper Steph Panozzo heightened her play during Big Ten contests, earning a tied for the second-most shutouts (4) and standing alone with the third-best goals-against average among conference goalies (0.79). Vanessa DiBernardo again sparked the offense throughout the majority of Big Ten play, finishing in the top-10 in every major offensive category with 16 points on six goals and four assists.

## AVOIDING THE SOPHOMORE SLUMP

After leading the Big Ten with 11 goals and five assists during her freshman season in 2010, sophomore midfielder Vanessa DiBernardo exceeded expectations set following the immediate adjustment to the college game, recording 39 points on 17 goals and five assists in 2011. DiBernardo tallied four multi-goal games and 14 multi-point performances; recording at least one point in 17 of the 23 games she has played in.

With 42 games of college soccer over the previous two seasons, DiBernardo owns 28 goals and 10 assists, giving the Waubonsie Valley graduate 66 career points - the fifth-most for an individual Illini ever. DiBernardo also ranks in the career

top-10 in goals (fifth) and game-winners (12, t-third). Individually, DiBernardo's 2011 season stands as one of the most dominant in program history, with DiBernardo's eight game-winning goals being the most in Illinois history in an individual season. Also, DiBernardo's 17 goals and 39 points ranks as the second-highest totals in an individual year for the Orange and Blue.

## WHERE'S IT GOING TO COME FROM?

While Vanessa DiBernardo led the charge with an Illinois-best 17 goals and five assists, the Orange

and Blue offense maintained a team-wide outburst to record 142 points in only 24 games (5.92 points per game). In the process, Illinois had six different players in double-digits for points on the season, the most since the 2000 campaign had seven.

Marissa Mykines earned a goal and two assists against Gonzaga to match DiBernardo's four-point output versus the Bulldogs. Mykines then followed with an insurance goal against Toledo, extending Illinois' lead to 3-1 while matching her 2010 season points output of six in the process. Mykines surpassed her previous year's points total by contributing a game-tying goal vs. Colorado and an insurance tally against Indiana before recording the game-winning mark in double overtime at

Michigan State. Mykines followed with another game-winner at Northwestern before kick-starting the Illini offense with an early goal at Nebraska to earn tallies in back-to-back games. During Big Ten Tournament play, Mykines added a game-winner in overtime when Illinois faced Michigan State; the second time in 2011 Mykines sent the Illini out victorious in extra time against MSU, and produced an assist in the championship game to reach 19 points on eight goals and three assists.

Niki Read began the season strong, producing a goal and assist against Gonzaga before tallying a seven-point contest at Ball State two games later. Against the Cardinals, Read produced a hat trick and an assist to become one of only five Illini to ever record seven or more points in a single game, matching her 2010 points total of 10 in the process. Read has since added five additional assists, one each against Colorado, Oregon, Indiana, Minnesota and Northwestern for a team-leading seven on the year. To reach 17 points on the season, Read added the first game-winning goal of the year for the Lake Orion, Mich., native - scoring the lone mark against Notre Dame in Illinois' NCAA Tournament First Round victory.

Megan Pawloski, a Big Ten All-Freshman honoree one season ago, surpassed her 2010 statistical impact by producing six goals and two assists for 14 points, highlighted by the Althoff Catholic graduate's game-tying mark against Louisville and multi-goal performance against Oregon. Julie Ewing, a defender in her first three years at Illinois, followed with a career-best five goals, recording one each against Gonzaga, Toledo, Oregon, Michigan and #11 Penn State, while totaling individual assists against Indiana and Northwestern to earn a career-best 12 points.

Shayla Mutz earned the game-winning goal in overtime at Louisville, while adding an assist on a Pawloski goal against #13 Pepperdine. Mutz also owns the game-tying strike at Iowa, a header shot in the 68th minute, and assisted on the winning tally against Wisconsin. Mutz was productive against Northwestern and Nebraska, tallying one mark against the Wildcats before facilitating two at Nebraska and another against #11 Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament, bumping the forward's totals to 11 points on three goals and five assists.

Following a year-long recovery from a devastating knee injury suffered in her final high school game, Janelle Flaws, a 2011 Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection, made an immediate impact mainly off the bench in her redshirt-freshman season. Flaws had nine points on three goals and three assists, notching her tallies against Pepperdine, Ohio State and Michigan, while contributing assists against Oregon, Iowa and Indiana.

during the season-ending span. Five straight opponents fell victim to the Illini defense via shutouts, as Purdue, Michigan State, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Northwestern were all held scoreless by Illinois, before the Illini outpaced Nebraska, 3-1, to reach 7-2-1 in Big Ten play and secure the #2 seed in the conference tournament.

Prior to setting down Purdue, the Orange and Blue dominated Indiana, 4-1, with the Illini defense holding strong throughout the first half, allowing the offense to find its rhythm and net three second-half goals to create the difference. After giving up a game-tying goal against the Hoosiers in the 48th minute, the Illini defense clamped down to hold opponents scoreless over 553 consecutive minutes of play, only 78 minutes shy of the program record.

After facing Nebraska, the Orange and Blue triumphed over Michigan, 3-2, during "Senior

Night" before outlasting a trio of tough opponents in the Big Ten Tournament. To earn the 2011 championship, Illinois fought past Ohio State on penalty kicks, 4-2, after drawing, 1-1, through two overtimes in the quarterfinals. The Illini followed with a 1-0 overtime victory against Michigan State in the next round and capped the tournament with a 2-1 overtime win against #11 Penn State to secure the championship trophy.

In its most recent action, Illinois added to its unbeaten streak with yet another shutout, this time downing the defending National Champions, Notre Dame, by a 1-0 margin to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament and notch the ninth shutout of the season. Finally, even though they fell to Oklahoma State in the NCAA Tournament Second Round, the Orange and Blue only allowed a single goal to the Cowgirls - the No.4-nationally ranked team in the country at the time of the game.

Senior center defender Jenna Carosio and junior goalkeeper Steph Panozzo spearheaded the second-half surge, earning recognition from the conference as a result. Carosio totaled Big Ten Defender of the Year and All-Big Ten First Team while Panozzo secured the Big Ten Tournament Defensive MVP with three outstanding performances against Ohio State, Michigan State and #11 Penn State. Carosio also took home NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region First Team honors and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week laurels (10/10), the only non-goalkeeper to do so, while Panozzo tallied a pair of weekly defensive honors (10/17; 10/24) from the Big Ten as well.

## CONVERTING OPPORTUNITIES

Though sophomore forward Megan Pawloski did not shoot often, only totaling 22 attempts over 23 games on the season, Pawloski earned six goals among her 11 on-target shots - good for a 54.5 percent conversion rate, the highest among all Illini. Pawloski recorded a pair of goals at Oregon after recording a lone tally against #14 Pepperdine, totaling a mark on each of her three attempts on that particular weekend. Pawloski also had individual goals against Louisville, Indiana and Wisconsin, with

## FINDING FEET

For the second consecutive season, junior forward Niki Read led the Illini in assists, accumulating seven during the 2011 season - the most for a single Illini since Chichi Nweke totaled seven during the 2007 season. For her career, Read now owns 10 goals and 15 assists for 35 total points, with the Lake Orion, Mich., native's four goals and seven assists this year each setting single-season personal records. Read recorded her first assist of the season in the season-opening win over Gonzaga, adding one each against Ball State, Colorado, Oregon, Indiana, Minnesota and Northwestern.

## FIGHTING ILLINI MEDIA COVERAGE

The University of Illinois soccer squad received considerable coverage from local and regional media outlets throughout the 2011 season, with live broadcasts of contests featured on the Big Ten Network and the Illini Sports Network - WDWS 1400AM, in addition to print weekly coverage in the Daily Illini and the Champaign News-Gazette. 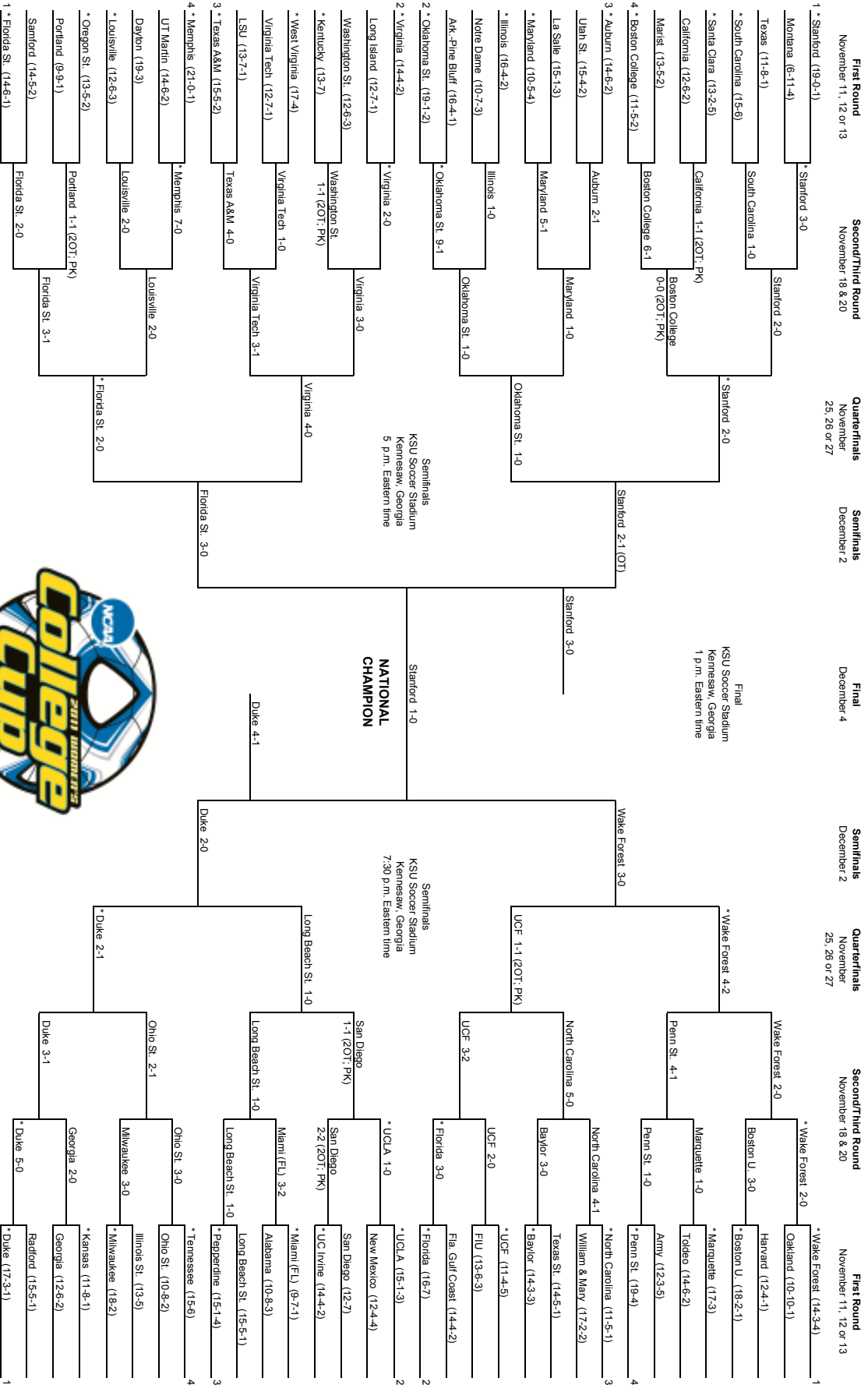

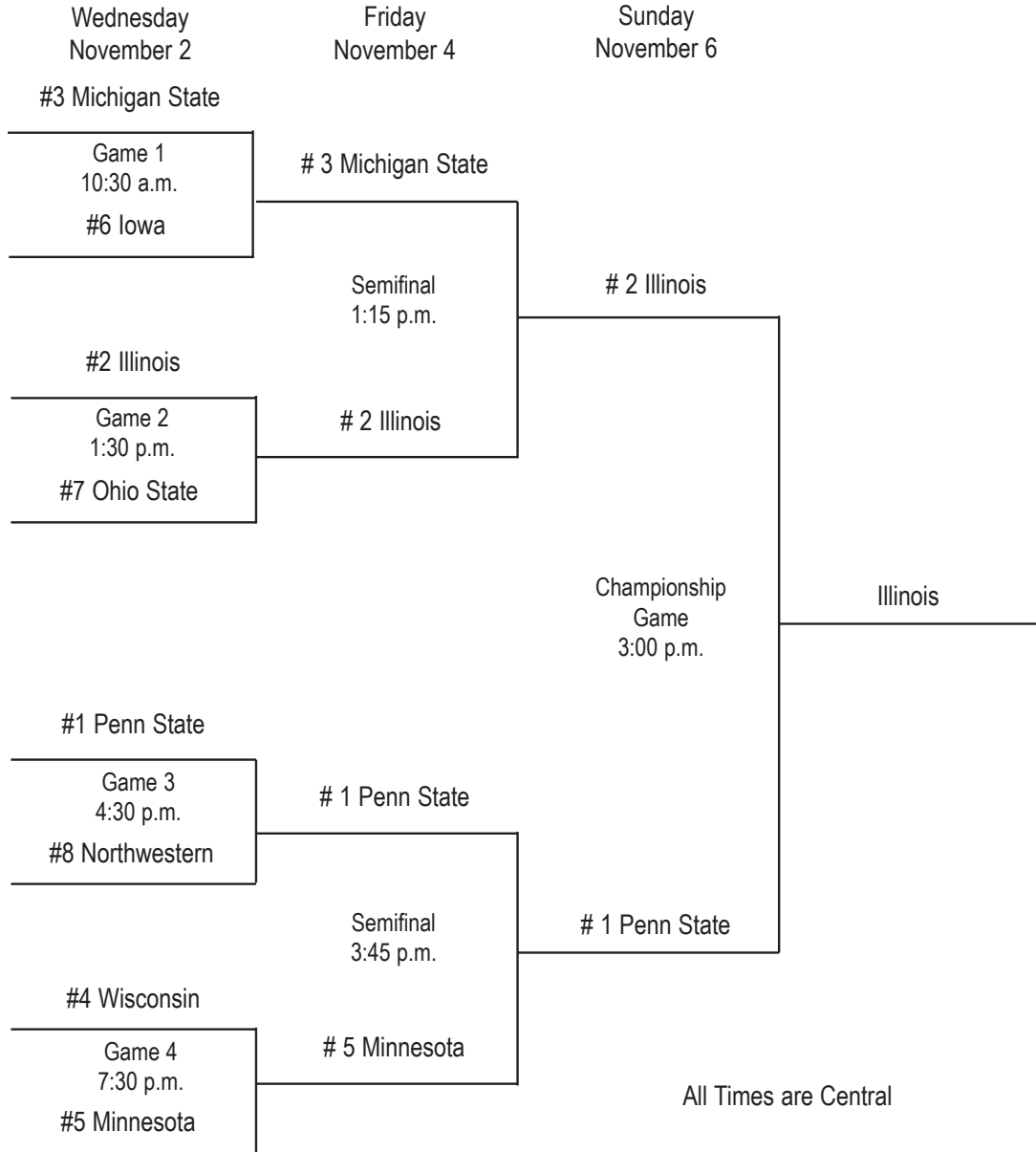
