THE OPENING TIP

The Indiana men's basketball team is ranked 10th in the AP Poll and 11th in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches Poll and will host Illinois in its Big Ten Conference home opener. The Hoosiers are 257-50 all-time at Assembly Hall against the league. IU has won its last nine games, the longest winning streak during Kelvin Sampson's two-year tenure, and is coming off a 78-64 win at Michigan on January 8. The Illini are coming off a 70-60 loss at Wisconsin. The teams met three times last year, with the Hoosiers winning 65-61 in Bloomington, while falling to Illinois, 51-43 in Champaign and 58-54 in overtime at the Big Ten Tournament. Indiana has the fourth longest home court winning streak in the country having won its last 26 games in Assembly Hall and the Hoosiers have won four of the last five meetings between the two teams in Bloomington. Indiana's current nine-game game winning streak is its longest since the start of the 2002-03 season and with a win, the Hoosiers would have a 10-game winning streak for the 22nd time in school history. The Hoosiers are currently enjoying their longest continuous string of success since they won 13 in a row in the 1992-93 season.

THE COACHES

Two-time National Coach of the Year **Kelvin Sampson** was named the 26th head coach in Indiana University history on March 29, 2006 and enters his second year with the Hoosiers and 25th as a collegiate head coach. He has notched 16 20-plus win seasons and is 489-269 (.645), which ranks 20th in victories among active NCAA Division I coaches. He is 34-12 (.739) in two seasons and is 24-0 at Assembly Hall. Branch McCracken holds the record for most consecutive wins at home to start a career with 25 from 1938-41. Both of Sampson's Hoosier teams have been nationally ranked. This year, the Hoosiers have been ranked as high as eighth in the country, while last year, they climbed to #19.

Coach **Bruce Weber** is in his fifth year at Illinois and has a 120-36 record during his tenure with the Fighting Illini.

UP NEXT

The Hoosiers will finish a stretch which has them playing three of their first four games on the road in conference play. IU goes to Minnesota on January 17 for the third of seven games this season that tip off after 9 p.m. in Bloomington. Indiana then will enjoy a three-game homestand when it hosts Penn State (January 20), Iowa (January 23) and UConn (January 26).

HOOSIER HISTORY

IU is third all-time in NCAA Championships (5), fifth in NCAA Tournament appearances (34), sixth in NCAA Tournament victories (60), seventh in Final Four appearances (8) and 10th in overall victories (1,623).

Indiana has won 20 Big Ten Championships with the last coming in 2002. The Hoosiers have the best winning percentage in conference games only at 60.0%. No team has had more All-Big Ten selections than IU with 51.

Indiana has won its last 26 regular season games in Assembly Hall and tied a school record by going 15-0 last year.

• **Eric Gordon** leads the league and is ninth in the nation in scoring (23.5), second in the league in free throw percentage (85.5), fourth in three-point field goals made (2.9), and eighth in steals (1.5). He has made (100) and attempted (117) more free throws than any other player in the league. The last freshman to lead the Big Ten in scoring was Minnesota's Kris Humphries (21.7) in 2004. The highest scoring average by a freshman in league history was set by Purdue's Glenn Robinson (24.1) in 1993.

• **D.J. White** had his ninth double-double in 10 games with his 21-point, and career-best 22-rebound performance at Michigan. He is currently fourth in the league in scoring (16.7), ninth in the nation and first in the league in rebounds (10.7) and field goal percentage (63.5) and third in the league in blocked shots (1.9). He is now 32nd on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,109 points and 20th in all-time rebounds at IU with 560. He is averaging 18.5 points and 18.5 rebounds in Big Ten action.

• **Jamarcus Ellis** is sixth in the Big Ten in rebounding (7.6) and fourth in assists (4.64). He also is second in the league in defensive rebounds at 5.9.

• The Hoosiers lead the league in scoring (82.6), free throw percentage (74.9) and rebounding margin (+10.4).

Fifteen rebounds

White is the first player since Steve Downing in 1972 to collect 15 rebounds or more in three straight games. White has had 52 rebounds in the last three games.

1,000 points/500 rebounds

White is now the 15th player in Hoosier History to record more than 1,000 points (1,109) and 500 rebounds (560) during their career. He is the first player to accomplish the feat since Jeff Newton had 1,203 points and 737 rebounds from 2000-2003.

Pan-Am Games Experience Helped

White became the eighth player in Indiana basketball history to suit up for Team USA in the Pan American Games this past summer for Villanova Coach Jay Wright and was the top performer for the squad after averaging 16.8 points (4th in the tournament) and 8.6 rebounds (3rd in the event) in five games. He shot 59.3% from the field.

ELLIS SETS THE TONE

Junior **Jamarcus Ellis** made quite a first impression in his first Big Ten game. He had 15 points, seven rebounds, seven assists and five steals. In addition, he tied the score just before halftime with an off-balance jumper, and had six straight points in a key second half stretch which saw the Hoosiers rally from a four-point deficit.

For the season, he is averaging 8.3 points, 7.6 rebounds (6th in the Big Ten), 4.6 assists (4th in the Big Ten) and is second on the team with 14 blocked shots and leads the club with 20 steals. His nickname, Tone, is short for his middle name, Antonio.

The Chicago native was a teammate of current Hoosier DeAndre Thomas at Westinghouse High School and Chipola Junior College.

CRAWFORD CONTRIBUTES AS A FROSH

Freshman **Jordan Crawford** has emerged as a strong candidate for the Big Ten's All-Freshman team and Sixth Man of the Year Award. He is fourth among rookies in scoring in the league averaging 13.5 points. Combined with Gordon, they make up one of the strongest young backcourts in the nation averaging 37.0 points per game or 44 percent of the Hoosiers scoring attack. Usually the first option off the bench, unless there is an injury, he has scored in double figures in nine of 11 games this season.

His most memorable performance of the season came when he started against his brother, Joe, when the Hoosiers battled Kentucky. Playing 39 minutes in his first career start, he had 20 points, two assists and two steals as the Hoosiers got the best of the Wildcats, 70-51.

D.J. IS WHITE HOT

In the last nine games, senior **D.J. White** is averaging 19.2 points, 13.7 rebounds, 2.4 blocks and is shooting 63.4% from the floor. He has had double-doubles in nine of his last 10 games and is coming off a 21-point, 22-board effort on the road at Michigan.

White was named Big Ten Men's Basketball Player of the Week for consecutive weeks (December 3 and 10) and was named National Player of the Week by Rivals.com on December 10. Since the conference began giving the honor in 1981-82, White is the first Hoosier to receive the league Player of the Week honors in back-to-back weeks. For his career, he has been honored three times.

White averaged 22.5 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks to carry Indiana to triumphs over Tennessee State and Kentucky. Against TSU, White had a career-high 29 points and against Kentucky, White racked up 16 points, 13 rebounds and two blocked shots.

DURING THE NINE GAME WIN STREAK

The Hoosiers are dominating the boards, winning the battle 42.4 to 28.4 since the Georgia Tech game.

Indiana is averaging 80.9 points, while holding opponents to 61.1 points per game.

Hoosier opponents are shooting just 32.8% from three-point range.

The Hoosiers have made 191 free throws, while IU's opponents have made just 91 during that same time frame.

The Hoosiers are averaging 5.1 blocked shots per game, led by D.J. White's 23.

Four players are averaging nine points or better including **Eric Gordon** (21.3), **D.J. White** (19.2), **Jordan Crawford** (14.3), and **Jamarcus Ellis** (9.4).

RPI AND SAGARIN RATINGS

The Hoosiers are 42nd in the latest RPI.

Indiana is 19th according to the Sagarin Ratings.

MICHIGAN POST-GAME NOTES

- **D.J. White** set a career high with 22 rebounds and added 21 points for his ninth double-double in the last 10 games for the Hoosiers. The 22 boards were the 13th-highest total in IU history and marked the first 20-rebound game for a Hoosier since Alan Henderson had 20 against Minnesota on Feb 8, 1995. It was also the first 20-20 game for an IU player since that game, as Henderson poured in 26 points against the Gophers.

- White is now averaging 16.7 points and 10.9 rebounds per game this season, as he seeks to become the first Hoosier since Henderson in 1994-95 to average double-figure points and rebounds. White is now in the top 20 all-time in rebounds, clocking in 20th with 560 in his career.

- The Hoosiers are now 13-1, the best start since IU began 15-1 in 1996-97.

- Indiana opened Big Ten play 2-0 for the second time in the last three seasons. The Hoosiers won their first two road games in conference play for the first time since the Final Four team of 2001-02.

- After holding a 15-11 edge, the Hoosiers went on a 14-2 run to open up a 29-13 lead. The Wolverines were 0-for-9 during that stretch from the field, while IU was 6-for-10 from the field.

- Michigan closed the first half on an 11-3 run to trim IU's lead to 37-31 at the half. However, the Hoosiers came out on fire after the break, going on a 24-8 run to open up a 22-point lead midway through the second half.

- The Hoosiers dominated the boards against the Wolverines, holding a 51-33 edge over the home squad. It marked the third time in the last five games that IU has 50-plus rebounds. Eighteen of the Hoosiers' boards came on the offensive glass, the sixth time IU has eclipsed 15 offensive rebounds.

- **Eric Gordon** went over 20 points for the 11th time this year, scoring 23 points on 9-for-16 shooting. Gordon shot 4-for-7 from 3-point land in the game, but had just two free throws (making one), the second-lowest total for the freshman this season.

- **A.J. Ratliff** had a career-high six assists for the Hoosiers and added three points and three rebounds in the game.

- **Jordan Crawford** scored 11 points to put himself in double digits for the ninth time in his 11 career games. The freshman added seven rebounds, four assists and two steals in the victory.

- **Jamarcus Ellis** continued his strong all-around play for IU, scoring seven points, dishing out six assists and grabbing four rebounds. It is the eighth time this season Ellis has had five or more assists.

- **Mike White** scored two points and had four rebounds for the Hoosiers, while **DeAndre Thomas** had a key four points in the first half and added a pair of boards in just nine minutes of action.

- **Lance Stemler** went 2-for-2 from the field for four points and pulled down three rebounds, two on the offensive glass.

- **Brandon McGee** played the final two minutes and had two points for Indiana. **Adam Ahlfeld** added one minute of action for IU.

HOOSIER QUICK HITS

• The Hoosiers posted a 2.89 grade point average during the fall semester. Seven players earned grade point averages above 3.0 including **D.J. White**, **A.J. Ratliff**, **Lance Stemler**, **Jamarcus Ellis**, **Brett Finkelmeier**, **Adam Ahlfeld** and **Kyle Taber**.

• Chicago State went 0 for 5 from the free throw line, the first Hoosier opponent since at least 1970 to not make at least one free throw during a game against Indiana. San Francisco went 1 for 1 on free throw attempts against Indiana in Assembly Hall on December 20, 1998. On December 3, 1991, the Hoosiers did not make a free throw in a 78-46 win over Notre Dame at home.

• Freshman **Eric Gordon** had 31 points against Illinois State, his third 30+ point effort of the season. Only one other freshman in school history, Mike Woodson in 1976-77, has scored 30 or more points three times in their freshman year.

The Indianapolis North Central product is the first player in Indiana basketball history to score 20 points or more in the first seven games of his career. George McGinnis held the previous record with six straight to start a career. Gordon also set an IU first game and two-game scoring record with 31 points against UT Chattanooga and a total of 54 points in his first two games, topped, McGinnis who had 52.

The Hoosiers are 10-0 when he makes two or more three-point field goals.

• Senior **D.J. White** has posted a double-double in 12 of his last 17 games and notched 10 rebounds or more in 12 of the last 16 games. He was an all-tournament choice at the Chicago Invitational Challenge.

With 560 career rebounds, he is now 20th in career rebounds at IU.

GORDON, WHITE HONORED IN THE SAME WEEK

Senior **D.J. White** was named Big Ten Player of the Week and freshman **Eric Gordon** was named National Player of the Week by ESPN.com on December 3 after the pair led IU to wins over Georgia Tech and #22 Southern Illinois.

White was honored after averaging 14 points, 13 rebounds and 3 blocked shots and Gordon averaged 26.5 points, 4 rebounds and two blocks. White also used a 57.8 shooting percentage and his defense on SIU's top player, Randal Falker, also helped his status. Against the Yellow Jackets, White scored 18 points and pulled down 14 rebounds while adding three blocks and two steals. The Tuscaloosa, Ala., native had 10 points, 12 boards and three blocks in the road win over the Salukis.

Gordon had 29 points against Georgia Tech and made 13 of 16 free throws in that game. He also had 22 points, three blocks and two steals against SIU.

He was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on November 19.

Assembly Hall

The Hoosiers own a 26-game winning streak at home and several numbers show why the Hoosiers have been dominant in Assembly Hall.

- Indiana is 178-18 (92.5) all-time at Assembly Hall against non-conference foes and 257-50 (87.2) against the Big Ten.
- The Hoosiers are averaging 89.0 points per game in their nine home games this season.
- Indiana is shooting 51.9% from the floor.
- Four players are shooting 50% or better from the field at home. **D.J. White** (69.8), **Jordan Crawford** (55.7), **DeAndre Thomas** (55.1), and **Armon Bassett** (51.0) all have been blistering from the field at home.
- Opponents are shooting just 39.5% from the floor and 33.5% from three-point range.
- The Hoosiers are outrebounding opponents 40.0 to 28.6.
- The Hoosiers have shot 273 free throws compared to 132 for their opponents.

GORDON NAMED BIG TEN CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Indiana freshman **Eric Gordon** was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on November 19 along with Michigan State's Raymar Morgan. Gordon set a first game and two-game IU scoring record in contests against Chattanooga and Longwood. He had 33 points in the season opener and had six rebounds, four assists and three steals. In addition, he held the Mocs leading scorer, Kevin Bridgewater, scoreless in the second half with his defense. His scoring output broke the IU first game scoring record of 26 points established by George McGinnis in December of 1970 against Eastern Michigan. Gordon followed that up with 21 points, three assists and two steals against Longwood. That 54-point, two-game mark, topped the 52 scored by McGinnis, who had 26 in his second game against Kansas State. For the week, he shot 58.6% from the field (17/29) and 63.2% from long range (12/19) and averaged 4.5 rebounds and 2.5 steals. For his efforts, he also was named Dick Vitale's Diaper Dandy of the Week on *ESPN.com*.

WHITE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN

Indiana senior **D.J. White** was named Preseason All-Big Ten and the Hoosiers were picked to finish second, the conference announced at its annual Basketball Media Day. White, who averaged 13.8 points, 7.3 rebounds per game and 2.3 blocks last season, was joined by four other seniors on the Big Ten's Preseason All-Conference team. Illinois center Shaun Pruitt, Ohio State guard Jamar Butler, Michigan State guard Drew Neitzel and Penn State guard Geary Claxton joined White as all-league honorees. Neitzel was chosen as Preseason Player of the Year. The Hoosiers, who return three starters and boast a top-10 recruiting class, were chosen behind preseason favorite Michigan State and ahead of Ohio State, who was selected to finish third.

GORDON WAS NOT JORDAN'S SON

One myth that has circulated for a number of years according to All-America candidate **Eric Gordon** is that he played Michael Jordan's son, Marcus, in the 1996 movie Space Jam. That myth grew legs when ESPN presented it as fact when showing highlights of Gordon's 33-point performance against Chattanooga. An actor with the same name and around the same age did portray Jordan's son, but it was not the current Hoosier standout.

WHITE ON NAISMITH AWARD WATCH LIST

Indiana senior **D.J. White** is one of 50 players named to the Naismith Award Watch List which is presented by the Atlanta Tipoff Club.

The watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its preseason criteria on player performances from last season and expectations for the 2007-08 season. Seniors and juniors accounted for 17 apiece, along with 16 sophomores. The list does not include incoming freshmen, although those student-athletes will be considered in the first vote in January, 2008. The Naismith Trophy is the most prestigious national award presented annually to college basketball's players of the year.

WHITE ALSO UP FOR WOODEN AWARD

Indiana senior **D.J. White** is one of 50 players who were chosen as preseason candidates for the Wooden Award which is presented by the Los Angeles Athletic club.

The list is composed of 50 student athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most coveted trophy. These top 50 candidates are comprised of returning players. Transfers, freshmen, and medical redshirts are not eligible for this preseason list, but will be evaluated and considered for both the Midseason Top 30 list and the National Ballot. Last year, Kevin Durant of the University of Texas was the first freshman to win the Wooden Award.

Freshman **Eric Gordon** is being heralded as not only one of the top freshmen in the country, but also as one of the top players overall in college basketball. He currently leads the Big Ten in scoring (23.5) and was named ESPN.com's National Player of the Week (12/3).

He is the first Hoosier to ever start his career with seven straight 20+ point efforts and his 33 points in the opener against Chattanooga set an IU first-game standard.

In his first regular season game, he set an IU record for most points in a debut with 33 against the Mocs. Perhaps more importantly was the job he did defensively holding UTC's Kevin Bridgewater, who had scored 14 first half points, scoreless in the second half. In addition, against Illinois State, he held the Redbirds leading scorer, Osiris Eldridge, 14 points below his average. He finished with seven points.

BASKETBALL DEVELOPMENT CENTER

IU held its official groundbreaking ceremony June 19 to signify the beginning of construction of several major athletic facilities including the North Endzone Facility, Basketball Development Center, Baseball Stadium, Softball Stadium and The Academic Resource Center. The \$55 million plan was approved by trustees on Sept. 22, 2006.

The Memorial Stadium North End Zone Project will house a new, state-of-the-art strength development area used by more than 600 Indiana student-athletes. In addition, coaches' offices and meeting space for the football program, a Hall of Champions which will spotlight successful student-athletes and teams throughout the history of IU athletics and administration offices will be a part of the plan.

Architectural plans call for the Indiana basketball teams to have a new facility to call home. The Indiana Basketball Development Center will serve as the daily headquarters for the men's and women's programs, featuring practice courts, locker rooms, coach's offices and meeting rooms for each team, as well as a training room and strength development area. The addition of the center will alleviate overcrowding issues encountered in the current facility.

The Student Development and Compliance unit at Indiana University (target move-in is spring 2009) will relocate as a part of the facilities plan, moving from a modest 2,500 square foot space in Assembly Hall to a spacious and renovated 18,000 square foot area located on the east side of Memorial Stadium. Classrooms, private tutoring space, study areas, computer labs and staff offices will all be housed in the Academic Center for Excellence.

BACK IN THE TOP 10

For the first time since the 1994-95 season, the Indiana men's basketball team began the season ranked in the top 10 of a major poll. The Hoosiers were ranked ninth in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches Preseason Poll and ninth in the first AP Poll of the season. The Hoosiers return three starters and seven lettermen from last year's 21-11 squad which advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. In addition, Indiana's recruiting class is generally regarded as one of the top ten in the country. This marks the 35th time in 38 years that Indiana has been nationally ranked and second straight season under second-year Coach Kelvin Sampson (IU was rated as high as 19th during the 06-07 campaign) that the Hoosiers have cracked the top 25.

HOOSIERS TOP MOCS, 99-77

BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA--Overcoming a slow start, No. 8 Indiana (1-0) came back with a dominating second-half performance for a 99-79 win over Chattanooga (1-1) Monday night at Assembly Hall in Bloomington.

Making his official collegiate debut, freshman Eric Gordon led all scorers with 33 points. Gordon was 9 of 15 on the court and made a staggering seven of 11 three-point attempts. It is the most points scored by a Hoosier player in his IU debut. The previous record of 26 was set by George McGinnis on December 1, 1970 against Eastern Michigan.

After turning the ball over 10 times in the first half the Hoosiers gave up the ball just three times in the second period while forcing eight Chattanooga giveaways. Indiana shot 60 percent (18-30) from the field in the second half, including 6 of 10 on three-point attempts.

With the Mocs shooting at a blistering 57 percent in the first half, the Indiana defense clamped down in the second period allowing just 29 points on 10 field goals.

Trailing 50-46 at the half the Hoosiers came out of the locker room fired up, punctuated by a dunk from Gordon that brought the crowd to its feet and made it a 50-all contest.

Indiana went back on top with a D.J. White jumper at 17:50 to make it 52-50 and slowly pulled away to an eight-point advantage (65-57).

The Hoosiers finished with five players in double figures as Armon Bassett contributed 20 points and White added 17. Jamarcus Ellis was the top IU rebounder with nine.

HOOSIERS OVER LONGWOOD, 100-49

BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA--The No. 8 Indiana Hoosiers shot 59 percent from the field, including 61 percent from three-point range in a 100-49 victory over Longwood Sunday afternoon at Assembly Hall in the first round of the Chicago Invitational Challenge.

Indiana (2-0) led by as many as 56 points (97-41) and finished with six players scoring in double figures for the first time since 1998. For the second time in as many games freshman Eric Gordon led all scorers with 21 points in just 26 minutes of play, hitting five of eight three-point attempts. Junior guard Jamarcus Ellis had a season-high 11 rebounds and just missed out on a double-double with nine points. Indiana won the rebounding battle, 46-33.

Gordon's two-game total of 54 points betters the IU record of 52 points scored in the first two games of a career set by George McGinnis in 1970-71.

The Hoosiers' defense smothered the Lancers' attack as Longwood shot just 26 percent for the game, including 17 percent (5 of 29) in the second half. After a layup from Danny Wilson cut the IU lead to one at 7-6, Indiana rattled off a 14-2 run that was punctuated by a Gordon dunk for a 21-8 advantage with 13:15 to play. Longwood would get no closer than eight (21-13) for the remainder of the game as the Hoosiers closed the half on a 24-11 run to take a 54-30 lead into the lockerroom at the break.

Freshman Jordan Crawford made his sixth basket in as many attempts with 9:42 left in the game to put Indiana ahead 79-41. The freshman finished with 16 points on 70 percent (7-10) shooting.

Senior D.J. White played just 21 minutes as head coach Kelvin Sampson turned to his bench early in the second half. White was 4-of-5 from the field and 4-of-5 from the charity stripe for 12 points, while guard Armon Bassett added 14 points and five assists in 23 minutes of action.

SECOND HALF HELPS IU OVER COPPIN ST.

BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA--D.J. White had 21 points and eight rebounds, and freshman Eric Gordon scored 13 of his 15 points in the second half, helping Indiana overcome its sluggish start to beat the Eagles 73-46.

The Hoosiers used a 20-2 run to start the second half to pull away for their 10th victory of the season.

Indiana appeared to take control with a 9-0 run midway through the first half, but Coppin State answered with six straight points to get back within two - the same margin they trailed by at halftime.

Eagles coach Ron "Fang" Mitchell went to the locker room hopeful his overworked players had something left after enduring a brutal back-to-back stretch more suited to NBA teams.

"Our guys understood what the situation was and they were willing to deal with it," Mitchell said. "I was very proud of them the first half but I've never been a coach who believed in moral victories. It said a lot because they fought the whole way, it just wasn't enough."

Tywain McKee led Coppin State with 16 points. No other players reached double figures.

The momentum switched quickly in the second half. Gordon opened with a 3 and sparked a 20-4 run that finally put the Hoosiers in control 48-30 with 12:40 to go. Coppin State never challenged again.

Despite the poor start, Sampson did move closer to Branch McCracken's school record for most consecutive wins at the start of a career. The Hoosiers have won 25 straight at home, and Sampson is 23-0 since coming to Bloomington last season.

HOOSIERS TAKE CONTROL OVER CHI. STATE

BLOOMINGTON, INDIANA-Eric Gordon scored 22 points and made 14 of 14 free throws and D.J. White dominated the middle with 21 points and a career-high 15 rebounds and the 13th/14th-ranked Hoosiers used two early scoring runs to defeat Chicago State, 97-59.

"One thing coach emphasized all week was the slow starts and defense," White said. "We wanted to start better. Starting the game fast was a big focus for us."

The Hoosiers dominated Chicago State in every facet. Indiana finished with a 56-26 rebounding edge, blocked 11 shots, had 11 steals and forced 18 turnovers.

But the first half was more impressive. The Hoosiers had 12 offensive rebounds, three on the game's first possession, and built a 48-19 lead despite shooting 34.2 percent from the field.

Indiana has won seven straight and 26 in a row at Assembly Hall where it has been unbeatable since Sampson joined the program last season. Sampson is 24-0 at home since coming to Bloomington and is within one win of tying Branch McCracken's school record for most consecutive home victories at the start of a career. McCracken was 25-0 from 1938-41.

Jordan Crawford had 15 points, eight rebounds , three assists and five steals off the bench and Armon Bassett returned to the starting lineup and posted 13 points, five assists and three steals as the Hoosiers finished December with a 6-0 record and have won their last seven games.

Indiana had a season-high 56 rebounds and made 21 of 23 free throw attempts.

HEAD COACH KELVIN SAMPSON



Two-time National Coach of the Year Kelvin Sampson was named the 26th head coach in Indiana University history on March 29, 2006, and since that day he has worked tirelessly to reposition the Hoosiers among college

basketball's elite programs. He has guided the Hoosiers to a 34-12 record (73.9%) during his tenure.

If the first year is any indication of how the merger of one of the NCAA's most tradition-rich basketball programs with a coach who has notched 16 20-plus win seasons, then Hoosier fans should be excited about things to come.

What Indiana fans respect most about Sampson is his energy, intensity, and his commitment to building a program an entire state can call its own. Entering his 25th season as a head coach, Sampson is 489-269 (.645). In his first year with the Cream and Crimson, Sampson's squad finished 21-11 and tied a school record by going 15-0 at Assembly Hall.

The Hoosiers earned their 34th NCAA Tournament bid, advanced to the second round of the West Regional after defeating Gonzaga, 70-57, in the first round, and were ranked as high as 19th in the country during the regular season.

As a team, the Hoosiers led the Big Ten in three-point field goal percentage (38.1) and three-point defense (31.0). Individually, junior D.J. White earned second-team All-Big Ten honors, senior Roderick Wilmont was a third-team All-League pick, and senior Earl Calloway was an honorable mention choice. In addition, Sampson's first IU recruiting class was consistently ranked among the nation's best by several noted experts.

THE BEST IN THE BIG XII

Sampson came to IU after a 12-year run at Oklahoma which saw him post a 279-109 record overall and a 128-60 mark combined in the Big 8 and Big XII. His 111 regular season Big XII victories when he left OU were the most in league history at the time.

He was 111-49 (.694) in conference play since the league formed in 1996-97 and his 128 triumphs combined in regular season and league tournament play also were conference standards. In addition, he was 239-87 during that 10-year span which also was the most wins by a single coach overall in that conference over that period.

With a 20-9 record in 2005-06, Sampson coached OU to its ninth consecutive 20-win season. Sampson's club was productive on the court and in the classroom. The squad posted a 3.14 grade point average (GPA) for the 2005 fall semester, setting a single-semester record for the 12-year Sampson era.

Eight of the 12 team members recorded a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Under Sampson's leadership, Oklahoma enjoyed one of the most successful three-year runs in school history from 2000-03. The Sooners were 84-19 (.816), won three-straight Big 12 Tournament titles and advanced to the 2002 NCAA Final Four (before losing to Indiana in the national semifinals) and the 2003 NCAA Elite Eight.

SAMPSON IN THE PAC-10

Sampson left quite a mark in his seven-year stint at Washington State. One of only four men to win 20 or more games in a single season in Washington State history, Sampson directed the 22-11 Cougars to the 1992 National Invitation Tournament (NIT), and earned Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors in the process. Sampson concluded his stay in Pullman by leading Washington State to a 20-11 mark and the 1994 NCAA Tournament, the Cougars' first NCAA Tournament appearance in 11 years. Sampson served as an assistant coach at WSU from 1985-87.

AT MONTANA TECH

He began his head coaching career at the helm of the Montana Tech program from 1981-85. After spending the 1981-82 campaign as the interim head coach, Sampson led the Orediggers to a 73-45 mark in his final four years. Montana Tech had won just 17 games in the three years combined prior to Sampson's arrival. He closed his Montana Tech tenure with three-straight Frontier League titles.

PERSONAL

Sampson was born on Oct. 5, 1955, in Laurinburg, N.C. He was raised in Pembroke, N.C., and was an all-league three-sport star (football, basketball and baseball) at Pembroke High School. He captained his high school basketball team for two years, coached by his father, John W. "Ned" Sampson. Sampson enrolled at Pembroke State University (now UNC Pembroke) where he earned four letters in basketball and three in baseball. He was a Dean's List student and received the Gregory Lowe Memorial Award as the school's outstanding physical education major as a senior.

Sampson received bachelor's degrees in health and physical education and political science in 1978 and his master's degree in coaching and administration from Michigan State in 1980. During his stay in East Lansing, he served as a graduate assistant to Jud Heathcote.

Sampson, who was inducted into the Montana Tech Hall of Fame in 1996 and the Pembroke State Hall of Fame in 1998, is married to the former Karen Lowery. They have one daughter, Lauren, and one son, Kellen. Lauren is in pharmaceutical sales for AstraZeneca in Bloomington, while Kellen, who recently graduated from Oklahoma after playing four years of basketball for the Sooners, is a graduate manager for the Hoosiers.
