### THE OPENING TIP

Indiana is in its 110th season of college basketball and will face Northwestern State University at Assembly Hall for the second straight year. IU will be looking to get back on track at home after just coming up short in three games at the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tipoff last weekend. NSU sits at 2-1 on the year with wins over East Texas Baptist (77-54) and Houston Baptist (92-61) and a loss on the road at Texas Tech (94-75).

### AGAINST THE SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE

Indiana is 2-0 all-time in games against teams from the Southland Conference and is 1-0 against Northwestern State thanks to an 83-65 win in Bloomington on Nov. 15, 2008. The other victory was against Nicholls State in 2005.

### THE COACHES

Indiana named **Tom Crean** as its 28th men's basketball coach on April 2, 2008, and he is in his second year with the Hoosiers. He needs two wins to reach the 200-win plateau in his 10-plus-season career and has a 198-124 record. He came to Indiana from Marquette where he was 190-96 (66.4) in nine seasons and made five NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 Final Four. His 2009 recruiting class was ranked among the top 10 in the country. Mike McConathy has an overall record of 157-156 as he is in his 11th year as Demons head coach. Northwestern State has been his only stop as a head coach and was highlighted by a 26-8 record during the 2005-06 season and an NCAA Tournament appearance.

### HEAD OF THE CLASS

Freshman **Maurice Creek** is the top freshman scorer in the Big Ten Conference averaging 16.2 points per game. He is ranked sixth in the league in that category. He also leads league rookies with 12 three-point field goals made. Freshman **Christian Watford** is tops among freshmen in the Big Ten in rebounding (7.8) and ranks eighth in the league overall in boardsmanship. He also is the top freshman free throw shooter making 81.0 percent of his attempts. Guard **Verdell Jones III** is the top scoring sophomore averaging 13.2 points per game and he leads second-year players in steals at 2.0 per game.

**SCOUTING NORTHWESTERN STATE**

NSU head coach Mike McConathy is in his 11th season leading the Demons. He has an overall record of 158-156, including a 2-1 start this campaign. Junior transfer Devon Baker leads the team averaging 15.3 points. He has hit on 47.6 percent of his three-point field goal attempts. Senior Damon Jones is averaging 13.7 points and 5.0 rebounds and junior Dominic Knight is averaging 11.3 points per game. The Demons are shooting 43.5 percent from three-point range in three games. They hit 13-of-28 three-pointers against Houston Baptist on Tuesday evening.

**HITTING THE BOARDS**

In Thursday's game against Ole Miss, the Hoosiers accumulated 43 rebounds, which is the most under Coach Crean. The last time an IU team had at least 43 rebounds was March 9, 2008, at Penn State when they had 45. Of those 43 total rebounds, 24 were on the offensive end, also the most under Crean and the most since Nov. 30, 1991, against Butler when the Hoosiers grabbed 26 offensive boards.

**HOOSIER HISTORY**

IU is third all-time in NCAA Championships (5), fifth in NCAA Tournament appearances (35), sixth in NCAA Tournament victories (60), seventh in Final Four appearances (8) and 11th in overall victories (1,643). Indiana has won 20 Big Ten Championships and has the best winning percentage in conference games only at nearly 60 percent. No team has had more All-Big Ten selections than IU with 53.

**DEJA 2**

Freshman forward **Christian Watford** finished his first career game with 14 points and 11 rebounds against Howard for his first career double-double. Watford followed that up with 17 points and 10 boards against USC Upstate for two double-doubles in as many games. Last year, teammate **Tom Pritchard**, who had five double-doubles on the season, had 13 points and 10 boards in his first career contest at IU and 19 points and 10 boards against IUPUI. Pritchard and Watford are the only two Hoosiers to post double-doubles in their first two career games at IU.

**TOP FIVE OF ALL-TIME**

The Indiana men's basketball program is widely regarded as one of the best programs in college basketball history. Recently, *ESPN/Sagarin* released it's rankings of the most prestigious basketball programs of all-time and not surprisingly, the Hoosiers were among the elite, checking in at No. 5 on the list.

## MO FROM MO

Freshman guard **Maurice Creek** has had a torrid start to his Hoosier career, averaging 16.2 points per game and shooting an astounding 54.4 percent (31-for-57) from the floor. The freshman from Oxon Hill, Md., led Indiana in scoring all three games of the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tipoff and averaged 16.7 points per game for the tournament. He had his best outing on Thursday against Ole Miss with 18 points on 7-of-15 shooting with three rebounds and three assists. He followed that up with 17 first-half points against Boston University.

## ROLLIN' ON THE RIVERS

Redshirt junior **Jeremiah Rivers**, who joined the Hoosiers last year after transferring from Georgetown University, set a new career-high with 14 points against Ole Miss thanks to a perfect 6-of-6 from the field and a pair of free throws. His previous high point total was nine points against Fairfield in December 2007 as a member of the Hoyas. He had another tremendous all-around game against Boston University with 13 points, six rebounds, four assists and two blocks.

## JONESIN' FOR A BASKET

Sophomore guard **Verdell Jones III** is second on the team in scoring at 13.2 points per game. He shot 45.7 percent in Puerto Rico and averaged 14.7 points over the three games. Jones III was 8-of-15 from the field against Ole Miss, setting a career high for made field goals. Last year as a freshman, he made seven field goals in a game on four occasions with all of them coming in the final month of the season.

## ELSTON EXCELLING OFF THE BENCH

Freshman forward **Derek Elston** has yet to start a game in his IU career, but he has been the biggest threat off the bench for head coach Tom Crean. In his IU debut, he posted 14 points on 6-of-7 shooting from the field against Howard. The next time out he poured in 10 points and grabbed eight rebounds against USC Upstate. He is second on the team with 10 offensive rebounds and is averaging seven points per game while playing an average of 15 minutes.

## PRITCHARD IN THE PAINT

Sophomore forward **Tom Pritchard** got off to a good start his first two games last year and his 64.7 field goal percentage is the best on the team through five games. In the season opener against Howard, the Westlake,

## POSTGAME NOTES - GEORGE MASON

- Indiana head coach Tom Crean's career record now stands at 198-124, just two wins away from 200 in his 11th year as a head coach.

- There were 11 ties and 25 lead changes in the game.

- The Hoosiers were 21-of-28 at the free throw line, the most free throws they have made this season and the most since Nov. 15, 2008 - the season opener against Northwestern State.

- The Hoosiers had the biggest lead of the game at 36-30 just 55 seconds into the second half. George Mason never led by more than four.

- Offensive rebounding has been a point of emphasis this year for the Hoosiers and on Sunday they excelled yet again, pulling down 18 offensive boards. Indiana is now averaging 14.4 offensive rebounds per game this season.

- Indiana was 5-for-8 (62.5 percent) from behind the arc against George Mason. IU has now made at least three triples in each of its five games so far and is shooting 41 percent as a team (25-of-61).

- George Mason on the other hand was just 3-of-13 (23 percent) from beyond the arc. The three made triples are the fewest by an opponent this season against IU.

- The Hoosiers came away with nine steals in the game to give them 45 on the year (9.0 steals per game).

- The 19 points off the bench are the second-most of the year, matching the output against USC Upstate. The most came in the season opener against Howard when the IU bench contributed 27 points.

- Freshman forward Bobby Capobianco scored his first career points in an IU uniform. He finished with his best game thus far with seven points and 10 rebounds (five offensive and five defensive) in just 17 minutes of action.

- Freshman guard Maurice Creek poured in 15 points and grabbed four rebounds. Through five games, Creek has scored in double figures in each game to become the first freshman since Eric Gordon to do that.

- Verdell Jones III was 6-for-6 from the free throw line and 3-of-10 from the field for 13 points. But he also added four assists, three rebounds and three steals.

- Freshman forward Christian Watford struggled in the first half, going 1-for-8, but rallied in the second half and had two key baskets down the stretch to keep IU in it. He finished with 10 points and eight rebounds to just miss his third double-double of the season.

- Freshman guard Jordan Hulls was perfect behind the arc (2-for-2) and at the line (2-for-2) for eight points in 14 minutes. He also had two rebounds, an assist and a steal.

- Sophomore guard Daniel Moore was effective off the bench in helping to break the GMU press, although his stats won't show it. He missed his only field goal attempt but did grab a rebound and hand out an assist.

- Derek Elston came off the bench and had two points and four rebounds in nine minutes.

- Senior center Tijan Jobe scored his first basket of the season on an assist from Daniel Moore in the first half.

- Freshman center Bawa Muniru made his first appearance in Puerto Rico and played three minutes.

- Senior Devan Dumes missed his only field goal attempt in seven minutes of action.

Ohio native had 10 points and five rebounds in 20 minutes of action.

## BOBBY C TO YOU AND ME

Freshman forward **Bobby Capobianco** had yet to make his presence felt through four games in an IU uniform. But then Coach Crean sent him into the game against George Mason and less than 30 seconds later, Capobianco had a steal and a three-point play to his credit for his first points as a Hoosier. He went on to put up seven points and 10 rebounds in 17 minutes.

## HULLS HANGING TOUGH

Freshman guard **Jordan Hulls** was named Mr. Basketball in the state of Indiana last year as a senior at Bloomington High School South and came to the IU campus with an abundance of expectations. In the season opener against Howard, he lived up to those expectations with five assists and zero turnovers. In the first two games in Puerto Rico, he struggled to get in the flow of the game but rebounded nicely in the final game against George Mason. He put up eight points, a season high, and hit both of his three-point attempts in 14 minutes of action.

**JUST DOING HIS "JOB"**

Senior center **Tijan Jobe** only averages seven minutes per game and rarely, if ever, has a play run for him, but he can be found setting countless ball screens at the top of the key as well as being a physical presence in the paint on defense for the Hoosiers. The big fella was able to get into the scoring column against George Mason when Daniel Moore found him underneath the basket for a fast break layup. Last year as a junior, Jobe scored a total of seven points and grabbed 14 rebounds.

**ROTH OUT INDEFINITELY**

Sophomore guard **Matt Roth** suffered a broken bone in his right foot (fifth metatarsil) and underwent surgery on Nov. 25. He will be out for an indefinite period of time and may apply for a medical hardship waiver to regain a year of eligibility. He averaged 6.7 points as a freshman. He had a career-high 29 points last season against Ohio State and tied a school record with nine three-point field goals made against the Buckeyes. He was averaging 2.0 points in the first two games of the season.

**BASKETBALL DEVELOPMENT CENTER**

The Indiana basketball program will move into its new Basketball Development Center at the conclusion of this season. The 67,000-square foot, multilevel facility features two practice courts, players lounge, locker rooms, coaches offices, athletic training facility, weight room and meeting and video rooms. This will allow each member of the program to have 24/7 access to help them in their development as a student-athlete.

The center also will feature Legacy Court which will celebrate the unrivaled tradition of Indiana basketball.

**RETURNING EXPERIENCE**

This year, IU will once again be one of the least experienced teams in the Big Ten. Along with Iowa, the Hoosiers only have one player (Brett Finkelmeier) that has been in the program for at least two seasons. Michigan State leads the conference with nine players with at least two years in their program. Here is how the rest shape up:

- Indiana has had 71 players selected in the NBA Draft, the most among Big Ten schools
- There are three players from IU currently on active rosters in the NBA - Eric Gordon (Los Angeles Clippers), D.J. White (Oklahoma City Thunder) and Jared Jeffries (New York Knicks).

**JIMMY V CLASSIC**

The Indiana University men's basketball team will face Pittsburgh in the second game of the 2009 Jimmy V Classic scheduled for 9 p.m., Tuesday December 8 in New York's Madison Square Garden. Butler will face Georgetown in the opening contest at 7 p.m., with both games set to air on ESPN. This is the 15th Annual Classic, with Indiana making its second appearance in the event (1999). IU defeated North Carolina, 82-73, in E. Rutherford, N.J., in the 1999 Classic.

**DUMES COMING BACK FROM KNEE INJURY**

Senior Devan Dumes has been slowed in the early part of the season with a knee injury that limited his practice time. He is averaging 3.6 points per game. He had a season-high seven points against Howard and also had five rebounds against USC Upstate. He averaged 12.7 points last season.

**HOOSIERS SIGN OLADIPO AND SHEEHY TO NLI**

Indiana University men's basketball coach Tom Crean has announced the signing of **Victor Oladipo**, a 6-4, 185 guard from DeMatha Catholic High School in Washington D.C. and **Will Sheehey**, a 6-6, 190 wing from Sagemont High School in Weston, Fla., to national letters of intent to attend the University and play basketball for the Hoosiers.

A resident of Upper Marlboro, Md., Oladipo is entering his senior year at DeMatha for head coach Mike Jones. He is currently ranked No. 133 in the 2010 recruiting class by Rivals.com and No. 36 among shooting guards. Scout.com lists the 6-4 guard as the No. 49 shooting guard in his class while ESPN.com has him listed at No. 53. He led DeMatha to a 29-3 record last year and a conference and city league title in the Washington, D.C. area. He had 14 points and 7 boards in the city championship game. He played AAU basketball for Team Takeover this past summer under the guidance of head coach Keith Stephens.

Born on May 14, 1991, he is the son of Chris and Joan Oladipo and has three siblings, Kritine, Kendra and Victoria.

A resident of Stuart, Fla., Sheehey is entering his senior year at Sagemont for head coach Adam Ross. He is currently ranked No. 131 in the 2010 recruiting class by Rivals.com. He played AAU ball for the Florida Rams under head coach Matt Ramker. As a junior, he averaged 24.6 points, 10.0 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game for South Fork High School in Florida.

Born on Jan. 16, 1992, he is the son of Mike Sheehey and Dawn Mailloux. He has a twin sister, Elizabeth, and a younger brother, Patrick. His father played collegiately at Syracuse and St. Bonaventure and his uncle, Tom Sheehey, was a former standout at Virginia and was drafted by the Boston Celtics.

**INDIVIDUAL LEADERS AT PUERTO RICO TIPOFF**

While the Hoosiers were unable to come away with a win at the O'Reilly Auto Parts Puerto Rico Tipoff last weekend, there were a number of positives that will be taken from the three games in four days. The best individual performance came from freshman **Maurice Creek**, who averaged 16.7 ppg and led the Hoosiers in scoring all three games. He has scored in double figures in all five games and is averaging 16.2 ppg on the year. Against Boston University, Creek came out red hot and scored 17 of the first 25 points for the Hoosiers. Redshirt junior **Jeremiah Rivers** also put up very respectable stats on the island, averaging 12.0 ppg and pulling down 6.7 rpg while getting to the free throw line a team-best 20 times. Sophomore **Verdell Jones III** was second on the team with 14.7 ppg while also nearly putting up a 2:1 assist-to-turnover ratio (11:6).

**PUERTO RICO TEAM NOTES**

Against Ole Miss, the Hoosiers pulled down 24 offensive rebounds - the most in a game since Nov. 30, 1991, against Butler when they had 26. The offensive glass continued to be a strength throughout the tournament as they pulled down another 18 against George Mason in the final game. The Hoosiers also made 21 free throws against George Mason, the most in a single game since making 28 in the season opener last year against Northwestern State.

**IU BY THE NUMBERS**

**0** - The Hoosiers do not have a player who has been in the program for four seasons. IU fielded one of the least experienced teams in college basketball history in 08-09. Junior walk-on Brett Finkelmeier is the only player who is in his third season at IU.

**17.2** - Verdell Jones III averaged 17.2 points per game in the final nine games of the 2008-09 season, including 23 points apiece in the final two games of the season against Wisconsin and Penn State. He was second among Big Ten freshmen in scoring at 11.0 points per game.

**6.4** - Tom Pritchard was the top freshman rebounder in the Big Ten averaging 6.4 boards per game.

**9** - Matt Roth set a Big Ten freshman record when he made nine three-pointers at Assembly Hall against Ohio State.

Bloomington, Indiana - Junior Devan Dumes scored 21 points, 13 in the first half, and freshman Verdell Jones III finished with 18 points, four boards, four assists, three blocked shots and three steals as Indiana overcome opening game jitters to post an 83-65 over Northwestern (La.) State in the first regular season game for head coach Tom Crean. Crean becomes the ninth straight Indiana head coach to win in his debut dating all the way back to Branch McCracken's 54-28 win over Ball State at the start of the 1938-39 season.

"I thought we were a little nervous to start," said Crean, who won 190 games in nine seasons at Marquette before coming to Indiana on April 2. "I know my stomach knew it was a real game."

The visiting Demons of the Southland Conference were quick out of the gate and led 12-5 with 16:08 to go after a layup by Damon Jones. Dumes, who has played more Division I minutes than any other Hoosier (he played his freshman year at Eastern Michigan before transferring to Vincennes last year), hit a pair of three-pointers and then freshman Tom Pritchard added a pair of charity tosses to give IU a 13-12 advantage with 14:35 left.

"It was a good momentum booster for the whole team and fan base," said Dumes. "I'm glad we got the first win under our belt."

NSU's Keithan Hancock had a steal and a layup to push the Demon edge to 16-13, but freshman Matt Roth nailed a triple to tie the score for the Hoosiers and Indiana took the lead for good on a free throw by freshman Malik Story with 11:09 left to make it 19-18.

The Hoosiers went into the locker room with a 38-29 lead. Defensively, Indiana forced 30 turnovers and held the visitors to 31.9% shooting. In addition, IU registered 15 steals.

Hancock would hit another long bomb that would make the score 49-40 with 15:37, but Indiana would start getting the ball inside with layups by sophomore Brett Finkelmeier, senior Kyle Taber, Roth and Pritchard would help IU build a 60-42 edge with 10:04 to go.

Pritchard would notch his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

## STEVE DOWNING AND BOB KNIGHT INDUCTED INTO IU ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

The Indiana University Athletic Hall of Fame inducted two of the most important names in the history of the men's basketball program, Steve Downing and Bob Knight. They were honored along with five others November 6 in a ceremony at Assembly Hall that was attended by 800, the largest crowd for the event ever. The pair join former men's soccer coach Jerry Yeagley (men's soccer, 1973-2003), Katrin Koch (women's track and field, 1989-92), Joe Norman (football, 1975-78), the late Mike Rabold (football, 1956-58), and Alan Somers (swimming, 1961-63) in the 2009 class.

Coach Knight was presented by 2008 IU Athletics Hall of Famer Bob Hammel and Rabold was honored by his brother John.

The Hall of Fame was established in 1982 by the Indiana University Varsity Club National Board of Directors, in cooperation with Indiana University, its Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, the I Association, and the Indiana University Alumni Association. Its purpose is to recognize and honor individuals who have made exceptional contributions to the achievements and prestige of Indiana University in the field of athletics and who have demonstrated the values imparted by intercollegiate athletics. Each year, a subcommittee of the Indiana University Varsity Club National Board of Directors selects inductees for the Hall of Fame. This year's class brings the current roster of IU Hall of Fame inductees to 164.

**STEVE DOWNING:** Won three basketball letters from 1971-73 ...Indiana and Big Ten most valuable player in 1973 after leading the Hoosiers to Final Four of the NCAA championship...was the first All-American under Coach Bob Knight... first team All-Big Ten in 1973 after averaging 20.1 points and 10.6 rebounds... averaged 15.1 rebounds in 1972, second best mark in IU history for season...ranks fifth in career rebounds with 889... played professional basketball for two years with the Boston Celtics and won an NBA title in 1974...served as IU Associate Athletic Director for 20 years... the Indianapolis native is currently a Senior Associate Athletic Director at Texas Tech.

**BOB KNIGHT:** Basketball coach from 1971-2000...career record of 662-239 at IU...coached teams that won 11 Big Ten Championships, a Big Ten record, and NCAA championships in 1976, 1981, and 1987...only coach in history to lead teams to NCAA (1976, 1981, and 1987), NIT (1979), Pan American (1979) and Olympic (1984) championships... last coach to have perfect winning season (32-0 in 1976)... coached 17 All-Americans, had 10 players win Big Ten MVP honors, and had 29 players who played in the NBA... Big Ten Coach-of-the-Year six times and National Coach-of-the-Year in 1975, 1976, 1987, and 1989... inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in 1991... he is the all-time winningest coach in college basketball history with a 902-371 record (70.8) which was compiled at Army, IU and Texas Tech... after playing at Orrville (Ohio) High School, he played at Ohio State under Hall of Fame Coach Fred Taylor and was a member of the Buckeyes 1960 national championship team.

**IU RADIO NETWORK**

Indiana University's basketball program receives some of the most extensive media coverage in the country. Learfield Communications holds the exclusive rights as Indiana University's official radio outlet.

Headquartered in Jefferson City, Mo., Learfield Communications also owns the multi-media rights to 26 leading universities.

The schools represented by Learfield include: Alabama, Army, Clemson, Colorado, Fresno State, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas State, Maine, Memphis, Miami (Fla.), Minnesota, Missouri, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon State, Penn State, Purdue, San Jose State, South Carolina, Texas A&M, Tulsa, Wyoming and Wisconsin. Learfield was founded in 1972.

**DON FISCHER**

This marks the 37th year that Don Fischer has been the radio play-by-play "voice" of Indiana University Football and Basketball games. In addition to broadcasting the games, Fischer hosts the weekly coaches talk shows for both football and basketball, and has a weekly IU sports show, from September through March on the IU Radio Network.

Fischer does freelance sportscasting, and for the last 12 years, he has served as the television voice of the Indianapolis Colts for their preseason games on WTTV-Channel 4 in Indianapolis.

During his 36 years of work with IU, Fischer has been named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year 22 times by two organizations. The National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association has honored him 18 times, while the Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association has named him its honoree four times. He has won several awards for best play-by-play, and has been honored by Indiana University with the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University. He also has been named an Honorary "I" Man. The Indiana Sportswriters and Sportscasters Association inducted Fischer into the ISSA Hall of Fame in April 2004.

In addition, the City of Indianapolis and the State of Indiana have each honored Fischer with a special "Recognition Day" for his service as the play-by-play broadcaster for IU.

Fischer has broadcast more than 1,200 Indiana University games that include six bowl games, four NCAA Basketball Championship games and two N.I.T. Championship games. From 1973 through 1987, he worked for ABC Radio, Canada's CBC, and several other major market radio stations, including WIRE in Indianapolis as their source for coverage of the Indianapolis 500. During that 14-year period, he also served Indianapolis radio station WIRE and Network Indiana, a statewide news network, as their Sports Director.

A native of Mendota and Rochelle, Ill., Fischer has been in the radio business for 39 years. His previous broadcast experience includes stops in Butte, Mont., Ottawa, Ill., Springfield, Ill. and Terre Haute, Ind. Fischer has four sons and seven grandchildren. He and his wife, Susy, reside in Greenwood.

**TODD LEARY**

Former Indiana guard Todd Leary is in his eighth season as the color analyst. Leary played for the Hoosiers from 1989-94 and still ranks among IU's top-10 career leaders in career three-point field goal percentage at .423, and his .460 shooting from beyond the arc in 1993-94 is ninth on the all-time list. Leary, his wife, Kim, and their three children live in Carmel, where Leary co-owns Mortgage Links and Legends Title.

**JOE SMITH**

Joe Smith is in his 27th year with the IU Radio Network. He has handled pre-game, halftime and post-game duties since 1983. Smith, the sports director of WGCL-AM 1370 in Bloomington, is in his 37th year of radio broadcasting in Bloomington. He began his career in 1969 at WAIK Radio in Galesburg, Ill. From 1973-89, Smith worked on "RFD-4 Agri-Business Show" on WTTV-4 with the late Bob Cook. In 1998, Smith was named Indiana Sportscaster of the Year and in April 2003 was inducted into the Indiana Sportswrit-

ers/Sportscasters Hall of Fame. Joe handled the IU TV Warmup Shows from 1978-82 and hosted several IU Coaches Shows from 1983-96 and again from 2002-04.

In June 2004, Smith received the J.W. Bill Orwig Medal, that goes to non-alumni for distinguished service to the University.

Joe has two children, both of whom are Indiana graduates. Jeff is a 2002 graduate with a bachelor's degree in sports communications/broadcasting and recently married the former Kristen Jacob. Smith's daughter, Jamie, earned her bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2005, and she completed her master's in sports management at Tennessee.

**TOM CREAN RADIO SHOW**

Beginning the first week of December, Don Fischer will host the one-hour Tom Crean Radio Show each Monday night at 7 p.m. from the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Bloomington.

The pair will recap the previous weeks events and take calls from a statewide audience which listens on the IU Radio Network.

**TOM CREAN TELEVISION SHOW**

Also beginning the first week of December, Jeremy Gray will host the 30-minute Tom Crean Show which will air each Friday evening at 4:30 p.m. on the Big Ten Network. Fans will get an inside look at the program and enjoy player interviews, instruction and other items pertinent to the IU Men's Basketball program.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Head Coach Tom Crean had a 100 percent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in his nine years at Marquette, as all 27 seniors graduated and earned a degree under his leadership. Four more players he recruited graduated after the 2008-09 season.

Tom Crean, who averaged over 20 wins a season in nine years at Marquette and led the Golden Eagles to five NCAA Tournament appearances including the 2003 Final Four, was named the 28th head basketball coach in Indiana University history, on April 2, 2008. In 10 years as a head coach on the collegiate level, he is 196-121 and has seen all 27 of the seniors who have played for him earn college degrees.

Since coming to Indiana, he and his staff recruited one of the top 10 classes in the country for 2009 and he has been relentless in embracing the tradition of Indiana University and building bridges for future fans of Indiana basketball throughout the state.

In each of his final seven seasons at Marquette, Crean's teams posted at least 19 wins and earned a postseason berth. Over those seven years, he compiled an aggregate record of 160-68 (.702). He is a two-time recipient of the Ray Meyer Conference USA, NABC District XI and USBWA District V Coach of the Year awards, and in 2003 won the Coach Clair Bee Award as well as being named a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award.

Crean built the Marquette program to the level where it has remained one of college basketball's best since 2001. From November 2001 through the end of his tenure at Marquette, the Golden Eagles spent 81 weeks in the rankings, including all but one week of the 2007-08 season, as the squad was ranked as high as 10th by the AP. In his nine years with the Golden Eagles, Crean's teams earned five NCAA Tournament bids, one more than the previous four Marquette coaches had in the 16 years prior to his arrival.

In his nine seasons in Milwaukee, Golden Eagles players earned 22 All-Conference selections and grasped the program's first conference player of the year award when Dwayne Wade won Conference USA's top honor in 2003. Wade also went on to become the first Marquette player since 1978 to be named an Associated Press first team All-American and finalist for the John R. Wooden Award.

In 2007-08, Crean's squad put together a 25-10 season and earned the No. 6 seed in the NCAA South Regional. The Golden Eagles topped Kentucky in the first round and lost a heartbreaker to No. 3 seed Stanford in overtime to come up just shy of a trip to the Sweet 16. MU finished tied for fifth in the BIG EAST with an 11-7 conference record.

Marquette had three All-BIG EAST selections as Lazar Hayward, Dominic James and Jerel McNeal all picked up second team accolades. MU was one of just two teams in the 16-squad BIG EAST to have three players selected to the top two teams. James was a first team all-conference selection in 2006-07 as well, while McNeal was named the conference's defensive player of the year.

In 2006, Steve Novak was a unanimous first team all-conference selection and went on to be selected by the Houston Rockets in the NBA Draft. That followed Travis Diener's All-America selection in 2005, joining Wade as Golden Eagles to earn the recognition under Crean's direction. Diener was selected 38th overall by the Orlando Magic in the 2005 Draft and played last year for the Indiana Pacers.

In Marquette's first two years in the BIG EAST, the Golden Eagles posted 20-plus wins and finished in the conference's top four in both campaigns. Marquette also picked up NCAA Tournament bids and won 10 conference games in both years. MU had strength in regular-season tournaments as well, winning the CBE Classic in 06-07 by topping Texas Tech and Duke and taking the Great Alaska Shootout in 2005-06.

The Golden Eagles earned trips to the National Invitation Tournament in both 2003-04 and 2004-05, their final two seasons in Conference USA. The squad won 19 games each season and posted its finest start (13-1) in over a quarter century in 2004-05.

The 2002-03 campaign was one of the finest in Golden Eagle history, as Marquette made a Final Four appearance for the first time since winning the NCAA Championship in 1977. MU won 27 games that year, 14 in conference play, thanks in part to the play of Wade in his All-America season. The Golden Eagles finished the regular season ranked No. 9 by the Associated Press and No. 6 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll and their .818 winning percentage was the program's best since 1977-78. Wade also was selected in the first round of the NBA Draft by the Miami Heat later that year.

Crean's breakthrough season came in 2001-02, as he coached Marquette to a 26-7 record and the team's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1997. The 26 victories were the third-most all-time and represented the program's first 20-win season since 1997.

The Golden Eagles secured 13 conference victories, the most in program history, and posted an undefeated home season at 16-0. In each of his first two years with MU, the Golden Eagles won 15 games and finished in the top four of the C-USA standings.

Prior to his arrival in Milwaukee, Crean served under Tom Izzo on the Michigan State basketball staff for four seasons, holding the position of associate head coach the last two. Crean also served as the Spartans' recruiting coordinator, where he routinely lured some of the nation's top talent to East Lansing, including two-time Big Ten Player of the Year Mateen Cleaves and two-time first team All-Big Ten selection Morris Peterson.

In Crean's four years on Izzo's staff, the Spartans put together an 88-41 record and made four consecutive postseason appearances, including a trip to the 1999 Final Four. In each of Crean's four seasons, MSU's win total increased, culminating with a 33-5 season and a 15-1 Big Ten ledger in 1999.

Prior to his tenure at Michigan State, Crean spent the 1994-95 season as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh and served as the associate head coach at Western Kentucky from 1990 to 1994.

In each of his final two seasons with the Hilltoppers, WKU earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament,

including a Sun Belt Championship and a trip to the Sweet 16.

Crean got his start in coaching on the Division I level in 1989-90, serving on Jud Heathcote's staff at Michigan State. That team posted a 28-6 record and earned a Sweet 16 trip after winning the Big Ten.

A native of Mount Pleasant, Michigan, Crean earned his bachelor's degree in parks and recreation with a minor in psychology from Central Michigan in 1989. While pursuing his degree, Crean coached basketball at Alma College and Mount Pleasant High School.

Tom and his wife, Joani, are the parents of Megan, 14, Riley, 10, and Ainsley, 4.

Joani's father, Jack Harbaugh, was a long-time college football coach who won a Division I-AA national championship while coaching at Western Kentucky. Her brother, Jim, played quarterback at Michigan and for the Indianapolis Colts and is currently the head football coach at Stanford. Another brother, John, is in his second year as the head coach of the Baltimore Ravens. He was an assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles from 1998-2006 after joining Cam Cameron's staff at Indiana for the 1997 season as a defensive backs/special teams coach.
