## THE OPENING TIP

Indiana begins its 109th season of men's basketball when it hosts Northwestern (La.) State on Saturday night in the head coaching debut of Tom Crean. The Hoosiers were 2-0 in exhibition games having defeated Anderson, 103-71, and Bemidji State, 72-54. Northwestern State was 15-18 and advanced to the Southland Conference Tournament Championship game for the fourth straight year in 2008.

Indiana is 179-18 all-time in non-conference games at Assembly Hall and 1-0 against teams from the Southland Conference. The Hoosiers defeated Nicholls State, 99-65, on November 18, 2005, in Bloomington.

## THE WHOOSIERS

Tom Crean and his staff will put one of the least experienced teams in NCAA Division I history on the floor for the 2008-09 season. Senior Kyle Taber (28 points) and sophomore walk-on Brett Finkelmeier (2 points) are all that return from last year's 25-8 squad which advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Indiana will take the floor with seven new scholarship players and three additional walk-ons to start the season with Taber and Finkelmeier during the first semester. Both players made significant contributions against Bemidji State. Taber had four points and nine rebounds in 15 minutes and Finkelmeier added two points and a steal in 10 minutes.

## THE COACHES

Indiana named Tom Crean as its 28th men's basketball coach on April 2, 2008. He came to Indiana from Marquette where he was 190-96 (66.4) in nine seasons and made five NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 Final Four. Mike McConathy is 145-135 in nine seasons with the Demons. Assistant Coach Mark Slessinger is a Bloomington native whose mother, Barbara, has been an usher in the end zone seats of Assembly Hall, near the IU bench, for two-plus decades.

## SEASON AND HOME OPENERS

The Hoosiers have won 23 straight home openers and are 86-22 in their first game of the season all-time in Bloomington. IU also has won 10 straight season openers.

## UP NEXT

The Hoosiers will host IUPUI on Tuesday, November 18 at 6:30 p.m.

## TOUGH NON CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

The 2008-09 Hoosiers will have the potential to play five nationally ranked programs in the non-conference portion of their schedule, the most since Indiana played six non-league games against ranked foes in the 1992-93 season. The Hoosiers will for sure play #9 Notre Dame in the EA Sports Maui Invitational(11/24), at #21 Wake Forest in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (12/3) and against #10 Gonzaga at the Hartford Hall of Fame Showcase in Indianapolis (12/6). In addition, #1 North Carolina and #7 Texas also will be at the EA Sports Maui Invitational.

## DEVAN DON'T MISS

Junior Devan Dumes, a junior college transfer from Vincennes, was a perfect 11-for-11 at the free thrown line against Anderson in the first exhibition game for the Hoosiers.

He continued that hot shooting in the second exhibition game against Bemidji State by making his first three to run his string to 14 consecutive made free throws. He would go on to miss his final three charity tosses in the game to finish 14-for-17 (82.5 percent) in the two games.

## DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Freshman forward Tom Pritchard posted a double-double in his Hoosier debut against Anderson with 20 points and 10 rebounds. He followed that up with 12 points and nine rebounds in the game against Bemidji State to conclude the two-game preseason with averages of 16 points and 9.5 rebounds.

## HEATING UP QUICK

Freshman Malik Story wasted little time getting in on the action against Bemidji State by scoring 15 points in just 19 minutes of action.

The native of Los Angeles, Calif., came in and provided a spark when the IU offense appeared to be struggling. He finished the contest by making six of his nine field goal attempts, including two of his four three-point field goals, in addition to grabbing seven rebounds.

In the first exhibition game, Story came off the bench and scored 14 points in 24 minutes. His 14 points came on 5-of-8 shooting from the field, including a pair of triples.

## IT STARTS AT HOME

Coach Crean also enjoyed considerable success in home openers as well during his tenure at Marquette. In his nine years in Milwaukee, Crean went 8-1 and won his last seven, including a 76-68 triumph over IUPUI last year at the Bradley Center. The average margin of victory in those wins in home openers is 16.5 points, with the largest margin coming in 2003 in a 79-41 win over Savannah State as part of the Pepsi Blue and Gold Classic.

## TEAM DEFENSE

In the pair of exhibition games, the Indiana defense was more than up to the task while the offense put up some very efficient numbers. Through the two games, IU shot nearly 50 percent from the floor (58-for-117) while holding its opponents to just 35 percent (43-for-122).

The team's percentage was aided by the fact that five players either did not miss a shot or were off with just one field goal attempt. There were also just two players that shot below 47 percent from the floor and three that were over 60 percent.

## STARTING OFF CREAN

Head coach Tom Crean had great success in season openers in his nine seasons at Marquette. In those nine lid-lifters, Crean has posted an 8-1 mark, including a 3-1 record in season openers at home. The lone loss came at the hands of South Alabama to start the 2000-01 season, Crean's second campaign at Marquette. Here is a look at all of Crean's season openers:

## IN THE NICK OF TIME

Freshman forward Nick Williams has been a consistent performer in both exhibition games for the Hoosiers. He had 10 points and five rebounds against Anderson and 12 points and seven boards against Bemidji State. He is averaging 11 points, 6.0 rebounds and is shooting 60.0 percent from the field and 81.8 from the line.

## VJ III

Freshman guard Verdell Jones III sparked the Hoosiers in their win over Anderson with 18 points on 8-for-12 shooting from the floor. He also is hauling in five rebounds per game in two exhibition games.

**DIVISION I EXPERIENCE**

The 2008-09 Indiana men's basketball team will be one of the least experienced teams in the history of Division I basketball. Of the 16 players on the roster, just four have seen action in a game at the Division I level.

In addition to returnees Kyle Taber and Brett Finkelmeier, Devan Dumes and Jeremiah Rivers have also played at this level.

Dumes played at Eastern Michigan as a freshman before transferring to Vincennes for his sophomore campaign. At EMU, he averaged 8.1 points and 2.0 rebounds, including a season-high 19 points against Ohio. He had 16 points against Tom Crean and Marquette for EMU.

Rivers comes to Indiana after playing his first two seasons at Georgetown. As a freshman, the Hoyas reached the Final Four with Rivers playing in 34 games.

The other 11 players on the roster are made up of nine freshmen, one junior college transfer, a red-shirt sophomore and a transfer from Lambuth University.

**SCOUTING  
NORTHWESTERN STATE**

Head coach Mike McConathy begins his 10th season at Northwestern State and has nine letterwinners back from a team that finished a 15-18 overall record and a 9-7 finish in the Southland Conference. Last year, the Demons advanced to the finals of the Southland Conference Tournament for the fourth straight season and sixth time in the last nine seasons under McConathy.

The Demons return five of the top eight scorers from last year's team, led by Keithan Hancock. Hancock averaged 8.7 points on the season and 10.2 points per game in conference games. Damon Jones is the next leading scorer returning for the Demons at 6.4 points per game, as he made 10 starts last year. Michael McConathy and Dominic Knight will share the point guard duties where they averaged a combined 5.0 assists per game last year.

Of the 17 players on Northwestern State's roster, 11 of them are either freshmen, sophomores or first-year transfers.

**EXHIBITION HISTORY**

The 2008-09 season marks the fifth campaign that the Hoosiers have opened the season with exhibition games against NCAA Division II or III schools.

**IU RADIO NETWORK**

This marks the 36th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University Football and Basketball games. In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches talk shows for both football and basketball, and has a weekly IU sports show, from September through March, on the IU Radio Network. Fischer has broadcast more than 1,200 Indiana University games that include seven bowl games, four NCAA Basketball Championship games and two N.I.T. Championship games.

Former Indiana guard Todd Leary is in his seventh season as the color analyst. Leary played for the Hoosiers from 1989-94 and still ranks among IU's top-10 career leaders in career three-point field goal percentage at .423, and his .460 shooting from beyond the arc in 1993-94 is ninth on the all-time list.

Joe Smith is in his 26th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime and post-game duties since 1983. 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Head Coach Tom Crean had a 100 percent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in his nine years at Marquette, as all 26 seniors graduated and earned a degree under his leadership.

Tom Crean, who averaged over 20 wins a season in nine years at Marquette and led the Golden Eagles to five NCAA Tournament appearances including the 2003 Final Four, was named the 28th head basketball coach in Indiana University history, on April 2.

In each of his final seven seasons, Crean's Marquette team's posted at least 19 wins and earned a postseason berth. Over those seven years, he compiled an aggregate record of 160-68 (.702). He is a two-time recipient of the Ray Meyer Conference USA, NABC District XI and USBWA District V Coach of the Year awards, and in 2003 won the Coach Clair Bee Award as well as being named a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award. Overall, he was 190-96 in nine years with the Golden Eagles.

Crean built the Marquette program to the level where it has remained one of college basketball's best since 2001. Since November 2001, the Golden Eagles spent 81 weeks in the rankings, including all but one week of the 2007-08 season, as the squad was ranked as high as 10th by the AP. In his nine years with the Golden Eagles, Crean's teams earned five NCAA Tournament bids, one more than the previous four Marquette coaches had in the 16 years prior to his arrival.

In his nine seasons in Milwaukee, Golden Eagles players earned 22 All-Conference selections and grasped the program's first conference player of the year award, when Dwayne Wade won Conference USA's top honor in 2003. Wade also went on to become the first Marquette player since 1978 to be named an Associated Press first team All-American and finalist for the John R. Wooden Award.

In 2007-08, Crean's squad put together a 25-10 season and earned the No. 6 seed in the NCAA South Regional. The Golden Eagles topped Kentucky in the first round and lost a heartbreaker to No. 3 seed Stanford in overtime to come up just shy of a trip to the Sweet 16. MU finished tied for fifth in the BIG EAST with an 11-7 conference record.

Marquette had three All-BIG EAST selections as Lazar Hayward, Dominic James and Jerel McNeal all picked up second team accolades. MU was one of just two teams in the 16-squad BIG EAST to have three players selected to the first and second teams. James was a first team all-conference selection in 2006-07 as well, while McNeal was named the conference's Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2006, Steve Novak was a unanimous first team all-conference selection and went on to be selected by the Houston Rockets in the NBA Draft. That followed Travis Diener's All-America selection in 2005, joining Wade as Golden Eagles to earn the recognition under Crean's direction. Diener was selected 38th overall by the Orlando Magic in the 2005 Draft and played last year for the Indiana Pacers.

In Marquette's first two years in the BIG EAST, the Golden Eagles posted 20-plus wins and finished in the conference's top four in both campaigns. Marquette also picked up NCAA Tournament bids and won 10 conference games in both years. MU had strength in regular-season tournaments as well, winning the CBE Classic in 06-07 by topping Texas Tech and Duke and taking the Great Alaska Shootout in 2005-06.

The Golden Eagles earned trips to the National Invitation Tournament in both 2003-04 and 2004-05, their final two seasons in Conference USA. The squad won 19 games each season and posted its finest start (13-1) in over a quarter century in 2004-05.

The 2002-03 campaign was one of the finest in Golden Eagle history, as Marquette made a Final Four appearance for the first time since winning the NCAA Championship in 1977. MU won 27 games that year, 14 in conference play, thanks in part to the play of Wade in his All-America season. The Golden Eagles finished the regular season ranked No. 9 by the Associated Press and No. 6 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll and their .818 winning percentage was the program's best since 1977-78. Wade also was selected in the first round of the NBA Draft by the Miami Heat later that year.

Crean's breakthrough season came in 2001-02, as he coached Marquette to a 26-7 record and the team's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1997. The 26 victories were the third-most all-time and represented the program's first 20-win season since 1997.

The Golden Eagles secured 13 conference victories, the most in program history, and posted an undefeated home season at 16-0. In each of his first two years with MU, the Golden Eagles won 15 games and finished in the top four of the C-USA standings.

Prior to his arrival in Milwaukee, Crean served under Tom Izzo on the Michigan State basketball staff for four seasons, holding the position of associate head coach the last two. Crean also served as the Spartans' recruiting

coordinator, where he routinely lured some of the nation's top talent to East Lansing, including two-time Big Ten Player of the Year Mateen Cleaves and two-time first team All-Big Ten selection Morris Peterson.

In Crean's four years on Izzo's staff, the Spartans put together an 88-41 record and made four consecutive postseason appearances, including a trip to the 1999 Final Four. In each of Crean's four seasons, MSU's win total increased, culminating with a 33-5 season and a 15-1 Big Ten ledger in 1999.

Prior to his tenure at Michigan State, Crean spent the 1994-95 season as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh and served as the associate head coach at Western Kentucky from 1990 to 1994.

In each of his final two seasons with the Hilltoppers, WKU earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, including a Sun Belt Championship and a trip to the Sweet 16.

Crean got his start in coaching on the Division I level in 1989-90, serving on Jud Heathcote's staff at Michigan State. That team

posted a 28-6 record and earned a Sweet 16 trip after winning the Big Ten.

A native of Mount Pleasant, Michigan, Crean earned his bachelor's degree in parks and recreation with a minor in psychology from Central Michigan in 1989. While pursuing his degree, Crean coached basketball at Alma College and Mount Pleasant High School.

Tom and his wife, Joani, are the parents of Megan, 13, Riley, 9, and Ainsley, 3.

Joani's father, Jack Harbaugh, was a long-time college football coach who won a Division IAA national championship while coaching at Western Kentucky. Her brother, John, is in his first year as the head coach of the Baltimore Ravens. He was an assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles from 1998-2006 after joining Cam Cameron's staff at Indiana for the 1997 season as a defensive backs/special teams coach. Another brother, Jim, played quarterback at Michigan and for the Indianapolis Colts and is currently the head football coach at Stanford.

**GORDON CHOSEN SEVENTH OVERALL BY THE CLIPPERS**

Former Indiana guard Eric Gordon was selected by the Los Angeles Clippers with the seventh pick in the 2008 NBA Draft on June 26. Gordon, who set the Big Ten freshman scoring record with 669 points, became the highest IU draft pick since Calbert Cheaney was selected sixth by Washington in the 1993 Draft.

Gordon is the second player in IU history to be drafted by the Clippers, joining Jay Edwards, who was selected in the second round in 1989. Indiana's last draft selection was Bracey Wright, who went 47th overall to Minnesota in the 2005 Draft. IU's last first-round selection was Jared Jeffries, who was selected 11th by the Washington Wizards in 2002. The Indianapolis native became the eighth Hoosier to be selected in the draft's top 10. He is the 19th IU player in school history to be selected in the first round.

Gordon was a *CBSSports.com* first team All-American, a second team NABC and *Sports Illustrated* All-American, and a third team *Associated Press* All-American. He became the first freshman in Indiana's storied history to earn All-America honors. The Big Ten coaches voted him a first team All-Big Ten honoree, Big Ten Freshman of the Year and an honoree on the All-Big Ten freshman team.

Gordon, who also was one of 24 players on the Wooden Award List and one of 30 players on the Naismith Award List, was selected an unanimous first team All-Big Ten selection and Big Ten Freshman of the Year by the league's media.

He finished the 2007-08 season averaging 20.9 points. He became the first IU freshman to average more than 20 points per game and the first Hoosier overall to produce 20 points per game since Brian Evans averaged 21.2 in 1996.

**D.J. WHITE CHOSEN IN FIRST ROUND BY DETROIT; NOW WITH OKC**

Former Hoosier forward D.J. White was selected by the Detroit Pistons with the 29th pick in the first round of the 2008 NBA Draft on June 26. The Pistons then traded the rights to White to the Seattle SuperSonics (now Oklahoma City) shortly after making the selection.

White, who finished in the top 16 in IU history in both points and rebounds for his career, became Indiana's 20th first-round draft choice, tying the Hoosiers with Notre Dame for sixth on the all-time list. Combined with Eric Gordon's selection (seventh to the Clippers),

White gives the Hoosiers multiple first-round picks for the fourth time in school history. The

last time the Hoosiers had two first-rounders was in 1993 (Calbert Cheaney, 6th, and Greg Graham, 17th). IU also had multiple first-round selections in 1981 (Isiah Thomas, 2nd, and Ray Tolbert, 18th) and 1976 (Scott May, 2nd, Quinn Buckner, 7th, Bobby Wilkerson, 11th).

White was a unanimous selection as the Big Ten MVP in 2007-08, marking the 16th time that a Hoosier has been named MVP of the Big Ten. White was the 14th Indiana player to earn the honor (Don Schlundt and Scott May won the award twice). He was the first Hoosier to take home the accolade since Jared Jeffries in 2002. He averaged 17.4 points and 10.3 rebounds and was named Big Ten Player of the Year.

The Tuscaloosa, Ala., native was named a second team All-American by the *Associated Press*, *Sports Illustrated*, *CBSSports.com*, *The Sporting News* and by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

He finished his career ranked 16th in IU scoring with 1,447 points. He also tied for ninth in career rebounding with 748 caroms. He finished second all-time at IU in career field goal percentage (56.2) and single season field goal percentage (60.5). He is the first player to average a double-double (17.4 points and 10.3 rebounds) since Alan Henderson in 1994 and just the second player to do so in the last 31 years.

# HOOSIERS DEFEAT ANDERSON, 103-71

Like a puppy in a cage waiting for its first venture into the backyard without a leash, the 2008-09 Indiana men's basketball team couldn't wait to run on the floor of storied Assembly Hall to face someone besides themselves.

With four freshmen and a junior college transfer who all were making their debut in the Cream and Crimson, the Hoosiers pounced on visiting Anderson with a 21-2 run that, much to the delight of the home crowd, showed displays of teamwork, unselfishness, heart and grit as they finished what they started by posting a 103-71 win over the Ravens in IU's first exhibition game of the season.

Five players scored in double figures as Crean had 12 players see action, but none for more than 28 minutes. Indianapolis native Devan Dumes, a junior transfer from Vincennes led IU with 22 points. Freshmen starters Tom Pritchard had 20 points and 10 rebounds and Verdell Jones III had 18 points, five rebounds, three assists and three steals to pace the Hoosiers.

Indiana shot 53.8% from the first half, had just three turnovers and outscored the Ravens 32-10 in the paint and 22-2 off of turnovers in building a 54-29 lead at the intermission. Not much changed in the second half, which saw the hosts outscore Anderson 49-42. The Hoosiers finished the game shooting 55.9% and held the Ravens to 36.8% marksmanship from the floor.

Indiana, led by Dumes' 11-for-11 effort from the line, made 33-of-40 charity tosses, an 82.5% clip. The Hoosiers controlled the game inside by a 50-28 advantage in the paint, a 35-11 point edge off of turnovers and a 29-7 margin on the fast break.

Freshman Malik Story was an offensive spark off the bench with 14 points and led the team with two three-pointers. Fellow frosh, Nick Williams, had 10 points, five boards, two assists and two steals also finished in double figures.

"We're all in it together," Crean said. "The more our fans understand that and get behind this team - I saw their confidence grow the way the fans reacted."

## POST GAME NOTES

- Baseball player Kipp Schutz, a sophomore from Evansville Harrison, suited up for the Hoosiers against Anderson. He is on a try out with the Hoosiers and averaged 11 points as a senior in high school.

- The Indiana basketball team defeated Anderson University, 103-71 to run its record in exhibition games to 6-0 over the past five seasons against lower-level colleges and universities.

- The Hoosiers opened the game on a 21-2 spurt, capped off by back-to-back three-point field goals from Devan Dumes and Matt Roth.

- The 103 points scored was the third consecutive exhibition game in which the Hoosiers topped the century mark.

- With the 32-point margin of victory, the Hoosiers defeated exhibition opponents by 30 or more points.

- Indiana shot a blistering 55.9 from the field for the game while holding Anderson to just 36.8 percent. In the first half, Indiana shot nearly 54 percent while the Ravens managed just 31.3 percent.

- At the foul line, Indiana held a decided advantage as well, making 12

more free throws than Anderson attempted in the game (33 made to 21 attempted). In the game, IU was 33-for-40 (82.5 percent) while Anderson was 14-for-21 (66.7 percent).

- Indiana pulled away early thanks to an sizeable advantage in fast break points and finished the game with a 29-7 edge in that category.

- The Hoosiers also dominated the Ravens in the paint, outscoring them 50-28.

- Of the 12 players who saw action for the Hoosiers, only Brett Finkelmeier had played in an IU uniform (11 minutes). Finkelmeier exceeded that total in one exhibition game with 15 minutes of action against Anderson.

## PLAYER NOTES

- The starting five for the Hoosiers scored 75 of the 103 points in the game. The starting lineup consisted of freshman Nick Williams (10), freshman Tom Pritchard (20), freshman Matt Roth (5), freshman Verdell Jones (18) and junior Devan Dumes (22).

- Junior Devan Dumes led the Hoosiers with 22 points, doing most of his damage from the free throw line (11-for-11).

- Freshman Tom Pritchard was the second-leading scorer for IU with 20 points on 8-for-13 shooting from the field. He also grabbed 10 rebounds to claim the team lead in that category.

- Verdell Jones III, another freshman, dropped in 18 points on 8-for-12 shooting from the floor. He also dished out three assists, and snared five rebounds and came away with three steals.

- Freshman Malik Story came off the bench and provided a spark in the early going and finished with 14 points to go along with three points and three assists.

- Freshman Nick Williams was the fifth player in double figures for the Hoosiers with 10 points in addition to five rebounds, two assists and two steals.

- Freshman Matt Roth closed with five points and three rebounds in his Hoosier debut.

- Junior college transfer Tijan Jobe scored four points, all from the free throw line while freshman Broderick Lewis chipped in with four points of his own by making both of his field goal attempts.

- Evan White, Brett Finkelmeier and Kory Barnett each scored two points.

- Daniel Moore did not break into the scoring column but he did hand out three assists and grab a rebound in 12 minutes of action.

# HOOSIERS GET BY BEMIDJI STATE, 72-54

Malik Story had 15 points and nine rebounds, including a pair of three pointers, and Indiana finished the preseason with a perfect 2-0 record after a 72-54 exhibition win over Bemidji State Tuesday night at Assembly Hall.

In addition to Story, Tom Pritchard had 12 points and nine rebounds, along with 12 points and seven boards from Nick Williams. Story and Williams combined to go 10-of-15 (66 percent) from the field on a night when the Hoosiers were not at their shooting best. As a team IU went 25 of 58 (43 percent) from the floor and was 17 of 29 (58 percent) on free throw attempts.

"I tried to stress to our team the last few days that competition level goes up, it doesn't go down," said head coach Tom Crean. "Every game it is going to be more and more, where we are playing against very talented teams and very talented players. That was a great learning lesson for a lot of people on our club today to understand."

Brady Fairbanks led the Beavers with 14 points, along with 12 from Seth Haake. Bemidji State was limited to 33 percent shooting (18-54) from the field and went 0-for-13 from the three-point line down the stretch after making four of its first seven shots.

The game marked the return of senior forward Kyle Taber. Taber missed the preseason as well as the first exhibition game while recovering from off-season surgery. Taber finished his season debut with four points and nine rebounds in 15 minutes of action.

"Getting Kyle (Taber) in is certainly a help, because now you have a very smart, well-school basketball player in there," Crean said. "It's great for him to get his legs under him."

The Beavers' outside shooting cooled off considerably, going 0-for-6 to close the half, and the Hoosiers stretched their lead to nine at 30-21 with 2:14 to play. Williams and Story turned BSU turnovers into points down the stretch and Indiana went into the locker room with a 37-26 lead.

Williams had 10 points to lead IU at the break, going 3-of-4 from the floor and hitting three of four free-throw attempts. Dumes had eight points, with both players pulling down four rebounds each. Taber also had four boards in seven minutes.

## POST GAME NOTES

- The 26 points allowed in the first half against Bemidji State are the fewest in a half in the two exhibition games this season. The next lowest was 29 in the first half against Anderson.

- The Hoosiers are 9-0 in exhibition games against lower-level opponents since the 2004-05 season.

- After Bemidji State cut the score to 37-36 by scoring the first 10 points of the second half, Indiana went on a 14-4 run to push the lead to 11 with 11:01 left.

- After hitting four of its first seven three-point field goals, the Beavers missed 13 straight long distance calls to finish 4-for-20 in the game beyond the arc.

- In two exhibition games, IU held its opponents to 21.2 percent from three-point range (11-for-52).

- The Hoosier bench outscored the Beavers 29-18 and IU held a 36-22 advantage in the paint, a 16-11 off of turnovers, a 14-7 margin in second chance points and 10-2 tally on the fast break.

## PLAYER NOTES

- The starting lineup of Tom Pritchard, Matt Roth, Verdell Jones III, Nick Williams and Devan Dumes remained in tact for the second straight game.

- Freshman Tom Pritchard had 12 points, nine boards and three block while playing a team-high 30 minutes.

- Freshman Malik Story had 15 points, including 10 in the second half, and added seven rebounds in 19 minutes. He shot 57.1 percent (4-7) from beyond the arc in the team's two exhibition games.

- Freshman Nick Williams had 12 points and seven boards in 25 minutes of action. He has made 9-of-11 free throws in two games.

- Senior Kyle Taber returned to action after having a knee injury earlier this fall and had four points and nine rebounds in 15 minutes.

- Freshman Daniel Moore had five points and three assists in 18 minutes in leading the team on a 10 point run in the second half.

- Freshman Matt Roth had a three-point field goal while junior Tijan Jobe added two rebounds to the Hoosiers cause.

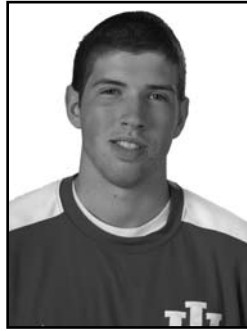
