THE OPENING TIP

The Indiana men's basketball team is ranked 12th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll and by AP and will look to continue its quest for the Big Ten championship when it hosts Ohio State. Indiana is coming off an 85-82 win at Northwestern. The Hoosiers boast the top two scorers in the conference in freshman **Eric Gordon** (21.5) and senior **D.J. White** (17.1). White also leads the league in rebounds, averaging 10.4 per game. The leading candidate for Big Ten Player of the Year honors, White has been named the league's Player of the Week four times, the second most in Big Ten history. Both White and Gordon are among the top 30 midseason candidates for the Wooden and Naismith Awards. Gordon, a favorite for Big Ten Freshman of the Year, has set the IU record for freshman scoring with 560 points surpassing the old mark of 500 which was set by Mike Woodson in 1976-77. Sophomore **Armon Bassett** has stepped up his play with his 24-point effort at Northwestern, while freshman **Jordan Crawford** had a career-high 21 points against the Wildcats. Bassett is the top three-point shooter in the league (48.6%) and also added 18 points in the Hoosiers win over then #15 Purdue last week. Ohio State is 17-9 overall and 8-5 in the league. IU took home a 59-53 win in their first meeting of the season in Columbus.

THE COACHES

Former Indiana player and assistant coach **Dan Dakich** was named interim head coach on February 22. He is 1-0 with Indiana and 157-140 overall as a head coach. He steps in for **Kelvin Sampson** who resigned after guiding Indiana to a 43-15 record in less than two years and notched a 498-272 mark in 25 years as a head coach. Dakich returned to IU this year after serving as the head coach for 10 seasons at Bowling Green. He was the third winningest coach in Falcon history with a 156-140 mark. Dakich helped the Indiana program win 73.7 percent (283-101) of its games over the 12 years he served as an assistant coach, while the Hoosiers were winning over 70 percent of their Big Ten contests. He was a graduate assistant from 1985-87 before being named full-time prior to the 1987-88 campaign. Coach **Thad Matta** is in his fourth season at Ohio State and is 98-32 with the Buckeyes. He is 3-4 all-time against Indiana. He was the head coach at nearby Butler in 2000-2001 and at Xavier from 2001-2004.

UP NEXT

The Hoosiers visit Michigan State on March 2. IU finishes out its home season on March 5 against Minnesota before ending the regular season on March 9 at Penn State. The Hoosiers have clinched an opening day bye in the Big Ten Tournament and will not play their first game in the event until Friday, March 14.

HOOSIER HISTORY

IU is third all-time in NCAA Championships (5), fifth in NCAA Tournament appearances (34), sixth in NCAA Tournament victories (60), seventh in Final Four appearances (8) and 10th in overall victories (1,632).

Indiana has won 20 Big Ten Championships with the last coming in 2002. The Hoosiers have the best winning percentage in conference games only at 60.0%. No team has had more All-Big Ten selections than IU with 51.

Indiana has won 16 of its last 17 games at Assembly Hall against Big Ten foes and is 29-2 against the league since 2005.

• **Eric Gordon** leads the league in scoring (21.5), is fourth in the league in free throw percentage (85.5) and fourth in three-point field goals made (2.46). He has made (188) and attempted (220) more free throws than any other player in the league. The last freshman to lead the Big Ten in scoring was Minnesota's Kris Humphries (21.7) in 2004.

• **D.J. White** has recorded 17 double-doubles in his last 23 outings. He is currently second in the league in scoring (17.1), first in the league in rebounds (10.4) and field goal percentage (62.0), and fourth in the league in blocked shots (1.67). He moved into 22nd on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,338 points and into 16th all-time at IU with 689 rebounds. He is averaging 18.1 points and 11.1 rebounds in Big Ten action.

• **Jamarcus Ellis** is third in the Big Ten in rebounding (7.1) and sixth in assists (3.78). He also is second in the league in defensive rebounds at 5.59.

• The Hoosiers lead the league in scoring (76.6), free throw percentage (76.7), rebounding (38.2) and defensive rebounding (27.07). Indiana sits in the top three in eight total statistical categories.

TEAMMATES COMPETE FOR SCORING TITLE

Freshman **Eric Gordon** and senior **D.J. White** are looking to become the first teammates to finish first and second in the scoring race in the Big Ten since Michigan's Glen Rice and Gary Grant achieved the feat in 1987-88.

INDIANA AND THE BIG TEN MVP

If either White or Gordon is chosen as the league's MVP, it would mark the third time since the 2000 season that a Hoosier has been selected as the top player in the conference. Since the new millennium, A.J. Guyton shared the honor in 2000 and Jared Jeffries captured the award in 2002. Illinois has had three honorees this decade with Dee Brown (2005), Brian Cook (2003), and Frank Williams (2001), while Wisconsin saw Alando Tucker (2007) and Devin Harris (2004) recognized. Morris Peterson from Michigan State (2000) and Terence Dials from Ohio State (2006) also received the honor.

INDIANA LEADING THE BIG TEN IN...

Conference Games Only

With their 71.7 scoring average the Hoosiers are looking to lead the Big Ten in scoring for the second straight year. Last year, Indiana averaged 70.3 points per game.

The Hoosiers are leading the league in free throw percentage at 78.1. They last led the Big Ten at the line in 1997 when they shot 78.6%.

Indiana leads the league in rebound margin +7.1 and has not been the best in the Big Ten in that category since 1982 (+4.4).

All Games

Eric Gordon would be the third Hoosier this decade to lead the league in scoring, joining Bracey Wright (18.3, 2005) and A.J. Guyton (19.7, 2000). He needs to score 99 points to break the Big Ten freshman scoring record of 658 set by Michael Redd of Ohio State in 1998.

D.J. White is looking to be the first Hoosier to lead the league in rebounding since George McGinnis in 1971 (14.9). Alan Henderson led the league in conference games only (10.3) in 1994.

White also is trying to become the first Indiana player since Alan Henderson (60.9) in 1995 to lead the conference in field goal percentage.

DEANDRE THE GIANT

Fan favorite **DeAndre Thomas** has shown that when he contributes the Hoosiers likely have success. After D.J. White went down with an injury he had his best game in the Big Ten with 10 points and four boards against Michigan State. In fact, the Hoosiers are 9-0 when he scores five points or more.

TABER SHOWED GLIMPSES IN BAHAMAS

Former walk on **Kyle Taber** averaged 7.0 rebounds on the team's three-game trip to the Bahamas over Labor Day weekend. Taber, who had his first dunk as a collegian against Purdue, has made 7-of-9 field goal attempts this year.

MORE NEW NOTES

With 23 wins, the Hoosiers also have eclipsed their win total of 21 last season and their 12 conference triumphs also better the 10 victories in the league a year ago.

Dan Dakich served for 410 games as an assistant coach at Indiana before being named interim head coach on February 22. Indiana was 305-105 in those games.

The Hoosiers earned a 35-18 advantage on the glass at Northwestern, improving to 18-2 when outrebounding an opponent this season.

The Hoosiers scored 85 points, their highest total in league play this season. Indiana has reached 80 points four times in conference action, posting a 4-0 mark and 11 times overall this season (11-0).

Indiana improves to 23-4 on the season, 12-2 in Big Ten play and is tied with Purdue and a half game behind Wisconsin for the Big Ten lead. Both marks are the best since the 1992-93 season when the Hoosiers started 24-3 and went 17-1 in Big Ten play.

The ESPN crew of Brent Musburger, Steve Lavin and Erin Andrews seem to bring out the best in **D.J. White**. In three games with the group calling the action, D.J. has averaged 21.6 points and 18.0 rebounds.

Sophomore **Armon Bassett** put together back-to-back double-digit scoring efforts for the first time since the first three games of the season when the Hoosiers defeated Purdue and Northwestern last week. He had 16 points and a career-high eight rebounds against Purdue and added 24 points versus the Wildcats. Indiana is 10-1 when he hits two three-pointers or more in a game this season.

Freshman **Jordan Crawford** came up big with a career-high 21 points and Northwestern. It also marked the third time this season that the Detroit product knocked in four three-pointers in a game. The Hoosiers also are 13-1 in games where he scores in double figures.

The Hoosiers were 10 for 10 from the line in the final five minutes of the game against Northwestern. For the season, they have connected on 130 of 163 charity tosses (79.8%) in the final five minutes of contests this season.

GORDON GETTING HOTTER

Freshman **Eric Gordon** is averaging 22.8 points in his last four games. In the four games, he is averaging 12.5 free throw attempts and has made 43-of-50 charity tosses. In fact, he has hit 13 free throws in each of his last two games (26-of-31). He had his Big Ten season high of 29 points against Northwestern on February 3 when the Hoosiers defeated the Wildcats, 75-63. The Hoosiers are 7-1 when he makes 10 free throws or more in a game.

D.J. WHITE AND ERIC GORDON

D.J. White and Eric Gordon are having one of the best seasons in school history by a pair of Hoosier teammates. Below is a summary of some of their accomplishments.

WHITE AND GORDON IN RARE COMPANY

WHITE DOMINATING BIG TEN POW

Indiana's **D.J. White** has been dominant in terms of earning Big Ten Player of the Week honors. The senior post player has picked up the award four times this season, while Michigan State's Raymar Morgan and Penn State's Geary Claxton are the only two players who have picked up the honor twice this season. White is one of just three players in league history to have collected the honor four times or more in a single season.

TOP SCORING TANDEM IN IU HISTORY

D.J. White and **Eric Gordon** are currently combining to average 38.6 points per game this season. The two currently rank 1-2 in the league in scoring in both league games and overall affairs. In all games, the pair is nearly 10 points ahead of the nearest competition, as Michigan State's Raymar Morgan (15.1) and Drew Neitzel (14.0) are combining for 29.1 points per contest.

White and Gordon are also looking to become the seventh duo in school lore to put up an aggregate of 40 points or more.

SEEING 25/25

Eric Gordon (29) and **D.J. White** (26) each cleared the 25-point mark in a 75-63 win over Northwestern on February 3. In doing that, they became the first pair of Hoosier teammates to break 25 points in the same game since Marco Killingsworth (28) and Marshall Strickland (25) did so in a victory over Nicholls State on Nov. 18, 2005. However, while Strickland and Killingsworth combined for 53.5 percent (53 of 99) of IU's points, White and Gordon made up a whopping 73.3 percent (55 of 75) of the Hoosier offense against Northwestern. On the year, Gordon and White have scored 1,023 of Indiana's 2,067 points (49.5 percent).

500/500 CLUB

Eric Gordon (560) and **D.J. White** (463) are both on pace to top the 500-point barrier this season, as they seek to become the 47th and 48th players in school history to top that mark. Should they both clear 500 points, they would become just the ninth tandem in IU lore to both score more than 500 points in a season. The highest point total that two Hoosiers have posted in the same season came in 1992-93, when Calbert Cheaney and Greg Graham set an IU record by scoring 1,362 points between them. Gordon (on pace for at least 670) and White (on pace for at least 548) could find themselves challenging that duo for the all-time scoring mark.

LAST TIME AGAINST OHIO STATE

- The win for Indiana was the 100th in the all-time series against the Buckeyes. The all-time series now stands at 100-72 in favor of the Hoosiers, and the win on the road was the first for Indiana in Columbus since Jan. 20, 2004.
- Indiana was 7-for-7 from the free throw line in the game. The last time IU did not miss a free throw was Jan. 2, 2007, at Ohio State when they went 11-for-11.
- For the 13th time this season, senior D.J. White scored the first points of the game for the Hoosiers and Indiana is 12-1 in those games.
- White's 21 points gives him 1,280 in his career, moving him up to 24th place on the all-time scoring list at Indiana, passing Steve Green and Joby Wright. Next on the list is Tom Bolyard with 1,299.
- In addition to his 21 points, White also grabbed 13 rebounds for his 15th double double in his last 19 games. Of his 13 rebounds, six were on the offensive end; the second time in the last three games he has grabbed six offensive boards. It also marked the 10th time in White's career that he surpassed the 20-point, 10-rebound mark in a game.
- There was little doubt as to if White was going to get his double double since he had secured it by halftime. It was the second time this season has had a double double in the bag by halftime (Chicago State-- 10 points, 10 rebounds at intermission)

- White also played all 40 minutes for the Hoosiers, the second straight game he has played 40 or more minutes. Prior to this season, White had played 40 or more minutes in a game just twice.
- Eric Gordon got the Hoosiers off to a good start, hitting two three point field goals in the first three minutes of the game. He would go on to hit his first three three-point field goals and finished with 15 points.
- The freshman from Indianapolis was also 4-for-4 from the charity stripe, with all of them coming in the final minute of play.
- Gordon's three 3-point field goals made give him 60 this season, the second most by a freshman in IU history, trailing only Bracey Wright's 66 in 2002-03.
- Jordan Crawford had one of his best all-around games of his brief IU career to this point. His line showed eight points, a career high seven assists, six rebounds and three steals in 31 minutes of play. He also had two key free throws with eight seconds left to bump the IU lead from four to six points.
- Kyle Taber went 1-for-1 from the field for the second straight game and also pulled down two rebounds.
- Jamarcus Ellis posted six points, four rebounds, two assists and a steal and was key in Hoosiers' offense against the Ohio State zone.

White was the first player since Steve Downing in 1972 to collect 15 rebounds or more in three straight games (Chicago State, Iowa, Michigan). White has had 121 rebounds in the last 10 games (12.1).

1,300 points/650 rebounds

White is now the 11th player in Hoosier history to record more than 1,300 points (1,338) and 650 rebounds (689) during his career. He is the first player to accomplish the feat since Kirk Haston had 1,406 points and 748 rebounds from 1999-2001.

Pan-Am Games Experience Helped

White became the eighth player in Indiana basketball history to suit up for Team USA in the Pan American Games this past summer for Villanova Coach Jay Wright and was the top performer for the squad after averaging 16.8 points (4th in the tournament) and 8.6 rebounds (3rd in the event) in five games. He shot 59.3% from the field.

ELLIS SETS THE TONE

Junior **Jamarcus Ellis** made quite a first impression in his first Big Ten game at Iowa. He had 15 points, seven rebounds, seven assists and five steals. In addition, he tied the score just before halftime with an off-balance jumper, and had six straight points in a key second half stretch which saw the Hoosiers rally from a four-point deficit against the Hawkeyes.

For the season, he is averaging 7.1 points, 7.1 rebounds (third in the Big Ten) and 3.78 assists (sixth in the Big Ten) and is second on the team with 20 blocked shots and leads the team with 39 steals. He grabbed a career-high 13 boards at Wisconsin, pulled down a career-best six offensive rebounds against Northwestern and added 11 rebounds, 10 on the defensive end at Illinois. His nickname, Tone, is short for his middle name, Antonio.

GORDON'S BIG TEN DEBUT WAS NOTABLE

HOOSIERS NEED BASSETT

Sophomore point guard **Armon Bassett** is showing his toughness by playing through pain caused by bone chips in his left foot and the Hoosiers are 10-2 when he scores 10 points or more. The Terre Haute, Ind., native had 16 points (4-of-4 from deep), a career-high eight rebounds and four assists in the team's win against Purdue and carded a season-high 24 points in the full 40 minutes at Northwestern. Over the last 10 games he has 32 assists to 14 turnovers. Bassett is currently leading the Big Ten in three-point field goal percentage at 48.6 percent. Bassett also saved the day with 11 points at home against Illinois and his clutch triples in the second half helped IU post the win against the Illini. His clutch free throws in overtime helped the Hoosiers top Illinois in Champaign.

TABER GETS WELL DESERVED START

Redshirt junior forward **Kyle Taber** made his first career start and played a career-long 24 minutes against Northwestern. Prior to the game, Taber had seen one minute of action in the previous seven Big Ten games.

He contributed four rebounds (two offensive) and added a blocked shot against the Wildcats. He followed that up with a strong 21 minutes at Illinois and found himself back in the starting fold in the team's win at Ohio State and against Wisconsin. After a solid 18-minute effort against Michigan State, the Evansville, Ind., native posted a career-best six points with five rebounds, two assists and one steal in 21 minutes against rival Purdue. Since the Northwestern game on Feb. 3, Taber has started three times and averaged 2.7 rebounds in 17.9 minutes.

He had a career-high four points against Chicago State and a career-best six rebounds against Western Carolina this season.

HOOSIERS ON THE ROAD THIS SEASON

Indiana is 7-1 on the road this season with wins at Southern Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Illinois and Ohio State. IU is 8-2 in games away from Assembly Hall.

Hoosier opponents are shooting just 29.1% from long distance when they are at home.

IU is winning the battle of the boards, 39.6 to 31.5, in these games.

Freshman **Eric Gordon** is averaging 18.8 points and shooting 44.1 from the field and 40.4 from three-point range and senior **D.J. White** is averaging 17.4 points and 13.6 rebounds.

Freshman **Jordan Crawford** is averaging 12.3 points and shooting 53.8 from long distance.

NORTHWESTERN POST-GAME NOTES

- Interim head coach Dan Dakich earned his first victory patrolling the Hoosier sideline. He is the 19th coach in Indiana history to win his first game.
- Indiana improves to 23-4 on the season, 12-2 in Big Ten play and moves into a three-way share of first place with Wisconsin and Purdue. Both marks are the best since the 1992-93 season when the Hoosiers started 24-3 and went 17-1 in Big Ten play.
- The Hoosiers improved to 7-1 on the road this season and 8-2 in games away from Assembly Hall.
- IU is 6-1 in Big Ten road games, the best mark since the 1992-93 squad went 8-1 in league road contests.
- Indiana hit 30 free throws for the second consecutive game. After connecting on 30-of-34 against Purdue, the Hoosiers hit 30-of-37 at Northwestern. Prior to the Purdue game, the last time a Hoosier squad hit 30 free throws was on Jan. 5, 2002 (32).
- Freshman guard Eric Gordon hit 13 of those 30 free throws in 16 attempts, his second straight game with 13 free throws made. It marked the eighth time this season the Indianapolis native hit double-digit free throws. He finished the game with 18 points in 38 minutes.
- As a team, the Hoosiers went 10-of-10 from the charity stripe in the final five minutes. Senior forward D.J. White capped the run with a pair with four seconds left for the final points of the ballgame.
- Sophomore point guard Armon Bassett scored 24 points, one off of his career-high of 25 (vs. Michigan State, 2/24/07). He shot 7-of-12 from the field, 4-of-7 from beyond the arc and 6-of-7 from the charity stripe.
- Bassett played the full 40 minutes. It is the second time this season the Terre Haute native has played at least 40 minutes. Bassett played a career-high 42 minutes at Illinois.
- Freshman guard Jordan Crawford scored a career-high 21 points in 29 minutes off the bench. Crawford went 4-of-5 from deep, matching his career-high (third time) and shot 6-of-7 overall. He also added five assists, four rebounds and went a perfect 5-of-5 from the foul line. He has hit his last 11 free throw attempts (4 vs. Purdue, 2 vs. Michigan State).
- D.J. White collected 16 points and 11 rebounds in 38 minutes against Northwestern. He now has 17 double-doubles on the season.
- With his 16 points White surpassed Ted Kitchel (1,336 points, 1970-72) for 22nd on the Hoosiers' all-time scoring list. He now has 1,338 points in his career. White also moved into 16th on the all-time rebound list, passing Ken Johnson (687 points, 1968-70). He now has 689 for his career, one behind Calbert Cheaney (1990-93).
- The Hoosiers earned a 35-18 advantage on the glass, improving to 18-2 when outrebounding an opponent this season.
- Indiana is now 107-43 all-time against Northwestern. The Hoosiers swept the season series against the Wildcats and earned its second straight victory in Evanston.
- The Hoosiers scored 85 points, their highest total in league play this season. Indiana has reached 80 points four times in conference action, posting a 4-0 mark and 11 times overall this season (11-0).
- The 85 points were the third-highest total allowed by Northwestern this season. NU entered the contest giving up 68.2 points per game.

HOME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED

Connecticut's victory at Assembly Hall snapped Indiana's 29-game home winning streak. The Hoosiers had not lost a home contest dating back to Feb. 11, 2006. It also marked Kelvin Sampson's first loss on the Branch McCracken Court (27-1) and snapped IU's 13-game overall winning streak.

CRAWFORD CONTRIBUTES AS A FROSH

Freshman **Jordan Crawford** has emerged as a strong candidate for the Big Ten's All-Freshman team and Sixth Man of the Year Award. He is eighth among rookies in scoring in the league averaging 10.4 points. Combined with Gordon, they make up one of the strongest young backcourts in the nation averaging 31.9 points per game or 41.6 percent of the Hoosiers' scoring attack. Usually the first option off the bench, unless there is an injury, he has scored in double figures in 14 of 23 games this season.

His most memorable performance of the season came when he started against his brother, Joe, when the Hoosiers battled Kentucky. Playing 39 minutes in his first career start, he had 20 points, two assists and two steals as the Hoosiers got the best of the Wildcats, 70-51.

In his last outing, Crawford scored a career-high 21 points in 29 minutes. Crawford went 4-of-5 from deep, matching his career-high (third time) and shot 6-of-7 overall. He also added five assists, four rebounds and went a perfect 5-of-5 from the foul line. He has hit his last 11 free throw attempts (4 vs. Purdue, 2 vs. Michigan State).

Since the Hoosiers' win at Illinois (six games), where he hit a pair of crucial treys in OT, Crawford has averaged 10.8 points, 3.7 boards, 3.3 assists and posted a 1.7 assist/turnover ratio. Crawford is shooting 47.8 from the floor and 52.6 from downtown during the stretch.

RPI AND SAGARIN RATINGS

The Hoosiers are 19th in the latest RPI and 13th according to the Sagarin Ratings.

STEMLER IS MR. BIG SHOT

Senior captain **Lance Stemler** is proving to be quite a performer in the clutch during Big Ten play. Twice in Big Ten play, he has made three-pointers which have given IU the lead for good and helped them erase second-half deficits. Against Minnesota, Stemler buried a triple from the top of the key to give the Hoosiers a 61-60 lead with a little more than a minute to go. At Iowa, he hit a trey from the right wing which gave IU the lead for good with more than 12 minutes to go. At Illinois, he hit another big triple late in regulation to cut the Hoosiers deficit from four to one. He has started five of the last six games and has hit at least one three-pointer in seven of the last nine contests.

HOOSIER QUICK HITS

• The Hoosiers posted a 2.89 grade point average during the fall semester. Seven players earned grade point averages above 3.0 including **D.J. White, Lance Stemler, Jamarcus Ellis, Brett Finkelmeier, Adam Ahlfeld** and **Kyle Taber**.

• Chicago State went 0-for-5 from the free throw line, the first Hoosier opponent since at least 1970 to not make at least one free throw during a game against Indiana. San Francisco went 1 for 1 on free throw attempts against Indiana in Assembly Hall on December 20, 1998. On December 3, 1991, the Hoosiers did not make a free throw in a 78-46 win over Notre Dame at home.

• Freshman **Eric Gordon** had 31 points against Illinois State, his third 30+ point effort of the season. Only one other freshman in school history, Mike Woodson in 1976-77, has scored 30 or more points three times in their freshman year.

The Indianapolis North Central product is the first player in Indiana basketball history to score 20 points or more in the first seven games of his career. George McGinnis held the previous record with six straight to start a career. Gordon also set an IU first game and two-game scoring record with 31 points against UT Chattanooga and a total of 54 points in his first two games, topped, McGinnis who had 52.

The Hoosiers are 16-1 when he makes two or more three-point field goals.

• Senior **D.J. White** has posted a double-double in 20 of his last 29 games and has notched 10 rebounds or more in 20 of the last 28 games. He was an all-tournament choice at the Chicago Invitational Challenge.

With 689 career rebounds, he is now 16th in career rebounds at IU.

ODDS AND TRENDS

- Indiana is 34-1 when scoring 70 points during the last two years
- Indiana is 32-4 when leading at the half in the past two seasons.
- The Hoosiers are 31-5 when outrebounding in the past two seasons.
- The Hoosiers played their first overtime game of the season at Illinois, winning in two extra sessions, 83-79. It was IU's first double-OT game since Jan. 15, 2005, at Purdue. Indiana is now 3-1 in double-overtime games in the last 10 years, with all three wins coming on the road.
- The Hoosiers made defensive stops in back-to-back games in the closing seconds when holding a two-point lead against Illinois and a one-point cushion against Minnesota.
- Indiana posted its first win in two years when trailing with under five minutes to go at Minnesota. The Gophers led 56-52. Indiana replicated the feat at Illinois, as the Illini held a 59-54 edge with five minutes to play.
- At Northwestern, the Hoosiers rallied for their ninth victory when trailing at the half during the past two seasons.
- The Hoosiers rallied for a win for the sixth time this season at Northwestern when trailing by eight points or more in a game. UNC Wilmington led IU, 18-8, with 15:29 to go in the first half, Georgia Tech led the Hoosiers, 26-18, with 9:25 left in the opening half and the Illini led the Hoosiers, 13-4, with 15:52 remaining in the first half in the team's game in Bloomington. In Champaign, the Hoosiers were down 42-30 with 16:33 to go in regulation. Against the Spartans, Indiana trailed 15-4 with 13:33 left in the first half and NU held a 25-16 edge with 9:42 to go in the opening stanza.
- The Hoosiers have four comeback wins when trailing in the second half, two of them against the Illini and one against Georgia Tech and at Northwestern.
- Indiana never trailed against Longwood, Illinois State, Tennessee State, Kentucky, Western Carolina, Chicago State and Northwestern.
- The Hoosiers had 56 rebounds, the most in the last two seasons, against Chicago State.
- Against Southern Illinois, Indiana saw the Salukis miss their first 12 three-point field goal attempts.
- The Hoosiers snapped a four-game losing streak in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge with an 83-79 victory over Georgia Tech.

Assembly Hall

The Hoosiers have won 32 of their last 34 games at home and several numbers show why the Hoosiers have been dominant in Assembly Hall.

- Indiana is 179-19 (90.4) all-time at Assembly Hall against non-conference foes and 263-51 (83.8) against the Big Ten.
- The Hoosiers are averaging 80.6 points per game in their 17 home games this season.
- Indiana is shooting 49.9% from the floor.
- Three players are shooting 50% or better from the field at home. **D.J. White** (65.7), **Armon Bassett** (51.9) and **DeAndre Thomas** (50.0) have been blistering from the field at home.
- Opponents are shooting just 40.5% from the floor and 36.0% from three-point range.
- The Hoosiers are outrebounding opponents 36.7 to 29.1.

BASKETBALL DEVELOPMENT CENTER

IU held its official groundbreaking ceremony June 19 to signify the beginning of construction of several major athletic facilities including the North Endzone Facility, Basketball Development Center, Baseball Stadium, Softball Stadium and The Academic Resource Center. The \$55 million plan was approved by trustees on Sept. 22, 2006. Architectural plans call for the Indiana basketball teams to have a new facility to call home. The Indiana Basketball Development Center will serve as the daily headquarters for the men's and women's programs, featuring practice courts, locker rooms, coach's offices and meeting rooms for each team, as well as a training room and strength development area. The addition of the center will alleviate overcrowding issues encountered in the current facility. In addition, a legacy area will be developed to honor the history of Indiana basketball. The Student Development and Compliance unit at Indiana University (target move-in is spring 2009) will relocate as a part of the facilities plan, moving from a modest 2,500 square foot space in Assembly Hall to a spacious and renovated 18,000 square foot area located on the east side of Memorial Stadium. Classrooms, private tutoring space, study areas, computer labs and staff offices will all be housed in the Academic Center for Excellence.

HOOSIERS WORK OVERTIME FOR WIN AT ILLINOIS

- The last time IU swept the season series from the Illini was also during the 1998-99 season when it logged a 62-53 win in Bloomington before that overtime win in Champaign.
- The 83-79 final score means that each of the last four meetings between the two teams has been decided by exactly four points, with the Hoosiers posting a 3-1 record in those games.
- Indiana's last overtime game was March 9, 2007 at the Big Ten Tournament, also against Illinois. The Illini came away with a 58-54 win in that game.
- The Hoosiers' last overtime win came during the 2004-05 season at home against Michigan State, a 78-74 triumph on Feb. 27, 2005. The last IU overtime win on the road also came that same season, a 75-73 double-overtime win at Purdue on Jan. 15.
- Four Indiana players, **Armon Bassett (43)**, **D.J. White (48)**, **Jamarcus Ellis (43)** and **Eric Gordon (45)**, played over 40 minutes for the first time since that same double overtime win at Purdue. The totals are new career highs for all four Hoosiers.

BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA--Indiana can win with defense, too.

On a night when Eric Gordon scored 30 points and five Hoosiers finished in double figures, it was a relentless defensive effort that overshadowed everything and allowed No. 8 Indiana to rout North Carolina-Wilmington 95-71 in the second round of the Chicago Invitational Challenge.

For the Hoosiers (3-0), it was actually a well-rounded night.

They shot 60.4 percent from the field, the highest percentage since Sampson took over as coach last year. They forced 26 turnovers and allowed UNCW to shoot only 44.4 percent after it started by making seven of its first nine shots.

Gordon was his usual self, connecting on 8-of-12 shots and making 12-of-13 free throws, and when he started going to the basket it opened things up for his teammates. The result: Armon Bassett scored 19 points, Jordan Crawford 15, D.J. White 12 and DeAndre Thomas 11.

Indiana flirted with the 100-point mark for the third straight game and produced its 20th consecutive regular-season home win. The Seahawks were led by Todd Hendley with 20 points and Chad Tomko with 17 but couldn't keep up with Indiana's scorers, depth or defensive pressure, and again, Gordon, a freshman, proved the difference. The Hoosiers went on a 9-0 run to take their first lead, 27-24, when Bassett completed a three-point play with 7:42 left in the half, and then the defensive pressure changed everything in the final 10 minutes.

With Gordon continually forcing UNCW to go to other players, the turnovers mounted. By halftime, they had 17 turnovers and the Hoosiers were running away with easy baskets that produced a 12-0 spurt and a 39-26 lead. By halftime it was 52-32, and Gordon and Bassett had already combined for as many points as the entire UNCW team.

HOOSIERS BEST ILLINOIS STATE, 70-57

HOFFMAN ESTATES, ILLINOIS--Freshman Eric Gordon scored 31 points, the third time in four games he's hit for at least 30, and No. 8 Indiana held off a second-half charge to beat Illinois State 70-57 in the Chicago Invitational Challenge.

Gordon showed off the dazzling skills that allowed him to average 28 points in the first three games of his freshman career. He scored 20 in the first half on 8-of-11 shooting. He had 11 straight Indiana points during one stretch to help the Hoosiers build a 38-28 halftime lead. Illinois State (3-1), seeking its first victory over a Top 10 opponent since the 1983-84 season, gave Indiana its first real test in its first road game.

Gordon made his first basket of the second half an emphatic one, driving down the lane for a thunderous dunk with 13:05 left, bringing a large contingent of Hoosiers fans at the Sears Center to their feet as Indiana went up by 11. But Levi Dyer, who had 18 points, hit a pair of 3-pointers as the scrappy Redbirds ran off nine straight points to cut the lead to 50-48 with just over 10 minutes remaining.

But another freshman, Jordan Crawford, scored six points to spark a late 10-2 run for Indiana that put the Hoosiers up by 11 with about three minutes to go. Crawford finished with 13 points, 10 in the second half.

Gordon helped the Hoosiers built a 13-point lead in the first half by scoring 11 straight Indiana points. He lost a dribble on a fastbreak but quickly retrieved it and hit a layup. And then moments after hitting two free throws, he sneaked free on an inbound pass for a layup to make it 25-16.

Xavier (4-1) outscored Indiana (4-1) 13-3 over the final 3:54 of the first half to turn a one-point advantage into a 40-29 lead, and the Musketeers maintained control the rest of the way. Anderson shot 7-of-14, while Raymond hit 7 of 12. And both did a good job on the boards, with Raymond grabbing 10 rebounds and Anderson eight.

They were leading 27-26 when they scored eight straight. Indiana's Armon Bassett hit a 3-pointer with 58 seconds remaining, but Burrell then rattled in one from the wing, the ball hitting the rim before falling through the net. The Musketeers ended the half with another wild shot.

It was a rough half for Indiana, which hit just 12 of 32 shots and was 1-of-9 on 3-pointers.

HOOSIERS OVER GA. TECH, 83-79

BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA-- Four players scored in double figures as No. 15 Indiana managed to gut out an 83-79 win over Georgia Tech at Assembly Hall as part of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. With the win the Hoosiers improved to 5-1, while the Yellow Jackets fall to 3-3.

Indiana, the top shooting team in the Big Ten entering the game, shot 49 percent (24-49) from the field. Solid Georgia Tech defense also limited IU from three-point range, hitting seven of 18 attempts (39 percent). The Hoosiers had a decisive advantage at the free throw line, connecting on 28 of 38 attempts while the Yellow Jackets were 11 of 20.

Freshman Eric Gordon led all scorers with 29 points. Gordon was just 7 of 14 from the field but went to the charity stripe 16 times, making 13 shots. Senior D.J. White recorded his second-straight double double with 18 points and a career-high tying 14 rebounds. Lance Stemler and Jamarcus Ellis each set season highs with 15 points apiece.

Clinging to a 38-34 halftime advantage, Indiana opened the second half with a four-minute scoring drought that allowed the Yellow Jackets to come back and take a 43-38 lead. White made good on one of two free throws with 12:15 to play and the Hoosiers were back within one, 51-50.

It remained a one-point affair at 53-52 until Ellis was fouled driving to the hoop and hit both freebies to put the Hoosiers back in the lead at 8:45. Up 63-60 as the clock ticked under six minutes, Stemler drained his third three-point basket of the night. A pair of Gordon free throws, resulting in some breathing room at 68-60, followed a defensive stand. Indiana's largest lead of the game came with 3:37 remaining when a triple from Gordon made it 75-65.

Indiana took control midway through the first half with a 15-5 run that expanded the lead to 20-15 with 6:11 left in the first half.

Kentucky closed to 31-23 when brother Joe Crawford stole the ball from his brother and drove in for a layup. But Jordan Crawford made three of four free throws in the final 90 seconds, during a five-point flurry that gave Indiana a 37-25 halftime lead.

The second half was all Hoosiers.

Indiana scored the first nine points in the second half, building a 46-25 lead, and then things turned ugly for the Wildcats. Bradley fouled out with 13:51 left, and Michael Porter fouled out with 9:58 to go.

Even when something did go right, like Joe Crawford's driving layup at the 12:49 mark, the Wildcats still made mistakes. Crawford drew a technical foul after the play.

The result: Kentucky never got closer than 17 points the rest of the way, and Jordan Crawford walked away with a win and family bragging rights.

Senior D.J. White became the 41st player in school history to eclipse the 1,000 point mark with his 16-point, 13-rebound performance. He now has scored 1,006 points.

Gordon had no trouble with his shooting touch, finishing 8-of-13 and 6-of-11 from 3-point range, and the Hoosiers had no problem getting back in sync with their dazzling freshman.

White opened the game with back-to-back three-point plays, an ominous sign of what was to come for the Catamounts.

By halftime, Indiana had already strung together runs of 8-0, 8-0, 11-0 and 7-0, then used a 15-0 spurt early in the second half to close out their 24th consecutive home victory. That's the fourth longest streak in the country, and Sampson is now 22-0 at Assembly Hall since taking over as coach last season.

HOOSIERS HOLD OFF WILDCATS, 85-82

EVANSTON, ILLINOIS--Armon Bassett scored a season-high 24 points and the No. 15 Hoosiers earned an 85-82 victory over Northwestern on Saturday night. Interim head coach Dan Dakich earned his first victory patrolling the Hoosier sideline.

Indiana improved to 23-4 on the season and 12-2 in Big Ten play. Both marks are the best since the 1992-93 season when the Hoosiers started 24-3 and went 17-1 in Big Ten play. D.J. White deflected a potential go-ahead layup by Northwestern's Michael Thompson, then hit two free throws to make it 85-82 with 5 seconds left. Thompson missed a pull-up 3-pointer at the buzzer, and the Hoosiers moved into a three-way tie for first with Wisconsin and Purdue.

Bassett played the full 40 minutes and finished one point away from matching his career-high set last season. He shot 7-of-12 from the field, 4-of-7 from beyond the arc and 6-of-7 from the charity stripe.

Jordan Crawford scored 21, and Eric Gordon scored 18, hitting 13-of-16 free throws. White added 16 points and 11 rebounds for his 17th double-double of the campaign.

Crawford went 4-of-5 from deep, matching his career-high (third time) and shot 6-of-7 overall in 29 minutes off the bench. He also added five assists, four rebounds and went a perfect 5-of-5 from the foul line.

Kevin Coble scored a career-high 37 points for Northwestern (7-18, 0-14), and his 3-pointer gave the Wildcats a 78-77 lead with 2:49 left, whipping their fans into a frenzy that only grew louder when Gordon charged into Nikola Baran.

But with Indiana leading 79-78, Northwestern had a chance to go ahead in the final minute, when the Hoosiers' Crawford attempted a long inbound pass near his own basket. Jeremy Nash intercepted the ball near midcourt, but Craig Moore missed a 3-pointer.

INTERIM HEAD COACH DAN DAKICH



Former Indiana player and assistant coach **Dan Dakich** was named interim head coach of the Hoosiers on February 22. He returned to Bloomington this past summer as Director of Basketball Op-

erations and was named an assistant coach in October.

The Indiana native began a 16-year association with the IU program in the fall of 1981 after graduating from Andrean High School in Merrillville.

He played for the Hoosiers and Coach Bob Knight from 1982-85 and was a team captain during his junior and senior seasons as the Hoosiers finished with an 84-39 record during his career. As a player, he helped Indiana win one Big Ten title, earn three NCAA Tournament berths and finish as the NIT runner-up his senior season. As a junior, he was named All-Tournament at the Indiana Classic and as a senior he earned similar accolades at the Hoosier Classic. He is best remembered for his excellent defensive effort against Michael Jordan in Indiana's upset of North Carolina in the 1984 NCAA East Regional.

Dakich also spent 12 seasons on the IU coaching staff under Coach Knight from 1985-97. Dakich helped the Indiana program win 73.7 percent (283-101) of its games over the 12 years he served as an assistant coach while the Hoosiers

were winning over 70 percent of their Big Ten contests. He was a graduate assistant from 1985-87 before being named full-time prior to the 1987-88 campaign.

The Hoosiers won a national title in 1987 and earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament in each of his 12 seasons on the staff. IU also captured four Big Ten titles while finishing third or better in nine of his 12 years.

He also coached six All-Americans and three national Player of the Year candidates, including

1993 Player of the Year Calbert Cheaney, worked with three Big Ten MVPs, and academically, graduated every four-year player to go through the program (Dakich was the academic monitor on the IU basketball staff his last seven years).

He also coached 10 players at IU who have played in the NBA.

Dakich returns to Bloomington after spending the last 10 years as the men's basketball coach at Bowling Green. At BGSU, he tied for third all-time in victories among Falcon coaches with 156 and also was just one of three coaches in school history to post four 18-plus win seasons or more in men's basketball. He saw 22 of 25 seniors complete their degree requirements and had 12 former players sign professional contracts, including current Indiana Pacers guard Keith McLeod. In addition, he had two players earn MAC Player of the Year and three lead the league in scoring during his tenure.

His 2000 squad won the regular season MAC title and played in the NIT and in 2002 his team advanced to the MAC Tournament title game and also played in the NIT. Dakich also was heavily involved in community activities. He ran the Junior Falcons basketball program, a league for children ages 7 thru 14. He also was involved with the United Way, Cherry Street Mission and Make-A-Wish program.

Dakich, who was one of 16 former prep players chosen for the 2006 Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame High School Silver Anniversary team, is a 1985 graduate of IU with a degree in telecommunications. He and his wife, Jackie, have a son, Andrew (13), and a daughter, Laura (10).

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH RAY McCALLUM



Indiana native **Ray McCallum** was named Assistant Head Coach on February 22, in the middle of his second year at Indiana.

The Ball State graduate has more than 20 years of coach-

ing experience, including two stints as a head coach at the Division I level. Additionally, McCallum spent the two years prior to Indiana as an assistant coach at Oklahoma.

McCallum has helped IU and OU to a combined 66-28 record and three NCAA Tournament appearances and has helped land top-10 recruiting classes at both schools. Prior to going to OU, McCallum was the head coach at Houston from 2000-04.

In 2001-02, he led the Cougars to an 18-15 mark and a berth in the NIT, Houston's first postseason tournament appearance since the 1992-93 season. Houston finished 9-7 in Conference USA's National Division that year, and advanced to the league's tournament semifinal for the first time.

During his stay in UH, McCallum played an integral role in the development of Andre Owens, who is with the Indiana Pacers. Overall, he has coached eight NBA players during their collegiate career.

McCallum made his head coaching debut at Ball State, where the Cardinals posted a 126-76 record from 1993-00. McCallum directed Ball State to two NCAA Tournament appearances and an NIT berth and became the first coach in Ball

State history to post seven consecutive winning seasons.

In 1999-2000, McCallum directed the Cardinals to a 22-9 record and the Mid-American Conference's (MAC) Western Division championship. Ball State captured the MAC Tournament title that year to earn an automatic NCAA Tournament bid. When he left BSU, his .624 winning percentage rated as fourth-best in the 53-year history of the MAC.

During his head coaching career at Ball State, McCallum recruited and coached Bonzi Wells, who has had a long NBA career. McCallum briefly joined the coaching staff at Michigan in 1993 before accepting the Ball State head coaching job.

McCallum started his full-time coaching career as an assistant at Wisconsin in 1984. The Badgers had won only 63 games the six seasons before McCallum joined the program. He helped reverse the trend when the Badgers were selected to play in the 1989 NIT -- Wisconsin's first postseason tournament showing since the 1947 NCAA Tournament.

One of the most illustrious players in Ball State history, McCallum graduated as the MAC's all-time scoring leader and became the first BSU athlete to have his jersey retired in any sport. McCallum led his team in scoring all four years.

In 1979-80, he garnered MAC Freshman of the Year recognition and earned second-team all-conference honors. He picked up All-MAC First Team and MAC All-Tournament Team accolades in each of the 1980-81, 1981-82 and 1982-83 seasons, and was tabbed the 1981 MAC Tournament MVP and the 1982-83 MAC Player of the Year.

McCallum also earned the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award as the nation's most outstanding collegiate senior 6-feet or under in 1983. Later that year, he was selected by the Indiana Pacers in the NBA Draft.

Born in West Memphis, Ark., and raised in Muncie, Ind., McCallum won Indiana state titles at Muncie Central High School in 1978 and '79 before earning his Ball State degree in industrial technology, and his wife, Wendy, are the parents of a daughter, Brittany, and a son, Ray Michael.
