THE OPENING TIP

Indiana is in its 110th season of college basketball and is matched up with Maryland as part of the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The Hoosiers put up 90 points in a win over Northwestern State on Saturday while Maryland went 1-2 at the EA Sports Maui Invitational. They picked up a victory over Chaminade before falling to Cincinnati and Wisconsin in their final two games. The game in Bloomington will mark the first true road game of the season for the Terrapins and first time in five meetings since 1934 that the teams have met on either school's home court. Fans are encouraged to wear white to create a "White Out" effect on the nationally televised game.

IU IN BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

Indiana is 3-5 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge and 28-18 all-time against members of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

CREAN LOOKS FOR WIN #200

Indiana named **Tom Crean** as its 28th men's basketball coach on April 2, 2008, and he is in his second year with the Hoosiers. He needs one win to reach the 200-win plateau in his 10-plus-season career and has a 199-124 record. He came to Indiana from Marquette where he was 190-96 (66.4) in nine seasons and made five NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 Final Four. His 2009 recruiting class was ranked among the top 10 in the country. Gary Williams has an overall record of 629-359 in his 32nd season as a head coach. He is 422-231 in his 21st season leading the Terps. He started his head coaching career with four years at American followed by four years at Boston College and three years at Ohio State before taking over Maryland to start the 1989-90 season. Williams also won an NCAA National Championship in 2002.

HEAD OF THE CLASS

Freshman **Maurice Creek** is the top freshman scorer in the Big Ten Conference averaging 16.3 points per game. He is ranked seventh in the league in that category. He also leads league rookies with 14 three-point field goals made and 10 steals. Freshman **Christian Watford** is tops among freshmen in the Big Ten in rebounding (7.3) and ranks eighth in the league overall in boardsmanship. He also is the top freshman free throw shooter making 82.8 percent of his attempts. Guard **Verdell Jones III** is the top scoring sophomore averaging 12.3 points per game and he leads second-year players in steals at 1.7 per game.

MARKED IMPROVEMENT

Through six games, the Hoosiers are averaging 74.3 points and shooting a Big Ten best 40.3% from three-point range. Last year at this time, IU was averaging 66.7 points and was shooting just 28.3% from long distance after three home games and three tournament games.

UP NEXT

The Hoosiers will travel to Madison Square Garden in New York for a meeting with Pittsburgh at 9:00 p.m., December 8, as part of the Jimmy V Classic.

Players can be made available after practice on a non-game or travel day as long as their is no class conflict. We request at least 48 hours notice to ensure the player availability.

SCOUTING MARYLAND

Maryland has four players averaging in double figures, led by Landon Milbourne and his 13.7 ppg on 57.7 percent shooting from the field. Greivis Vasquez is perhaps the best all-around threat for the Terrapins as he is averaging 11.2 points, 4.2 rebounds, 5.3 assists and two steals per game. Eric Hayes is a deadly option from beyond the arc as he enters the game shooting 48.1 percent from three-point land (13-of-27). As a team, Maryland is holding its opponents to just 57 points per game and forcing opponents into nearly 20 turnovers a contest.

HITTING THE BOARDS

In Thursday's game against Ole Miss, the Hoosiers accumulated 43 rebounds, which is the most under Coach Crean. The last time an IU team had at least 43 rebounds was March 9, 2008, at Penn State when they had 45. Of those 43 total rebounds, 24 were on the offensive end, also the most under Crean and the most since Nov. 30, 1991, against Butler when the Hoosiers grabbed 26 offensive boards.

HOOSIER HISTORY

IU is third all-time in NCAA Championships (5), fifth in NCAA Tournament appearances (35), sixth in NCAA Tournament victories (60), seventh in Final Four appearances (8) and 11th in overall victories (1,644). Indiana has won 20 Big Ten Championships and has the best winning percentage in conference games only at nearly 60 percent. No team has had more All-Big Ten selections than IU with 53.

DEJA 2

Freshman forward **Christian Watford** finished his first career game with 14 points and 11 rebounds against Howard for his first career double-double. Watford followed that up with 17 points and 10 boards against USC Upstate for two double-doubles in as many games. Last year, teammate **Tom Pritchard**, who had five double-doubles on the season, had 13 points and 10 boards in his first career contest at IU and 19 points and 10 boards against IUPUI. Pritchard and Watford are the only two Hoosiers to post double-doubles in their first two career games at IU.

TOP FIVE OF ALL-TIME

The Indiana men's basketball program is widely regarded as one of the best programs in college basketball history. Recently, *ESPN/Sagarin* released its rankings of the most prestigious basketball programs of all-time and not surprisingly, the Hoosiers were among the elite, checking in at No. 5 on the list.

THE CREEK IS RISING

Freshman guard **Maurice Creek** has had a torrid start to his Hoosier career, averaging 16.3 points per game and shooting an astounding 52.2 percent (35-for-67) from the floor. The freshman from Oxon Hill, Md., led Indiana in scoring all three games of the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tipoff and averaged 16.7 points per game for the tournament. He had his best outing on Thursday against Ole Miss with 18 points on 7-of-15 shooting with three rebounds and three assists. He followed that up with 17 first-half points against Boston University. Upon returning to Bloomington, Creek lit up Northwestern State for 17 points.

ROLLIN' ON THE RIVERS

Redshirt junior **Jeremiah Rivers**, who joined the Hoosiers last year after transferring from Georgetown University, set a new career-high with 14 points against Ole Miss thanks to a perfect 6-of-6 from the field and a pair of free throws. His previous high point total was nine points against Fairfield in December 2007 as a member of the Hoyas. He had another tremendous all-around game against Boston University with 13 points, six rebounds, four assists and two blocks. His tremendous all-around play led to six points, four rebounds and a career-high 10 assists against Northwestern State.

JONESIN' FOR A BASKET

Sophomore guard **Verdell Jones III** is second on the team in scoring at 13.2 points per game. He shot 45.7 percent in Puerto Rico and averaged 14.7 points over the three games. Jones III was 8-of-15 from the field against Ole Miss, setting a career high for made field goals. Last year as a freshman, he made seven field goals in a game on four occasions with all of them coming in the final month of the season.

SWEET HOME INDIANA

Freshman forward **Christian Watford** tied for team-high honors with 17 points against Northwestern State. He is averaging 12.0 points and 7.3 rebounds and shooting a team-high 82.8% from the line. Like fellow Alabama native, former Hoosier All-American D.J. White, the Birmingham resident chose Indiana because of its passion for basketball. He has scored in double digits in four of the Hoosiers six games this season and has made 14 of his last 15 free throw attempts.

POSTGAME NOTES - NORTHWESTERN STATE

- Head Coach Tom Crean inched closer to the 200-win plateau, improving to 199-124 in his 10-plus seasons as a head coach.
- The Hoosiers are 35-1 in Assembly Hall in November dating back to a 75-64 loss to Louisville on Nov. 24, 1984. The only loss in that time was 75-67 loss to Duke on Nov. 30, 2005 as part of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.
- The 90 points scored are the most in the Tom Crean era, and represent the most scored by the Hoosiers since IU netted 97 against Chicago State on Dec. 29, 2007.
- The 34 free throws made are the most by Indiana under Crean and are the most since Feb. 8, 1997, against Ohio State (43). The Hoosiers shot 34-for-44 from the stripe, a season-high 77.3 percent. Maurice Creek and Christian Watford led the way, with each going 7-for-8 from the line.
- For the second time in as many games against the Demons, the Hoosiers went to the line over 40 times. IU shot 41 free throws against NSU in the 2008-09 opener. The 44 free throws on Saturday are the most since Indiana shot 44 against Ohio State on Feb. 19, 2000.
- Indiana tallied 19 assists on 25 baskets in the game, the second-highest assist total of the season for the Hoosiers. Jeremiah Rivers led the way with 10 dimes, becoming the first Hoosier since Jamarcus Ellis dished out 10 against Tennessee State on Dec. 3, 2007.
- The Hoosiers shot 54.2 percent from the field in the second half, including a 12-for-21 mark inside the three-point line.
- IU got a season-high 37 points from the bench in the contest.
- Indiana's 13 steals are a season high. Derek Elston had a career-high four takeaways in the game.
- The Hoosiers put together a 20-5 run midway through the second half to balloon a 59-50 lead into a 79-55 edge.
- Freshman Maurice Creek has scored in double figures in each of the Hoosiers' six games so far this season. The last IU freshman to do that was Eric Gordon at the start of the 2007-08 season, when he did it in his first seven games.
- Creek went 4-for-10 from the field for 17 points in the game and added two assists and two steals without a turnover.
- Rivers' 10 assists set a new career high. His previous high was seven against Belmont on March 15, 2007. His seven rebounds in the game matched a season high, as he led the team in both categories.
- Christian Watford tied Creek for the team lead with 17 points in the contest. Watford was 5-for-7 from the field and 7-for-8 from the line in the victory. He added five rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block.
- Devan Dumes had a season-high 11 points in the win. Dumes was 2-for-4 from beyond the three-point line and 3-for-4 from the free-throw line to go along with three rebounds.
- Derek Elston finished in double figures for the third time in his career, shooting 5-for-7 from the field. Elston added six boards to go along with his four steals.
- Daniel Moore made the most of his six minutes, scoring six points in hitting his only field goal and going 4-for-4 from the free-throw line. He also had a steal in his time.
- Tijan Jobe netted a career-best four points, netting both of his field goals in the game. Jobe also had two blocks in his 12 minutes of action.
- Verdell Jones III finished with eight points to go along with four assists, four rebounds and a block.

ELSTON OFF THE BENCH

Freshman forward **Derek Elston** has yet to start a game in his IU career, but he has been the biggest threat off the bench for head coach Tom Crean. In his IU debut, he posted 14 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the field against Howard. The next time out he poured in 10 points and grabbed eight rebounds against USC Upstate. Most recently, he came off the bench against Northwestern State to score 12 points, grab six rebounds and come away with four steals. He is tied for the team lead with 12 offensive rebounds and is averaging nearly eight points per game in just 16 minutes per game.

DUMES KNEE IMPROVING

Senior **Devan Dumes** has been slowed in the early part of the season with a knee injury that limited his practice time. He is averaging 4.8 ppg thanks to an 11-point outburst against Northwestern State the last time out. He averaged 12.7 points last season. Last year, December was a big month for the Indianapolis native as he averaged 14.8 points and shot 36.5 (15 for 41) from three-point range.

HULLS HANGING TOUGH

Freshman guard **Jordan Hulls** was named Mr. Basketball in the state of Indiana last year as a senior at Bloomington High School South and came to the IU campus with an abundance of expectations. In the season opener against Howard, he lived up to those expectations with five assists and zero turnovers. In the first two games in Puerto Rico, he struggled to get in the flow of the game but rebounded nicely in the final game against George Mason. He put up eight points, a season high, and hit both of his three-point attempts in 14 minutes of action.

PRITCHARD IN THE PAINT

Sophomore forward **Tom Pritchard** got off to a good start his first two games last year and his 64.7 field goal percentage is the best on the team through five games. In the season opener against Howard, the Westlake, Ohio native had 10 points and five rebounds in 20 minutes of action.

ROTH OUT INDEFINITELY

Sophomore guard **Matt Roth** suffered a broken bone in his right foot (fifth metatarsal) and underwent surgery on Nov. 25. He will be out for an indefinite period of time and may apply for a medical hardship waiver to regain a year of eligibility. He averaged 6.7 points as a freshman. He had a career-high 29 points last season against Ohio State and tied a school record with nine three-point field goals made against the Buckeyes. He was averaging 2.0 points in the first two games of the season.

BOBBY C TO YOU AND ME

Freshman forward **Bobby Capobianco** had yet to make his presence felt through four games in an IU uniform. But then Coach Crean sent him into the game against George Mason and less than 30 seconds later, Capobianco had a steal and a three-point play to his credit for his first points as a Hoosier. He went on to put up seven points and 10 rebounds in 17 minutes.

JUST DOING HIS "JOBE"

Senior center **Tijan Jobe** only averages seven minutes per game and rarely, if ever, has a play run for him, but he can be found setting countless ball screens at the top of the key as well as being a physical presence in the paint on defense for the Hoosiers. The big fella was able to get into the scoring column against George Mason when Daniel Moore found him underneath the basket for a fast break layup. Against Northwestern State, Jobe had a career-best four points on a pair of nifty reverse layups. Last year as a junior, Jobe scored a total of seven points and grabbed 14 rebounds. He is the "Most Improved Player" on the team according to Coach Crean.

MOORE PLAYING TIME

Sophomore walk on guard **Daniel Moore** has brought the team a lift in his limited playing time the last two games. He had six points and made all four of his free throw attempts against Northwestern State. He has played 17 minutes the last two games.

INDIVIDUAL LEADERS AT PUERTO RICO TIPOFF

While the Hoosiers were unable to come away with a win at the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tipoff last weekend, there were a number of positives that will be taken from the three games in four days. The best individual performance came from freshman **Maurice Creek**, who averaged 16.7 ppg and led the Hoosiers in scoring all three games. He has scored in double figures in all five games and is averaging 16.2 ppg on the year. Against Boston University, Creek came out red hot and scored 17 of the first 25 points for the Hoosiers. Redshirt junior **Jeremiah Rivers** also put up very respectable stats on the island, averaging 12.0 ppg and pulling down 6.7 rpg while getting to the free throw line a team-best 20 times. Sophomore **Verdell Jones III** was second on the team with 14.7 ppg while also nearly putting up a 2:1 assist-to-turnover ratio (11:6).

PUERTO RICO TEAM NOTES

Against Ole Miss, the Hoosiers pulled down 24 offensive rebounds - the most in a game since Nov. 30, 1991, against Butler when they had 26. The offensive glass continued to be a strength throughout the tournament as they pulled down another 18 against George Mason in the final game. The Hoosiers also made 21 free throws against George Mason, the most in a single game since making 28 in the season opener last year against Northwestern State.

- Indiana has had 71 players selected in the NBA Draft, the most among Big Ten schools
- There are three players from IU currently on active rosters in the NBA - Eric Gordon (Los Angeles Clippers), D.J. White (Oklahoma City Thunder) and Jared Jeffries (New York Knicks).

- There are also six people with Indiana ties on coaching staffs around the league and they are:

HOOSIERS SIGN OLADIPO AND SHEEHY TO NLI

Indiana University men's basketball coach Tom Crean has announced the signing of **Victor Oladipo**, a 6-4, 185 guard from DeMatha Catholic High School in Washington D.C. and **Will Sheehy**, a 6-6, 190 wing from Sagemont High School in Weston, Fla., to national letters of intent to attend the University and play basketball for the Hoosiers.

A resident of Upper Marlboro, Md., Oladipo is entering his senior year at DeMatha for head coach Mike Jones. He is currently ranked No. 133 in the 2010 recruiting class by Rivals.com and No. 36 among shooting guards. Scout.com lists the 6-4 guard as the No. 49 shooting guard in his class while ESPN.com has him listed at No. 53. He led DeMatha to a 29-3 record last year and a conference and city league title in the Washington, D.C. area. He had 14 points and 7 boards in the city championship game. He played AAU basketball for Team Takeover this past summer under the guidance of head coach Keith Stephens.

Born on May 14, 1991, he is the son of Chris and Joan Oladipo and has three siblings, Kritine, Kendra and Victoria.

A resident of Stuart, Fla., Sheehy is entering his senior year at Sagemont for head coach Adam Ross. He is currently ranked No. 131 in the 2010 recruiting class by Rivals.com. He played AAU ball for the Florida Rams under head coach Matt Ramker. As a junior, he averaged 24.6 points, 10.0 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game for South Fork High School in Florida.

Born on Jan. 16, 1992, he is the son of Mike Sheehy and Dawn Mailloux. He has a twin sister, Elizabeth, and a younger brother, Patrick. His father played collegiately at Syracuse and St. Bonaventure and his uncle, Tom Sheehy, was a former standout at Virginia and was drafted by the Boston Celtics.

FREE THROW IMPROVEMENT

In the last two games, Indiana has made 76.4 % from the line making 55 of 72 charity tosses against George Mason and Northwestern State.

LIKEWISE FROM DOWNTOWN

In the last two games, Indiana has made 45.8 % from the line making 11 of 24 triples against George Mason and Northwestern State.

THE GLASS IS CLEANER

Another area the Hoosiers are more efficient in this season is its offensive rebounding. After six games last year, Indiana averaged 9.7 offensive boards per game. This year, Indiana has pulled down 13.7 offensive rebounds per game. Their 24 against Ole Miss in the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tipoff set a tournament record for the event.

IU BY THE NUMBERS

0 - The Hoosiers do not have a player who has been in the program for four seasons. IU fielded one of the least experienced teams in college basketball history in 08-09. Junior walk-on Brett Finkelmeier is the only player who is in his third season at IU.

17.2 - Verdell Jones III averaged 17.2 points per game in the final nine games of the 2008-09 season, including 23 points apiece in the final two games of the season against Wisconsin and Penn State. He was second among Big Ten freshmen in scoring at 11.0 points per game.

The Indiana University men's basketball team will face Pittsburgh in the second game of the 2009 Jimmy V Classic scheduled for 9 p.m., Tuesday December 8 in New York's Madison Square Garden. Butler will face Georgetown in the opening contest at 7 p.m., with both games set to air on ESPN. This is the 15th Annual Classic, with Indiana making its second appearance in the event (1999). IU defeated North Carolina, 82-73, in E. Rutherford, N.J., in the 1999 Classic.

BASKETBALL DEVELOPMENT CENTER

The Indiana basketball program will move into its new Basketball Development Center at the conclusion of this season. The 67,000-square foot, multilevel facility features two practice courts, players lounge, locker rooms, coaches offices, athletic training facility, weight room and meeting and video rooms. This will allow each member of the program to have 24/7 access to help them in their development as a student-athlete. The center also will feature Legacy Court which will celebrate the unrivaled tradition of Indiana basketball.

The Indiana University men's basketball team hosted close to 150 members of the Indiana National Guard on Saturday as part of the Camouflage Kids Program based out of Elkhart. The program provides tickets to sporting events for families who are involved with our military effort overseas.

"It means a ton because (founder) Jeff [Nix] has been a great friend of mine for so long and I know exactly what his passion's all about and when he's passionate for something he gets behind it 100 percent. There's nothing like seeing the faces, and sometimes you see it on the videos that Jeff puts together, or in our case like tomorrow you see them in person. You see that there's an opportunity for them to come in, and whatever's going on in their life, it gives them an opportunity to do something different that day."

STEVE DOWNING AND BOB KNIGHT INDUCTED INTO IU ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

The Indiana University Athletic Hall of Fame inducted two of the most important names in the history of the men's basketball program, Steve Downing and Bob Knight. They were honored along with five others November 6 in a ceremony at Assembly Hall that was attended by 800, the largest crowd for the event ever. The pair join former men's soccer coach Jerry Yeagley (men's soccer, 1973-2003), Katrin Koch (women's track and field, 1989-92), Joe Norman (football, 1975-78), the late Mike Rabold (football, 1956-58), and Alan Somers (swimming, 1961-63) in the 2009 class.

Coach Knight was presented by 2008 IU Athletics Hall of Famer Bob Hammel and Rabold was honored by his brother John.

The Hall of Fame was established in 1982 by the Indiana University Varsity Club National Board of Directors, in cooperation with Indiana University, its Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, the I Association, and the Indiana University Alumni Association. Its purpose is to recognize and honor individuals who have made exceptional contributions to the achievements and prestige of Indiana University in the field of athletics and who have demonstrated the values imparted by intercollegiate athletics. Each year, a subcommittee of the Indiana University Varsity Club National Board of Directors selects inductees for the Hall of Fame. This year's class brings the current roster of IU Hall of Fame inductees to 164.

Facts on Downing and Knight

STEVE DOWNING: Won three basketball letters from 1971-73 ...Indiana and Big Ten most valuable player in 1973 after leading the Hoosiers to Final Four of the NCAA championship...was the first All-American under Coach Bob Knight... first team All-Big Ten in 1973 after averaging 20.1 points and 10.6 rebounds... averaged 15.1 rebounds in 1972, second best mark in IU history for season...ranks fifth in career rebounds with 889... played professional basketball for two years with the Boston Celtics and won an NBA title in 1974...served as IU Associate Athletic Director for 20 years... the Indianapolis native is currently a Senior Associate Athletic Director at Texas Tech.

BOB KNIGHT: Basketball coach from 1971-2000...career record of 662-239 at IU...coached teams that won 11 Big Ten Championships, a Big Ten record, and NCAA championships in 1976, 1981, and 1987...only coach in history to lead teams to NCAA (1976, 1981, and 1987), NIT (1979), Pan American (1979) and Olympic (1984) championships... last coach to have perfect winning season (32-0 in 1976)... coached 17 All-Americans, had 10 players win Big Ten MVP honors, and had 29 players who played in the NBA... Big Ten Coach-of-the-Year six times and National Coach-of-the-Year in 1975, 1976, 1987, and 1989... inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in 1991... he is the all-time winningest coach in college basketball history with a 902-371 record (70.8) which was compiled at Army, IU and Texas Tech... after playing at Orrville (Ohio) High School, he played at Ohio State under Hall of Fame Coach Fred Taylor and was a member of the Buckeyes 1960 national championship team.

DID YOU KNOW?

Head Coach Tom Crean had a 100 percent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in his nine years at Marquette, as all 27 seniors graduated and earned a degree under his leadership. Four more players he recruited graduated after the 2008-09 season.

Tom Crean, who averaged over 20 wins a season in nine years at Marquette and led the Golden Eagles to five NCAA Tournament appearances including the 2003 Final Four, was named the 28th head basketball coach in Indiana University history, on April 2, 2008. In 10 + years as a head coach on the collegiate level, he is 199-124 and has seen all 27 of the seniors who have played for him earn college degrees.

Since coming to Indiana, he and his staff recruited one of the top 10 classes in the country for 2009 and he has been relentless in embracing the tradition of Indiana University and building bridges for future fans of Indiana basketball throughout the state.

In each of his final seven seasons at Marquette, Crean's teams posted at least 19 wins and earned a postseason berth. Over those seven years, he compiled an aggregate record of 160-68 (.702). He is a two-time recipient of the Ray Meyer Conference USA, NABC District XI and USBWA District V Coach of the Year awards, and in 2003 won the Coach Clair Bee Award as well as being named a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award.

Crean built the Marquette program to the level where it has remained one of college basketball's best since 2001. From November 2001 through the end of his tenure at Marquette, the Golden Eagles spent 81 weeks in the rankings, including all but one week of the 2007-08 season, as the squad was ranked as high as 10th by the AP. In his nine years with the Golden Eagles, Crean's teams earned five NCAA Tournament bids, one more than the previous four Marquette coaches had in the 16 years prior to his arrival.

In his nine seasons in Milwaukee, Golden Eagles players earned 22 All-Conference selections and grasped the program's first conference player of the year award when Dwayne Wade won Conference USA's top honor in 2003. Wade also went on to become the first Marquette player since 1978 to be named an Associated Press first team All-American and finalist for the John R. Wooden Award.

In 2007-08, Crean's squad put together a 25-10 season and earned the No. 6 seed in the NCAA South Regional. The Golden Eagles topped Kentucky in the first round and lost a heartbreaker to No. 3 seed Stanford in overtime to come up just shy of a trip to the Sweet 16. MU finished tied for fifth in the BIG EAST with an 11-7 conference record.

Marquette had three All-BIG EAST selections as Lazar Hayward, Dominic James and Jerel McNeal all picked up second team accolades. MU was one of just two teams in the 16-squad BIG EAST to have three players selected to the top two teams. James was a first team all-conference selection in 2006-07 as well, while McNeal was named the conference's defensive player of the year.

In 2006, Steve Novak was a unanimous first team all-conference selection and went on to be selected by the Houston Rockets in the NBA Draft. That followed Travis Diener's All-America selection in 2005, joining Wade as Golden Eagles to earn the recognition under Crean's direction. Diener was selected 38th overall by the Orlando Magic in the 2005 Draft and played last year for the Indiana Pacers.

In Marquette's first two years in the BIG EAST, the Golden Eagles posted 20-plus wins and finished in the conference's top four in both campaigns. Marquette also picked up NCAA Tournament bids and won 10 conference games in both years. MU had strength in regular-season tournaments as well, winning the CBE Classic in 06-07 by topping Texas Tech and Duke and taking the Great Alaska Shootout in 2005-06.

The Golden Eagles earned trips to the National Invitation Tournament in both 2003-04 and 2004-05, their final two seasons in Conference USA. The squad won 19 games each season and posted its finest start (13-1) in over a quarter century in 2004-05.

The 2002-03 campaign was one of the finest in Golden Eagle history, as Marquette made a Final Four appearance for the first time since winning the NCAA Championship in 1977. MU won 27 games that year, 14 in conference play, thanks in part to the play of Wade in his All-America season. The Golden Eagles finished the regular season ranked No. 9 by the Associated Press and No. 6 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll and their .818 winning percentage was the program's best since 1977-78. Wade also was selected in the first round of the NBA Draft by the Miami Heat later that year.

Crean's breakthrough season came in 2001-02, as he coached Marquette to a 26-7 record and the team's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1997. The 26 victories were the third-most all-time and represented the program's first 20-win season since 1997.

The Golden Eagles secured 13 conference victories, the most in program history, and posted an undefeated home season at 16-0. In each of his first two years with MU, the Golden Eagles won 15 games and finished in the top four of the C-USA standings.

Prior to his arrival in Milwaukee, Crean served under Tom Izzo on the Michigan State basketball staff for four seasons, holding the position of associate head coach the last two. Crean also served as the Spartans' recruiting coordinator, where he routinely lured some of the nation's top talent to East Lansing, including two-time Big Ten Player of the Year Mateen Cleaves and two-time first team All-Big Ten selection Morris Peterson.

In Crean's four years on Izzo's staff, the Spartans put together an 88-41 record and made four consecutive postseason appearances, including a trip to the 1999 Final Four. In each of Crean's four seasons, MSU's win total increased, culminating with a 33-5 season and a 15-1 Big Ten ledger in 1999.

Prior to his tenure at Michigan State, Crean spent the 1994-95 season as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh and served as the associate head coach at Western Kentucky from 1990 to 1994.

In each of his final two seasons with the Hilltoppers, WKU earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament,

including a Sun Belt Championship and a trip to the Sweet 16.

Crean got his start in coaching on the Division I level in 1989-90, serving on Jud Heathcote's staff at Michigan State. That team posted a 28-6 record and earned a Sweet 16 trip after winning the Big Ten.

A native of Mount Pleasant, Michigan, Crean earned his bachelor's degree in parks and recreation with a minor in psychology from Central Michigan in 1989. While pursuing his degree, Crean coached basketball at Alma College and Mount Pleasant High School.

Tom and his wife, Joani, are the parents of Megan, 14, Riley, 10, and Ainsley, 4.

Joani's father, Jack Harbaugh, was a long-time college football coach who won a Division I-AA national championship while coaching at Western Kentucky. Her brother, Jim, played quarterback at Michigan and for the Indianapolis Colts and is currently the head football coach at Stanford. Another brother, John, is in his second year as the head coach of the Baltimore Ravens. He was an assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles from 1998-2006 after joining Cam Cameron's staff at Indiana for the 1997 season as a defensive backs/special teams coach.

IU RADIO NETWORK

Indiana University's basketball program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield Communications holds the exclusive rights as Indiana University's official radio outlet.

Headquartered in Jefferson City, Mo., Learfield Communications also owns the multi-media rights to 26 leading universities.

The schools represented by Learfield include: Alabama, Army, Clemson, Colorado, Fresno State, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas State, Maine, Memphis, Miami (Fla.), Minnesota, Missouri, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon State, Penn State, Purdue, San Jose State, South Carolina, Texas A&M, Tulsa, Wyoming and Wisconsin. Learfield was founded in 1972.

DON FISCHER

This marks the 37th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University Football and Basketball games. In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches talk shows for both football and basketball, and has a weekly IU sports show, from September through March on the IU Radio Network.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, and for the last 12 years, he has served as the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts for their preseason games on WTTV-Channel 4 in Indianapolis.

During his 36 years of work with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 22 times by two organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has honored him 18 times, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times. He has won several awards for best play-by-play, and has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. He also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in April 2004.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

Fischer has broadcast more than 1,200 Indiana University games that include six bowl games, four NCAA Basketball Championship games and two N.I.T. Championship games. From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC, and several other major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis as their source for coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 14-year period, he also served Indianapolis radio station WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their Sports Director.

A native of Mendota and Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 39 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont., Ottawa, Ill., Springfield, Ill. and Terre Haute, Ind. Fischer has four sons and seven grandchildren. He and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood.

TODD LEARY

Former Indiana guard Todd Leary is in his eighth season as the color analyst. Leary played for the Hoosiers from 1989-94 and still ranks among IU's top-10 career leaders in career three-point field goal percentage at .423, and his .460 shooting from beyond the arc in 1993-94 is ninth on the all-time list. Leary, his wife, Kim, and their three children live in Carmel, where Leary co-owns Mortgage Links and Legends Title.

JOE SMITH

Joe Smith is in his 27th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime and post-game duties since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 37th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003 was inducted into the Indiana Sportswrit-

ers/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Joe has two children, both of whom are Indiana graduates. Jeff is a 2002 graduate with a bachelor's degree in sports communications/broadcasting and recently married the former Kristen Jacob. Smith's daughter, Jamie, earned her bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2005, and she completed her master's in sports management at Tennessee.
